COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)—Quarterback Stephen Garcia and freshman tailback Marcus Lattimore each ran for two touchdowns, and South Carolina coach Steve Spurrier won his 18th straight college opener 41-13 over Southern Miss on Thursday night.

Garcia got things started with a 22-yard touchdown run and Lattimore followed with first-half scores of three and seven yards to send the Gamecocks to a surprisingly easy win against the Golden Eagles.

And Lattimore wasn't the only young star to excel for Spurrier.

Sophomore Alshon Jeffery had 106 receiving yards and freshman Ace Sanders had a 53-yard rush - the Gamecocks' longest in four years - to set up Lattimore's first score.

Even freshman backup passer Connor Shaw came through, connecting with D.L. Moore for a 15-yard touchdown pass for South Carolina's final score.

Southern Miss kept the Gamecocks off stride early on, forcing a punt on South Carolina's opening series and quickly driving to the Gamecocks 22.

That's when momentum changed for good.

Akeem Auguste broke up a third-down pass that settled into the hands of safety DaVonte Holloman, and South Carolina followed with a solid drive of its own led by Garcia.

The junior was 4-for-4 passing for 51 yards on the series and finished things with a gritty, 22-yard TD run.

Then South Carolina's youngest guns took control.

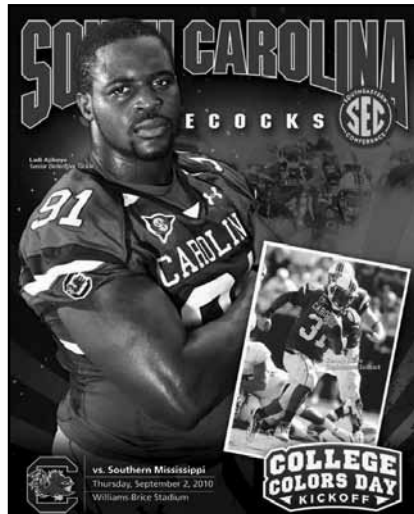
Speedy Sanders had his back-breaking end around to the Southern Miss 9. Two plays later, Lattimore bounced through for his first college score from three yards out.

Lattimore, considered the country's top tailback prospect last February, got the call a series later. This time, he picked his way through Southern Miss defenders for a seven-yard scoring run as South Carolina led 24-6 - its most points by halftime since the 2006 Liberty Bowl.

Garcia ended 16 of 23 for 193 yards.

Golden Eagles coach Larry Fedora followed Spurrier as Florida's playcaller in 2002 and tried to out-scheme him with a no-huddle, flood-the-field attack.

But Southern Miss twice bogged down in the red zone after the early pick, settling for two field goals.

South Carolina coach Steve Spurrier brought in Marcus Lattimore to run the ball.

And Spurrier let his prize freshman do it all day against No. 22 Georgia.

Lattimore rushed for 182 yards and two touchdowns to lead the 24th-ranked Gamecocks (2-0, 1-0 Southeastern Conference) to a 17-6 victory Saturday.

Lattimore carried 37 times in his first SEC game, punching in a pair of two-yard TDs and sealing things during a long, fourth-quarter field goal drive.

"I'm a little sore," Lattimore said.

He'll let the cheers at Williams-Brice Stadium soothe any lingering pain. The fans chanted his name at the end as Lattimore pounded the Bulldogs (1-1, 0-1) again and again.

Get used to it, SEC, because Spurrier sounds ready to ground it out all season.

He pushed past the defensive line for his first two-yard touchdown. Lattimore had two defenders on his back on his next score and dragged them into the end zone for a second two-yard TD.

He also had yardage on South Carolina's final scoring drive, starting with a 16-yard run and carrying eight of 11 plays to seal the game with Spencer Lanning's 24-yard field goal.

It was a complete reversal from most games in the South Carolina-Georgia series. It's usually a Bulldog tailback who takes charge, and the Gamecocks who play catch up.

This time, Georgia was outgained by more than 100 yards and held without a touchdown for the first time in three years since its last loss to South Carolina, 16-12, in 2007.

The Bulldogs' best chance to tighten the game came in the third quarter when they drove to the South Carolina 3 while trailing 14-6. But Washuan Ealey fumbled and cornerback Stephon Gilmore recovered to end the threat.

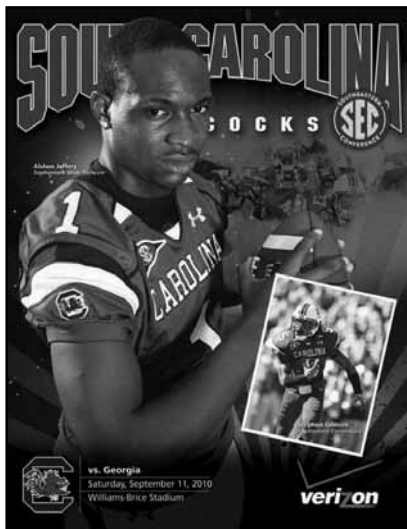
Right from the start, Georgia had no answer for Lattimore, the freshman who was considered the country's top high school running back last winter. He had runs of 16, 10 and 10 on South Carolina's opening drive that ended with Lattimore's first touchdown.

Lattimore was back at it right before halftime, giving the Gamecocks a 14-3 lead that Georgia couldn't match.

Spurrier likes Lattimore's square posture that keeps him moving forward even after he's hit. It also helped that Gamecocks called on Lattimore's favorite zone-read play from high school.

"That's all I did for four years," he said.

Georgia got a quick start from Ealey, the tailback who was suspended for the Bulldogs' opener last week. Ealey gained 32 yards on his team's opening drive, which stalled in the red zone when Orson Charles bobbled a third-down pass from Aaron Murray with running room ahead. But the Bulldogs' attack sputtered the rest of the half, managing 13 yards as they went three-and-out in three straight possessions.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)— South Carolina coach Steve Spurrier knows the best part of his 13th-ranked Gamecocks beating lower-division Furman.

“Glad the game’s over,” he said, “and we don’t have to play them again for another 25 years.”

Stephen Garcia threw for two touchdowns, freshman Marcus Lattimore rushed for one and South Carolina won 38-19 on Saturday, improving to 3-0 for the first time in three years. Not that it came easily against the Paladins – something that’s happened before with FCS teams in Spurrier’s six seasons.



The Gamecocks needed a fourth-quarter interception to hold on against Wofford 27-20 in 2006, then managed only a pair of touchdowns against those same Terriers in a 23-13 win.

The last time they played Furman was even worse for the Gamecocks, a stunning 28-23 win for Paladins at Williams-Brice Stadium in 1982.

And Furman (1-1), of the FCS Southern Conference, seemed poised to make this one tight, cutting a 28-6 lead to 31-19 in the final period and driving for more before Stephon Gilmore’s interception and 80-yard TD return finally settled things.

Furman’s Adam Mims finished with 10 catches for 202 yards.

It was a drastic turn from a week ago, when the Gamecocks’ stamped themselves as contenders in the Southeastern Conference with a 17-6 win over Georgia.

Garcia’s 15-yard scoring throw to Tori Gurley and Lattimore’s four-yard touchdown run put the Gamecocks up 14-0.

When Garcia completed a nifty six-yard throw to D.L. Moore in the back of the end zone early in the third quarter, South Carolina led 28-6 and looked ready to rout Furman.

But the Gamecocks had trouble putting this one away.

Shawn Boone began Furman’s comeback, tipping and catching Garcia’s screen pass attempt near the goal line for a three-yard touchdown return.

After Spencer Lanning’s career best 51-yard field goal, the Paladins struck again with Tersoo Uhaa’s halfback pass to Mims for a 72-yard touchdown.

Furman drove 53 yards to South Carolina’s 30 the next time it had the ball before Cody Worley’s overthrown pass settled in Gilmore’s hands with a clear path to the end zone.

Still, Spurrier improved to 40-0 all-time against programs from outside the BCS automatic qualifier conferences.

Garcia finished 13 of 20 for 150 yards with his first two interceptions of the year. Lattimore added 97 yards rushing and his fifth TD on the ground this year. Jeffery had five catches for 97 yards, coming up short of his third-straight game with at least 100 receiving yards.

South Carolina’s defense registered seven sacks and held Furman to 51 yards on the ground.

AUBURN, Ala. (AP)—Cam Newton and No. 17 Auburn are hard to stop once they get going.

The Tigers' 250-pound quarterback rushed for 176 yards and three touchdowns and passed for two more scores. Auburn then forced four fourth-quarter turnovers to pull off another come-from-behind victory, this one 35-27 against No. 12 South Carolina on Saturday night.

The Tigers (4-0, 2-0 Southeastern Conference) overcame a double-digit halftime deficit for the second straight week against a team from the Palmetto State, this time falling behind 20-7. Both of Newton's scoring passes came in the fourth quarter after fumbles by South Carolina quarterback Stephen Garcia.

South Carolina (3-1, 1-1) twice drove into Auburn territory in the final minutes behind freshman backup Connor Shaw, but he was intercepted each time. Demond Washington picked off a pass that deflected off the hands of receiver Alshon Jeffery in the end zone with 33 seconds left to seal the win.

Newton was 16-of-21 passing for 158 yards and also logged 25 runs, including a 54-yard TD scamper after a nice fake handoff in the first quarter.

Auburn racked up 334 yards rushing against a defense that came in giving up a league-low 60 yards on the ground. The Tigers were ball hogs in a dominant second half, running 49 plays to South Carolina's 22.

The Gamecocks had no turnovers in the first three quarters and four in the final 15 minutes to waylay a bid for their first 4-0 start since 2001. Instead, the Gamecocks left with their sixth-straight loss in league road games and fifth in a row against Auburn since joining the SEC.

There was some give and take in that regard. Earlier Auburn had lost three fumbles, and the first two set up South Carolina touchdown drives.

Shaw took the Gamecocks downfield on both his drives but threw the ball right to linebacker Josh Byner under pressure for an interception at the 11 to end the first.

Auburn failed to get a first down and run out the clock on three-straight Newton runs but then capitalized on one of the few balls Jeffery didn't bring down.

He had eight catches for 192 yards and caught two of Garcia's three touchdown passes. Garcia went 15-of-21 passing for 235 yards, but was sacked three times and had two costly fumbles before being pulled in the fourth quarter.

The Tigers' Michael Dyer won the battle of highly-touted freshman running backs, outgaining Marcus Lattimore 100-33. Dyer had 23 carries but Lattimore was stymied early and only carried 14 times after emerging as a workhorse coming into the game. Dyer gained 78 yards after halftime.

The defense and Newton's timely passing carried the day in the end. He completed a seven-yard touchdown pass to tight end Philip Lutzenkirchen to take a one-point lead early in the fourth.

Then, Emory Blake jumped over a diving defender and just pushed the ball over the goal line for a 12-yard TD with 6:23 left.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)— Stephen Garcia threw three touchdown passes, two to Alshon Jeffery, and Marcus Lattimore scored three times as 19th-ranked South Carolina stunned No. 1 Alabama 35-21 on Saturday.

Never before had the Gamecocks beaten a team ranked No. 1 - at least not in football.

Opponents have had little chance against Alabama the past few seasons. The defending national champions had won 19 straight games - including last week's 31-6 rout of Florida - since losing the Sugar Bowl to Utah after the 2008 season.

But facing a third-consecutive ranked SEC team caught up with Alabama as Garcia and the Gamecocks used the Crimson Tide's formula for success: Cashing in on chances close to the goal line and limiting the country's best tailback duo in Mark Ingram and Trent Richardson to 64 yards.

South Carolina shredded the country's top-rated scoring defense, putting up the most points on Alabama since a 41-34 loss to LSU in 2007. The Gamecocks scored four touchdowns when they got inside the Bama 20--double what the Crimson Tide had allowed coming in.

Alabama tried to rally back as it had against Arkansas two games ago, this time cutting South Carolina's 21-3 lead to 28-21 with most of the fourth quarter left.

The Crimson Tide's charge came courtesy of an odd safety by Garcia - Spurrier threw his notes about five yards onto the field when his quarterback grabbed a wayward shotgun snapped and flung it through his own end zone from about the two - a field goal and a 51-yard touchdown catch by Darius Hanks.

Alabama's last chance to tighten things came at the start of the fourth quarter when Jeffery, the SEC's leading receiver, bobbled a catch into the hands of Tide defensive back Will Lowery for an interception. But McElroy was sacked for a seven-yard loss by Stephon Gilmore, and Saban called a fake field goal that didn't come close to working as defensive lineman Ed Stinson dropped the throw from holder A.J. McCarron.

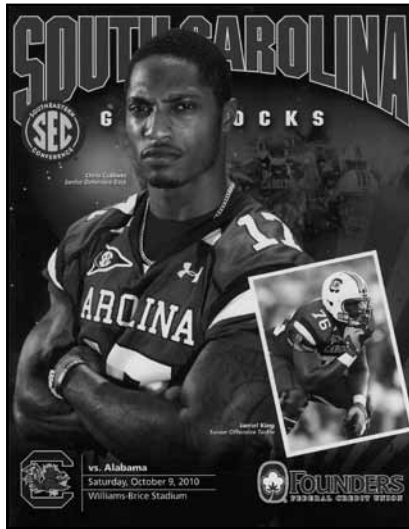
South Carolina answered with a 75-yard drive, capped by Lattimore's two-yard score with 7:01 left that put the game away.

Alabama could not respond and South Carolina fans, as they had after the basketball team beat Kentucky in January and the baseball team beat Arizona State at the College World Series in June, celebrated beating the country's No. 1 team.

Spurrier earned his 107th SEC victory, breaking a tie for second with Mississippi great Johnny Vaught. Alabama's Paul "Bear" Bryant is the all-time leader with 159 league wins.

Lattimore finished with 93 yards rushing. He also caught Garcia's first scoring pass, a nine-yard touchdown in the opening quarter.

Garcia was a tidy 17 of 20 for 201 yards and the one interception. He also picked up a critical fourth-and-1 on the Gamecocks final scoring drive. Jeffery had seven receptions for 127 yards, including TD catches of 26 and 15 yards.

LEXINGTON, Ky. (AP)—

The 10th-ranked Gamecocks seemed as if they'd keep it together before freshman running back Marcus Lattimore went down with an ankle injury.

Then they could only watch as Kentucky's Randall Cobb caught a 24-yard touchdown pass with 1:15 remaining then added the two-point conversion to cap a furious second-half rally and give Wildcats a stunning 31-28 victory, ruining South Carolina's chance to get a leg up in the jumbled SEC East.

Mike Hartline threw for a career-high 349 yards and four touchdowns for the Wildcats, who had lost 10 straight to the Gamecocks and never beaten Spurrier in 17 tries.

Lattimore had 212 yards of total offense and three touchdowns but spent most of the second half on the sideline after rolling his left ankle while getting tackled early in the third quarter. Kentucky shut the Gamecocks down over the final 30 minutes, holding them to 103 yards - 49 of which came on the desperate final drive - while slowly chipping away at the lead.

Hartline hit LaRod King for a five-yard touchdown pass to cap a 95-yard drive and bring Kentucky within 28-17. Then Hartline found Matthews for a 38-yard score to get within 28-23. Matthews finished with 12 receptions for 177 yards and a score.

Given one last chance with 7:31 remaining, Hartline guided Kentucky to the South Carolina 24. Facing fourth down, he pumped the ball once and lofted the ball to a wide open Cobb in the end zone. Cobb bulled over left tackle for the two-point conversion to put the Wildcats up three.

Garcia, who finished with 382 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions, quickly moved the ball to the Kentucky 20 with 11 seconds remaining. The Gamecocks used a timeout and opted to take a shot at winning in regulation. Garcia threw it up to 6-foot-3 receiver Lamar Scruggs. The ball was tipped, and Mosley snagged it out of the air.

The giddy celebration hardly seemed possible after a first half in which the Gamecocks did whatever they wanted behind Lattimore. The freshman bounced off Kentucky's would-be tacklers on handoffs or ran past the overmatched defensive ends who had the assignment of covering him on pass routes out of the backfield.

Lattimore came into the game with 81 yards receiving all season. He had 133 in the first half, when the Gamecocks victimized Kentucky's overzealous pass rush by sending Lattimore on wheel routes out of the backfield. Three times Lattimore ran by a Kentucky defender and into the open field, gaining huge chunks of yardage. A 48-yard reception set up his own 10-yard touchdown run, and later added a 47-yard scoring pass in which he sprinted past defensive end Taylor Wyndham then easily sidestepped another Kentucky defender at the 10 before strolling into the end zone.

The score gave the Gamecocks a 28-10 halftime lead, and things could have been worse. South Carolina turned it over three times in the half, and the Wildcats turned two of the miscues into points.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP)—Brian Maddox rushed for a career-high 146 yards and the game-clinching touchdown to lead No. 19 South Carolina to a difficult 21-7 win over Vanderbilt on Saturday night, giving Steve Spurrier his 40th victory with the Gamecocks.

The win snapped South Carolina's seven-game Southeastern Conference road losing streak that dated back to 2008 and put the Gamecocks (5-2, 3-2) in first place in the SEC East. South Carolina had lost two of the last three to Vanderbilt (2-5, 1-3).

Maddox didn't carry the ball until South Carolina's fourth series with about six minutes left in the first half, replacing an ineffective Kenny Miles, who started in place of injured freshman Marcus Lattimore.

His touchdown from two yards out with 4:59 left in the third quarter broke a 7-7 tie and seemed to shake the Gamecocks awake.

A combination of intense first-half pressure on quarterback Stephen Garcia and the Gamecocks' own mistakes kept the Commodores in it most of the way.

South Carolina had drives end on sacks, an errant snap, Casey Hayward's SEC-leading fifth interception and a blocked field goal, among other issues.

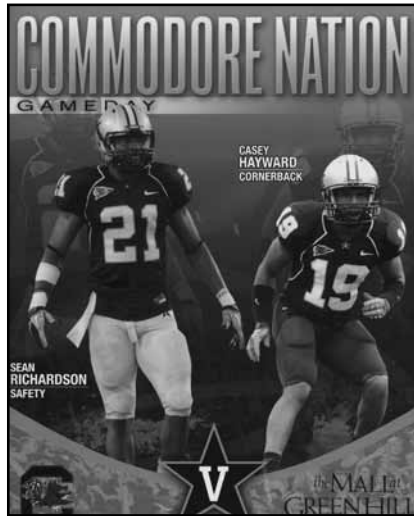
The Commodores' pass defense and intense pressure kept Garcia focused on the short passing game most of the night. Through two-and-a-half quarters he seemed to favor the left flat and Tori Gurley, who had career highs with 14 catches for 112 yards. Vanderbilt had four sacks--half of its season total--and several key hurries in the first half.

It wasn't until Garcia hit a couple of long passes late that things seemed to open up.

First, he found Gurley on a 24-yarder to set up Maddox's touchdown. The second went for a 72-yard touchdown to Alshon Jeffery midway through the fourth quarter to end Vanderbilt's threat.

Jeffery finished with nine catches for 158 yards, giving the Gamecocks two receivers with 100 yards in the same game for the first time since 2006. Garcia also hit Gurley for a 15-yarder on a quick-strike 51-second drive at the end of the first half to tie the game after Larry Smith put Vanderbilt up on a 3-yard run.

Garcia hit 31 of 39 passes for 355 yards a week after throwing for 382 in loss to Kentucky last week.

Alshon Jeffery's 70-yard touchdown catch broke a fourth-quarter tie and kept No. 17 South Carolina in control of the SEC East with a 38-24 victory over Tennessee on Saturday.

The Vols (2-6, 0-5 Southeastern Conference) had rallied back from a 14-point deficit on a pair of touchdown passes from backup quarterback Tyler Bray to tie the game 24-24.

That's when Stephen Garcia found Jeffery in the middle of the field and the SEC's leading receiver outraced three defenders to the end zone with 12:17 to go.

Garcia sealed the win for South Carolina (6-2, 4-2) with his second rushing touchdown, this one from 1-yard out with 3:28 left.

The Gamecocks are the East's only two-loss team. They can clinch their first berth in the SEC title game with wins over Arkansas and Florida in the next two weeks.

South Carolina freshman Marcus Lattimore had a career-high 184 yards and his 11th rushing touchdown in his first start since spraining an ankle in a 31-28 loss at Kentucky two weeks ago.

Things haven't gone well in Tennessee coach Derek Dooley's first season. The Vols were run over by Georgia and Alabama in the past two weeks and Dooley compared his team to German troops watching the Allies' D-Day invasion during World War II.

Tennessee, though, showed it wasn't ready to give up anything to South Carolina with its second-half rally.

The Vols pulled off their first successful fake punt since 2004 as Chad Cunningham ran for 25 yards on fourth-and-10. On the next play, Bray connected with Denarius Moore on a 30-yard scoring pass to pull within a touchdown.

Bray and Moore were at it again on Tennessee's next series. The two combined for a 64-yard reception to the Gamecocks 2 and, after a personal foul penalty pushed the Vols back, Bray hit Gerald Jones for a 17-yard touchdown to tie it up at 24.

That's when South Carolina struck back with Jeffery's catch and run. He had only one reception for five yards until that point.

For Tennessee, Moore had six catches for a career high 228 yards.

It was South Carolina mistakes that kept the Vols in it early on.

The Gamecocks moved 72 yards to the Tennessee 3, but Garcia threw an interception--forcing the ball to the triple-covered Jeffery.

Things tipped back the Gamecocks way in the second quarter when Lattimore carried seven times for 51 yards, the last a one-yard TD run that put South Carolina ahead 10-3.

But Tennessee responded quickly. Matt Simms found Moore for a 13-yard pass on third-and-10 and ended the series with a 12-yard touchdown toss to wide open tight end Luke Stocker.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP)— No. 17 Arkansas showed South Carolina what a Southeastern Conference title contender should look like.

Ryan Mallett threw for 303 yards, Knile Davis tied a career high with three touchdowns and the Razorbacks (7-2, 4-2 SEC) handed 18th-ranked South Carolina its worst home loss in five years, 41-20, on Saturday night.

Despite the hammering, the Gamecocks (6-3, 4-3 SEC) get a shot at the Eastern Division and their first spot in the league title game against Florida at The Swamp next Saturday night.

The Razorbacks scored on four of their five first-half possessions to lead 24-10 at the break, held Gamecocks star runner Marcus Lattimore to 30 yards and gained 140 yards rushing on the SEC's top defense against the run. Knile Davis had 110 yards, including scoring runs of two, 21 and one yard.

The Gamecocks hadn't been beaten this badly at Williams-Brice Stadium since a 37-14 win by Alabama in coach Steve Spurrier's debut season of 2005.

"We didn't have much tonight," Spurrier said. "The way we played, you wonder how we won six games already this year."

Arkansas brought the country's second-best air attack and the league's top passer in Mallett into Williams-Brice. The Razorbacks were missing injured receiver Greg Childs, out for the season with a knee injury, but it didn't slow down Mallett. He got things started with a four-yard TD pass to Cobi Hamilton, who moved into Childs' spot and caught seven passes for 111 yards.

Then it was Davis' turn. The sophomore continually eluded defenders and tied his career high for touchdowns set last month against Ole Miss. And kicker Zach Hocker hit a career-long 51 yard field goal, the Razorbacks longest since 1992.

Spurrier said when Mallett saw the way Gamecock defensive backs played the past month - this was the fourth time in five games they allowed 300 passing yards -- he'd lick his chops. South Carolina's Head Ball Coach wasn't too far off.

Mallett wasted little time torching the Gamecocks secondary. He went 3 of 4 for 50 yards on the Razorbacks opening drive, ending with Hamilton's touchdown.

In the second quarter, Mallett launched a 57-yard throw to a falling Jarius Wright - he easily got behind cornerback C.C. Whitlock - to set up Davis' first rushing TD from 2 yards out.

When the Gamecocks didn't come close on a fake punt try after snapping to upback Dalton Wilson, Mallett and the 'Hogs were at it again. Mallett used passes of six yards to Hamilton and 11 yards to tight end D.J. Williams to set up a 21-yard scoring run along the sidelines by Davis for a 24-7 lead.

The Head Ball Coach notched a huge win at his ol' stomping grounds. After years of being the top Gator, Steve Spurrier led South Carolina to its first division crown in the stadium he nicknamed The Swamp.

Marcus Lattimore ran 40 times for a career-high 212 yards and three touchdowns, Stephen Garcia played turnover-free and the 22nd-ranked Gamecocks upset No. 24 Florida, 36-14, Saturday night to clinch the Southeastern Conference's Eastern Division.

The Gamecocks won for the second time in 19 tries against Florida, snapped an 0-for-12 streak in Gainesville and earned a spot in the league title game for the first time. The Gators lost to a division opponent for the first time in 17 games, dropped their third-consecutive home game and proved they didn't deserve to play for a championship.

South Carolina started celebrating after Garcia's eight-yard TD run early in the fourth that put the Gamecocks ahead 29-7. Players and fans got even more raucous after Lattimore's 11-yard scoring run with 2:43 remaining. Players doused Spurrier with - what else? - Gatorade with 1:01 remaining. Spurrier spent the final few seconds with cameras in his face then got carried to midfield on players' shoulders.

Andre Debose returned the opening kickoff 99 yards for a touchdown, but it was one of the few highlights the Gators could muster.

The first quarter was all anyone needed to watch to see how the game would unfold: The Gators ran 18 plays for 51 yards, failed to convert a third down, punted five times and had five penalties.

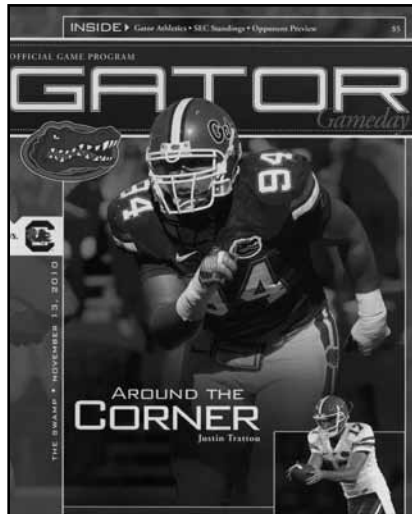
The Gamecocks had to settle for three field goals from Spencer Lanning, who hit from 49, 47 and 41 yards. He also banged an extra point off the left upright following Lattimore's seven-yard touchdown run in the first quarter.

There was little else South Carolina did wrong. Garcia had his first turnover-free game since late September. He completed 15 of 22 passes for 156 yards. He added 28 yards on the ground.

Lattimore, the league's second-leading rusher behind Auburn quarterback Cam Newton, demoralized Florida with every carry. He ran 21 times for 83 yards in the first half, then added a backbreaking, 21-yard TD run to cap South Carolina's opening drive of the second half.

Alshon Jeffrey, the SEC's leading receiver, came up with several key third-down receptions and was Garcia's safety valve. Jeffrey caught six passes for 53 yards. South Carolina finished with 395 yards, 169 more than Florida.

John Brantley took most of the snaps for Florida and completed 16 of 31 passes for 130 yards, with an interception. Trey Burton and Jordan Reed played sparingly. Reed threw a 26-yard TD pass to Chris Rainey late but was stopped short on a fourth-down run near midfield earlier.

Marcus Lattimore had three touchdowns and 102 yards rushing by halftime to lead the 17th-ranked Gamecocks to a 69-24 victory, its biggest point total under Steve Spurrier and the most it has scored in 15 years.

Lattimore and the Gamecocks ended the doubts early as he scored on runs of 17, eight and five yards for a 21-0 lead less than seven minutes in.

The TD surge gave Lattimore 19 touchdowns, surpassing Harold Green's 16 for South Carolina's single-season mark. Lattimore also moved one TD away from the SEC freshman record of 20 set by Tennessee's Reggie Cobb in 1987.

Troy had five turnovers, all which led to touchdowns.

After Troy's DuJuan Harris fumbled the opening kickoff, Lattimore took his first handoff 17 yards for the touchdown. Next possession, he set himself up with a season-long 58 yard run, then ended the series with an eight-yard score. Moments later, Lattimore was in the end zone again with his five-yard romp.

Garcia threw two touchdowns and ran for a third. Even the defense chipped in with safety D.J. Swearinger and defensive end Chaz Sutton both running interceptions back for touchdowns.

Sutton's was a 56-yard bolt as the second quarter ended and put South Carolina ahead 56-7, believed to be the most points the Gamecocks ever scored in a half.

It bettered the Gamecocks previous high for points in Spurrier's six seasons, a 52-7 win over Middle Tennessee State in 2006, and was South Carolina's most points since a 77-14 victory over Kent in 1995.

Lattimore's yardage gave him 1,066 for the season, the first South Carolina rusher to break the 1,000 mark since Derek Watson in 2000.

South Carolina receiver Alshon Jeffery had five catches for 123 yards in the first half for 1,210 on the season. He moved past Sidney Rice's 2005 total of 1,143 for the school's single-season yardage mark. Lattimore and Jeffery became South Carolina's first runner and receiver combo to surpass 1,000 yards each.

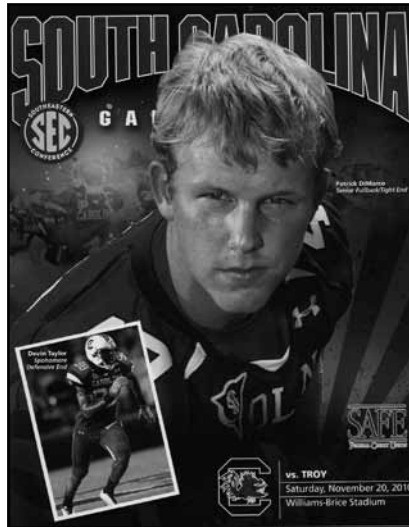
Garcia completed 9 of 12 throws for 198 yards in a half of work.

Troy entered with hopes of catching the Gamecocks peeking too far ahead. Plus, the Trojans are comfortable going toe-to-toe with anyone as shown by their 41-38 loss to current No. 12 Oklahoma State last September.

This time, though, Troy came unglued early. Maybe it was last week's stunning 52-35 loss at home to Florida International that dented hopes of a fifth-straight Sun Belt Conference title. Or maybe it was South Carolina playing free and loose after clinching its division.

Little, though, went right for the Trojans. Harris had his early miscue, then punter Will Goggans fumbled his kick attempt, a turnover that led to Lattimore's third TD.

Quarterback Corey Robinson had the two pick-six interceptions. The Trojans had more yards on kickoff returns than offense (46 to 37) in the first quarter. They were outgained by South Carolina in the half, 320 to 136.

Stephen Garcia threw for two touchdowns, Alshon Jeffery had his seventh 100-yard receiving game and No. 18 South Carolina posted its third nine-win season ever with a 29-7 victory over rival Clemson on Saturday.

In a season of milestones, this was likely one of the sweetest for the Southeastern Conference Eastern Division winners, who beat the Tigers in consecutive games for the first time since 1968-70.

The Gamecocks (9-3) have only won nine games twice before in 117 seasons of football, going 10-2 in 1984 and 9-3 in 2001. And their passing game, led by Garcia and star wideout Jeffery, gave Auburn's secondary something to worry about with next week's SEC championship coming up.

Jeffery had four catches for 126 yards by halftime, including a 37-yard touchdown throw from Garcia.

Clemson (6-6) was held scoreless for the game's final 58 minutes.

South Carolina's already had a landmark season with its first-ever win at Florida and its first divisional crown. Adding a victory at Clemson - its second in the past three trips here - was a satisfying way for the Gamecocks to head into the Georgia Dome for the SEC title game.

A year ago, it was Clemson with bigger things down the road as it brought its ACC Atlantic title into the season-ending rivalry. The Tigers fell in that contest 34-17.

Trailing 7-3, the Gamecocks' Brian Maddox pounced on a ball that got away from Clemson's punter Dawson Zimmerman. Garcia threw a simple screen to fullback Patrick DiMarco on the next play to put the Gamecocks ahead for good.

Jeffery struck for catches of 39 and 37 yards, the last a beautiful post route for a touchdown. It was the first time in seven games Clemson's defense had surrendered two TDs in a game. South Carolina and Jeffery weren't through. He added a 33-yard catch a series later that ended with Lanning's second field goal.

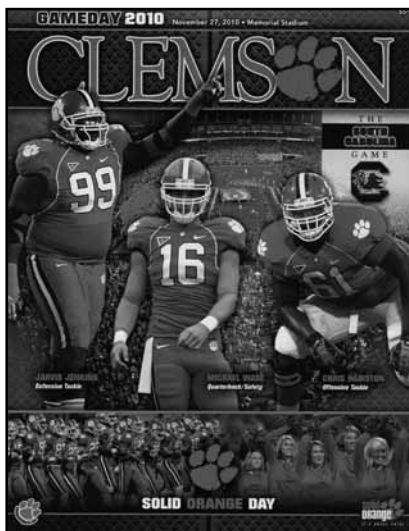
Jeffery's best reception may have been one out of bounds in the third quarter after he tipped up a long pass between two defenders and lunged for the catch that didn't count. He finished with five catches for 141 yards. Garcia was 14 of 30 for 227 yards.

Clemson freshman DeAndre Hopkins ignited the crowd just minutes into the game as he got behind South Carolina's secondary for a 45-yard TD, giving Clemson an early lead.

The Tigers managed just 39 yards of offense the rest of the half, though. Coach Dabo Swinney even brought in injured Andre Ellington, the team's leading rusher who's been out since Oct. 30 with foot problems, for a spell. But he didn't gain any ground, either.

It was a bad end for Kyle Parker, Clemson's two-sport star who gave up \$800,000 in additional money from the Colorado Rockies to play one last season for the Tigers.

But Parker got an earlier exit than expected after Antonio Allen returned an interception 36 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter. Backup Tajh Boyd took over, the second time in two home games Parker, who threw 20 touchdowns a year ago, was benched. Parker was just 7-of-17 for 117 yards.

ATLANTA (AP)—Cam Newton passed for a career-high 335 yards and four touchdowns, plus ran for a pair of TDs in an MVP performance that led No. 2 Auburn to the Southeastern Conference championship with a 56-17 rout of Steve Spurrier and No. 18 South Carolina on Saturday.

The Tigers, who came into the day sitting atop the Bowl Championship Series standings, will be playing Oregon for the national title on Jan. 10 in Glendale, Ariz.

Hard to imagine the Heisman vote even being close after the 6-foot-6, 250-pound junior followed Tim Tebow as only the second player in the history of football's top division to run and pass for 20 touchdowns in a season. He slipped away from defenders with his surprising quickness, buying extra time to throw. He broke tackles with his power, not at all shocking given that he outweighed all three of South Carolina's starting linebackers by at least 25 pounds.

Newton guided the Tigers (13-0) to touchdowns on their first three possessions, though South Carolina (9-4) was in the game as halftime approached. Trailing only 21-14, the Gamecocks simply had to knock down Newton's last-gasp heave on the final play before the break. They couldn't even do that.

Newton launched one up, and 6-foot-2 DeVonte Holloman, standing in front of Terrell Zachery, leaped to tip it away. But the deflected ball went right to Darwin Adams for an improbable 51-yard touchdown that changed the complexion of the game. After South Carolina missed a field goal on the first possession of the second half, it was all Tigers.

In the second half, Newton ran right over Antonio Allen on a one-yard touchdown, sending the linebacker tumbling onto his back to make it 35-14. The Auburn star finished his day with a nifty little seven-yard scoring pass to Emory Blake in the right corner of the end zone for a 49-14 lead.

Auburn will give the SEC a chance to add to its already unprecedented streak of four-straight national titles, which began with Florida in 2006 and was carried on by LSU, Florida again and Alabama last season.

Spurrier was denied another SEC title. The offensive mastermind who led Florida to a half-dozen championships in his 12 years at the Swamp was a flabbergasted, visor-throwing mess on the sideline, watching his team get blown out by an Auburn team that had struggled to beat the Gamecocks in the opening month of the season.

The drama was lacking in this one. It became a full-fledged rout when the defense took aim at South Carolina quarterback Stephen Garcia, whose attempt at flipping away a screen pass under heavy pressure wound up right in the arms of cornerback T'Sharvan Bell, who returned it 10 yards for a touchdown and a 42-14 lead midway through the third period.

The Tigers set an SEC championship game record for scoring and piled up 589 yards. Newton had a hand in 408 of them, breaking his previous best of 317 yards passing against Chattanooga and leading Auburn in rushing with 14 carries for 73 yards. Despite two big drops, Adams set another SEC championship record with 217 yards on seven receptions.

ATLANTA (AP)—EJ Manuel threw a fourth-quarter touchdown pass to stop a South Carolina rally and lead Florida State to a 26-17 victory over the Gamecocks in the Chick-fil-A Bowl.

Manuel took over after senior quarterback Christian Ponder left early in the second quarter with a concussion. The sophomore appears ready to assume the starting role next season.

"I hate it for Christian," Florida State coach Jimbo Fisher said. "He got dinged on the back of his head. He came off, and he was kind of out of it a little bit. I hate that because of what he means to us but EJ, oh boy, I'm glad he's on our team."

Manuel completed 11 of 15 passes for 84 yards and a touchdown and had seven carries for 46 yards. He was 7-for-7 passing on the fourth-quarter touchdown drive.

Dustin Hopkins kicked four field goals for the No. 23 Seminoles (10-4), who reached 10 victories for the first time since 2003. Hopkins tied his own school record for a bowl, and the four field goals also matched the Chick-fil-A Bowl record.

No. 19 South Carolina (9-5), which was seeking its first 10-win season since 1984, lost star running back Marcus Lattimore when he was hit hard on the Gamecocks' first drive. Coach Steve Spurrier's team also committed five turnovers.

"We had (414) yards," Spurrier said. "It wasn't a terrible offensive performance. It was just the turnovers that hurt us."

"Stephen struggled early and then he made some pretty decent throws in the second half," Spurrier said. "It looked like we had a chance to get back in the game."

Garcia recovered to lead two long touchdown drives that trimmed Florida State's lead to 19-17 before Manuel answered with the seven-yard scoring pass to Taiwan Easterling.

"Man, I was so happy," Manuel said. "We weren't moving the ball like we wanted to. We weren't getting touchdowns. We were getting field goals instead."

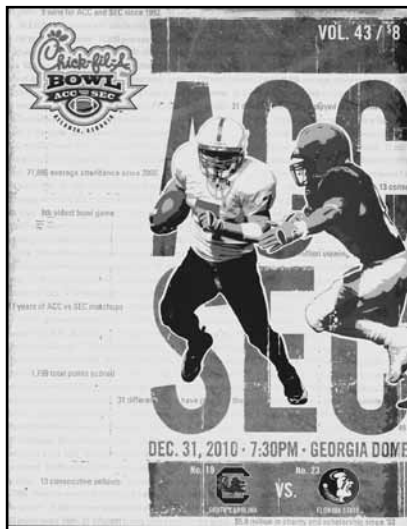
Florida State cornerback Greg Reid, whose hits caused the fumbles by Lattimore and Jeffery, deflected a fourth-down pass by Garcia with 3:23 remaining to end the Gamecocks' last hope.

Garcia completed 19 of 34 passes for 243 yards and also scored on a nifty play in the third. On a third-down play from the Florida State three, Garcia threw a screen pass to Ace Sanders, who threw back across the field to Garcia alone in the right side of the end zone.

The Seminoles answered with Hopkins' fourth field goal, from 45 yards, to push the lead to nine. Hopkins also kicked four field goals in the Seminoles' Gator Bowl win over West Virginia.

Garcia responded by leading a 79-yard drive, capped by Brian Maddox's seven-yard TD run. Garcia helped set up the score with a 29-yard pass to Jeffery.

Reid's hit on Lattimore knocked the freshman out of the game with an injury announced as a cut to his mouth. Spurrier said after the game that Lattimore also had "a little bit of a concussion" and was taken to a hospital for stitches.
