No. 18 South Carolina will spend Thanksgiving in Tallahassee, Fla., as they prepare to face No. 2 Florida State in the program's first-ever NCAA Quarterfinal on Fri., Nov. 28, at 2 p.m. The winner of the match earns a trip to the College Cup as one of the final four teams left standing in this season's NCAA Tournament. There will be no broadcast of the contest, but live stats will be available through NCAA.com.

## SCOUTING FLORIDA STATE

Riding a seven-game win streak and a school record 18-game unbeaten run, Florida State is seeking its third straight trip to the College Cup. Last season's national runner up, the Seminoles returned a bulk of their roster and continued their success this season, posting a 21-1-1 record and a 9-0-1 mark in ACC play. The well-rounded team has scored 62 goals this year while allowing just nine. In conference play, FSU allowed just two goals and has posted seven shutouts in the last nine games. The Seminoles have not been shutout this season.

Dagny Brynjarsdottir leads the team with 16 goals and 36 points. Brynjarsdottir puts nearly 60 percent of her shots on frame and has scored twice in NCAA play. Her fellow Icelandic native Berglind Thorvaldsdottir is just behind her with 11 goals while Cheyna Williams has pocketed a pair of NCAA scores to bring her season total to 10. Florida State is third in the country with 78 assists. Megan Campbell and Carson Pickett lead the way with 12 and 11 helpers, respectively.

Cassie Miller has played every minute in the net, allowing just nine goals this season to rank third nationally in goals against average at 0.38. With a solid backline in front of her, Miller has been forced to make just 41 saves.

## JUST ONCE BEFORE

The Gamecocks and Seminoles have played just once, a 2008 3-3 tie in Auburn, Ala., in the Auburn Soccer Classic. Florida State was ranked No. 7 in the country in the contest.

## HOW THEY GOT HERE

One of the tournament's four No. 1 seeds, FSU earned the ACC's automatic bid after capturing its third conference tournament championship in four seasons. In the opening round, South Alabama kept the Seminoles off the board for the first 44 minutes, but ultimately fell, 5-0, after FSU found the back of the net five times in 34 minutes. Against Northeastern in the second round, the Seminoles returned to the Sweet 16 with a 3-0 decision. Last Sunday, it took nearly 60 minutes of play, but Florida State found the game-winner in a 1-0 contest against Central Florida.

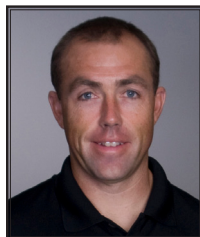

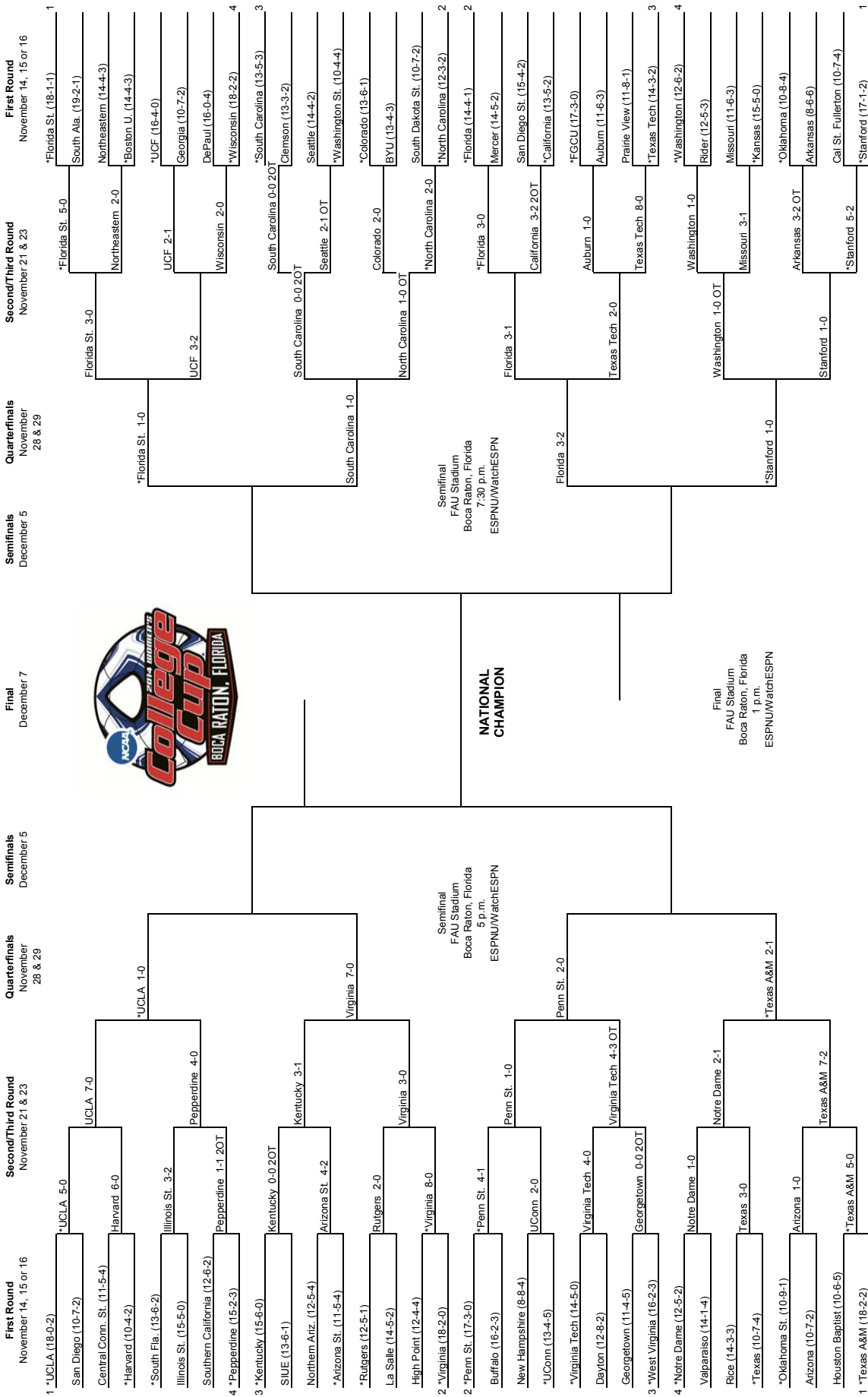

### COMMON GROUND

Both the Gamecocks and Seminoles hosted Florida and took on North Carolina on the road this season. South Carolina went 2-0 against the foes, posting a thrilling 3-2 win over Florida at Stone Stadium on Oct. 16 and advancing to the Elite Eight with a 1-0 win at UNC's Fetzer Field. The matches against the common opponents are the only blemishes on the Seminoles' record. FSU fell to rival Florida, 2-1, at home on Sept. 5 and tied the Tar Heels 1-1 on Oct. 23 in Chapel Hill.

### CRIDER'S DEBUT TURNS HEADS

When All-American goalkeeper Sabrina D'Angelo went down with an injury in training before the weekend, Abbey Crider earned her first career start against Seattle. Logging just 56 minutes this season with all-everything D'Angelo firmly entrenched in front of her, Crider had some big shoes to fill. She rose to the occasion, notching her first career shutout in the double-overtime result vs. Seattle and made two saves in the penalty shootout to help the Gamecocks advance. In the Round of 16, Crider shutout the vaunted Tar Heels in her second career start. The netminder was peppered with five of North Carolina's six second-half shots in the final 15 minutes of play and secured the victory by making a save on a point-blank shot from Paige Broyles. Crider was named to the Top Drawer Soccer National Team of the Week for her shutout weekend.

### STATE OF DEFENSE

In 24 games this season, the Gamecocks have posted 13 shutouts, including three straight in the NCAA Tournament. Just four teams still standing have yet to allow a goal in this season's tournament, South Carolina, Florida State, Virginia and UCLA. The teams match up against each other in two of the national quarterfinals. The Gamecocks have allowed 13 goals this season, good enough for a 0.510 goals against average (8th nationally). Over the last 400 minutes of play, South Carolina has allowed just one goal – an 87th minute strike from Texas A&M in the SEC Semifinals. In the stretch of four games, the Gamecocks have faced three ranked opponents – No. 7 Texas A&M, No. 22 Clemson and No. 6 North Carolina. The lone unranked opponent in the run was Seattle in the NCAA Second Round, a team that boasted the No. 3 offense in the country with 68 goals.

### A STRANGE WAY TO GET HERE

While every other team in the quarterfinals has scored at least seven goals, the Gamecocks have reached the program's first quarterfinal by scoring just one goal. Against bitter rival Clemson, the match seemed destined to go to penalty kicks with a pair of all-conference goalkeepers in between the posts. After 110 minutes of scoreless action and one combined shot on goal, the Gamecocks dispatched the No. 22 Tigers in PKs, 4-3, after Sabrina D'Angelo came up with a pair of saves and all four of her teammates converted their PKs. In the second round, forced to play without D'Angelo, the Gamecocks held Seattle, who had scored 68 goals this season, scoreless, despite playing down a man for both overtime periods. In the shootout, the Redhawks missed two while freshman Abbey Crider, who had stepped in for D'Angelo, saved two. The Gamecocks were not as successful as they were in the week before, but housed two of five opportunities to advance. Against the No. 6 Tar Heels South Carolina found the back of the net for the first time in 366 minutes when Raina Johnson snuck a shot inside the right post. The 23rd minute tally stood up to be Johnson's fourth game-winning goal of the season.

### CLASH OF THE CAROLINAS

In order to make their first-ever NCAA Quarterfinal, the Gamecocks had to go through No. 6 North Carolina, the owners of 21 national championships, on its home field. Playing without the injured Sabrina D'Angelo in goal and Taylor Leach, who was shown a red in the previous match, South Carolina took it to the Tar Heels. In a dominate first half, the Gamecocks found the back of

the net for the first time in 366 minutes of play when Raina Johnson snuck a shot in past Tar Heel keeper Bryane Haeblerin at the right post in the 23rd minute. South Carolina's only goal of the tournament stood up to be the game-winner after the Gamecocks withstood a furious North Carolina attack. Unleashing five of their six second-half shots in the last 15 minutes, the Tar Heels tried to extend the game. The backline deflected a pair of shots and with just 37 seconds on the clock, Joanna Boyles rocketed a point-blank shot towards Abbey Crider. The freshman blocked the shot with her body and wrapped it up to preserve the shutout victory.

### THE ONLY ONES

After the 1-0 win over No. 6 North Carolina in the Round of 16, the Gamecocks are the only NCAA program with an all-time series edge on the Tar Heels. South Carolina now leads UNC, 2-1 all-time and has won two-straight contests at Fetzer Field. After North Carolina routed the Gamecocks 9-1 in 2000, South Carolina leveled the series with a 1-0 decision in the 2007 season opener in Chapel Hill for the program's first win over a top-ranked program. The contest snapped a 27-game Tar Heel winning streak.

### UNCHARTED TERRITORY

In the program's second NCAA Round of 16, the Gamecocks advanced to their first national quarterfinal. Shelley Smith's squad broke new ground in 2009, earning the first national seed in school history and hosting three rounds of the NCAA Tournament. Wake Forest scored in the final seconds of the match to claim a 1-0 win and move on to the Elite Eight. This season, South Carolina has eliminated rival No. 22 Clemson (0-0, 4-3 PKs), the No. 3 offense in the country in Seattle (0-0, 2-1 PKs) and No. 6 North Carolina, the most successful program in the history of women's soccer, to clinch its first quarterfinal berth. This year is the Gamecocks' seventh NCAA Tournament appearance in the last eight years.

### CHANGING OF THE GUARD?

In the last 10 years, no SEC team has advanced out of the Round of 16. In a 90-minute stretch on Sunday, three league teams punched their tickets to the NCAA Quarterfinals. No. 3 seed South Carolina, No. 2 Florida and No. 1 Texas A&M will represent the conference this weekend as they lead the nation with three of the eight teams still standing.

### D'ANGELO, LEACH NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

After earning recognition on the Capital One Academic All-District 4 Team, seniors Sabrina D'Angelo and Taylor Leach moved on to the national ballot. The pair made history as the Gamecocks earned two spots on the All-America team for the first time. D'Angelo garnered a first-team honor while Leach made the third team. The goalkeeper joins fellow netminder Mollie Patton and Blakley Mattern as the program's first-team honorees.

### OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN?

Last Sunday, South Carolina faced an uphill battle when it took the field without either of its senior team captains Sabrina D'Angelo and Taylor Leach in their regular roles. The All-American goalkeeper D'Angelo is not able to play in goal after suffering an arm injury in training last week, but is available as a field player. Leach picked up two yellow cards, one coming in the final minute of regulation, against Seattle in the second round. The cautions meant a red card and the centerback had to sit Sunday's contest. The pair has earned First-Team All-SEC honors the last two seasons. Leach will be back in her normal starting position against the Seminoles.

### SHOOTOUT SUCCESS

After back-to-back shootouts to open the NCAA Tournament, South Carolina has gone to penalty kicks just seven times in program history, advancing on five occasions. In the NCAA Tournament, the Gamecocks are 2-1 in PKs after dispatching Clemson in the first round and Seattle in the second.

### SEATTLE SHOOTOUT

In the second round, the Gamecocks yet again played 110 minutes of scoreless soccer and went to a shootout for the second time in as many games. South Carolina was forced to play a man down for the entirety of overtime after Taylor Leach picked up her second yellow of the match in the 90th minute. The Gamecocks stayed with the same penalty kick order as last week's shootout against Clemson, but the story was not the same. Down 0-1 after the first two rounds, Abbey Crider made a diving save to her right and Lindsey Lane converted to level the contest. Seattle's Kiana Kraft clanked her opportunity off the left post and the Redhawk keeper Brianna Smallidge saved Bay Daniel's shot to keep the score 1-all after four rounds. Crider made a spectacular save to her right on Stephanie Spiekerman's chance and put the game on Chelsea Drennan's foot. The Gamecocks clinched last week's PKs before Drennan had the opportunity to shoot. This week she calmly stepped up to the spot and powered a kick low and left to advance South Carolina to the Round of 16.

### SWEET CAROLINA

Shelley Smith and her team are pleased with the relatively short travel to Chapel Hill, N.C., after long hauls in their previous two NCAA Tournaments. After hosting first round matches in 2011 and 2013, the Gamecocks had to fly across the country for NCAA Second Round matchups. South Carolina played Stanford both years, facing them on their home field in Palo Alto, Calif., in 2011 and in Los Angeles, Calif., at UCLA in 2013. The Cardinal ended the Gamecocks' season in both meetings.

### LOOKING FOR OFFENSE...AGAIN

Somehow, the Gamecocks earned a spot in the Round of 16 without scoring a goal. The South Carolina offense has been shutout in three straight games, unable to find the back of the net in nearly 343 minutes. In the SEC Tournament quarterfinals on Nov. 5, Stevi Parker and Sophie Groff scored in the 2-1 win over Missouri. Since, the Gamecocks faced Texas A&M in the semifinals and despite outshooting the Aggies 10-8, South Carolina couldn't find the back of the net. Texas A&M broke the shutout in the 87th minute to get a 1-0 win. Against Clemson just over a week ago, South Carolina did not manage a shot on goal in 110 minutes of play. In the second round, South Carolina put eight of its 15 shots on frame before again needing PKs to advance. In September, the Gamecocks went just over 200 minutes without a goal after Missouri and then No. 22 Georgia shut them out in back-to-back conference games.

### NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY

After back-to-back draws and a win over North Carolina to reach the quarterfinals, the Gamecocks are 6-6-3 all-time in the NCAA Tournament. Last season, South Carolina picked up a 5-0 win over Furman first round action. Prior to last fall, the Gamecocks' last NCAA Tournament win came in 2011, with a 1-0 win over Texas. South Carolina saw its deepest run in 2009 when the team reached the Round of 16, where the team fell to Wake Forest, 1-0, in the final seconds of regulation at Stone Stadium.

### SWEET REVENGE

In the first round, South Carolina and rival Clemson met for the first time ever in the postseason and delivered the drama. After playing 110 minutes with just one shot on goal between them, the teams went on to penalty kicks. A pair of all-conference first teamers in Gamecock keeper Sabrina D'Angelo and her Canadian compatriot Kailen Sheridan of Clemson, took the line for a shootout. Tied at 2-2 after two rounds, D'Angelo went diving to her right and saved Claire Wagner's attempt. Lindsey Lane consolidated the save with her make to put South Carolina up 3-2. Tiger Jenna Weston and Gamecock Bay Daniel were true in the fourth round to make the score 4-3. Needing a make to stay in the shootout, Gabby Byorth sent the ball right, but D'Angelo read it perfectly tipping it away to advance South Carolina to the second round and avenge an 0-1 regular-season loss.

### FIRST ROUND SHOOTOUTS

Of the 32 first round contests, four matches, including South Carolina-Clemson, went to shootouts. All four rounds of penalty kicks featured nationally seeded teams, with just one unable to advance. Of the No. 3 seeds, South Carolina advanced over Clemson (4-3) and Kentucky over SIUE (4-2) while No. 3 West Virginia could not get past Georgetown (3-4). Pepperdine, a No. 4 national seed, eliminated Southern California 4-2 in its first-round shootout.

### VS. THE FIELD

The Gamecocks played 13 games against 11 teams selected to this year's 64-team field, posting a 7-5-1 mark. South Carolina faced four eventual conference champions - Texas A&M, High Point, Boston University and Florida Gulf Coast - and collected three wins, while posting a draw and a loss against Texas A&M. The Gamecocks also played South Florida, who fell to UCONN in the AAC championship game in PKs, and recorded a win.

### ATTRACTING A CROWD

In 11 home regular-season matches this season, the Gamecocks are third in the nation in average attendance with 2,805, just a handful of people per game behind SEC foe Texas A&M (2,916). Portland leads the country, averaging 2,971 over eight games. A total of 30,853 have come through the gates at Stone Stadium with only one match seeing less than 1,700 fans this season. On Fri., Sept. 5, South Carolina set a program record with 5,855 in attendance at the rivalry match vs. Clemson. The previous regular-season record stood at 3,017 (Clemson, 9/10/10) with the all-time attendance number of 4,347 set vs. Wake Forest in the NCAA Tournament on Nov. 20, 2009. Nine of the 12 2014 contests rank in the top 18 of the program's all-time attendance annals.

In the first round matches, just seven programs posted attendance of over 1,000. The Gamecocks attracted a crowd of 1,344 to post the fifth-best attendance number of last weekend's 32 first-round contests.

**SEC ELITE**

When the 2014 SEC honors were announced on Sunday, the Gamecocks were well represented. Forward Savannah McCaskill became the third SEC Freshman of the Year in program history, joining teammate Sabrina D'Angelo (2011) and Ashley Kirk (2004). McCaskill was also named Second-Team All-SEC and All-Freshman. For the second-straight season, senior team captains Sabrina D'Angelo and Taylor Leach earned First-Team All-SEC recognition after anchoring the defense as they led the league in nearly every major statistical category including goals allowed (11), goals against average (0.58), shots on goal allowed (60) and points allowed (31). The South Carolina backline limited 10 of its 11 league opponents to 5 shots on goal or less. D'Angelo, a two-time SEC Defensive Player of the Year (2011, 2013), has earned All-SEC honors all four years of her career in the Garnet and Black and boasts a career goals against average of .779.

**ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT**

Senior team captains Sabrina D'Angelo and Taylor Leach were named to the Capital One Academic All-District 4 Team, as selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) in October. With the pair's selection, the Gamecocks have had at least one player make the Academic All-District Team in 10 of the last 11 years. The announcement marked the second recognition for D'Angelo and the first for Leach.

**1-0 WOES**

All five of the Gamecocks' losses - vs. Clemson, vs. Missouri, vs. Georgia, at Kentucky, vs. Texas A&M - have been 1-0 decisions, despite the fact that South Carolina has outshot its opponents 54-40 in the contests. The matches are the only five times this season that the Gamecocks have been scored upon first. South Carolina has come from behind to win just once this season, a 2-1 double-overtime victory at Auburn in the SEC opener.

**SAD TO SEE YOU GO**

At the end of the regular season, South Carolina honored one of the most accomplished senior classes in Gamecock history. The group of Sabrina D'Angelo, Taylor Leach, Christa Neary and Andie Romness has made an impact since arriving on campus, combining for over 25,000 minutes of play and 277 starts. With the trio of defenders and goalkeeper manning the backline, the Gamecocks have earned 37 shutouts and 53 total wins. In their freshman season, South Carolina captured the 2011 SEC regular season championship. Last year, they led the Gamecocks to the first perfect record at Stone Stadium, posting an 11-0 mark. The team has been in the top 25 for 25 weeks while the foursome has been South Carolina's main line of defense. The group became the first team ever to win back-to-back matches on the road at Florida and posted the first win over a top-5 opponent at Stone Stadium in a thrilling 3-2 victory over the No. 5 Gators on Oct. 16.

**McCASKILL MAKES HISTORY**

After her two-goal performance in the 3-2 win over No. 5 Florida on Oct. 13, freshman Savannah McCaskill earned her second SEC Freshman of the Week recognition, becoming the first Gamecock to receive multiple nods in their rookie season. In the thrilling 3-2 win over the Gators, McCaskill doubled her season goal total, netting a pair of tallies, including the 89th minute game-winner, Thursday night. McCaskill won the match on a bouncing header off a corner kick service from Chelsea Drennan after scoring her first goal of the night in the 34th minute. McCaskill has posted three of her four goals in conference play and is now tied for the team lead in both goals (4) and points (11). The freshman was also an honorable mention for the TopDrawerSoccer.com National Team of the Week.

**GATOR TALES**

The Oct. 16 win over No. 5 Florida was a historic Gamecock victory. South Carolina record consecutive wins over the Gators for the first time in program history a year after becoming the first team to post consecutive victories at Florida's James G. Pressly Stadium. The win was the first over a top-5 opponent since a 2007 1-0 decision at No. 1 North Carolina and was the first at Stone Stadium. It was just the second time South Carolina had prevailed over Florida at Stone Stadium and just the fifth time in the all-time series.

**OFFENSIVE OUTBURST**

After scoring just four goals in their first six conference matches, the Gamecocks exploded for five in one weekend in the 3-2 win over No. 5 Florida and 2-0 shutout over Ole Miss. South Carolina had scored three goals just once this season (a 3-0 win at USF) before the SEC Network tilt vs. the Gators.

**D'ANGELO NAMED SENIOR CLASS AWARD FINALIST**

After being selected as one of 30 semifinalists in August, senior goalkeeper Sabrina D'Angelo was named one of 10 finalists for the 2014 Senior CLASS Award in women's collegiate soccer in mid-October. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in



School, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. The finalists were chosen by a media committee from the list of 30 women's candidates announced in September. Nationwide fan voting begins immediately to help select the winner. Fans are encouraged to vote on the Senior CLASS Award website through November 24. Fan votes will be combined with media and Division I head coaches' votes to determine the winner. The Senior CLASS Award winners will be announced during the 2014 NCAA Men's and Women's College Cup® championships in December.

#### **STABILITY AND DEPTH**

The Gamecocks have seen little change this season, employing the same starting lineup for the first 11 matches of the season. In the match vs. Alabama (Oct. 3), South Carolina made a change at one of the forward spots, moving junior Coryn Bajema, who missed the first four matches due to injury, into the lineup in sophomore Sophie Groff's place. Seven other players have logged minutes in each contest with a total of 24 Gamecocks logging minutes this season. The long bench has allowed South Carolina to combat the challenges of the Friday-Sunday weekends, especially in the attack and at outside back.

#### **LOOKING FOR OFFENSE**

South Carolina found the back of the net for the first time in over 200 minutes on a header from Savannah McCaskill in the 24th minute at Alabama (Oct. 3). It was the first time the Gamecocks had scored since Stevi Parker notched the game-winner in the 100th minute at Auburn on Sun., Sept. 21. The following match, a Sunday afternoon contest vs. LSU on Oct. 5, the Gamecocks broke a nearly 300-minute scoring drought at The Graveyard. South Carolina had not scored at home since the first half of a 2-0 win over High Point on Sun., Sept. 7. Daija Griffin stopped the dry spell in the 75th minute with the game-winner. The Gamecocks have been shutout in all three of their losses, posting 0-1 results to Clemson, Missouri and No. 22 Georgia. South Carolina outscored its opponents 15-1 in the non-conference slate, but has posted just four goals in conference play.

#### **HOME SWEET HOME**

"The Graveyard" has proven to be a friendly place for the Gamecocks recently. In 2013 as they streaked to a perfect 11-0-0 record at home, the first in program history. With a 2-1 win over SEC foe Kentucky, the 2013 squad became the first team to win 10 regular season games at Stone Stadium. They added another against Furman in the NCAA Tournament to push the streak to 11, tying the 2009 (11-1-0) squad with the most home wins in school history. South Carolina's stingy defense allowed just four goals in 11 home matches. With shutout wins over Samford, No. 22 Boston University in overtime and Milwaukee to open the 2014 home slate, the Gamecocks stretched the streak to 14, the longest win streak in school history. South Carolina was stopped just short of the record 15-match unbeaten streak at Stone Stadium, falling to Clemson 1-0 on Sept. 5, 2014.

#### **200**

In her 18th season as a head coach, South Carolina's Shelley Smith collected her 200th career victory over Milwaukee on Aug. 31, 2014. The second head coach in Gamecock history has posted 163 of her now 204 career wins at the helm of the Garnet and Black. Her 14-year career in Columbia has featured both an SEC tournament (2009) and regular-season championship (2011).

#### **D'ANGELO, LEACH NAMED CANDIDATES FOR SENIOR CLASS AWARD**

Goalkeeper Sabrina D'Angelo and center back Taylor Leach have been selected as two of thirty candidates for the 2014 Senior CLASS Award in women's collegiate soccer. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. South Carolina is one of just three schools to have a pair of candidates on the list.

#### **D'ANGELO, McCASKILL GARNER RECOGNITION IN WEEK 4**

For their performances in a pair of shutout road victories over USF and FGCU in Tampa, Fla., senior goalkeeper Sabrina D'Angelo and freshman forward Savannah McCaskill earned SEC weekly honors. D'Angelo posted her 25th and 26th career shutouts over the weekend and collected a season-high seven saves against USF. D'Angelo was also named National Defensive Player of the Week by College Sports Madness and was an honorable mention on the TopDrawer-Soccer.com Team of the Week. McCaskill scored her much-awaited first career goal in the 82nd minute against FGCU. She also recorded an assist against USF for her first multi-point weekend of the season.

#### **D'ANGELO EARNS HER FIRST SEC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

A two-time SEC Defensive Player of the Year, Sabrina D'Angelo earned her first SEC Defensive Player of the Week for her shutout efforts against No. 22 Boston University and Milwaukee in Week 2. D'Angelo recorded her 22nd and 23rd career shutouts (second in school history). After shutout performance over the ranked Terriers, D'Angelo came up big when it mattered. Faced with an early Milwaukee penalty kick, the senior keeper kept the shutout streak alive with a diving save to her right. The save ignited a run that led to the Gamecocks' first goal of the day less than three minutes later. The pair of wins extended the home winning streak to a program-best 14, captured head coach Shelley Smith's 200th career victory and won the Garnet & Black Classic Title. The Gamecocks are the only SEC team to not allow a goal this season. D'Angelo was named SEC Freshman of the Week in October of 2011.

**SHUTOUT START**

With a pair of 2-0 wins at East Carolina and at home over Samford to open the season followed by a 1-0 double-overtime thriller against No. 22 Boston University and a 2-0 decision over Milwaukee, South Carolina opened the season with four-consecutive shutouts for the second-straight season. The Gamecocks allowed just 11 total shots in their first four matches, fewest in the SEC, and was the only league team that did not allow a point in the first four matches of the 2014 season.

**LEACH RECOGNIZED NATIONALLY OPENING WEEKEND**

TopDrawerSoccer.com named Leach to their Team of the Week after the center back provided the offense in the season opener at East Carolina, scoring a pair of set-piece goals in the 2-0 win. The match marked her first career multi-goal game. The senior also helped captain the Gamecocks' defense to back-to-back shutouts to start the season for the second-straight year. The unit allowed just three shots over the course of the opening weekend, the fewest in the league, and is one of three SEC teams that has yet to allow a point.

**WATCHING D'ANGELO**

A year after becoming the first MAC Hermann semifinalist in program history, Sabrina D'Angelo begins the season on the 2014 MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List. Of the 35 players on the 2014 watch list, D'Angelo is one of four who were semifinalists last season. In 2013, the Canadian had one of the best seasons for a keeper in South Carolina history, recording 12 shutouts and posting a 0.59 goals against average while anchoring the SEC's top defense. Her 12 shutouts led the conference and ranked seventh nationally. In two games against top-10 competition in 2013, D'Angelo stood her ground against 22 shots to produce eight saves and allow only one goal to help the Gamecocks defeat two top-10 opponents in a season (No. 7 Duke, 1-0; at No. 8 Florida, 2-1 2OT) for the first time in program history.

**77.3**

South Carolina returns eight of 11 starters and 77.3 percent of its scoring from the record-breaking 2013 campaign. 2013 leading scorer Raina Johnson netted 10 goals and an assist last season. Johnson's five game-winning goals is the second-most in a season in South Carolina history. The Gamecocks' top distributor

Chelsea Drennan is back for her sophomore season after dishing out 12 assists to set a freshman single season record in 2013. Six of Drennan's set-ups led to a game-winning tally, a single-season record.

**PRESEASON SEC**

The SEC coaches selected South Carolina to finish third in the league, with Florida and Texas A&M topping the table. Last season, the Gamecocks finished behind co-champions Florida and Texas A&M. Four Gamecocks were named to the SEC Preseason Watch List – senior goalkeeper Sabrina D'Angelo, senior centerback Taylor Leach, sophomore midfielder Chelsea Drennan and freshman midfielder Savannah McCaskill. D'Angelo is a two-time SEC Defensive Player of the Year (2011, 2013) and has been an All-SEC honoree each season of her career in the Garnet and Black. Leach joined D'Angelo on the All-SEC First Team and Drennan earned an SEC All-Freshman nod. McCaskill enters the season as a four-star prospect.

**NATIONAL RESPECT ON THE RISE**

The Gamecocks start the season ranked in various polls after the program earned its second top-15 final ranking in school history last year. The NSCAA has South Carolina at the No. 14 spot in their preseason poll, the highest for the Gamecocks since entering the 2010 season at No. 12. South Carolina is one of three SEC teams in the poll with Florida at No. 8 and Texas A&M at No. 9. TopDrawerSoccer.com has Shelley Smith's program at No. 9 in their preseason rankings.
