CAROLINA QUICK HITS

- South Carolina is in its 36th season of varsity soccer in 2013.
- South Carolina head coach Mark Berson is in his 37th season overall and his 36th season as head coach of the Gamecocks. He is assisted by former players Spencer Lewis and Joey Worthen, both in their second season. Tim O'Toole is the volunteer assistant coach.

SCOUTING UAB

No. 10 UAB has put together an impressive season, boasting an 11-3-1 overall record and a 4-2-1 mark in C-USA. The Blazers have dropped just one of their eight home matches this season including a victory over defending NCAA Champion and then-No. 8 Indiana 2-1 in overtime in Birmingham on September 6. The lone loss was a 0-1 defeat at the hands of East Tennessee State on September 15.

UAB is coming off a 3-4 loss at New Mexico on Wednesday in a match between two of the top-three teams in the league. The Lobos converted a penalty kick with seven seconds remaining in regulation for the victory. Junior midfielder Alex Clay netted two goals in the match for the Blazers.

A pair of forwards leads the offensive effort. Sophomore Freddy Ruiz paces the offense with 24 points on 11 goals and two assists while junior Diego Navarrete adds 19 points on six goals and a team-leading seven assists. After his two-goal performance against the Lobos, Clay has 18 points on six goals and six assists. Entering the New Mexico match, the Blazers' offense led the country in scoring, averaging 2.43 goals a game.

Between the posts, Raphael Ville has played in all 15 matches for the Blazers and boasts 52 saves, four shutouts and a 1.00 goals against average. Despite being outshot by their opponents 210-167, UAB is outscoring their opponents 37-16.

Last season, South Carolina fell to then-No. 25 UAB 3-4 in Stone Stadium. Current Gamecocks Jeffrey Torda and Braeden Troyer scored for the Gamecocks. Asa Kryst was credited with an assist.

LAST WEEK'S ACTION

- The Gamecocks battled FIU to a scoreless draw on Wednesday, October 30. Freshman keeper Marco Velez collected five saves in the conference match. With the result, South Carolina picked up one point in the league race.
- In the 92nd minute, freshman forward Eli Dent scored an unassisted goal to lift the Gamecocks over No. 25 New Mexico on Saturday, Oct. 26. The 1-0 upset win was the first C-USA defeat for New Mexico, who is in their first year in the league. South Carolina limited the Lobos to just three shots on goal in the contest. Posting his third shutout of the season, freshman keeper Marco Velez was honored by C-USA as Defensive Player of the Week. The win was the Gamecocks' first in overtime and the first victory over a ranked opponent this season.

■ Head coach Mark Berson collected his 450th victory at the University of South Carolina in an overtime victory over No. 25 New Mexico on Saturday, Oct. 26. He is just the fourth Division I head coach to post 450 victories at one institution. On Nov. 1, 2011, Berson collected his 450th career win in a double overtime victory over No. 22 UCF in Orlando, Fla., becoming the eighth Division I coach all-time to reach the 450-win career milestone.

AT STONE STADIUM

■ The Gamecocks have just one of their 11 regular-season contests remaining at Stone Stadium this season. The Gamecocks completed the 2013 non-conference slate with a 3-0-2 undefeated home record. Only three other teams in C-USA did the same, Florida Atlantic (4-0-0), Tulsa (3-0-0) and Kentucky (2-0-0).

SCORING ON SET PIECES

■ Of the Gamecocks' 19 goals this season, 10 of the tallies have come directly (8) or indirectly (2) as a result of a set piece. Kaba and Arambula are the usual suspects, connecting four times for a score this season. Kaba's team-leading fifth goal was on a rebound from a shot attempt created from a corner kick.

OVERTIME MATCHES

■ In its 16 regular-season matches, South Carolina has played eight overtime matches. Five have resulted in ties, and two of the Gamecocks' losses have come in extra minutes. Five of seven conference games this season have gone to extra time.

EARLIER CONFERENCE USA ACTION

■ Trailing 0-1 on the road at Marshall on Saturday, Oct. 19, senior midfielder J.P. Rafferty scored the equalizer in the 54th minute on a header. Ultimately, the Gamecocks and Herd tied 1-1 after 110 minutes of play. Freshman Kurtis Turner recorded his fourth assist of the season on the play, setting up Rafferty on a long cross off of a free kick. Turner broke into the Gamecock all-time top 10 for assists by a freshman. After the weekend, Rafferty and Turner are currently second and third on the team in points with seven and six, respectively.

■ Turner put the game-winning goal away in the 87th minute on Wednesday, Oct. 16, in a home conference match against FAU. The tally was Turner's first career goal in the Garnet and Black. The Gamecocks also scored on a penalty kick from junior defender Braeden Troyer in the first half in the 2-1 victory.

■ The Gamecocks surrendered a 1-0 lead to No. 23 Tulsa on Sunday, Oct. 6. The Golden Hurricane scored the game-winner with three seconds on the clock in the first overtime period of the match. Junior defender Mahamoudou Kaba scored on a header from a corner kick from sophomore midfielder Ryan Arambula. The goal capped a three-goal week for Kaba after scoring two in the non-conference finale against Presbyterian earlier in the week.

■ In a road match against Kentucky on Sunday, Oct. 13, South Carolina collected one point in the C-USA race. The Gamecocks and Wildcats tied 0-0 after 110 minutes of action.

■ South Carolina's first road win of the season could not have come at a better time. The Gamecocks scored two unanswered goals to defeat (RV) Charlotte 2-1 on Friday, Sept. 27. Junior defenders Mahamoudou Kaba and Braeden Troyer provided the offense. Troyer's unassisted gamewinner came off a rebound from a corner kick in the 81st minute. Prior to the Gamecocks' two tallies, the 49ers had allowed just four goals over the course of their first seven matches of the season. Freshman keeper Marco Velez earned his first career win in the Garnet and Black.

NON-CONFERENCE FINALE

■ Junior defender Mahamoudou Kaba scored twice against Presbyterian in the midweek non-conference finale for the first multi-goal game of his career.

■ Freshman forward Eli Dent recorded his first career start and goal in the match against Presbyterian. Dent scored an unassisted tally in the 40th minute of the match.

GAMECOCK CLASSIC

■ In the 27th edition of the Gamecock Classic on Sept. 20 and 22, South Carolina played 220 minutes of soccer and finished the weekend 0-0-2. Sophomore midfielder Jeffrey Torda scored his second goal of the season in the fifth minute against USF, but the Bulls tied the match and played out to a 1-1 tie on Friday, Sept. 20. Less than 48 hours later, the Gamecocks faced Dartmouth and again went the distance, this time playing to a 0-0 draw. South Carolina outshot their opponents 36-20 over the course of the weekend.

NON-CONFERENCE ACTION

- To end their three-game road stretch, the Gamecocks dropped a Sunday afternoon contest 0-3 at Rutgers on Sept. 15.
- South Carolina faced No. 12 St. John's on Friday, Sept. 13, without Conference-USA preseason honoree Troyer (suspension for red card vs. Coastal Carolina) and starting keeper Robert Beebe (injury). The teams played 60 scoreless minutes before the Red Storm recorded a tally for the 1-0 win. The Gamecocks faced a 7-2 shot deficit at the half, but ultimately outshot St. John's 12-11. Velez notched his first career start in Beebe's place between the posts.
- Freshman Ive Burnett scored his first career goal for the Garnet and Black in the fourth minute against Coastal Carolina on Tues., Sept 10. The Gamecocks couldn't hold on to the early 1-0 lead and dropped the road match 1-3.
- Senior J.P. Rafferty recorded the first multi-goal game of his career on Friday, Sept. 6, in a 5-2 win over High Point. Rafferty's two second-half goals came within 15 minutes of each other. Freshman Kurtis Turner scored the first points of his Gamecock career against High Point, assisting on three goals in the non-conference win.
- The five South Carolina goals against High Point are the most scored by the Gamecocks since a 5-2 road win at East Carolina on Oct. 5, 2005.
- South Carolina came from behind, but ultimately fell to Clemson 2-1 in double overtime on Sept. 2. Kaba scored the first goal of his career on a header off a Ryan Arambula corner kick to level the match in the second half. Clemson tallied the golden goal in the 102nd minute for the win.
- The Gamecocks improved to 30-5-1 in season openers with a 1-0 shutout victory over East Tennessee State on Aug. 30. Torda netted the unassisted gamewinner in the 26th minute.

EXHIBITION PLAY

- South Carolina posted two shutouts in exhibition play this season, a 1-0 win over Mercer and a 2-0 win over Elon.
- Three different Gamecocks scored during preseason play, junior forward Asa Kryst, sophomore midfielder Jeffrey Torda and senior midfielder J.P. Rafferty.
- The Garnet and Black posted 31 shots in the pair of matches, with a decided 23-6 advantage over Mercer. The Gamecocks preferred quality over quantity against Elon, putting seven of their eight shots on frame.

PRESEASON NOTES

- Nine newcomers (seven freshmen and two transfers) join 15 letterwinners and four starters from the 2012 squad.
- Junior Braden Troyer was selected to the Preseason All-Conference USA squad in August. Last season, the Columbia, S.C., native earned second-team all-conference honors, was named to the Capital One Academic All-District 4 Team and earned a spot on the C-USA All-Academic Team.
- Last season, the Gamecocks finished 5-11-2 (2-5-1 C-USA), a year removed from earning a share of the 2011 Conference USA Regular Season championship after a 6-1-1 conference campaign.

UP NEXT FOR THE GAMECOCKS

South Carolina is off for six days before the final regular season match of the season on Saturday, Nov. 9. The home finale against league leader No. 24 Old Dominion is set for a 7 p.m. kick in Stone Stadium. Senior Day festivities will take place before the match.
