Outlook

Gamecocks prepared for promising 2011 campaign

The 2011 cross country season holds much promise for the Gamecocks. The top five returners all ran PRs during the 2011 track season. No. 1 runner, Senior Beatrice Biwott, ran 9:39 indoors, 17:13 for the 5K outdoors and once again was an NCAA qualifier in the 3K steeplechase, where she placed fourth in the SEC and missed qualifying for the NCAA Finals by four seconds.

Sophomore Penny Boswell, dropped her 5K PR from 19:20 to 17:49. Senior Nicole Rheinlander improved from 18:32 to 17:57. Sophomore Liz Locke improved her 5K PR from 19:10 to 18:20, and sophomore Scola Jepngetich dropped to 18:18 and a track PR of 2:10 in the 800.

The race to make the final varsity Southeastern Conference squad will have many competitors, giving the team much depth. Sophomore Sierra Henderson, a 2:10 runner on the track, was in the top seven in 2010 and has run 18:41 for a 5K race. Senior Erin Fedewa has had a good summer of training and was a top seven runner her first two years on the team. Junior Jessie Hartman had big PRs on the track in the 5K and 1500 during the 2010 season. Hartman has trained very well this summer and should be able to drop her 5K times into the low 18s.

Junior Laura Beggs returns from an illness that knocked her out of cross country last season. As a freshman, Beggs was in the team's top seven. She is healthy and is expected to once again be one of the team's top runners and run in the 18s in the 5K. Sophomore Rachel Grochowski is also returning from an abbreviated cross country season. Grochowski has PRs in the low 11s and mid 18s from high school and will be a good addition to the team's depth.

The 2011 signing class is made up of 11 student-athletes. Leading

the class are several runners who will fight for top 10 spots and the chance to race at the SEC Cross Country Championships.

Kayla Lampe from Downingtown, Pa., has the fastest high school PRs, running 11:18 and 18:28. Lampe was a top finisher in the state meet, with a high placing of 12th in the large school class in Penn-sylvania. Bryttin Boyd from Magnolia, Texas, improved her two-mile PR 45 seconds in 2011 to 11:36. She has also raced in the 18s in 5K road races. Transfer sophomore Kelly Newcomb ran 18:55 during the indoor track season and freshmen Alex Mullin from Chattanooga, Tenn., Jessica Muse from Roswell, Ga. and Carolyn Batke from Chagrin Falls, Ohio have all run in the low 19s.

The 2011 meet schedule is a mix of local and national meets. Following the Gamecock Invitational, the Gamecocks will compete in the Winthrop Invitational. The team will then travel to Minnesota for the prestigious Griak Invitational. The Griak meet will showcase a dozen nationally ranked teams and another dozen regionally ranked teams, making it one of the strongest fields in the country. Following the Griak Invitational is the Charlotte Invitational on the Foot Locker South course. The B team will then race at the Furman Invitational before the varsity travels to Indiana for the NCAA Preview race at Indiana State, host of the NCAA Championships. This race will also have a field of nationally and regionally ranked teams, helping the Gamecocks prepare for the grueling SEC Championships, which follows.

Tennessee will host the SEC Championships on Monday, Oct. 31, followed by the NCAA Southeast Region Championship race in Louisville, Ky. The NCAA finals are November 21 in Terre Haute, Ind.

Morgan Allman Freshman • McDonough, Ga. Marine Science

Morgan joins the gamecocks as a freshman with a passion for running. She began running her sophomore year of high school and quickly made a name for herself. Morgan acquired seven variety letters in cross country (three), swimming (one), and track and field (three). She also captained both the cross country and track teams her junior and senior year, holds the school records for the 800 and mile, and was a national qualifier in the 800.

While at USC Morgan plans to major in marine science and continue to improve in running as much as she can. Morgan is the daughter of Danny and Suzanne Allman and is the sister of Logan and Brandee.



Carolyn Batke Freshman • Novelty, Ohio Liberal Arts McKissick Scholar

Carolyn graduated from The Laurel School where she earned seven varsity letters, four in cross country and three in lacrosse. Carolyn was captain of her high school's cross country team for three years. She was a member of league and district championship teams in 2008, 2009, and 2010. She was a member of her high school team's regional runner-up team in 2007, 2008, and 2010. Carolyn was awarded MVP for her high school team all four years.

Outside of school, Carolyn enjoys doing community service work. She has traveled to Honduras the past two summers to help teach English to the boys of the Flor Azul orphanage.



Laura Beggs Junior • Frankfort, III. Journalism McKissick Scholar / Honors College

As a freshman, Laura was a constant top ten runner for the Gamecocks. She improved her PR by almost 30 seconds, running in the low 19's during cross country. During her Sophomore season, Beggs was stuck down with an illness, that caused her to miss so much training she was redshirted. With the good summer of training, Coach Rosenthal expects Laura will run in the 18's during this fall.

Laura earned four varsity letters in cross country and three in track and field. Laura was a member of the cross country conference championship teams in 2005, 2006, 2007, and 2008, and also helped her team earn regional championships in 2006, 2007, and 2008 and a sectional win in 2008. She was a three-time state qualifier in cross country and ran a three mile PR of 18:20. Laura was the cross country team's MVP her junior year and served as the team's co-captain her sophomore, junior, and senior years. She also qualified for state in the 3200 meter in track her junior year.

Laura was a Scholar-Athlete, a member of National Honors Society, Pi Sigma Pi, Mu Alpha Theta, and Key Club. She also participated and served as the squad leader on the Poms dance team at her high school both freshman and sophomore years. Laura was named an Illinois State Scholar, and was her school's nominee for the Illinois State All Academic Team. Her parents are Edward and Emily Beggs.



Beatrice Biwott Senior • Iten, Kenya Public Health

Biwott has been the teams No. 1 runner the past three years. Coach Rosenthal expects her to lead the team once more. Her leadership by example will be a very important factor in leading the Gamecocks to continued improvement.

Biwott won two meets during the 2010 season, the Gamecock Invite and the Winthrop Invitational. During the 2011 track season, Beatrice set many new PR's. Indoors she ran 17:13 in New York City's Armory track. She also run 9:39 for the 3K at Texas A&M indoors. Outdoors the highlight was qualifying for the NCAA's for the third consecutive year. 2011 will be here best season yet. Her goals are to be top ten at the SEC and race for an NCAA qualifying spot during the NCAA Southeast Regional Championship.

Beatrice is a member of the PANASA (Pan-African Student Organization) at South Carolina. The organization empowers students on tackling issues affecting African communities.



Emma Borowicz Junior • Greenville, S.C. International Business/Marketing

Emma starts her junior season for the Gamecocks. She has been a successful runner in South Carolina for the past six years. She was an 11-letter varsity athlete in high school, competing in swimming (2), cross country (5), and track (4). Emma was a member of a five-time state championship track team, making all-state each year in the 4x800 meter relay (9:36), the 1600 meter run (5:12), and the 3200 meter run (11:33), and a four-time state runner-up on the cross country team, making all-state all four years. Her best 5k time is 19:05. Emma's first and second yearsas a South Carolina Gamecock have been troubled by injuries after racing only three races in cross country and three races in track.Emma is coming in for her junioryear injury free and is ready to get back in to the racing world.

Emma finished her freshman year at South Carolina with a 3.93 GPA, a 4.0 in the fall semester and a 3.8 in the spring. Rounding out her sophomore year, Emma was accepted into the Moore School of Business International Business program and finished with a GPA of 3.8. In addition to running, Emma enjoys cooking, hanging out with friends, and singing.

Her parents are Jackie and Eric Borowicz. She has three siblings: a twin sister at Clemson University (Kate), an older sister at Clemson University (Sarah), and a younger brother at J.L. Mann Academy (Robert).




Penny Boswell Sophomore • Canal Winchester, Ohio Exercise Science McKissick Scholar

Penny was the teams seventh runner during cross country. It was during the track season, that she really blossomed. Indoors Boswell dropped her 3K PR to 10:35. Outdoors is where she really shined, as Penny lowered her 5K PR from 19"20 down to 17:49. With her huge improvements, Coach Rosenthal expects her to be a top racers for the Gamecocks and to set a great example for the incoming class, what can be accomplished with hard work.

Boswell earned four varsity letters in cross country and three in track and field at Canal Winchester High School. She also earned a varsity letter in track from Vicenza American High School in Italy, where she spent her Senior Spring semester. She helped Canal win three league championships and qualify for the Ohio State Cross Country Meet three years in a row. Penny is a two-time state qualifier herself in cross country and has made All-Ohio honors twice. Her teammates voted her Most Valuable Player in 2006 and 2008.

In track, Penny was part of her school's record holding 4x800m team. She helped her team win two league titles. Penny finished her high school running career as the 3000m and 1500m Department of Defense Dependents Schools European Track and Field Champion.

Her parents are Robert and Julie Boswell. She has two brothers, Jack who attends the Virginia Military Institute, and Joe who attends Vicenza American High School.

Bryttin Boyde Freshman • Magnolia, Texas Anthropology/Journalism McKissick Scholar/Honors College

Bryttin joins the Gamecocks as a freshman with a love for distance running. She competed all four years of high school in both cross country and track, becoming a seven-letter varsity athlete. Bryttin was a member of the 2010 State Qualifying cross country team (the first in her high school's history), and the 2009 and 2010 Regional Qualifying cross country teams. She also advanced to Regionals individually her sophomore year during the 2008 cross country season. Bryttin was also an all-district finisher her sophomore and junior seasons in cross country, and her junior and senior seasons in track. Additionally, she was named an All-District Academic athlete for three years in high school.

Among other honors, Bryttin captained her cross country and track team both her junior and senior seasons, was named as one of the Texas State Farm Scholar Athletes for 2010, and was named as the All-Montgomery County Scholar Athlete of the Year for Cross Country in 2010.

Bryttin was a Scholar-Athlete and a member of the National Honor Society. She was also named as an AP Scholar and graduated as Valedictorian for the Magnolia HS class of 2011.

Bryttin hopes to pursue her studies both inside the classroom and abroad, gaining anthropological knowledge from all over the globe. Her parents are Ben and Nicole Boyde, and she has a younger brother, Brayson, currently at Magnolia High School.



Ginsie Britton Freshman • Milton, Ga. Exercise Science Woodrow Scholar

Ginsie comes to Carolina after only running for two years at Milton High School but has found a huge love for running and racing. Before running she rode horses competitively for 10 years and was on the Area three Young Rider Team.

During the last year of riding, she severely broke her ankle and for three years was on and off crutches until surgery during her sophomore year of high school. The following year, her junior year, is when she began running and quickly made progress.

She was a four time Scholar-Athlete and received four varsity letters, two in cross country and two in track. Her senior year she was all-county for Fulton County in cross country and helped her team win their first region cross country championship title in school history on their way to qualifying for the state meet.

Ginsie's personal best for the 5k is 20:20 which she ran at the Atlanta Women's 5K and placed second in her age group. Her senior year she was the girls' distance track captain, a member of the school record holding 4x1600 (22:13) relay team and received the Most Improved Runner award. Ginsie's personal best for the 1600 is 5:39 which is the 10th fastest time ran for Milton High School. She also has run the 11th fastest 3200 time for Milton.



Kayli Buckley Sophomore • Waxhaw, N.C. Exercise Science McKissick Scholar/Honors College

Kayli graduated from Marvin Ridge High School and was a captain for the cross country team her senior year. In high school, she was a three-time letter winner for cross country and fourtime letter winner for both indoor and outdoor track and field. She was the 3200m regional champion her sophomore year and a member of her high school's two-time state champion 4x800 relay team.

She was named Union County Cross Country Athlete of the Year her senior year.

As a member of the South Carolina Honors College, Kayli is excited to excel both academically and athletically. Her parents are John and Tracie Buckley.



Maura Craney Sophomore • Maple Glen, Pa. Business

Maura joins the Gamecock cross country team from Archbishop Glenn High School in Pennsylvania. She was three-time First Team All-Catholic League in high school for cross country. She took second at the District 12 AAA meet in the 3,200 (12:00) and has also run 5:30 in the 1600.

Kristina Cribb Freshman • Rock Hill, S.C. Nursing

Cribb is from Rock Hill, S.C. She graduated from South Pointe High School in 2010, and is a walk on returning from injury for the 2011 season.

She is studying Nursing where she has been on the Deans List for the past two semesters. She is currently a Peidmont Medical Scholar and is looking forward to contributing to the team this 2011 Cross Country and 2012 Track Seasons.

Erin Fedewa Senior • DeWitt, Mich. Marine Science McKissick Scholar

Erin has been one of the teams consistent members during the past three years. She has run anywhere from No. 5 to No. 10 on the varsity. She has also run the 800 and 1500 during track season, including being on an SEC DMR scoring team.

During college, Erin received the SEC Community Service Award for 2010 and has been on the Dean's List every semester. Last year, Erin received an outstanding undergraduate award through the Marine Science Department and was selected as a 2010 NOAA Hollings Scholar. Through the program, Erin spent the summer in La Jolla, CA tagging sharks and completing a research project on blue fin tuna. As a Spanish minor, she also spent a month this summer studying abroad in Spain. In addition, last spring Erin was named a Udall Scholar and a USC Leadership Scholar, enabling her to help initiate the athletic department's first carbon-neutral athletic event. Erin is looking forward to her senior year and a strong cross country season.

In high school, she earned all-state in track from her sophomore to senior year, running a PR of 2:15 in the 800. Erin was all-state in cross country as a junior (18:58). She was four-time academic all-state and four-time all-area. Erin was also the Wendy's Heisman State winner for Michigan. She was a member of the conference champion track team in 2008 and a member of the state qualifying equestrian team.

Jenny Lake (2002-05 wrapped up her career as one of the most decorated athletes in South Carolina cross country history. Lake, who was a two-time NCAA qualifier, finished sixth at SEC Championship as a junior and earned All-SEC honors. Lake set the 3,000m record at the SEC Indoor Championships, which has now been broken by current Gamecock Beatrice Biwott. She was also named the USC Scholar Athlete of the Year and earned the NCAA Post-Graduate Scholarship.



Patrice Frierson Junior • Dalzell, S.C. Accounting Valedictorian Scholar

Entering her third year on the cross country team, Patrice will be helping out in any way that she can. She did not compete last year due to a knee injury. As a freshman, she competed in one race, the Charlotte Invitational with a PR time of 22:03.

Patrice is a Valedictorian Scholar and this past year received the A. Byrnes Bryant, Jr. Business Scholarship. In high school, she lettered in volleyball and five-times in track and field. Coached by Laverne Knox at Lee Central High School, Patrice served as captain three times and holds the school record for the 800, 1600, and 3200. She was named Impact Player of the Year her first year on the track team and was a four-time MVP. She was a two-time state qualifier for the 1600 and made All-Conference four years in a row for the 800, 1600, and 3200. She was the Upper-State Champion and was named an All-State Selection for the 800 her senior year.

Patrice was the 2008 Wendy's High School Heisman school winner and received the SCHSL Scholar Athlete Award and the American Legion School Award. She was president of Fellowship of Christian Athletes and the Student Council. She was an AmeriCorps member and a member of the National Beta Club, National Technical Honor Society, and Newberry College and WLTX-19 2009 Best of the Class. She also graduated as valedictorian.

Born on February 14, 1991 to William and Patricia Frierson, her hobbies are running, drawing, and dancing.



Rachel Grochowski Sophomore • Herndon, Va. Elementary Education Woodrow Scholar

Rachel was redshirted as a freshman. With a good summer of training, coach Rosenthal has high hopes for her in 2011.

She is a six-time captain and a ten-time All-District selection at Chantilly High in cross country, indoor track and outdoor track, three-times earning All-Region honors and was also a two-time State qualifier. She was a nine-time letter winner in cross country and track and received several awards, including Rookie of the Year, Most Improved, Coach's Award, and was named a four-time MVP. She finished No.11 all-time in school cross country history. Rachel also competed in soccer and field hockey in high school. She chose South Carolina over James Madison University and Christopher Newport University.

In her free time, Rachel enjoys shopping, listening to music, and going to the beach. She is the daughter of Randy and Melinda Grochowski.



Sara Hartley Senior • Naperville, III. Print Journalism Cooper Scholar/Honors College

Sara enters the 2011 cross country season looking to make an impact for the Gamecocks. After a successful high school career, Sara was redshirted her freshman cross country season when she suffered a foot injury a week before she reported to school at the end of the summer. After her long layoff, Sara raced the 800 outdoors. Her best time of 2:16 was her fastest time in two years.

In high school, Sara was voted team captain by her teammates in both cross country and track. She helped her team to a memorable state experience. She placed 18th at the 2007 IHSA Cross Country state meet running a PR of 17:38 for three miles. She was all-state in the 800m (2:14) as a junior and competed at state in the 4x800m relay all four years. She was three-time MVP and received the Outstanding Senior Award for cross country. Sara earned academic all-conference awards all four years and was an Illinois State Scholar.

Sara has won academic awards during her time at South Carolina, including being on the President's Honor List every semester so far. During the school year she is an assistant news editor at the Daily Gamecock and is a student mentor for BGTIME, a program that engages and connects senior citizens through a community website.



Jessica Hartman Junior • Centreville, Va. Exercise Science Woodrow Scholar

Jessie had a breakout season during the 2011 track season, running new PR's in the 1500 and 5K. She trained well this summer and has high expectations for continued improvement during cross country. She was the No. 10 runner on the team for most of the 2010 cross country season.

Hartman had a great deal of experience in high school from her 12 seasons of varsity cross country and track and field at a competitive AAA high school level. She holds 14 varsity letters from Westfield High School: cross country, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field,

Tri-Athlete and 3.5 Athlete.

Jessie was a member of the three-time state championship 4x800 relay team, a two-time regional qualifier in the open 800, a four-time member of the regional cross country team, and team captain for four seasons in high school. She was awarded the Coach's Award and Team MVP Award her senior year. Jessie competed in four meets during her first cross country season with the Gamecocks but wasn't able to compete during the indoor track season due to injury. She came back to race the 800 and 1500 during the 2010 spring season.

When she's not running, Jessie likes to spend time with friends and family, swim, and cook. Jessie chose the University of South Carolina over James Madison University, East Carolina University, and the University of North Carolina at Charlotte.



Maggie Henderson Freshman • Marietta, Ga. Nursing Woodrow Scholar

Maggie joins the Gamecocks as a freshman and has enjoyed running for the past four years. She was a four year varsity letter athlete in cross country and track. She also lettered as a member of the swimming team and diving team. During her high school career Maggie was a member of the All-County (Cobb) Team, Marietta Daily Journal Runner of the Week, and two- time Cross Country individual state qualifier. She was the captain of the women's cross country and track teams her senior year. She received the Cross County Coach's Award her senior year. She received the Track Distance MVP Award her freshman, sophomore, and senior years. She currently holds the Marietta High School records in the 5k (19:27), 3200 meter (11:35), 1600 meter (5:18), and pole vault (9').

Head Cross Country Coach 11th Season at South Carolina

Stan Rosenthal enters his 11th year as head cross country coach at South Carolina. Rosenthal also coaches the distance runners during track and field season and was instrumental in helping the South Carolina women's team to its twelfth consecutive NCAA indoor top-12 finish in 2009.

The past four seasons, the Gamecock women's team has been ranked in the NCAA Southeast Region top 15. During the past several years, the distance runners have also done well on the track. Dani Barnes was a NCAA qualifier in the mile in 2009, while Beatrice Biwott was the Southeastern Conference champion in the steeple-chase in 2010 with a school record and also qualified for the NCAA Track Championships in 2009, 2010 & 2011. As freshmen in 2011, Scola Jepgnetich ran a 2:10 in the 800-meter run and Penny Boswell improved her time in the 5K from 19:20 to 17:49.

The South Carolina cross country team has also performed well in the classroom, receiving USTFCCCA All-Academic Cross Country Team honors last season for the 10th consecutive time of coach Rosenthal's tenure with a No. 13 national ranking. In 2008, the Gamecocks were ranked No. 1 in the NCAA with a team cumulative GPA of 3.76, which was the highest of all 340 Division I teams.

Shay Shelton added to Rosenthal's total of SEC champions by claiming the indoor league crown in the 800 in 2006. Rosenthal coached Jenny Lake to a record-breaking 3,000-meter performance at the SEC Indoor Championship in 2006. Lake, who ran 9:41, broke the school indoor record she set in 2003 with a fourth-place finish. Rosenthal also coached the DMR team to a second-place finish at the SEC Championships.

In 2002, South Carolina's women finished fourth at the NCAA Indoor Championships and won the SEC and NCAA Outdoor Championships, giving the Gamecocks their first national team title in any sport. Additionally, Rosenthal oversaw the men's sprint medley relay team that was ranked No. 1 in the USA and NCAA that year, while his 2006 women's squad accomplished the same feat with a No. 1 ranking in the sprint medley relay.

Prior to joining the South Carolina staff, Rosenthal was the head men's and women's cross country and track and field coach at UNC Asheville. During his seven-year tenure, the women won four Big South Conference Cross Country Championships. In the three years the women did not win, UNC Asheville finished as runner-up. The men's cross country team was Big South Conference runner-up in three of his last four years.

Rosenthal's runners have achieved success from the conference level to the world championship level. Two of his freshmen runners



earned spots on the USA Junior Team and competed in the IAAF World Cross Country Championships, where they placed 40th and 43rd, respectively. Five other runners competed in the USA Olympic trials. Many of his runners have qualified for the NCAA Track and Field Championships. During his seven years as a high school coach in Virginia, two runners qualified for the Foot Locker/Kinney National Cross Country Championships.

Rosenthal has served on several USA international coaching staffs. He coached on three USA staffs for the IAAF World Cross Country Championships and was a coach at the USA Olympic Festival. In 2001, he was appointed to the NCAA Track and Field Committee. As a member of the Executive Committee for the Women's Cross Country Coaches Association, Rosenthal acted as the Southeast Region representative. he earned USA Track and Field Level I and II certifications for the endurance events.

Academic success is very important to Rosenthal. Jenny Lake was named 2005 USC Scholar Athlete of the Year, a McWhorter Scholar and the recipient of an NCAA Post-Graduate Scholarship. The first-team academic All-American graduated with a 4.0 GPA in mathematics and with honors from South Carolina's Honors College.

Seven other athletes were selected as Conference Scholar-Athletes of the Year during his coaching career. Many have later earned graduate level degrees, including three who are currently in medical school and three others who are in PT School.

In addition to his coaching stint at UNC-Asheville, Rosenthal coached at Long Beach State, Georgia, South Alabama and was a graduate assistant coach at Tennessee. He also coached at Albemarle High School in Charlottesville, Va., and Spotsylvania, Va., where he started his coaching career in 1976. Coach Rosenthal earned his master's degree in education from Tennessee in 1983. His undergraduate degree came from Indiana University of Pennsylvania in 1975, where he majored in history and elementary education. While at IUP, he was a four-year varsity letter winner. In 1973 he competed in the six-mile run at Nationals. He was a member of two national qualifying cross country teams for IUP in 1970 and 1972.


Ashley Vaughn

• Six professors at the University of South Carolina have been named 2011 fellows in the American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS), the world's largest general scientific society.

• The Arnold School of Public Health is meeting the professional development needs of the state's vital public health workforce through the new S.C. Public Health Training Center.

• The Ernest F. Hollings Special Collections Library, which was dedicated in July 2010, has earned LEED Gold certification. The building houses the S.C. Political Collections, the Irvin Department of Rare Books and Special Collections and Digital Collections and features exhibition areas and meeting spaces for classes and special events.

American Bar Association Law Student Division, the largest USC representation in ABA history.

• The William P. and Lou W. Kennedy Pharmacy Innovation Center, established with a \$30 million gift from alumni William and Lou Kennedy, is bringing together the nation's top minds in entrepreneurship, health sciences, communications and other disciplines with leading pharmacy practice faculty to foster research and prepare students to be regional and national leaders in the profession.

• Three colleges and the School of Law have new deans. They are Rob Wilcox, law; Dr. Lemuel Watson, education; Dr. Anna Scheyett, social work, and Dr. Steven Lynn, South Carolina Honors College.

• Dr. Michelle Martin, a specialist in children's literature and African American children's literature and community literacy programs, has joined the faculty as the first holder of the Augusta Baker Chair in Childhood Literacy in the College of Mass Communications and Information Studies.

• A newly renovated Patterson Hall reopened its doors to 544 female freshmen this fall. Patterson features suite-style accommodations, a cyber lounge, smart classrooms, a green roof terrace and was built to LEED silver standards.

• The Ronald E. McNair Center for Aerospace Innovation and Research (McNAIR) has been established with a \$5 million gift from alumna and financier Darla Moore. The center's activities will focus on three distinct areas: basic research anddevelopment of novel materials and devices; applied research in support of advanced manufacturing tools and processes; and the development of a business and economic model that will build and support South Carolina's growing aerospace cluster through education, research and development.



Academics Top 20 Program

The South Carolina cross country program has proven that academics are also an important part of its student-athlete's career. The Gamecocks have been a consistent top 20 academic program and were the 2008 Academic National Champion out of 333 Division I teams with a cumulative team GPA of 3.767. The Gamecocks have received All-Academic Team honors for 10 consecutive seasons.

To be honored as an All-Academic Team, teams were required to compete and compile a team score in an NCAA Regional Meet and have at least a cumulative GPA of 3.0.

"The Dodie"

When University of South Carolina Athletics Director Eric Hyman talks about "the Dodie," the \$13 million state-of-the-art facility that opened in the spring of 2010, he enthusiastically refers to it as, "the heart of the athletics department and the place where the ebb and flow of student-athletes' days are centered."

"The Dodie" is named for Dolores F. Anderson of Greer, S.C., whose philanthropic gift helped fund the center for University of South Carolina student-athletes. Anderson is the widow of Robert Anderson, the former president and chairman of Anderson Hardwood Floors, the largest privately-owned hardwood floor manufacturer in the United States. A 1981 graduate of USC Upstate with a degree in interdisciplinary studies, Dodie Anderson is co-owner of Anderson Hardwood Floors and a longtime supporter of USC Upstate's athletic programs.

The three-story, 40,000-square-foot center is located across Heyward Street from Stone Stadium, the Gamecocks' soccer facility, in the 41-acre footprint known as "the Roost." It is the focal point of and the first piece in the re-developed area that eventually will include a coaches' support building, a new tennis complex, a basketball practice facility, a parking garage and updated soccer practice fields, softball stadium and outdoor track facilities.

Student-athletes are in and out of "the Dodie" throughout the day as they use computers and study areas, receive tutoring, counseling and advising and even eat their meals.
