## Clemson Series Notes

The Lady Tigers lead the series 33-24, but the Gamecocks have won five of the last seven meetings, including each of the last two. Additionally, South Carolina holds a 16-10 advantage over Clemson in games played in Columbia. South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley is currently 2-2 against the Lady Tigers in her tenure in Columbia.

The Gamecocks' most recent victory over Clemson was a $65-48$ decision on Nov. 17, 2011, at Littlejohn Coliseum. South Carolina used an explosive first half to jump out to a 43-26 lead at halftime and held on for a more evenly matched second half.

South Carolina's last win over the Lady Tigers at Colonial Life Arena came on Nov. 18, 2010, by a $73-59$ score. Then-sophomore Ieasia Walker announced her arrival as a premier scorer with 30 points on 13-of-19 shooting.

## Scouting the Lady Tigers

Clemson comes to Columbia with the nation's fourth most inexperienced team trying to shake off an 0-2 start to the season. The Lady Tigers boast the nation's 16th-best recruiting class but has just 10 years of experiences among its 12 players on the roster. Freshman guard Danaejah Grant leads the offense with 13.5 points per game, while her classmate Jonquel Jones averages a double-double early in the season with 12.0 points and 13.5 rebounds per game to her credit.

Clemson's two losses came by a combined five points, and the 3-point shot might be the difference. The Lady Tigers are shooting just 21.7 percent from behind the arc, hitting just 5 -of- 23 , while allowing opponents to take (42) and make (14) 3 s at a far higher rate ( 33.3 percent).

Head coach Itoro Coleman is in her third season at Clemson with an overall record of 16-44.

## Last Time Out

South Carolina posted its second 30 -point win of the season in a $78-47$ win over Savannah State on Thursday night at Colonial Life Arena. Another balanced offensive effort and strong production on the glass led to four Gamecocks in double-figure points and two with 12 rebounds each. Sophomore forward Aleighsa Welch collected her first career double-double with a game-high 13 points to go with her career-high-tying 12 boards. A trio of Gamecocks handed out four or more assists as the team finished with 18 assists on 31 baskets.

## Home Sweet Home

South Carolina is in its 11th season at Colonial Life Arena and enjoys a 107-55 (.660) record in that time. Overall, the Gamecocks are 351-152 all-time in home games. Since South Carolina first entered a conference in the 1983-84 season, the Gamecocks are 283131 in non-conference home games.

Head coach Dawn Staley has amassed a 41-22 home record in her fifth season at the helm, including a $24-5$ mark in nonconference action.

## Noting November

South Carolina is 77-39 (.664) all-time in games played in November. That total includes a 39-10 record (.796) at home and a 22-17 mark (.564) on the road. Head coach Dawn Staley accounts for a 17-10 record (.630) in the first month of the season.

## Helping Hand

With arguably the best point guard in international women's basketball history at the helm, South Carolina has been at its best when its assist numbers are highest. In the Dawn Staley era (2008-09 through present), the Gamecocks are $50-18$ when handing out 10 or more assists, including a perfect 3-0 mark this season. When missing the 10 -assist plateau, South Carolina is just 18-41 overall with Staley.

The Gamecocks have handed out 15 or more assists in all three games this season and have assisted on 57.6 percent of their total field goals ( 53 assists on 92 made field goals). At Louisiana Tech (Nov. 12), South Carolina amassed 20 assists on its 30 made baskets.

## High Octane Offense

South Carolina's offense has been clicking early this season with the Gamecocks averaging 79.0 points through the first three outings. In head coach Dawn Staley's fifth season, South Carolina has scored 70 or more points just 25 times, including all three games this season, in her 128 games at the helm with a 22-3 record in those high-scoring outings. The Gamecocks posted 70 or more points just five times last season, including the first two games of the NCAA Tournament. The high flying offense has been almost just as likely to come out on the road as it has at Colonial Life Arena with 15 of the contests played at home (13-2), six on the road (6-0) and four at neutral sites (3-1).

## Sharing the Load

With five active returning players and five newcomers on this season's roster, South Carolina has to rely on the talent of its youth this season, especially early, and so far, the quintet is doing a nice job of sharing the load. Through the first three games, returning Gamecocks are the leaders in the major statistical categories - points per game (Ashley Bruner, 13.3), rebounds per game (Aleighsa Welch, 9.7) and assists per game (Ieasia Walker, 5.7). But the newcomers have accounted for 43.5 percent of the team's scoring ( 103 of 237 points) and 38.6 percent of the rebounding ( 49 of 127 boards). One of the four Gamecocks currently averaging double-figure points is a freshman (Tiffany Mitchell, 10.7 ppg ) and two of the top four rebounders on the squad are first-year Gamecocks as well (Asia Dozier 5.0 rpg ; Mitchell, 5.0 rpg ).

## Preseason Predictions

South Carolina was picked by both the media and league's coaches to finish in the middle of the 14 -team pack in the Southeastern Conference. The media predicted the Gamecocks would take seventh place, while the coaches slotted South Carolina into sixth.

Senior guard Ieasia Walker drew preseason second-team all-conference honors from both groups. She is the team's lone returning starter and the highest returning scorer from last year's squad. Her 7.9 points per game came with 3.2 assists per outing, which combined to earn her Second-Team All-SEC honors for the second-straight year.

## Watching the Gamecocks

Fans can catch up with the Gamecocks on television nine times this season. South Carolina will also live stream video of all of its non-televised home games for free via its official athletics website, www.GamecocksOnline.com.

The television schedule opens with four non-conference games, beginning with the Savannah State game on Nov. 15 on SportSouth. The station also

Cox Sports Southeast airs the Jan. 13 contest at Georgia before the Gamecocks return to SportSouth for a Jan. 24 outing against Kentucky. SEC Network will broadcast South Carolina's game at Ole Miss (Feb. 17), and the regular-season finale against Florida (March 3) will air on SportSouth.

South Carolina was 14-4 last season in games televised live, including a 7-1 mark in SEC action and a 4-2 record in postseason play.

## Quick Re-Take

South Carolina put together its best season in a decade last season, reaching the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 for the first time since 2001-02 and making the program's first ever appearance in the SEC Tournament semifinals. The team's 25 victories tied for the most during the program's time in the SEC, matching that of the 2001-02 team, which advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight.

The Gamecocks found success behind a steady dose of stifling defense, ranked fourth in the

nation, and a diversified offense. South Carolina allowed more than 55 points just 12 times in 25 games and held five nationally ranked opponents to that mark or lower. Seven different Gamecocks led the team in scoring, and eight scored in double figures at least once. South Carolina’s 14-2 start earned the program's first national ranking since the end of the 2002-03 season, and the Gamecocks finished the season ranked No. 25 by the Associated Press. The team posted the most SEC wins since the 2001-02 squad also had 10. Signature league wins included the program's first sweeps of Vanderbilt and Florida and its first win over Tennessee in Knoxville.
