South Carolina opens SEC play this weekend when they host Tennessee and Georgia at Stone Stadium. The Gamecocks take on Tennessee Friday at 7 p.m. as they look to make it two wins in a row against the Lady Vols after knocking them out of the SEC Tournament Quarterfinals last season. The win marked Carolina's first victory of the Lady Vols in program history after a close call in a double-overtime loss in the regular season at Knoxville.

Carolina will then welcome Georgia on Sunday at 2 p.m. The Bulldogs defeated Carolina twice last season, first in an overtime game in the regular season and then in the SEC Tournament semifinals. Carolina last recorded a victory against the Bulldogs at Stone Stadium in 2006.

During Friday's match fans can participate in the 2008 SEC Together We CAN Drive. Bins will be setup at Stone Stadium where fans can donate canned goods and financial donations to support the Harvest Hope Food Bank.

Gametracker will be available for both matches at GamecocksOnline.com. Tickets are \$5 for adults and \$3 for youth.

ON THE HORIZON

South Carolina hits the road next weekend when they travel to take on Kentucky and Vanderbilt. The Gamecocks and Wildcats meet Friday, Oct. 3 at 7 p.m. before Carolina travels to Nashville for a 3 p.m. match at Vanderbilt. The Carolina-Kentucky match will feature a pair of sisters on the field in the Gamecocks' Ellen Fahey - a freshman defender - and the Wildcats' Katie Fahey - a junior forward.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE

The Lady Vols, historically a premier team in the Southeastern Conference, has seen a bit of misfortune in the difficult non-conference portion of their schedule. Tennessee enters Friday's match with a 3-5-0 record, and this game marks the first time since Oct. 12, 2003 that the Lady Vols enter the Carolina match unranked. Tennessee is led by two-time defending SEC Offensive Player of the Year Kylee Rossi with four goals. All-American Jaimel Johnson returns in goal and carries a 1.03 GAA with two shutouts.

SCOUTING GEORGIA

Much like Tennessee, Georgia's 2-6-0 record and current five-game losing streak could come as a surprise to many before taking a closer look at the Bulldogs's schedule. Georgia's six losses have all come to teams that have been ranked this season, including their last five matches which have been against teams all currently in the Top 15. Add in Friday's match at Gainesville and Carolina's No. 29 ranking (SoccerBuzz) and the Bulldogs will play a stretch of seven consecutive ranked teams, including 2007 NCAA Champion Southern California. Carrie Patterson leads the Bulldogs with two goals and three assists for seven points while Michelle Betos has played every minute in goal with a 2.21 GAA.

MONTEIRO PUSHED OUT

Senior **Danila Monteiro** looked forward to enjoying a full season with the Gamecocks in her final year but saw that idea end in just the second minute of Sunday's match against Western Carolina. A hard foul to the back knocked Monteiro on the ground and she missed the remainder of the game with a leg injury. Monteiro, who missed the 2007 regular season finale and post-season after tearing her ACL, will be evaluated and will not dress until further notice.

GRIMSLEY GRABS CONFERENCE, NATIONAL HONORS

Heralded freshman **Kayla Grimsley** performed well since entering the starting lineup against Boston. She leads the team with four goals that came in four consecutive games, a first for a freshman and a feat only achieved one other time in Carolina history. Her efforts led to her being named the SEC Offensive Player of the Week (Wk4) in addition to being named to three national teams of the week: TopDrawerSoccer.com, Soccer Buzz and Soccer America. A flashy player with tremendous ability, Grimsley was named a Soccer Buzz Top 75 national recruit coming out of high school and was a three-time Florida High School Player of the Year.

RETURN TO THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

For the second consecutive week the Gamecocks are ranked as they come in the Soccer Buzz poll at No. 29. Carolina is also receiving votes in the NSCAA poll as the fifth team out.

HOME AT THE STONE

South Carolina has been nearly unstoppable at Stone Stadium the past two seasons, posting a 20-1-3 record at home since 2006. The streak included a 15-game unbeaten streak from Aug. 31, 2006-Oct. 5, 2007. The lone blemish on the record was a double-overtime loss to Vanderbilt (Oct. 7, 2007) when the Gamecocks surrendered a goal with nine seconds remaining in the game. Carolina has 16 shutouts during the 24 game stretch, including 10 of the last 12 matches.

OFFENSE STARTS FROM THE MIDFIELD

After starting the season with just three goals in the first four games, the South Carolina offense has awakened recently with 10 in the last five. The catalysts to the output has come from the starting midfield trio of juniors Kim Miller and Lindsay Small and freshman Kayla Grimsley. Those three have combined for seven of those 10 goals.

PATTON SHINES IN FIRST SEASON IN GOAL

Redshirt-sophomore **Mollie Patton** has been the spark to the team's success in the early part of the season. Playing for the first time since she graduated high school in 2005, Patton currently leads the SEC with five shutouts and sports a 0.54 goals against average which ranks third in the conference. She began the season with a 434:23 shutout streak that ended against Furman and came up big in Carolina's draw with No. 7 Florida State.

O CANADA!

Freshman **Idana DeCecco** has made the most of her opportunities in the early part of the season, scoring the game-tying goal against No. 7 Florida State on her only shot so far this season. DeCecco, a native of Sherwood Park, Alberta, is the first Gamecock player to hail from Canada. She is only the eighth international player to play at Carolina, the others coming from England, Trinidad, Finland (two players), Brazil, Ireland and Nova Scotia. DeCecco was a U15 and U16 national team member for Canada and is expected to bring a strong defensive presence to the Gamecocks this season.

SHUTOUT SOCCER

Defense has been the calling card for coach **Shelley Smith's** teams and the 2008 season thus far looks to be no different. The Gamecocks posted four consecutive shutouts to open the season, the first time a South Carolina team held opponents scoreless through the first four games, and currently lead the conference with six shutouts on the year. Led by starting defenders **Brittany Rhoades**, **Ellen Fahey**, **Blakely Mattern** and **Samantha Diaz-Matosas**, the Gamecocks have limited opponents to only 74 shots and 37 shots on goal in nine matches, numbers that rank third and fifth in the conference, respectively.

OVERTIME MATCHES

After playing six matches in extra minutes last season - all coming after the start of SEC play - the Gamecocks have already played three this year. South Carolina tied UNC Wilmington and No. 7 Florida State in double-overtime and defeated Furman 2-1 in the first OT. The win marked Carolina's first OT victory since defeating LSU (also by a 2-1 score) on Oct. 20, 2006.

FIRST TIME OPPONENTS

South Carolina faced four opponents for the first time during the 2008 season, posting a 1-1-2 record in those games. UNC Wilmington was the first as the Gamecocks and Seahawks battled to a scoreless tie in the season opener, followed by Carolina's 1-0 win over Boston. The Gamecocks tied #7 Florida State before dropping their first match of the season to a scrappy Western Carolina. Last season, USC went 4-0 against first time opponents, defeating East Tennessee State, Winthrop, Marshall and UC Davis last season by a combined 16-3, including two shutouts.

NO SMALL FEAT

Junior midfielder **Lindsay Small** recorded not only her first career goal but also her first career points as she led Carolina to a 1-0 victory over Boston. Normally a defensive midfielder, Small fielded a cross from Kim Miller in the 56th minute and placed it in the near post from 12 yards out to hit the game-winning goal. She followed that with her second GWG in consecutive games for Carolina, hitting the lone goal in the 48th minute in a victory over rival Clemson.

SAM I AM

Junior **Samantha Diaz-Matosas** scored Carolina's first goal of the season with a penalty kick in the 43rd minute against East Carolina. The PK was her first career attempt as the goal was the first game-winner of Diaz-Matosas's career. The score was her fourth overall and second since moving from forward to defender last season.

LINDSAY SMALL NAMED TO SOCCER AMERICA TEAM OF THE WEEK

SOMETHING NEW BETWEEN THE POSTS

For the first time since 2002 someone other than a member of the **Laura Armstrong/Lindsay Thorstenson** duo will play as goalkeeper for South Carolina. Armstrong and Thorstenson played every game between the posts for Carolina from 2003-07 - 93 games and 7,798 minutes - leading the team to an NCAA Tournament appearance and two trips to the SEC Tournament semifinals.

Redshirt sophomore **Mollie Patton** (Milford, Ohio) grabbed the start against UNC Wilmington and came up strong in her first collegiate game in three years. Patton registered four saves in the double-overtime tie, none more crucial than her stop on a 1v1 point-blank attempt from eight yards out in the 32nd minute. The double-overtime shutout was the first for a single South Carolina keeper since Thorstenson shutout Ole Miss in extra minutes on Oct. 16, 2006.

BLAKELY MATTERN NAMED PRESEASON ALL-SEC

South Carolina junior defender **Blakely Mattern** was selected to the women's soccer 2008 Coaches Preseason All-Southeastern Conference team.

This season marks the second year that the coaches have voted on a Preseason All-SEC team as Mattern makes her second consecutive appearance on the list.

Mattern (Simpsonville, S.C./JL Mann HS) led Carolina last year to its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1998. She became the first sophomore in conference history to be named SEC Defensive Player of the Year. A former Soccer Buzz Freshman All-American, she picked up the first All-America honors in program history last season when Soccer Buzz named her an All-American and All-Southeast Region selection. A two-time All-SEC selection, Mattern has started every game of her career and was invited to attend the U.S. U-20 National Team camp this year.

"Blakely belongs among the best in the conference from her performance the past two seasons and to be recognized last year as the SEC Defensive Player of the Year," South Carolina head coach Shelley Smith said. "The honor is well deserved as she continues to improve and show herself as a leader of our program. We have several players that were deservedly nominated, but the team announced shows how strong of a conference that the SEC is along with the type of quality players among the teams."

ALL-AMERICAN DEFENSE

The South Carolina defense has been consistently one of the top in the SEC and in the nation, and all signs point to this season being another strong one for the Garnet and Black. The Gamecocks return two former Freshman All-Americans in junior **Blakely Mattern** and sophomore **Brittany Rhoades**.

Mattern (Simpsonville, S.C.) has started every game of her career at center back, earning Freshman All-America honors in 2006 and becoming Carolina's first All-American after picking up honors in 2007. Mattern also picked up SEC Defensive Player of the Year honors last season, becoming the first sophomore in conference history to earn the honor, and earned a trip to the US U-20 National Team camp last spring. Rhoades (Wilmington, Del.) set a USC freshman record with 23 games played and 22 games started last year at left back, becoming the second Freshman All-American in as many years for the defense.

PENNSYLVANIA DEJA VU

For the second straight season, Carolina grabbed a top recruit from the state of Pennsylvania. Unfortunately, for the second straight season, that recruit will possibly miss the entire season after suffering an ACL injury her senior season of high school. Soccer Buzz Top 150 recruit **Dani Henry** (Avondale, Pa.) went down with an injury in the Delaware state semifinals (Padua Academy in Wilmington, Del.) and will likely miss the entire 2008 season.

The injury follows the same situation that befell sophomore **Brooke Jacobs** (Chambersburg, Pa.) last season. Jacobs tore her ACL in her final high school season but returned to play for the Gamecocks in the non-conference finale against Marshall. She went on to have a great season for Carolina and earned SEC Freshman of the Week honors after scoring the gamewinning goal against Arkansas.

COACHES TAB GAMECOCKS FOURTH IN SEC EAST

The South Carolina women's soccer team was picked to finish fourth in the Eastern division of the 2008 SEC preseason poll, the conference office announced Aug. 14. South Carolina finished the 2007 with a 14-6-3 record and earned the sixth seed in the SEC Tournament with a 5-4-2 conference record.

Florida was selected as the favorite to claim the 2008 women's soccer title in the poll voted on by the league's 12 head coaches.

The Gamecocks return six starters and 12 letterwinners from last season's NCAA Tournament team. Danila Monteiro is the team's lone returning senior and is a co-captain along with juniors Blakely Mattern and Kim Miller. Carolina also returns starters Shannon Bigbie, Samantha Diaz-Matosas, Brittany Rhoades and Brooke Jacobs, but the team will look to replace 63 percent of its point-scoring from last season while the loss of decorated seniors Laura Armstrong and Lindsay Thorstenson means a new goalkeeper will mind the net for the first time since 2004.

TRI-CAPTAINS

Senior midfielder **Danila Monteiro**, junior midfielder **Kim Miller** and junior defender **Blake-ly Mattern** will serve as 2008 team captains. Monteiro (Sao Paulo, Brazil) is the only senior on the roster after transferring from Young Harris JC last season. Miller (Farmington, N.Y.) has been a workhorse at midfield the past two seasons, starting 43 of 45 games. Mattern (Simpsonville, S.C.) is one of Carolina's most decorated players despite only being a junior. She became Carolina's first All-American last season and became the first sophomore to ever earn SEC Defensive Player of the Year honors.

#20 SOUTH CAROLINA DROPS FIRST MATCH OF THE SEASON

CULLOWHEE, N.C. (Sept. 21) - No. 20 South Carolina dropped its first match of the season Sunday afternoon in a physical 1-0 game against Western Carolina at the Catamount Athletic Complex in Cullowhee, N.C. The loss ends Carolina's program best eight-game unbeaten streak as they drop to 6-1-2 on the year.

Western Carolina's Arlan Whittle scored the lone goal of the match in the 64th minute when she lined a corner kick that deflected into the goal in what amounted as the Catamounts' third shot of the contest.

Playing in the non-conference finale, the Gamecocks came inches within scoring the third fastest goal in program history when a Catamount defensive mis-clear sent the ball to Lindsay Small whose shot hit the left post. Less than a minute later the Gamecock offense suffered a severe blow when senior Danila Monteiro went to the ground following a foul from the back just 2:02 into the game. The lone senior on the team, Monteiro left the field with a leg injury and did not return to the match, changing the dynamic of the with forward Brooke Jacobs also missing the match after suffering a leg injury in Friday's 4-0 victory against East Tennessee State.

Western Carolina ended the game with 20 fouls to Carolina eight although the number could have been double that amount both ways. The Gamecocks finished with an 11-5 shot advantage and 5-3 advantage in corner kicks.

FOUR GOAL FIRST HALF LEADS #20 GAMECOCKS PAST ETSU

COLUMBIA, S.C. (Sept. 19)- Four separate Gamecocks scored in the first half to lead No. 20 South Carolina to a 4-0 victory against East Tennessee State in women's soccer action at Stone Stadium. The win improves Carolina's unbeaten streak to eight games with a 6-0-2 record, the longest in program history. East Tennessee State drops to 2-4-0 on the year in the loss.

Senior Danila Monteiro scored her first goal of the season in the 8th minute for the game-winner. Lindsay Small, Kayla Grimsley and Blakely Mattern also scored for South Carolina while Brooke Jacobs, Grimsley, Kim Miller, Lindsay Small and Brittyny Rhoades notched assists in the effort.

Kayla Grimsley's goal in the 22nd minute marked her fourth consecutive game with a goal after also scoring against Furman, Marquette and Florida State. The four-match scoring streak is the longest for a freshman since Lydia Bienias held a six-match scoring streak (goals and/or assists) in her freshman season from Sept. 30 to Oct. 17, 1998. However, Grimsley does become the first freshman to notch a goal in four consecutive games and is only the second player in Carolina history to do so, the other being Ashley Williams who hit goals in four games in 2004.

The last time South Carolina scored four goals in one half came in a 5-0 victory against Winthrop last season (Sept. 12, 2007) when the Gamecocks posted four goals in the second half against the Eagles. Carolina also scored five in the first half against East Tennessee State earlier in the year (Sept. 3, 2007).

Shelley Smith Eighth Season

Shelley Smith enters her eighth season at the helm of the USC women's soccer program and looks to continue building upon the success that she brought to the program after putting the Gamecocks in the national spotlight last season.

Smith directed the 2007 Gamecocks to arguably the best season in school history, tying the school record with 14 victories and advancing to the NCAA Tournament for only the second time in program history. Carolina posted a 14-6-3 overall record including a 5-4-2 mark in the SEC after beginning the season by becoming the first team ever to knock off defending national champion and top-ranked North Carolina in a season opening game at Chapel Hill. The Gamecocks ran to a 7-0-0 start to the season – program bests for start to a season and winning streak – and peaked at No. 7 in the national polls. For the second consecutive season South Carolina advanced to the SEC Tournament semifinals after knocking off Tennessee for the first time in program history and earned the school's first bid to the NCAA Tournament since 1998. Defensively, Carolina recorded a program-best 12 shutouts while Laura Armstrong's 0.49 goals against average ranked first in the SEC and ninth nationally.

Four players earned All-SEC honors with Ashley Kirk and Blakely Mattern named to the first team, Darcel Mollon named to the second team and Brittny Rhoades named to the freshman team. Mattern became the first sophomore to ever earn SEC Defensive Player of the Year honors. In addition, Mattern and Mollon earned NSCAA second team All-Southeast Region selections, becoming the first Gamecocks honored by the association since 2002. Mattern, Kirk, Mollon and Rhoades also picked up All-Region honors by Soccer Buzz with Rhoades becoming the second Freshman All-American under Smith at USC. Mattern was named a fourth team All-American, the first in South Carolina history.

Carolina's success in the classroom continued last season as Smith's squad earned three Academic All-District honorees, the most at USC in a single season. Mattern, along with seniors Annie Galloway and Erin Sullivan, earned the honors while Sullivan was also named to the Academic All-America third team. It is the third straight season a Carolina player has earned Academic All-America honors, the longest active streak in the Southeastern Conference. The team had a program-best 16 players named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll (Laura Armstrong, Kacie Brewer, Annie Galloway, Kimberly Gillespie, Monica Hogan, Leah Loguidice, Blakely Mattern, Kim Miller, Darcel Mollon, Kali Neumann, Mollie Patton,

Aly Shattls, Lindsay Small, Erin Sullivan, Lindsay Thorstenson and Mary Worthen). Smith has coached 81 SEC Academic Honor Roll recipients since coming to USC in 2001.

Smith has coached several top student-athletes at Carolina including Ashley Kirk, USC's first four-time All-SEC honoree, and two-time All-SEC performers Melinda Carter, Jessica Julin, Sarah Lentz and Blakely Mattern. Julin is currently the captain of the Finland National Team and Carter played in the WUSA. The Gamecocks have had 17 players earn All-SEC selections in the last seven years.

In her first season as head coach at Carolina (2001), the Gamecocks were the third most improved team in the nation with an 8-7-3 overall record. Carolina also had one of the school's best home records, going 5-3 at Stone Stadium, allowing opponents to score only four goals in eight matches.

The success continued for USC in 2002 with 13 wins in Smith's second season. The year was highlighted with USC's first ever victories against Florida and Kentucky. Smith also led her team to ties against 2002 SEC champion Auburn and Eastern Division champion Tennessee.

Smith led the Gamecocks to another successful season in 2003 with 10 wins including a USC record eight-game unbeaten streak as well as a 6-2-1 record at home in Stone Stadium.

The 2004 season featured a win over No. 7 Clemson, the USC's first win over a ranked opponent since 1998, as well as a 6-3 mark in non-conference action. Ashley Kirk became the first soccer player in school history to be named SEC Freshman of the Year. In addition, South Carolina set a school record for a home game-winning streak with six consecutive victories.

Following an injury filled 2005 season, the program took a big step forward in 2006 as USC went undefeated at home for the first time in school history with an 8-0-3 mark. The team's goals against average of 0.69 was the lowest ever tallied at Carolina. The season culminated with the Gamecocks advancing to the SEC Tournament semifinals for the first time in Carolina history, as Blakely Mattern became the team's first Freshman All-America selection since 1998.

In 11 years as a head coach, Smith has compiled an overall record of 111-90-20. Besides her collegiate coaching, Smith was a member of the Region III ODP staff for the past five years, as well as an assistant for the '90 Regional Team. Smith also was a member of the U-14 National Camp staff for U.S. Soccer in 2003.

With a background in both semi-professional and collegiate soccer, Smith previously served as head coach at Rhode Island from 1997-2000. The 2000 NSCAA Northeast Region Coach of the Year, Smith rebuilt the URI women's soccer program, compiling a 41-35-2 overall record. Smith took a program that was 2-16 her first year to 12-7-1

in her second season, marking the eighth-most improved won-lost record for a team in NCAA history. In 2000, Smith coached URI to its best record ever of 15-4-1, while reaching the Atlantic 10 Semifinals, a first in URI history.

Smith was nominated for the 2000 National Coach of the Year. The New England Women's Soccer Intercollegiate Soccer Association (NEWISA) also named her its Division I Coach of the Year in 2000. She was the 1998 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year as well.

In addition to her experience as a coach, Smith brings experience from the semi-professional level. From 1996-2000, Smith played for the Boston Renegades in the W-1 League. Smith was captain in 2000 as she led Boston to the semifinals in the W-1 Championship. The Renegades reached the finals in 1998. Smith also had the opportunity to play overseas in 1994 as a member of the Sheffield United Women's Football Club in England.

Smith, a 1993 graduate of the University of Vermont with a degree in nutritional science, received her teacher's certificate from the same institution in 1995. Smith started all four years for the Catamounts. Her primary positions were center midfielder and central defender. She was all-conference and regional All-American in both 1992 and '93. During her freshman year, the squad won the ECAC Tournament. Vermont was one of the first programs to offer women's soccer as a varsity sport and it competed on a national level. Smith was named to Vermont's Athletic Hall of Fame in the summer of 2004.

Smith worked as an assistant coach at Dartmouth College from 1995-97. The Big Green made the NCAA Tournament in her second season with the program.

Smith is married to USC associate head coach Jamie Smith, a 1994 graduate of Providence College. They are the proud parents of two sons, Braden James and Evan Addison. The family resides in Cayce, S.C.

Smith has her USSF B license and the NCAA Advanced National Diploma. She is currently a member of the USYSA Regional Olympic Development Staff.

A native of Shaftsbury, Vt., Smith graduated from Mount Anthony Union High School in 1989.
