A South Carolina Win Would...

- Be the third in a season opener in head coach Dawn Staley's five-year tenure, but her first at home as the Gamecocks have opened three of her five seasons on the road.
- Give the Gamecocks a 27-12 all-time record in season openers.
- Keep Staley undefeated in four career college meetings with Elon head coach Charlotte Smith as Staley's Virginia Cavaliers topped Smith's North Carolina Tar Heels three times in the 1991-92 season, the only one in which their playing careers at the two ACC rivals overlapped.

Elon Series Notes

The Gamecocks and Phoenix have not met since the 1974-75 season when they played twice. That was the first official season of women's basketball at South Carolina with the "Carolina Chicks" as part of the athletics department. Elon won both games that season, including an 82-77 victory on its home floor in the AIAW Region II Tournament. The location of the first game is unknown.

Scouting the Phoenix

Elon returns four starters from last season's 16-14 squad and added four newcomers to the mix. Senior guard Ali Ford led the offense last season with 14.5 points per game – second-best in the Southern Conference – highlighted by 35.7 percent shooting (87-244) from 3-point range. Her efficiency earned a spot on the All-SoCon First Team. Forward Kelsey Evans joined Ford on the Preseason All-Conference squad this season behind her 11.7 point and 7.5 rebound averages in 2011-12. The lone departing starter was also the team's playmaker, so Elon will have to replace her 4.0 assists and 1.8 steals per game, both team highs.

Elon head coach Charlotte Smith is in her second season at the helm after serving nine seasons as an assistant at her alma mater, North Carolina. Smith is just the sixth head coach in Elon women's basketball history, and her 16 victories last season were the most by a first-year head coach at the school.

Preseason Predictions

South Carolina was picked by both the media and league's coaches to finish in the middle of the 14-team pack in the Southeastern Conference. The media predicted the Gamecocks would take seventh place, while the coaches slotted South Carolina into sixth.

Senior guard Ieasia Walker drew preseason second-team all-conference honors from both groups. She is the team's lone returning starter and the highest returning scorer from last year's squad. Her 7.9 points per game came with 3.2 assists per outing, which combined to earn her Second-Team All-SEC honors for the second-straight year.

On Exhibition

The Gamecocks showed their athleticism and raw talent in an 88-31 victory over Anderson in an exhibition game on Sunday afternoon. South Carolina's stifling defensive pressure, rapidly becoming a trademark of the program, allowed the Trojans to shot just 27.3 percent from the field. Five Gamecocks scored in double figures, including three freshmen – Asia Dozier (14), Khadijah Sessions (11) and Tiffany Mitchell (10). Senior Sancheon White (13) and sophomore Aleighsa Welch (14) joined the scoring barrage, while sophomore Elem Ibiam dominated the glass with 12 rebounds. Sessions handed out five assists and swiped six of the team's 16 steals to complete her impressive afternoon. As a team, South Carolina shot 51.5 percent from the field against an Anderson team that had upended Clemson two nights earlier.

For Openers...

In its 39th season of women's basketball, South Carolina is 26-12 in season openers, including a 2-2 mark under head coach Dawn Staley. The Gamecocks have lost just once in 12 season openers at home. Tonight is just the third time South Carolina has opened at home during Staley's five seasons at the helm, the most recent being an 84-65 loss to then-No. 5 Xavier on Nov. 12, 2011.

We're Back...

South Carolina technically returns just one starter from last season, but two others were key members of the Gamecocks' NCAA Sweet 16 run. Senior Ieasia Walker has started 64 of the team's 68 games over the last two seasons. As a sophomore (2010-11), she led the team in scoring with 12.2 points per game. Walker went on to pace the squad in assists, ranking seventh in the SEC at 3.2 per game, as a junior.

Among the team's other five returning letterwinners are senior Ashley Bruner and sophomore Aleighsa Welch, both of whom played considerable minutes last season. Bruner has proven over the last two seasons to be one of the SEC's most tenacious rebounders, overcoming her height disadvantage with good instincts and effort. She was among the league's top 20 rebounders last season and ranked sixth in offensive rebounding as a sophomore. Welch earned SEC All-Freshman honors after pacing the Gamecocks with 6.1 rebounds per game, good for 13th in the league.

Fresh Look

South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley added five student-athletes to her roster this season, especially providing talent and height on the backcourt while building a foundation for the frontcourt. The group is made up of the Gatorade North and South Carolina Players of the Year (Tiffany Mitchell and Asia Dozier, respectively), a Parade All-American (Khadijah Sessions), a top-30 point guard (Tiffany Davis) and a JUCO All-American (Wilka Montout).

Watching the Gamecocks

Fans can catch up with the Gamecocks on television nine times this season. South Carolina will also live stream video of all of its non-televised home games for free via its official athletics website, www. GamecocksOnline.com.

The television schedule opens with four non-conference games, beginning with the Savannah State game on Nov. 15 on SportSouth. The station also will air games against Clemson (Nov. 18) and Furman (Dec. 9). The non-conference portion of the TV schedule closes with the Dec. 19 game against Stanford. The SEC package kicks in on Jan. 3 with the home game against Tennessee on SportSouth. Cox Sports Southeast airs the Jan. 13 contest at Georgia before the Gamecocks return to SportSouth for a Jan. 24 outing against Kentucky. SEC Network will broadcast South Carolina's game at Ole Miss (Feb. 17), and the regular-season finale against Florida (March 3) will air on SportSouth.

South Carolina was 14-4 last season in games televised live, including a 7-1 mark in SEC action and a 4-2 record in postseason play.

Quick Re-Take

South Carolina put together its best season in a decade last season, reaching the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 for the first time since 2001-02 and making the program's first ever appearance in the SEC Tournament semifinals. The team's 25 victories tied for the most during the program's time in the SEC, matching that of the 2001-02 team, which advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight.

The Gamecocks found success behind a steady dose of stifling defense, ranked fourth in the nation,

Seven different Gamecocks led the team in scoring, and eight scored in double figures at least once. South Carolina's 14-2 start earned the program's first national ranking since the end of the 2002-03 season, and the Gamecocks finished the season ranked No. 25 by the Associated Press. The team posted the most SEC wins since the 2001-02 squad also had 10. Signature league wins included the program's first sweeps of Vanderbilt and Florida and its first win over Tennessee in Knoxville.
