South Carolina Notables

- This is the Gamecocks' 40th season as a varsity sport, the sixth with head coach Dawn Staley at the helm. It is South Carolina's 23rd season in the SEC.
- In a vote of student-athletes and coaches, the team selected tri-captains this season – Elem Ibiam, Khadijah Sessions and Aleighsa Welch.
- The Gamecocks' 70-point win over Charleston Southern in the season opener was the largest margin of victory in Colonial Life Arena history and the fourth-largest overall in school history.
- South Carolina's 60.9 percent field goal accuracy against Charleston Southern was the second highest by any team in Colonial Life Arena history, while the Buccaneers' 18.5 percent was the fifth lowest ever shot in the building.
- Elem Ibiam shot a perfect 7-of-7 from the field against Charleston Southern, tying for fourth in Colonial Life Arena history behind three former Gamecocks who were 8-of-8 in a home game.
- Alaina Coates' scoring output against Charleston Southern was the first 20-point game by a freshman in her debut game since Kelsey Bone scored 22 in an overtime victory at Charlotte on Nov. 16, 2009.
- Redshirt sophomore Tina Roy handed out a career-high seven assists against Charleston Southern, more than triple her previous career high in the category.
- South Carolina holds the No. 21 spot in the USA Today/WBCA Preseason Coaches' Poll. The Associated Press Preseason Poll has the Gamecocks at No. 22. South Carolina was tabbed the No. 13 team in the nation in Lindy's Preseason Poll earlier this fall. This is just the eighth season in South Carolina history in which the Gamecocks have earned a spot in the AP preseason poll, the first of the Staley era as the last preseason rank came in the 1990-91 season (No. 22). South Carolina has ended a season ranked among the nation's top 25 nine times, including the last two seasons.
- South Carolina is coming off back-to-back 25-win seasons that included NCAA Tournament appearances. The program's last consecutive 25-win efforts came in the 1978-79 and 1979-80 seasons. The last back-to-back 20-win seasons were in 2001-02 and 2002-03.
- South Carolina returns two starters from last season – leading scorer and Second-Team All-SEC selection Welch, and SEC All-Freshman honoree Tiffany Mitchell.
- Despite losing three starters from last season, the Gamecocks return 60.1 percent of their scoring and 61.7 percent of their rebounding.
- All four of the Gamecocks' newcomers hail from the state of South Carolina, although two took a detour into North Carolina before joining their homestate's flagship program – freshmen Alaina Coates (Irmo, S.C.) and India Farmer (North Myrtle Beach, S.C.), redshirt-sophomore LeAnna Morrison (Monck's Corner, S.C. – transferred from Charlotte), and junior Olivia Gaines (Chester, S.C. – transfer from Louisburg College).
- As the state has become a hotbed of women's basketball recruiting, Staley has locked down her home borders. This season's team features three South Carolina player of the year selections – Alaina Coates (2013), Asia Dozier (2012) and Aleighsa Welch (2011).

mentor 6-foot-4 freshman Kevlone Moten and 6-foot-3 transfer TyJae' Chenevert.

Weatherspoon is looking to take her team back to postseason action. The Lady Techsters last played in the NCAA Tournament in 2011. The former college, USA Basketball and WNBA standout player continues to build her coaching resume with an 87-51 overall record.

Preseason Predictions

South Carolina was picked to finish fifth in the SEC by the league's coaches in preseason voting. The media tabbed the Gamecocks at seventh in their voting. In each of the last four seasons, South Carolina has out-performed the predictions of both groups.

Louisiana Tech Series Notes

The Lady Techsters hold a 3-2 lead in a series that was hotly contested in the early 1980s with both programs rated among the nation's best. In the first game played in the series since that decade, the Gamecocks posted an 82-58 victory in Reston, La., on Nov. 12, 2012.

Six current Gamecocks played in the last meeting, including three who scored in double figures – Aleighsa Welch (14), Tiffany Mitchell (13) and Wilka Montout (12). For South Carolina, 20 assists against just seven turnovers highlighted the team's effort that night. Then-freshman Lulu Perry led the Lady Techsters' offense with 16 points as she drew the start in her collegiate debut.

In the first three meetings of this series, neither team was ranked lower than sixth. While South Carolina has been ranked in more of the total meetings (five, including this season), Louisiana Tech was ranked among the nation's top three in each of the first four contests, playing with the No. 1 ranking in two of those.

The first time the Gamecocks and Lady Techsters squared off they were ranked Nos. 4 and 3, respectively. Playing in the consolation game of the AIAW National Tournament on March 23, 1980, South Carolina took the victory 77-69.

Scouting the Lady Techsters

Louisiana Tech opens its first season as a member of Conference USA behind head coach Teresa Weatherspoon, who was a central player during much of the Lady Techsters' heyday in the 1980s. In her sixth season at the helm, Weatherspoon will rely on seven returning letterwinners, including three starters, to steady the team in uncharted waters.

Junior forward Whitney Frazier is Louisiana Tech's top returning scorer as she poured in 11.7 points per game last season to go along with 6.0 rebounds per game, also the top number among returners. Sophomore guard Lulu Perry returns, bringing along her 10.2 points per game, which helped her earn Western Athletic Conference All-Freshman honors last season. Senior guard Jelena Vucinic is the other returning starter as she drew the nod in 14 games last season.

Weatherspoon is grooming a new point guard for the third straight season, and the early favorite to man the critical position is JUCO transfer Chrisstasia Walter. The Arkansas native played her freshman year for the Razorbacks before spending her sophomore season at Hutchinson Community College.

Louisiana Tech has significant height in its frontcourt this season, boasting four players who stand 6-foot-2 or taller. Returners Veanca Hall and Savanna Langston have little game experience, but will look to have an impact and

Home Grown, Nationally Known

Since her arrival for the 2008-09 season, South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley has been working to protect her new home state's best prospects while fielding a team that competes at a national level. Her efforts are paying dividends as this season's roster features seven Gamecocks who played high school basketball in the state of South Carolina. Beginning with Aleighsa Welch, the first South Carolina player to sign a National Letter of Intent for Staley, the Palmetto State has sent its players of the year to Columbia as Welch (2011), Asia Dozier (2012) and Alaina Coates (2013) have each earned the title during their high school careers.

Guess Who's Back

The Gamecocks return six letterwinners from last season's 25-win team, including starters Aleighsa Welch and Tiffany Mitchell. The other four returners each played in at least 29 of last season's 33 games with two of those – Elem Ibiom and Khadijah Sessions – averaging at least 15 minutes.

Eager to bolster the efforts of the veterans is redshirt sophomore Tina Roy. Fully recovered from her offseason knee surgery, the guard looks to improve on her 4.4 points per game as a freshman. She proved she is capable of delivering more offense toward the end of that season, averaging 8.7 points during the Gamecocks' three-game run to the SEC Tournament semifinals.

Fresh Look

South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley added four newcomers to this season's roster and will welcome the return of redshirt freshman Tiffany Davis, whose initial campaign was limited to three games by a knee injury.

Local product Alaina Coates (Irmo, S.C.) headlines this season's crop of newcomers as the McDonald's and Parade All-American makes the site of her two high school state championships her college home court. Junior transfer Olivia Gaines was named the Junior/Community College Player of the Year by the WBCA last season after leading Louisburg College to the NJCAA Division II National Championship. Walk-ons India Farmer and LeAnna Morrison will battle for court time as well.

Be the Change

South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley has provided an extra challenge for her program with the "Be the Change" theme for this season. Reflecting on her career as she prepared for enshrinement into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and traveling in Africa this summer, she discovered she wanted her team to embrace the importance of focusing on others. In Africa especially, she noted the significant impact even small acts can have on the world around her.

To that end, Staley has challenged her program and everyone who supports it to commit 50,000 random acts of kindness this season. The program has set up Twitter (@SC_WBB_RAoK) and Facebook (SC Women's Basketball Random Acts of Kindness) accounts to help keep track of everyone's contributions. Fans are encouraged to submit their acts to those accounts.

Drive for 5

The Gamecocks launched their "Drive for 5" women's basketball ticket campaign this season. Inspired by head coach Dawn Staley's jersey number during her Naismith Hall of Fame playing career, the campaign looks to bring at

Watching the Gamecocks

South Carolina will play a total of 13 regular-season games on television in 2013-14. Four non-conference home games – College of Charleston (Nov. 14), NC Central (Dec. 2), SC State (Dec. 22) and Savannah State (Dec. 29) – will air on Fox Sports South and Fox Sports Carolinas in addition to the Gamecocks' game at Southern Cal airing on the Pac-12 Networks and their outing at Kentucky showing on Fox Sports South. The SEC package includes four national and three regional broadcasts during league play. The Gamecocks will play twice on ESPN2 – at Vanderbilt (Jan. 26) and at LSU (Feb. 16) – and twice on ESPNU – vs. Vanderbilt (Jan. 5) and at Tennessee (Mar. 2). Other televised games are at Auburn (Jan. 12, SportSouth), vs. Arkansas (Feb. 9, SECTV) and vs. Florida (Feb. 23, SportSouth).
