- South Carolina had seven of its 21 teams ranked at one time during the 2014-15 academic year in the Top 10 in national polls (football, baseball, women's basketball, women's golf, men's golf, women's soccer and equestrian). Carolina had 14 of its 21 teams ranked at one time in the Top 25 of national polls.
- South Carolina is the only school in the nation to rank in the Top 35 in average attendance for these seven sports: women's basketball (1st), women's soccer (3rd), baseball (4th) men's soccer (5th), football (16th), volleyball (35th) and men's basketball (33rd).
- South Carolina has had at least one of its teams ranked in the Top 5 nationally every week since Sept. 16, 2014 (36 consecutive weeks).
- South Carolina coaches and student-athletes earned 11 conference or national year-end awards
- South Carolina student-athletes earned first-team All-SEC in 2014-15
- South Carolina student-athletes earned first-team All-America in 2014-15
- **90** South Carolina student-athletes earned their degrees during this year's spring and summer ceremonies



HIGHLIGHTS

- Carolina's victories included a series win vs. national runner-up Vanderbilt as well as a series victory at NCAA Super Regional participant Texas A&M.
- Senior first baseman **Kyle Martin** finished the year leading the Gamecocks in all three of the Triple Crown categories. Martin hit .350 (71-for-203) with 14 HR and 56 RBI. He also scored 50 runs, tallied 12 doubles, tripled twice and stole 11 bases. Martin had a .455 onbase percentage and a .635 slugging mark. Martin had 14 multi-RBI games for the season. Martin earned All-America honors and was a first-team All-SEC selection.
- Junior infielder **Max Schrock** hit .328 (63-for-192) with six HR and 34 RBI. He scored 44 runs, doubled 11 times and tallied two triples. Schrock had a .419 onbase percentage with a .500 slugging mark. He was a second-team All-SEC selection.
- Junior left-hander **Jack Wynkoop** went 8-5 with a 3.27 ERA with 16 appearances and 14 starts. Wynkoop pitched a team-high 104.1 innings and struck out 86 batters with just 14 walks. Wynkoop became the 23rd pitcher in school history to reach the 20-win total. Wynkoop currently ranks 17th all-time in career wins with 22 in his three-year career.

The team finished 17-16, its first winning season since 2008-09

HIGHLIGHTS

- For the second-straight season, the Gamecocks advanced to the Quarterfinals of the SEC Tournament, winning both its first and second round games.
- South Carolina won four of its final six games, including a road win at Tennessee, snapping a 15-game UT win streak in the series. It also marked Carolina's first win at Thompson-Boling Arena since 2002.
- South Carolina finished the season averaging 11,520 fans per game, which ranked fourth in the SEC and 33rd in the nation. Last season, Carolina averaged 10,074 fans per home game,

finishing sixth in the SEC.

- On Jan. 3, Carolina registered its first win vs. a Top 10 opponent since the 2009-10 season with a 64-60 win against #9 Iowa State in Brooklyn, N.Y.
- In Week 9, the Gamecocks received votes in both the AP and USA Today Coaches Polls.





NCAA **Tournament Final Four** - First in program history

OVERALL RECORD: 34-3 CONFERENCE: 15-1 (T-1st)





HIGHLIGHTS

- Behind a school-record 34 victories, South Carolina finished the season ranked third in both the AP and USA Today Polls, marking the best final ranking in program history. The Gamecocks earned their first ever No. 1 in ranking, holding the spot in the AP Poll for 12 weeks.
- The Gamecocks followed up their 2014 SEC regular-season championship with a share of the 2015 title and went on to claim the program's first SEC Tournament title as well.
- South Carolina boasted the SEC Player of the Year and Freshman of the Year for secondstraight season as Tiffany Mitchell and A'ja Wilson, respectively, collected those awards. Senior Aleighsa Welch became the program's first SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year. Those three Gamecocks became the program's first trio to all earn First-Team All-SEC honors.



Gamecocks won four meets during the 2014 season

CONFERENCE FINISH: 13th AT SEC CHAMPIONSHIPS 18th AT NCAA SOUTHEAST REGIONALS





HIGHLIGHTS

- To open the 2014 season, the team won three straight meets and would ultimately win four of the six regular-season meets to post one of the best regular-season records in program history.
- The team earned USTFCCCA All-Academic Team honors for the 14th straight year, and the distinction of holding the top grade point average in the country at 3.79. It marks the second time the team has achieved the top GPA nationally, with the first coming in 2008.
- Anna Todd recorded the fifth-fastest 6K time in program history, at 21:02, en route to a 35th-place finish at the prestigious Paul Short Invitational
- Monica York was selected as the Southeastern Conference Women's Freshman Runner of the Week on Oct. 14. She earned the recognition after earning her first-career win at the USC Open #2 on Oct. 8 with a two-mile time of 11:53.95 that ranked in the top 20 for the conference.
- In the postseason, Carolina finished 18th at the Southeast Regional, with **Anna Todd** posting the team's top finish. She would jump 15 spots in the second half of the 6K, finishing 39th overall.



Carolina has won four bowl games in as many seasons

OVERALL RECORD: 7-6 CONFERENCE: 3-5 (T-4th)





HIGHLIGHTS

- The Gamecocks defeated Miami (Fla.), 24-21, to capture the 2014 Duck Commander Independence Bowl. It was the Gamecocks' fourth-straight bowl win, establishing a school record. The Gamecocks are one of only three Power-5 schools that has won bowls games in each of the last four seasons.
- The 2014 senior class recorded 40 victories over the past four seasons, the second-winningest senior class
- in school history, behind only the 2013 class that posted 42 wins over a four-year period.
- The Gamecocks set single-season records for both passing yards (3,661) and passing attempts (468), surpassing the previous marks of 3,373 yards, set in 1995, and 452 attempts, set in 2008.
- Senior quarterback Dylan Thompson led the SEC and shattered the school record with 3,564 passing yards.



Finished ranked in the top 10 and captured a school-record five tournament titles

SEC CHAMPIONS





HIGHLIGHTS

- Carolina finished the year ranked in the top 10 in the Golfweek/Sagarin Rankings (6) and Golfstat Relative Rankings (7).
- The Gamecocks received the top seed to the NCAA Bremerton Regional, their 19th regional appearance in the last 20 seasons and 23rd overall. Carolina finished second to advance to the NCAA Championship for the third-straight year.
- Matt NeSmith became just the second Gamecock to win an SEC title as he claimed a six-stroke victory at the SEC Championship with a school-record 54-hole total of 196 (-14).
- Juniors Will Starke and Matt NeSmith finished the year with the two lowest single-season scoring averages in school history. Starke's average of 70.27 ranks first all-time, while NeSmith's average of 70.51 is the second lowest.
- Head coach Bill McDonald became the winningest coach by tournament victories in school history with the Gamecocks' win at the Carpet Capital Collegiate, his 10th at South Carolina, and finished the season with 14 career tournament wins.
- The Gamecocks won a school-record five tournament titles, recorded a school-record 10 top-five finishes and shattered the school record for team scoring average in a season by more than four strokes (282.85).



HIGHLIGHTS

- South Carolina won its NCAA Regional for the third time in the last six seasons.
- The Gamecocks finished the season sixth in all three national rankings - Golfstat, Golfweek/Sagarin and BirdieFire.com. South Carolina captured its first No. 1 ranking in school history on Oct. 3 from Golfweek/Sagarin.
- Justine Dreher was a WGCA First-Team All-America selection, becoming the third Gamecock ever to earn first-team honors. The SEC co-Scholar Athlete of the Year finished the season ranked ninth in the nation by Golfstat.
- South Carolina won two team titles in the fall, including the ANNIKA Intercollegiate, which featured 11 of the top 13 teams in the nation.
- With a 72.53 stroke average this season, Justine **Dreher** broke current LPGA player Katie Burnett's single-season school record.
- Head coach Kalen Anderson was named SEC Coach of the Year, and two Gamecocks earned All-SEC honors in Justine Dreher (first team) and Katelyn Dambaugh (second team).

Gamecocks finished the season ranked 17th in the DiG Magazine Beach Volleyball Poll



HIGHLIGHTS

- The Gamecocks finished the regular season with a 14-7 record, which is nearly triple the win total of a year ago, when the team had a 5-12 mark in its inaugural season.
- On March 8, the Gamecocks defeated No. 20 Louisiana-Monroe, 3-2.
- South Carolina received the program's first ranking (No. 20) in the DiG Magazine Collegiate Beach Volleyball Poll on March 9.
- South Carolina's pairs combined for an 83-58 overall record, including a 65-40 mark in dual play.
- Four Gamecock pairs finished the season with winning records. The senior tandem of Paige
 Wheeler and Megan Kent set the school record for overall wins in a season (20-10), while senior Jade Hayes and freshman Macie Tendrich set the record for dual wins in a season (16-5).

HIGHLIGHTS

- The Gamecocks reached the championship game of the Conference USA Tournament before falling to host Old Dominion, 2-1. The Gamecocks defeated #18 Kentucky (2-1) and #21 UAB (1-0) to advance to the final game.
- Gamecock coach Mark Berson was named the 2014 recipient of the Bill Jeffrey Award, given by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America annually to an individual for outstanding service to or achievement in intercollegiate soccer.
- Gamecock Mikkel Knudsen captured two Conference USA individual awards, The Golden Boot and Freshman of the Year, while also earning second-team all-conference accolades and a spot on the C-USA All-Freshman Team.

- Mahamoudou Kaba and Braeden Troyer also earned second-team all-conference honors and Kurtis Turner was named third-team all-conference.
- Mikkel Knudsen also took first-team honors on the College Soccer News All-Freshman Team and secondteam from Top Drawer Soccer's Freshman Best XI grouping.

- No. 9 in final NSCAA rankings tied highest final ranking in school history
- 2,683 in average attendance, a total that ranked third in the nation. The Gamecocks played in front of seven of the program's top 15 all-time crowds, including the two largest crowds in history - Clemson (5,855) and Boston University (5,415).
- Posted a 0.68 goals against average to lead the SEC and rank 26th in the country
- Earned the program's second-straight national seed in the NCAA Tournament. The Gamecocks have earned a bid to the tournament in seven of the last eight years and have

South Carolina went to its third straight NCAA **Tournament**

OVERALL RECORD: 38-22 CONFERENCE: 10-14 (9th)





HIGHLIGHTS

- South Carolina went to its 18th NCAA Tournament overall and third straight under head coach Beverly Smith, playing in the Tallahassee Regional for the second-consecutive year
- Alaynie Page earned first-team NFCA All-America honors. the first Gamecock to garner such accolades since 1999. This came in addition to her first-team All-SEC and firstteam All-Southeast Region nods.
- Page led the team in 12 offensive categories, set five new single-season school records and placed her name 17 times in the top-15 single-season lists for offensive categories.

- Tiara Duffy garnered selection to the SEC All-Freshman Team (DP/U).
- Macey Webb gained placement on the 2015 SEC Softball Community Service Team.
- Nickie Blue posted the best season for a Gamecock pitcher since 2007, ending with a 1.86 ERA and a 20-9 record.
- Blue tossed the bulk of two one-hitters, including the complete-game shutout of USC Upstate, while fanning 12 batters in another game (Marshall, 2/28).





- Two doubles teams finished the season ranked nationally Kyle Koch/Thiago Pinheiro (#29) and Thomas Mayronne/ Harrison O'Keefe (#73).
- The 2015 senior class finished its career with 64 team victories, making it the most successful set of seniors since the 2005 class won 69 matches in its four-year stretch.
- Senior Kyle Koch became the first Gamecock to earn one of the highest individual awards from the SEC coaches, taking home SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year honors. He was also a Second-Team All-SEC selection, marking the third-straight season at least one Gamecock has been on the All-SEC team.
- South Carolina earned ITA All-Academic Team honors for the fourth-straight seasons. 

HIGHLIGHTS

- The team won five events at the prestigious Penn Relays, the most at the event since 2002.
- The Gamecocks were ranked in 12 weeks (4 indoor, 8 outdoor) of this season's USTFCCCA polls, including every week of the outdoor regular season. Prior to this season, the last time the men were in the top 25 was week six of the 2010 indoor season.
- The men's throwing duo of Josh Awotunde and Clarence Gallop had an incredible outdoor season. Awotunde recorded the sixth-best shot put and fifth-best discus
- marks in school history, and Gallop threw the fifthbest hammer in school history during the Spring.
- At the Florida Relays, Michael Wamer finished third in the men's triple jump with a mark of 54 feet and one half inch. He finished as the top collegiate athlete in the competition, and he moved to second in the NCAA ranking and ninth in the world. With that big jump, Wamer also broke South Carolina's program record, across both the indoor and outdoor seasons. The previous outdoor record was set back in 1975, and Wamer added nearly two full feet to his new record.
- The Gamecocks sent four athletes to indoor nationals, the most since 2010. For the outdoor championships, Carolina sent two individuals and two relay teams.
- After finishing 21st at nationals in his freshman campaign, Jussi Kanervo ran sixth overall in the men's 400-meter hurdles at nationals despite struggling with a season-long injury. Of the eight finalists in the race, he finished second among runners returning in 2016.
- Markus Leemet became just the second multi-event athlete in program history to earn All-America honors after he finished 10th in the decathlon at nationals.



- Assistant head coach **Delethea Quarles** has been selected as the head coach for the Team USA women's track and field team that will compete this August in Beijing, China, at the IAAF World Championships. It is

the seventh time she will coach internationally and the third straight World Championships where she will be a coach.

- Freshman Shelby Freedman had a solid first season throwing the javelin for Carolina. She won the college division of the javelin at the prestigious Penn Relays, and earlier in the season recorded the second-best throw in school history, at 153-1.
- at the NCAA national meet on June 13. It is her first national title, and the women's first individual national champion since 2007. She is the first jumper in Carolina history to win a title, men or women, and becomes the 21st woman in program history to win one.



ACADEMIC HIGHLIGHTS

- South Carolina topped all 14 institutions with 362 student-athletes earning Southeastern Conference Academic Honor Roll status during the 2014-15 academic year. Carolina had the most in each of the four honor rolls announced by the SEC – Fall, Winter and Spring sports as well as first-year status.
- Gamecock student-athletes ended the Spring 2015 semester with the second-highest departmental grade point average (GPA) in school history, posting a 3.258. It extended the streak to 17-consecutive semesters of a combined GPA of 3.0 or better for the students who participate in intercollegiate athletics.
- 90 South Carolina student-athletes earned their degrees during the 2015 spring and summer ceremonies. The group earned 36 All-American awards, 49 all-conference honors and appeared on the conference academic honor roll 192 times. Eleven of these student-athletes were members of national championship teams, while there were four additional individual national championships won by the 2015 graduates.
- Four South Carolina student-athletes earned Academic All-America honors in their respective sports:
 - Sabrina D'Angelo, First-Team Capital One Academic All-American Women's Soccer Taylor Leach, Third-Team Capital One Academic All-American Women's Soccer Braeden Troyer, First-Team Capital One Academic All-American Men's Soccer Jeannelle Scheper, Second-Team Capital One Academic All-American Women's Track and Field
- Two Gamecock programs women's golf and women's tennis were recognized by the NCAA for their latest multi-year APR scores. The APR accounts for eligibility, retention and graduation and provides a measure of each team's academic performance.
- The Gamecock men's basketball team was honored with the Team Academic Excellence Award by the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC).
 South Carolina posted a 3.164 team GPA for the academic year.

- The Gamecock men's and women's teams garnered the National Soccer Coaches Association of America Team Academic Award for the sixth-straight year. South Carolina's GPA ranked in the top 15 in NCAA Division I.
- The Gamecock track and field team earned the top GPA in Division I, with a mark of 3.79. It marks the second time the team has achieved the top GPA nationally, with the first coming in 2008. It is the 14th straight year the Carolina has been a USTFCCCA All-Academic team.
- Football student-athlete Dylan Thompson was recognized for his contributions off the field, as he was the recipient of the Freddie Solomon Community Spirit Award, was a member of the SEC Community Service team, was a finalist for the Wuerffel Trophy and earned a spot on the CoSIDA Academic All-District team.
- Senior football student-athlete Damiere Byrd was a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy and earned a spot on the CoSIDA Academic All-District team for the third-consecutive year.
- Braeden Troyer and Jeffrey Torda earned placement on the 2014 Conference USA Men's Soccer All-Academic Team and on the 2014 NSCAA Scholar All-South Region second team.
- The Gamecock men's and women's swimming and diving teams were named to the College Swimming Coaches Association of America (CSCAA) Fall 2014 Scholar All-America Teams.
- The South Carolina volleyball team earned the American Volleyball Coaches Association Team Academic Award for the 2014-15 season.
- The Gamecock men's tennis team earned the ITA All-Academic Team honors for the fourth straight season.





GAMECOCK FANS

- South Carolina is the only school in the nation to rank in the top 35 in average attendance for these seven sports: women's basketball (1st), women's soccer (3rd), baseball (4th) men's soccer (5th), football (16th), volleyball (35th) and men's basketball (33rd).
- South Carolina was ranked 3rd in the nation in total (250,057) and 4th in average (6,946) attendance in baseball.
- South Carolina women's basketball finished the season with a national best attendance average of 12,293 fans per game. Last season, Carolina finished 10th in the nation in average attendance at 6,371 fans per game. Eight of the nation's top 18 crowds have been at Colonial Life Arena, including six of the top 10.
- The attendance of 17,156 at the Jan. 11, 2015 game vs. Kentucky at Colonial Life Arena was 11th largest NCAA women's basketball regular season crowd in the last seven seasons (since Dawn Staley's arrival at USC).

- In final NCAA football statistics, South Carolina finished 16th in the nation in average attendance (81,381), 8th in percent of capacity (101.41) and 12th in cumulative attendance (569,664).
- In final NCAA women's soccer statistics, South Carolina was second in the nation in total attendance (32,197) and third in average attendance (2,683). In men's soccer, South Carolina ranked 6th in the nation in total attendance (28,619) and 5th in average attendance (2,602).
- In volleyball, South Carolina was 34th in the nation in total attendance (18,581) and 35th in average attendance (1,239). In 15 games, the Gamecocks have filled the Carolina Volleyball Center to 103.23 percent of capacity, which is fifth in the nation.

Two new grass fields, adjacent to the new \$14,320,000 indoor football facility, have been added on the west end of Gamecock Park. 

Summary/Highlights

South Carolina has the **12th-largest social media following among NCAA programs,** holding steady from last year's ranking, up from the 15th-largest following in 2011-12. South Carolina has 563,000 fans on Facebook and over 113,000 followers on Twitter*. Facebook and Twitter are the only two social networks counted for these rankings by Coyle Media, but the Gamecocks also attract large numbers of followers on YouTube, Instagram, and Pinterest. According to rankings compiled by Auburn University, South Carolina is one of only five schools (joined by Auburn, Florida, Oregon, and Wisconsin) to have athletics department accounts ranked in the Top 20 in followers on Facebook, Twitter, YouTube, Instagram, and Pinterest.

From July 2014 to July 2015, the South Carolina Gamecocks page saw its first-ever year-over-year decrease, dropping a slight 0.02%, as Facebook identified and eliminated spam, duplicate, or inactive accounts from its platform.

Facebook continues to have the largest following of any social media platform and is a place for Gamecock fans to gather and engage, both during events and throughout the year. We post videos, high quality photos and graphics, and questions to spark discussion. The fan is the focus, highlighted by our Fan Photo features and several themed fan photo albums that are updated regularly such as Gamecock Pets, Gamecock Weddings, and Gamecock Military and Veterans where fans submit their photos to be included.

@GamecocksOnline 113,197 followers, ranked 11th nationally

From July 2014 to July 2015 the main @GamecocksOnline Twitter account earned 39,197 new followers, a 53% increase and faster rate of growth than the previous year at 49%.

Twitter continues to grow as a source of breaking news and information. We use it to spread news, give in-game updates, share photos and behind-the-scenes action, answer questions, provide customer service, and engage with fans on a daily basis. Fans join us in widely using the #Gamecocks and #HereSC hashtags to track and join conversations about South Carolina teams.

In addition to the main athletics department account, every South Carolina team has an individual team Twitter account. Among college baseball programs the @GamecockBasebll team account has the 2nd most followers in the country (84,935) behind only LSU, while head coach Chad Holbrook has

the most followers of any baseball coach in the country with 26,456. Basketball coaches Dawn Staley and Frank Martin are ranked No. 4 and No. 11 in followers, respectively. On the heels of the most successful season in school history, the women's basketball team account (@GamecockWBB) more than doubled its following to over 16,000 fans compared to just under 8,000 followers at this time last year, and moved up four spots to the fifth-largest follower count in the country.

Also ranked in the Top 25 for followers in their sports are Equestrian (@ GamecockEQ, No. 4), Football (@GamecockFB, No. 12), Men's Golf (@GamecockMGolf, No. 21), Men's Soccer (@GamecockMSoccer, No. 23), Women's Soccer (@GamecockWSoccer, No. 23), Men's Tennis (@GamecockMTennis, No. 23), and Swimming & Diving (@GamecockSwim, No. 24). Last year, only two Gamecock team accounts were ranked in their Top 25 for followers. The Gamecocks' beloved mascot, Cocky (@Cocky2001), is No. 5 in the country with over 23,000 Twitter followers.
