If you will be attending a home match, please inform Padgett at least 24 hours in advance. Thank you for your interest in South Carolina volleyball. Please let us know if we can assist you in your coverage of the Gamecocks.

#### **CREDENTIALS**

Credentials are not required to attend volleyball matches, however, please notify Padgett at least 24 hours in advance of a home match to assure having your name placed on the pass list.

#### **MEDIA SERVICES**

Box scores will be available at the conclusion of each game, and a complete box with play-by-play will be distributed when the match has finished. Fax service is available as well for those media members needing it. At the present time, high-speed Internet is not available at the facility for non-USC employees. Several phone lines are available for a dial-up connection.

#### **VISITING RADIO**

Visiting radio should notify the media relations office at least one week in advance of a match so that arrangements may be made for the broadcast. Visiting radio typically is seated on the side opposite the team's benches with two available phone lines. In the event of a televised match, visiting radio is placed behind the service area near the entrance to the facility.

# THE SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

### ABOUT THE SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

The Southeastern Conference, with its storied 76-year history of athletic achievements and academic excellence, has built perhaps the greatest tradition of intercollegiate competition of any league in the country since its inception in 1933. The 2007-08 academic year was another season to remember for the SEC as conference teams captured five national titles and five national runner-up finishes. The SEC won consecutive national championships in football, gymnastics, women's basketball and men's tennis. Since 1990, the SEC has won 126 national team championships for an average of nearly seven per year.

LSU won the SEC's first national title of the year with its win in the BCS National Championship Game in football. The Tennessee Lady Vols won its second consecutive women's basketball national championship. Georgia earned a pair of national championships as the Gym Dogs won their fourth straight gymnastics championship as well as the men's tennis team won back-to-back national titles. LSU won its second national championship of the year when the women's track & field squad won the national title. Florida finished first among Southeastern Conference schools and sixth overall in the Director's Cup final standings.

Overall, the SEC finished in the top two in nine and in the top five in 13 of the 20 sports. Nine SEC teams participated in football postseason bowls with Alabama, Auburn, Georgia, Kentucky, LSU, Mississippi State and Tennessee winning the Independence, Chick-Fil-A, Sugar, Music City, BCS National Title Game, Liberty and Outback Bowls, respectively. A league record-tying six men's basketball teams were invited to the NCAA Tournament with Tennessee advancing to the Sweet 16. The SEC has now sent at least one team to the regional semifinals for 19 straight years. Five women's basketball teams were also invited to the NCAA Tournament with Tennessee winning the NCAA Championship and LSU advancing to the Women's Final Four for the second straight year. The SEC had a record-tying nine teams advance to post-season play in baseball, hosting two super regionals with Georgia finishing second and LSU advancing to the College World Series. With 168 teams advancing to NCAA postseason competition, the SEC continued to solidify its place as the nation's premier conference.

In addition to the five team championships, 46 SEC student-athletes garnered individual national championships, while 457 individuals were awarded with First-Team All-American honors. Student-athletes around the league continued to excel in the classroom as well with over 2,300 earning recognition on the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

On the national all-sport level, the SEC placed nine programs in the top 50 of the NACDA Director's Cup rankings. Florida led the league with a sixth-place finish. LSU placed eighth while Georgia was 10th; Tennessee finished 16th, Auburn 20th, Arkansas 24th, Alabama 25th, Kentucky 36th and South Carolina 48th to round out the league's top-50 finishes.

## SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE VOLLEYBALL

Year after year, the Southeastern Conference shows why it is considered to be one of the premier volleyball conferences in the nation.

In the last two decades, the SEC has made stellar contributions in volleyball. The conference has sent at least two SEC teams to the NCAA Tournament in every season the last 18 years. The SEC had a team reach the Final Four seven of the 10 seasons in the '90s with the league having a team advance to the regional final nine of those 10 seasons. Since 2000, the SEC has had a team reach the Final Four three times and regional final four times.

In 2007, Florida captured its 17th ever SEC Championship and made its 18th NCAA Tournament appearance and advanced to the regional semifinals. In all, five teams from the SEC made the NCAA Tournament, including Alabama, Florida, Kentucky, LSU and Mississippi.

Since the inaugural SEC volleyball championship in 1979-80, many changes have occurred in the conference with volleyball. The addition of Arkansas and South Carolina to the league in 1991 brought the divisional format to the sport with five teams competing in the Eastern Division and six teams in the Western Division.

Along with the popularity growth throughout the country, women's volleyball has also grown in the SEC. A benchmark in that growth came in 1995 when SEC volleyball was first broadcasted on SEC-TV (FOX Sports Net South, FOX Sports Net Southwest and Sun Sports) on a tape-delay basis. For the past nine seasons the coverage of live telecasts has grown, especially in the last six years.

SEC volleyball will continue to enjoy the live coverage on SEC-TV to almost 22 million subscribers in the conference's nine-state region.



# **SEC VOLLEYBALL NOTES**

- The 2007 season marked the 18th consecutive year in which the SEC placed at least two teams in the NCAA Tournament.
- Five SEC teams earned berths to the NCAA Tournament.
- All 11 teams in the SEC posted wins in double digits in 2007, with four claiming 20-win seasons.
- LSU claimed the Western Division crown in 2007, while Florida earned the Eastern Division championship and overall title.
- Florida captured its 17th SEC championship and advanced to the NCAA Regional semifinals.
- Two players were named AVCA All-America, five were named AVCA Honorable Mention All-America and nine (including two honorable mention) players were named to the AVCA Division I All-South Region Team.
- Two players were selected to the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-American Teams.
- Twelve student-athletes were named to ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District teams.
- In the past 17 years, 980 student-athletes have earned selection to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.
