#### MICHAEL FLACH SET FOR NCAA MEN'S CHAMPIONSHIPS

Sophomore Michael Flach will represent the University of South Carolina for the second straight year at the NCAA Men's Swimming & Diving Championships, which run Thursday-Saturday, March 24-26, at the University Aquatic Center in Minneapolis, Minn.

Flach will swim the 500 freestyle, 200 freestyle and 200 butterfly at the meet, the same events he swam at last season's championships in Columbus, Ohio. He enters the meet as the No. 6 seed in the 500 free with a top time of 4:16.03. Four of the top six competitors in the 500 free are from the SEC - Conor Dwyer, Florida (4:11.36), Martin Grodzki, Georgia (4:14.93), Ryan Harrison, Tennessee (4:15.13) and Flach.

The sophomore from Annandale, Va., is seeded 21st in the 200 freestyle with a 1:35.39, and he is 22nd in the 200 butterfly with a 1:45.36.

Preliminaries begin at noon ET with finals set for 8 p.m. each day of the competition. ESPN3.com will have live video of the finals on Friday and Saturday, and live results will be available through NCAA.com.

#### HISTORY AT THE NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

This will mark the 14th straight season and the 28th overall that South Carolina has sent at least one athlete to the NCAA Men's Championships. The Gamecocks have placed in the top 25 at the national championships 12 times, with the last time being a 20th-place finish at the 2004 meet. The best showing for a Gamecock squad came in 1987 when the Metro Conference champions earned a 10th-place finish behind All-America performances from nine individuals and two relays.

#### 2010 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS RECAP

Then-freshman Michael Flach competed in three events for South Carolina at the 2010 NCAA Swimming & Diving Championships in Columbus, Ohio. He posted a 4:21.33 in the 500 freestyle to finish 27th, despite recording his second-fastest time of the season. On Friday, he was 33rd in the 200 freestyle prelims with a 1:36.90, then he recorded a then-careeer best 1:46.71 in the 200 butterfly.

#### GAMECOCKS RANKED 25TH IN FINAL CSCAA POLL

South Carolina earned a top-25 finish in the final College Swimming Coaches Association of America Dual-Meet Rankings, finishing in a tie for 25th in the poll that was released Monday. It was the first top-25 finish for South Carolina since the 2002 season when the Gamecocks were 13th in the final dual-meet ranking. The Gamecocks finished with a 10-1 overall record in dual-meet competition - the second 10-win season in school history - with a 2-1 mark against Southeastern Conference foes. The worksheet included wins over a pair of teams that finished in the final top 25. Carolina beat No. 21 Alabama (ranked No. 16 at the time) in the season's final meet on Jan. 29, and the Gamecocks took down archrival Clemson on Oct. 29; the Tigers tied the Gamecocks for the 25th spot in the final ranking. South Carolina then earned a seventh-place finish at the SEC Championships, its best showing at the league meet since 2007.

#### **NATIONAL RECOGNITION FOR FLACH**

After posting five NCAA 'B' cuts at the Nike Cup Invitational, Gamecock sophomore Michael Flach was named the Counsilman Hunsaker National Swimmer of the Week by CollegeSwimming.com. He had one of the best weeks of his career with a victory in the 500 freestyle (4:21.68), posting a prelims time of 4:20.03 which was the fastest in the nation at that point. He also won the 200 freestyle in a personal-best time of 1:35.53, setting the Nike Cup meet record. His 200 butterfly time of 1:45.36 was also a personal-best and the third-fastest time in SC history, earning a runner-up finish. He also helped the 800 freestyle relay team to a victory and earned 'B' cuts with both that team and the 400 free relay squad.

#### NCAA WOMEN'S CHAMPIONSHIPS RECAP

Freshman **Amanda Rutqvist** earned two All-America honors - highlighted by her 5th-place finish in the 200 breaststroke - to help the Gamecocks to a 29th-place finish at the 2011 NCAA Women's Championships. Rutqvist lowered her own school and SEC record by another seven-tenths of a second with a 2:07.86 in the championship final. She also finished 16th in the 100 breaststroke with a 1:01.04. Rachael Schaffer competed in the 200 IM, 400 IM and 200 breast, barely missing the finals in the 400 IM with a 4:10.27 to finish 17th, and senior **Tarvn** Zack wrapped up her Carolina career with an 18th-place finish in 1-meter diving and a 21st-place showing on the 3-meter board.

#### 2011 SEC CHAMPIONSHIPS RECAP

South Carolina swimmers broke nine school records, posted 37 NCAA provisional qualifying times (and one NCAA automatic time), and the men's and women's teams earned their best finishes at an SEC Championship in several years. The Carolina women earned a sixth-place finish with 252 points, the best SEC finish since 2006. For the Gamecock men, it was a seventh-place finish with 217 points, finishing ahead of Kentucky and falling just short of sixth-place Alabama's 271 points and fifth-place LSU's 271.5.

Freshman Amanda Rutuvist and senior Taryn Zack won SEC Championships in the 200 breaststroke and 1-meter diving, respectively, and sophomore **Michael Flach** won his second straight bronze medal in the 500 freestyle.

#### FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING

Ten times had a South Carolina women's diver climbed to the top spot on the medal stand at the SEC Championships. But never a women's swimmer - until this year.

Freshman Amanda Rutgvist became South Carolina's first-ever Southeastern Conference women's swimming champion, winning the 200-yard breaststroke event and setting a new SEC record with a time of 2:08.56 to put an exclamation mark on the Gamecocks' week at the 2011 SEC Swimming Championships, which wrapped up Saturday night at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center Natatorium on the campus of the University of Florida.

Rutqvist broke a 10-year-old league mark of 2:08.85, previously held by Alabama's Anna Poleska, as she sprinted to what was nearly a two-second victory over Auburn junior Micah Lawrence. She was also nearly a second faster than the 2010 champion, Arkansas senior Yi-Ting Siow, who went 2:09.23 to win last year's title in Athens, Ga. And more importantly, it was the fifth-fastest time in the country this year and an NCAA automatic qualifying mark, earning her a quaranteed berth in the 2011 NCAA Women's Swimming Championships, set for March 17-19 in Austin, Texas.

#### **ZACK WINS SEC 1-METER CHAMPIONSHIP**

Taryn Zack set the SEC Championship record in 1-meter diving and won her second SEC title giving the Gamecocks their 10th all-time SEC diving championship at last week's meet in Gainesville. Zack's score of 336.55 broke a four-year old SEC Championships 1-meter record of 333.90, previously set by Kentucky's Taryn Ignacio at the 2007 league meet. She also became South Carolina's fourth diver to win multiple SEC Championships, joining Allison Brennan, Michelle Davison and Vivian Alberty in that elite club.

Not to be lost in Zack's triumph was an outstanding performance by junior **Courtney Forcucci**, who just missed the medal stand with a personal-record score of 315.95 to finish in fourth place. Forcucci led after the first round with a 60.00 on her opening dive, then was steady throughout the competition and never fell below fourth place. Only a near-perfect final dive by Auburn's Vennie Dantin bumped Forcucci to fourth place as Dantin took third behind Zack and St. Germain.

#### ZACK NAMED SEC SCHOLAR-ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

South Carolina senior diver Taryn Zack was named the Southeastern Conference's Female Scholar-Athlete of the Year as the SEC announced its year-end swimming and diving awards on Friday.

In addition, Zack and freshman Amanda Rutqvist were first-team All-SEC selections, while Rutqvist and fellow freshman Rachael Schaffer were both named to the SEC All-Freshman Team.

Zack, a native of Stony Plain, Alberta, Canada, graduated in June 2010 with a degree in exercise science and a GPA of 3.926; she is currently in graduate school where she is pursuing a physical therapy degree and carries a perfect 4.0 GPA. Two weeks ago, Zack won her second SEC Championship in 1-meter diving, scoring an SEC Championship-record 336.55 to win the title in Gainesville, Fla. She also captured the 1-meter title as a sophomore in 2009. Zack is the school record-holder in 1-meter diving (357.75) and 3-meter diving (389.03).

#### GAMECOCKS SWEEP ALABAMA; FALL TO GEORGIA ON SENIOR DAY

In a meet that came down to the final two races, Carolina's men defeated Alabama 160-140 on Saturday to pick up their 10th win of the season. The Gamecocks fell to No. 9 Georgia, 180.5-117.5. On the women's side, Carolina earned their second SEC victory of the year, winning the final relay against the Tide to ensure a 158-142 win. The Gamecock women fell to the No. 2-ranked Lady Bulldogs, 178.5-119.5.





The Gamecock men finish the regular season 10-1 overall (2-1 SEC), the first winning record under fourth-year head coach McGee Moody and a huge turnaround from a 4-6 finish a year ago. The 10-win mark also matches the most wins in a season in school history, equaling the 1966 Gamecock squad that went 10-2 and finished fourth at the ACC Championships. Carolina's women finish the regular season with a 7-6 mark (2-3 SEC), their first winning season since 2002.

Sophomore **Bobby Cave** was the biggest catalyst for the Carolina men, posting a 4:00.58 in his first career attempt at the 400 IM to clinch the win over Alabama. Earlier in the meet, he won both the 100 and 200 breaststroke against Alabama. **Michael Flach, Brooks Ross** and **Max Heinze** also earned wins over Alabama, while **Rylan Ridenour** took the win on the 3-meter board. In the women's meet, freshman **Rachael Schaffer** came through with an inspired performance in the 400 IM, posting a winning time of 4:15.55—the best Gamecock time ever at the Carolina Natatorium — to all but clinch the win over Alabama. **Courtney Forcucci** earned a pair of wins on both the 1- and 3-meter boards, and **Amanda Rutqvist** was a two-time winner in the breaststroke events to help pace the Gamecocks.

#### THANK YOU. SENIORS

A total of 10 Gamecock seniors were recognized before Saturday's meet as part of Senior Day festivities. Two men - **Brett Sexton** and **Gray Tedder** - were recognized, along with eight women who experienced their final home meet - **Allison Barr, Shaylyn Blake, Blair Bowers, Bridget Halligan, Stephanie Hellenga, Kelly Kirchler, Megan Sparks** and **Taryn Zack**.

#### **GAMECOCKS EARN SEC WEEKLY AWARDS**

After their first meet against Vanderbilt and Western Kentucky on Oct. 16, South Carolina's swimming & diving team nearly swept the Southeastern Conference's weekly awards, as freshmen **Rachael Schaffer** and **Gerard Rodriguez**, sophomore **Rylan Ridenour** and juniors **Courtney Forcucci** and **Chris Kelly** all earned SEC Athlete of the Week honors.

Two more Gamecocks were honored after Carolina's sweep of archrival Clemson on Oct. 29. Senior **Taryn Zack** and Ridenour were named the SEC Divers of the Week after a dominating performance against the Tigers. Following the Nike Cup Invitational, Schaffer earned her second weekly honor as the SEC Freshman of the Week. Forcucci earned her second award following the Gamecocks' win over Alabama on Senior Day.

#### UNBEATEN STREAK CONTINUES FOR GAMECOCK MEN AT UNCW

South Carolina got a tough fight from UNC Wilmington on Saturday at Seahawk Natatorium, but the Gamecock men pulled away for a 161-137 dual-meet victory. The Carolina women fell to the host Seahawks in a tight meet, dropping a 155-140 decision. **Michael Flach** put together another strong performance and added another event to his repertoire. Flach earned a victory in the 200-yard freestyle with a 1:40.53, falling just short of the UNCW pool record. He also swam the 200 backstroke for the first time this year, winning with a 1:52.43. He also swam the butterfly leg on the victorious 400 medley relay team along with **Max Heinze, Bobby Cave** and **Alex Fitton,** posting a 3:23.80 to open the meet with a victory.

Whitney Avers won the 1000 freestyle (10:16.17) and took her fourth straight victory in the 200 butterfly (2:05.65). Rachael Schaffer earned a pair of wins, taking the top spot in the 200 free with a 1:53.00, then continued her unbeaten streak in the 200 IM with a UNCW pool-record time of 2:04.23. Amanda Rutqvist earned a win in the 100 breaststroke with a 1:03.70, then came back to win the 200 breast with a time of 2:17.35.

#### GAMECOCKS SET THREE POOL RECORDS AT EAST CAROLINA

South Carolina got a trio of record-breaking swims and had the top times in 24 of 28 events as the men and women earned a victory over East Carolina on Jan. 22. The 23rd-ranked Carolina men won by a score of 163.5-128.5, while the Gamecock women took a 168-128 decision. **Michael Flach** set the Menges Aquatic Center record in the 1000-yard freestyle with a 9:17.77 to win by more than six seconds. It was a career-best time for Flach by more than 10 seconds and broke the ECU pool record that had stood for more than 17 years. Flach was undefeated on the day, posting victories in the 200 butterfly (1:48.86) and 500 freestyle (4:32.31) and anchoring the 400 freestyle relay team of **Alex Fitton**, **Brett Sexton**, **Gerard Rodriguez** and himself to a first-place time of 3:06.45.

Another pool record swim came in the women's 200 medley relay as **Megan Sparks**, **Amanda Rutqvist**, **Bridget Halligan** and **Lauren Raczkowski** got the afternoon off to a strong start with a 1:45.59 to eke out a victory over the top ECU relay squad by .30 seconds. Rutqvist had a second record-breaking swim in the 200 breaststroke. Her time of 2:17.38, while far from a season-best, broke a 16-year-old record at the Menges Aquatic Center and led the Gamecocks to a 1-2 finish in that event (**Rachael Schaffer** clocked a 2:21.39). It was part of an undefeated day for the freshman from Sweden as she also took top honors in the 100 breaststroke (1:04.49) and 200 IM (2:08.69). Schaffer was also the runner-up in the 100 breast while earning a win of her own in the 100 butterfly with a time of 57.10.

#### MEN SWEEP, WOMEN SPLIT WITH DUKE, QUEENS

South Carolina's men swept Duke and Queens University on Jan. 15, while the Gamecock women defeated Queens but fell to the host Blue Devils. The Gamecocks took down Duke's men, 165-145, and defeated Queens 247-41. Carolina's women earned a 249-24 win over Queens while Duke's women prevailed 160-140.

Gerard Rodriguez, Bobby Cave and Chris Kelly all earned two wins in the meet, with Rodriguez taking the 200 and 500 free, Cave controlling the breaststroke events and Kelly winning the 200 back and 400 IM. Brooks Ross (1000 free), Michael Flach (200 fly) and Max Heinze (100 back) earned other wins for the Carolina men. For the women, Courtney Forcucci set a PR with a 308.93 in 1-meter diving to earn a big win over the defending ACC Champion. Bridget Halligan earned a pair of sprint freestyle wins and led the victorious 400 FR team, while Whitney Avers, Rachael Schaffer and Amanda Rutqvist also took wins for Carolina. Schaffer

### GAMECOCKS SWEEP CHARLESTON; SPLIT WITH KENTUCKY

South Carolina's men got a pair of dual-meet wins over SEC foe Kentucky (189.5-110.5) and College of Charleston (251-47). The Gamecock women defeated Charleston 236-57 and lost a 144-137 thriller to Kentucky that came down to the final relay. The Carolina men totaled 11 wins in 16 events during the meet. Freshman **Gerard Rodriguez** led the charge, winning the 200 and 500 free and leading the 400 free relay team to a closing victory. Other victories came from **Michael Flach** (100 fly), **Chris Kelly** (200 back),

Max Heinze (100 back), Bobby Cave (200 breast), Brooks Ross (1000 free) and Collin Kaden (200 IM). The 400 medley relay team of Heinze, Cave, Isaac Badillo and Alex Fitton opened the meet with a win, while Rodriguez, Andrew Seiler, Fitton and Flach earned victory in the 400 free relay. Rylan Ridenour also earned a victory in 1-meter diving. For the women, Whitney Avers and Jordan Gibbs won in the 500 and 1000 freestyle, and Avers also picked up a victory in the 200 butterfly. Rachael Schaffer remained unbeaten in dual-meet action in the individual medley, and Amanda Rutqvist took victory in the 200 breast. In addition, Taryn Zack and Courtney Forcucci finished 1-2 in 1-meter diving.

#### RECORDS FALL AT NIKE CUP INVITATIONAL

Freshmen Amanda Rutqvist and Rachael Schaffer combined to break three school records and post four NCAA 'B' cuts, sophomore Michael Flach posted five provisional times of his own, and the Gamecocks recorded numerous personal-best times as both the men's and women's squads earned third-place finishes at the Nike Cup in Chapel Hill, N.C. Flach was named National Swimmer of the Week for his efforts (see note above).

Rutqvist shattered the school record in both the 100 and 200 breaststroke, posting a 1:01.77 in the 100 and a 2:10.35 in the 200 to top the Gamecock charts in just her fourth collegiate meet; both swims earned NCAA 'B' cuts. Schaffer set the school mark in the 400 IM with a 4:14.12 to win that event, and also posted an NCAA 'B' cut time in the 200 IM with a 2:00.89, the second-fastest mark in school history.

**Brooks Ross** and **Gerard Rodriguez** also earned 'B' cuts in their respective events, and the men's 400 and 800 freestyle relay teams posted provisional qualfiying times as well.

#### MEN DEFEAT MISSOURI; WOMEN EARN TWO B-CUTS VS. TIGERS, HOGS

South Carolina's men improved to 3-0 with a 181.5-118.5 victory over the Missouri Tigers on Nov. 5 at the Arkansas Natatorium. The Gamecock women, despite several standout individual performances, fell to Arkansas 194-106 and to Missouri 176-124. Rachael **Schaffer** earned her second 'B' cut of the season with a 4:17.42 in the 400 IM. **Amanda Rutqvist** picked up her first B-cut of the season as well, recording a 2:15.78 to earn one of her two wins on the day; the other came in the 100 breast. Courtney Forcucci picked up the other win for the Carolina women, taking top honors on the 3-meter board. For the men, Michael Flach, Bobby Cave and Brooks Ross each won two events to help the Gamecocks to their third straight victory. Flach won the 200 fly, then came back with a victory in the 100 fly – an event he swam for the first time as a collegian. Ross dominated the distance freestyle events, and Cave continued his dominance in the breaststroke. Chris Kelly won the 200 backstroke and 400 IM. and **Gerard Rodriguez** won the 200 freestyle for the second time this year. Rylan Ridenour went 1-for-2 in the diving events, winning on the 3-meter board for the third time this year.

#### TAKING DOWN THE TIGERS

The Gamecocks got three wins each from **Rachael Schaffer** and **Michael Flach**, and the Carolina divers dominated both boards to lead to a sweep of archrival Clemson. In front of a standing-room-only crowd at Carolina Natatorium, the Gamecock men took a 169.5-125.5 victory while the Carolina women beat Clemson 167-133.

Taryn Zack was named SEC Diver of the Week after winning the 1-meter competition and finishing a close second to teammate Courtney Forcucci on the 3-meter board. On the men's side, Rylan Ridenour was the SEC Diver of the Week following a sweep of the 1- and 3-meter boards. In the pool, Flach won the 200 free, 500 free and 200 fly, while Bobby Cave swept the breaststroke events. Brooks Ross (1000 free) and Isaac Badillo (100 fly) grabbed the other wins for the Gamecock men. For the Gamecock women, Schaffer took top honors in the 200 breast, 200 fly and 200 IM, while Lindsey Olson won the 500 and 1000 free.





Bridget Halligan (50 free) and Amanda Rutgvist (100 breast) also picked up wins for Carolina.

#### **OPENING WITH A BANG**

South Carolina got its 2010-11 season off to a great start on Oct. 16 with a sweep of Western Kentucky and Vanderbilt in Nashville. The Carolina women downed Vanderbilt 252-43 and took care of WKU 195-104 while the Gamecock men were quite impressive in a 203-97 victory over the Hilltoppers. Between the two teams, the Gamecocks won 24 of 32 events on the day and were never seriously threatened after the opening relay.

**Lindsey Olson** won both the 500- and 1000-yard freestyle events. **Rachael Schaffer** and **Amanda Rutqvist** were as advertised, with Schaffer winning the 200 breaststroke. She also won the 200 IM with Rutqvist taking top honors in the 100 breast. **Bridget Halligan** won both sprints, **Kelly Tannhauser** won her first collegiate race with a 1:53.45 in the 200 free, and **Megan Sparks** won the 100 backstroke in 57.91. The 400 FR team of Tannhauser, **Lauren Raczkowski, Shaylyn Blake** and Halligan closed the meet with a win (3:32.43).

On the men's side, it was **Bobby Cave** earning a pair of breaststroke wins and **Chris Kelly** sweeping the backstroke swims. **Michael Flach** took top honors in the 200 butterfly and teamed with **James Crawford**, **Andrew Seiler** and **Gerard Rodriguez** to win the the 400 FR. **Brooks Ross** led a sweep in the 1000 free, and **Matt Columbus** won the 500 free. **Collin Kaden** posted a victory in the 200 IM with a 1:52.72, and Rodriguez earned a victory in the 200 free (1:39.51).

#### **HEADING TO THE TRIALS**

Junior **Courtney Forcucci** earned a berth in the 2012 U.S. Olympic Trials as she and assistant coach **Allison Brennan** both advanced to the finals in 3-meter diving at the USA Diving Winter National Championships in early February. Forcucci finished 12th in the national finals while Brennan took eighth place.

# McGee Moody

# Head Swimming Coach Fourth Year at South Carolina

A proven leader in the coaching profession, McGee Moody is in his fourth season as the head swimming coach at the University of South Carolina. He and his staff continue to build the South Carolina program and strive toward the elite level of the sport through effective training methods and tireless recruiting efforts.

In his four seasons at the helm, Moody has overseen a successful stretch for the Carolina swimming and diving program. This season, the Gamecock men equaled the school record for wins in a single season, finishing with a 10-1 dual-meet record. The Carolina women also finished with a winning record for the first time since 2002, posting a 7-6 dual-meet mark.

His first three seasons saw gradual improvements. The 2009-10 season was a bit of a rebuilding year, but highlights included freshman Michael Flach's bronze-medal performance in the 500 freestyle at the SEC Championships. In 2008-09, the Gamecock women finished with a .500 dual meet record for the first time since 2005 and won five meets for the first time since 2002. The women also earned their highest SEC Championships finish in three years. The Carolina men, meanwhile, sent two swimmers - Nick Walkotten and Kyle Cormier - to the NCAA Championships and earned a 29th-place national finish, the best for a Carolina squad since 2005. Combined, the Carolina men and women turned in 23 NCAA provisional qualifying times and broke 14 school records.

It wasn't an easy beginning for the East Carolina graduate, but Moody made great strides with the South Carolina program in his initial season on the Horseshoe. Despite arriving on campus only a month before the start of the 2007-08 season, Moody oversaw a successful transition as Carolina sent three swimmers to the NCAA Championships. Walkotten and Dominique Lendjel represented the Gamecock men while Christy Williams swam for the women.

Aside from NCAA competition, Moody saw even more success as nine Gamecock swimmers competed in the Olympic Trials. One swimmer, then-sophomore Sharntelle McLean, represented her home country of Trinidad & Tobago in the 2008 Summer Olympics in Beijing. In addition, then-rising senior Nicholas Walkotten competed at the Short Course World Championships.

Moody spent three years at William & Mary, where his teams achieved 559 lifetime best swims, 301 all-time Tribe top-10 performances, 46 school records and 18 gold medals at the Colonial Athletic Association Championships. The Tribe swimming program also excelled academically. The women received Academic All-America honors in each semester under Moody's tutelage.

In 2007, Moody earned the conference's Coach of the Year honor after leading his women's team (8-4, 6-2 CAA) to the first Colonial Athletic Association Championship in the program's 80-year history with a record-tying 12 gold medals. In doing so, the squad swept the conference awards by winning Performer of the Meet, Swimmer of the Year and Rookie of the Year. The men's program finished with a winning record (6-3-1, 5-2-1 CAA) for the first time since 1998-99, and finished fourth at the conference meet behind a pair of runner-up performances and a host of bronze medals.

In 2005-06, the Tribe women's team improved upon its fourth-place conference finish in 2005 by taking second, passing George Mason on the final day of the CAA Championships. During the season, the women were even more impressive, posting a 10-4 ledger (8-1 CAA), to set the school record for conference wins in a season. In the conference, their only blemish was against eventual champion UNC Wilmington. The men also experienced improvement, achieving five dual-meet wins for the first time since 1999 and posting a .500 mark (4-4) in the conference. They also improved on their result at the conference championship, riding a bevy of personal records in the last two days to a fifth-place finish.

Moody spent four seasons as an assistant men's swimming coach at the United States Naval Academy. During his tenure at Navy, Moody coached the Midshipmen's first NCAA automatic qualifier since 1996 in addition to guiding numerous NCAA, Senior National and Olympic Trial qualifiers. His 200 and 400 freestyle relay teams finished the season ranked in the top 25 of the world. Moody also made an impact in the Navy record book, with his athletes setting all of the top-10 fastest times in school history in both the 50 and 100 freestyles. Building his athletes into academic success stories as well, Navy's men's swimming team was awarded Academic All-America honors all three seasons from 2001-2004 under Moody's direction.

Moody got his coaching start at his alma mater, East Carolina University. He was the top assistant swim coach for both men and women for the Pirates from 1996-2000. While working in nearly every facet of the program at East Carolina, Moody coached over 25 varsity record holders.

A 1998 graduate of East Carolina, Moody swam on the Pirates' varsity squad for four seasons, setting several freshman records and captaining the team his junior and senior years. Moody was also an Olympic Trials qualifier in the 200 freestyle in 1992.

Moody, who earned both a bachelor's degree in psychology and master's in sports administration from ECU, is an active professional in the swimming community. He also served in the United States Navy, attaining the rank of Lieutenant. A member of both the American Swimming Coaches Association and the College Swimming Coaches Association of America, he has served as the chair of the latter's Media Relations Committee since 2001. He and his wife, Monica, have four daughters: Sydney (10), Olivia (7), Lily (4) and Whitney (2).
