## South Carolina Notables

- This is the Gamecocks' 39th season as a varsity sport, the fifth with head coach Dawn Staley at the helm.
- South Carolina scored 70 or more points in its first two games this season as the team seems to be picking up where it left off in the NCAA Tournament when the Gamecocks scored 80 against Eastern Michigan before netting 72 at Purdue to advance to the Sweet 16.
- The Gamecocks opened the season strong on the glass, currently holding a +17.5 rebounding margin. The team's 20-rebound advantage over Elon was the third-highest in the Dawn Staley era, trailing a 22-rebound edge over Alabama on Jan. 23, 2011, and a 21-board lead over Jacksonville on Dec. 30, 2008.
- The SEC coaches tabbed South Carolina to finish sixth in the league, while the media slotted it into seventh, despite the Gamecocks' fourth-place finish (tied) last season.

## Savannah State Series Notes

The Gamecocks are 4-0 all-time against the Lady Tigers, with all four games played in Colonial Life Arena. The two teams have met each of the last two seasons. South Carolina won last season's meeting 65-39 on Dec. 21, 2011, after posting a 52-33 victory the previous season.

## Scouting the Lady Tigers

Savannah State returns three starters, who were the team's top three scorers, from last season's 10-20 team. Led by junior guard Ezinee Kalu, the Lady Tigers to an $89-55$ win over Columbia College in the season opener, scoring 25 points on 9 -of-10 shooting. That performance picks up right where she left off last season when she averaged 17.6 points per game, taking more than 200 more shots than the next closest teammate while also leading the team with 2.8 assists per game. Junior guard Jasmine Kirkland was second on the squad at 8.7 points per game, and Blessing Uba, another junior guard, rounds out the returners with 5.2 points per game last season. The Lady Tigers will have to replace the rebounding of Jasmine Kirkland, who added 7.0 boards per contest last season.

Head coach Cedric Baker is in his 10th season at Savannah State with an 86-172 record at the school. Overall, he is 392-370 over 21 seasons.

## Last Time Out

South Carolina passed its first road test of the season with an 82-58 win at Louisiana Tech Monday night. The Gamecocks pounded the ball inside early and took advantage of the resulting open 3-point shots later to upend the Lady Techsters. Five Gamecocks finished with double-figure points, while three shared the team lead with eight rebounds in another solid effort on the glass. Senior Ieasia Walker handed out a career-best eight assists, including five on the first seven baskets of the game to set the early tone.

## Home Sweet Home

South Carolina is in its 11th season at Colonial Life Arena and enjoys a 106-55 (.658) record in that time. Overall, the Gamecocks are 350-152 all-time in home games. Since South Carolina first entered a conference in the 1983-84 season, the Gamecocks are 282-131 in non-conference home games.

Head coach Dawn Staley has amassed a 40-22 home record in her fifth season at the helm, including a 23-5 mark in non-conference action.

## Noting November

South Carolina is 76-39 (.661) all-time in games played in November. Those totals include a 38-10 record (.792) at home and a $22-17 \operatorname{mark}(.564)$ on the road. Head coach Dawn Staley accounts for a 16-10 record (.615) in the first month of the season.

## High Octane Offense

South Carolina's offense has been clicking early this season with the Gamecocks averaging 79.5 points through the first two outings. In head coach

Dawn Staley's fifth season, South Carolina has scored 70 or more points just 24 times in her 127 games at the helm with a 21-3 record in those outings. The Gamecocks posted 70 or more points five times last season, including the first two games of the NCAA Tournament. The high flying offense has been almost just as likely to come out at Colonial Life Arena as it has on the road with 14 of the contests played at home (12-2), six on the road (6-0) and four at neutral sites (3-1).

## Sharing the Load

With five active returning players and five newcomers on this season's roster, South Carolina has to rely on the talent of its youth this season, especially early, and so far, the quintet is doing a nice job of sharing the load. Through the first two games, returning Gamecocks are the leader in the major statistical categories - points per game (Ashley Bruner, 16.0), rebounds per game (Aleighsa Welch, 8.5) and assists per game (Ieasia Walker, 6.0). But the newcomers have accounted for 40.9 percent of the team's scoring ( 65 of 159 points) and 39.5 percent of the rebounding ( 32 of 81 boards). One of the four Gamecocks currently averaging double-figure points is a freshman (Tiffany Mitchell, 11.0 ppg ) and two of the top four rebounders on the squad are first-yeat Gamecocks as well (Asia Dozier 6.0 rpg ; Mitchell, 5.0 rpg ).

## Preseason Predictions

South Carolina was picked by both the media and league's coaches to finish in the middle of the 14 -team pack in the Southeastern Conference. The media predicted the Gamecocks would take seventh place, while the coaches slotted South Carolina into sixth.

Senior guard Ieasia Walker drew preseason second-team all-conference honors from both groups. She is the team's lone returning starter and the highest returning scorer from last year's squad. Her 7.9 points per game came with 3.2 assists per outing, which combined to earn her Second-Team All-SEC honors for the secondstraight year.

## We're Back...

South Carolina technically returns just one starter from last season, but two others were key members of the Gamecocks' NCAA Sweet 16 run. Senior Ieasia Walker has started 64 of the team's 68 games over the last two seasons. As a sophomore (2010-11), she led the team in scoring with 12.2 points per game. Walker went on to pace the squad in assists, ranking seventh in the SEC at 3.2 per game, as a junior.

Among the team's other five returning letterwinners are senior Ashley Bruner and sophomore Aleighsa Welch, both of whom played considerable minutes last season. Bruner has proven over the last two seasons to be one of the SEC's most tenacious rebounders, overcoming her height disadvantage with good instincts and effort. She was among the league's top 20 rebounders last season and ranked sixth in offensive rebounding as a sophomore. Welch earned SEC All-Freshman honors after pacing the Gamecocks with 6.1 rebounds per game, good for 13th in the league.

## Fresh Look

South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley added five student-athletes to her roster this season, especially providing talent and height on the backcourt while building a foundation for the frontcourt. The group is made up of the Gatorade North and South Carolina Players of the Year (Tiffany Mitchell and Asia Dozier, respectively), a Parade All-American (Khadijah Sessions), a top-30 point guard (Tiffany Davis) and a JUCO All-American (Wilka Montout).

## Quick Re-Take

South Carolina put together its best season in a decade last season, reaching the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 for the first time since 2001-02 and making the program's first ever appearance in the SEC Tournament semifinals. The team's 25 victories tied for the most during the program's time in the SEC, matching that of the 2001-02 team, which advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight.
The Gamecocks found success behind a steady dose of stifling defense, ranked fourth in the nation, and a diversified offense. South Carolina allowed more than 55 points just 12 times in 25 games and held five nationally ranked opponents to that mark or lower. Seven different Gamecocks led the team in scoring, and eight scored in double figures at least once. South Carolina's 14-2 start earned the program's first national ranking since the end of the 2002-03 season, and the Gamecocks finished the season ranked No. 25 by the Associated Press. The team posted the most SEC wins since the 2001-02 squad also had 10. Signature league wins included the program's first sweeps of Vanderbilt and Florida and its first win over Tennessee in Knoxville.
