South Carolina Notes

- South Carolina drops to 132-66 all-time in NCAA Tournament games.
- The Gamecocks are now 64-12 all-time in NCAA postseason games in Columbia and 22-4 in contests at Founders Park.
- South Carolina is 0-4 all-time against Oklahoma State. Its three previous losses occurred at the College World Series in 1981, 1982 and 1985.
- Freshman right-hander Braden Webb's 128 strikeouts on the year are the eighth-most for a Gamecock in a season.
- Webb finished Saturday with 110 pitches, his second-highest pitch total in a game this year.
- Dom Thompson-Williams hit his first home run of the postseason in his final at-bat today. The junior outfielder ranks second on the team with eight home runs this season.
- Junior outfielder Gene Cone extended his hitting streak to 13 games with a single in the bottom of the fourth inning.
- Infielder DC Arendas collected his eighth hit of the postseason in the bottom of the fifth inning. The senior recorded 27 hits during the regular season.



Oklahoma State Notes

- The Cowboys are 144-89 all-time in NCAA Tournament games.
- Oklahoma State is the first team to defeat the Gamecocks in a Super Regional contest at Founders Park. South Carolina won its first four Super Regional games at the venue, sweeping UConn in 2011 and Oklahoma in 2012.
- The Cowboys held South Carolina to its lowest scoring output of the postseason.
- Sophomore right-hander Thomas Hatch has not allowed a run in 14 innings of action this postseason. He has worked six or more innings in 14 of his 17 outings on the year.
- Junior outfielder Ryan Sluder hit his fourth home run of the season in the top of the third inning. His last home run came at Kansas State on March 25.
- Senior outfielder Corey Hassel has recorded seven RBI over his last three games for the Cowboys.
- Designated hitter Conor Costello's double in the sixth inning gave the senior his seventh multi-hit game in his last nine outings. He has hit safely in each game during that stretch.
- Junior infielder Dustin Williams notched his 11th multi-hit game of the season. Saturday marked his first multi-hit outing of the postseason.
- Collin Theroux's ninth-inning home run was his sixth of the year. His three RBI today were the most for the junior since he recorded four against Dallas Baptist on May 10.
