FOR STARTERS

South Carolina (10-2) is back in action on Friday beginning a three-game home series vs. Rider (6-1). First pitch for the opener is 7 p.m. with Saturday's contest at 4 p.m. and Sunday's series finale scheduled for 1:30 p.m. All three games can be heard on the Gamecock Radio Network from IMG College including flagship station 107.5 FM, "The Game." Live video broadcast is also available at GamecocksOnline on the All Access Channel.

GAMECOCKS IN THE RANKINGS

South Carolina is ranked for the fourth straight week. The Gamecocks are No. 6 by Baseball America and Collegiate Baseball and No. 7 in the USA Today coaches' poll.

A LOOK BACK

South Carolina won a pair of midweek games vs Ball State. Carolina won 10-0 on Tuesday night and followed that up with a 14-4 victory on Wednesday afternoon.

Joey Pankake hit a pair of three-run homers in each victory. The Gamecocks were strong at the plate with 10 hits on Tuesday as well as 14 on Wednesday. Freshman left-hander Jack Wynkoop retired the first 16 batters he faced on the way to the 10-0 win on Tuesday. Wynkoop, Vince Fiori, Joel Seddon and Forrest Koumas combined for 11 strikeouts with no walks on the mound. Wednesday's win saw Carolina race out to a 6-2 lead in the first three innings with seven more runs scored in the bottom of the eighth.

LAST WEEK'S RECAP

South Carolina continued the 2013 season with a win over Furman in a midweek contest and a series victory vs. Clemson with two wins in three games over the weekend. South Carolina made a bookend of the weekend with a 6-0 shutout on Friday at Doug Kingsmore Stadium as well as an 8-0 shutout of the Tigers on Sunday at Carolina Stadium. The Gamecocks have now won 20 of the last 28 games played between the two schools from the 2007 season to the present.

SELLOUT

Sunday's 8-0 win at Carolina Stadium vs. Clemson was played in front of a sellout crowd of 8,242 fans, the second sellout of the season for the Gamecocks. South Carolina owns a 22-6 record in 28 career sellouts at Carolina Stadium since its opening in 2009.

BELCHER BRINGS IT

Senior left-handed pitcher Nolan Belcher pitched the first complete game shutout of his career in the 8-0 victory vs. Clemson. Belcher allowed just three hits and no walks while striking out seven batters in the win. Only one base runner reached third base the entire game for the Tigers. It is the first complete game shutout by a Gamecock pitcher since Sam Dyson on May 15, 2010 in a 5-0 win at Arkansas. Belcher's **complete game shutout** was also the first by a Gamecock pitcher in the Clemson series since May 4, 1986 when Rodney Richey hurled a four-hit complete game shutout in a 5-0 victory vs. the Tigers at Sarge Frye Field. Richey didn't walk a batter as well in his victory and struck out three batters. Richey went 7-2 that season with a 3.17 ERA for June Raines' squad. He would follow that up with a 10-2 season in 1987.

Belcher is now 2-1 on the year with a 2.18 ERA in a team-high 20.2 innings pitched. He has 23 strikeouts to just one walk. Opponents are hitting only .192 against him. This was Belcher's second career complete game. He pitched a complete game as a freshman on April 11, 2009 in an 8-1 win at Ole Miss.

MONTGOMERY WITH A CONVINCING START

Equally impressive on the mound was sophomore left-hander Jordan Montgomery, who opened the Clemson series with eight scoreless innings of work in the 6-0 win over the Tigers. Montgomery did not allow a runner to reach third base as he limited the Tigers to three hits and two walks in the victory. Montgomery tied a career-high with eight innings pitched for the third time in his career and struck out a career-high nine batters in the victory.

Montgomery was named the Tom Price Award winner at the conclusion of the series, the award given to the Gamecocks' MVP for the season series against the Tigers. Montgomery is only the third Gamecock pitcher to earn the award that has been given since 2001. Also earning the award was right-handers Aaron Rawl (2003) and Nick Godwin (2008).

DANTZLER WITH THE HOT BAT

Senior first baseman LB Dantzler continues to swing a solid bat for the Gamecocks. Dantzler is hitting .462 (18-for-39) with 12 runs scored, four homers and 15 RBI. Dantzler currently holds a nine-game hitting streak as well. Dantzler had a two-out RBI single in the 6-0 victory at Clemson. He added a solo home run in the 6-3 loss in Greenville and went 1-for-3 with a walk and a run scored in the 8-0 win. Dantzler's on-base percentage is a team-best .600. He leads the SEC in slugging percentage, is second in on-base percentage and third in batting average.

Dantzler was named SEC Player of the Week after the Albany series when he went 9-for-13 (.692) at the plate with two doubles, two homers, six runs scored and 10 RBI. He had 17 total bases for the weekend with a .733 on-base percentage as well as a 1.308 slugging percentage. In an 8-3 win, Dantzler tallied a career-high four hits and career-high five RBI with a home run. He followed that up with a 2-for-4 game with three runs and four RBI in the 14-1 win and closed out the weekend 3-for-4 with a run scored and two RBI in the 6-4 victory.

PANKAKE SIZZLING

Sophomore shortstop Joey Pankake crushed a three-run homer in the 10-0 win over Ball State and followed that up the next day with another three-run homer in the 14-4 win over the Cardinals.

Pankake is hitting .314 (11-for-35) with eight runs scored and 11 RBI. He has a .409 on-base percentage to go along with a .543 slugging percentage.

START ME UP

Four Gamecock position starters have started all 11 games: First baseman LB Dantzler, center fielder Tanner English, left fielder Graham Saiko and infielder Max Schrock.

MIX IT UP

Many Gamecocks were in the mix to help Carolina to a series victory vs. Clemson. Nine different Gamecock position players had at least one RBI over the weekend. Dantzler, Saiko, Schrock, Grayson Greiner, Chase Vergason and Connor Bright all had two RBI over the weekend with English, Joey Pankake and Erik Payne each driving in a run as well.

GREINER FINDS SUCCESS IN THE CLEMSON SERIES

Sophomore catcher Grayson Greiner was the team's leading hitter in the Clemson series hitting .364 (4-for-11) with a double, three runs scored and a pair of RBI. He also stole two bases and caught both the Friday and Sunday victories.

Greiner added a pair of hits and three RBI in the 14-4 win over Ball State. Greiner is hitting .278 (10-for-36) for the season with three doubles and eight RBI.

TYLER WEBB MAKES HIS MARK

Senior left-hander Tyler Webb struck out the side to combine with Montgomery for the three-hit complete game shutout in the 6-0 win over Clemson. Webb has made a team-high six appearances and has three saves in 5.0 innings pitched. He has 10 strikeouts to just two walks with opponents hitting .133 against him. Webb's third save came in the 5-2 win over Furman with one scoreless inning of relief with two strikeouts.

Webb has 84 appearances in his Gamecock career, seventh all-time in school history. The record is 102 set last year by Matt Price (2009-12). He has pitched in relief in 72 of those appearances, with 57 relief appearances without allowing a run (79.1 percent). In career relief appearances he is 8-1 with six saves.

WESTMORELAND EFFECTIVE IN RELIEF

Senior left-hander Adam Westmoreland was effective in relief in Saturday's 6-3 loss. Westmoreland worked 4.1 innings and allowed just one run, unearned, on three hits with no walks and seven strikeouts. Westmoreland's seven strikeouts ties for second highest in his career and the most for him in a relief outing. Westmoreland has nine strikeouts in 7.2 innings of work this season.

A HIT

Eight of nine Gamecock position starters had at least one hit in the 8-0 win vs. Clemson as the team finished with 11 hits for the afternoon. Greiner, Bright and Vergason all had two hits apiece to lead the Gamecocks at the plate. Bright went 2-for-3 with a two-run double with Greiner 2-for-4 with two runs scored and a RBI and Vergason 2-for-4 with a RBI and a run scored.

A BIT OF ENGLISH

Sophomore center fielder Tanner English has reached base safely in 10 of 11 games this year. English is hitting .324 (11-for-34) with nine runs scored. He has a .500 on-base percentage.

JACK OF ALL TRADES

Freshman left-hander Jack Wynkoop retired the first 16 batters in the 10-0 win over Ball State. Wynkoop allowed just two hits in six innings of work with no walks and struck out five batters to earn the win.

The 5-2 win over Furman featured the first career start and victory for Wynkoop. Wynkoop hurled 5.1 scoreless innings, scattered five hits with no walks while striking out a pair of batters.

Wynkoop is 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA in 11.1 innings pitched with a walk and seven strikeouts.

EVAN ALMIGHTY

Sophomore right-hander Evan Beal had 2.2 perfect innings of relief in the 5-2 win over Furman with three strikeouts. He has five strikeouts in 3.2 innings pitched on the year with a 0.00 ERA.

AT THE PLATE & ON THE FIELD

Carolina has done a very good job getting on base in the first 12 games of the season. The team has 72 walks and 12 hit by pitches to just 71 strikeouts for the season. Carolina is hitting .294 (114-for-388) as a team with 88 runs scored. Carolina is fielding .980 for the year with just nine errors. Carolina and LSU rank at the top of the league in fielding.

ON THE MOUND

The Gamecock pitching staff has a 2.21 team ERA in 106.0 innings pitched. Carolina has 105 strikeouts to just 27 walks with 79 hits allowed. Opponents are hitting just .205 against the squad.

ON BASE WITH CHASE

Senior infielder Chase Vergason homered and had a pair of hits in the 8-0 win vs. Clemson. He also homered in the 14-1 win over Albany. Vergason finished 3-for-4 with two runs scored and three RBI in the Albany game. The three runs batted in were a career-high with the three hits tying a career-high as well.

Vergason is hitting .314 (11-for-35) with 11 walks and a .478 on-base percentage.

SCHROCK DRIVES THEM IN

Freshman infielder Max Schrock has at least one RBI in eight of the 12 games played this year. Schrock went 3-for-5 with two runs scored and two RBI as well as three stolen bases in the 14-4 win over Ball State.

A BRIGHT SPOT

Sophomore outfielder Connor Bright was 1-for-2 with a run scored in the 10-0 win over Ball State and went 2-for-3 with a two-run double in the 8-0 win vs. Clemson. He has hit .385 (5-for-13) with two runs scored.

A NO-NO

Sunday's 14-1 victory featured a combined no-hitter by Colby Holmes, Forrest Koumas and Josh Knab. It is the first no-hitter by a Gamecock team in 38 years since March 26, 1975 when Ray Lavigne hurled a no-hitter in an 8-0 win over George Mason. It is the seventh no-hitter in school history and the first combined no-hitter as well.

Holmes opened the outing with six innings of work allowing just one walk and an unearned run. He struck out three batters. Koumas followed with two scoreless innings in which he walked three and struck out one. Knab closed out the no-hitter with a perfect ninth inning inducing three consecutive groundouts. Holmes is now 1-0 with a 1.46 ERA in a team-high 12.1 innings pitched. Opponents are hitting just .077 against him.

MORE ON DANTZLER

Dantzler tied three Carolina Stadium records for a three-game series with 17 total bases, nine hits and six runs scored in the Albany series. It is the most hits in a three-game series at Carolina Stadium since Jackie Bradley Jr. tallied nine in a three-game series vs. Vanderbilt (May 1-3, 2009). It's the most total bases since Nick Ebert finished with 17 vs. Georgia (May 14-16, 2009) and the most runs since Jackie Bradley Jr. had six vs. Mississippi State (April 2-4, 2010).

SAIKO LEADS IT OFF

Junior outfielder Graham Saiko is hitting .310 (13-for-42) for the season with a .439 on-base percentage and a team-high 12 walks. He has scored 11 runs as well.

Saiko went 3-for-4 with a RBI and a run scored in the 10-0 win over Ball State.

Freshman right-hander Curt Britt earned his first career save in his first career stint on the mound vs. Albany. Britt worked four innings of relief in the 8-3 victory over the Great Danes and allowed just one run on two hits with no walks and three strikeouts.

NINE TO FIVE

Carolina's nine-run total in the bottom of the 5th inning vs. Albany was the most runs in an inning by the Gamecocks since 10 on March 9, 2010 in the bottom of the third of a 12-4 win over Valparaiso.

1977 GAMECOCKS HONORED

Before last Saturday's game vs. Albany, the Gamecocks honored members of the 1977 National Runner-Up squad. June Raines' first club was recognized for their achievements and presented College World Series rings. Former players that returned were: William Allen, Jamie Chakales, Ronnie Crapps, John Hinkel, Hal Hutchens, Mark Kish, Randy Martz, Chuck McLean, Richard Ness, Robbie Parrish, Don Repsher, David Small, Michael Toalson and Mookie Wilson. Steve King's daughter also accepted her father's ring. Athletic trainer Daryl Driggers, assistant coach Johnny Hutton and June Raines attended as well.

A FIRST

For the first time in school history, South Carolina opened a season with three consecutive one-run games. Last year, the Gamecocks opened the year with two one-run victories vs. VMI.

OPENING DAY

South Carolina is now 83-38 on Opening Day. The Gamecocks have won 15 consecutive Opening Day games. The win also marked head coach Chad Holbrook's first career victory as a head coach in collegiate baseball. South Carolina is 9-3 on Opening Day in one-run games dating back to 1970.

WHAT A RALLY

The seven-run rally for the Gamecocks in the 8-7 victory over Liberty was the largest comeback from a deficit since Carolina rallied from an eight-run deficit in a 15-12 win at Tennessee on May 9, 2009.

TANNER'S JERSEY RETIRED

Before the season opener, former head coach and current athletics director Ray Tanner was honored for his 16 years as a head coach for the Gamecocks. The pre-game ceremony was topped off by the retiring of his No. 1 jersey, the first jersey to be retired in South Carolina baseball history.

Tanner served as head coach of the baseball program for 16 seasons from 1997-2012. Tanner led South Carolina to back-to-back NCAA Division I Baseball Championships in 2010 and 2011 as well as a pair of national runner-up finishes, six College World Series appearances, three SEC championships, six SEC Eastern division titles, a SEC tournament crown. He went to 10 NCAA Super Regionals in 14 NCAA Tournament appearances as well.

Under the direction of Tanner, South Carolina's postseason success from 2010-2012 is arguably the greatest run in collegiate baseball history. In the three-year span, the Gamecocks established NCAA records with 22 consecutive postseason wins and 12 consecutive wins in the College World Series. The Gamecocks won the NCAA Division I Baseball Championship in 2010 and 2011 with a national runner-up finish in 2012. Tanner went 738-316, his winning percentage for the Gamecocks was .700, the second highest winning percentage in SEC history.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA HONORS

Sophomore catcher Grayson Greiner, senior left-handed pitcher Tyler Webb, senior right-handed pitcher Colby Holmes and sophomore left-handed pitcher Jordan Montgomery all earned Preseason All-America honors. All four were named to the 2013 Louisville Slugger Preseason All-America team as announced by *Collegiate Baseball*. Greiner was a second-team selection with Holmes, Montgomery and Webb named to the third team.

Greiner returns after earning Freshman All-America honors last season by Collegiate Baseball. He was a SEC All-Freshman selection and hit six homers with 32 RBI with 13 doubles as well.

Webb, who garnered second-team Preseason All-America honors earlier in the

month from the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association, went 6-1 with a 1.56 ERA last year in 39 relief appearances.

Montgomery and Holmes both were starters last season. Montgomery went 6-1 with a 3.62 ERA in 74.2 innings with Holmes going 7-2 with a 3.05 ERA in 79.2 innings. Montgomery also earned Freshman All-America honors last year.

SOME MORE RECOGNITION

Baseball America recognized several Gamecocks in their college preseason preview.

Sophomore shortstop Joey Pankake was rated the No. 9 best prospect in the SEC for the 2014 Draft as well as the No. 35 sophomore in the country. Pankake was also selected as the infielder with the Best Arm in the SEC.

Sophomore catcher Grayson Greiner was right behind Pankake and rated the No. 10 best prospect in the SEC for the 2014 draft as well as the No. 44 best sophomore. Greiner was also recognized as the catcher with the Best Arm in the SEC.

Freshman infielder Max Schrock is rated the No. 6 best newcomer in the SEC and the No. 19 best freshman in college baseball with sophomore outfielder Tanner English named as the Fastest Runner in the SEC and the No. 48 best sophomore in the nation.

Several Gamecock seniors are recognized with left-hander Tyler Webb rated the No. 12 best senior, infielder LB Dantzler the No. 30 best senior and right-handed pitcher Colby Holmes the No. 47 best senior in the nation.

OH CAPTAIN - MY CAPTAIN

Senior left-handed pitcher Nolan Belcher, senior infielder LB Dantzler and senior right-handed pitcher Patrick Sullivan have been named captains for the season. They earned the honor after a vote by their teammates.

GAMECOCKS SELECTED TO FINISH THIRD IN EASTERN DIVISION IN SEC COACHES POLL

South Carolina was selected to finish in third place in the Eastern Division in the 2013 SEC Preseason Coaches' Poll that was released on Tuesday, Feb. 12. Both the Gamecocks and Kentucky shared a tie for third place in the poll. The Gamecocks won the SEC East in 2012 and tied for first place and the SEC championship in 2011. Carolina has finished in the top three places of the SEC Eastern Division 16 of 21 seasons since joining the league. The 2013 season begins on Friday, February 15 as the Gamecocks host a three-game series with Liberty at Carolina Stadium.

Arkansas is the choice to win the 2013 SEC championship with Vanderbilt the choice to win the East. In addition to picking a preseason champion, the head coaches voted a predicted order of finish in the SEC Eastern and Western Divisions. Points were compiled on a 7-6-5-4-3-2-1 basis for each division. Coaches were not allowed to vote for their own team.

Head Coach Chad Holbrook

Chad Holbrook was named head baseball coach for the University of South Carolina on July 16, 2012. Holbrook was promoted to the top spot by athletics director Ray Tanner after serving four seasons as associate head coach and recruiting coordinator for the Gamecocks.

"Coach Holbrook is a man of tremendous character and experience," said Tanner. "He will successfully lead our Gamecocks for years to come. This job as South Carolina's head baseball coach could have attracted many across the country, but the best man for this job was already here. Coach Holbrook's a great recruiter and evaluator of talent. He will be a great ambassador for the University of South Carolina."

Holbrook came to South Carolina in July 2008 as associate head coach. Along with his recruiting coordinator duties, he served as hitting instructor, overseeing the Gamecock offense, including base running and the short game and was the third base coach. He also worked with the outfielders. Holbrook came to the Gamecock program after serving 15 seasons as a member of the University of North Carolina coaching staff. Holbrook was recently honored as the 2011 ABCA/*Baseball America* Assistant Coach of the Year.

A tremendous evaluator of talent, Holbrook recently was named the No. 10 best recruiter in all of college sports by *ESPNU & ESPN The Magazine* in the publication's 2011 January edition. The list was put together in conjunction with three-dozen experts who were asked the question: Who are the top 20 recruiters in college sports? Holbrook was the only baseball coach on the list.

Holbrook's offensive prowess has made an immediate impact on the South Carolina baseball program in his first four seasons. His guidance was instrumental in helping the Gamecocks to back-to-back national championships in 2010 and 2011 at the College World Series as well as a national runner-up finish in 2012.

Holbrook helped in the development of two-time All-America Christian Walker, who led the Gamecocks in all three Triple Crown categories the last two years. He finished 2012 hitting .321 (77-for-240) with 11 homers and 55 RBI as well as a .450 on-base percentage and a .525 slugging percentage. Walker was a fourth round selection by the Baltimore Orioles in the 2012 MLB Draft. Walker was named to the CWS All-Tournament team for a third time. He tied a CWS record for hits also in a career as he notched 28 that put him alongside Dustin Ackley of North Carolina (2007-09), ironically also a player that Holbrook recruited and coached in Chapel Hill.

Holbrook helped bridge together a new crop of Gamecocks in the 2012 season as he molded newcomers Tanner English, Grayson Greiner and Joey Pankake into SEC All-Freshman honorees. All three would factor into Carolina's successful season. The group of newcomers was also rated the top recruiting class in the country in 2011 by *Collegiate Baseball* and No. 6 in the nation by *Baseball America*.

Holbrook played a key role in 2011 MLB supplemental draft selection Jackie Bradley Jr.'s Gamecock career. In 2010 Bradley was a 2010 All-SEC selection and College World Series Most Outstanding Player. That season, Holbrook helped to oversee an offense that peaked in the

postseason with a .309 batting average in 12 postseason contests. Evan Marzilli was the team's top postseason hitter with a .419 average (18-for-43) with Walker right behind him at .389 (21-for-54) and Bradley hitting .348 with four HR and 17 RBI. Carolina finished the season with a .300 team batting average as well as a .392 on-base percentage. The squad's 734 hits were second highest in the conference with the team also tallying 298 walks, 14th highest in the country.

In 2009, Holbrook's first season, the Gamecocks finished with a team batting average of .310 on the year, the highest average in the last nine seasons, along with an improved on-base percentage of .394 and a .528 slugging percentage. Carolina was fifth in the nation with 109 home runs. Among the players he tutored that first year were Freshman All-America Jackie Bradley Jr. and 2009 All-SEC selections, Justin Dalles, Nick Ebert, Bobby Haney and DeAngelo Mack.

Prior to joining the Gamecock program, Holbrook worked for 15 seasons on the North Carolina coaching staff. While at UNC, the Tar Heels made 11 NCAA Tournament appearances including four NCAA Super Regionals and three trips to the College World Series. The 2007 squad captured an ACC championship, the first at UNC since 1990 when Holbrook was a freshman.

At UNC, Holbrook mentored several top players including 2008 second-team All-America outfielder Tim Fedroff, third-team All-America first baseman Dustin Ackley and third-team All-America second baseman Kyle Seager. Ackley also earned third-team All-America honors in 2007 and was both *Baseball America & Collegiate Baseball's* Freshman of the Year. Ackley was drafted No. 2 overall in the 2009 MLB Draft by the Seattle Mariners. In addition, Holbrook was instrumental in recruiting current Major League Baseball players Daniel Bard, Matt Harvey, Chris Iannetta, Andrew Miller, Seager and Ackley to UNC.

As recruiting coordinator for the North Carolina program, Holbrook put together consecutive top 10 recruiting classes that helped the Tar Heels in making three consecutive College World Series appearances. From 2006-2008, North Carolina led the nation in wins with 54 in 2006, 57 in 2007 and 54 in 2008. *PG Cross Checker* ranked his last UNC recruiting class No. 3 in the nation. Holbrook's 2007 class ranked fourth in the nation by *Baseball America* with his 2006 class selected eighth in the country. *Baseball America* also ranked his 2004 class 11th in the nation with the publication naming the Tar Heels recruiting class of 2003 as the No. 1 group in the country. That 2003 class tied for first in *Collegiate Baseball's* recruiting rankings with South Carolina.

Under Holbrook's eye, UNC batted .324 as a team in the 2008 season and posted six of the top seven hitting seasons in Tar Heel history. The Tar Heels led the nation in hits in 2007 as well with 820 to finish the year. The school record for batting average in Chapel Hill was also set under Holbrook's direction in 2002 when the Tar Heels finished with a .325 mark.

Holbrook served as undergraduate assistant coach in 1994 and was promoted to full-time assistant in the fall of 1994. Holbrook served as assistant coach up to 2007 when he earned a promotion to associate head coach. Holbrook worked one summer in the Cape Cod League as head coach of the Harwich Mariners in 1997 where he led them to the Eastern Division championship.

Before joining the North Carolina staff, Holbrook played for the Tar Heels from 1990-93. He was a second-team All-ACC selection as a senior when he hit .353 at the plate. He also earned all-tournament team honors in 1993 at the NCAA Central I Regional in College Station, Texas, where he hit .565 (13-for-23) with three doubles and two triples in five games. Holbrook sits second all-time on the UNC list for triples with 14 in his career as well as 40 stolen bases. His stolen bases record was broke by Brian Roberts, who played for UNC from 97-98 before transferring to South Carolina.

Holbrook is a 1994 graduate of North Carolina with a degree in physical education. He is the son of Eddie Holbrook, former head men's basketball coach for Gardner-Webb and Furman. Holbrook and his wife, the former Jennifer Hilliard, were married in August of 2000. They have two sons, Reece, who was born on May 4, 2002, and Cooper, who was born on June 14, 2004.
