### No. 18 Gamecocks Host LSU In Pink Game Live Sunday on ESPN

No. 18 South Carolina returns home as the SEC leader with two games remaining, beginning with Sunday's 1 p.m. fixture against LSU that will be televised live on ESPN. The game is South Carolina's "Kick for the Cure Pink Game" for breast cancer awareness.

#### THE NATION'S STINGIEST DEFENSE?

South Carolina's backline has now limited 10 consecutive opponents to four shots on goal or less, a streak that includes six road games, four home games and all SEC competition. All 10 teams were also limited to 10 total shots or less with the streak dating back to the road victory at then-No. 22 Wake Forest in the non-conference finale.

#### MOLLIE PATTON'S COUNTDOWN TO 33

Heading into the weekend, senior goalkeeper **Mollie Patton** has 30 career solo shutouts at South Carolina. Her 30 shutouts are three shy of tying the SEC record of 33, held by Megan Rivera of Auburn (2001-04). She already holds the SEC records for consecutive shutouts (7) and single-season shutouts (15), and was already the South Carolina all-time record holder before the season began. Patton played 45 minutes in the 7-0 win against Mississippi State, a combined shutout that does not count towards the record.

## ON THE HORIZON

South Carolina hosts Florida Friday night at 7 p.m. in a game that will determine the SEC Regular Season and East Division champion. Entering Sunday's games, three teams (South Carolina, Florida, Georgia) can win the SEC title, but everything will depend on the SC-UF final score regardless of Sunday's results. Friday's match will be televised live on SUN Sports.

## THE ROAD TO ORANGE BEACH

South Carolina leads the SEC at 7-1-1 with 22 points, taking the top spot over Florida (7-1-1) due to tiebreakers. With two games remaining, Carolina can finish first, second or third in the league with either finish marking a program best finish. The SEC tournament is played at the Orange Beach Soccer Complex in Orange Beach, Ala., taking the top eight teams in the standings.

## SCOUTING LSU

LSU enters Sunday as the SEC West leader at 3-3-0 in conference action. The Tigers have gone 0-3-1 against ranked opponents this season, recently falling 2-0 against Florida. LSU is led offensively by junior transfer Natalie Martineau's five goals and one assist for 11 points. Highly touted freshman Megan Kinneman sports a 0.74 goals against average with four shutouts and 38 saves since taking over starting goalkeeper duties.

## SC-LSU SERIES

Sunday marks the third consecutive meeting between South Carolina and LSU airing on ES-PNU. The Tigers won a 1-0 match in Baton Rouge last year when SC's **Ellen Fahey** left the match with a red card. Carolina returned the favor in the SEC Tournament by defeating the Tigers 8-7 in penalty kicks of the SEC Championship Game after a 1-1 draw after 110 minutes.

South Carolina holds a 6-2-4 edge in the series with the Tigers but the teams have tied three of the last four. Four of the last five matches have gone to overtime, including a 0-0 draw in Columbia in 2008 that saw Mo Isom earn seven saves to keep the Tigers in the game.

## JACOBS QUESTIONABLE

South Carolina senior forward **Brooke Jacobs** is questionable with a hamstring injury suffered against Alabama. The senior missed sat out of the Georgia and Arkansas games while playing only the opening 10 minutes against Tennessee last Sunday. In three games South Carolina has played without Jacobs since the 2008 season - a span of 64 total games played, the Gamecocks have gone 1-2 with losses coming against Western Carolina (2008) and Georgia (2010) along with the 3-1 victory at Arkansas Thursday night. Lolly Holland earned the start in her place against Arkansas.

## SUNDAY MADNESS

South Carolina has performed at a perfect level on Sunday afternoon matches, traditionally the toughest day of the week after playing a Friday game. The Gamecocks, 8-0-1 in Sunday matches this year, have outscored opponents 24-4 on Sundays with the lone blemishes coming in a 1-1 tie against Arizona State, a 5-1 win at Kentucky and a 2-1 win at Alabama. Carolina has scored 16 goals in SEC Sunday matches this year. For the record, that means 24 of Carolina's 37 goals have come on Sundays.

**THE 10-10-30 CLUB**

Junior **Kayla Grimsley** is one assist shy of becoming the first Gamecock to join the 10-10-30 club. Grimsley has 11 goals and nine assists for 31 points this season, numbers that pushes her to the top of the SEC list in goals, assists, points and game winning goals (5). In just her third season, Grimsley is already No. 2 in the South Carolina record books for career goals (32), assists (22) and points (86).

**EXCEEDING EXPECTATIONS**

For the fourth consecutive year Shelley Smith's 2009 squad exceeded preseason expectations by finishing strong in SEC play. Picked by the coaches to finish last in 2006, the Gamecocks earned fifth in the Eastern division. Picked to finish last in the East in the 2007 SEC Preseason poll, the Gamecocks tied a program record for wins en route to a fourth place division finish. Carolina was picked fourth in the 2008 preseason poll and again improved in the standings with a third place finish in the Eastern division. Coach Smith's team was again picked fourth in 2009 and responded with an SEC East runner-up finish that earned her SEC Coach of the Year honors.

**NEW-LOOK GRIMSLEY**

Junior **Kayla Grimsley**, an All-American candidate at forward, has been called upon to play many roles for the youthful Gamecocks in 2010. Already one of the most prolific scorers in Gamecock history, Grimsley has added to her M.O. as a distributionist as well. With nine assists already on the season - three coming on game-winning goals - Grimsley moves to No. 2 on the South Carolina all-time list with 22 in her career, behind the 24 put up by Mindy Sanders from 1996-99. Already in the Carolina top two in nearly every offensive category (including goals, assists and points), Grimsley now holds the freshman (6), sophomore (7) and junior (9) records for single-season assists. She's currently No. 3 in the NCAA this year in assists.

**GAMECOCKS ON TV**

South Carolina will appear on a TV a minimum of five times in 2010 with three of those games occurring on national TV, marking the fourth consecutive season that Carolina will play in front of a national audience. Five of Carolina's six SEC home games are televised, including the 3-0 win against Ole Miss (FSC), 7-0 win against Mississippi State (CSS) and 2-1 win against Tennessee (ESPNU). The LSU match will also be on ESPNU. The Florida game will be shown on SUN Sports.

**IN THE POLLS AND RPI**

South Carolina stands firm in the top 20 this week with national rankings of No. 18 by the NSCAA and No. 15 by Soccer Times. Carolina has also positioned itself as a potential NCAA host site with three games remaining as the No. 17 team in the latest RPI report. Carolina is second to only Florida in the SEC in the RPI report and is looking to host the NCAA's for the second consecutive year.

**SENIOR CLASS SETS THE RECORD**

The 2009 senior class left Columbia as the winningest senior class in program history, but the 2010 class took over that distinction after Sunday's win against Tennessee. The Class of '09 held a 55-23-14 (.674) record, but the Class of '10 currently claims a career record of 57-20-11 (.710) and has the chance to become the first class to advance to the NCAA Tournament all four years.

**NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

Junior **Kayla Grimsley** was named the National Player of the Week last week after her four-goal performance last weekend to push Carolina to the top of the SEC ladder. She is the third Gamecock to earn National Player of the Week honors behind Lindsay Thorstenson (2007) and Blakely Mattern (2009).

**PATTON AT THE TOP OF THE NATION**

Heading into the weekend, senior **Mollie Patton** sits sixth in the nation with eight solo shutouts. A Lowe's Senior CLASS Award nominee, Patton's 30 career shutouts leaves her three shy of tying the all-time SEC record of 33 set by Auburn's Megan Rivera (2002-04). She is No. 3 on the list of active goalkeepers with 30 career shutouts behind Central Michigan's Shay Mannino (31) and West Virginia's Kerri Butler (39).

**BARR'S UP**

Freshman Kelsey Barr has been a tenacious presence at center mid and has been one of the most solid freshmen to step on the field for the Gamecocks. A top reserve, Barr has seen her minutes steadily increase throughout the season and has turned into one of the most reliable players in the midfield at controlling pace and winning knockdowns.

### NATIONAL GAMECOCKS

Two Gamecocks find themselves among the nation's top 25 in various statistics as we hit the end of the season. Junior **Kayla Grimsley** has proven to be one of the top distributionists in the country at No. 8 (9 assists) in the NCAA in assists. Grimsley is also 10th in the NCAA in points at 29. Senior goalkeeper **Mollie Patton** sits sixth in the nation in shutouts at 8 despite not earning a solo shutout in a 7-0 win against Mississippi State that saw three goalkeepers play. Patton is also 20th in the nation in goals against average (0.61).

### SINCLAIR STARTS

Freshman midfielder **Elizabeth Sinclair** is a Gamecock to keep your eyes on. She immediately impressed with her work ethic and skills, taking her all of two games to crack the starting 11 in the spot vacated by the graduation of All-SEC performer **Kim Miller**. Sinclair brings the same all-around presence to the field that Miller gave the Gamecocks as a four-year starter.

### HOME AT THE STONE

South Carolina has been nearly unstoppable at Stone Stadium the past three seasons, posting a 39-6-6 record at home since 2006. The streak included a 15-game unbeaten streak from Aug. 31, 2006-Oct. 5, 2007 and a 13-game unbeaten streak at "The Graveyard" from Oct. 19, 2007-Oct. 23, 2008. The lone blemishes on the record are a double-overtime loss to Vanderbilt (Oct. 7, 2007), a loss to #7 Florida (Oct. 30, 2008), the NCAA Third Round thriller against #14 Wake Forest (Nov. 20, 2009) and losses to Louisville, Minnesota and Georgia this season.

### OFFENSIVE OUTPUT

After struggling to put the ball in the net for much of the non-conference season, South Carolina emerged as an offensive threat in SEC play with 15 unanswered goals in a three-game stretch. Since Kentucky went ahead 1-0 in that match, South Carolina went on a roll with five straight against the Wildcats, three goals against Ole Miss (3-0) and seven goals against Mississippi State (7-0). Carolina possesses the SEC's No. 2 offense and No. 1 defense overall.

### WATTS ADJUSTS EASILY

Sophomore **Christine Watts** played as Carolina's first person off the bench last season as a backup midfielder. This season, Watts has been asked to play a new role as the team's starting right back, and the transition has been seamless. She has already earned six assists from her new position with two of those assists coming on game-winning goals. Watts also hit the game-winning goal against Mississippi State.

### LOVEABLE LOLLY

Junior midfielder **Lolly Holland** has been one of the top reserves this season and responded with four goals. She started against Kentucky due to an injury to starter **Kira Campbell** and responded by notching her second goal of the year. She followed that up with goals against Ole Miss and Mississippi State and is currently tied for third on the team with four goals on the year. Her first tally came in the season opener against Boston University, which coincidentally was her first career goal as well.

### AU SO GOOD!

Freshman **Danielle Au** had an impact weekend at the Carolina's Cup with two goals, including the game-winner against Furman in overtime. She became the first Gamecock freshman (and second ever!) to score a golden goal since **Lexi Tourtelotte** (the only other to achieve the feat) did it against Evansville (Oct. 16, 1995) - a span of 15 seasons and 56 overtime games. For her efforts, Au was named the tournament MVP and picked up SEC Freshman of the Week and CollegeSoccer360.com Primetime Performer of the Week honors.

### MORE ON AU

Freshman **Danielle Au** has scored 10 points in South Carolina's last 12 games, including hitting the game-winning goals against Furman and Wake Forest. Au's game-winner against Wake Forest continued her record trend as she became just the second Gamecock freshman to ever hit a game-winning goal to defeat a ranked opponent. The only other was **Mindy Sanders** who score the game-winner in a 3-2 win against No. 9 Clemson (Sept. 18, 1996), the first game against a ranked opponent in South Carolina history.

### JACOBS HITS THE HAT TRICK

Senior forward **Brooke Jacobs** notched her first career hat trick with three goals in a 14-minute span against Mississippi State. The hat trick was the sixth in South Carolina history and the first against an SEC opponent. The last hat trick was performed by Erin Sullivan against The Citadel in 2006.

### CAMPBELL'S RETURN

Junior **Kira Campbell** missed the Kentucky game after suffering a concussion against Vanderbilt two nights before. She returned in the next game against Ole Miss and responded by knocking in her first career goal in the 15th minute for what proved to be the game-winner.

Junior defender **Ellen Fahey** missed the Gamecock Courtyard Cup after suffering an injury against Northeastern, and the leader at centerback was missed in the team's first game without her - a 1-0 loss to Louisville at home. In fact, in the three games South Carolina has played without Fahey since 2008, the Gamecocks have gone 1-2-0, with losses against the Cardinal this year and LSU last year, and the lone win coming against Ohio this season. Fahey returned to the pitch against Arizona State and will be looked upon as the leader at centerback.

### KORTNEY RHOADES IS BACK AS WELL

Junior midfielder **Kortney Rhoades** sat out the first four games of the season due to pre-season surgery, but the regular starter made her 2010 debut against Arizona State with 17 minutes off the bench. Rhoades will be eased back into the lineup over the next few games after not playing at Wake Forest. Her presence on the field adds another dimension to the Carolina attack as she brings another layer of creativity to go along with that of **Kayla Grimsley** up top.

### HENRY FILLS IN ADMIRABLY

Sophomore defender **Dani Henry** took upon one of the most high-profile jobs this year when she was called to fill in the centerback spot vacated by the graduation of consensus All-American **Blakely Mattern**. Henry, a top 150 recruit coming out of high school, has played nearly every minute of the season in the spot beside **Ellen Fahey**.

### MOLLIE PATTON: LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD CANDIDATE

Senior goalkeeper **Mollie Patton** has been selected as one of 30 candidates for the 2010 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award for women's soccer. Candidates are chosen based on their dedication and achievement in four areas: Classroom, Character, Community and Competition.

### KAYLA GRIMSLEY: MAC HERMANN TROPHY AWARD WATCH LIST

Junior forward **Kayla Grimsley** has been named as one of 45 players selected to the 2010 Watch List for the Missouri Athletic Club's (MAC) Hermann Trophy, the top individual award presented in intercollegiate soccer.

Grimsley's appearance marks the first time a Gamecock has been selected as a candidate for the prestigious award. The honor comes on the heels of being selected for the Preseason All-SEC team. She is a two-time postseason All-SEC selection, a TopDrawerSoccer Team of the Season selection.

### GILBERT GOES FOR GOLD

Freshman defender **Gabrielle Gilbert** had a strong opening week for the Gamecocks in her collegiate debut. The Canadian national earned starts against Boston and Northeastern at right back and hit the game-winning goal against the Terriers to become the first true freshman to score a game-winning goal on the season opening weekend since Melinda Carter scored the GWG against Davidson on Sept. 1, 1998.

### BREAKING STREAKS IN BOSTON

South Carolina opened the year with back-to-back road shutouts against Boston University and Northeastern, ending long home winning streaks for each team. South Carolina's victory at Boston ended a 20-game winning streak for the Terriers at Nickerson Field, dating back to the 2008 season opener. The victory at Northeastern ended a home unbeaten streak for the Huskies who had not lost a home game since October of 2008 and had not been shutout in 17 games.

### RETURNING CATEGORY LEADERS

Carolina returns six starters from last season's NCAA Tournament team. South Carolina will enter 2010 with a new look and new faces, but talent and depth will be available after Coach Shelley Smith signed 11 freshmen and added another standout during preseason training.

### Shelley Smith 10th Season

Shelley Smith enters her tenth season at the helm of the USC women's soccer program after turning the Gamecocks into conference and national title contenders with three consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances.

Smith moved Carolina into the upper echelon of programs after guiding the Gamecocks in 2009 to the program's first SEC title and a berth in the NCAA Round of 16, earning her SEC Coach of the Year and NSCAA South Region Coach of the Year honors. South Carolina was a No. 2 national seed in the tournament and finished with a 19-4-2 record, the best in school history. The team's 7-3-1 conference record was also a program best, and four players earned All-SEC honors.

The Gamecocks finished as one of the top defensive teams in the nation with a school record 15 shutouts, led by Mattern on the backline who was a consensus first team All-American in her final season. Grimsley finished the year with 33 points and was named an honorable mention All-American by Top Drawer Soccer. The team finished eighth in the nation in average attendance.

Carolina's success in the classroom also continued last season as her squad earned two Academic All-District honors in Mattern and Mollie Patton for the second consecutive year. Mattern was also named to the Academic All-America first team, making South Carolina one of only four teams in the nation - and the only in the SEC - to have an Academic All-American selected each of the past five seasons. Her team was also honored with its eighth NSCAA Team Academic Award. Smith has coached 131 SEC Academic Honor Roll recipients since coming to USC in 2001.

Smith has coached several top student-athletes at Carolina including Ashley Kirk, USC's first four-time All-SEC honoree, Carolina's first All-American in four-time All-SEC selection Blakely Mattern and two-time All-SEC performers Melinda Carter, Jessica Julin, Kayla Grimsley and Sarah Lentz. Julin is currently the captain of the Finland National Team and Carter played in the WUSA. The Gamecocks have earned 24 All-SEC honors in the last nine years.

In her first season as head coach at Carolina (2001), the Gamecocks were the third most improved team in the nation with an 8-7-3 overall record. Carolina also had one of the school's best home records, going 5-3 at Stone Stadium, allowing opponents to score only four goals in eight matches.

The success continued for USC in 2002 with 13 wins in Smith's second season. The year was highlighted with USC's first ever victories against Florida and Kentucky. Smith also led her team to ties against 2002 SEC champion Auburn and Eastern Division champion Tennessee.

Smith led the Gamecocks to another successful season in 2003 with 10 wins including a USC record eight-game unbeaten streak as well as a 6-2-1 record at home in Stone Stadium.

The 2004 season featured a win over No. 7 Clemson, the Gamecocks' first win over a ranked opponent since 1998, as well as a 6-3 mark in non-conference action. Ashley Kirk also became the first freshman soccer player in school history to be named SEC Freshman of the Year. In addition, Carolina set a school record for a home game-winning streak with six consecutive wins.

Following an injury filled 2005 season, the program took a big step forward in 2006 as USC went undefeated at home for the first time in school history with an 8-0-3 mark at Stone Stadium. The season culminated with the Gamecocks advancing to the SEC Tournament semifinals for the first time in Carolina history, as Blakely Mattern became the team's first Freshman All-American selection since 1998.

The 2007 season marked the official turning point of the program, tying the school record with 14 victories and advancing to the NCAA Tournament for only the second time in program history. Carolina posted a 14-6-3 overall record including a 5-4-2 mark in the SEC after beginning the season by becoming the first team ever to knock off defending national champion and top-ranked North Carolina in a season opening game at Fetzer Field in Chapel Hill. The Gamecocks ran to a 7-0-0 start to the season and peaked at No. 7 in the national polls. For the second consecutive season South Carolina advanced to the SEC Tournament semifinals after knocking off Tennessee for the first time in program history and earned the school's first bid to the NCAA Tournament since 1998. Blakely Mattern became the first sophomore to ever earn SEC Defensive Player of the Year honors in addition to becoming the first All-American in South Carolina history.

Smith cemented Carolina's position as a conference title contender and player on the national stage after guiding the Gamecocks in 2008 to their second consecutive NCAA Tournament bid and third consecutive SEC Tournament bid. The Gamecocks went 11-7-4 overall and earned five SEC wins for the third year in a row with only one senior on the roster. Respected as a top defensive team, the Gamecocks finished the regular season second in the SEC with eight shutouts and ranked in the top two in every major defensive category including goals allowed, points allowed, shots allowed and shots on goal allowed.

Besides her collegiate coaching, Smith was a member of the Region III ODP staff for the past five years, as well as an assistant for the '90 Regional Team. Smith also was a member of the 2003 U-14 National Camp staff for U.S. Soccer.

With a background in both semi-professional and collegiate soccer, Smith previously served as head coach at Rhode Island from 1997-2000. The 2000 NSCAA Northeast Region Coach of the Year, Smith rebuilt the URI women's soccer program,

compiling a 41-35-2 overall record. Smith took a program that was 2-16 her first year to 12-7-1 in her second season, marking the eighth-most improved won-lost record for a team in NCAA history. In 2000, Smith coached URI to its best record ever of 15-4-1, while reaching the Atlantic 10 Semifinals, a first in URI history.

Smith was nominated for the 2000 and 2009 National Coach of the Year. The New England Women's Soccer Intercollegiate Soccer Association (NEWISA) also named her its Division I Coach of the Year in 2000. She was the 1998 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year as well.

In addition to her experience as a coach, Smith brings experience from the semi-professional level. From 1996-2000, Smith played for the Boston Renegades in the W-1 League. Smith was captain in 2000 as she led Boston to the semifinals in the W-1 Championship. The Renegades reached the finals in 1998. Smith also had the opportunity to play overseas in 1994 as a member of the Sheffield United Women's Football Club in England.

Smith, a 1993 graduate of the University of Vermont with a degree in nutritional science, received her teacher's certificate from the same institution in 1995. Smith started all four years for the Catamounts. Her primary positions were center midfielder and central defender. She was a regional All-American in both 1992 and '93 in addition to being named First Team All-North Atlantic Conference each year from 1991-93. During her freshman year, the squad won the ECAC Tournament. Smith was named to Vermont's Athletic Hall of Fame in the summer of 2004.

Smith worked as an assistant coach at Dartmouth College from 1995-97. The Big Green made the NCAA Tournament in her second season with the program.

Smith is married to USC associate head coach Jamie Smith, a 1994 graduate of Providence College. They are the proud parents of two sons, Braden James, born on Nov. 25, 2003 and Evan Addison born on Jan. 6, 2006. The family resides in Columbia, S.C.

Smith has her USSF B license and the NCAA Advanced National Diploma. She is currently a member of the USYSA Regional Olympic Development Staff.
