With expectations surrounding this season, Staley believed it was important for her team to focus on the collective instead of any individual, knowing that to thrive in pressure situations, each student-athlete may have to sacrifice a piece of herself to become one team.















South Carolina Notables

- The Gamecocks are in their 41st season of women's basketball. It is the program's 24th season in the SEC and the seventh under head coach Dawn Staley. South Carolina has played in the last three NCAA Tournaments, including two trips to the Sweet 16 (2012, 2014).
- South Carolina's win over No. 22/22 Syracuse marked the first time the Gamecocks defeated the first ranked team they played in a season since 2002-03 when they topped then-No. 18 Boston College 54-51 on Nov. 30 in Albuquerque, N.M.
- After putting three different starting lineups on the floor in the first three games of the season, Staley sent the same opening five to floor in both games of the Junkanoo Jam – Alaina Coates, Elem Ibiam, Aleighsa Welch, Tiffany Mitchell and Khadijah Sessions.
- South Carolina's bench has accounted for 36.4 of the team's 78.4 points per game this season. In fact, the Gamecock bench is rivaling its opponents' total scoring as South Carolina ranks second in the SEC in scoring defense at 49.4 points per game
- With four Gamecocks standing at least 6-foot-4, South Carolina has scored 34.0 points per game in the paint this season, accounting for 43.4 percent of its total scoring. Meanwhile, the Gamecocks lead the SEC in 3-point field goal shooting, hitting 39.1 percent from outside the arc while averaging 6.8 made 3s per game to rank third in the league.
- South Carolina also leads the SEC in assists per game at 20.4, which ranks eighth in the nation. The Gamecocks have assisted on 102 of their 145 made field goals (70.3%).
- Defense is still a focal point for the Gamecocks, not allowing an opponent to reach the 65-point mark this season to rank eighth in the nation in scoring defense (49.4 ppg). In fact, in the last four seasons, South Carolina has yielded 70 or more points just seven times in 107 outings. An opponent has failed to cross the 60-point barrier in 77 of the 107 contests beginning with the 2010-11 season.
- Junior Tiffany Mitchell and forward Aleighsa Welch were named to both the Wooden Award Preseason Top 30 and the Wade Watch List. South Carolina is one of four programs with two entries on both lists.

- Be bring head coach Dawn Staley within one win of 300 in her career.
- Make the Gamecocks 6-0 for the third-straight season, aiming to rival Staley-era best of 10-0 in 2012-13 and 2013-14.

NC Central Series Notes

These two teams opened this series on Dec. 2, 2013, with South Carolina posting a 79-27 victory over NC Central. All 11 Gamecocks that got into the game scored at least two points with three finishing in double figures – Alaina Coates, Tiffany Mitchell and Aleighsa Welch. Then-junior Raquel Davis was the lone Eagle in double figures with 14 points.

NC Central is the first of three Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference foes the Gamecocks will take on this season. South Carolina hosts Savannah State on Dec. 14 before traveling to Hampton on Dec. 17.

Home Sweet Home

The Gamecocks are in the midst of unprecedented success at Colonial Life Arena,

having won their last 21 games on their home court, including the first perfect season in 2013-14. That 16-0 mark alone matched the previous record for win streak at the facility, originally set Jan. 20, 2002-Jan. 9, 2003. South Carolina's last loss at Colonial Life Arena was a 50-48 decision to then-No. 14 Texas A&M on Feb. 10, 2013.

Overall, South Carolina is 136-58 (.701) at Colonial Life Arena, including a 70-25 (.737) mark under head coach Dawn Staley. In the now 41-year history of the program, the Gamecocks are 381-155 (.711) in home games.

Offshore Outings

South Carolina returned from the Bahamas Saturday with the Junkanoo Jam Lucaya Division title, marking its third tournament win on international soil under head coach Dawn Staley. Her team swept three games in the 2012 Paradise Jam last season to win the Reef Division of that event. In her first season at South Carolina, Staley led her team to the title at the Cancun Thanksgiving Classic.

Poll Presence

This week's rankings extended South Carolina's string of Associated Press top-10 appearances to 14, the longest in program history. The previous high was 13 weeks from Jan. 22, 1980 through Dec. 16, 1980.

The AP's No. 1 ranking on Nov. 24 was the program's first, besting the No. 2 spot the Gamecocks held for five times in their history – Nov. 17, 2014; Preseason 2014-15; Jan. 2, 1982; Dec. 27, 1981; and Dec. 20, 1981..

The Gamecocks opened this season with their highest preseason ranking from the organization, coming in at No. 2 to best the previous high of No. 4 heading into the 1981-82 season.

SWAT Team

South Carolina leads the SEC and ranks 26th in the nation with 5.6 blocked shots per game this season. The effort is a continuation of last season, during with the Gamecocks shattered the school record for blocks in a season by 41, recording 240 over 34 games for a 7.1 average.

Four Gamecocks rank among the SEC's top 15 blockers, led by senior forward Aleighsa Welch with 1.6 per game (8), which puts her in the top 100 in the nation. It is an art the veteran has added to her resume just late last season. After recording 45 blocks in her first two seasons combined, Welch posted 47 last season, 37 of which came in the final three months of the season. Her now 100 career blocks ranks her 10th in program history.

Freshman A'ja Wilson and senior Elem Ibiam are tied for ninth in the SEC with 1.2 blocks per game (6), and sophomore Alaina Coates rounds out the quartet in 14th with 1.0 per game (5).

Zone Buster

Since the emergence of Elem Ibiam and the arrival of Alaina Coates last season, South Carolina has been a team feared for its inside presence. That perception got a boost with the

addition of Jatarie White and A'ja Wilson this season, and teams have packed into a zone early and often against the Gamecocks.

This season, South Carolina's guards have been effective at capitalizing in on what opposing teams are willing to cede in that defensive scheme – the 3-point shot. The Gamecocks lead the SEC and are 27th in the nation in 3-point field goal percentage, hitting 39.1 percent from outside the arc. After closing last season averaging 3.9 made 3s per game, South Carolina is off to a blistering 3.9 average this season, which ranks third in the SEC.

Bench Marks

While every player wants to be a starter, the Gamecocks have shown that the bench can be just as productive a position. The South Carolina bench as out-scored its starting counterparts twice this season and has out-scored the entire opposing team two times as well – Clemson (Nov. 20) and San Diego State (Nov. 23). In all, the bench as accounted for 46.4 percent of the Gamecocks' points this season.

Of the 19 double-figures games turned in so far this season, 10 of them have come from the bench – A'ja Wilson (4), Bianca Cuevas (2), Jatarie White (2), Alaina Coates (1) and Tina Roy (1). The production has come with just slightly fewer minutes on the floor – 18.2 per reserve per game compared to 21.8 per starter per game.

Crowd Control

With over 7,900 season-ticket holders, the Gamecocks have enjoyed unprecedented support at Colonial Life Arena this season. South Carolina is currently one of two programs in the nation averaging more than 10,000 fans so far this season and rank second in the nation in average attendance. In fact, the attendance for the last two games – 11,012 vs. Clemson and 10,301 vs. San Diego State – are two of the top three most attended games in the nation so far this season.

The Gamecocks drew 10,057 fans to their season opener against Southern Cal, the largest crowd for a home opener since the opening game at Colonial Life Arena drew 17,712.

South Carolina women's basketball has logged seven crowds of over 10,000 fans in Colonial Life

Arena history, six of which have come in the last three seasons, including all three home games so far this season.

Helping Hand

South Carolina has shown good ball movement and ability to find the best shot available so far this season. The Gamecocks lead the SEC and rank eighth in the nation with 20.4 assists per game this season, including two games of 25 assists each. In all, South Carolina has assisted on 102 of its 145 made field goals this season (.703). Last season's team set the mark for best percentage of the Dawn Staley era at 57.7 percent.

Trademark TM

Junior guard Tiffany Mitchell made her name last season for her versatility – the only player to appear in the rankings for scoring, rebounding, assists and steals in SEC action. The one element of her game that she had not exploited during that All-America campaign was her 3-point shooting, unleashing that weapon judiciously, attempting just 2.2 per game to account for just 22.1 percent of her field goal attempts on the season.

This season, the usually attacking guard has shown that opponents better be prepared to play her a little tighter around the arc. Mitchell is 20th in the nation in 3-point field goal percentage, hitting 54.2 percent from long range. She has made 2.6 3s per game to rank fourth in the SEC, and the outside shot has accounted for more than half of her field goal attempts (24 3FGA, 46 FGA).

Mitchell's heightened accuracy was on full display against San Diego State (Nov. 23) when her 6-of-6 effort from 3 was the best perfect game in program history.

Welch Watch

Already second in school history in career offensive rebounds (354), senior forward Aleighsa Welch looks to mount an attack on other parts of the Gamecock record book before closing out her career.

Bang off the Bench

Just as Alaina Coates earned the unprecedented double of SEC Freshman and Co-6th Player of the Year honors last season, freshman A'ja Wilson is putting in an early bid to repeat the feat.

The 6-foot-5 Heathwood Hall product started the season opener, but has thrived off the bench in the last four games averaging 14.8 points and 7.5 rebounds during the stretch. Overall on the season, Wilson is the only freshman to rank among the SEC's top 20 in both scoring and rebounding – 19th with 12.6 points per game, 17th with 7.0 rebounds per game.

E-I, E-I, No

Senior center Elem Ibiam is making a charge for the school record for career blocks this season after setting the single-season mark with 83 in 2013-14. The Fayetteville, Ga., native is currently fifth with 136 in her career, trailing Demetress Adams (2006-09) in fourth place at 140. The Gamecocks' career record of 177 of set by Lakesha Tolliver (2004-07) is also well within reach.

Power of Three

Prior to the season, espnW ranked the top 25 college players in the nation, and a trio of Gamecocks made the list. Reigning SEC Player of the Year Tiffany Mitchell was tabbed No. 4 in the nation because "[her] greatest strength is that she doesn't really have a weakness.

Shooting, penetrating, distributing, rebounding, defending and leading from her point guard spot are all part of Mitchell's resume," according to Charlie Creme. Two-time All-SEC selection Aleighsa Welch came in on the No. 7 spot for her ability to "come up with the big basket or the big rebound when the Gamecocks need it most," per Michelle Smith. 2014 SEC Freshman of the Year Alaina Coates captured the No. 25 position after a season in which she was "just scratching the surface of her potential...she could be unstoppable inside, even without a large repertoire of moves," per Mechelle Voepel.

Back in (Garnet and) Black

A huge reason the this season's lofty expectations is the return of all five starters among the 10 returning letterwinners. The Gamecocks return 97.6 percent of their scoring, 96.0 percent of their rebounding, 98.4 percent of their assists and 97.1 percent of their school-record shot blocking from last season's top-10 squad. Nine of the 10 returners played in at least 29 of the team's 34 games last season and contributed at least 2.0 points per game.

Elite Additions

The Gamecocks added the nation's No. 2 signing class to their core of returning letterwinners. Four of the five signees will take the court for the Gamecocks this season, led by No. 1 A'ja Wilson and No. 7 Jatarie White. Two other top-35 signees – Bianca Cuevas, Kaydra Duckett – round out the group that will contribute this season.

SEC Title Talk

In 2013-14, South Carolina became the seventh program to win the SEC regular-season title and were predicted by the league's coaches and media to the repeat the feat this season. If Staley's group brings that forecast to fruition, it would be just the fourth team to repeat as the regular-season champion, joining Tennessee (multiple times), Georgia (1996, 1997) and LSU (2005, 2006).

Rare Company

As just the second sophomore ever to earn SEC Player of the Year honors from the league's coaches last season, junior Tiffany Mitchell was tabbed by the SEC coaches and media to claim the award again this season. If that prediction comes true, Mitchell would become just the seventh player to pick up the award twice in her career, joining South Carolina assistant coach Nikki McCray (1994, 1995) among others.

South Carolina's other player of the year candidate last season, Aleighsa Welch also received votes for the award in both preseason polls. If she can dethrone her teammate this season, it would be the first time in league history that the same school had different student-athletes win the award in consecutive seasons.

Home Grown, Nationally Known

Since her arrival for the 2008-09 season, South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley has been working to protect her new home state's best prospects while fielding a team that competes at a national level. Her efforts have paid huge dividends as eight of the 15 members of this

year's team hail from South Carolina. Beginning with Aleighsa Welch, the first South Carolina player to sign a National Letter of Intent for Staley, the Palmetto State has frequently sent its players of the year to Columbia as Welch (2011), Asia Dozier (2012), Alaina Coates (2013), A'ja Wilson (2014) and Kaydra Duckett (2014) have each earned the title during their high school careers.

Cliney to Miss 2014-15 Season

South Carolina announced in September that the NCAA approved an initial eligibility waiver for freshman Doniyah Cliney, which allowed her to enroll in school but not compete for the Gamecocks in the 2014-15 season. The guard will focus on academics in the fall semester with an opportunity to begin practicing with the team beginning in the spring semester.

Cliney was ranked the 13th-best guard in the 2014 class and helped Malcolm X Shabazz to state titles in her final two seasons. The honorable mention all-state selection averaged 13.4 points,

DAWN STALEY

7th Season at South Carolina Virginia, 1992

When three-time Olympic gold medalist Dawn Staley took the reins of the University of South Carolina women's basketball program on May 10, 2008, the Gamecocks' stature immediately rose not just in the Southeastern Conference but on the national stage as well. Building on a foundation of hard work, defensive effort and a "team first" mentality, South Carolina began to realize those expectations in 2011-12. Three consecutive 25-win seasons were capped with the 2013-14 squad's 29-win effort that included the program's first SEC regular-season championship and No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament as well as the Gamecocks' second NCAA Sweet 16 appearance in three seasons.

In her 14 seasons as a head coach, Staley has amassed a 298-151 record, including her 126-71 slate in six seasons at South Carolina. She has led her teams to nine 20-win seasons, a total of 11 postseason appearances (two WNIT), highlighted by the Gamecocks' pair of Sweet 16 appearances and 14 weeks in the Associated Press top 10, including four in the top five. The future continues to brighten as the nation's top recruits make Columbia, S.C., a highly coveted destination. Consistently signing the top players in the state, Staley's 2014 group illustrated the seeds her staff had been sowing since its arrival as the No. 1 recruit in the class joined two other top-35 entries among the five-member class that was ranked No. 2 in the nation.

While her coaching career is blossoming, Staley is still recognized for her body of work as a one of the most decorated participants in United States women's basketball history. The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame solidified her legacy with her enshrinement into the Hall as part of the Class of 2013. The Phoenix Club of Philadelphia established the Dawn Staley Award recognizing the nation's top guard in women's Division I basketball in 2013 as well. Staley was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame as part of the Class of 2012 and was one of the final nominees for induction to the U.S. Olympic Hall of Fame the same year. In the summer of 2011, the WNBA recognized her as one of the league's "Top 15," honoring the most influential players in the league's history.

At the helm of the Gamecocks over the last six seasons, Staley has been named National Coach of the Year (2014, Basketball Times), Naismith National Coach of the Year Finalist (2014), SEC Coach of the Year (2014, Coaches and AP) and BCA Female Coach of the Year (2012). She has coached an All-American, 12 All-SEC selections, five SEC All-Freshman team selections, an SEC Player of the Year, an SEC Sixth Player of the Year, an SEC Defensive Player of the Year and two SEC Freshmen of the Year. South Carolina's 29 wins in 2013-14 were one shy of the overall school record, breaking the best mark since joining the SEC of 25 set in 2011-12 and tied in 2012-13. The Gamecocks have won more SEC games than the season before in each of Staley's last five seasons, and her 52 SEC victories are more than any other Gamecock coach and account for 44.8 percent of the program's total 116 league wins. She has helped the Gamecocks to three of the program's four top-four finishes in the SEC, including the first regular-season championship in 2013-14. Her 97 overall wins in the last four seasons marks the most successful four-year stretch in program history.
