The South Carolina women's soccer team earned its eighth trip to the NCAA Tournament in the last nine years when the 64-team field was announced Monday afternoon. The Gamecocks host a first round matchup vs. UNCW on Friday, Nov. 13 at 6 p.m. at Stone Stadium.

"We are thrilled to be home," said South Carolina head women's soccer coach Shelley Smith. "Credit to the (players). We've had a great season and we are rewarded with a home game. To get in the NCAA's and have a home game is tremendous."

South Carolina enters the tournament with a 12-4-3 overall record with UNCW 14-6-1 on the year. South Carolina is 3-0-1 vs. UNCW in the all-time series. Carolina defeated UNCW 2-0 on Aug. 23, 2013, the last time the two schools met.

The Gamecocks are one of six teams from the SEC to earn a spot in the tournament.

OFFENSE ON FIRE

Through 19 games this season South Carolina has scored 44 goals compared to last year's squad that netted 32 all season. The Gamecocks have had 17 different goal scorers.

IN THE RANKINGS

The Gamecocks are No. 16 in the latest NSCAA poll, No. 23 in the TopDrawerSoccer.com ranking, and No. 26 in the latest RPI released by the NCAA.

BY THE NUMBERS

South Carolina holds a 292-151 shot advantage over opponents through 19 games. The Gamecocks have put 146 of 292 shots on target, compared to opponents tallying 65 shots on goal. South Carolina averages 15.4 shots per game and is outscoring opponents 44-20 on the year. Averaging 2.32 goals per contest, the Gamecocks are tied for the 12th highest scoring offense in the country and second-highest in the SEC.

South Carolina ranks high and among the best in the SEC in several key offensive and defensive categories. The Gamecocks are second in the league with 43 assists for an average of 2.26 per contest. The Gamecocks are also second in goals per game (2.32) and points (131). South Carolina ranks fifth in goals against average at 1.00 and fourth in goals allowed with just 20 goals yielded.

In SEC contests the Gamecocks are second in fewest goals allowed with 11 and boast the third lowest goals against average with a 0.95 mark. The Gamecocks are one of only five teams to record three or more shutouts against league opponents.

ALL-SEC

South Carolina sophomore midfielder Savannah McCaskill earned first-team All-SEC honors with senior forward Raina Johnson picking up second-team All-SEC accolades, as announced by the league office.

McCaskill is the team's leading scorer and ranks among the top players in several offensive categories in the league with 10 goals and nine assists for 29 points on the year. McCaskill ranks tied for third in points, fourth in assists and eighth in goals. This is McCaskill's second consecutive All-SEC honor as she earned second-team honors her freshman season as well as SEC Freshman of the Year.

Johnson ranks second on the team in points with 18 on the year as she has tallied six points and six assists to her ledger including a pair of game-winning goals. Johnson has saved some of her best play for the SEC as well as she put together 14 of her 18 points in league play, fourth-best among conference players. This is Johnson's first All-SEC honor as a member of the Gamecocks.

ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

Junior midfielder Chelsea Drennan earned a spot on the CoSIDA Academic All-District 4 Team. She stands second in the Southeastern Conference with 10 assists on the season. She's now second in school history with 29 career helpers, four shy of the record. The junior majors in pharmacy.

Drennan is the 16th Gamecock woman honored with the distinction, gaining the 24th certificate for the program started in 1996. To be eligible for the award, a student must be at least a sophomore both academically and athletically and have a 3.30 cumulative grade point average. All the district winners move onto the national ballot, with the results of that vote set to be announced on Tues., Nov. 24.

LOOKING BACK

No. 16 South Carolina (12-4-3) and No. 19 Auburn (14-4-1) dueled to a 2-2 draw in the quarterfinals of the SEC Tournament before the Tigers eventually advanced to the semifinals 5-3 on penalty kicks at the Orange Beach Sports Complex.

The fourth-seeded Tigers converted all of their penalty kicks and secured a spot in the SEC semifinals after midfielder Ellie Leek found the back of the net on Auburn's fifth penalty shot.

Forwards Savannah McCaskill and Bay Daniel and midfielder Lindsey Lane all converted their penalty attempts for the No. 5 seed Gamecocks. Junior Sophie Groff, who saw her first action on the field since suffering an ACL injury last month, missed wide right on South Carolina's first penalty kick.

Anna Conklin and Simone Wark each scored for the Gamecocks in the contest.

The Gamecocks jumped out to a 2-0 lead, opening the scoring in the 20th minute on Conklin's third goal of the season after a series of nice passes by senior Carly Ray and McCaskill. Ray found McCaskill at the top of the attacking third, and the South Carolina forward threaded a beautiful through ball towards the right side of the box to Conklin. Conklin gathered the pass and raced into the box before calmly slipping the ball into the left corner of the net past Auburn goalkeeper Sarah Le Beau.

McCaskill's second assist of the night in the 61st minute made it 2-0 Gamecocks, as her cross from the right side of the box connected with Wark directly in front of the Auburn goal. The freshman striker stretched her foot out and deflected the ball that dribbled over the goal line.

The Tigers responded quickly, scoring less than one minute later to cut into the lead after a turnover by the South Carolina defense. Forward Kristen Dodson took advantage of the miscue, tallying her fourth goal of the season after receiving a pass from Brooke Ramsier.

In the 76th minute, Ramsier again provided the service for the Tigers, who evened the match at two. Her flick pass in the box found Leek, and the midfielder rifled a shot that sent the ball into the top right corner of the net.

Neither team produced a quality scoring chance in overtime, as the two combined for just four shots in the two 10-minute extra periods.

Gamecock goalkeeper Caroline Kelly turned in her best performance of the season on Wednesday, finishing with a season-high eight saves.

TEN STRAIGHT

The Gamecocks had a 10-game unbeaten streak this season that ended with a 2-0 loss at Ole Miss. During the 10-game stretch the Gamecocks won eight consecutive matches, went unbeaten in six-straight SEC contests and were 9-0-1 overall.

RAY EARNS SEC CO-DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Gamecock senior Carly Ray earned Co-Defensive Player of the Week honors from the Southeastern Conference after her two-goal outing against Tennessee on Thursday night.

On Senior Night at Stone Stadium, Ray tallied the brace with a pair of corner-kick scores in the first 15 minutes of the 4-0 win over Tennessee. For Ray, those stand as her first career goals. She also helped with the defensive effort that shut out the Volunteers, holding them to five shots in the match, only two on goal.

She's the second South Carolina player to earn Defensive Player of the Week honors this season, joining Abbey Crider's nod on Sept. 28.

Senior forward Raina Johnson netted the game-winner in South Carolina's matches against Texas A&M and Alabama. Johnson scored in the 89th minute to break a 1-1 tie in the Gamecocks' 2-1 victory over the Aggies and opened scoring in the sixth minute in a 3-0 win over the Crimson Tide.

TWO FOR GROFF

Junior forward Sophie Groff scored a pair of goals in two games this season (Coastal Carolina and Kennesaw State), including a game-winner in both contests. Groff also scored in the Gamecocks 3-0 win over Alabama. Her six goals rank 10th in the SEC. Groff is likely to miss the remainder of the 2015 season with a partial ACL tear to her right knee.

ROOKIES ARE ROLLING

Newcomers Carrie Lawrence, Courtney Kaplan and Simone Wark have found the back of the net early in their freshman campaigns, each tallying at least one goal this season. Wark scored the game-winner in the Gamecocks' 1-0 win at Missouri and earned SEC Freshman of the Week honors for her efforts. She also netted the equalizer in a 2-2 draw at Arkansas.

ROOM FOR TWO

Senior Caroline Kelly and sophomore Abbey Crider have split time in the net this season. Crider is 6-1-0 on the year with three shutouts. She has made 13 saves and has a goals against average of 0.80. Crider earned SEC Defensive Player of the Week honors for her performance against Texas A&M and Alabama. Kelly is 5-2-1 on the year with one shutout. She has made 15 saves and has a goals against average of 1.13. In SEC contests, Crider leads the league with a goals against average of 0.75 while Kelly ranks seventh (1.18). Crider's two shutouts against conference opponents tie for fifth.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE

The Gamecocks won eight-straight matches and are 9-1-0 at Stone Stadium in 2015. South Carolina posted an 8-3-1 record at "The Graveyard" last season and in 2013 the Gamecocks streaked to a perfect 11-0-0 record at home, the first in program history.

IT'S A FIRST

Sophomores Anna Conklin and Dominique Babbitt and junior Kaleigh Kurtz have all scored their first career goal this season.

THE FAST LANE

Sophomore midfielder Lindsey Lane netted the game winner in the Gamecocks' double overtime victory over Oklahoma. Three of Lane's four career goals have been game-winners.

GRAY FOR THE WIN

Senior defender Caroline Gray secured South Carolina's win in the season opener, scoring her first career goal against Northeastern.

HISTORY MAKERS

The Gamecocks reached the NCAA Elite Eight for the first time in program history in 2014 and the No. 9 ranking at the end of the year matched the 2009 team's mark for the best season-ending rank in school history.

PRESEASON SEC

The SEC coaches selected South Carolina to finish fourth in the league with Florida, Texas A&M and Kentucky claiming the top three spots.

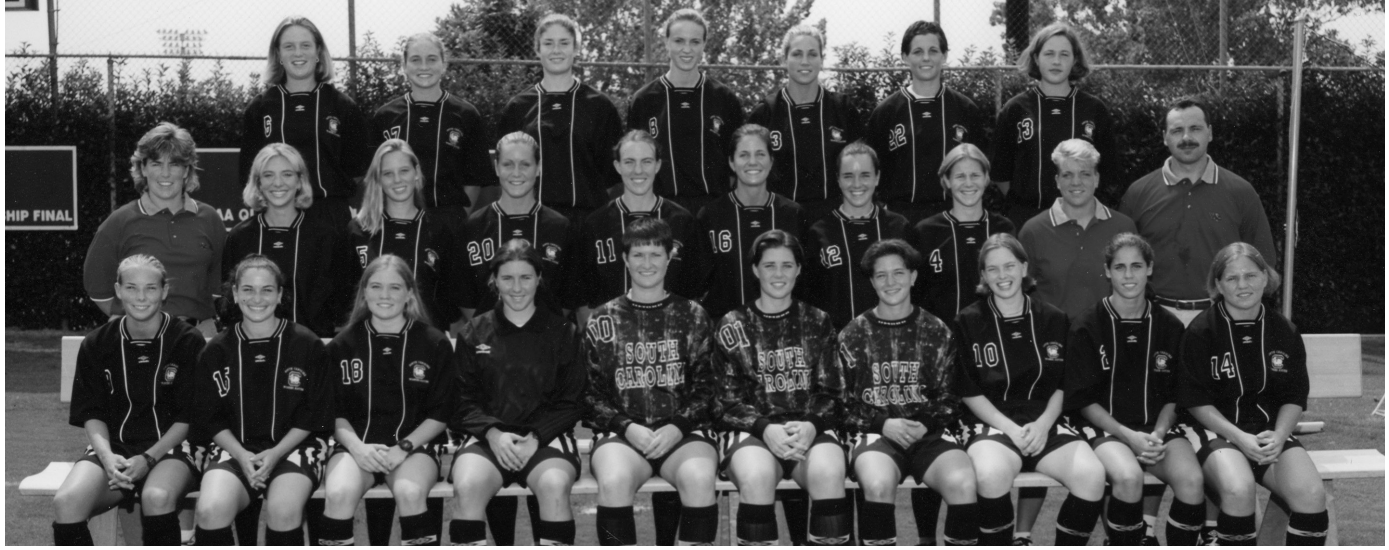

"It's an awful way to lose but that is the game of soccer," Shelley Smith said. "Unfortunately we didn't get the job done in PKs."

In penalty kicks, Duke hit its first three to give the Blue Devils a 3-0 lead after USC was unable to get it past GK Alison Lipsher. USC's Kim Miller then put one on the board for the Gamecocks, but the outcome had already been determined.

Officially for the Gamecocks this contest goes down as a tie, but semantics don't change the reality.

"It definitely feels like a loss," Smith said. "In this type of environment it is a loss because you're not able to play again."

The first half was scoreless after each team only mustered one shot on goal. In the second half, Duke's Lorraine Quinn broke the tie with a shot from 20 yards to give Duke the 1-0 lead at the 63:10 mark.

USC answered back two minutes later. Using her speed, USC's Darcel Mollon drew a foul to set up a Brittny Rhoades free kick. From the right corner, Rhoades sent the ball into the goalie's box where SEC Defensive Player of the Year Blakely Mattern was standing to put the ball in the bottom right corner of the net to tie it at 65:29.

Rutgers fought to the end though and came as close as possible in the 90th minute off a corner kick. A header by Wake Forest midfielder Bess Harrington in the final second of regulation found the back of the net for a goal as the Demon Deacons defeated South Carolina 1-0 as time expired in the NCAA Third Round at Stone Stadium on the campus of the University of South Carolina. Carolina forward Brooke Jacobs drove down the right side of the field in the 46th minute and hit a long shot that drifted deep into the box that was saved on line by Wake Forest keeper Amanda Barasha. Lindsay Small had a header in the 51st minute off a free kick that would also be saved by Barasha. Senior forward Samantha Diaz-Matosas would come close to a goal as Jacobs sailed in a ball that went to the far post and just a couple feet away from the foot of Diaz-Matosas. Wake Forest's Bess Harrington would have Wake's first strong goal opportunity in the 57th minute from 10 yards out only to see her shot saved by Gamecock keeper Mollie Patton.

No. 8 Virginia scored two goals in the run of play and a penalty kick with nine minutes remaining to knock No. 20 South Carolina out of the postseason with a 3-0 win in NCAA Second Round action at Klockner Stadium. The Cavaliers (15-4-2) advance to the Round of 16 while the Gamecocks end their fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance with a 15-6-4 record.

Virginia got on the board in the 21st minute with a rare assist by the goalkeeper. Chantel Jones sent her goal kick to midfield where it found the back of Meghan Lenczyk's head and flicked behind the Gamecock backline to give Sinead Farrelly a breakaway opportunity that she converted to make the score 1-0.

The Cavaliers added the second goal at 60:13 with a volley by Lindsey Miller. The senior one-touched the volley from the top of the '18 after a Gamecock header off a Virginia cross landed right at her foot. The final score was off a penalty kick by Julia Roberts in the 81st minute.

The match against Virginia marks the second consecutive year that the Gamecocks have played in the NCAA Second Round despite losing eight seniors and six starters from last year's SEC Championship team.

"I knew it would be a battle today," South Carolina head coach Shelley Smith said. "They are a very good program. Steve Swanson does a wonderful job with them. We knew it would take our best game, but unfortunately I don't think we played as well as we can. I'm really proud of the girls and their effort. They left it on the field. Despite a couple of miscommunication errors that led to some goals, that's not like us defensively. Virginia gave us everything we could handle today. They deserved to win and move on, and I wish them the best of luck."

Playing in front of a home crowd of 645 fans, the Cavaliers put constant, heavy pressure on the Gamecocks throughout the first half. Virginia had six shots and a corner kick in the opening 20 minutes before scoring the goal at 20:15. In contrast, Carolina's first shot came at 21:12 on a header by Danielle Au off a Kira Campbell free kick.

South Carolina used their first shot - which was on frame and saved by Jones - to begin pulling together some momentum on the offensive end. Less than a minute later, Ellen Fahey took a free kick shy of midfield that found its way to the goal for another Virginia save. However, Carolina would only get one more shot in the half, a bullet by Gabrielle Gilbert that went wide, as the team kept putting long touches on their passes that went out of reach of the attackers.

Virginia tallied the second goal almost out of nowhere after a series of throw-ins had the Gamecocks driving down the field and into the attacking third. Danielle Au's shot in the 58th minute went high but seemed to forecast a mounting Gamecock pressure before Miller sent home the volley off the mis-clearance in the Gamecock defensive end.

A Gamecock foul in the penalty area led to a penalty kick for Virginia's Julia Roberts, who made the score 3-0 at 81:07 with her PK slotted into the lower left corner. .

Top-ranked and unbeaten Stanford proved too much for the SEC Champion South Carolina Gamecocks in a 2-0 victory Friday night in NCAA Second Round action at Cagan Stadium.

“Obviously we knew Stanford was a very good team,” South Carolina head coach Shelley Smith said. “They showed that and proved that tonight. I’d think it would be hard for anyone in the country to beat them. A lot of credit to them to come out, do what they did and finish chances. I thought our team played very well. We made it hard for them to find that first goal. Credit to them to put away the opportunities but we can walk off the field with our heads held high because of our effort.”

The Gamecocks held top-ranked Stanford to their third-lowest scoring output of the season, and freshman goalkeeper Sabrina D’Angelo cemented her reputation as one of the top young Canadian goalkeepers with a stellar effort between the pipes with six saves. Stanford improved its home-unbeaten streak to 48 matches and won their 19th-consecutive match with goals by Mariah Nogueira and Taylor McCann.

The teams went into the half with Stanford holding a 1-0 lead courtesy of a goal headed home by Mariah Nogueira at 33:46 on a Teresa Noyola free kick. Stanford earned the set piece after a handball called on the Gamecocks on the right flank in front of the corner flag.

The match kicked off at 10:26 p.m. (ET) after the first match between Boston College and California went to a penalty kick shootout. As the teams lined up for the opening kick, a heavy rainstorm hit Cagan Stadium on a chilly 51-degree night in Palo Alto.

Both teams had good looks in the opening 10 minutes as Kayla Grimsley and Danielle Au led a 2v3 in the eighth minute that was picked up by the Stanford goalkeeper, and Stanford’s Kendall Romine had a blast from midfield in the ninth minute that clanged off the crossbar.

Stanford had a scare in the 26th minute when All-American Lindsay Taylor collided with D’Angelo on a challenge off a free kick that saw Taylor lay on the ground for one minute to collect herself. Four minutes later, Nogueira hit a header from range but couldn’t get it past a diving D’Angelo. She eventually scored three minutes later and almost doubled it in the 36th with a replica of the scoring play, but Andie Romness saved it off the line.

The opening 20 minutes of the second half saw a near even effort by the Gamecocks against the Cardinal with the rain no longer falling. Grimsley earned her first 1v1 chance in the 54th but was fouled after beating her defender to set up a free kick. Christa Neary was able to get the Gamecock look on the set piece, but her shot was blocked by a defender’s back to keep the Gamecocks away from frame.

Teresa Noyola gave Stanford its first chance to double its lead in the 65th when she found herself alone from 12 yards in front of the goal, but D’Angelo came up with the point-blank save to keep the All-American off the board. Stanford would eventually get the goal two minutes later when Taylor McCann sent one curling into the upper corner of the net.

The University of South Carolina women's soccer team (17-3-2) earned a 5-0 victory over Furman (17-4-2) in the first round of the 2013 NCAA Tournament on Friday night at Stone Stadium. Redshirt-junior midfielder Taylor Leach scored the game winner in the 15th minute and junior goalkeeper Sabrina D'Angelo secured the 12th shutout of the season for Carolina in the victory. South Carolina's 11-0 record at Stone Stadium this season is currently the best home record in school history.

South Carolina advances to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the fourth time overall, having advanced through the opening round in the 2009, 2010 and 2011 seasons previously. The win improves the Gamecocks' record in NCAA Tournament play to 5-5-1 overall, including a 4-1 record in games played at Stone Stadium, with all four of those wins coming as shutouts.

Freshman midfielder Chelsea Drennan collected two assists on the night, moving her into second all-time in the Carolina record book for assists in a season with 12. She also holds the record for single-season game-winning assists with six in 2013. Senior forward Danielle Au also collected two assists in the match, and she is now tied for seventh in the record book in career assists with 13.

Furman's India Robinson sent a hard shot wide of frame in the fifth minute, but D'Angelo was there to hold the ball from crossing the endline. The teams traded possession through the midfield until the Gamecocks marked the scoreboard in the 15th minute on Leach's eventual game winner.

Drennan stepped to the corner flag and sent a long cross to the far post from the right side, which senior midfielder Gabrielle Gilbert flicked to Leach, who headed towards goal. The ball deflected off a Furman defender before finding the back of the net for the early Gamecock lead.

Furman would threaten in the 17th minute when forward Jamie Alexander hit the crossbar with a strong attempt, but Carolina added to its lead just two minutes later.

Sophomore forward Raina Johnson scored her team-leading 10th goal of the year to push the Carolina lead to 2-0 in the 19th minute. D'Angelo collected her second-career assist with a long ball out of the defensive third, which Au continued forward into the path of Johnson. Battling a Furman defender, Johnson found the ball near ground level and hit a one-time volley past the Paladin goalkeeper for the score.

South Carolina once again added to its lead less than 10 minutes later.





On another corner from Drennan, freshman forward Daija Griffin and senior midfielder Liz Sinclair connected for assists before sophomore forward Coryn Bajema found the back of the net with a header to the far post past Hull.

Furman struggled to find a rhythm after the early goals, and the Gamecocks continued to hold the majority of possession.

Bajema found the back of the net again for her third goal of the season in the 34th minute. Drennan collected her second helper of the match, finding Bajema on the left side of the 18-yard box. The striker located Hull and sent a well-placed shot low to the far post for a 4-0 Gamecock lead.

Sophomore midfielder Stevie Parker nearly gave the Gamecocks another goal in the 44th minute on a strike that hit the crossbar, but the score held at 4-0 entering the halftime break.

South Carolina threatened early in the second half on an attempt from Au. The senior striker found an open slot 10 yards from frame, looking for the near post, but the Paladin goalkeeper forced the ball over the endline for the Gamecock corner kick.

Au collected her second assist of the night and her fourth of the season on Carolina's fifth tally of the match in the 62nd minute. Au found Sophie Groff in front of frame, and the freshman forward's attempt hit the near side goal post before crossing the goal line for the final Gamecock score of the match.

South Carolina dominated the remainder of the match and D'Angelo collected her SEC leading 12th shutout of the season.

Nov. 22, 2013 - South Carolina vs. Stanford (NCAA Second Round) Los Angeles, Calif.

A battle from the beginning between No. 14 South Carolina (17-4-2) and No. 17 Stanford (15-5-1) in the second round of the NCAA Tournament ended as Taylor Uhl netted the game's only goal less than two minutes into overtime to give the Cardinal the 1-0 win on a chilly night at Drake Stadium.

A quick play down the right flank, Stanford got a cross in before it was knocked back out. Midfielder Chioma Ubogagu corralled the ball at the top of the 18-yard box where she tapped it forward to Uhl who one-timed a soft shot past Gamecock keeper Sabrina D'Angelo inside the left post.

A stalemate throughout, neither team could find a way to break down the others defense.

Stanford had the first attempt of the game on a free kick from just outside the box in the fifth minute. After Courtney Verloo's first attempt was whistled back, her second attempt curled away from the left post.

Five minutes later, the Gamecocks earned the first corner of the night. A collision in the box occurred as the ball was in the air between Stanford keeper Jane Campbell and Gamecock defender Taylor Leach and the ball was knocked away. Midfielder Stevi Parker pounced on the loose ball, but her shot was over the crossbar.

In the 12th minute, Uhl hit a low shot from close range that crossed the face of goal, but it missed wide of the left post.

With the Cardinal keeping the ball in the Gamecocks half for much of the first 20 minutes, the Gamecocks began to settle in after bringing on several subs over the ensuing 10 minutes.

After a dangerous attacking run up the middle from forward Daija Griffin, the ball was poked away by a Stanford defender. Forward Coryn Bajema was got the loose ball and hit a shot from range, but the attempt landed in the hands of Campbell.

After 45 minutes of play, Stanford held a 4-2 advantage in shots, while both sides only produced one shot on goal.

The Gamecocks came quick out of the break as midfielder Gabrielle Gilbert lined up a one-timed shot from outside the box that was just over the bar early in the half.

In the 78th minute, Stanford's Natalie Griffen had the best chance in regulation as she got on he end of a bouncing ball and ripped a shot across the face of goal that caromed off the crossbar. That came just after D'Angelo came up big for her side on a shot from Ubogagu that was destined for the back of the net. The junior went to her left and was able to punch away the attempt before it tucked under the crossbar.

The Cardinal put the Gamecocks under heavy pressure late in the regulation, but the defense was able to withstand it and force overtime.

In a defensive match-up, Stanford managed to outshoot South Carolina 9-6, while holding a 4-1 advantage in shots on goal.

For the second Friday in a row, No. 18 South Carolina went to penalty kicks in an NCAA Tournament match after 110 minutes of scoreless play. This time, the No. 3 seeded Gamecocks (13-5-5) claimed the shootout, 2-1, over Seattle (15-4-3) to advance to the NCAA Round of 16 for the second time in school history. With senior All-American keeper Sabrina D'Angelo out of the net due to injury, freshman Abbey Crider stepped in to earn her first career shutout and to make two crucial saves in penalty kicks.

Nine minutes into the match, Seattle's leading scorer Stephanie Verdoia posted the day's first shot on goal, but Crider confidently collected her first save of the day.

Midway through the first half, the Gamecocks started to gain some momentum in the attack and nearly opened the scoring in the 27th minute with a pair of shots on frame. Seconds into the second overtime period, Seattle nearly ended everything. Verdoia made another long run and unleashed a shot from range, but Crider dove to her right to make the save, and nine minutes later, the teams went to penalty kicks.

The Gamecocks stayed with the same penalty kick order as last week's shootout against Clemson, but the story was not the same. Down 0-1 after the first two rounds, Crider made a diving save to her right and Lindsey Lane converted to level the contest. Kraft clanked her opportunity off the left post and Smallidge saved Bay Daniel's shot to keep the score 1-all after four rounds.

Crider made a spectacular save to her right on Stephanie Spiekerman's chance and put the game on Drennan's foot. The Gamecocks clinched last week's PKs before Drennan had the opportunity to shoot. This week she calmly stepped up to the spot and powered a kick low and left to advance South Carolina to the Round of 16.

Junior Raina Johnson's goal in the 23rd minute and a stellar team defensive effort propelled No. 18 South Carolina past No. 6 North Carolina, 1-0, and into the NCAA Quarterfinals for the first time in program history on Sunday afternoon at Fetzer Field. In the program's first NCAA Quarterfinal, No. 18 South Carolina (14-6-5) saw its NCAA Tournament run come to an end with a 5-0 loss to No. 2 Florida State (22-1-1) on Friday at the Seminole Soccer Complex

From the opening kick, the Seminoles applied pressure and allowed the Gamecocks very little possession past midfield. After 15 minutes of play, the Seminoles recorded the first shot of the afternoon off the foot of Michaela Hahn. A Gamecock defender was in position to block the shot though.

Then, within 93 seconds, Cheyna Williams scored twice. The first came on a point-blank look in front of the goal thanks to a cross from Brynjarsdottir. The second was a close-range header set up by Brynjarsdottir and Carson Pickett on a free kick to push the score to 5-0 with under 30 minutes to play.
