South Carolina returns home for its regular season finale against the seventh-ranked Florida Gators Thursday night. The match will be nationally broadcast live on the Fox Soccer Channel at 8 p.m. as the NSCAA College Game of the Week. The Gamecocks, currently ranked fifth in the SEC standings with a 5-3-2 record, will look to defend a 13-game home unbeaten streak while ending Florida's 11-game winning streak. The Gamecocks earned their third consecutive SEC Tournament berth with their win at Arkansas, marking the first time Carolina has advanced to postseason play in three consecutive years.

ON THE HORIZON

South Carolina will travel to Orange Beach, Ala., for the SEC Tournament. Carolina, currently seeded fifth in the conference race, can finish anywhere from second to sixth.

SCOUTING FLORIDA

Florida is looking to become the first team to finish 11-0-0 in SEC play. The conference began the current scheduling format (11 games, each team plays each team once) in 2004, and no team has gone undefeated since that format began. The Gators have already wrapped up their third consecutive SEC regular season championship crown. Three Gators have scored over 20 points this season, led by Megan Kerns (10g, 7a, 27p). Freshman Tahnai Annis is second on the team with nine goals and four assists for 22 points. The Gators have used a platoon system at goalkeeper, but Meghan Berlingo has received the nod recently and has performed well with a 0.50 goals against average and a sparkling 11-0-0 record with four shutouts.

SOUTH CAROLINA VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

No. 7 Florida will be the third ranked team the Gamecocks will play this season after tying then-No. 7 Florida State 3-3 at the Auburn Soccer Classic and then-No. 13 LSU 0-0 at home. Florida will be the highest ranked team to enter Stone Stadium since the Gamecocks recorded a 2-0 victory over No. 7 Clemson on Sept. 15, 2004. The Gamecocks are 2-0-0 all-time at home against teams ranked in the top 10, both wins coming against Clemson.

HOME AT THE STONE

South Carolina has been nearly unstoppable at Stone Stadium the past two seasons, posting a 23-1-5 record at home since 2006. The streak included a 15-game unbeaten streak from Aug. 31, 2006-Oct. 5, 2007. Carolina is currently in the midst of a 13-game unbeaten streak at "The Graveyard". The lone blemish on the record was a double-overtime loss to Vanderbilt (Oct. 7, 2007) when the Gamecocks surrendered a goal with nine seconds remaining in the game. Carolina has 17 shutouts during the 29 game stretch, including 11 of the last 17 matches.

PATTON SHINES IN FIRST SEASON IN GOAL

Redshirt-sophomore **Mollie Patton** has been one of many bright spots upon Carolina's new starters this year. Playing for the first time since she graduated high school in 2005, Patton currently is third in the SEC with a 0.81 goals against average despite playing the most minutes of all keepers. She tied a USC single-season record - and is tied for first in the SEC - with her seventh shutout this year in a 0-0 draw against No. 13 LSU. She began the season with a 434:23 shutout streak and came up big in Carolina's draw with No. 7 Florida State.

MONTEIRO BATTLES BACK FROM INJURIES

Senior **Danila Monteiro** saw the field for the first time in nearly a month when she played eight minutes against Ole Miss. The lone senior on the team, Monteiro missed five games after a hard foul to the back in the second minute at Western Carolina knocked her to the ground and she missed the remainder of the game with a leg injury. Monteiro, who missed the 2007 regular season finale and postseason after tearing her ACL, also missed the Furman game this year after suffering a concussion in the Clemson win with a ball to the back of the head.

GRIMSLEY CONTINUES TO CLIMB THE CHARTS

Freshman **Kayla Grimsley** has carried her strong play from the non-conference portion of the season to SEC play. Grimsley currently leads Carolina with eight goals and four assists for 20 points, numbers that rank second all-time for Carolina freshmen with at least two games remaining. Even more impressive is that 11 of her 20 points have come in six SEC games (4 goals and 3 assists).

Grimsley has earned weekly honors from Top Drawer Soccer, Soccer Buzz, Soccer America and the SEC. Her weekend against Kentucky and Vanderbilt made her just the second Gamecock to score three goals in one SEC weekend - the last being Jennie Ondo in 1999.

MILLER TIME!

Junior midfielder **Kim Miller** had a game to remember against Arkansas. She did as an individual what no team as a whole could do all season - score two first half goals against the Razorbacks. Miller scored in the 15th and 37th to lead Carolina to a 3-1 victory. Her goals ended a three-game scoreless streak for Carolina, the longest since the 2001 season. Her efforts earned her Soccer Buzz Elite Team of the Week honors and the USC athletics department player of the week honors.

SHUTOUT SOCCER

Defense has been the calling card for coach **Shelley Smith's** teams and the 2008 season thus far looks to be no different. The Gamecocks posted four consecutive shutouts to open the season, the first time a South Carolina team held opponents scoreless through the first four games, and currently lead the conference with eight shutouts on the year.

OVERTIME MATCHES

After playing six matches in extra minutes last season - all coming after the start of SEC play - the Gamecocks have played five so far this year. South Carolina tied UNC Wilmington and No. 7 Florida State in double-overtime and defeated Furman 2-1 in the first OT. The win marked Carolina's first OT victory since defeating LSU (also by a 2-1 score) on Oct. 20, 2006. Two SEC games have gone to overtime, both ending in draws - Georgia (1-1) and #13 LSU (0-0).

OFFENSE STARTS FROM THE MIDFIELD

The catalysts of the Carolina offense has come from the starting midfield trio of juniors **Kim Miller** and **Lindsay Small** and freshman **Kayla Grimsley**. Those three have combined for 15 of Carolina's 27 goals and rank first, second and third on the team in points.

JACOBS LEADS THE FORWARDS

Sophomore **Brooke Jacobs** scored in the 8th minute against Mississippi State for her second career goal - both having gone as game-winners. Jacobs's goal against the Bulldogs marked the first goal this season by a player that strictly plays forward; a combination of defenders and midfield/forwards scored Carolina's first 20 goals this season. Jacobs scored her second goal of the year in Sunday's 3-1 win at Arkansas.

DEFENSIVE LEADERS

South Carolina is ranked in the top two in the SEC in every major defensive category. Led by starting defenders **Brittany Rhoades**, **Ellen Fahey**, **Blakely Mattern** and **Samantha Diaz-Matosas**, Carolina has registered an conference best eight shutouts. The team holds a 0.80 goals against average, allows only 8.74 shots per game and has limited opponents to 3.82 shots on goal, all ranking second in the SEC. Carolina limited Mississippi State and LSU both to only four shots in those games, marking the ninth time Carolina has done that to an SEC opponent.

SAM I AM

Junior defender **Samantha Diaz-Matosas** scored Carolina's first goal of the season with a penalty kick in the 43rd minute against East Carolina. A former forward, Diaz-Matosas was named to the Soccer Buzz Elite Team of the Week that week.

Freshman **Natalie Aaron** had a weekend to remember to start SEC play! The freshman midfielder was named SEC Freshman of the Week after scoring the game-winning goal against Tennessee and game-tying goal against Georgia, the first two goals of her career.

GRIMSLEY GRABS CONFERENCE, NATIONAL HONORS

Heralded freshman **Kayla Grimsley** performed well since entering the starting lineup against Boston. She leads the team with four goals that came in four consecutive games, a first for a freshman and a feat only achieved one other time in Carolina history. Her efforts led to her being named the SEC Offensive Player of the Week (Wk4) in addition to being named to three national teams of the week: TopDrawerSoccer.com, Soccer Buzz and Soccer America. A flashy player with tremendous ability, Grimsley was named a Soccer Buzz Top 75 national recruit coming out of high school and was a three-time Florida High School Player of the Year.

O CANADA!

Freshman **Idana DeCecco** has made the most of her opportunities in the early part of the season, scoring the game-tying goal against #7 Florida State on her only shot so far this season. DeCecco, a native of Sherwood Park, Alberta, is the first Gamecock player to hail from Canada. She is only the eighth international player to play at Carolina, the others coming from England, Trinidad, Finland (two players), Brazil, Ireland and Nova Scotia. DeCecco was a national team member for Canada and is expected to bring a strong defensive presence to the Gamecocks.

FIRST TIME OPPONENTS

South Carolina faced four opponents for the first time during the 2008 season, posting a 1-1-2 record in those games. UNC Wilmington was the first as the Gamecocks and Seahawks battled to a scoreless tie in the season opener, followed by Carolina's 1-0 win over Boston. The Gamecocks tied #7 Florida State before dropping their first match of the season to a scrappy Western Carolina. Last season, USC went 4-0 against first time opponents, defeating East Tennessee State, Winthrop, Marshall and UC Davis last season by a combined 16-3, including two shutouts.

NO SMALL FEAT

Junior midfielder **Lindsay Small** recorded not only her first career goal but also her first career points as she led Carolina to a 1-0 victory over Boston. Normally a defensive midfielder, Small fielded a cross from Kim Miller in the 56th minute and placed it in the near post from 12 yards out to hit the game-winning goal. She followed that with her second GWG in consecutive games for Carolina, hitting the lone goal in the 48th minute in a victory over rival Clemson.

LINDSAY SMALL NAMED TO SOCCER AMERICA TEAM OF THE WEEK

Junior midfielder **Lindsay Small** was named to the Soccer America Team of the Week after being named Tournament MVP at the Carolina's Cup in Week 3. She became the sixth Gamecock to earn the honor, the last being **Lindsay Thorstenson** in Week 1 last season.

SOMETHING NEW BETWEEN THE POSTS

For the first time since 2002 someone other than a member of the **Laura Armstrong/Lindsay Thorstenson** duo will play as goalkeeper for South Carolina. Armstrong and Thorstenson played every game between the posts for Carolina from 2003-07 - 93 games and 7,798 minutes - leading the team to an NCAA Tournament appearance and two trips to the SEC Tournament semifinals.

Redshirt sophomore **Mollie Patton** (Milford, Ohio) grabbed the start against UNC Wilmington and came up strong in her first collegiate game in three years. Patton registered four saves in the double-overtime tie, none more crucial than her stop on a 1v1 point-blank attempt from eight yards out in the 32nd minute. The double-overtime shutout was the first for a single South Carolina keeper since Thorstenson shutout Ole Miss in extra minutes on Oct. 16, 2006.

BLAKELY MATTERN NAMED PRESEASON ALL-SEC

South Carolina junior defender **Blakely Mattern** was selected to the women's soccer 2008 Coaches Preseason All-Southeastern Conference team.

This season marks the second year that the coaches have voted on a Preseason All-SEC team as Mattern makes her second consecutive appearance on the list.

Mattern (Simpsonville, S.C./JL Mann HS) led Carolina last year to its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1998. She became the first sophomore in conference history to be named SEC Defensive Player of the Year. A former Soccer Buzz Freshman All-American, she picked up the first All-America honors in program history last season when Soccer Buzz named her an All-American and All-Southeast Region selection. A two-time All-SEC selection, Mattern has started every game of her career and was invited to attend the U.S. U-20 National Team camp this year.

"Blakely belongs among the best in the conference from her performance the past two seasons and to be recognized last year as the SEC Defensive Player of the Year," South Carolina head coach Shelley Smith said. "The honor is well deserved as she continues to improve and show herself as a leader of our program. We have several players that were deservedly nominated, but the team announced shows how strong of a conference that the SEC is along with the type of quality players among the teams."

ALL-AMERICAN DEFENSE

The South Carolina defense has been consistently one of the top in the SEC and in the nation, and all signs point to this season being another strong one for the Garnet and Black. The Gamecocks return two former Freshman All-Americans in junior **Blakely Mattern** and sophomore **Brittany Rhoades**.

Mattern (Simpsonville, S.C.) has started every game of her career at center back, earning Freshman All-America honors in 2006 and becoming Carolina's first All-American after picking up honors in 2007. Mattern also picked up SEC Defensive Player of the Year honors last season, becoming the first sophomore in conference history to earn the honor, and earned a trip to the US U-20 National Team camp last spring. Rhoades (Wilmington, Del.) set a USC freshman record with 23 games played and 22 games started last year at left back, becoming the second Freshman All-American in as many years for the defense.

PENNSYLVANIA DEJA VU

For the second straight season, Carolina grabbed a top recruit from the state of Pennsylvania. Unfortunately, for the second straight season, that recruit will possibly miss the entire season after suffering an ACL injury her senior season of high school. Soccer Buzz Top 150 recruit **Dani Henry** (Avondale, Pa.) went down with an injury in the Delaware state semifinals (Padua Academy in Wilmington, Del.) and will likely miss the entire 2008 season.

The injury follows the same situation that befell sophomore **Brooke Jacobs** (Chambersburg, Pa.) last season. Jacobs tore her ACL in her final high school season but returned to play for the Gamecocks in the non-conference finale against Marshall. She went on to have a great season for Carolina and earned SEC Freshman of the Week honors after scoring the game-winning goal against Arkansas.

COACHES TAB GAMECOCKS FOURTH IN SEC EAST

The South Carolina women's soccer team was picked to finish fourth in the Eastern division of the 2008 SEC preseason poll, the conference office announced Aug. 14. South Carolina finished the 2007 with a 14-6-3 record and earned the sixth seed in the SEC Tournament with a 5-4-2 conference record.

Florida was selected as the favorite to claim the 2008 women's soccer title in the poll voted on by the league's 12 head coaches.

The Gamecocks return six starters and 12 letterwinners from last season's NCAA Tournament team. Danila Monteiro is the team's lone returning senior and is a co-captain along with juniors Blakely Mattern and Kim Miller. Carolina also returns starters Shannon Bigbie, Samantha Diaz-Matosas, Brittney Rhoades and Brooke Jacobs, but the team will look to replace 63 percent of its point-scoring from last season while the loss of decorated seniors Laura Armstrong and Lindsay Thorstenson means a new goalkeeper will mind the net for the first time since 2004.

RETURNING CATEGORY LEADERS

Carolina returns seven that started at the end of the season and five that were regular starters in 2007. However, the Gamecocks only return one major statistical category leader from last year in **Danila Monteiro** (GWG). After losing 13 players from last year's squad, the Gamecocks will welcome 14 freshmen this season to pick up the slack.

Brooke Jacobs added an insurance goal in the second half as the Gamecocks clinched an SEC Tournament berth with the victory.

Miller scored in the 15th and 37th minutes for the first multi-goal game of her career. "The wind played a big part today," head coach Shelley Smith said. "We limited the chances they had. Anytime balls went long, Blakely Mattern, Ellen Fahey and Lindsay Small came up huge with balls in the air and winning balls against their kids in the middle. Kim Miller not only scored for us today but she played a tremendous game in the middle. When our backline was forced to win those balls in the air, she did a great job to win the second knockdown. She was all over the place today and it was nice for her to be recognized for scoring."

CAROLINA DRAWS #13 LSU BEHIND DOMINATING DEFENSIVE EFFORT

COLUMBIA, S.C. (10/23/08) - In a battle of the Southeastern Conference's top two defensive teams, South Carolina continued its series advantage over #13 LSU with a 0-0 draw Thursday night at Stone Stadium, improving Carolina's unbeaten streak against the Tigers to nine games. The Gamecocks are now 6-1-3 in the all-time series against LSU with the only loss coming in the first game between the two teams in Carolina's inaugural season of 1995.

Mollie Patton registered the shutout for South Carolina for her seventh of the season. With two regular season games remaining, Patton ties the South Carolina single-season record for shutouts that was set in 2003 by Elise Matthews and 2007 by Laura Armstrong. Playing in her first season in goal for Carolina, the redshirt-sophomore moves into fifth place on the Carolina all-time shutouts list.

Shelley Smith Eighth Season

Shelley Smith enters her eighth season at the helm of the USC women's soccer program and looks to continue building upon the success that she brought to the program after putting the Gamecocks in the national spotlight last season.

Smith directed the 2007 Gamecocks to arguably the best season in school history, tying the school record with 14 victories and advancing to the NCAA Tournament for only the second time in program history. Carolina posted a 14-6-3 overall record including a 5-4-2 mark in the SEC after beginning the season by becoming the first team ever to knock off defending national champion and top-ranked North Carolina in a season opening game at Chapel Hill. The Gamecocks ran to a 7-0-0 start to the season – program bests for start to a season and winning streak – and peaked at No. 7 in the national polls. For the second consecutive season South Carolina advanced to the SEC Tournament semifinals after knocking off Tennessee for the first time in program history and earned the school's first bid to the NCAA Tournament since 1998. Defensively, Carolina recorded a program-best 12 shutouts while Laura Armstrong's 0.49 goals against average ranked first in the SEC and ninth nationally.

Four players earned All-SEC honors with Ashley Kirk and Blakely Mattern named to the first team, Darcel Mollon named to the second team and Brittny Rhoades named to the freshman team. Mattern became the first sophomore to ever earn SEC Defensive Player of the Year honors. In addition, Mattern and Mollon earned NSCAA second team All-Southeast Region selections, becoming the first Gamecocks honored by the association since 2002. Mattern, Kirk, Mollon and Rhoades also picked up All-Region honors by Soccer Buzz with Rhoades becoming the second Freshman All-American under Smith at USC. Mattern was named a fourth team All-American, the first in South Carolina history.

Carolina's success in the classroom continued last season as Smith's squad earned three Academic All-District honorees, the most at USC in a single season. Mattern, along with seniors Annie Galloway and Erin Sullivan, earned the honors while Sullivan was also named to the Academic All-America third team. It is the third straight season a Carolina player has earned Academic All-America honors, the longest active streak in the Southeastern Conference. The team had a program-best 16 players named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll (Laura Armstrong, Kacie Brewer, Annie Galloway, Kimberly Gillespie, Monica Hogan, Leah Loguidice, Blakely Mattern, Kim Miller, Darcel Mollon, Kali Neumann, Mollie Patton,

Aly Shattls, Lindsay Small, Erin Sullivan, Lindsay Thorstenson and Mary Worthen). Smith has coached 81 SEC Academic Honor Roll recipients since coming to USC in 2001.

Smith has coached several top student-athletes at Carolina including Ashley Kirk, USC's first four-time All-SEC honoree, and two-time All-SEC performers Melinda Carter, Jessica Julin, Sarah Lentz and Blakely Mattern. Julin is currently the captain of the Finland National Team and Carter played in the WUSA. The Gamecocks have had 17 players earn All-SEC selections in the last seven years.

In her first season as head coach at Carolina (2001), the Gamecocks were the third most improved team in the nation with an 8-7-3 overall record. Carolina also had one of the school's best home records, going 5-3 at Stone Stadium, allowing opponents to score only four goals in eight matches.

The success continued for USC in 2002 with 13 wins in Smith's second season. The year was highlighted with USC's first ever victories against Florida and Kentucky. Smith also led her team to ties against 2002 SEC champion Auburn and Eastern Division champion Tennessee.

Smith led the Gamecocks to another successful season in 2003 with 10 wins including a USC record eight-game unbeaten streak as well as a 6-2-1 record at home in Stone Stadium.

The 2004 season featured a win over No. 7 Clemson, the USC's first win over a ranked opponent since 1998, as well as a 6-3 mark in non-conference action. Ashley Kirk became the first soccer player in school history to be named SEC Freshman of the Year. In addition, South Carolina set a school record for a home game-winning streak with six consecutive victories.

Following an injury filled 2005 season, the program took a big step forward in 2006 as USC went undefeated at home for the first time in school history with an 8-0-3 mark. The team's goals against average of 0.69 was the lowest ever tallied at Carolina. The season culminated with the Gamecocks advancing to the SEC Tournament semifinals for the first time in Carolina history, as Blakely Mattern became the team's first Freshman All-America selection since 1998.

In 11 years as a head coach, Smith has compiled an overall record of 111-90-20. Besides her collegiate coaching, Smith was a member of the Region III ODP staff for the past five years, as well as an assistant for the '90 Regional Team. Smith also was a member of the U-14 National Camp staff for U.S. Soccer in 2003.

With a background in both semi-professional and collegiate soccer, Smith previously served as head coach at Rhode Island from 1997-2000. The 2000 NSCAA Northeast Region Coach of the Year, Smith rebuilt the URI women's soccer program, compiling a 41-35-2 overall record. Smith took a program that was 2-16 her first year to 12-7-1

in her second season, marking the eighth-most improved won-lost record for a team in NCAA history. In 2000, Smith coached URI to its best record ever of 15-4-1, while reaching the Atlantic 10 Semifinals, a first in URI history.

Smith was nominated for the 2000 National Coach of the Year. The New England Women's Soccer Intercollegiate Soccer Association (NEWISA) also named her its Division I Coach of the Year in 2000. She was the 1998 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year as well.

In addition to her experience as a coach, Smith brings experience from the semi-professional level. From 1996-2000, Smith played for the Boston Renegades in the W-1 League. Smith was captain in 2000 as she led Boston to the semifinals in the W-1 Championship. The Renegades reached the finals in 1998. Smith also had the opportunity to play overseas in 1994 as a member of the Sheffield United Women's Football Club in England.

Smith, a 1993 graduate of the University of Vermont with a degree in nutritional science, received her teacher's certificate from the same institution in 1995. Smith started all four years for the Catamounts. Her primary positions were center midfielder and central defender. She was all-conference and regional All-American in both 1992 and '93. During her freshman year, the squad won the ECAC Tournament. Vermont was one of the first programs to offer women's soccer as a varsity sport and it competed on a national level. Smith was named to Vermont's Athletic Hall of Fame in the summer of 2004.

Smith worked as an assistant coach at Dartmouth College from 1995-97. The Big Green made the NCAA Tournament in her second season with the program.

Smith is married to USC associate head coach Jamie Smith, a 1994 graduate of Providence College. They are the proud parents of two sons, Braden James and Evan Addison. The family resides in Cayce, S.C.

Smith has her USSF B license and the NCAA Advanced National Diploma. She is currently a member of the USYSA Regional Olympic Development Staff.

A native of Shaftsbury, Vt., Smith graduated from Mount Anthony Union High School in 1989.
