South Carolina takes on two in-state rivals this weekend as they host the Carolina's Cup at Stone Stadium. The Gamecocks will take on Clemson in Friday's highlight match at 7:30 p.m. in a rematch of last season's 1-0 loss at Riggs Stadium. The first 350 fans at the match will receive free "Beat Clemson" t-shirt. The Gamecocks will then host Furman Sunday at 2 p.m. Other matches scheduled for the tournament include Francis Marion-Furman (Friday at 5 p.m.) and Francis Marion-Clemson (Sunday at 11:30 a.m.). Admission to each session is \$5 for adults and \$3 for youth. All Gamecock fans are encouraged to wear Garnet.

**Due to construction on The Dodie Academic Enrichment Center, a large section of Heyward Street will be closed to traffic beginning immediately. Fans planning to attend upcoming men's and women's soccer events at Stone Stadium should be aware of this closure and seek an alternate route to parking lots surrounding the stadium.**

### ON THE HORIZON

South Carolina travels to Auburn, Ala., to compete in the Auburn Soccer Classic from Sept. 12-14. The Gamecocks will meet Marquette in Friday's match at 5:30 p.m. before taking on NCAA runner-up Florida State Sunday at noon. The Seminoles, currently ranked third in the nation and first in the Southeast region, return eight starters but lost Player of the Year Mami Yamaguchi.

### SCOUTING CLEMSON

A perennial NCAA Tournament team, Clemson was picked to finish 10th in the 11-team ACC Coaches Poll (Georgia Tech does not field a women's soccer team). The Tigers are under the guidance of first year head coach Hershey Strosberg, a former Virginia assistant in his first head coaching position. Clemson has run to a 3-0 start, most recently defeating UNC Asheville 8-0 on the feet of senior Julie Bolt's four goals. Opponents have yet to challenge sophomore Paula Pritzen in goal, a first year starter taking over for graduated All-American Ashley Phillips.

### SCOUTING FURMAN

2007 NCAA Tournament participant Furman enters with a 1-0-1 record with a defeat of Coastal Carolina and tie against Canisius. Picked to finish second in the SoCon, Furman is led by three preseason all-conference selections in Rachel Fry, Ashley Creavalle and Briana da Mota.

### HOME AT THE STONE

South Carolina has been nearly unstoppable at Stone Stadium the past two seasons, posting a 17-1-3 record at home since 2006. The streak included a 15-game unbeaten streak from Aug. 31, 2006-Oct. 5, 2007. The lone blemish on the record was a double-overtime loss to Vanderbilt (Oct. 7, 2007) when the Gamecocks surrendered a goal with nine seconds remaining in the game. Carolina recorded 14 shutouts during the stretch, six coming in the eight games in 2007.

### FIRST TIME OPPONENTS

South Carolina will face four first time opponents during the 2008 season. UNC Wilmington was the first as the Gamecocks and Seahawks battled to a scoreless tie in the season opener, followed by Carolina's 1-0 win over Boston. National runner-up Florida State and Western Carolina will also take on the Gamecocks for the first time this year. Last season, USC went 4-0 against first time opponents, defeating East Tennessee State, Winthrop, Marshall and UC Davis last season by a combined 16-3, including two shutouts.

### NO SMALL FEAT

Junior midfielder **Lindsay Small** recorded not only her first career goal but also her first career points as she led Carolina to a 1-0 victory over Boston. Normally a defensive midfielder, Small fielded a cross from Kim Miller in the 56th minute and placed it in the near post from 12 yards out to hit the game-winning goal.

### GRIMSLEY GRABS THE START

Heralded freshman **Kayla Grimsley** earned her first career start Sunday night against Boston. A flashy player with tremendous ability, Grimsley was named a Soccer Buzz Top 75 national recruit coming out of high school and was a three-time Florida High School Player of the Year.

### SHUTOUT SOCCER

Defense has been the calling card for coach **Shelley Smith's** teams and the 2008 season thus far looks to be no different. The Gamecocks have posted three consecutive shutouts to open the season, the first time a South Carolina team held opponents scoreless through the first three games. Led by starting defenders **Brittany Rhoades**, **Ellen Fahey**, **Blakely Mattern** and **Samantha Diaz-Matosas**, the Gamecocks have limited opponents to only 17 shots and 11 shots on goal in three matches.

### SAM I AM

Junior **Samantha Diaz-Matosas** scored Carolina's first goal of the season with a penalty kick in the 43rd minute against East Carolina. The PK was her first career attempt as the goal was the first game-winner of Diaz-Matosas's career. The score was her fourth overall and second since moving from forward to defender last season.

### O CANADA!

Freshman **Idana DeCecco** saw her first game action Thursday night against East Carolina. DeCecco, a native of Sherwood Park, Alberta, is the first Gamecock player to hail from Canada. She is only the eighth international player to play at Carolina, the others coming from England, Trinidad, Finland (two players), Brazil, Ireland and Nova Scotia. DeCecco was a U15 and U16 national team member for Canada and is expected to bring a strong defensive presence to the Gamecocks this season.

### SOMETHING NEW BETWEEN THE POSTS

For the first time since 2002 someone other than a member of the **Laura Armstrong/Lindsay Thorstenson** duo will play as goalkeeper for South Carolina. Armstrong and Thorstenson played every game between the posts for Carolina from 2003-07 - 93 games and 7,798 minutes - leading the team to an NCAA Tournament appearance and two trips to the SEC Tournament semifinals.

Redshirt sophomore **Mollie Patton** (Milford, Ohio) grabbed the start against UNC Wilmington and came up strong in her first collegiate game in three years. Patton registered four saves in the double-overtime tie, none more crucial than her stop on a 1v1 point-blank attempt from eight yards out in the 32nd minute. The double-overtime shutout was the first for a single South Carolina keeper since Thorstenson shutout Ole Miss in extra minutes on Oct. 16, 2006.

Through three games, Patton has posted 290:00 of shutout soccer, a program-best for a keeper to begin the season.

### BLAKELY MATTERN NAMED PRESEASON ALL-SEC

South Carolina junior defender Blakely Mattern has been selected to the women's soccer 2008 Coaches Preseason All-Southeastern Conference team, the conference office announced Wednesday.

This season marks the second year that the coaches have voted on a Preseason All-SEC team as Mattern makes her second consecutive appearance on the list.

Mattern (Simpsonville, S.C./JL Mann HS) led Carolina last year to its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1998. She became the first sophomore in conference history to be named SEC Defensive Player of the Year. A former Soccer Buzz Freshman All-American, she picked up the first All-America honors in program history last season when Soccer Buzz named her an All-American and All-Southeast Region selection. A two-time All-SEC selection, Mattern has started every game of her career and was invited to attend the U.S. U-20 National Team camp this year.

"Blakely belongs among the best in the conference from her performance the past two seasons and to be recognized last year as the SEC Defensive Player of the Year," South Carolina head coach Shelley Smith said. "The honor is well deserved as she continues to improve and show herself as a leader of our program. We have several players that were deservedly nominated, but the team announced shows how strong of a conference that the SEC is along with the type of quality players among the teams."

### ALL-AMERICAN DEFENSE

The South Carolina defense has been consistently one of the top in the SEC and in the nation, and all signs point to this season being another strong one for the Garnet and Black. The Gamecocks return two former Freshman All-Americans in junior **Blakely Mattern** and sophomore **Brittany Rhoades**.

Mattern (Simpsonville, S.C.) has started every game of her career at center back, earning Freshman All-America honors in 2006 and becoming Carolina's first All-American after picking up honors in 2007. Mattern also picked up SEC Defensive Player of the Year honors last season, becoming the first sophomore in conference history to earn the honor, and earned a trip to the US U-20 National Team camp last spring. Rhoades (Wilmington, Del.) set a USC freshman record with 23 games played and 22 games started last year at left back, becoming the second Freshman All-American in as many years for the defense.

For the second straight season, Carolina grabbed a top recruit from the state of Pennsylvania. Unfortunately, for the second straight season, that recruit will possibly miss the entire season after suffering an ACL injury her senior season of high school. Soccer Buzz Top 150 recruit **Dani Henry** (Avondale, Pa.) went down with an injury in the Delaware state semifinals (Padua Academy in Wilmington, Del.) and will likely miss the entire 2008 season.

The injury follows the same situation that befell sophomore **Brooke Jacobs** (Chambersburg, Pa.) last season. Jacobs tore her ACL in her final high school season but returned to play for the Gamecocks in the non-conference finale against Marshall. She went on to have a great season for Carolina and earned SEC Freshman of the Week honors after scoring the gamewinning goal against Arkansas.

### MONTEIRO RETURNS

Senior **Danila Monteiro** returns to the Gamecocks this year after missing the 2007 regular season finale and all of postseason play last season after suffering an ACL injury on Halloween. The lone senior and the team's leading returner in goals, assists (tied) and points, Monteiro came close to scoring Carolina's first goal of the season when her shot in the 92nd minute at UNC Wilmington beat the keeper but hit the left post to keep the scoreless tie.

### LEXINGTON MIDFIELDERS

The Lexington, S.C., duo of junior Shannon Bigbie and freshman Kira Campbell both started in Carolina's season opening game at UNC Wilmington. Both graduates of Lexington High School and former Carolina Elite Soccer Academy (CESA) players, Bigbie and Campbell have put on strong preseason's in their first season playing together since 2005 when Bigbie was a senior and Campbell was a sophomore at Lexington.

### ARMSTRONG RETURNS TO THE SIDELINES

A familiar face will roam the Gamecock sideline this year as 2007 graduate **Laura Armstrong** returns to work as a volunteer assistant with the team. Armstrong enjoyed one of the most prolific careers of any Gamecock regardless of position after her record-setting senior season last year. She currently sits third on the Southeastern Conference's all-time list with a 0.82 career goals against average. She also finished her career tied atop the Carolina record books for single season (7) and career (15) shutouts, in addition to being the Carolina record holder for GAA in a season (0.49) and career.

Armstrong is one of 128 players invited to the Women's Professional Soccer (WPS) combine that will be held Sept. 4-7 in Tampa, Fla. The WPS begins its inaugural season in the spring of 2009.

### RETURNING CATEGORY LEADERS

Carolina returns seven that started at the end of the season and five that were regular starters in 2007. However, the Gamecocks only return one major statistical category leader from last year in **Danila Monteiro** (GWG). After losing 13 players from last year's squad, the Gamecocks will welcome 14 freshmen this season to pick up the slack.

### COACHES TAB GAMECOCKS FOURTH IN SEC EAST

The South Carolina women's soccer team was picked to finish fourth in the Eastern division of the 2008 SEC preseason poll, the conference office announced Aug. 14. South Carolina finished the 2007 with a 14-6-3 record and earned the sixth seed in the SEC Tournament with a 5-4-2 conference record.

Florida was selected as the favorite to claim the 2008 women's soccer title in the poll voted on by the league's 12 head coaches. Tennessee was picked second, followed by Georgia. Following USC was Vanderbilt and Kentucky, respectively.

The Gamecocks return six starters and 12 letterwinners from last season's NCAA Tournament team. Danila Monteiro is the team's lone returning senior and is a co-captain along with juniors Blakely Mattern and Kim Miller. Carolina also returns starters Shannon Bigbie, Samantha Diaz-Matosas, Brittney Rhoades and Brooke Jacobs, but the team will look to replace 63 percent of its point-scoring from last season while the loss of decorated seniors Laura Armstrong and Lindsay Thorstenson means a new goalkeeper will mind the net for the first time since 2004.

### SHATTLIS, BLACKWELL RETURN

Two Gamecocks that missed the 2007 season due to preseason injuries will hope to make their return this year. Redshirt-sophomore **Aly Shattlis** (Huntington, W.Va.) returns to the pitch after succumbing to an ACL injury while redshirt-freshman **Maggie Blackwell** (Marietta, S.C.) will see her first action for the Garnet and Black after a getting a broken leg last year. Both are still rehabbing their injuries and hope to make the field this season.

### SMALL NETS FIRST CAREER GOAL IN 1-0 VICTORY AGAINST BOSTON

COLUMBIA, S.C. - South Carolina junior midfielder **Lindsay Small** could pick no better time to score her first career goal as she led the Gamecock women's soccer team to a 1-0 victory against Boston Sunday night at Stone Stadium. The match was the first between the Gamecocks (2-0-1) and Terriers (1-2-0) as the two 2007 NCAA Tournament teams battled in a close match that was decided in the midst of heavy rain for the final 20 minutes of action.

Despite outshooting the Terriers 12-10, Carolina couldn't seem to get shots on the frame as they went into the half with zero of their five shots on goal. Small's goal in the 56th minute was only Carolina's second to the net as the Gamecocks finished with four on frame. It went slightly better for the Terriers as six of their 10 shots hit the mark, but Gamecock goalkeeper **Mollie Patton** continued her strong play in her first year in goal with six saves in the shutout. Patton has posted three shutouts to begin the season, a stretch that includes 290 minutes of shutout play. The streak is the longest to begin a season for a South Carolina goalkeeper and marks the first time that the Gamecocks began a season with three consecutive shutouts.

Carolina came close to scoring an early goal in the 13th minute when **Shannon Bigbie** played a ball on the left flank up to Small ahead of the Boston defense. Small's center to **Brooke Jacobs** landed perfectly, but the sophomore's effort just missed the right post to keep the game tied. The first shot on goal for either team did not come until the 28th minute when Boston's Marisha Schumacher-Hodge lofted one to the top of the goal that was punched saved by Patton before sneaking in.

With a nearly even game at the half in every statistical category, the Gamecocks did not get a shot on goal until Small struck one in the 54th minute that was saved by Boston keeper Janie Reilly. Normally more of a defensive midfielder for the Gamecocks, Small continued on the attack and saw her opportunity when **Kim Miller** played crossed a long ball from right that was challenged by Bigbie before finding Small 12 yards out for the goal. The assist was Bigbie's second career and the fourth career for Miller.

"It was a great ball by Miller on the right side," Small said. "It was really intended for Shannon. She challenged the ball with a Boston defender in front of her and luckily it just landed right at my feet."

Neither team was able to get strong looks in the final 20 minutes as rain began to fall heavily onto the field, causing the Stone Stadium crowd of 404 to search for cover. One Terrier ball bounced high in the box in the rain but was caught by Patton before bouncing into the net. Boston's best opportunity at the equalizer came in the 85th minute as Lina Cords attempted a direct kick from 25 yards out that sailed over the top of the goal.

### DIAZ-MATOSAS PKS CAROLINA TO HOME-OPENING VICTORY

COLUMBIA, S.C. - **Samantha Diaz-Matosas** scored on a penalty kick in the 43rd minute as the South Carolina women's soccer team continued its strong play at Stone Stadium in a 1-0 victory Thursday against East Carolina. The Gamecocks (1-0-1) improve to 10-3-1 in home openers and get their first victory of the season while the Pirates (2-1-0) drop their first match of the year.

In a match where they once again dominated in shot differential with a 15-3 edge, it was an ECU handball in the 18' that ultimately led to Carolina's first goal of the season. **Maria Petroni** played a ball at the top of the penalty box that was originally intended to be a shot, but the ball hit the hand of a Pirate defender inside the 18' to set up the penalty kick at 42:31. Playing in the back line, Diaz-Matosas pushed up for her first career PK and snuck it past goalkeeper Amber Campbell for her first goal of the season. The strike came one game after Campbell, a preseason All C-USA selection, moved into first on the ECU record books with 23 career shutouts.

"Sam did a great job to step up and want to take the PK," South Carolina head coach **Shelley Smith** said. "She put the team on her shoulders and finished her opportunity. I'm happy for her and for Maria to set the opportunity up for our team. Luckily we did finish that very important opportunity."

## GAME 4



**Shelley Smith  
Eighth Season**

Shelley Smith enters her eighth season at the helm of the USC women's soccer program and looks to continue building upon the success that she brought to the program after putting the Gamecocks in the national spotlight last season.

Smith directed the 2007 Gamecocks to arguably the best season in school history, tying the school record with 14 victories and advancing to the NCAA Tournament for only the second time in program history. Carolina posted a 14-6-3 overall record including a 5-4-2 mark in the SEC after beginning the season by becoming the first team ever to knock off defending national champion and top-ranked North Carolina in a season opening game at Chapel Hill. The Gamecocks ran to a 7-0-0 start to the season – program bests for start to a season and winning streak – and peaked at No. 7 in the national polls. For the second consecutive season South Carolina advanced to the SEC Tournament semifinals after knocking off Tennessee for the first time in program history and earned the school's first bid to the NCAA Tournament since 1998. Defensively, Carolina recorded a program-best 12 shutouts while Laura Armstrong's 0.49 goals against average ranked first in the SEC and ninth nationally.

Four players earned All-SEC honors with Ashley Kirk and Blakely Mattern named to the first team, Darcel Mollon named to the second team and Brittny Rhoades named to the freshman team. Mattern became the first sophomore to ever earn SEC Defensive Player of the Year honors. In addition, Mattern and Mollon earned NSCAA second team All-Southeast Region selections, becoming the first Gamecocks honored by the association since 2002. Mattern, Kirk, Mollon and Rhoades also picked up All-Region honors by Soccer Buzz with Rhoades becoming the second Freshman All-American under Smith at USC. Mattern was named a fourth team All-American, the first in South Carolina history.

Carolina's success in the classroom continued last season as Smith's squad earned three Academic All-District honorees, the most at USC in a single season. Mattern, along with seniors Annie Galloway and Erin Sullivan, earned the honors while Sullivan was also named to the Academic All-America third team. It is the third straight season a Carolina player has earned Academic All-America honors, the longest active streak in the Southeastern Conference. The team had a program-best 16 players named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll (Laura Armstrong, Kacie Brewer, Annie Galloway, Kimberly Gillespie, Monica Hogan, Leah Loguidice, Blakely Mattern, Kim Miller, Darcel Mollon, Kali Neumann, Mollie Patton,

Aly Shattls, Lindsay Small, Erin Sullivan, Lindsay Thorstenson and Mary Worthen). Smith has coached 81 SEC Academic Honor Roll recipients since coming to USC in 2001.

Smith has coached several top student-athletes at Carolina including Ashley Kirk, USC's first four-time All-SEC honoree, and two-time All-SEC performers Melinda Carter, Jessica Julin, Sarah Lentz and Blakely Mattern. Julin is currently the captain of the Finland National Team and Carter played in the WUSA. The Gamecocks have had 17 players earn All-SEC selections in the last seven years.

In her first season as head coach at Carolina (2001), the Gamecocks were the third most improved team in the nation with an 8-7-3 overall record. Carolina also had one of the school's best home records, going 5-3 at Stone Stadium, allowing opponents to score only four goals in eight matches.

The success continued for USC in 2002 with 13 wins in Smith's second season. The year was highlighted with USC's first ever victories against Florida and Kentucky. Smith also led her team to ties against 2002 SEC champion Auburn and Eastern Division champion Tennessee.

Smith led the Gamecocks to another successful season in 2003 with 10 wins including a USC record eight-game unbeaten streak as well as a 6-2-1 record at home in Stone Stadium.

The 2004 season featured a win over No. 7 Clemson, the USC's first win over a ranked opponent since 1998, as well as a 6-3 mark in non-conference action. Ashley Kirk became the first soccer player in school history to be named SEC Freshman of the Year. In addition, South Carolina set a school record for a home game-winning streak with six consecutive victories.

Following an injury filled 2005 season, the program took a big step forward in 2006 as USC went undefeated at home for the first time in school history with an 8-0-3 mark. The team's goals against average of 0.69 was the lowest ever tallied at Carolina. The season culminated with the Gamecocks advancing to the SEC Tournament semifinals for the first time in Carolina history, as Blakely Mattern became the team's first Freshman All-America selection since 1998.

In 11 years as a head coach, Smith has compiled an overall record of 111-90-20. Besides her collegiate coaching, Smith was a member of the Region III ODP staff for the past five years, as well as an assistant for the '90 Regional Team. Smith also was a member of the U-14 National Camp staff for U.S. Soccer in 2003.

With a background in both semi-professional and collegiate soccer, Smith previously served as head coach at Rhode Island from 1997-2000. The 2000 NSCAA Northeast Region Coach of the Year, Smith rebuilt the URI women's soccer program, compiling a 41-35-2 overall record. Smith took a program that was 2-16 her first year to 12-7-1

in her second season, marking the eighth-most improved won-lost record for a team in NCAA history. In 2000, Smith coached URI to its best record ever of 15-4-1, while reaching the Atlantic 10 Semifinals, a first in URI history.

Smith was nominated for the 2000 National Coach of the Year. The New England Women's Soccer Intercollegiate Soccer Association (NEWISA) also named her its Division I Coach of the Year in 2000. She was the 1998 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year as well.

In addition to her experience as a coach, Smith brings experience from the semi-professional level. From 1996-2000, Smith played for the Boston Renegades in the W-1 League. Smith was captain in 2000 as she led Boston to the semifinals in the W-1 Championship. The Renegades reached the finals in 1998. Smith also had the opportunity to play overseas in 1994 as a member of the Sheffield United Women's Football Club in England.

Smith, a 1993 graduate of the University of Vermont with a degree in nutritional science, received her teacher's certificate from the same institution in 1995. Smith started all four years for the Catamounts. Her primary positions were center midfielder and central defender. She was all-conference and regional All-American in both 1992 and '93. During her freshman year, the squad won the ECAC Tournament. Vermont was one of the first programs to offer women's soccer as a varsity sport and it competed on a national level. Smith was named to Vermont's Athletic Hall of Fame in the summer of 2004.

Smith worked as an assistant coach at Dartmouth College from 1995-97. The Big Green made the NCAA Tournament in her second season with the program.

Smith is married to USC associate head coach Jamie Smith, a 1994 graduate of Providence College. They are the proud parents of two sons, Braden James and Evan Addison. The family resides in Cayce, S.C.

Smith has her USSF B license and the NCAA Advanced National Diploma. She is currently a member of the USYSA Regional Olympic Development Staff.

A native of Shaftsbury, Vt., Smith graduated from Mount Anthony Union High School in 1989.
