South Carolina Head Coach Chad Holbrook

Congratulations first to Liberty. Coach [Jim] Toman did a phenomenal job with his team. I told Coach [Jerry] Meyers and Coach [Sammy] Esposito that when they announced the regional pairing, offensively, I thought they were an SEC-type team. They had our upmost respect when we played them earlier in the year, and they played phenomenal baseball to get here, and they played phenomenally today. We were very fortunate today. The two runs in the fifth gave us a little breathing room. Kyle [Martin] got a big bunt down there, and Graham [Saiko] got a big hit. Tanner [English] executed a bunt for base hit that was really critical. I'm proud of our team and our players. Liberty is a class act. Great kids, great players, and we think the world of coach Toman and his staff. We're very fortunate to have won, and we look forward to playing next week.

On the approach to today, putting Liberty on its heels early...

With how good they are offensively, I didn't feel comfortable at all with a two-run lead. I just wanted to make it three or four, if we could. The first chance to get a runner in scoring position, I kind of slept on it, and I was going to do it. Also, they were not in a bunt defense. If they had been in a real bunt defense, I might have thought about doing something else. They weren't really playing Kyle to bunt, and, I think, that took a little bit of the pressure off Kyle to make a perfect bunt. I thought it was important to put a runner in scoring position. Our pitching staff has been very, very good all year long. If we score over five runs in a game, our percentage is pretty high that we'll win. That's what my thought process was.

On the team raising the level of play in the NCAA Tournament every year...

One of the things that I noticed, the energy in our dugout this weekend was unlike the energy we've had in our dugout all year. I don't know why. I got kind of mad at them, to be quite honest with you, because we played a lot of important games before this point. I was thinking, 'why now?' But, they were wanting to win, and they competed every pitch. I thought we were a little tired today. I thought we had some slow swings, our bat speed not quite what it usual is and [we had] bad at-bats after we got the 6-2 lead. But our guys competed, and they played hard. ... I think they turned it up a notch this weekend, to be honest with you. I'm proud of them for doing that, but I'm also disappointed that they didn't or couldn't have turned it up a little bit in Hoover or something. They're young and they have energy, so they should be able to bring it every day. But, we're lucky to keep playing, and I'm proud as heck. There was a lot of pressure on our kids this week with the regional pairings and the talk of the possibility of playing Clemson again. That wears on our kids. They're human beings, and they don't want to let anybody down. For them to come out with the energy and determination that they did, concentration every pitch offensively and defensively, I couldn't be more proud.

On Tanner English's bunt in the fifth inning...

It's not the first time he's tried it. Any time there's a runner on third with two outs – we've been working on it in the fall – he has the freedom and the liberty to bunt. I actually encourage it all the time. If he bunts it, and it doesn't have to be a good bunt, it puts an incredible amount of pressure on the defense to make a play. He's worked on it hard. The guy didn't have great velocity, so he's an easier pitcher to bunt off, and he executed a perfect bunt. I was proud that he had the courage to do it. Even though he's done it before, he had the courage to do it. He wanted to win, and it's a terrific testament to Tanner that he had the courage to try the play.
