Mark Berson, one of three coaches all-time to post 450 victories while coaching only in NCAA Division I, begins his 37th season at the helm of the South Carolina soccer program in 2014. Berson has been at South Carolina from the beginning, hired in 1978 to move the program to varsity status.

Before coming to Carolina in 1978, Berson went 11-5-0 in one season at The Citadel, making his overall record 462-205-68, a .675 winning percentage at the start of 2014. In 2006, Berson became one of five active (at that time) Division I coaches and the 10th all-time to reach the 400-victory milestone when his Gamecocks defeated UAB, 2-0, in a televised contest at Stone Stadium. Berson entered the year with a 451-200-68 record at South Carolina.

Berson has taken the Gamecocks to 20 NCAA Tournaments, with those teams advancing to at least the second round 11 times. His squads have four quarterfinal and two NCAA College Cup appearances to their credit as well. In 1993, the Gamecocks advanced to the NCAA Championship Game.

Though Carolina has been independent during the majority of the program's tenure, the Gamecocks have captured four conference titles under Berson's leadership. Carolina won the 1993 Metro Conference Championship in one of its two years competing in the conference. The Gamecocks joined Conference USA in 2005 and promptly claimed the league's tournament championship and automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament, while Carolina also won the C-USA Championship Tournament in 2010 and collected the regular season championship in 2011.

Besides making an impact in collegiate soccer, Berson's presence is also felt at higher ranks. The Gamecocks are one of only two collegiate programs to have had a player on each of the last four United States World Cup teams. Josh Wolff competed on the United States World Cup team for the second time during the summer of 2006 and was also an Olympic team member in 2000. Clint Mathis, a teammate of Wolff during his time at Carolina, also enjoyed a celebrated professional career that spanned 11 seasons in Major League Soccer. Mathis, who retired from professional soccer in 2010, was a member of the 2002 U.S. World Cup squad and helped his MLS team, Real Salt Lake, capture the MLS Cup in 2009. Mathis also graced the cover of Sports Illustrated in May 2002 prior to the World Cup, marking the third Gamecock athlete, in any sport, to be featured on the cover of the prestigious magazine. Former Gamecock goalkeeper Brad Guzan was honored during the summer of 2010 with a roster spot on the U.S. Men's National Team for the 2010 FIFA World Cup in South Africa. The netminder continued the Gamecocks' streak with a roster spot for the 2014 FIFA World Cup in Brazil.

Berson led Carolina to a 113-39-12 mark (.726) in the 1990s, which rated the Gamecocks as one of the winningest programs in NCAA Division I soccer. In 1998, Berson earned the inaugural Independent Coach of the Year award after leading Carolina to the best record of all Independent schools. Berson has also been honored as the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Coach of the Year in the South Region on four occasions (1984, 1985, 1988, 1995).

Berson has been involved in soccer development as a coach, teacher and administrator on many levels. He is a U.S. Soccer National Instructional Staff Coach with an "A" coaching license and has served as a US Soccer National Instructional staff coach since 1989. He has served as State Coach for the South Carolina Youth Soccer Association (SCYSA), working in player development and coaching certification. In 1992, he was inducted into the South Carolina Youth Soccer Association Hall of Fame.

Berson also coached the U.S. National U-18 team in the Granatkin/Leningrad Tournament in January 1989, in the Soviet Union. In July 1987, he directed the South team to the gold medal in the U.S. Olympic Festival in Durham, N.C., one year after serving as an assistant coach for the South squad.

A 1971 graduate of Summit (N.J.) High School, Berson attended the University of North Carolina and received his bachelor of arts degree in journalism in 1975. Berson played on the Tar Heel soccer squad for four years, one as a midfielder and the other three in goal. As a senior, Berson received the UNC Educational Foundation Award and was a member of the Academic ACC Honor Roll. Berson earned his master's of education degree in sport administration from Ohio University in 1977.

Born March 16, 1953, in Hartford, Conn., Berson is married to the former Shauna Hopkins, a South Carolina alum, of Columbia. They have two children, Erin Rhea and Luke William. Erin graduated from South Carolina in 2009, and Luke is currently enrolled at the University of South Carolina in the Moore School of Business.

## CONFERENCE USA TOURNAMENT STARTS WITH SC vs. KENTUCKY ON WED. IN NORFOLK

- South Carolina clinched a berth in the 2014 Conference USA Tournament on Nov. 12-16.
- The seventh seed, the Gamecocks open the event on Wed., against second-seeded Kentucky.
- The winner gets the victor of the UAB-Marshall match on Friday at 4:30 p.m.
- This is the Gamecocks' eighth appearance in the event, with the team going 7-5-1.
- Only once has SC faced a team it lost to in the regular season in the league tournament.
- In 2010, South Carolina fell to SMU in the regular season 3-1 but came back to win the semifinal rematch 2-1 en route to its second tourney title.
- Twice, the Gamecocks have won the C-USA Tournament (2005 and 2010).
- Charlotte, the top seed, received a bye into the semifinals, where it will face the UAB/Old Dominion winner.
- The quarterfinals and semifinals will be shown on the C-USA Digital Network.

## SOUTH CAROLINA CELEBRATING 10 YEARS IN CONFERENCE USA

- The 2014 season is South Carolina's 10th as a men's soccer affiliate member of Conference USA.
- In 2011, the Garnet and Black captured the league's regular-season crown, sharing it with UAB.
- South Carolina's student-athletes have taken 40 all-league nods, with 14 coming on the first team.
- In C-USA outings, South Carolina owns a 38-28-16 (.561) mark.
- On the road, that mark is 19-13-10 (.571). At Stone Stadium, that record is 19-15-6 (.550).
- The Gamecocks fell a game shy of their fifth undefeated road slate in their C-USA history.

## KNUDSEN HEADLINES FOUR GAMECOCKS ON ALL-CONFERENCE USA TEAMS

- Redshirt freshman Mikkel Knudsen gained four honors from Conference USA as part of their 2014 awards.
- Knudsen captured the Golden Boot with his six goals in league play and the Freshman of the Year.
- He's the fourth Gamecock to be named Freshman of the Year, following Mike Gustavson, Jeff Scanella and Jimmy Maurer.
- Knudsen also headlined the All-Freshman Team and took a spot on the second-team, matching Maurer's honors in 2007.
- Senior defenders Mahamoudou Kaba and Braeden Troyer joined Knudsen on the second team.
- Sophomore midfielder Kurtis Turner garnered a third-team spot.

## SOUTH CAROLINA TEAM NOTES

- South Carolina has been a second-half team, winning more corner kicks (52-32) and shot chances (136-104) in the second 45 in its 17 matches.
- Two Gamecocks have played every minute this year: Braeden Troyer (Sr.) and Ive Burnett (So.).
- South Carolina took 131 of their 247 shots, 53 percent, in six home matches: Belmont, Mercer, UNC Greensboro, Marshall, Georgia State and Kentucky.
- Four times, SC has held foes to 2 or less shots on goal: Belmont, Marshall, Georgia State and UAB.
- South Carolina stands with an all-time record of 459-209-68 (.670).
- The 3-0 start was South Carolina's best in a decade, when the 2004 squad won its first four matches.
- Ranked 17th in the Sept. 9 NSCAA/Continental Tire poll, South Carolina received its first ranking since the last regular season poll of 2011 (23rd).

## ESPECIALLY EXPERIENCED IN OVERTIME

- The Gamecocks hold a 4-4 mark in overtime this year, the most OT wins in a season in history and the most extra-time matches played without a tie for the Gamecocks.
- The eight overtime matches ties for most in a season with 2013.
- South Carolina has played 15 overtime matches in its last 30 outings dating back to last year.
- The eight OT contests ties for seventh in NCAA Division I this year, behind UC Davis' 14 and Albany's, Detroit's, Loyola's (Chicago), Northwestern's and Valparaiso's nine.
- The Gamecocks are tied with Brown, Butler, James Madison, and SIU Edwardsville with eight (as of Nov. 9).

## 2014 GAMECOCKS ROAD WARRIORS IN C-USA ACTION

- The Gamecocks went 3-1 in road Conference USA contests, with the lone loss coming at No. 25 New Mexico in the final match of the regular season.
- In league play, South Carolina scored 11 goals on the road and three at home, with four matches in each category.
- South Carolina went 0-4 in league play at home, the first winless home slate since joining C-USA.
- All three goals at home came in the final 50 minutes of action vs. No. 19/22 Kentucky.
- The three goals against the Wildcats pushed their goals-against average down 10 spots to No. 12 in the Oct. 27 NCAA Division I stats rankings.

### GAMECOCKS ARE COMEBACK KINGS IN 2014

- In five of South Carolina's eight wins, the team has come from behind to take the victory.
- Four victories came from one goal back, with the fifth marking the largest comeback in school history (down 0-3 at Florida Atlantic).
- Twice, the team has fought back against a ranked foe despite being down a player to force double overtime (down 0-1 vs. No. 25/18 Clemson, down 0-3 vs. No. 19/22 Kentucky).
- The only wins that didn't involve overtime or falling behind were a 2-0 decision over Mercer and the 1-0 triumph at Old Dominion.

### BERSON RANKS SIXTH ON NCAA DIVISION I COACHING WINS LIST

- The only head coach in South Carolina men's soccer history, Mark Berson ranks as one of four coaches in NCAA Division I history with 450 wins at one institution.
- Berson owns 470 career victories in 38 years, which includes his 11 in 1977 at The Citadel.
- He holds 6th on the NCAA Division I wins list and 16th on the all-divisions listing.
- The FAU win broke a tie with former Kean head coach Tony Ochrimenko to give Berson 16th alone on the all-divisions list.
- Berson coached his 750th collegiate match vs. Kentucky on Oct. 25.
- He's coached 13 players who have captured 15 All-America nods at South Carolina.
- He's also guided at least one player on each of the past four US Men's National Teams in the World Cup (Clint Mathis 2002, Josh Woolf 2002 and 2006, Brad Guzan 2010 and 2014).

### THREE NAMED TO CAPITAL ONE ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT 4 TEAM BY CoSIDA

- South Carolina, for the third time in seven years, had three student-athletes claim a spot on the Capital One Academic All-District 4 Team as selected by CoSIDA.
- Forwards Jeffrey Torda and Eli Dent garnered recognition for the first time, while senior Braeden Troyer made his third appearance on the team.
- Honorees must have a 3.3 cumulative grade point average, completed one full academic year at the school and be a sophomore both athletically and academically.
- Academic All-Americans will be announced on Tues., Nov. 25.
- The 2008 and 2010 teams also had three members make what was then two squads honored.

### WE SCHEDULED STRONG FOES

- Of the 17 regular-season matches scheduled this season for the Gamecocks, 12 came against top-100 RPI teams in the final 2013 report from the NCAA.
- Seven ranked in the top 50, four from C-USA (Charlotte, UAB, Old Dominion & New Mexico).
- Four foes made the NSCAA/Continental Tire Preseason Top 25, well, 26 when you count Old Dominion tying for the 25th spot with Navy.
- Five Gamecock foes from 2014 appear in the most-recent NSCAA top 25, while another receives votes.
- SC is 2-6 against top-40 teams in the latest RPI report.

### GAMECOCKS VS. RANKED FOES

- South Carolina is 32-57-9 (.372) against foes ranked in the NSCAA top 25 (since 1996).
- Broken down by site, the Gamecocks are 17-27-4 (.396) at home, 11-19-5 (.386) on the road and 4-11 (.267) in neutral-site outings.
- This season, the Gamecocks are 1-4 against NSCAA-ranked opponents.

### RECENT DOMINANCE OF ARCHRIVAL CLEMSON

- Since 2007, the Gamecocks are 6-2 against their archrival Clemson, with both of the losses coming in double overtime on the road (2011 & 2013).
- The last four matches at Stone Stadium have gone to the Gamecocks, three coming in shutouts.
- It's the best stretch since the Gamecocks went 10-4 from 1985-95 against the Tigers, with three of the wins in that stretch coming in NCAA Tournament play.

## SCOUTING KENTUCKY

- The Wildcats are 10-4-4 on the year, dropping their only C-USA game against Charlotte last Fri.
- Things start with UK's defense, with junior Callum Irving posting a 0.64 goals against average, the 10th-best GAA in NCAA Division I.
- He's totaled 10 shutouts in 18 matches, making 59 saves in 1,701 minutes of play.
- Most offensive categories are even between UK and its foes.
- Of note, Kentucky has not given up a penalty kick while only taking two all season.
- Forty-five percent of the Wildcats' shots have come on goal.
- Justin Laird leads Kentucky with six goals and has added four assists.
- Bryan Celis has a team-best six assists, followed closely by Charlie Reymann's five.
- Napo Matsoso, who ranks second on the team in goals with five and third in assists with four, will miss the match due to a red card in the last match against Charlotte.
- Only five of the Wildcats' 24 goals have been unassisted.

## SERIES HISTORY VS. THE WILDCATS

- The series is level at 5-5-3, with the lone neutral-site meeting a scoreless tie in the first round of the 2005 C-USA Tournament (11/9).
- The Gamecocks advanced on penalty kicks that day, 3-0, in Dallas, Texas.

## THE LAST TIME - OCT. 25, 2014

### SOUTH CAROLINA VS. KENTUCKY - STONE STADIUM

COLUMBIA, S.C. - On Senior Night at Stone Stadium, South Carolina (7-8, 2-4 C-USA) fought back from down 3-0 for the second time in 10 days to force overtime against No. 19/22 Kentucky (9-3-3, 4-0-2 C-USA), but the Wildcats tallied the golden goal with a minute remaining in the second overtime to claim a 4-3 win.

Ryan Creel hit the game-winner in the 109th minute, sending a strike from 10 yards away past the Gamecocks' defense after Bryan Celis set him up with the cross. That concluded the Gamecocks' attempt to match the largest comeback in school history done on Oct. 17 at Florida Atlantic.

Down 3-0 in the 59th minute while also down a man, South Carolina replaced two-thirds of the field players at once, including putting seniors Ryan Freiburger and Dan Traxler on the pitch for their only action of the night. That group, which also included juniors Wesley Eads, Devin L'Amoreaux, Joey Hutchinson and Reid Grayson, started attacking with vigor, getting a header off a corner kick in the 60th minute that bounced off the crossbar. Six minutes later, sophomore defender Ive Burnett, one of the three to stay on the pitch, dribbled to the top of the 18 and ripped the shot to the left of Kentucky's goalkeeper to break the ice for the Gamecocks.

Redshirt freshman Mikkel Knudsen scored twice to knot the match, first in the 83rd on a blast from the top of the 18 into the left upper 90. Sophomore midfielder Koty Millard helped with the game-tying tally in the 86th, sending the cross to Knudsen inside the six, where the Dane put it in the net to tie the match at 3-3.

Kentucky held a 2-0 lead at half after a pair of goals from Napo Matsoso. The Wildcats worked the ball down with precision passing for the first goal in the 36th, as Matsoso sent it home on the back post from the six after assists from Charlie Reymann and Celis. Celis helped again on the 42nd-minute score, as Matsoso took the play back to him and scored from 20 yards away, sneaking the ball in under the crossbar.

Matsoso made it 3-0 in the 56th when he converted the cross from Gerald Laird on the near post from inside the six.

Kentucky held a man advantage for the final 64 minutes of play, after Gamecock sophomore midfielder Kurtis Turner was shown red after a tackle from behind 30 seconds before halftime.

## GAMECOCKS COME BACK AT FLORIDA ATLANTIC FOR BIG WIN

- The Gamecocks scored four unanswered goals in the final 30 minutes of regulation and five minutes of overtime to claim a 4-3 road win at Florida Atlantic on Oct. 17.
- South Carolina posted its biggest come-from-behind victory with that effort, the first time in 37 years a Gamecock team overcame a three-goal deficit.
- Doubling the Owls in shots in the second half, SC had two goals from redshirt freshman Mikkel Knudsen, including the neutralizer with 7:59 remaining.
- Two Gamecocks made their season debut in the win, juniors Devin L'Amoreaux and Wesley Eads. L'Amoreaux had an assist on the game-tying goal by Knudsen.

## AWARDS CAME IN BUNCHES IN SECOND WEEK

- Sophomore goalkeeper Marco Velez won two honors over Sept. 8-9, the Conference USA Defensive Player of the Week and the Disney Soccer/NSCAA Player of the Week.
- It's Velez's second C-USA weekly honor, matching his award on Oct. 28, 2013, as a freshman.
- He's the first national player of the week for SC since Bradlee Baladez took the College Soccer News award on Oct. 4, 2010.
- The last Gamecock before Velez to earn NSCAA's weekly nod was Ayo Akinsete on Oct. 25, 2006.
- Mahamoudou Kaba took a spot on CSN's Team of the Week on Sept. 8 after garnering the C-USA Preseason Defensive Player of the Year award.

## ATTENDANCE OUTSTANDING AT STONE STADIUM

- The 2014 Gamecocks have the fifth-highest paid attendance average in NCAA Division I at 2,602.
- That 2,602 attendance average is the largest for a season in Stone Stadium history.
- The paid attendance of 5,415 for the season-opening match against Belmont ranks as the 4th-best in Stone Stadium history and 8th in the site's history of men's matches.

## GAMECOCKS HAVE A RICH HISTORY IN NCAA TOURNAMENT

- On 20 occasions, the Gamecocks made an NCAA Tournament, the most in Conference USA.
- Eleven times, the Gamecocks have played the NCAA Tournament Round of 16.
- South Carolina is 16-19-1 in the tourney, making two College Cups in 1988 and 1993.
- To make their 21st appearance, the Gamecocks will need to win the C-USA Tournament for the third time.

## TROYER NAMED A SENIOR CLASS AWARD CANDIDATE

- Gamecock Braeden Troyer was one of 30 candidates for its men's soccer Senior CLASS Award but was not one of 10 finalists.
- Troyer leads all SC returners with 10 career goals, tied for seventh in Gamecock history during the Conference USA era (since 2005).
- Twice he's been named to the C-USA All-Academic Team, and he has four All-C-USA nods, ('12, '13 & '14 second team, '11 third team).
- He also made the 2011 Conference USA All-Freshman Team and has been honored once on the College Soccer News Team of the Week (Sept. 29, 2013).
- On three occasions, CoSIDA has voted him on the Capital One Academic All-District 4 team.
- In the classroom, he's been a member of the Honors College at South Carolina and earned three C-USA Academic Medals, given to student-athletes with a 3.75 GPA.
- He's a co-captain in 2014 (along with Mahamoudou "Mo" Kaba).
