

Mark Berson, one of three coaches all-time to post 450 victories while coaching only in NCAA Division I, begins his 37th season at the helm of the South Carolina soccer program in 2014. Berson has been at South Carolina from the beginning, hired in 1978 to move the program to varsity status.

Before coming to Carolina in 1978, Berson went 11-5-0 in one season at The Citadel, making his overall record 462-205-68, a .675 winning percentage at the start of 2014. In 2006, Berson became one of five active (at that time) Division I coaches and the 10th all-time to reach the 400-victory milestone when his Gamecocks defeated UAB, 2-0, in a televised contest at Stone Stadium. Berson entered the year with a 451-200-68 record at South Carolina.

Berson has taken the Gamecocks to 20 NCAA Tournaments, with those teams advancing to at least the second round 11 times. His squads have four quarterfinal and two NCAA College Cup appearances to their credit as well. In 1993, the Gamecocks advanced to the NCAA Championship Game.

Though Carolina has been independent during the majority of the program's tenure, the Gamecocks have captured four conference titles under Berson's leadership. Carolina won the 1993 Metro Conference Championship in one of its two years competing in the conference. The Gamecocks joined Conference USA in 2005 and promptly claimed the league's tournament championship and automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament, while Carolina also won the C-USA Championship Tournament in 2010 and collected the regular season championship in 2011.

Besides making an impact in collegiate soccer, Berson's presence is also felt at higher ranks. The Gamecocks are one of only two collegiate programs to have had a player on each of the last four United States World Cup teams. Josh Wolff competed on the United States World Cup team for the second time during the summer of 2006 and was also an Olympic team member in 2000. Clint Mathis, a teammate of Wolff during his time at Carolina, also enjoyed a celebrated professional career that spanned 11 seasons in Major League Soccer. Mathis, who retired from professional soccer in 2010, was a member of the 2002 U.S. World Cup squad and helped his MLS team, Real Salt Lake, capture the MLS Cup in 2009. Mathis also graced the cover of Sports Illustrated in May 2002 prior to the World Cup, marking the third Gamecock athlete, in any sport, to be featured on the cover of the prestigious magazine. Former Gamecock goalkeeper Brad Guzan was honored during the summer of 2010 with a roster spot on the U.S. Men's National Team for the 2010 FIFA World Cup in South Africa. The netminder continued the Gamecocks' streak with a roster spot for the 2014 FIFA World Cup in Brazil.

Berson led Carolina to a 113-39-12 mark (.726) in the 1990s, which rated the Gamecocks as one of the winningest programs in NCAA Division I soccer. In 1998, Berson earned the inaugural Independent Coach of the Year award after leading Carolina to the best record of all Independent schools. Berson has also been honored as the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Coach of the Year in the South Region on four occasions (1984, 1985, 1988, 1995).

Berson has been involved in soccer development as a coach, teacher and administrator on many levels. He is a U.S. Soccer National Instructional Staff Coach with an "A" coaching license and has served as a US Soccer National Instructional staff coach since 1989. He has served as State Coach for the South Carolina Youth Soccer Association (SCYSA), working in player development and coaching certification. In 1992, he was inducted into the South Carolina Youth Soccer Association Hall of Fame.

Berson also coached the U.S. National U-18 team in the Granatkin/Leningrad Tournament in January 1989, in the Soviet Union. In July 1987, he directed the South team to the gold medal in the U.S. Olympic Festival in Durham, N.C., one year after serving as an assistant coach for the South squad.

A 1971 graduate of Summit (N.J.) High School, Berson attended the University of North Carolina and received

his bachelor of arts degree in journalism in 1975. Berson played on the Tar Heel soccer squad for four years, one as a midfielder and the other three in goal. As a senior, Berson received the UNC Educational Foundation Award and was a member of the Academic ACC Honor Roll. Berson earned his master's of education degree in sport administration from Ohio University in 1977.

Born March 16, 1953, in Hartford, Conn., Berson is married to the former Shauna Hopkins, a South Carolina alum, of Columbia. They have two children, Erin Rhea and Luke William. Erin graduated from South Carolina in 2009, and Luke is currently enrolled at the University of South Carolina in the Moore School of Business.

SOUTH CAROLINA TEAM NOTES

- Sophomore goalkeeper Marco Velez won two honors, the Conference USA Defensive Player of the Week and the Disney Soccer/NSCAA Player of the Week on Sept. 8-9.
- It's Velez's second C-USA weekly honor, matching his award on Oct. 28, 2013, as a freshman.
- He's the first national player of the week for SC since Bradlee Baladez took the College Soccer News award on Oct. 4, 2010.
- The last Gamecock to earn NSCAA Player of the Week was Ayo Akinsete on Oct. 25, 2006.
- Senior defender Mahamoudou Kaba took a spot on CSN's Team of the Week, the first national honor of his this year.
- Kaba also garnered the C-USA Preseason Defensive Player of the Year award.
- Ranked 17th in the latest NSCAA/Continental Tire poll, South Carolina is ranked for the first time since the last regular season poll of 2011 (23rd).
- South Carolina has taken its last three meetings against a ranked team (No. 25 New Mexico on 10/26/13, No. 10 UAB on 11/3/13, No. 25 Clemson on 9/2/14).
- With its 3-0 start, South Carolina is off to its best season beginning since 2004, when it won its first four matches.
- The Gamecocks stand with an all-time record of 454-200-68 (.676).

BERSON TRYING TO MOVE UP NCAA COACHING WINS LIST

- The only head coach in South Carolina men's soccer history, Mark Berson ranks as one of four coaches in NCAA Division I history with 450 wins at one institution.
- His next win ties him with former SMU coach Schellas Hyndman for 6th on the NCAA Division I wons list and 17th on the all-divisions listing.
- Berson owns 465 career wins, which includes his 11 in 1977 at The Citadel.
- He's coached 11 players who have captured 13 All-America nods at South Carolina.

TROYER NAMED A SENIOR CLASS AWARD CANDIDATE

- On Sept. 2, the Senior CLASS Award announced its 30 candidates for its men's award, naming Gamecock Braeden Troyer to the list.
- Troyer leads all SC returners with 10 career goals, tied for seventh in Gamecock history during the Conference USA era (since 2005).
- Twice he's been named to the C-USA All-Academic Team, and he has three All-C-USA nods, ('12 second team, '11 & '13 third team).
- He also made the 2011 Conference USA All-Freshman Team and has been honored once on the College Soccer News Team of the Week (Sept. 29, 2013).
- On two occasions, CoSIDA has voted him on the Capital One Academic All-District 4 team.
- In the classroom, he's been a member of the Honors College at South Carolina and earned three C-USA Academic Medals, given to student-athletes with a 3.75 GPA.
- He's a co-captain in 2014 (along with Mahamoudou "Mo" Kaba).

SOUTH CAROLINA CELEBRATING 10 YEARS IN CONFERENCE USA

- The 2014 season is South Carolina's 10th as a men's soccer affiliate member of Conference USA.
- In 2011, the Garnet and Black captured the league's regular-season crown, sharing it with UAB.
- Twice, the Gamecocks have won the league's tournament (2005 and 2010).
- South Carolina's student-athletes have taken 40 all-league nods, with 14 coming on the first team.
- In C-USA outings, South Carolina owns a 35-23-16 (.581) mark. At Stone Stadium, that record is 19-11-6 (.611).

THE GAMECOCKS SHINE IN THE CLASSROOM AS WELL

- South Carolina's 18 returners have a total of 30 SEC Academic Honor Roll certificates and 31 Conference USA Academic Honor Roll notations between them.
- Of those, 10 are Conference USA Academic Medal mentions, which is awarded to student-athletes with a 3.75 cumulative GPA or higher.
- Four of the seniors, Robert Beebe, Mahamoudou "Mo" Kaba, Asa Kryst and Braeden Troyer have three certificates each.
- Troyer has three of those Academic Medals, while both Ryan Arambula and Jeffrey Torda have two.

WE SCHEDULED STRONG FOES

- Of the 17 regular-season matches scheduled this season for the Gamecocks, 12 come against top-100 RPI teams in the final 2013 report from the NCAA.
- Seven rank in the top 50, four from C-USA (Charlotte, UAB, Old Dominion & New Mexico).
- Four foes made the NSCAA/Continental Tire Preseason Top 25, well, 26 when you count Old Dominion tying for the 25th spot with Navy.
- The Gamecocks are 1-0-0 against a ranked team in 2014, beating No. 25/18 Clemson.

SCOUTING UNC WILMINGTON

- The Seahawks enter Friday's contest with a 2-1-1 record, dropping their last outing against Winthrop 2-1.
- UNC Wilmington has tallied six goals while shooting 60 times, 24 on goal, in four matches.

- Five different Seahawks have goals this year, including junior Colin Bonner, last year's leading scorer with six goals and three assists.
- Senior Jamie Dell also returns with his team-best four assists to go with four goals.
- Redshirt junior David Sizemore is the only Seahawk with one goal and one assist this year.
 Sophomore goalkeeper Sean Melvin has handled the net minding this year, posting one shutout
- with his 0.91 goals against average in 396 minutes.As a freshman, he tallied two clean sheets in 12 matches, compiling a 1.76 GAA in 1,024 minutes.

SERIES HISTORY VS. UNC WILMINGTON

- South Carolina is 7-1-1 all-time against the Seahawks, including a 4-0 mark at home.
- The Gamecocks have won the last four meetings in 1983, 1984, 2004 and 2005.
- Only once has South Carolina not tallied at least two goals in a match against UNCW (10/31/1982).

GAMECOCKS HAVE A RICH HISTORY IN NCAA TOURNAMENT

- On 20 occasions, the Gamecocks made an NCAA Tournament, the most in Conference USA.
- Eleven times, the Gamecocks made the NCAA Tournament Round of 16.
- South Carolina is 16-19-1 in the tourney, making two College Cups in 1988 and 1993.

SOUTH CAROLINA VS. UNC WILMINGTON - STONE STADIUM Propelled by a pair of first-half goals from Eric Szeszycki, South Carolina rolled past No. 25 UNC Wilmington,

4-2, Wednesday night at Stone Stadium.

UNC Wilmington jumped to a 1-0 lead in the seventh minute as Keith Shevlin fed Will Clark and Clark knocked the ball past Gamecock goalkeeper Mike Gustavson.

Szeszycki struck for his first goal at the 23:01 mark following a well-built play. Mike Sambursky played the ball to Josh Alcala, who slipped it to Szeszycki in the middle of the box. Szeszycki tied the match, 1-1, with his shot.

Szeszycki added his second goal a minute and a half later, dribbling the ball into the 18yard box and through three defenders before shooting it right to left for the score at 24:30.

With SC up 2-1, the Seahawks knotted the game in the 55th minute on a goal by Chris Murray. Carolina saved a UNCW shot off the line, but the deflected ball landed just outside the "18" and Murray rifled the shot into the goal.

South Carolina responded six minutes later when Sambursky scored from 10 yards out on the right side. Paracat and Alcala both earned assists on the play.

Charest added an insurance goal in the 73rd minute, picking up a deflected shot by Sambursky on the left post and pushing it across the line.
