QUICK HITS

FOR STARTERS

South Carolina (15-4) is back in action on Tuesday, Mar. 20 with a non-conference tilt vs. Furman (11-10) at Fluor Field in Greenville, S.C. First pitch is set for 7 p.m. with the game televised on SportSouth. The Gamecocks return home to Carolina Stadium on Wednesday, Mar. 21 vs. Wofford with first pitch at 7 p.m. and the game televised on FS South/FS Carolinas. Both games can be heard on the Gamecock Radio Network from IMG College. The Gamecocks are ranked No. 6 by Collegiate Baseball and No. 8 by Baseball America and in the ESPN/USA Today coaches' poll.

QUICK RECAP

South Carolina continued the 2012 season with non-conference wins vs. Charleston Southern and Appalachian State. The Gamecocks were swept in a weekend series at Kentucky in the first week of conference play. South Carolina is 15-4 on the year including a 14-0 record at Carolina Stadium.

ONE MILESTONE REACHED

South Carolina head coach Ray Tanner won his 700th game as head coach at South Carolina in the 2-1 victory over Princeton. Tanner is now 704-300 (.701) in 16 years at the helm of the Garnet & Black. Tanner is one step closer to another milestone as he enters this weekend with a 1,099-473-3 (.699) career record in 25 years as a head coach in collegiate baseball.

CLOSE CALLS

South Carolina is 10-4 in games decided by three runs or less through 19 games. The Gamecocks also own a 6-3 record in one-run contests.

HIT PARADE

The Gamecocks totaled double-digits in hits in four of the five games this past week. The Gamecocks had 11 vs. Charleston Southern, 10 in both the Friday and Saturday games at Kentucky as well as 11 in the series finale vs. the Wildcats. Carolina raised the team batting average eight points up to .285 after this past week's games.

SHOWING OFF THE GLOVE

The Gamecocks have also been playing pretty good defense lately with just one error this past week and just two in the past nine games. South Carolina is fielding .979 with only 14 errors for the season.

A CALL TO ARMS

South Carolina's pitching staff continues to post stellar numbers through the first part of the season. The Gamecocks own a team ERA of 2.23 with 46 runs allowed, 42 earned, in 169.2 innings on 110 hits. Opponents are hitting only .180 against the Gamecock pitching staff. The staff has 184 strikeouts to 45 walks. Carolina leads the conference in ERA, opposing batting average and saves.

ROTH LEADS THE WAY

Despite a no-decision on Friday at Kentucky, senior left-hander Michael Roth had a quality start. He allowed just two runs on five hits in 6.2 innings of work. Roth is 2-0 on the year with a 1.26 ERA. He has 36 strikeouts to just seven walks. Opponents are hitting only .151 against him.

Roth carried a shutout into the ninth inning and limited Princeton to just one run on six hits in a 2-1 victory over the Tigers. He also struck out a career-high 10 batters, the most strikeouts by a Gamecock pitcher since June 28, 2010 when Blake Cooper had 10 vs. UCLA in the CWS Championship Series. At one point in the game, he had retired 12 batters in a row.

BRING THE PAYNE

Sophomore infielder Erik Payne had a stellar week at the plate. He was 6-for-11 (.545) in the Kentucky series as well as 3-for-7 in the midweek contests vs. CSU and ASU. Payne had two hits apiece in all three games at Kentucky as well as a solo home run in Friday's 4-3 loss. Payne is hitting .419 (13-for-31) for the season with a double, triple, homer, five runs scored and five RBI. He owns a .710 slugging percentage.

MARZILLI LEADS IT OFF

Junior outfielder Evan Marzilli had a game-winning three-run double as well as a career-high four RBI in the 6-4 win over Appalachian State. He is hitting .316 (24-for-76) for the season with 12 runs scored, a team-high seven doubles and nine RBI. He has reached base in all 19 games this year. Marzilli had a nine-game hitting streak snapped in Sunday's 6-3 loss at Kentucky. He also tied a school record with three doubles in the 2-1 win over Princeton. It is the 25th time in school history that a player has tallied three doubles in one game.

Marzilli's defense was essential for the Gamecocks in the 3-2 win over Clemson in 11 innings. Marzilli had his first assist of the year with a throw to home plate to nab a Tiger runner trying to score and his diving catch with two outs in the bottom of the 11th inning sealed the Gamecock victory.

Marzilli was effective in the first weekend vs. VMI as he hit .500 (6-for-12) with a .538 on-base percentage. Marzilli had a 3-for-4 day at the plate on Opening Day. He scored the game-winning run in the opener and also was key in the 13-1 victory as he went 2-for-4 with a triple, run scored and two RBI.

WALKER PROVIDES A PUNCH

Junior first baseman Christian Walker tied a season-high in hits with a 3-for-4 day and a RBI in the 6-4 win over Appalachian State as well as three hits including two doubles in the 4-3 loss at Kentucky on Saturday. Walker is hitting .338 (24-for-71) with six doubles, nine runs scored and 18 RBI. His on-base percentage is .434 with a .4645 slugging percentage.

He also had a season-high three hits as well as three RBI in the 8-1 win over UNC Asheville. In the 8-1 win over Elon, Walker reached base all four times at the plate including two hits, a homer and five RBI in the victory. The five RBI tied a career-high. Walker hit safely in all three games of the series.

THE PRICE IS RIGHT

Junior right-hander Matt Price has been steady on the mound. Price is 2-1 on the year with a 3.71 ERA and 32 strikeouts in 26.1 innings pitched. Opponents are hitting just .181 against him.

ONE MORE APPEARANCE FROM ROTH & PRICE

Both Matt Price and Michael Roth have appeared in 79 games in their careers with the Garnet & Black. That is tied for fifth all-time in school history with Brian Beatson (1987-90) and nine shy of the school record set by Rob Mosser (1990-93).

HOLMES WITH THE ANSWER

Junior right-hander Colby Holmes is the team's leader in victories with a 3-0 record. Holmes hurled five scoreless innings with just four hits allowed in the 3-1 victory over Princeton. He struck out six and walked one. Holmes owns a 1.88 ERA in five starts with 24.0 innings pitched. He has 25 strikeouts to nine walks.

BEAL BRINGS IT

Freshman right-hander Evan Beal posted two saves vs. Princeton and one vs. Appalachian State. He is 1-1 with a 3.86 ERA. He has 14 strikeouts and just one walk in 9.1 innings. Opponents are hitting just .129 against him.

Beal earned his first career win in the 9-6 victory vs. Clemson. Beal entered the game in the bottom of the fifth and retired nine in a row and lasted four innings allowing just two runs on three hits while striking out five and walking one.

DYNAMIC DUO BEHIND THE DISH

Freshman catcher Grayson Greiner became the first Gamecock to hit two home runs in a game this season when he belted a pair in the 6-5 loss at Clemson. Greiner had a three-run homer and a solo shot. The last Gamecock player to hit two homers in a game was Steven Neff on May 11 in a 7-1 win over Arkansas. The last freshman to accomplish the feat was Adam Matthews in 2009 against East Carolina in the NCAA Regional, a 12-2 win over the Pirates. Greiner is hitting .269 (14-for-52) with a pair of homers and 11 RBI.

Not to be outdone is junior catcher Dante Rosenberg, who played a pivotal role in the 3-2 win over VMI on Saturday. Rosenberg was 2-for-4 with two doubles, a run scored and a RBI including the game-winning RBI hit in the bottom of the sixth inning in the victory.

KOUMAS FACTORS IN

Sophomore right-hander Forrest Koumas did not allow a run in four relief appearances this past week. He pitched 2.1 perfect innings with four strikeouts in the 5-2 win over Charleston Southern. He is 1-1 with three saves and a 2.45 ERA in 11 innings pitched. He has 12 strikeouts to four walks.

WEBB MAKES HIS MARK

Junior left-hander Tyler Webb picked up the win in relief in Wednesday's 6-4 win over Appalachian State. Webb had four appearances in the five games this past week. He has been a steady reliever thus far with a 0.60 ERA in a team-high 12 relief appearances. Webb has allowed just one earned run in 15 innings while striking out 19 and walking three.

ENGLISH HAS A KNACK

Another key offensive contributor early in the season has been freshman outfielder Tanner English. He had a season-high three hits and a run scored in the 5-2 win over Charleston Southern. English went 2-for-4 with two runs in the 8-1 win over UNC Asheville. He scored a run in all three games of the Elon series and hit safely in all three games as well. English drove in three runs for the weekend with a key two-run triple to left-center in 6-0 win over Elon in the second inning.

English is hitting .282 (20-for-71) with a .338 on-base percentage.

Freshman infielder Joey Pankake was 2-for-2 in the 4-3 loss at Kentucky on Saturday. He owns a .286 batting average (12-for-42) with 12 runs scored.

He tallied his first career homer and RBI in the 2-1 win vs. Presbyterian. The game-winning hit came in the bottom of the fourth inning. Pankake was productive in the Elon series. He was 2-for-4 with a triple and three runs scored in the 8-1 win in the opener. He had two walks in game two and a hit and a run scored in the Sunday series finale.

LB LIGHTS IT UP

Junior third baseman LB Dantzler was 2-for-4 with a season-high three runs scored in the 6-4 win vs. Appalachian State. He also went 2-for-4 with a RBI in the 6-3 loss at Kentucky. Dantzler is hitting .275 (19-for-69) with three homers, three doubles, 11 runs scored and 14 RBI.

Dantzler finished the weekend 4-for-11 (.364) at the plate with five RBI and a .727 slugging percentage.

Junior left-hander Adam Westmoreland won his first start of the 2012 season in the 5-2 win over Appalachian State. Westmoreland allowed one run on four hits in 5.2 innings with four strikeouts and a walk.

MORE FROM THE PEN

Junior right-hander Ethan Carter has a 1-0 record with a 0.00 ERA. He has pitched 10 innings in five appearances and has 10 strikeouts to just two walks. Opponents are hitting just .088 against Carter.

Another junior right-hander that has been near flawless has been Hunter Privette. The side-armed struck out the two batters he faced in the 3-1 win over Princeton and had three strikeouts in 1.1 perfect innings of relief in the 6-4 win over Appalachian State.

K-MART

Freshman Kyle Martin was the starting designated hitter this weekend vs. Princeton. He hit .556 (5-for-9) with a pair of runs scored and a RBI in the weekend sweep. Martin tied a season-high with three hits including a solo home run in the 2-1 win over Princeton on Friday night. He also tallied two hits with a double and a run scored in the 3-1 win on Sunday. CHECK IT OUT!

The eight-run total allowed by the Gamecock pitching staff through the first seven games was the lowest run total to start a season since 1977, when the Gamecocks allowed just seven runs in their first seven games.

IF YOU BUILD IT - THEY WILL COME

South Carolina is among the nation leaders in attendance after three weekends. South Carolina has totaled 101,422 in attendance for 14 home games for an average of 7,244.

Opening Day was sold out with a crowd of 8,242 in attendance. The three-game series vs. VMI totaled 23,253 for an average of 7,751 per contest. Carolina's second sellout came on March 3 vs. Clemson. South Carolina has sold out Carolina Stadium with capacity crowds 13 times in school history.

South Carolina set a record for season tickets sold this year with a total of 5,580 sold in the preseason, surpassing the previous record of 5,414 set last year. South Carolina's total attendance of 297,279 for 40 games last year at Carolina Stadium was second highest in the country.

The Gamecocks own a 106-19 (.848) record since opening the facility on Feb. 21, 2009.

MATTHEWS EARNS TOM PRICE AWARD

South Carolina senior outfielder Adam Matthews earned the Tom Price Award as MVP of the series for South Carolina vs. Clemson. Matthews hit .417 (5-for-12) in the three games vs. the Tigers with four runs and four RBI. Matthews had two hits including a three-run homer in the 9-6 victory over Clemson on Saturday.

BELCHER KEEPS CONTRIBUTING

Junior left-hander Nolan Belcher had a productive week with a win and two saves in all three victories over Presbyterian and Clemson two weeks ago. Belcher earned his first win since May 11, 2010 with 2.1 scoreless innings of relief in the 2-1 win over Presbyterian. He allowed just one hit and struck out three batters. Roth is in his second straight year as captain for the baseball team. Last year, Roth was named to the College World Series All-Tournament Team and was a first-team CoSIDA Academic All-American as well. He also earned the NCAA Elite 88 award as the student-athlete with the highest GPA of all student-athletes in the 2011 College World Series.

The South Carolina National Guard Band opened with the national anthem and fans were treated to a video tribute to the 2011 national championship squad. Several former Gamecock players from the '11 team were in attendance including Robert Beary, Jackie Bradley Jr., Bryan Harper, Peter Mooney, Adrian Morales, Steven Neff, John Taylor, Brady Thomas and Scott Wingo. Bradley, the 2010 College World Series Most Outstanding Player and Wingo, the 2011 College World Series Most Outstanding Player, each threw out ceremonial first pitches before the game. Bradley threw a strike down the middle from near the pitcher's mound to Thomas with Wingo and Beary simulating a throw from second base to home plate. It was Wingo's throw and Beary's pick at home plate that was a key play in the game one victory in the 2011 championship series with the Florida Gators.

OPENING DAY START GOES TO ROTH

South Carolina senior left-hander Michael Roth is slated to get the Opening Day start for the Gamecocks. Roth is third pitcher under head coach Ray Tanner to have multiple Opening Day starts on the mound along with Aaron Rawl (2004-05) and Kip Bouknight (1999-2000-01). Roth is a consensus Preseason All-America selection.

A consensus All-American and CollegeBaseballInsider.com's National Player of the Year in 2011, Roth went 14-3 last year while posting a 1.06 ERA in 145.0 innings of work. In his first full year as a starting pitcher, Roth struck out 112 batters and walked 41 to help lead the Gamecocks to their second-consecutive NCAA Division I national championship. Roth also tallied a 1.17 ERA in Southeastern Conference play, the lowest of any starter in the league. His 14 wins tied for fifth most by a Gamecock in a single season. A first-team All-SEC selection, Roth was named to the College World Series All-Tournament Team and was a first-team CoSIDA Academic All-American.

Head Coach Ray Tanner

A three-time National Coach of the Year and Southeastern Conference Coach of the Year, Ray Tanner is in his 16th season as head coach at the University of South Carolina. Tanner has established one of the premier programs in all of college baseball with milestones and accomplishments piling up each season.

Tanner's 15th season with the Garnet & Black culminated in Omaha, Neb., where the Gamecocks won the 2011 National Championship becoming only the ninth repeat champion in MCWS history. Carolina was the first team to go 10-0 in NCAA Tournament play (3-0 in Regional, 2-0 in Super Regional, 5-0 in MCWS) in one season. The Gamecocks, who entered the tournament as the number four national seed, established NCAA records with 16 consecutive postseason wins and 11 consecutive wins in the College World Series. While in Omaha, South Carolina defeated Texas A&M, number one seed Virginia twice, and number two seed Florida twice without a loss.

The 2011 national championship adds to a list of achievements that ranks as strong as any school in the country. Under Tanner, the Gamecocks reached Omaha for the fifth time in 10 years, only one school in the nation has made more College World Series appearances over the last decade.

In the previous year, South Carolina closed out Rosenblatt Stadium winning the 2010 National Championship as the Gamecocks became the first team in MCWS history to win six consecutive games in Omaha on the way to a national title, the first men's national championship at the University of South Carolina. Tanner is one of five active coaches in NCAA Division I Baseball to have won multiple national titles.

Under Tanner's leadership, South Carolina owns the longest current streak of NCAA Regional appearances among the 12 SEC schools with 12 straight trips to the tournament dating back to the 2000 season. In that span, Carolina has nine NCAA Super Regional appearances (2000, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2006, 2007, 2010, 2011). South Carolina is one of only four schools in the nation to make at least nine NCAA Super Regionals in the last 12 years and one of only eight schools in the country to have reached the NCAA Regionals every season from 2000 to the present. The program's 12-year record of 577-231 is the third-highest win total among NCAA Division I schools. South Carolina has 12 consecutive seasons of 40 or more wins.

Carolina's 2011 SEC regular-season championship was the third in school history as the Gamecocks also collected championships in the Southeastern Conference with regular-season

titles in 2000 and 2002 along with a SEC Tournament crown in 2004. Tanner's last 12 teams have featured 23 All-America performers.

The upcoming 2012 season will be Tanner's 25th year as a collegiate head coach. At South Carolina, Tanner owns a 689-296 record at South Carolina with a .699 winning percentage, second highest all-time among SEC coaches. His career record is 1,084-469-3 for a winning percentage of .698. In 2010, Tanner also reached a career milestone, recording his 1,000th career victory, as he became the fourth-fastest active coach to reach that total.

Tanner guided South Carolina's 2011 squad to one of the most impressive seasons in school history with a share of the SEC championship and the number one seed at the SEC Tournament on the way to the school's second-consecutive national title. Carolina won nine of 10 league series in the regular season en route to a 22-8 conference record. The team featured All-America and All-SEC pitcher Michael Roth, who went 14-3 on the year, including a win in the national championship clincher over Florida. Roth's 14 wins tied for the national lead and his ERA was best among all starting pitchers in college baseball. Roth ranks on South Carolina's single-season charts in ERA (2nd, 1.06), starts (T1st, 20), innings (3rd, 145) and wins (T5th, 14). Roth also showcased his talents off the field as an Academic All-America first-team selection and as winner of the Elite 88 Award for the NCAA Division I Baseball Championship, given to the student-athlete with the top GPA at the College World Series. Right-handed reliever Matt Price also earned All-America and All-SEC accolades as he posted seven wins and 20 saves out of the bullpen in 59.0 innings. First baseman Christian Walker earned All-America and All-SEC honors as well as he led the way for the Gamecocks at the plate as the team's Triple Crown winner with a .358 batting average, 10 HR and 62 RBI. Second baseman Scott Wingo was a first-team All-SEC honoree as well as the College World Series Most Outstanding Player. Wingo hit .333 over five games in the series with four RBI, including three in the finals, and also made several stellar defensive plays throughout the MCWS. He finished his career having appeared in 254 career games, one shy of South Carolina's school record (255 Michael Campbell, (2003-06). Right-hander Forrest Koumas earned SEC All-Freshman team honors with Walker, Wingo and junior outfielder Jackie Bradley Jr. named to the All-SEC Defensive team. The 2011 MLB Draft concluded with 11 South Carolina players selected, one behind the SEC record of 12 set this past year by Vanderbilt.

Tanner gained valuable experience at an international level in his association with USA Baseball. He has served five stints with Red, White and Blue, including in 2003 as head coach for the USA National Baseball Team. At the helm of some of the top freshmen and sophomores in the country, Tanner's club finished with a 27-2 record, the best record for a U.S. National Team (.931 winning percentage) and won a silver medal at the 2003 Pan American Games. He was named the U.S. National Coach of the Year for his work that season. Prior to his head coaching stint, Tanner served as an auxiliary coach under Tommy Lasorda for the 2000 Olympic Team that won a gold medal at the XXVII Olympiad in Sydney, Australia. He was also an assistant under former LSU coach Skip Bertman with the 1995 and 1996 USA teams that culminated in a bronze medal win at the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta, Ga. Tanner also served alongside current Mississippi State coach Ron Polk on Bertman's staff. Tanner's first stint with USA Baseball came as an assistant coach to the national team in the summer of 1993. Tanner was named the South Carolina head coach June 14, 1996, after nine successful seasons at North Carolina State.
