Gamecocks Head to Mason Rudolph Championship

After a tie for 11th finish in the season-opening Carpet Capital Collegiate, the South Carolina men's golf team is ready to get back on the course as it is set to tee off in the first round of the Mason Rudolph Championship. The 54-hole tournament, which is hosted by Vanderbilt, runs Friday through Sunday at the Vanderbilt Legends Club South Course in Franklin, Tenn. The South Course will play as a par-71, 7,100-yard setup.

This Week's Lineup

The Gamecocks' lineup for the Mason Rudolph Championship will be almost identical to the season-opening lineup with only one change. Freshman Sean Kelly will be making his first career start, while senior Wesley Bryan, junior Dykes Harbin, sophomore Caulder Moore and sophomore Blaine Woodruff will be competing for the second straight tournament.

Harbin is coming off the best 54-hole performance of his career after posting rounds of 73-73-72=218 (+2) to lead South Carolina at the Carpet Capital Collegiate. McDonald expects the Augusta, Ga., native to continue his solid play this weekend.

Continuing the Success

The Gamecocks have had plenty of success in the Mason Rudolph Championship, finishing no worse than third in their four previous appearances. South Carolina won the tournament in 2008 and has finished second in each of the last two seasons. Last season, the Gamecocks shot rounds of 285-279-280=844 (-8) to finish runner-up behind Memphis (-10).

Breaking Down the Field

South Carolina will compete against 13 teams at the 2011 Mason Rudolph Championship, including defending champion Memphis. The Gamecocks finished runner-up to the Tigers last season. Vanderbilt, Belmont, College of Charleston, Davidson, Georgia Southern, Georgia State, Middle Tennessee State, Oklahoma, Mississippi, Samford and Western Carolina round out the field.

Oklahoma is the lone ranked team in the field at No. 25. The Sooners made an appearance in last year's NCAA Championship.

Gamecocks Finish Runner-Up at 2010 Mason Rudolph Championship

A furious charge in the closing holes gave South Carolina a second straight round under par on Sunday, but fell two shots short of a second tournament title in three years at the Mason Rudolph Championship. The Gamecocks were runners-up for the second straight year, finishing two shots behind tournament champion Memphis.

Freshman Blaine Woodruff led the charge all three days, posting a 7-under-par 206 to take runner-up honors, one shot behind tournament medalist Jack Belote of Memphis. Fellow freshman Logan Harrell was also a major contributor to the final-round effort, posting three straight bogeys on the final three holes to close with a 69 (-2), his best round as a Gamecock.

Harrell ended his day with a 69 (-2) to leave him at 1-over-par 214 in a tie for 17th place.

Also tied for 17th place was the team's third freshman, Caulder Moore, who posted his first round under par as a collegian with a 70 (-1). Junior Wesley Bryan had a rough closing round with a 76 to drop out of the tournament's top 10, unable to card a birdie in his final round to go along with three bogeys and a double-bogey, and finished in a tie for 29th place.

Gamecocks Tie for 11th to Open Season

South Carolina recorded a final-round 300 (+12) and tied for 11th place to wrap up play at the Carpet Capital Collegiate at The Farm Golf Club to open the 2011-12 season. The Gamecocks finished the week with a team total of 890 (+26).

Junior Dykes Harbin proved to be the most consistent Gamecock during the weekend as he posted a final-round 72 (E) to finish the tournament in a tie for 21st with rounds of 73-73-72=218 (+2).

Sophomore Blaine Woodruff improved his score for the third straight day with a 1-over 73 as he finished in a tie for 35th with rounds of 76-74-73=223 (+7).

After posting the Gamecocks' tournament low with a 3-under 69 in the second round, senior Wesley Bryan was unable to carry that momentum into the final round with a 6-over 78 to wrap up the tournament in a tie for 42nd with rounds of 78-69-78=225 (+9).

Sophomore Caulder Moore made the turn at even par but fell back on the back nine with four bogeys and a double bogey as he turned in a 77 (+5) for the round, while sophomore Logan Harrell posted an 82 (+10) for the Gamecocks.

Coaching Staff Shake-up

Longtime Gamecock assistant coach Michael Burcin patiently waited for his first head coaching job, and the wait paid off in June. Burcin was named head coach at the University of Wisconsin after serving the last seven years as an assistant with the Gamecocks.

Burcin's departure opened the door for Don Hill to join the South Carolina coaching staff. On June 15, Hill was named South Carolina's associate head golf coach after an eight-year stint as an assistant at North Carolina.

During his time as North Carolina's assistant coach, the Tar Heels won 10 tournaments, including the ACC Championship in 2006 and the UNCG Bridgestone Golf Collegiate in the fall of 2010, and five Tar Heels captured seven individual championships. Hill has coached three All-Americans - Martin Ureta in 2005 and 2006, Dustin Bray in 2002-04 and Kevin O'Connell in 2008.

Hill was a member of the UNC men's golf team (1995, 1997-99). He was a two-time All-ACC performer and two-time honorable mention All-American in 1998 and 1999. Hill helped lead North Carolina to 10th-place NCAA finishes in 1997 and 1999. He was the runner-up at the 1998 ACC Championship, one stroke behind Clemson's Charles Warren, and finished 10th at the 1999 NCAA Championship. Hill posted 13 top-10 finishes during his four-year collegiate career and 23 top-25 finishes. He posted a 72.88 stroke

average in 1997-98 and a 73.03 average in 1998-99.
