## South Carolina Notables

- This is the Gamecocks' 38th season as a varsity sport.
- The 2011-12 season is the fourth at the helm for South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley. Her teams have improved by four wins each of the last two campaigns, capped by last season's 18-15 mark.
- Senior Markeshia Grant is third in the SEC in assist-to-turnover ratio at 4.5 . Her 4.5 assists per game (against just 1.0 turnovers) is eighth-best in the league.
- The Gamecocks have the third-stingiest defense in the SEC, allowing opponents just 52.5 points per game. South Carolina was sixth in the league last year, yielding just 59.6 points per game.
- Senior La'Keisha Sutton continues to show her balanced game, ranking 15th in the SEC in assists ( 3.5 apg ) and 24th in scoring ( 11.5 ppg ).

## Last Time Out

A strong offensive night for the frontcourt helped South Carolina to a 60-53 win over Alabama A\&M Monday night at Colonial Life Arena. the Gamecocks pounded the ball inside to junior Ashley Bruner and freshman Aleighsa Welch, and the duo combined for 27 of the team's 60 points. The guards set the table for the tandem, led by senior Markeshia Grant's career-high six assists. Backcourt-mates La'Keisha Sutton and Ieasia Walker closed the deal late, scoring eight of the team's final nine points after the Bulldogs had closed to within four points with 5:33 left to play.

## Clemson Series Notes

The Gamecocks and Tigers have met 56 times before tonight's game, the last time being November 18, 2010, which the Gamecocks won 73-59. Overall, Clemson leads the series 33-23, but the Gamecocks have won four of the last six meetings. The Tigers hold a decisive 20-5 edge in games played on their home floor.

This year's senior class is looking for the career split with the Tigers, entering tonight's game with a 1-2 record against its arch-rival. The most bitter loss of the stretch is likely the doubleovertime 94-92 defeat the last time the Gamecocks came to Littlejohn Coliseum (Nov. 19, 2009). That disappointing results was somewhat eased by Ieasia Walker's 30-point outburst against Clemson last season.

## Road Warriors

South Carolina has a 180-230 (.439) all-time record on the road. The Gamecocks' best season on the road was 1979-80 when they went 11-4. Under head coach Dawn Staley, South Carolina is 11-21 in road games. In her 11th season as a head coach, Staley has a 73-67 road record. Aside from home games, the Gamecocks are 33-38 all-time in games played in their home state.

## Triple Play

Coming into the season, may observers felt the fate of the Gamecocks' season rested largely in the hands of its experienced backcourt - seniors Markeshia Grant and La’Keisha Sutton and junior Ieasia Walker. Through the first two games, that has certainly been the case as between their points and assists, the trio has contributed to 67.9 percent of the team's 65.5 points per game.

The trio's camaraderie on and off the floor has bred friendly competition specifically between the two seniors, designed to ultimately guide the team to its goals.

After Sutton led the team with 3.6 assists per game last season, Grant has set her sights on unseating her classmate in the assist department. After the two each handed out three assists in the season opener, Grant surged ahead with a career-high six against Alabama A\&M.

## Not So Fast

While the backcourt gets all the attention, the Gamecock frontcourt has led the team in scoring in each of the first two games of the season, specifically junior Ashley Bruner. Particularly when it comes to the assist battle in the backcout, South Carolina's forwards will be counted on to deliver the basket at the end of those passes. That ability was especially on display in the second half against Alabama $\mathrm{A} \& \mathrm{M}$ when Bruner and freshman Aleighsa Welch netted 15 of the team's 30 points. The duo finished the night with 27 of the Gamecocks' 60 points and handed out three assists of their own. Bruner also matched her career high with four steals in the outing.

## Hitting a High Note

The Gamecocks' 71 points at Illinois were their most since posting 77 against NC State in Colonial Life Arena on Dec. 12, 2010, and the most on the road since a 73-70 win at then-No. 22 Vanderbilt on Feb. 28, 1010. South Carolina netted 70 or more points three times last season -77 vs. NC State (Dec. 12), 75 vs. Charleston Southern (Dec. 1) and 73 vs. Clemson (Nov. 18) - and won all three contests. In fact, the Gamecocks are 15-3 in the Dawn Staley era when reaching the 70 -point plateau.

## Every Which Way

All 13 players available on the Gamecock roster saw the court at Illinois with all but two scoring at least one field goal in the outing. South Carolina's offense showed just the versatility head coach Dawn Staley was hoping for it posted 71 points by all manner of scoring. The Gamecocks netted 26 points in the paint, 18 from 3-point range and 18 from the free-thow line. They posted 18 second-chance points off 18 offensive rebounds and scored 27 points off turnovers. And, finally, 14 of South Carolina's 24 field goals were assisted.

## Preseason Props

SEC Coaches voted two Gamecocks to the Preseason All-SEC team last week as senior La'Keisha Sutton and junior Ieasia Walker earned spots on the second team. The pair of guards accounted for 38.2 percent of the team's scoring last season and handed out 54.0 percent of the assists.

## We're Back...

South Carolina returns eight letterwinners from last season's Women's NIT team. All are juniors and seniors, including three starters. Additionally, the group includes the top two in points, rebounds and assists for the season. The two seniors that departed in May provided vast leadership and experience, but did not necessarily have a significant game-to-game statistical impact.

The returning Gamecocks accounted for 74.5 percent of last season's scoring, 63.1 percent of rebounding and 81.4 percent of assists. The group of five seniors and three juniors amassed 103 starting assignments a year ago.

## Fresh Look

South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley added five student-athletes to her roster this season, providing depth and height on the backcourt while building a foundation for the frontcourt. As a group, the newcomers have accumulated two state titles, eight all-conference selections, six all-state honors and six player of the year awards.

## On the Horizon

Head coach Dawn Staley inked three in the early signing period. Below is a brief look at each of the future Gamecocks.

- Tiffany Davis (Houston, Texas/Westbury Christian) is a 5 -foot-8 point guard rated the 29th in the 2012 class at that position. Before transferring to Westbury Christian, she helped Westside High to the 2011 District 20-5A championship game. Davis earned all-region and first-team all-district honors as a junior, netting 16.0 points per game.
- Asia Dozier (Columbia, S.C./Spring Valley) is a 5 -foot-11 guard who helped Spring Valley to state championships in 2009 and 2011. Rated the 34th-best guard in the 2012 class and a four-star player by ESPN Hoop/Gurlz, Dozier averaged 17.1 ppg and 3.8 apg as a junior as the Lady Vikings went 29-0. As a freshman, her 18.3 ppg and 3.8 apg earned her Class 4A Area Player of the Year honors from The State newspaper. Her father, Perry, and uncle Terry Dozier also played basketball for the Gamecocks.
- Tina Mitchell (Charlotte, N.C./Providence Day) is a 5 -foot-10 guard who is rated among the top 50 players in the 2012 class by ESPN Hoop/Gurlz. She earned South Charlotte player of the year honors and was an Associated Press All-State selection after averaging 18.4 points, 6.9 rebounds, 4.2 steals and 3.9 assists as a junior. She guided the Chargers to 21 straight wins in 201011, including the program's second-straight NCISAA state title.


## Noting November

The Gamecocks are 71-38 (.651) all-time in the month of November, including a 35-9 (.795) record at home. Under head coach Dawn Staley, South Carolina is 10-9 in the first month of basketball season. The Gamecocks went 3-2 in Staley's first year at the helm (2008-09), were 3-3 in 2009-10 and posted a 2-4 mark last season. The team is currently 2-0 this month.

## Strength of Schedule

After finishing the 2010-11 campaign with the nation's 19th-toughest schedule, the Gamecocks are facing another challenging slate in 2011-12. With both the Associated Press and USA Today/ESPN Coaches preseason polls released this week, South Carolina will play seven games against nationally ranked

teams. Another five games will be against teams that also received votes in one or both polls.

Seventeen of the Gamecocks' 29 games this season will be against teams that participated in the 2011 postseason, including nine who were in the NCAA Tournament. Of the 24 opponents on the schedule, eight finished the 2010-11 season with an RPI in the top 50 . Six others closed with an RPI between 51 and 100 .

## Watching the Gamecocks

Fans can catch up with the Gamecocks on television 12 times this season, including a pair of games on the ESPN family of networks. South Carolina will also live stream video of all of its non-televised home games for free via its official athletics website, www.GamecocksOnline.com.

The television schedule opens with four nonconference games on SportSouth, beginning with the Penn State game on Nov. 20. The station also will air games against College of Charleston (Nov. 23), Presbyterian (Nov. 27) and Furman (Dec. 11). The SEC package kicks in on Jan. 22 with the contest at Vanderbilt airing on ESPNU. Fox Sports Net will show the home game against Ole Miss (Jan. 26), and SEC Network will air the Mississippi State tilt (Jan. 29). Following the CSS broadcast of the game at Tennessee (Feb. 2), ESPN2 comes to Columbia for the Florida game (Feb. 12). The games against Georgia (Feb. 16) and at Alabama (Feb. 19) will air on FSN, and SEC Network closes out the string with the regular-season finale against Arkansas (Feb. 26).

South Carolina was 9-5 last season in games televised live, including a 5-3 mark in SEC action.
