South Carolina Notables

- South Carolina is playing in its third NCAA Elite Eight contest tonight, all coming against ACC schools, including
 its second-straight against Florida State. In what was then their furthest drive into the tournament, the Gamecocks
 fell to Duke in the 2002 Elite Eight. In 2015, they reached their first NCAA Final Four with a win over Florida State
 in Greensboro.
- Both South Carolina and Florida State rank among the nation's best offensive teams with the Seminoles ranked 13th
 - and 12th in scoring offense and field goal percentage, respectively, and the Gamecocks coming in 20th and eighth in the categories. South Carolina has the edge defensively, coming in 25th in scoring defense and 16th in field goal percentage defense while Florida State is 44th and 92nd, respectively.
- The Gamecocks' nine wins over ranked opponents this season include five over top-10 foes. The Seminoles have two top-10 wins this season.
- Not one to just pad her numbers, national player
 of the year candidate A'ja Wilson's averages against
 ranked opponents are markedly higher than those
 against unranked foes. The 6-foot-5 forward who
 impacts the came in many ways averages 19.5 points
 vs. ranked teams compared to 17.2 in all other games.
 Her rebounding average goes to 8.3 from 7.2 and her
 blocked shots to 3.2 from 2.1.
- Do-everything guard Allisha Gray's versatility has made her the team's top scorer twice, top rebounder four times – including two NCAA Tournament games – and the assist leader seven times.
- Junior guard Kaela Davis continues to thrive in the postseason, adding 5-of-6 3-point shooting in the Sweet 16 to her high-scoring performances.

Five Second Count

South Carolina is one of three programs in the nation to appear in every AP top 10 since the start of the 2014-15 season and is enjoying its third-straight 30-win season. The Gamecocks have played in five of the last six NCAA Sweet 16s, including the 2015 Final Four. In the SEC, South Carolina is now just the second program in league history to win four-straight, regular-season championships and has claimed the last three SEC Tournaments, also just the second program to achieve that mark. In the last four seasons, the Gamecocks are 126-14 (.900) overall and 59-5 (.922) in SEC action

Heart of a Champion

Tournament time shows just how strong a players' iron has been forged in the heat of the season. In these win-or-go-home games this season, South Carolina's A'ja Wilson has put South Carolina on her back even as the defensive focus on her doubled in the absence of her long-time frontcourt partner Alaina Coates.

In six postseason games spanning the SEC and NCAA Tournaments, Wilson averages 20.3 points on 58.6 percent shooting, 7.3 rebounds, 3.5 blocked shots and 1.5 steals

In the three games within five points at the end of their third quarters, Wilson led the Gamecocks with 8.0 points on 50.0 percent shooting (5-of-10) and 93.3 percent free throw accuracy (14-of-15) along with 4.7 rebounds and 1.3 blocked shots.

Gamecocks' starting power forward. Undersized only in height, the six-foot guard's heart and competitive fire made those outings – at LSU, at Texas A&M, vs. Mississippi State, UNC Asheville, Arizona State, vs. Quinnipiac – some of her most productive games of the season. Averaging roughly the same minutes as her season mark (29.2), Gray posted 14.5 points, 7.3 rebounds and 1.0 blocks per game while shooting 63.2 percent in those five games. In fact, against UNC Asheville, she out-scored AND out-rebounded All-America roommate A'ja Wilson.

In the Driver's Seat

South Carolina junior guard Kaela Davis exploded into her Gamecock career with a 37-point outing against #7/6 Ohio State and rained in 3-pointers through the first month of the season. Enduring an up-and-down regular season, Davis has thrived in the postseason by relying on the other tools at her disposal – including those outside her renowned scoring abilities.

The 6-foot-2 lithe athlete closed SEC action averaging 11.0 points on 33.9 percent shooting, including 26.8 percent from 3-point range, to go with 3.1 rebounds per game in league play.

With her renewed focus on diversifying her offense, six postseason victories have come in large part because of Davis' 17.2 points per game on 48.6 percent shooting, including 53.8 percent from 3-point range, and 4.3 rebounds per game. In the three tightest games of that group – SEC semifinal vs. Kentucky and final vs. #6/7 Mississippi State and NCAA second round vs. Arizona State – her scoring exploded to 20.0 points per game on 53.7 percent shooting, including 50.0 percent from 3-point range.

To Your Point

Most pundits have opined that South Carolina's

postseason fate lies in the hands of its points guards – the young but steady freshman Tyasha Harris and the experienced but unpredictable Bianca Cuevas-Moore. The nation's most notable point guard of all-time, Dawn Staley enthusiastically agrees with the duo's ability to power the Gamecocks toward their goals.

Moving Harris into the starting role at the start of SEC play, Staley set on optimizing her high-octane starting lineup with an organized, pass-first point guard while letting Cuevas-Moore pounce on opponents off the bench as a fast-paced offensive weapon with quick hands on the defensive end.

While both are in the starting lineup now due to the injury to Alaina Coates, Harris and Cuevas-Moore have mastered and are constantly expanding their roles.

In six postseason games, Harris averages 4.2 assists per game with a 2.1 assist-to-turnover ratio while shooting 52.6 percent from the field. Cuevas-Moore has balanced her 9.2 points per game on 40.5 percent shooting this postseason with 2.7 assists per game and 2.0 steals per contest.

Best All-Around of the Best

Junior A'ja Wilson has spent the last two seasons among the finalists for the various national player of the year awards, and she is making her strongest case for the award this season. The two-time SEC Player of the Year can change the complexion of the game on both ends of the floor as a dynamic scorer, rebounder and shot blocker.

Three players appear are among the four finalists for both the Naismith and Wade Trophy – Wilson, Napheesa Collier (UConn) and Kelsey Plum (Washington). If the scoring alone is the test, the contest would appear to be a runaway for Plum, but, presumably, it requires more to be declared the best in the nation.

Wilson and Collier led their teams to both their

regular-season and tournament championships, and both have their teams in the NCAA Elite Eight, while Washington reached none of those benchmarks. Collier and Wilson also contribute on the glass, averaging 8.5 and 8.3 rebounds per game, respectively.

Some nuanced offensive stats tell a deeper story as well, measuring by games against ranked opponents to level the playing field as much as possible:

In addition to rebounding, Collier and Wilson add another element to their teams – defense in the form of blocks and steals. Here, Wilson shines above Collier, averaging 3.2 blocks and 1.2 steals per game against ranked opponents (combined 4.4) while Collier posts 1.5 blocks and 2.0 steals per such outing (combines 3.5).

Florida State Series Notes

The Gamecocks are 17-2 all-time against Florida State, but a bulk of those games came during their time shared in the Metro Conference. Dormant for the first

NCAA Tournament Tally

South Carolina is in its 14th NCAA Tournament and sixth straight under head coach Dawn Staley, making this season's senior class just the fourth in program history to play in the NCAA Tournament every season and the second straight to do so. South Carolina earned its fourth No. 1 seed in as many seasons

The Gamecocks are 22-13 overall in the NCAA Tournament with eight Sweet 16 appearances, highlighted by 2015's run to the program's first NCAA Final Four

In her 17th season as a head coach, Staley has taken a team to the NCAA Tournament 12 times. She is 16-11 at the event, including a 14-5 mark at South Carolina.

Gamecocks Against the Field

South Carolina has played three games against two of the eight teams that remain in the 2017 NCAA Tournament with a 2-1 record. The Gamecocks picked up two wins over SEC rival Mississippi State but fell to overall No. 1 seed UConn.

Overall, South Carolina faced 14 teams that made this season's NCAA Tournament with a 14-4 regulars-season record against those 14 teams. Just six of those 18 games came at home.

In addition to their seven SEC rivals in the original field – Auburn, Kentucky, LSU, Mississippi State, Missouri, Tennessee and Texas A&M – the Gamecocks faced non-conference games against Duke, Hampton, Louisville, Ohio State, Texas, UCLA and UConn.

Fourth Follow-Up

South Carolina delivered on the preseason predictions of SEC coaches and media to win its fourth-straight SEC regular-season championship. The Gamecocks join Tennessee as the only programs to collect the title in four consecutive seasons. The Lady Vols went on to win a league-record seven consecutive titles (1998-2004).

SEC Tournament Rewind

South Carolina won its third-straight conference tournament for the first time in program history and joined Tennessee as the only programs to win three straight SEC Tournament championships, capturing the 2017 title in front of a largely home crowd at Bon Secours Wellness Arena in Greenville, S.C. The Gamecocks' three-year sweep of regular-season and tournament titles from 2015 through 2017 matches the Lady Vols' stretch from 1993 to 2000 as well.

In the 2017 tournament, junior forward A'ja Wilson drew Tournament MVP honors behing her 19.7 points and 8.0 rebounds per game. In the title game, she posted seven points and eight rebounds in the fourth quarter to power the Gamecocks to the win. Junior guard Kaela Davis also earned All-Tournament honors, putting together her most efficient offensive games of the season with 16.3 points per game on 50.0 percent field goal shooting, including 5-of-7 from 3-point range. As a team, the Gamecocks brought home the trophy behind a pair of wins over ranked opponents and topped their three opponents by an average of 15.3 points. Defensively, they held their quarterfinal and championship game opponents – Georgia and Mississippi State, respectively – to under 50 points.

Senior Moments

The Gamecocks' 2017 Senior Class is now the most victorious four-year class in program history both overall

with 126 wins and in SEC regular-season action at 59 victories en route to four straight conference titles. The class of Alaina Coates and Tiffany Davis took the lead from the 2016 class' 121 wins with its SEC Tournament semifinal victory over Kentucky (Mar. 4).

Neutral Stance

The Gamecocks are 115-83 all-time on a neutral court, including a 51-43 mark in postseason contests. South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley is 37-17 in games played at neutral sites, including a 21-12 slate in the postseason.

Ranked Readings

Under head coach Dawn Staley, South Carolina is 47-45 against nationally ranked opponents, including an 18-17 mark at Colonial Life Arena. That overall record is skewed by the early seasons of her tenure as the Gamecocks are 32-6 versus ranked foes since the start of the 2014-15 campaign. South Carolina is 14-4 against top-10 opponents during that time.

Staley's Gamecocks are 16-14 against ranked opponents on their home courts after winning seven the last eight road games against ranked foes and 12 of the last 17 such contests dating back to the start of 2013-14.

This season, the Gamecocks' 9-1 record against ranked foes includes just three home games and three neutral-site contests. South Carolina is 5-1 against top-10 opponents this season with two of those games played at Colonial Life Arena. The most ranked wins in a season in program history is 13, claimed by the 2015-16 squad and included five over top-10 teams.

SEC Stories

Head coach Dawn Staley has steadily lifted the Gamecocks' national profile by building the Gamecocks into a consistent SEC contender with four straight regular-season titles, shirking decades of difficulty in the nation's best women's basketball conference.

In her ninth season at the helm, Staley boasts a 97-45 (.683) SEC regular-season record and has finished outside the league's top five just twice – an unprecedented achievement for a program that had finished INSIDE

the top five only two times in the previous 17 seasons. Staley's 97 wins include six seasons of double-digit league victories – 10 in 2012; 11 in 2013; an SEC-best 14 in 2014, 15 in 2015 and 16 in 2016; and 14 in 2017 – and account for 60.2 percent of the program's all-time 161 league wins.

Staley's SEC regular-season record includes a 53-19 (.736) mark at home and a 44-26 (.629) slate on the road

Rankings Review

Ranked third in this week's AP Poll, the Gamecocks are in the midst of the nation's third-longest active top-10 ranking streak (70), trailing just UConn (233) and Notre Dame (126) and well ahead of fourth-place Baylor (53). South Carolina has appeared in the top 25 in each of the last 92 AP Polls.

In the Staley era, South Carolina has collected 54 top-five rankings in the AP Poll, including 44 weeks in the top three and 12 weeks at No. 1.

Tough Task

Head coach Dawn Staley did not shy away from a challenging schedule this season, despite having to replace five seniors, including three starters, from last season's squad. The Gamecocks' overall regular-season schedule ranked the seventh-toughest in the nation based on opponent winning percentage (.635).

The slate included 12 games against teams ranked in the AP Top 25 this week, including four against this week's top-10 teams. Just three of those 12 games were home games for the Gamecocks.

National Recognition

The Gamecocks' frontcourt of senior Alaina Coates and junior A'ja Wilson has captured national attention all season long, beginning with espnW naming them the No. 9 and No. 1 player in the nation, respectively, coming into the 2016-17 campaign and the WBCA naming both regional finalists for its All-America Team.

Named to ESPN's All-America First Team last week, Wilson continues to be in the running for national player of the year honors as a member of the Wooden National Ballot and a Naismith Trophy and Wade Trophy Finalist.

Coates is also in the running for All-America status, ranking among the nation's top 20 in field goal percentage (3rd), rebounding (12th) and double-doubles (19th). She was on the Wooden Award and Naismith Trophy late-season watch lists.

Basketball and Books


Junior guard Kaela Davis was named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District 4 First Team for her dual excellence on the court and in the classroom. Her selection marks the fourth-straight season a Gamecock has made an the team, and she is the eighth Gamecock all-time to earn the honors.

Trust the Process

While South Carolina entered the season with lofty expectations based on its roster, head coach Dawn Staley knew that it would take time for her team to learn to play its best together. Through all the ups and downs, she encouraged them to trust the process of establishing their strengths and how they best suit the team.

The Gamecocks seem to be rounding into form just in time for a postseason run, both individually and as a unit. The team's field goal percentage jumped from .466 in 2016 to .476 in SEC play and has skyrocketed to 52.4 percent in the postseason.

Individually, junior forward A'ja Wilson lifted her scoring average from 16.4 points in 2016 to 18.2 in SEC action. She elevated again in the postseason,

pouring in 20.3 points per game, including 26 in the SEC Tournament semifinal against #20/24 Kentucky and 24 in the Sweet 16 game against Quinnipiac. Similarly, freshman Tyasha Harris came into her own in 2017. Averaging 4.6 points, 2.2 assists and 20.1 minutes in 2016, she turned in 5.9 points, 3.8 assists and 28.3 minutes per SEC contest. In postseason action, she has posted 4.2 assists per game to go with 52.6 percent shooting in 26.5 minutes per game. The most recent improvement came from junior guard Kaela Davis, who had struggled down the stretch of SEC action, averaging 12.2 points on 36.5 percent shooting, to bounce back with 17.2 points per postseason game on 48.6 percent shooting, including 53.8 percent from

3-point range. Three of her seven 20-point games this season have come in postseason action. For the eversteady Allisha Gray, her offense has remained the same in the postseason with 12.8 points per game, but she has helped fill the rebounding void left by Alaina Coates, grabbing 6.5 rebounds per game in the postseason compared to her 4.4 rebounding averaging entering the SEC Tournament.

Diversified Assets

Five different Gamecocks have led the team in scoring at least once this season, led by A'ja Wilson's 20 games. Six have been the team's top rebounder – a list paced by Alaina Coates' 20. Even more diverse is the collection of assist leaders. While dominated by freshman point guard Tyasha Harris at 14, there are nine total Gamecocks who have led the team in at least one game.

League Legends

The Gamecocks are the only team in the nation to boast two former WNBA All-Stars on their coaching staff in head coach Dawn Staley and assistant coach Nikki McCray-Penson. Five other programs tout multiple WNBA alums – Miami, Notre Dame, Penn State, Texas and Vanderbilt – but only Beth Cunningham at Notre Dame and Tina Thompson at Texas earned All-Star status at least once in their time in the league.

South Carolina has the added bonus of its other two coaches – associate head coach Lisa Boyer and assistant coach Fred Chmiel – having WNBA coaching experience.

U-S-A! U-S-A!

South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley was named head coach of the U.S. Women's National Team, USA Basketball announced on March 10. She becomes 15th head coach for the squad and the first African-American.

Second Effort

South Carolina has found itself in a single-digit game at halftime 15 times this season. The Gamecocks were in the lead in nine of those games, tied once and trailed five times – two of which they came back to win (Mississippi State, Jan. 23; Arizona State, Mar. 19).

The Gamecock making the biggest leap when it comes down to winning is junior guard Allisha Gray. In the 11 wins, the quiet scorer who is always ready to do whatever the team needs, lifted her scoring average from 4.0 points per first half to 9.7 per second half and her field goal percentage from .364 (16-of-44) to .617 (37-of-60), which includes a 3-point range jump from 11.1 percent (1-of-9) to 41.7 percent (5-of-12).

Offensive Operation

Head coach Dawn Staley is often thought of as a defensive coach, but she has steadily built an efficient offensive team over the last few seasons. In the last three seasons, the Gamecocks have twice ranked among the nation's top 20 in points per game – 20th, 77.2 ppg this season and 18th, 75.9 ppg in 2014-15 – and among the top 10 in field goal percentage – eighth, .477 this season and fourth, .484 in 2014-15.

Looking across the more level playing field of games against ranked opponents, here's a look at the offense's growth over the last four seasons:

They're Free, Take Two!

South Carolina ranks among the nation's top five in free throws attempted (5th, 764) and made (5th, 547). The Gamecocks average 16.1 made free throws per game, while opponents average just 13.9 ATTEMPTS.

In 13 games this season, at least 25.0 percent of the Gamecocks' points have come from the free throw line, including six of the nine wins over nationally ranked opponents. Free throws accounted for a seasonhigh 39.5 percent (30-76) of the Gamecocks' points at #14/15 Texas (Dec. 1).

Location, Location

The Gamecocks average 38.6 points in the paint this season, making up 50.0 percent of their offense. Only three opponents have out-scored South Carolina in the paint this season – Duke (42-32, 12/3/16), Tennessee (38-26, 1/20/17) and UConn (34-26, 2/13/17). The Gamecocks are out-pacing their opponents in that space by 14.6 points per game. Their interior advantage has been at least 20 points 13 times, including twice with a season-high 44 – against Maine (Nov. 21) and UNC Asheville (Mar. 17).

Interestingly, the Gamecocks' paint production increased in the seven games that senior center Alaina Coates has missed with her injury, going from 38.1 points per game to 40.6 per game without her.

Blocking Scheme

South Carolina leads the SEC and ranks 15th in the nation with 5.6 blocked shots per game and have blocked double-digit shots twice this season – 11 vs. Clemson (Dec. 15), 10 vs. Alabama (Jan. 1). The two driving forces of that defensive movement are also the program's all-time career blocked shot leaders – A'ja Wilson (247) and Alaina Coates (210).

Wilson broke the program's career blocks record earlier this season (vs. Saint Peter's, Nov. 22) but could hardly celebrate with Coates nipping at her heels. Wilson is second in the SEC and 23rd in the nation with 2.5 blocks per game. Coates is at 1.4 per game for sixth in the league, and freshman Mikiah Herbert Harrigan is



following in her frontcourt mentors' footsteps, ranking 11th in the league with 1.1 blocks per game, which includes three games of three or more blocks.

To Three, or Not to Three

South Carolina added a pair of outside threats with junior transfers Kaela Davis and Allisha Gray, but the Gamecocks' offensive strategy continues to center on the paint. In fact, the addition of the outside weapons has made South Carolina less reliant on the 3-point shot for scoring this season than last.

This season's 177 3s account for 20.2 percent of the Gamecocks' total offense, which is LESS than last season when the 190 3s made up 22.1 percent of the offense.

Interestingly, reliance on outside shooting decreases dramatically against ranked opponents. In 10 games against top-25 foes this season, South Carolina's 38 3-pointers made up just 15.1 percent of its 754 points, which is much lower than the 18.0 percent of the offense in 15 games against ranked foes last season.

The seven-game absence of one of the Gamecocks' All-America frontcourt starters also did not increase the Gamecocks' desire to line it up from outside the arc. In the two games without Wilson and five others without Coates in the lineup, 20.3 percent of South Carolina's points came from long range compared to 20.2 percent in the games both have played.

20/20 Vision

Five different Gamecocks have recorded at least one 20-point game this season – A'ja Wilson (13), Kaela Davis (7), Alaina Coates (4), Allisha Gray (3) and Bianca Cuevas-Moore (1) – across 20 games this season. Two Gamecocks have reached that mark in the same game seven times, marking the most such games in a season since the 1985-86 season also saw seven such games. In the 1988-89 campaign had 10 games with multiple 20-point scorers.

Four x 1,000

South Carolina boasts four 1,000-point scorers on this season's roster, led by junior transfer Kaela Davis (1,678 – includes 1,246 at Georgia Tech). Senior center

Alaina Coates (1,603) is next in line with juniors A'ja Wilson (1,589) and Allisha Gray (1,493 – includes 1,053 at North Carolina) just behind.

Helping Hands

South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley likes to say that with good movement, the ball will find who is supposed to shoot it on any given possession. With four 1,000-point scorers on this season's team, many observers wondered how the quartet would abide that philosophy.

Returns are good as the Gamecocks are second in the SEC with 15.4 assists per game and have assisted on at least half their field goals 27 times in 34 games, including four games assisting on at least two-thirds of their made baskets – vs. Minnesota (Dec. 11), at Auburn (Jan. 5), at Kentucky (Feb. 2) and against Auburn (Feb. 9).

Of the Gamecocks' 15.4 assists per game, the quartet of 1,000-point scorers account for 7.5 assists per game of that average with Allisha Gray leading the group at 2.6 and Kaela Davis handing out 2.3 per game.

Freshman point guard Tyasha Harris moved into the team lead in the category against Tennessee (Jan. 30) and now has 11 games of five or more assists to average 3.3, which ranks 14th in the league. Her 2.1 assist-to-turnover ratio is fifth-best in the conference and 55th in the nation – sixth among the country's freshmen. In SEC action, the first-year guard was ninth with 3.8 assists per game while holding fourth in assist-to-turnover ratio at 2.4.

Quarter Breakdown

Through 34 games this season, South Carolina has out-scored its opponent in all but 33 quarters. The Gamecocks have out-paced their opponent by double digits 37 times in the 136 quarters, including a season-high differential of 25 points (37-12) in the first quarter against Saint Peter's (Nov. 22). In SEC action, the 23-point advantage in the first quarter at Auburn (Jan. 5) was a season high.

South Carolina has shot at least 50.0 percent from the field 64 times in its 136 quarters of action, including 14 of the last 20 quarters. The Gamecocks shot a seasonbest 81.3 percent in the third quarter of their NCAA Sweet 16 game against Quinnipiac (Mar. 25). South Carolina's 37 points in the first quarter against Saint Peter's are the most for the program since the NCAA went to the format for the 2015-16 season.

Defensively, South Carolina has held an opponent to single digits in a quarter 30 times this season, including six quarters of five or fewer points. An opponent has shot 20.0 percent or less from the field in 26 quarters, including four under 10.0 percent (6.3% by Vanderbilt, 4th qtr., 2/16/17; 7.1% by Florida, 2nd qtr., 1/8/17; 8.3% by Auburn, 4th qtr., 1/5/17; 6.7% by UNC Asheville, 3rd qtr., 3/17/17).



Individually, junior guard Kaela Davis leads the Gamecocks with seven double-digit scoring quarters and has the highest-scoring quarter this season with 19 points in the first at Auburn (Jan. 5). A'ja Wilson has six double-digit scoring quarters with Allisha Gray just behind at five. Alaina Coates has posted three and Bianca Cuevas-Moore has recorded one.

Fresh Faces

Five new Gamecocks joined the fold this season with the four freshmen taking the court right away. Junior forward Alexis Jennings will sit out this season due to NCAA transfer rules.

Guard Tyasha Harris (Noblesville, Ind.) headlines the freshman class, coming off a summer spent helping the U.S. to its seventh-straight gold medal in the FIBA U18 Americas Championship. Araion Bradshaw (Hyde Park, Mass.) and Victoria Patrick (Orlando, Fla.) join her in the guard spot. Bradshaw is point guard with good court vision, and Patrick comes in as a scorer to help stretch the floor. Forward Mikiah Herbert Harrigan rounds out the class, bringing athleticism, speed and



perimeter shooting to the team.

The quartet combines to play 51.4 minutes per game, while contributing 11.9 points per game. Harris leads the group in both minutes at 25.5 per game and in scoring (5.2 ppg). She was also the first of the group to earn a starting spot (Dec. 11 vs. Minnesota). Herbert Harrigan is just behind Harris in scoring with 5.1 points per game and earned the start against Georgia (Jan. 15), creating the first freshman tandem in a Gamecock starting lineup since the 2009-10 season.

Great Gamecock Fans

With over 10,000 season-ticket holders for the second-straight season, South Carolina leads the nation in average attendance at 12,853 and is the only program drawing at least 10,000 fans per game.

The Gamecocks have posted the highest average attendance at the end of the last two seasons and enjoyed steady fan growth over the last five years – 3,952 in 2012-13; 6,371 in 2013-14; 12,293 in 2014-15; 14,364 in 2015-16.

This is 30

With 30-point games already this season by juniors Kaela Davis (37 at #7/6 Ohio State, 11/14) and A'ja Wilson (31 at #14/15 Texas, 12/1), the Gamecocks have the most 30-point games in a season since 2002-03 when Jocelyn Penn recorded three such outings, none of which were against a ranked opponent.

The program record for 30-point games in a season is six with the most recent coming in 1994-95. In each of the three seasons with six 30-point games, every game was recorded by the same Gamecock. Shannon Johnson posted six in 1994-95 to duplicate her effort in 1993-94. Beth Hunt originally set the record with her six 30-point games in the 1989-90 campaign. The only 30-point outing against a ranked opponent in those three seasons was Beth Hunt's 34-point showing in a losing effort at then-No. 18 Southern Miss.

Individually, only eight 30-point games by a Gamecock have come against ranked opponents, including this season's showings from Davis and Wilson. Davis' 37 points is the most in a game against a ranked opponent and was the first since Johnson netted 35 against then-#5 Tennessee on Feb. 15, 1996, which until Davis' 37 was the highest-scoring came against a

USA Basketball Connection

At least one Gamecock has donned the red, white and blue for USA Basketball in each of the last three summers, and the group has helped six U.S. teams to five gold medals and one bronze in that time. Former Gamecock Tiffany Mitchell got the streak started with her FIBA 3x3 World Championship gold in 2014, which A'ja Wilson and Dawn Staley matched with a gold in the 2014 FIBA U18 Americas Championship. Staley went on to assist on USA Basketball's FIBA World Championship gold-medal team that same year. The next summer, Wilson and Staley claimed the 2015 FIBA U19 World Championship gold.

The most recent medals came from freshman Tyasha Harris who steered the U18 team to gold in the FIBA U18 Americas Championship and junior transfer Alexis Jennings, who brought home bronze from the 2016 FIBA 3x3 World Championship.

Elisia (Lele) Grissett

Durham, N.C./Hillside • Wing • 6-1

A five-star player ranked No. 24 overall in the class, Grissett was an AP All-State First-Team selection in 2016. Her 21 points in the title game led Hillside to the 2017 PAC-6 championship, for which she earned conference player of the year honors. The athletic wing can drive, score through contact and attack the glass with an emerging perimeter game. She averaged 21.4 points, 11.0 rebounds, 3.4 assists, 2.9 steals and 2.7 blocks in 2016-17.

Bianca Jackson

Montgomery, Ala./Brewbaker Tech Magnet • Wing • 5-11

Ranked No. 54 overall in the class, Jackson is a three-time ASWA First-Team All-State selection and the daughter of the Alabama State men's and women's basketball coaches. 
