Liberty Notes

• Liberty's win was the second in school history (2-6) and its first postseason victory since 2000 (10-2 win over Seton Hall at the Columbia, S.C. Regional on May 27, 2000).

• Junior pitcher Josh Richardson logged his third compete game of the season. Today, the right hander retired 17-straight Clemson batters in a stretch that began with one out in the third and ended with a leadoff hit in the bottom of the ninth.

- Freshman third baseman Jake Kimbell tallied a career-high three hits for Liberty after registering just 18 hits all season
- Senior catcher Trey Wimmer brought in a career-high six RBI. He also recorded his fifth homer of the year.
- The Flames advance to Saturday's winner's bracket game at 8 p.m. EDT against the winner of the South Carolina/Saint Louis game.

Clemson Notes

• Clemson drops to 19-3 when scoring in the first inning. Clemson falls to 9-9 when committing two or more errors. The Tigers are now 2-4 when their opponents hit two or more home runs.

- Freshman Steven Dugger matches his season best with three hits, the sixth time he's hit that mark this season.
- Clemson is 8-5 when their pitching staff combines for 10 or more strikeouts but has lost its last two.
- It's the first time Clemson has lost its first game of an NCAA Regional since 2003 (8-10 vs. Ohio State in Auburn, Ala.), snapping an eight-game streak.
- The Tigers have fallen in six-consecutive games.
