Played on both sides of the ball for head coach Mike Owens at Fort Walton Beach High School in Florida... suffered a season-ending knee injury in the second game of his senior season... junior season was limited to the last five games due to illness... still finished with 55 tackles and an interception, while rushing 74 times for 364 yards and four touchdowns... logged 120 tackles and three sacks with two fumble recoveries as a sophomore... considered the 19th-best "athlete" in the country, ranked as the 57th-best player in the state of Florida and was a four-star recruit by Rivals.com... considered a three-star prospect and the nation's 39thbest strongside linebacker according to Scout.com... named to *PrepStar's* All-Southeast Region squad... Matthew C. Coffee was born October 15, 1991... is the brother of Alabama running back Glen Coffee... also had offers from Ole Miss, Mississippi State, NC State and Maryland among others.

Aldrick J. Fordham was born September 23, 1990... turned down an offer from Tennessee to sign with the Gamecocks.

January enrollee at South Carolina... played for head coach Mark Kantor at Tampa's Gaither High School... rushed for over 1,500 yards as a senior... selected to participate in the Under Armour High School All-American Game in Orlando... rushed for 1,478 yards on 238 carries (6.2 yards per carry) with 20 touchdowns as a junior in 2007... a Rivals.com four-star prospect who was rated as the No. 22 player in the state of Florida and the No. 3 all-purpose back by the website... considered a four-star prospect and the nation's 35th-best running back according to Scout.com... considered the state's 29th-best player by SuperPrep... ranked 53rd on the ESPNU 150... listed among both Rivals.com and PrepStar's Top 250... selected South Carolina over an original commitment to Tennessee and Nebraska among others.

STEPHON GILMORE DEFENSIVE BACK 6-2 181 ROCK HILL, S.C. (SOUTH POINTE)

Enrolled at Carolina in January... earned first-team all-state honors by The State as a senior playing for head coach Bobby Carroll at South Pointe High School in Rock Hill... named to the prestigious PARADE All-America team and was a first-team All-American by EA Sports... named Mr. Football for the state of South Carolina... helped his team to a perfect 15-0 record and the South Carolina AAAA Division II title as a senior... rushed for 1,331 yards and 23 touchdowns and passed for 1,771 yards with 14 scores... rushed for 119 vards and three TDs and passed for 69 yards and another score in the state championship game win over Northwestern... played quarterback in the 72nd Shrine Bowl Game of the Carolinas... rushed for 71 yards and passed for 28 more to lead the Sandlappers to a come-from-behind victory over the Tar Heels, earning Offensive MVP honors... selected to participate in the Under Armour High School All-American Game in Orlando... surpassed the 1,000-yard mark both passing and rushing in 2007... a four-star prospect who was the second-best prospect in the state of South Carolina, the nation's sixth-best "athlete" and listed 84th overall by Rivals.com... considered a four-star prospect and the nation's 26th-best cornerback according to Scout.

Local product from Columbia High School whose senior season was cut short by a torn ACL... coached by Kember Amick... selected to play in the Under Armour All-American Game but was unable to participate due to the injury... recorded 109 tackles, five interceptions, four sacks and five blocked punts as a junior in 2007... rated the seventh-best "athlete," the 87th-best player in the nation and a four-star prospect by Rivals.com... was also the third-best prospect in the state of South Carolina according to the website... considered a four-star prospect and the 10th-best weakside linebacker in the nation according to Scout.com... considered the state's fifth-best player by SuperPrep... regarded as the 92ndbest player in the nation by *PrepStar...* ranked 43rd on the ESPNU 150... DaMario T. Jefferv was born January 12, 1991... turned down offers from Southern California, Alabama, Auburn, Clemson and North Carolina to sign with the Gamecocks... high school teammate of Gamecock signee Chris Payne... runs a 4.5 40 with a 34-inch vertical leap.
