South Carolina Notables

- South Carolina has won nine SEC games for the just the third time in its 21 seasons in the league. The program has posted eight or more SEC wins just four times with two of those coming in the Dawn Staley era. The Gamecocks won a school-record 10 SEC games in 2002.
- The Gamecocks are 17-0 this season (8-0 SEC) when scoring at least 60 points. Leaving them 3-7 overall (1-5 SEC) when failing to hit that mark.
- Freshman Aleighsa Welch will not play tonight due to a right knee sprain suffered in the second half of Sunday's game at Alabama. She may return to the court as soon as Sunday's regular-season finale against Arkansas.
- South Carolina's trio of starting guards has scored 61.5 percent of the team's points over the last five games. When factoring in their assists (and excluding the baskets on which they assisted each other), the backcourt combination has had a hand in 75.1 percent of the team's 60.2 points per game over the last five outings.
- Senior forward Charenee Stephens and senior guard La'Keisha Sutton have established themselves among the program's best, especially in the SEC era. Stephens stands 23rd in school history with 559 career rebounds. That number ranks her 11th among the Gamecocks who played any part of their careers in the SEC. Sutton is one of just 11 Gamecocks to score 1,000 points while handing out 300 assists in her career and just the sixth to do so during the program's SEC era. Sutton is currently 13th in career assists (336) and 19th in career points (1,200).

A South Carolina Win Would...

- Give the Gamecocks 21 regular-season wins for the first time since the 2002-03 team carried a 21-6 record into postseason play.
- Be the Gamecocks' 10th SEC win of the season, which would tie the 2001-02 team for the most in school history.
- Be the Gamecocks' ninth road win of the season, the program's most since the 1987-88 team turned in nine victories in their 15 road outings (both numbers exclude neutral site games). The school record for road wins is 11 set by the 1981-82 and 1979-80 teams.
- Be the Gamecocks' fifth SEC win on the road this season, making it the most in South Carolina's 21-year history in the league. The Gamecocks have posted four league road wins four times prior to this season's effort.

By the Numbers

Last Time Out

South Carolina shot a season-high 55.6 percent from the field en route to a 69-55 win at Alabama Sunday afternoon. The Gamecocks overcame 21 turnovers and Alabama's 22 offensive rebounds with its most efficient shooting game of the season, including hitting 62.5 percent in the second half. All three starting guards scored in double figures, led by La'Keisha Sutton's 13 points, all coming in the second half. She also led the way on the glass with seven rebounds, which tied her career high.

Kentucky Series Notes

The Wildcats lead the series 29-18, but the teams have split their two annual meetings each of the last two seasons. To continue that trend, South Carolina will have to buck another one as Kentucky won the first matchup this season and holds a 17-5 edge over the Gamecocks in Lexington. South Carolina's last win on the Wildcats' home court was a 65-57 decision on March 2, 2008, in Rupp Arena on Senior Day.

Kentucky scored a 66-58 win over the Gamecocks in the first meeting this season (Jan. 15). South Carolina had three players in double-figure points and out-rebounded the Wildcats 40-30, but could not overcome a season-high 29 turnovers in the outing.

The Gamecocks' most recent win in the series was a 66-61 victory over then-No. 15 Kentucky on Feb. 10, 2011. A trio of guards led the offense in that outing as La'Keisha Sutton and Ieasia Walker each netted 17 points and Markeshia Grant added 12. Grant also tied for team-high honors on the glass with eight rebounds as South Carolina out-rebounded the Wildcats 37-32 and forced 18 Kentucky turnovers.

Road Warriors

South Carolina has a 187-234 (.444) all-time record on the road. The Gamecocks' best season on the road was 1979-80 when they went 11-4. Under head coach Dawn Staley, South Carolina is 18-25 in road games. In her 11th season as a head coach, Staley has a 80-71 road record.

The Gamecocks are 8-4 on the road so far this season, making it the season with the most road wins since the 1989-90 squad went 8-2 in enemy territory.

Life in the League

South Carolina is 90-191 all-time in its 21st season SEC regular-season play. The Gamecocks are 58-83 in SEC games played in Columbia with a 32-108 record on the road. The Gamecocks are 24-22 in conference play since head coach Dawn Staley's first season in the league yielded a 2-12 mark.

This season's nine SEC wins is the most of the Dawn Staley era and matches the mark of the 2002-03 squad, which finished 9-5. It marks just the third time in their 21 seasons in the league that South Carolina has posted at least nine conference wins. In fact, the Gamecocks have only won seven or more league games six times in their 21 seasons with three of those coming under Staley.

Overall, Staley boasts a 124-59 record in league play, including eight seasons leading her Temple teams to a 99-25 Atlantic 10 mark.

Figuring Out February

The Gamecocks are 179-138 (.565) all-time in the month of February, including a 101-39 (.721) record at home. Under head coach Dawn Staley, South Carolina is 11-15 in the second month of the year. The Gamecocks went 1-5 in Staley's first year at the helm (2008-09), were 3-5 in 2009-10 and posted a 4-3 record last season. The Gamecocks are 3-2 so far this February.

Rating the Ranked

South Carolina is 54-191 against nationally ranked teams in its 38th season of women's basketball. The Gamecocks have collected 29 of those 54 wins in Columbia, including 11 in Colonial Life Arena.

In its basketball history, South Carolina's highest-ranked victim was a No. 3-ranked foe, and there are two of those victories, both over Auburn. The first came by a 83-76 score at home on Dec. 29, 1990. The second was a 59-47 decision over the Tigers on Feb. 27, 1993 in the final home game of the season. In the Dawn Staley era, the highest ranked team the Gamecocks have defeated was at then-No. 8 Tennessee on Feb. 9, 2012, by a score of 64-60.

In the last three seasons South Carolina has defeated a nationally ranked team nine times in 27 outings, including this year's 4-3 record.

Deep Thoughts

One of the keys to the Gamecocks' success this season as been their depth. Going to the bench without losing momentum has not been a luxury head coach Dawn Staley has enjoyed in her time at South Carolina until this season. It is the first time in her tenure that no player is averaging 30 minutes per game. While injuries had an impact on that figure in previous seasons, this is also the first time in the Staley era that more than one bench player has seen action in every game as seven Gamecocks have appeared in all 26 games this season.

Nail Bitters

Six of the Gamecocks' 14 SEC games have been decided by five or fewer points, and South Carolina has won four of those outings thanks to gutty play, especially from seniors, in the final five minutes.

At Florida (Jan. 8), the Gamecocks saw their 10-point lead cut to five with 4:55 left in the game. Strong defense held the margin into the final 30 seconds of the game, but the Gators twice drew within a 3-pointer in the final 30 seconds. The first time they were turned away by Charenee Stephens' offensive rebound and put back with 12 seconds to play. Leading by three with six seconds to go, La'Keisha Sutton hit both ends of a 1-and-1 opportunity to put the game out of reach.

At Vanderbilt (Jan. 22), South Carolina saw the Commodores erase a four-point deficit in the final two minute of regulation to send the game into overtime. Sutton's five points early in the OT period allowed the Gamecocks to reassert themselves and score the five-point win.

At Tennessee (Feb. 2), the Gamecocks trailed the Lady Vols for 7:50 of the final 10 minutes, but delivered when it counted most. South Carolina turned a seven-point deficit at the five-minute mark into the program's first win in Knoxville by scoring 14 of the game's final 17 points in every way imaginable – transition 3-pointer from Markeshia Grant, layup from Ashley Bruner, transition layup from Aleighsa Welch, driving layup by Ieasia Walker, and free throws by Walker and the final two by Sutton to make it a two-possession game with 12 seconds to play.

Against Florida (Feb. 12), South Carolina answered a 6-0 run that had tied the score with a Grant 3-pointer with 5:02 left to play. The Gators closed within a point with 2:04 to play, but Sutton delivered a left-handed scoop shot on a clear-out to put the Gamecocks up 61-

58 with 32 seconds to go. Walker forced a travel on the Gators' next possession, and Welch ripped down a defensive rebound with six seconds to go. Sutton went to the line with one second remaining and made it a two-possession game and out of reach for Florida.

Reading the Rankings

South Carolina appeared in the national polls this season for the first time since closing out the 2002-03 season ranked 16th. This season, the Gamecocks have appeared in one or both of the national polls three times (Jan. 9, Feb. 6, Feb. 13). In its history, South Carolina has gone 165-72 in games in which it is nationally ranked, including a 2-4 mark this season.

Gamecock head coach Dawn Staley has led a nationally ranked team before as her Temple squads were in the rankings for a total of 26 weeks during her eight seasons at the helm. She is one of 37 coaches who have coached multiple teams in the national rankings, only 21 of which are currently still coaching at the NCAA Division I level.

Wish Granted

Senior guard Markeshia Grant was named USBWA National Player of the Week and SEC Player of the Week after her 27-point performance at then-#8/8 Tennessee on Feb. 2. The Tampa, Fla., native's seven 3-pointers paced the Gamecocks in their first win at Tennessee in program history and their first over the Lady Vols in since January 1980.

The effort was just Grant's exclamation point in a five-game stretch (Jan. 26-Feb. 12) that saw her shoot 21-of-34 (.618) from 3-point range and average 18.2 points. Three of her five 20-point games this season came in that span, and she made at least two 3s in each of the contests. The senior entered the stretch shooting just 20.0 percent from 3-point range in SEC games, but now ranks second in the league in that category (.410) and leads the league in made 3s per conference game (2.4).

Bringing the Defense

The South Carolina defense ranks fourth in the nation in points allowed per game (49.9) behind just Connecticut (45.3), UAB (47.8) and Hampton (48.5). The Gamecocks have allowed more than 55 points just nine times in 27 games this season - Georgia (Feb. 16, Florida 58 (Feb. 12), at Arkansas 68 (Feb. 9), at Tennessee 60 (Feb. 2), at Vanderbilt 60 in overtime (Jan. 22), Kentucky 66 (Jan. 15), at LSU 58 (Jan. 12), at Drexel 58 (Dec. 28), at Xavier 56 (Nov. 30) and have held 11 opponents to 48 or fewer points.

Under head coach Dawn Staley, stingy defense has been a staple of the Gamecock game plan. South Carolina has allowed just 59.4 points per game on Staley's watch, including a 49.9 average this season and a 59.6 mark in 2010-11. In the last two seasons, the Gamecocks held their opponent to 55 or fewer points in a game 32 times, including 18 of 27 games this season. In the 117 games with Staley at the helm, South Carolina has held an opponent to 55 points or fewer 40 times. In that same period, an opponent has netted 70 or more points in a game just 26 times.

How Do They Go So Low?

One of the more interesting facets of the Gamecocks' stifling defense is that they have not necessarily held opponents to a sub-par shooting percentage. Through Staley's tenure, opponents have shot 40.8 percent from the field. South

Triple Play

Coming into the season, many observers felt the fate of the Gamecocks' season rested largely in the hands of its experienced backcourt – seniors Markeshia Grant and La'Keisha Sutton and junior Ieasia Walker. That has certainly been the case as between its points and assists, the trio has contributed to 64.3 percent of the team's 61.3 points per

Carolina has shot 39.3 percent during that time with the Gamecocks' final season field goal percentage exceeding that of its opponents just once (2009-10).

The defensive success comes from limiting opponent shot attempts entirely as South Carolina has put up more shots than its opponents every season except Staley's first (2008-09). This season alone, the Gamecocks have taken 7.5 more shots per game than their opponents. South Carolina has had fewer shot attempts than its opponent just four times this season – Kentucky (Jan. 15), Mississippi State (Jan. 29), at Arkansas (Feb. 9) and at Alabama (Feb. 19) – and is 2-2 in those games.

Good Hands

South Carolina is ranked 32nd in the country and third in the SEC with a +4.2 turnover margin. The trio of experienced guards have helped the Gamecocks on both sides of the turnover margin. The Gamecocks have forced 20 or more turnovers 11 times this season while committing 20 or more turnovers only five times (21 at Alabama, Feb. 19; 23 at Arkansas, Feb. 9; 29 vs. Kentucky, Jan. 15; 25 at LSU, Jan. 12; 22 vs. College of Charleston, Nov. 23). The Gamecocks are 26th in the country in fewest turnovers per game with 14.6, the lowest average for the program since the 1983-84 team set the school record of 8.2.

Tough to Scout

Throughout the preseason, head coach Dawn Staley talked about the versatility of her team as a key to the season's success. While she may have been speaking more about the various ways individual players could score, it has been the Gamecocks' ability to get points from different players that has delivered the program's most wins since Staley arrived in Columbia. Seven different players have led the team in scoring – Ashley Bruner, Markeshia Grant, Tina Roy, La'Keisha Sutton, Charenee Stephens, Ieasia Walker and Aleighsa Welch. In all, eight different Gamecocks have scored in double figures at least once this season.

On the Horizon

Head coach Dawn Staley inked four players in the early signing period. Below is a brief look at each of the future Gamecocks.

- **Tiffany Davis** (Houston, Texas/Westbury Christian) is a 5-foot-8 point guard rated the 29th in the 2012 class at that position. Before transferring to Westbury Christian, she helped Westside High to the 2011 District 20-5A championship game. Davis earned all-region and first-team all-district honors as a junior, netting 16.0 points per game.
- **Asia Dozier** (Columbia, S.C./Spring Valley) is a 5-foot-11 guard who helped Spring Valley to state championships in 2009 and 2011. Rated the 34th-best guard in the 2012 class and a four-star player by *ESPN Hoop/Gurlz*, Dozier averaged 17.1 ppg and 3.8 apg as a junior as the Lady Vikings went 29-0. As a freshman, her 18.3 ppg and 3.8 apg earned her Class 4A Area Player of the Year honors from *The State* newspaper. Her father, Perry, and uncle Terry Dozier also played basketball for the Gamecocks.
- **Tiffany Mitchell** (Charlotte, N.C./Providence Day) is a 5-foot-10 guard who is rated among the top 50 players in the 2012 class by *ESPN Hoop/Gurlz*. She earned South Charlotte player of the year honors and was an *Associated Press* All-State selection after averaging 18.4 points, 6.9 rebounds, 4.2 steals and 3.9 assists as a junior. She guided the Chargers to 21 straight wins in 2010-11, including the program's second-straight NCISAA state title.
- **Khadijah Sessions** (Myrtle Beach, S.C./Myrtle Beach) is a 5-foot-6 point guard rated the seventh-best in the class at her position by *ESPN Hoop/Gurlz*. The 40th-ranked player overall, she averaged 17.9 points and 5.7 assists as a junior while leading the Seahawks to their second-straight AAA state championship. A member of the all-state team, Sessions also captured all-region honors last season.

game. That number rises to 67.5 percent of the 59.5 points per SEC contest.

Grant is leading the trio in scoring with her team-high 11.3 points per game, which ranks 18th in the SEC. Sutton is just behind with 10.1 points per game (24th) to go with her 2.8 assists per game, which is 11th in the league. Walker has been the primary play-maker on both sides of the ball, ranking sixth in the SEC in assists (3.3) and steals (2.0). She is also sixth with a 1.3 assist-to-turnover ratio overall, and her 1.4 ratio in league play is third-best in the conference.

Not So Fast

While the backcourt got all the attention leading into the season, the frontcourt has made significant contributions to the team's success as well.

The unanticipated spark of the season as been freshman forward Aleighsa Welch. Surprising head coach Dawn Staley with her consistent play and ability to absorb and apply every teaching point, the six-foot Goose Creek, S.C., product is third on the team with 8.2 points per game and leads the club in rebounding at 6.1 per contest, which ranks her 12th in the SEC – second among league freshmen. Her 59.9 percent field goal accuracy is second in the league. In SEC action, Welch has posted seven or more boards seven times.

While Welch has been the more recent catalyst in the frontcourt, junior Ashley Bruner had a significant hand in much of the season's early success as she spent most of the season's first month as the team's top scorer and rebounder and continues to provide solid support numbers. She accounts for 6.7 points and 5.0 rebounds per game.

Helping Hand

With arguably the best point guard in international women's basketball history at the helm, South Carolina has been at its best when its assist numbers are highest. In the Dawn Staley era (2008-09 through present), the Gamecocks are 48-17 when handing out 10 or more assists, including a 16-2 mark this season. When missing the 10-assist plateau, South Carolina is just 15-39 overall with Staley, including a 5-24 mark in SEC action. That overall record includes this season's 4-5 ledger.

Defense Is the Difference

How solid is the South Carolina defense this season? Just look at its performances in six games against five of the nation's top 25 offenses.

Most recently, the Gamecocks challenged Tennessee (currently 14th in scoring offense) in Knoxville (Feb. 2), limiting the Lady Vols, who entered the game scoring 75.9 points per game on the season to 60 points.

South Carolina took on the ninth-highest scoring team in the nation in then-#9/8 Kentucky (Jan. 15). The Gamecocks held the high-flying Wildcat offense 15 points below its season average, allowing just 66 points when UK came in averaging 81.1 per game.

The Gamecocks limited Vanderbilt (Jan. 5) to just 55 points after the Commodores entered the game ranked ninth in the country with 80.0 points per game. South Carolina crippled the nation's top 3-point shooting team, which entered the game shooting 43.8 percent from the arc and making 6.5 3-pointers per game, allowing Vanderbilt to take just six 3-pointers in the game, making one of them. In the second meeting between the two teams, the Gamecocks were just as effective, yielding just 60 points in their overtime victory and allowing the Commodores to shoot just 17.6 percent (3-of-17) from 3-point range.

Entering its Dec. 18 game against the Gamecocks, North Carolina led the nation in scoring, pouring in 87.5 points per game. South Carolina allowed the Tar Heels just 54.9 percent of that average – 48 points – the lowest scoring output for the Tar Heels since Connecticut held them to 47 points on Jan. 9, 2010.

The first evidence of the stingy South Carolina defense came early in the season when the Gamecocks allowed Penn State, which is currently ranked 13th in the nation in scoring offense, just 55 points on Nov. 20. The Lady Lions have not scored lower than 65 points in any other game this season and have topped out at 103 in three games.

500 on the Boards

Senior forward Charenee Stephens became just the 25th Gamecock to reach the 500-rebound mark in her career. Currently in 23rd place all-time with 559 career boards (and needing just three rebounds to match Marsi McAlister in 22nd place), Stephens reached the plateau with her six-rebound effort at Florida (Jan. 8). The last Gamecock to reach 500 rebounds was Demetress Adams, who accomplished the feat in 2008 en route to 736 boards during a career that spanned 2006-09.

For Stephens, 42.0 percent of her rebounds (235) have come on the offense glass. It is the fourth-highest percentage of offensive rebounds of the 25 members of the 500-rebound club. Annie Lester (1997-2000) holds the highest percentage with 44.3 percent of her 785 total rebounds coming on the offensive end. Jocelyn Penn (1999-2003) reeled in 43.0 percent of hers on that end, and 42.5 percent of Johnson's 557 were offensive.

Making a Name for Herself

In December, senior guard La'Keisha Sutton etched her name among the top guards in South Carolina women's basketball history. Handing out her 300th career assist against Drexel (Dec. 28) and scoring her 1,000th career point against South Carolina State (Dec. 14), making her just the 11th Gamecock to achieve both milestones in her career. Sutton is just the sixth Gamecock to reach the mark playing any part of her career since South Carolina joined the SEC for the 1991-92 season. The last to achieve the feat was Cristina Ciocan in 2003-04.

Sutton's 1,000th career point came just 8:40 into the 100th game of her career on a trademark drive through the lane. Her effort against South Carolina State, which ended with 12 points, made her just the 27th player in school history to score at least 1,000 points. She also became the 48th player to play in 100 career games in that outing. Her 300th assist came just in time for the Gamecocks to hold off a late rally by Drexel. After driving the lane, Sutton found Ashley Bruner on the right block for a bucket that ended a four-minute scoring drought for the Gamecocks.

Sutton currently has 336 career assists, ranking her 13th in school history in that category, just three behind Kelly Morrone's (2000-04) 339. Sutton's 1,200 career points are 19th-most in school history. She trails Lisa Diaz's (1987-90) 17th-place number (1,249) by 49. Sutton is just the 11th Gamecock to reach the 1,000-point plateau playing any part of her career in the SEC. She stands seventh in total points on that list.
