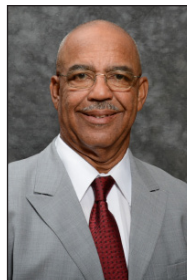

2014: Indoors - ran the mile three times, winning his first collegiate race at the Gamecock Indoor #1 (4:39.98)...hit a season best of 4:38.11 at the Gamecock Invitational to take third...entered the 3,000 meters once, placing 12th at the Virginia Tech Invitational with a time of 9:46.56... **Outdoors** - collected a pair of top five finishes in his two entries in the 3,000 meters, posting a best time of 9:06.38 to finish fifth at the Bill Carson Invitational...also won the 3,000 meter steeplechase at Bill Carson, posting a season-best time of 9:28.18...finished 16th in the steeplechase at his first SEC Championships, recording a time of 9:37.32...took second at the Weems Baskin Invitational in the 5,000 meters, clocking a 15:50.17.

2013: Did not run attached for the Gamecocks during the indoor or outdoor season...competed at the 2013 USA Track and Field Junior Championships in the 3,000-meter steeplechase, placing 18th with a time of 10:36.06.

HIGH SCHOOL: Top marks of 16:05 in the 5000m and 9:50 in the 3200m while competing at Stratford High School in Goose Creek, S.C....2012 Footlocker Senior All-South Team...2012 South Carolina All-State Cross Country Team...2012 South Carolina team state runner-up...two-time South Carolina All-State Track Team

PERSONAL: Graduated high school with a 4.0 GPA...intends to major in biochemistry and molecular biology...son of Benjamin and Albertha Flowers...also considered College of Charleston, Clemson, Vanderbilt, Alabama...chose South Carolina because of the tremendous school spirit, wonderful professors and outstanding athletics.

2014: Indoors - entered a pair of heptathlons, finishing his first effort at the Hilton Garden Invitational with 4,668 points...posted bests of 7.18 in the 60 meters, 2:44.77 in the 1,000 meters, 8:40 in the 60-meter hurdles, 6'3" (1.91m) in the high jump, 23'9" (7.24m) in the long jump and 42'9" (13.04m) in the shot put. Long jump mark of 23'9" to finish fifth at the Armory Collegiate Invitational is No. 7 in program history... **Outdoors** - entered two decathlons during the season, finishing 10th at Mt SAC (6,210 pts) and fourth at his first SEC Outdoor Championships with 6,995 points, a collegiate best and the No. 6 point total in school history...PR'ed in five decathlon events at SECs - the 400m (50.34), 110mH (15.24), pole vault (4.50m // 14-05.75), long jump (7.18m // 23-06.75) and javelin (47.33m // 155-03).

PRE-COLLEGE: Concentrated on multi events before coming to South Carolina...attended the Universite Catholique de Lille in Lille, France...at the French junior nationals, earned second place in the indoor long jump and the heptathlon...finished fourth last summer in the decathlon at the U-23 national championships in France...was selected by the French national junior team to compete in the heptathlon in 2011 for a dual against the United Kingdom...boasts PRs of 7,050 in the decathlon and 5,141 in the heptathlon.

PERSONAL: Son of Thierre and Nathalie Asselin, Alexandre has two siblings, Amelie (17) and Lauriane (13)...born in Paris, France, and grew up in Merignies, France...also considered North Carolina and Ohio State but decided to come to South Carolina because of the weather and the chance to be coached by international level coaches.

HIGH SCHOOL: Top marks of 52.2 in the 400m hurdles and 13.6 in the 110m hurdles...Mercer County (NJ) 400m hurdles freshman record holder while competing at Trenton Central High School West in Trenton, N.J....2011 high school 400mH Penn Relay winner...two-time 400mH state champion and 2012 110mH state champion...indoor national champion 4x200m relay...competed at US Junior Nationals in the 400mH.

PERSONAL: Son of Markeata Clemes and Jermaine Collier, Sr...one sibling, Mijah... intends to major in information technology...also considered LSU and George Mason... decided on South Carolina for the family atmosphere, academics and Division I athletics.

2013: NCAA East Preliminary qualifier (110mH, 4x100m)... **Indoor** - won two of the three South Carolina home indoor meets, posting a best 55mH time of 7.38...Posted a pair of top-eight finishes at the Auburn Invitational and Hokie Invitational...clocked in with the ninth-fastest 60mH time in school history at the prestigious Armory Collegiate Invitational, finishing fourth with a time of 7.85...took 10th place at the Tyson Invitational and finished in 13th at his first SEC Indoor Championships... **Outdoors** - concentrated on the high hurdles...posted top-five finishes in his first three outdoor meet at the Hurricane Invitational, Weems Baskin Invitational and the Raleigh Relays...at the SEC Outdoor Championships, punched his ticket to the finals with a then-season-best 14.00, the fifth-fastest time of the prelims...in the finals, took sixth to score with a time of 14.52 (-2.1)... qualified for the NCAA East Preliminary round and moved through the first round with a 14.00 (+1.2) and was just outside of the top-12 with his collegiate-best time of 13.90 (+0.7) to finish in 15th...also a relay member, running the second-fastest 4x100m time of the year at the NCAA East Preliminary round, finishing in 16th place.

PERSONAL: Also an All-State football player at Potomac High School in Oxon Hill, Md...owns the Maryland high school state record with four interceptions in one game... intends to major in political science...also considered Clemson, Alabama, Auburn, Pittsburgh, Ohio, Ole Miss and Texas Tech...came to South Carolina for the coaching staff and to compete in the SEC.

ATTENTION BOOSTERS



The University of South Carolina Office of Compliance Services is committed to a comprehensive compliance program that educates everyone about the importance of adhering to NCAA, SEC, and institutional rules. We strive to create a “compliance conscience” within the University and throughout the community.

The commitment to compliance ensures institutional control over the department of athletics and furthers the mission of the University of South Carolina. The existence of a successful compliance program depends on the willingness of coaches, administrators, staff, student-athletes and boosters to be cognizant of NCAA, SEC, and institutional rules.

WHAT IS COMPLIANCE?

At South Carolina, the Office of Compliance Services works within the department of athletics and the University to ensure South Carolina’s compliance with all applicable rules. In doing so, the compliance staff is charged with the following tasks:

- Educating administrators, coaches, staff, prospects, student-athletes and boosters about NCAA, SEC, and institutional rules;
- Developing monitoring systems to ensure compliance with these rules. These systems are designed to monitor rules pertaining to recruiting, academic eligibility, financial aid, awards, extra benefits, ethical conduct, amateurism, agents, employment, occasional meals, and the playing and practice seasons for each sport; and
- Investigating and reporting violations of NCAA, SEC, and institutional rules to the appropriate governing authority.

ARE YOU A BOOSTER?

You are a booster if you are or ever have:

- Been a member of a booster organization that supports University of South Carolina athletics;
- Made any financial contributions to any area the University of South Carolina;
- Made any annual or lifetime membership commitment to a booster organization;
- Been involved with the recruitment of a prospect;
- Provided benefits to an enrolled student-athlete or his/her relatives or friends;
- Been involved in promoting South Carolina’s athletic program;
- Provided or helped to arrange employment for student-athletes;
- Been a season ticket holder.

PROSPECTIVE STUDENT-ATHLETES

A prospective student-athlete (prospect) is a student who has:

- Started classes for the ninth grade, or
- Ever received any financial assistance or other benefit prospective students do not generally receive.

An individual remains a prospect until one of the following occurs (whichever is earlier):

- The individual officially registers and enrolls in a minimum full-time program of studies and attends classes in any term (including summer) of a four-year collegiate institution’s regular academic year.
- The individual participates in a regular squad practice or competition at a four-year collegiate institution that occurs before the beginning of any term.

Remember a prospect remains a prospect even after signing a National Letter of Intent with the University of South Carolina.

EXTRA BENEFITS

A recruiting inducement or extra benefit is any special arrangement by a University of South Carolina employee or booster to provide a prospect, a student-athlete, or their relatives or friends a benefit not expressly authorized by the NCAA. Examples of impermissible extra benefits include, but are not limited to:

- Free or reduced cost services, rentals, or purchases of any type (e.g., meals, drinks, clothing, laundry, haircuts, legal fees, tattoos, car repairs, free upgrades on products or services, etc.)
- Gifts of any kind, including special occasions (birthdays, holidays, graduation, etc.)
- VIP access to bars, clubs, events, etc.
- Free or reduced cost housing for any length of time
- Loans (including co-signing)
- Cash or like items
- Use of an automobile or transportation
- An employment arrangement for a prospect or student-athlete’s relatives
- Entertainment
- Use of your telephone or credit card
- Providing a meal in your home
- Academic assistance of any kind (e.g., tutoring, editing papers/projects, assistance in completing classwork, use of computer, etc.)
- Any tangible items, including merchandise

WHAT ARE THE CONSEQUENCES?

South Carolina is responsible for the actions of its boosters. If a booster provides an impermissible benefit to a prospect, a student-athlete, or their relatives or friends, South Carolina may be subject to penalties, even if the student-athlete has completed his or her eligibility. The prospect or student-athlete who accepts an impermissible benefit jeopardizes his or her eligibility for intercollegiate competition. A booster who provides an impermissible benefit may be disassociated from the University’s athletics program. Disassociation results in a loss of all benefits or privileges offered by the department of athletics and may involve other penalties as appropriate.

In February 2012, the University of South Carolina appeared before the NCAA Committee on Infractions as a result of violations committed by boosters of its athletics program. Many of Frye's former athletes and staff members were on hand to celebrate the accomplishment with the coach, including Olympic gold medalists Aleen Bailey, Allen Johnson, along with Olympians Shalonda Solomon and Lisa Misipeka. Jim Bibbs, former Michigan State coach and one of Frye's oldest and most important mentors, was also on hand for the event.



Started in 1995, the USTFCCCA Coaches Hall of Fame exists to recognize coaches who have brought great distinction to themselves, to their institutions and to the sports of cross country and track & field. Each of the honorees exemplifies the qualities of dedication to the sport, leadership and passion for their profession that serve as an inspiration to coaches everywhere in the sport.

GAMECOCKS A STRONG PRESENCE AT 2000 OLYMPICS

South Carolina sent a combined 19 athletes/coaches to the 2000 Olympics in Sydney, Australia, 12 of whom came from the track and field program. Graduates **Charmaine Howell** and **Terrence Trammell** both won silver medals, with Howell's coming in the 4x400-meter relay for Jamaica and Trammell's in the 110-meter hurdles for the USA. Former volunteer coach **Monique Hennagan** scored a gold medal as a member of the USA's 4x400m relay squad. Another former volunteer, **Melissa Morrison**, received a bronze medal competing for the USA in the 100-meter hurdles. Former Gamecocks **Miki Barber**, **Dawn Ellerbe**, **Michelle Fournier**, **Tonique Williams-Darling** and **Marvin Watts** competed in the Sydney Olympics, as well as former volunteer coach **Allen Johnson**. Former student-athletes Lisa Barber, Jimmie Hackley, Jackie Madison, Candy Mitchell, Demetria Washington, Antoinette Wilks and Ellakisha Williamson were Olympic trials participants.

2004 OLYMPIC GAMES

TEN GAMECOCKS COMPETE AT 2004 OLYMPICS

Ten Gamecocks, currently and formerly coached by **Curtis Frye** (who served as an assistant coach for the USA Women's Track and Field Team), were among the 2004 Olympians in Athens, Greece. Of those 10, four brought home a total of five medals, including the USC track and field program's first three gold medals won by former athletes **Tonique Williams-Darling** (Bahamas) in the 400m, **Otis Harris** (USA) in the 4x400m relay and **Aleen Bailey** (Jamaica) in the 4x100m relay. Harris also won a silver medal in the 400m, while **Terrence Trammell** claimed his second consecutive silver medal in the 110m hurdles. Former volunteer coach **Melissa Morrison** also added to her medal count with a bronze in the 100m hurdles. Other USC Olympians included **Lisa Misipeka**, **Michelle Fournier**, **Brad Snyder**, **Lashinda Demus**, **Adrian Durant** and **Shevon Stoddart**, as well as former volunteer coaches **Allen Johnson** and **Monique Hennagan**.

NINE GAMECOCKS REPRESENT AT 2008 OLYMPICS

South Carolina sent a combined 13 athletes/coaches to the 2008 Olympics in Beijing, China, nine of whom came from the track and field program. An unfortunate string of events left Team USA hurting on the medal stand, but **Natasha Hastings** helped bring home a gold medal in the 4x100-meter relay, marking the second consecutive Games that a Gamecock took gold in the event. **Chelsea Hammond** narrowly missed medaling in her first Olympic Games, taking fourth in the long jump, while **Tiffany Ross-Williams** led the field through the preliminary rounds before taking eighth in the 100-meter hurdles. For a large contingent of Gamecocks favored to medal in their events, the scoreboards showed multiple “Did Not Finish” results, including for relay members **Aleen Bailey**, **Leroy Dixon**, **Mechelle Lewis** and **Rodney Martin**. **Terrence Trammell**, a favorite to medal in the 110-meter hurdles for his third consecutive Games, suffered a hamstring injury in the preliminary round to end his quest.

RICHARDSON, DEMUS BRING HOME OLYMPIC SILVER FROM 2012 OLYMPICS

Former Gamecocks **Lashinda Demus** and **Jason Richardson** both claimed silver in London. The two medals bring the South Carolina track and field Olympic medal count up to 13 since the 2000 Olympic Games in Sydney.

Demus claimed silver in the 400-meter hurdles at 52.77, the fastest second-place Olympic time in history, and Richardson claimed silver in the 110-meter hurdles at 13.04.

Having struggled with injuries all season and battling back problems in London, Demus ran a composed race in the 400 hurdles. Jamaica's Kaliese Spencer got out well in the outside lane, with Demus and Natalya Antyukh of Russia very close behind. The Russian moved into the lead halfway through and had a stride and a half lead over Demus coming off the penultimate hurdle. The 2008 world silver medalist and 2011 world champion, Demus closed hard as both women lunged for the finish. Antyukh won in a personal-best time of 52.70, with Demus second in a season best of 52.77. Zuzana Hejnova of the Czech Republic won bronze in 53.88. Demus ran the fastest second-place time in Olympic history.

“I can’t explain how bad I wanted a gold,” Demus said. “I have been dreaming about it for years. So many people were supporting me. I am grateful I got on the podium. Number two in the world says a lot but number one says a lot more so I won’t stop till I get that. I’m a fighter, I have always been one.”

The 2011 World Outdoor champion, Richardson was slightly sluggish out of the blocks but passed world record holder Dayron Robles of Cuba over the fourth hurdle to move into second. He finished in 13.04 to win the silver medal, holding off Hansle Parchment of Jamaica, who was third in 13.12.

“You don’t train to get second,” Richardson said. “I’m so happy for Aries (Merritt, gold medalist from USA). I made a few tactical errors but I didn’t give up. The best man won here today. It is an honor to be part of a race with two American medals. I am very happy for the experience. If I am satisfied with silver then there is no hope for gold, so I will keep that hunger.”

Former Gamecock **Natasha Hastings** also represented South Carolina in London as a member of the 4x100m relay pool. Hastings did not see action on the track in London.

2013 IAAF WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

MOSCOW - When nearly two thousand athletes from 206 nations converged on Luzhniki Stadium in Moscow for the 14th IAAF World Championships, seven with Gamecock ties were in the middle of the action.

South Carolina head coach **Curtis Frye** oversaw the sprint and hurdle crew in Moscow. His group claimed nine medals, including a medal in every event. Team USA brought home three gold medals (David Oliver - 110mH, LaShawn Merritt - 400m, 4x400m Relay), five silvers (Justin Gatlin - 100m, Ryan Wilson - 110mH, Tony McQuay - 400m, Michael Tinsley - 400mH and the 4x100m Relay) and one bronze (Curtis Mitchell - 200m).

South Carolina assistant head coach **Delethea Quarles** served as Team USA's jumps and multis coach for the women's team. The group claimed a gold (Brittney Reese - long jump) and two silvers (Jennifer Suhr - pole vault and Brigetta Barrett - high jump) to win medals in three of their five events.

All three former Gamecocks finished in the top five of their events. US outdoor champion **Natasha Hastings** posted a fifth-place finish in the 400-meter dash and added another 4x400-meter relay medal to her resume with a silver. Hastings has won two world championship gold medals in the event in 2007 and 2009 to go with her 2008 Olympic gold medal.

Defending world champion **Lashinda Demus** collected a bronze medal in the women's 400-meter hurdles. In the last three major international competitions, Demus won the 2011 world title, the 2012 London Olympic silver

and the 2013 world championship bronze.

Jason Richardson narrowly missed the podium in the 110-meter hurdles, crossing the line in fourth place by .03 seconds despite hitting the final hurdle. Like Demus, Richardson has also been a mainstay on the international scene, winning the 2011 world gold, the 2012 Olympic silver and collecting a fourth place finish in Moscow.

Rising senior **Jeannelle Scheper** made her IAAF World Championship debut, competing for St. Lucia in the high jump. Scheper finished 13th in her qualifying group.

Kierre Beckles, who completed her collegiate eligibility in the spring of 2013, represented Barbados in the women's 110-meter hurdles. She finished 31st overall in the opening heats.

The next IAAF World Championships will be in Beijing in 2015.

2002 NCAA WOMEN'S OUTDOOR NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

BATON ROUGE, La. (June 1, 2002) — Winning the 4x400m relay with an NCAA meet and collegiate record, the University of South Carolina women's track and field team won the NCAA Outdoor Track and Field title in Baton Rouge, La. It is the school's first-ever NCAA team title in any sport.

USC's women scored 82 points to win the title with UCLA scoring 72 points. Southern California, the defending champions, finished third and LSU, the 2002 indoor champions, was fourth.

On the men's side, South Carolina's men finished sixth with 30 points. LSU won the title with 64 points and Tennessee, favored all year, finished second with 57 points.

"I've learned a lot from a lot of great people," Carolina head coach Curtis Frye said. "I stand on the shoulders of incredible giants in the sport. I think our kids understand what it means to be a class act and win a championship. I knew some things had to happen for UCLA. We didn't have a lot of things go wrong and we wanted to control our own destiny. We wanted to run our best race of the year in the 4x400m relay and we did. I am just thrilled; I have waited 27 years for this.

"I'm just as thrilled with the men's finish," Frye continued. "We came here hoping to finish in the top 10 — maybe top five. I am proud of our efforts. I knew after we won the SEC title in the 4x400m relay, our men would win the race here. All four put it on the line and did an incredible job."

The women ran a time of 3:26.46 to break its own collegiate and NCAA Championship records in the 4x400m relay. The team of Tiffany Ross, Demetria Washington, Tacita Bass and Lashinda Demus helped USC to a first-place finish over Texas. It last won the NCAA title in 2000.

"I can't put into words how I feel right now," Lisa Barber said. "Winning the school's first NCAA title — ever — wow! I am so proud of our entire team. We knew we had a chance if we just worked hard. We are thrilled. I am so proud of the men's and women's teams."

On the men's side, USC won the final event of the meet, the men's 4x400m relay with a school-record time of 3:02.16. The relay included James Law, Otukile Lekote, Otis Harris and Jon Fortenberry. Fortenberry, hoping to reverse his luck after dropping the stick in the prelims, wore his uniform backward and beat LSU and Baylor at the tape.

"I didn't want to drop the stick again tonight, so I wore my uniform backward. It worked," Fortenberry said.

In the final day of the NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships,



USC's quarter-mile runners went 2-3-4 to collect 19 points in the event alone. Barber ran a personal-best at 50.87 to finish as the runner-up in the 400m. Demus was third, finishing at 51.30, also a personal best. Demus won the 400m hurdles Friday. Washington was fourth, finishing at 51.38. Washington was the runner-up in 2001 and at the indoor meet in 2002.

One hour later, Aleen Bailey stepped on the track with Barber and picked up 12 points in the 200m, finishing second and fifth, respectively. Bailey ran a 22.99 to finish as the runner-up and Barber finished fifth at 23.29.

"Coach Frye told us before the 200m race that we had to score six points to help the team," Bailey said. "We scored 12! I am so happy to finish second. I know the points helped the team."

On the men's side, Harris was eighth in the 400m at 45.99. It was the first time Harris has scored at the outdoor meet and his first outdoor All-America honor. Fortenberry was ninth and also collected All-America honors.

Ross was eighth in the 100m hurdles at 13.57. It was a first-time appearance for Ross in the event, as she was the NCAA runner-up Friday in the 400m hurdles with a time of 55.22.
