## South Carolina Notables

- South Carolina is in its 41 st season of women's basketball. It is the program's 24 th season in the SEC and the seventh under head coach Dawn Staley. The back-to-back SEC champion has won at least 25 games in each of the last four seasons and played in the last three NCAA Tournaments, including two trips to the Sweet $16(2012,2014)$. The Gamecocks have spent 30 straight weeks ranked in the AP top 10 , highlighted by 12 weeks at No. 1 this season.
- Junior Tiffany Mitchell and South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley remain in the conversation for premier national awards this season as both were named Naismith finalists by the Atlanta Tipoff Club this week. Staley was a finalist last season, while Mitchell is the Gamecocks' third finalist in program history, joining Jocelyn Penn (2003) and Shannon Johnson (1996).
- With entry into tonight's game, senior Aleighsa Welch will tie the program record for career games played at 134. Gamecock great Sheila Foster (1979-82) is the current record holder.
- The Gamecocks' 31 wins this season broke a 35-year old school record, topping the 1979-80 team's 30-win effort that yielded a spot in the AIAW Final Four and a No. 4 final ranking.
- South Carolina's 64.2 percent field goal shooting was the best in Colonial Life Arena history and the fourth highest in program history. The Gamecocks flirted with the NCAA Tournament field goal percentage record (. 750 by Texas vs. Missouri, $3 / 14 / 86$ ) for much of the game after shooting 72.0 percent in the first half. South Carolina kept it over 70.0 percent until the 2:00 mark, shooting 74.4 percent at $5: 49$ and 70.8 percent until a missed 3-pointer at 1:36.
- With their individual efforts against Savannah State (Mar. 20), senior Aleighsa Welch (6-of-6) and Alaina Coates (5-of-5) joined 15 other perfect shooting efforts in Arena history (minimum 5 FGM). Two other games on that list came earlier this season, and all but one of them have been by Gamecocks.
- In now four postseason games, South Carolina has lifted its offensive efficiency and tightened its already stingy defense, which has been among the top 10 in the nation all season. The Gamecocks are shooting 51.4 percent from the field in postseason action after finishing the regular season at 47.7 percent. Defensively, South Carolina has allowed just 46.0 points per game in postseason action after yielding 53.3 in the regular season.
- The Gamecocks are 30-0 when out-scoring opponents in the paint and have topped their foes in that category by at least 30 points seven times, including two games of $40+$ points more. South Carolina averages 39.4 points per game in the paint.
- South Carolina's bench is among the most productive in the nation, accounting for 48.2 percent of the team's 75.7 points per game ( 36.5 ppg ). The group has outscored the Gamecocks' starters 18 times this season, including 11 SEC games and two postseason outings, and has provided the team's top scorer 17 times.

Prior to each season, head coach Dawn Staley chooses a theme for her team to play under. This season's is "one." ## Syracuse Series Notes

The Gamecocks lead the series 2-1 after rallying from a 10 -point second-half deficit for a 67-63 win over Syracuse on Nov. 28 in the Junkanoo Jam. After trailing for much of the game, South Carolina mounted a furious 18-4 run that closed the game. The Orange locked down the Gamecocks' veteran post players, but freshman A'ja Wilson dominated late in the second half with six of her 10 rebounds and 11 of her 15 points coming in the period. In the final 2:00, Dozier, Wilson and Mitchell combined to seal the victory.

The first games of the series came in 2000 and 2001 with each team winning on its home court.

## Five-Second Count

South Carolina continued its constant growth under head coach Dawn Staley, increasing their overall and SEC win totals for the sixth-straight season. The Gamecocks repeated as SEC regularseason champions, sharing the title with Tennessee, then powered past the Lady Vols to win the program's first SEC Tournament title.

Ranked No. 1 in the nation for 12 weeks this season, South Carolina is one of just three schools to rank among the nation's top 25 in both scoring offense and defense, coming in 22 nd in offense $(75.7 \mathrm{ppg})$ and seventh in defense ( 52.4 ppg ). The Gamecocks' scoring average is the best of the Staley era and the fifth-highest in program history. Their opponent scoring average is the second-lowest in school history, trailing Staley's 2011-12 team's 51.4.

The success has come from a balance inside and outside play as well as from starters and reserves as the Gamecocks have one of the most productive benches in the nation with the group contributing 48.0 percent of the team's total points.

## NCAA Tournament Tally

South Carolina is making its 12th NCAA Tournament appearance and fourth straight under head coach Dawn Staley, making this season's senior class just the second to play in the NCAA Tournament every season. The last four-year stint came in 1988-91 as part of the Metro Conference.

The Gamecocks are 14-11 overall in the NCAA Tournament with five Sweet 16 appearances,
highlighted by a run to the 2002 Elite Eight, which was the last season in which South Carolina hosted tournament games.

South Carolina earned its second No. 1 seed in as many seasons and will play all of its NCAA Tournament games in the Eastern Time Zone for the first time in the Staley era. In her 15 th season as a head coach, Staley has taken a team to the NCAA Tournament nine times. She is 8-9 at the event, including a 6-3 mark at South Carolina.

## Gamecocks Against the Field

South Carolina has faced 10 teams that are playing in this season's NCAA Tournament, including two of the three teams traveling to Columbia. The Gamecocks are 13-1 against those 10 teams, which includes six SEC foes. South Carolina topped 11thseeded LSU three times and went 2-0 against No. 2 seed Tennessee and No. 10 seed Arkansas. The Gamecocks' non-conference scheduled featured four games against teams that are now in the tournament field - Connecticut, Duke, Savannah State and Syracuse.

## Poll Prominence

South Carolina is No. 3 in the Associated Press poll this week, after a 12 -week run as the No. 1 team. It was the third-longest stretch at the top by an team in the last five seasons (beginning 201011). Only four teams have held the top spot in the AP poll during that time - Baylor (39 weeks), Connecticut ( 35 weeks) and Stanford ( 6 weeks).

In the last 10 seasons (beginning 2005-06), eight teams have occupied the AP Poll's No. 1 position. South Carolina's 12 weeks in the spot is the fifthmost among that group - UConn (85), Baylor (39), Tennessee (16) and Duke (14).

The AP's No. 1 ranking on Nov. 24 was a South Carolina program first, besting the No. 2 spot the Gamecocks held for five times in their history - Nov. 17, 2014; Preseason 2014-15; Jan. 2, 1982; Dec. 27, 1981; and Dec. 20, 1981.

## Reading the RPI

With a 31-2 record, including a 16-2 mark outside of Columbia, South Carolina is third in the NCAA RPI released on March 14 behind Notre Dame and Tennessee, respectively. Kentucky rounds out the SEC's top-10 entries at No. 8, and Mississippi State comes in at No. 29.

## SEC Stories

Head coach Dawn Staley has steadily lifted the Gamecocks' national profile by building the Gamecocks into a consistent SEC contender with back-to-back regular-season titles, shirking decades of difficulty in the nation's best women's basketball conference.

In her seventh season at the helm, Staley boasts a 67-43 (.609) SEC regular-season record and has finished outside the league's top five just twice - an unprecedented achievement for a program that had finished INSIDE the top five only two times in the
previous 17 seasons. Staley's 67 wins include now four seasons of double-digit league victories - 10-6 in 2012, 11-5 in 2013, an SEC-best 14-2 in 2014 and this season's $15-1$ mark.

Staley's SEC regular-season record includes a 38$18(.679)$ mark at home and a 29-25 (.537) slate on the road.

## SEC Title Talk

In 2013-14, South Carolina became the seventh program to win the SEC regular-season title, and the Gamecocks joined even more elite company by repeating this season. Just four teams have done so, and South Carolina shares the honor with Tennessee (multiple times), Georgia $(1996,1997)$ and LSU (2005, 2006).

## Rare Company

As just the second sophomore ever to earn SEC Player of the Year honors from the league's coaches last season, junior Tiffany Mitchell became the seventh player to pick up the award twice in her career, joining South Carolina assistant coach Nikki McCray $(1994,1995)$ among others. Mitchell is the second-straight player to do it after Kentucky's A'dia Mathies completed her double in 2012 and 2013, but the first to earn the award outright in consecutive seasons since LSU Seimone Augustus took home the honor in 2005 and 2006.

## New Name, Same Title

South Carolina became just the second team in league history to earn back-to-back SEC Freshman of the Year awards as A'ja Wilson followed in the footsteps of Alaina Coates. Georgia is the only other team to have captured the award in consecutive seasons - 2001 with Christi Thomas and 2002 with Kara Braxton. Wilson and Coates also share the SEC record, with several others, with five SEC Freshman of the Week honors.

## Books and Boards

Senior Aleighsa Welch became the Gamecocks' first ever SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year this season. The sport and entertainment management major marries her strong GPA with even stronger work on the glass as she is third in school history in total rebounds and holds the career offensive rebounds record.

## Conference Climbing

The Gamecocks' 29 regular-season games included 16 in SEC play and 13 non-conference outings, and seven of South Carolina's nine primary contributors showed marked improvement in at least one statistic from non-conference to SEC action.

Two Gamecocks improved their scoring averages - Bianca Cuevas ( 4.5 to 6.8 ppg ) and Khadijah Sessions ( 4.0 to 4.9 ppg ). Those two, along with Tina Roy, have improved field goal percentages to thank for the increase with Cuevas going from 35.9 percent to 6.7 , Sessions rising from 31.6 percent to

46.0 and Roy improving from 35.3 percent to 44.3 . The latter two made significant leaps from outside the 3-point line - Sessions (23.1 to 33.3\%) and Roy (36.1 to $43.1 \%$ ).

Aleighsa Welch and A'ja Wilson lifted their rebounding averages with Welch going from 5.6 to 6.9 rpg and Wilson rising from 6.5 to 7.4 rpg. Alaina Coates blocked more shots per game -1.3 to 2.0 bpg. Tiffany Mitchell rounded out the group, lifting her steals per game from 1.9 to 2.0 in SEC action.

## Crunch Time

South Carolina has won all six of its games this season when the margin is under 10 points in the last five minutes, and the Gamecocks have done so with their primary strengths - Tiffany Mitchell, rebounding and defense.

In those six games - Southern Cal, vs. \#22/22 Syracuse, at \#9/8 Duke, \#10/11 Kentucky, at Missouri and vs. \#6/6 Tennessee - Staley trusts in Mitchell's competitive spirit, giving her the ball in late-game situations. The junior has answered the bell, averaging 3.4 points per final five minutes of those games - nearly double the next Gamecock on the list. Behind her fearless attacking of the rim, a majority of her points have come at the free throw line, where she has hit 14 -of-17 (.824) attempts during those close-game situations.

In a show of determination, the Gamecocks have also dominated the glass at crunch time, outrebounding their opponents 6.6 to 4.8 per final five minutes, with Alaina Coates, A'ja Wilson and Aleighsa Welch grabbing the bulk of the boards.

South Carolina's defense has held those opponents to just 27.0 percent shooting and 9.1 percent from outside the arc in that time span.

## Win Any Way

As the Gamecocks' baseball coach a few years ago, South Carolina athletics director Ray Tanner frequently used the phrase "Win Anyway." Women's basketball has put its own twist on the quote. The Gamecocks have lost just twice this season, but the end has not always come by the same means.

Dawn Staley's team has won with both a highflying offense - posting records of $4-0$ when scoring $90+$ points, $8-0$ when scoring $80-89$ points - and a more methodical one, 8-0 when scoring 70-79

points, 10-2 scoring fewer than 70 .
The Gamecocks have won both inside - 15-1 when shooting less than 33.3 percent from 3-point range, $14-1$ when at least half of points come in the paint - and outside - 16-1 when shooting 33.3 percent or better from 3-point range, 17-1 when less than half of points come in the paint.
South Carolina has seen its top scorer come from both the starting lineup (14-1) and the bench (15-1) - with two games in which a starter and reserve tied for the team high (win vs. Auburn - Welch, Wilson; win vs. Vanderbilt - Mitchell, Wilson).

## Controlled Caroms

The Gamecocks have also built their success on the glass - an aspect of the game that head coach Dawn Staley preaches as a measure of effort as much as talent. South Carolina ranks ninth in the nation in rebounding margin, out-boarding its opponents by 10.5 per game. The Gamecocks have out-paced their opponent by double-digit rebounds 16 times this season, including eight SEC outings. The rebounding margin has been at least 20 four times Clemson (+22), Savannah State (+35), at Hampton ( +27 ) and Vanderbilt ( +20 ).
Only two teams - \#22/22 Syracuse (Nov. 28) and \#9/8 Duke (Dec. 7) - have out-rebounded South Carolina this season. Kentucky (Mar. 1) tied the Gamecocks on the boards.

## Bench Marks

While every competitor wants to be a starter, the Gamecocks have shown that the bench can be just as productive a position. The South Carolina bench has tied or out-scored its starting teammates 18 times this season, including 11 SEC contests, and has out-scored the entire opposing team five times - Clemson (Nov. 20), San Diego State (Nov. 23), NC Central (Dec. 1) and Florida (Jan. 19). In all, the bench has accounted for 48.2 percent of the Gamecocks' points this season, including 50.6 percent of the offense in SEC games.
Of the 115 double-figure games turned in this season, 58 of them have come from the bench - $A^{\prime} j$ a Wilson (26), Alaina Coates (18), Bianca Cuevas (7), Tina Roy (4), Jatarie White (2) and Asia Dozier (1).

## Diehard Defenders

While the offense has fluctuated in source and volume, the one standard for the Gamecocks - both this season and throughout head coach Dawn Staley's career - has been their defense. South Carolina is seventh in the nation in scoring defense, allowing 52.4 points per game. That number drops to 52.4 points per game in postseason action. On the season, just three opponents scored more than 63 points ( 87 by UConn, Feb. 9; 66 by Tennessee, Feb. 23; 67 by Kentucky, Mar. 1) and 15 failed to meet the 50-point threshold.
In SEC play, South Carolina yielded a leaguebest 55.5 points per game and limited some of the conference's highest scoring teams well beneath their averages. Kentucky (2nd in the SEC in scoring) scored 72.3 points per game in their 14 games against other SEC teams but averaged just 63.5 in two against the Gamecocks. The league's fourth-best scoring team, Mississippi State posted 65.7 points per game in their other 14 games compared to 50 against South

Carolina In all, five teams failed to get within eight points of their average against other league schools while playing the Gamecocks - Missouri (59.7-49), Florida (57.1-42) and Georgia (55.9-35).

## SWAT Team

After shattering the season record for blocked shots last season with 240, South Carolina's 212 this season are just behind that mark. The Gamecocks added another record this season with 15 blocks against Arkansas in the SEC Tournament quarterfinals, and the Gamecocks closed the tournament averaging 8.7 blocks against their three opponents.

The Gamecocks lead the SEC and rank sixth in the nation with 6.4 blocked shots per game. South Carolina has swatted double-digit shots six times,
including three SEC games - 10 vs. Southern Cal, 10 vs. Kentucky, 10 at Georgia, 11 at Arkansas 12 at Kentucky and 15 against Arkansas.

Four Gamecocks rank among the SEC's top 15 blockers, led by freshman A'ja Wilson in second at 1.8 per game, followed closely by sophomore Alaina Coates in fourth at 1.5 per game. Seniors Aleighsa Welch and Elem Ibiam are next in line with Welch swatting 1.1 per game for sixth and Ibiam rejecting 1.0 per game for 13 th place.

## Zone Buster

While the Gamecocks are highly regarded for their post play, South Carolina's guards have been effective at capitalizing on what opposing teams are willing to cede in their preferred zone defense - the 3-point shot. The Gamecocks lead the SEC and rank 51st in the nation in 3-point field goal percentage, hitting 34.7 percent from outside the arc. The percentage is just slightly higher than last season's (.347), but after closing 2013-14 averaging 3.9 made 3 s per game, South Carolina is fourth in the SEC with a 4.8 average this season.

Junior Tiffany Mitchell has been the primary long-range shooter, attempting 3.73 s per game while shooting 43.1 percent from outside the arc. But junior Tina Roy lifted her long-range production in SEC action, hitting a team-best 43.1 percent in league games. Junior Khadijah Sessions is 4 -of-7 (.571) from beyond the arc in postseason play.

## Diversified Assets

South Carolina is often lauded for the depth of its talent, and the Gamecocks' improved offensive numbers certainly bear out those accolades - 22nd in the nation at 75.7 points per game and sixth in the nation in field goal percentage (.481).

The embarrassment of riches has not upset South Carolina's chemistry but instead has strengthened it as each Gamecock plays for the good of the team instead of herself - a message head coach Dawn Staley often equates with USA Basketball's utopian camaraderie and ultimate success.
Two stats that best exemplify the all-for-one mentality of the team are in the assist numbers - 16th in the nation at 16.8 per game - and that only one Gamecock is averaging 10.0 or more shots per game. In fact, on one of the nation's most efficient offensive teams, which features all five of its top scorers shooting over 50.0 percent, just one Gamecock have made the minimum field goals required for individual ranking in field goal percentage - Tiffany Mitchell, 45th at 50.3.

## Staley Status Update

While leading the Gamecocks to the best season in program history, South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley has continued to carve out her place as one of the top coaches in the game.

With the Gamecocks' rise to No. 1 in the Associated Press poll this season, Staley joined Baylor's Kim Mulkey as the only women to have played on and coached a No. 1-ranked team. Staley's Virginia team was ranked No. 1 for a total of 24 weeks spanning her junior and senior seasons. She has led the Gamecocks to 12 weeks in the top spot in the Associated Press poll so far.

Staley also earned an extension from USA Basketball last week as she was named to an assistant coach to the U.S. Women's National Team through the 2016 Olympic Games. Her USA Basketball coaching resume already includes gold medals at the 2014 FIBA U18 Americas Championship (head coach), 2014 FIBA World Championship (assistant coach), 2008 Beijing Olympics (asst. coach) and 2007 FIBA Americas Championship (asst. coach).

## More on Muffin

Two-time All-SEC First-Team selection Aleighsa Welch became the program's first SEC ScholarAthlete of the Year as the league coaches recognized the career contributions of the heart and soul of the Gamecock program, who now holds the school record for career offensive rebounds (435) and is third in total rebounds (921).

Welch has been locked in on finishing her career with a bang, and her consistent effort has her ranked among the program's career top 10 in eight different categories, including three rebounding top-five entries, while also among the top- 15 scorers. Among the Gamecocks' 301,000 -point scorers, she is just the fourth in program history to also amass at least 900 rebounds as well. Her current career .581 field goal percentage is second in school history behind only Jocelyn Penn's school-record .593 .

The expansion of the Gamecocks' frontline has brought her overall rebounding numbers down slightly ( 6.2 rpg this season vs. 7.2 average previous three seasons), but she has been especially tenacious on the glass against ranked opponents, averaging a team-high 8.6 boards over 10 games against ranked foes (including a flu-ridden two-rebound effort at \#13/15 Kentucky to end the season) compared to 5.2 in the Gamecocks' other 23 outings. Welch also continues to provide consistency on the offensive end, shooting a team-best 57.0 percent from the field and handing out 1.9 assists per game.

## Trademark TM

Two-time SEC Player of the Year Tiffany Mitchell remains part of the national player of the year conversation because of her ability to affect the game in myriad ways. She ranks among the SEC's best in scoring ( $8 \mathrm{th}, 14.2 \mathrm{ppg}$ ), field goal percentage ( 2 nd , .503 ) and free throw percentage (2nd, .840 ). Aside from scoring, Mitchell is also among the league's top 15 in assists (15th, 2.7) and steals (9th, 1.9). In fact, only two players rank among the SEC's top 15 in scoring, assists and steals - Mitchell and Georgia's Shacobia Barbee.

The junior guard showed similar diversity last season and added outside shooting to this season's resume, hitting 43.1 percent from outside the arc, where she makes 1.63 s per game. Her heightened accuracy was on full display against San Diego State (Nov. 23) when her 6-of-6 effort from 3 was the best perfect game in program history. She went on to match her career high with six 3 s at Hampton as well, those coming on eight attempts.

## Double Trouble

One of sophomore Alaina Coates' goals this season focuses around posting double-doubles, taking to heart her head coach's quip that the 6-foot4 center is a "walking double-double." Ranking 46th in the nation with 11 this season -2 nd in the SEC the Irmo, S.C., native has 21 career double-doubles through 66 games, tying her for ninth in school history in the category.

Five of this season's 11 came in SEC action, which is one shy of the program record of six set by Marsha Williams in 1991-92. Her 10 career SEC doubledoubles is just one shy of Williams' career record of 11.

## Hometown Hero

SEC Freshman of the Year A'ja Wilson wrapped up her first regular season with a bang as her 19 rebounds at \#13/15 Kentucky (Mar. 1) broke the South Carolina freshman record, previously held by Alaina Coates at 17 against Kentucky on Jan. 9 2014.

With five double-doubles on the season, Wilson is second on the team in scoring, ranking 12th in the SEC in at 13.3 ppg , and rebounding, coming in eighth in the league at 6.8 rpg . She is the only freshman to rank among the SEC's top 20 scorers and rebounders. She has led the team in scoring a team-high 14 times, including seven SEC games. Wilson also ranks second in the league in blocked shots average at 1.8.

Wilson was the only freshman on either the Wooden Late-Season Top 20 or the Naismith Midseason Top 30. She earned SEC Freshman of the Week five times, tying the league record, and was the USBWA's first Freshman of the Week (games Dec. 1-7).

## It's Elem-entary

Senior center Elem Ibiam is making a charge at the school record for career blocks this season after setting the single-season mark with 83 in 2013-14. The Fayetteville, Ga., native is currently second with 163 in her career, trailing the Gamecocks' career record of 177 of set by Lakesha Tolliver (2004-07).

## Shooting Sessions

Junior point guard Khadijah Sessions has taken opponents' pack-the-paint defensive strategy personally as she is often the Gamecock most loosely guarded. Following South Carolina's road swing to Missouri and Florida, Sessions was shooting 33.8 percent from the field, including 22.9 percent from 3-point range. With a week between games, the Myrtle Beach, S.C., native logged extra time in the gym and has shot 47.7 percent (31-of-65) from the field with 44.0 percent (11-of-25) accuracy from outside the arc in the 15 games since.

## Class of 2015 Signee

Head coach Dawn Staley added one future Gamecock during the early signing period. Canada's Shay Colley signed her NLI with South Carolina on Nov. 18 and will have four years of eligibility upon enrollment.

Colley is a three-year standout for Team Canada in junior international play, representing her country in the 2014 FIBA U18 Americas Championship (silver), the 2013 FIBA U19 World Championship (7th) and the 2012 FIBA U17 World Championship (bronze).

Beginning with Aleighsa Welch, the first South Carolina player to sign a National Letter of Intent for Staley, the Palmetto State has frequently sent its players of the year to Columbia as Welch (2011), Asia Dozier (2012), Alaina Coates (2013), A'ja Wilson (2014) and Kaydra Duckett (2014) have each earned the title during their high school careers.
