Sophomore Year (2016-17)

- Played in all 37 games, including one start
- Great contributor in postseason, averaging 23.0 minutes over nine games after logging 16.8 in the regular season
- Led team in rebounding three times – Saint Peter’s, at Savannah St., vs. #10/13 Florida State
- Hit a pair of free throws late in first quarter of NCAA title game vs. #7/7 Mississippi State (April 2) to give team first lead of the game, swiped a fourth-quarter steal that launched a 10-2 run to seal the championship
- Scored in transition as part of 13-0 run that turned seven-point deficit into six-point lead in third quarter of NCAA semifinal against #6/6 Stanford (Mar. 31)
- Great second half on the glass in the NCAA Elite Eight game against #10/13 Florida State (Mar. 27), grabbing five on the defensive end
- Came up with a steal and layup to cap pivotal 6-1 run to close the third quarter and bring the Gamecocks within two of Arizona State in NCAA Tournament second round (Mar. 19)
- Netted a career-high 11 points on 4-of-8 shooting in the SEC quarterfinals against Georgia (Mar. 3) ... connected on a 3-pointer with 45 seconds to go in the second quarter to send Carolina into the half with a 26-point lead
- Baseline jumper late in second quarter at Texas A&M (Feb. 23) launched 10-4 run to close the half that turned a back-and-forth opening 20 minutes into a six-point Gamecock lead
- Active on offensive glass at Arkansas (Feb. 5), grabbing four of her five on the offensive end – second-most on the team

Season

- 1st – Games played in a season (37 in 2016-17)
- Most games played by a sophomore (37 in 2016-17)

- Facilitated the offense at #25/- Kentucky (Feb. 2) with a game-high six assists, the first of which led to a layup that sparked game-changing 22-4 run to close the first half
- Dished out three of her career-best six assists at Auburn (Jan. 5) in the fourth quarter
- Hit a 3-pointer to give Gamecocks first lead at Georgia (Jan. 26) and closed game with four of last five points
- Picked up two of her three steals in final minute of the first quarter at LSU (Jan. 15) to help Gamecocks to nine-point lead
- Slowed down #9/9 UCLA’s backcourt attack (Dec. 18) and netted the final four points of second quarter to even the score
- Made an impact on the glass against Clemson (Dec. 15), grabbing a career-best nine boards, including three offensive ... netted a season-high seven points and came up with a steal and layup in transition to cap a pivotal 12-2 Gamecock run in the third quarter that put Carolina in control
- Matched a career high with eight rebounds against Minnesota (Dec. 11) after earning her first start of the season
- Was solid defensively in 20 minutes off the bench against #4/4 Louisville (Nov. 27)
- Tied for team lead in rebounds with eight against Saint Peter’s (Nov. 22)

Redshirt-Freshman Year (2015-16)

- Played in 20 games following hand injury suffered in the preseason, drawing three starts
- Helped pace South Carolina’s strong defensive effort against Georgia (Feb. 18) with a career-high three steals
- Scored five of team’s first eight points in first career start against #16/19 Florida (Feb. 11) en route to first double-digit scoring game

- Efficient in relief of Tiffany Mitchell (injury) against #18/18 Kentucky (Feb. 4), notching seven points (3-of-4 shooting) that included a key bucket in transition during South Carolina's 10-2 run to end the game
- Scored her four points against Ole Miss (Jan. 28) during 13-4 fourth-quarter run to end Rebels' rally
- Made an impact on the boards against Ole Miss (Jan. 28), grabbing a career-best three rebounds in 12 minutes of action
- Showed her court vision at Auburn (Jan. 21) handing out three assists in the second half while capping the third quarter with her first career 3-pointer
- Added five points to win over No. 20/- Missouri (Jan. 10), finding her way in pace of play on both sides of the ball after not seeing game action since high school (2013-14)
- Made her South Carolina debut at Vanderbilt (Jan. 7), tallying two points in five minutes of action
- Had a great preseason before surgery on her right hand in early November ... had cast removed Dec. 17 and was fully cleared for practice in January

- Received an initial eligibility waiver from the NCAA, allowing her to enroll in school but not compete
- After focusing on academics in the fall, began practicing with the team in the spring

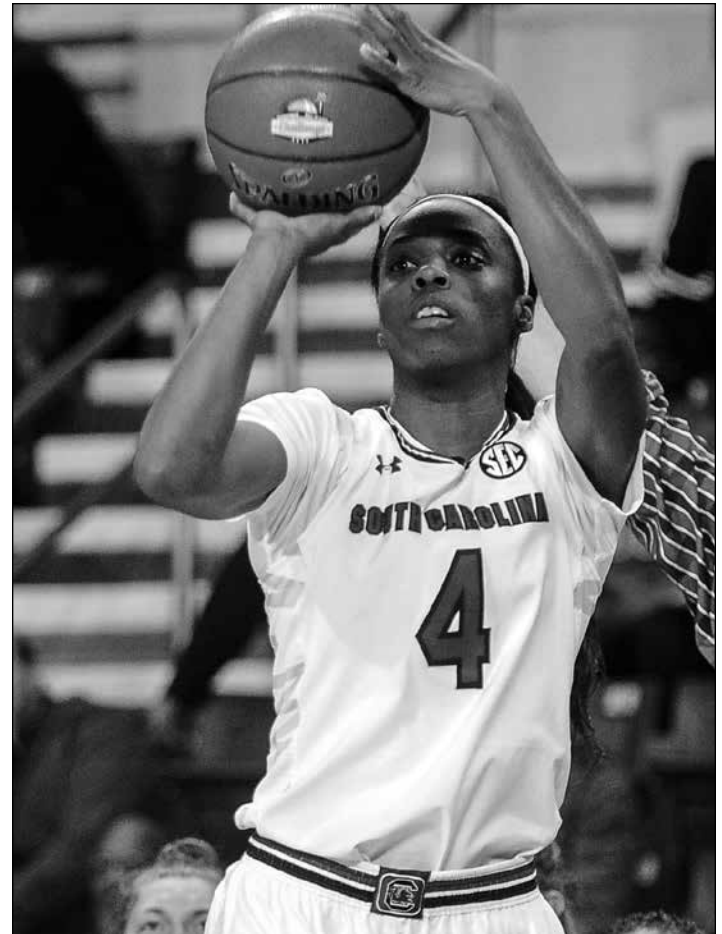

Junior Year (2016-17)

- Started 19 of 37 games, moving to a bench role at start of SEC play but returning to starting lineup due to injuries
- Set the tone for Carolina defensively in the NCAA Tournament, leading the team with 2.0 steals per game to breaking the school record for steals in an NCAA Tournament (12)
- Distributed the ball well at the SEC Tournament, averaging 3.3 assists per game
- Knocked down multiple 3-pointers in six of 16 SEC contests
- Played stalwart defense in NCAA title game vs. #7/7 Mississippi State (Apr. 2) to keep Bulldogs out of a fluid offense
- Scored five of her seven points in the NCAA semifinal against #6/6 Stanford (Mar. 31) during a 13-0 third-quarter surge that turned a seven-point deficit into a six-point advantage
- Netted 10 of Carolina's first 14 second-quarter points in the first round of the NCAA Tournament against UNC Asheville (Mar. 17), seven of which came off her steals
- Recorded eight of her 13 points against #20/24 Kentucky (Mar. 4) in the SEC semifinals in the second half ... shot 5-of-6 from the line over the last two quarters, making all four of her free throw attempts in the final minute
- Dished out five first-half assists in the SEC quarterfinals against Georgia (Mar. 3)
- Brilliant defensively at Texas A&M (Feb. 23) with a career-best six steals ...

- Swiped two of her game-high three steals in crunch time at Missouri (Feb. 19), the second of which helped give Carolina a 60-58 lead with less than a minute to play
- Efficient from the 3-point line at #1/1 UConn (Feb. 13), going 3-of-4 from beyond the arc en route to 11 points
- Accounted for all of Carolina's eight points in the final 1:20 against Tennessee (Jan. 30) and knocked down two 3-pointers during the stretch, including a pull-up from beyond the arc to even the score at 74 with 15 seconds to play
- Connected on first three shots at LSU (Jan. 15) for team-high nine first-quarter points en route to 17 points total

BIANCA CUEVAS-MOORE

- Netted 17 of her career-high 25 points in the second half against Georgia (Jan. 12), including eight in a back-and-forth final period ... applied good defensive pressure on the perimeter to disrupt the Lady Bulldogs' offense
- Posted her best offensive showing of the season at Auburn (Jan. 5), knocking down at least one 3 in each quarter to for a career-high five en route to a season-high 19 points
- Hit 3 early in third quarter against Clemson (Dec. 15) to spark at 13-4 run that put the Gamecocks firmly in control
- Scored four of her nine points at Duke (Dec. 4) on transition layups during a 12-0 first-quarter run
- Matched her career high with five steals against Saint Peter's (Nov. 22) in just 16 minutes

Sophomore Year (2015-16)

- Appeared in 34 of South Carolina's 35 games, earning one start
- Led team in scoring once – vs. Arizona State
- Handed out team-high assists three times – vs. CSUB, at Alabama, vs. Auburn
- Shot the ball well over the first two rounds of the NCAA Tournament, hitting 58.3 percent (7-of-12) to average 8.0 points in helping Gamecocks reach Sweet 16
- Hit a 3 to launch a 12-2 run that opened the second quarter of the NCAA Tournament game against Kansas State (Mar. 20)
- Affected the game on both ends of the court in the NCAA Tournament opener against Jacksonville (Mar. 18), scoring eight points on 4-of-6 shooting to go along with three assists and an NCAA Tournament career-high three steals
- Led team with eight steals in SEC Tournament action, finishing third in scoring with 10.7 points per game on 52.4 percent shooting, including 5-of-10 from 3-point range
- Added eight of her 15 points in the SEC Tournament semifinal against #13/13 Kentucky (Mar. 5) in the fourth quarter as Gamecocks, including a pair of 3s to cap 6-of-9 shooting
- Put together a complete game in the SEC Tournament quarterfinals against Auburn (Mar. 4), scoring in double figures for the first time since conference play began, including a first-quarter 3 to take the first lead of the game, which she followed with the first of her four steals
- Made her first career start at Ole Miss (Feb. 25) and set defensive tone with four steals, one of which led to a layup and capped a 16-3 second-quarter scoring run that established a 15-point halftime lead
- Posted a productive all-around performance at Alabama (Feb. 22), tallying a



- career-best six boards and a team-high three assists and converted a 3-pointer early in the second quarter to give South Carolina its first double-digit lead of the game
- Hit a 3-pointer and dished out two of her three assists during 16-0 run that opened second quarter against #16/19 Florida (Feb. 11)
- Solid extended minutes against #18/18 Kentucky (Feb. 4), committing just one turnover in 21 minutes
- Scored seven of her nine points against #15/11 Texas A&M (Jan. 17) during 12-7 fourth-quarter run that gave Gamecocks five-point lead with 3:55 to play
- Played lock-down defense against #20/- Missouri (Jan. 10), recording a career-best five steals
- Swiped a game-high three steals in the SEC opener against Arkansas (Jan. 3)
- Matched a career high with four rebounds against #14/13 Duke (Dec. 6)
- Named to the Rainbow Wahine Showdown All-Tournament team, finishing second on the team in scoring at the event with 17.0 points per game on 54.1 percent shooting, averaging 3.3 rebounds and swiping seven steals over the three-game event
- Scored in double figures for the third-straight game with 13 at Hawaii (Nov. 29), including nine in the second half to help Gamecocks pull away from a seven-point halftime lead
- Fell one point shy of her career high with 20 against CSU Bakersfield with four of her nine fourth-quarter points coming on back-to-back plays to launch a 14-2 run that put the game out of Roadrunners' reach
- Went on a personal 11-7 second-half run against #16/18 Arizona State (Nov. 27) as part of her team-high tying 18 points
- Gave UNCG (Nov. 15) trouble with her speed en route to 11 points, including 6-of-8 from the free throw line

Freshman Year (2014-15)

- Scored in double figures eight times, including one 20-point game
- Was the team's top scorer twice - at Ole Miss, at Georgia
- Led team in assists eight times – San Diego State, vs. Central Michigan, at Florida, Alabama, Vanderbilt, vs. Arkansas, Savannah St., Notre Dame

- Scored the last six points of the first half at Ole Miss (Feb. 1) in just one minute en route to 21 points, nearly double her previous career high points
