DOUG ALLISON - 1987 ALL-AMERICAN - FORWARD

Doug Allison, South Carolina's first ever first-team All-American is the school's all-time leading point (158) and goal scorer (63). He led Carolina in scoring all four of his years and went to the NCAA Tournament three straight years from 1985-87. A native of Barnstaple, England, Allison joined Marty Baltzegar as the school's first All-America award winners. He served as an assistant coach to Mark Berson at South Carolina from 1991-94 and is currently the head coach at cross-state rival Furman.




MARTY BALTZEGAR - 1987 ALL-AMERICAN - DEFENDER


Marty Baltzegar was a second-team All-American after anchoring a stifling defense that allowed only 10 goals all year, two coming on penalty kicks. Baltzegar joined teammate Doug Allison as Carolina's first ever All-America honorees. Baltzegar scored 24 career points on six goals and 12 assists.




CHARLES ARNDT - 1988 ALL-AMERICAN - GOALKEEPER

A first-team All-America selection, Charles Arndt compiled 13 shutouts while leading the Gamecocks to their first semifinal appearance in the NCAA Tournament during his senior campaign. For his efforts, Arndt was named National Goalkeeper of the Year. He holds school records for career goals against average (0.70) and combined shutouts (29).










CLARK BRISSON - 1989 ALL-AMERICAN - FORWARD

Clark Brisson earned All-America honors after leading Carolina with a then-school record 50 points (21g, 8a). Brisson closed out his career in 1990 with 98 points (36g, 26a), good for fourth all-time in South Carolina history. In Brisson's four-year career, the Gamecocks compiled an amazing 61-14-11 (.773) mark and advanced to the NCAA Tournament four times.



TOMMY LOEBER - 1990 ALL-AMERICAN - DEFENDER


Tommy Loeber was a First-Team All-America selection by the NSCAA. He led a defense that only allowed 19 goals all year while advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Loeber, an Arlington, Texas, native, started more games than anyone in Carolina history, notching 87 starts in 87 games. He finished his career with six points on two goals and two assists.




CHRIS FAKLARIS - 1993 ALL-AMERICAN - FORWARD

Chris Faklaris was a consensus Second-Team All-American by *Soccer America, Soccer News* and the NSCAA after leading the Gamecocks in points (44) and goals (20). Carolina's second all-time leading scorer with 124 points (55 goals, 14 assists), Faklaris led the Gamecocks to their only national championship game appearance in 1993.











ROB SMITH - 1994 ALL-AMERICAN - MIDFIELDER

Rob Smith, a third-team All-American, ended his career as Carolina's all-time leader with 40 assists. A starter in all 84 matches during his four-year career, Smith is tied for ninth all-time in scoring with 78 points (19 goals, 40 assists). Smith, who played for the MLS's Columbus Crew, completed his degree at South Carolina in 2001. He represented the United States at the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta, Ga.



CLINT MATHIS - 1995, '97 ALL-AMERICAN - MIDFIELDER

Clint Mathis set Gamecock season records for most points (53), goals (25) and game-winning goals (10) on his way to becoming a consensus first-team All-America selection in 1995. A third-team selection in 1997, he finished his career as the third all-time leading scorer in Carolina history with 121 points (53g, 15a). He was a three-time finalist for the Hermann Trophy and the MAC (Missouri Athleic Club) Player of the Year award. In 2002, he represented the United States in the World Cup.





HENRY RING - 1998, 'OO ALL-AMERICAN - GOALKEEPER

Henry Ring posted a goals against average of 0.72 and recorded 9.5 shutouts while allowing only 14 goals in 1,753 minutes in 1998. Ring was named to the first-ever All-Independent First Team. He became only the second Gamecock to earn All-America honors twice, joining Clint Mathis. Ring earned third-team honors after ending the 2000 campaign with an 0.93 GAA, allowing only 17 goals his senior season. He was drafted by the Chicago Fire in the 2001 MLS Superdraft and was the starter in net for the Fire in 2004.











BRAD GUZAN - 2004 ALL-AMERICAN - GOALKEEPER


Brad Guzan earned Second-Team All-America honors from the NSCAA in his second and final season as a Gamecock in 2004. He was also a semfinalist for the MAC (Missouri Athletic Club) Hermann Trophy and one of *Soccer America's* 11 Collegiate MVPs. The Homer Glen, III., native played every minute in goal of his two seasons at Carolina before opting to turn pro. Guzan was the No. 2 pick in the MLS SuperDraft, making him the highest goalkeeper ever drafted (CD Chivas USA). Guzan was the starting goalkeeper for the U.S. in the 2008 Beijing Olympics, while he began his first season with Aston Villa of the Barclays Premier League in England in late 2008. He was most recently honored with a roster spot on the 2010 U.S. Men's National Team that competed in the 2010 FIFA World Cup in South Africa.



GREG REECE - 2005 ALL-AMERICAN - DEFENDER

Greg Reece earned Third-Team All-America honors from *CollegeSoccerNews.com* following his senior season in 2005. A native of Clemmons, N.C., Reece was selected Conference USA Defensive Player of the Year and helped the Gamecocks capture the C-USA Championship and an automatic berth in the NCAA Tournament. Reece was a four-year starer on the backline for South Carolina.

NSCAA ALL-SOUTH REGION

Since head coach Mark Berson started the Gamecock program in 1978, a total of 45 different student-athletes have collected 69 National Soccer Coaches Association of American (NSCAA) All-South Region honors. Brian Winstead was the first Carolina player to make the team in 1978. Fourteen Carolina players made the All-South Region team more than once during their career. Rob Smith was selected All-South Region in all four of his seasons at South Carolina (1991-1994). Doug Allison (1985-1987) and Chris Faklaris (1992-1994) were three-time All-South Region selections.

At least one South Carolina player has made the All-South Region team in every season since 1983, and two players have garnered the honor in 24 of those seasons. Three Gamecocks were honored in 2010 and four were named to the squad in the 1986, 1987 and 1994 seasons.





NATIONAL GOALKEEPER OF THE YEAR

One of the most prestigious awards on the national college soccer scene is "Goalkeeper of the Year," so named by adidas and the NSCAA. Within a four-year span, South Carolina brought home two of those awards — Warren Lipka winning in 1985 and Charles Arndt in 1988.

Arndt became one of USC's best players ever after a sparkling senior campaign that saw him engineer 13 shutouts for the Gamecocks en route to a semifinals appearance in the NCAA Tournament. Arndt broke Lipka's long-standing record for minutes played in a career and has the best career goals against average in school history — allowing a goal every one-and-a-half games for an 0.70 career mark. Arndt was also named All-South Region, All-America, Academic All-America and John M. Johnson Award winner after the 1988 season.

Lipka became the Gamecocks' first-ever "Goalkeeper of the Year" award winner in 1985, after South Carolina completed what is still the best record in school history (20-3-1) while advancing to the NCAA Tournament quarterfinals. Lipka played 2,155 minutes in goal that season (still a school best) while being part of 15 shutouts in 24 matches that year for another school standard.

INDEPENDENT ALL-STAR TEAMS

From 1998 to 2000, the nine Independent teams voted on All-Independent All-Star teams. Six Gamecocks were named to the All-Independent teams in 1998, four to the first team and two to the second team. John Harr, Jonas Myllenberg and Scott Campagna joined Henry Ring on the first team. Harr and Myllenberg were a part of the USC offense that outscored its opponent's 47-14.

Midfielder Ryan O'Neill and forward Joey Worthen were named to the second team that year. Worthen also earned the honor of Co-Rookie of the Year. Head Coach Mark Berson also earned postseason accolades by earning Independent Coach of the Year honors.

In 1999, four Gamecocks represented South Carolina on the All-Independent squads. Senior defender Chris Morman made his first appearance on the first team, while fellow senior Ryan O'Neill made his second appearance after making the second team the previous season. As a sophomore, Joey Worthen also made the move from second team in '98 to first team in '99. He led the team in scoring with 11 goals and five assists for 27 points.

Freshman Tim Glowienka rounded out the list by making the second team. The midfielder started all 19 matches as a freshman and ended the season with three goals and two assists for eight points.

In 2000, eight of the Independent teams formed the Atlantic Soccer Conference, leaving South Carolina as the only true independent.

BRIAN WINSTEAD MEMORIAL AWARD

The Brian Winstead Memorial Award was established to honor the memory of Carolina soccer great Brian Winstead, who died in December 2004.







Behind the late heroics of Jaime Posnanski, USC captured a 1-0 victory over Cal State-Fullerton to advance to the national championship game against ACC foe Virginia. The Cavaliers collected a 2-0 victory, but Carolina etched its name in history.

COLUMBIA, S.C. — Freshman Bradlee Baladez scored with 59 seconds remaining in the first overtime period to give No. 18 South Carolina a 1-0 victory against No. 24 Duke in NCAA Second Round action at Eugene E. Stone III Stadium. With the win, South Carolina (13-6-2) advances to the NCAA Round of 16.

Baladez earned his team-leading fifth game-winning goal at 99:01 with assists by Stephen Morrissey and J.P. Rafferty. It was the fifth assist of the year for Morrissey and the first career points for Rafferty, a freshman from Raleigh, N.C. Senior goalkeeper Jimmy Maurer tallied six saves in the match, and Duke sophomore James Belshaw collected four saves for the Blue Devils (10-6-4).

South Carolina will make its first NCAA Third Round appearance since the 1998 squad advanced to the Round of 16.

The first half of play proved physical, as both teams drew 14 fouls, including two yellow cards each. Duke's first chance came just under the two-minute mark after a Gamecock foul just outside of the penalty area. Grossman hit a strike over the wall, but high over the crossbar to halt the threat. Carolina countered, as Morrissey battled for two shots within the Blue Devil 18-yard box, the first blocked by a Duke defender, and the second saved by Belshaw.

Maurer made back-to-back point blank saves 14 minutes into the match on shots by Christopher and Daniel Tweed-Kent, respectively. Duke placed a through pass directly across the Gamecock six-yard box to Christopher who attempted a one-touch which Maurer saved. Waiting just past the out-stretched hands of Maurer was Daniel, who attempted a rebound, which was once again saved by Maurer off the goal line.

The teams traded possession the remainder of the half, with neither team finding rhythm on the offensive end. Carolina earned a free kick opportunity 30-yards from goal with just over seven minutes remaining before halftime. Root sent a lofted chip into the six-yard box, which was headed just wide of frame by Howayeck to hold the contest scoreless. Root hit a shot high over the crossbar minutes later and Duke's Sih hit a shot wide of frame in the 42nd minute, as the contest stood at 0-0 at halftime.

Carolina had a chance on frame immediately into the second half, as Brettschneider took the kickoff into the Blue Devil six-yard box. Root collected a loose ball within the penalty area and sent a bullet towards frame, which Belshaw saved over the end line for Carolina's second corner of the match, but Baladez's cross was cleared by the Duke defense.

Carolina continued to press on the offensive end. The Gamecocks earned a free kick at the 50-minute mark after a Duke foul outside the penalty area. Brettschneider sent a bullet towards frame, straight into the path of Belshaw who earned his third save of the match, clearing the strike towards midfield.

Back and forth play followed midway through the half. Gamecock midfielder J.P. Rafferty chipped a ball into the bath of Brettschneider at the 70-minute mark. Brettschneider out-raced a Blue Devil defender, but his shot attempt inched just wide of the far post, the contest still scoreless with 20 minutes left in regulation.

With 11 minutes remaining, South Carolina was awarded a free kick after a foul by Duke just outside the penalty area. Brettschneider's strike was deflected for a Gamecock corner. Morrissey's corner resulted in a shot by Cates, but the Duke defenders cleared the rebound. Both teams had their chances the remainder of regulation. Duke nearly scored at the 87-minute mark when Grossman connected on a cross from Christopher Tweed-Kent steps away from the goal, but his attempt was just high of the crossbar.

Duke continued to pressure through the final minutes of regulation, forcing Maurer to make two saves late in the half to send the contest into overtime. Carolina nearly scored at the opening whistle, when Rafferty sent a cross, which deflected off Baladez directly in front of the Duke goal. Maurer collected his sixth save of the match, another excellent stop from point-blank range with seven minutes left in the first overtime session. Grossman hit a one-time shot towards goal on a pass from Daniel Tweed-Kent, but Maurer made a diving save to his left, which Cates cleared towards midfield.

South Carolina held possession, nearly earning the win on a breakway by Baladez with five minutes remaining in the set. Morrissey split the Blue Devil defense, placing a perfect through ball into the path of Baladez. Seventh-seeded South Carolina (13-7-2) battled but could not overcome playing with a man down as 10-seed Michigan earned a 3-1 victory Nov. 28, 2010 in NCAA Round of 16 action at Eugene E. Stone III Stadium in Columbia. The Wolverines (16-4-3) advance to the NCAA Quarterfinals for the first time since 2003.

Senior forward Blake Brettschneider led the Gamecock attack with seven shots in the match, including two on goal. Freshman midfielder Bradlee Baladez tallied five shots and senior midfielder Sam Arthur added two, including the Ione South Carolina goal in the contest, his first of the season. Michigan held a 22-18 upperhand in shots, led by Soony Saad with eight shots and one goal, including the game winner, and Justin Meram with seven shots, which included two goals. Saad and Alex Wood each picked up an assist for the Wolverines in the match.

South Carolina goalkeeper Jimmy Maurer concluded a celebrated Gamecock career versus Michigan. Maurer collected a season-high nine saves in the contest. UM counterpart Chris Blais earned six saves.

Maurer was tested early, as Meram had an attempt at frame just 21 seconds into the contest. The Wolverine striker hit a shot from inside the 18-yard box, but the attempt was directly into the hands of Maurer. Both teams had their chances through the following minutes of play. Brettschneider nearly connected on a cross by Baladez with just over 32 minutes remaining in the half. Brettschneider battled past a Wolverine defender, but the strike went just wide of the near post.

Michigan threatened at the 18-minute mark on a corner kick opportunity. After a short corner was cleared by Carolina, Saad collected a lose ball just outside the penalty area and hit a rocket towards frame which was blocked by a Gamecock defender. On the rebound, UM's Alex Wood sent a strike towards frame, which Maurer collected on a diving save to his left to hold the contest scoreless.

Brettschneider earned Carolina's third shot on goal with 15 minutes left in the opening half. J.P. After a Wolverine free kick with 11 minutes remaining in the half, Carolina had another chance at frame on the transition. Cates sent a long throw-in down the near sideline to Brettschneider, who beat two Wolverine defenders before missing a shot inches above the crossbar with nine minutes remaining in the half.

Carolina earned a free kick on the near sideline with just over four minutes remaining. The cross by Cates clipped through the Wolverine defense to the far post where Janny Rivera hit a one-touch shot towards frame, which Blais saved around the near post for a Gamecock corner. Michigan cleared the corner and neither team marked the scoreboard the remainder of the half, as the contest stood at 0-0 at halftime.

Michigan sent a free kick from 40 yards away from goal wide of the left goal post in the 53rd minute as play got underway in the second half. Minutes later South Carolina nearly scored, as a shot by Evan O'Dell hit off the goal post after a corner kick opportunity. Maurer followed with a stellar save just minutes later. GAMECOCKS IN THE PROS

The University of South Carolina soccer program continues to prepare its student-athletes for the total experience in college, and for making the next step to the professional soccer world. In 34 years of play – all coming under the direction of head coach Mark Berson – the Gamecocks have had over 40 players that were drafted or played in the professional ranks. Those individuals were drafted by teams either in the North American soccer leagues or in foreign leagues.

With the emergence of Major League Soccer in 1996, Gamecock Rob Smith joined the Columbus Crew. Former Gamecock greats, Clint Mathis (New York/ New Jersey Metrostars) and Josh Wolff (Chicago Fire/Kansas City Wizards/DC United), soon joined the list of Gamecocks in the MLS. Wolff and Mathis finished second and third, respectively, in the voting for MLS Rookie of the Year in 1998. Henry Ring was the first goalkeeper drafted in the 2000 MLS Super Draft and spent three years with the Chicago Fire and was named to the MLS All-Star team during a breakout 2004 season. Josh Wolff played for a short time overseas, but returned to the friendly confines of MLS in 2008, rejoining the Kansas City Wizards. Mathis announced his retirement from professional soccer in early August 2010.

Currently three former Gamecocks are listed on MLS rosters with Blake Brettschneider (New England Revolution), Tyler Ruthven (New York Red Bulls) and Josh Wolff (DC United) in the league. Celebrated goalkeeper Jimmy Maurer is currently playing professionally in Chile, Brad Guzan has played much of his career overseas and Mark Wiltse continues to represent the Gamecocks on the roster of the Charleston Battery (USL-Pro).

In 2003, three more Gamecocks joined the professional ranks. Defender Tim Glowienka was drafted by the NY/NJ Metro Stars and later joined teammate Michael Bachmeyer with the A-League's Pittsburgh Riverhounds. Midfielder David Moore joined the Atlanta Silverbacks, also a member of the A-League. Joey Worthen played with the Richmond Kickers of the A-League in 2004 and Real Salt Lake of the MLS in 2006, and Tyler Ruthven, a senior in 2009, is a member of the Harrisburg City Islanders.

Brad Guzan was the No. 2 pick, the highest ever for a goalkeeper, in the 2005 MLS SuperDraft. Guzan was a three-year starter for Chivas USA, however, in August of 2008 he made the move to the English Premier League, signing with Aston Villa. In 2007, Mike Sambursky was drafted by the defending MLS Champions and his hometown Houston Dynamo. The most recent former Gamecock to join an MLS squad is former goalkeeper Mike Gustavson who joined the San Jose Earthquakes in 2008 for a short time.

The 2011 senior class saw three drafted in the MLS supplemental draft. Forward Blake Brettschneider, the 2010 C-USA Co-MVP, was drafted and signed to DC United, while goalkeeper Jimmy Maurer was selected by the New York Red Bulls and striker Sam Arthur was chosen by the Chicago Fire.

MAJOR LEAGUE SOCCER

HISTORY

Goalkeeper Brad Guzan earned 2007 MLS Goalkeeper of the Year honors and enjoyed a breakout season with his club Chivas USA. Along with South Carolina's first Major League Soccer player, Rob Smith, Guzan, Mathis and Wolff have had a huge impact on the MLS and the U.S. National Team.

Both Mathis and Wolff entered the MLS after the 1997 season by different methods. Mathis was drafted by the Los Angeles Galaxy as the sixth overall pick in the 1998 draft. Wolff signed with "Project 40" and was assigned to the Chicago Fire. Mathis and Wolff had breakthrough seasons in 2000. Mathis was the star of the 2000 All-Star game, playing for the NY/NJ MetroStars in the same season that Wolff led the U.S. Olympic team to its best finish in the Olympics. Wolff played every minute for the U.S. during the Olympic Games.

Despite suffering injuries in 2001, Mathis and Wolff were named to the 2002 U.S. World Cup team by head coach Bruce Arena. Both strikers impacted the team's success in South Korea.

In 2001, Wolff was joined by former Gamecock teammate Henry Ring. The goalkeeper was drafted in the third round by the Fire. Ring was the first Gamecock since Mathis to earn two All-America honors (1998 and 2000). Ring, Mathis and Wolff were all teammates during Carolina's 16-3-1 season in 1997, when they closed out their season in the second round of the NCAAs. Wolff was traded from the Chicago Fire to the Kansas City Wizards in 2003. Ring assumed starting duties for the Fire in 2004 and had a breakout season, being named to the MLS All-Star team, while Mathis spent the 2004 campaign playing overseas with Hannover 96 of the German Bundesliga before returning to the MLS. Mathis announced his retirement from professional soccer in early August 2010.

Guzan collected 13 shutouts during the 2007 en route to MLS Goalkeeper of the Year honors. Following a successful three-year stint in MLS, Guzan signed with Aston Villa of the Barclays Premier League in England for the 2008 season.

Brettschneider was signed by by DC United in early 2011, and made an immediate impact on the field for the team. As of early August 2011, Brettschneider had played in 10 games, scoring one goal and contributing two assists for the club.

These Gamecocks are carrying on the Gamecock tradition on the national scene. Mathis and Wolff have been featured on ESPN and ABC for their efforts in the MLS, tracing their start at South Carolina.

GAMECOCKS ON NATIONAL TEAMS

A number of players have played on various United States national teams throughout the years. Coach Mark Berson directed the South team to the gold medal at the U.S. Olympic Festival in Durham, N.C., in 1987 – one year after serving as assistant coach for the South squad.
