2016 SPRING SEASON UNDERWAY

South Carolina begins its 2016 spring campaign ranked No. 50 in the nation, looking to bounce back from a 2015 season that saw the Gamecocks get off to a hot start before losing key components to injury and finish 15-15. Head coach Josh Goffi is in his sixth season leading the Garnet and Black and turns to a talented young nucleus, led by Penn State transfer Alex Fennell and sophomores Harrison O'Keefe and Gabriel Friedrich, to guide a squad that is without a senior.

O'Keefe is the Gamecocks' highest ranked singles player (No. 65), followed by Fennell (No. 116). The duo combined for a 24-7 record in the fall, as Fennell won the title at the Bulldog Scramble.

Sophomore Thomas Mayronne bounced back from a tough freshman campaign to post 13 fall wins, pushing for a spot in the lineup and the rest of the team as a result. Junior Andrew Schafer returns after leading the team in SEC wins last season with six.

A challenging lineup awaits the Gamecocks, who are scheduled to play 17 matches against NCAA tournament teams from a year ago.

SCOUTING REPORT: Presbyterian / Winthrop

Presbyterian dropped their opener to Georgia Tech, 6-1, but bring a roster with six upperclassmen, led by first-year head coach Patrick Fediuk, who took over at the semester break. Presbyterian is looking to improve on last season's 20-9 record that included a 4-4 mark in Big South play and a runner up finish in the conference championship. Senior Danny Bruce headlines the returners. The team captain went 16-7 in singles to move himself into fourth on the school's career wins list with 42. Juniors Diego Manzanas and Ben Kelley each won at least 15 matches last season for the Blue Hose.

Jon Collins steps in as new head coach at Winthrop, a program coming off back-to-back Big South Tournament Titles and a 15-9 season from a year ago. The Eagles made their second-straight NCAA Tournament appearance in 2015, falling to Georgia in the first round, 4-0. A trio of seniors leads the way with Michael Chen (13-10) and Steven Patrick (9-14) hoping to take the next step to help the Eagles to a third-straight conference title. Behind the seniors, a combined six freshmen and sophomores fill out the roster. Sophomore Ruben Franzanti showed flashes as a freshman in 2015 on his way to an 8-10 record.
