Head coach Steve Spurrier begins his ninth season in Columbia with just one new coach on hand. Deke Adams takes over the defensive line duties in 2013. While the Head Ball Coach remains the key figure guiding the offense, he is assisted by co-offensive coordinators Shawn Elliott and Steve Spurrier Jr. Defensive coordinator Lorenzo Ward is in his second season directing the Carolina defense.

41 The Gamecocks

South Carolina returns 36 letterwinners from last season's 11-win squad, including a dozen starters. Six starters return on offense, while five are back on defense and one on special teams. In addition, the Gamecocks welcome their ninth-straight Top-25 recruiting class to Columbia this fall.

77 2012 in Review

South Carolina posted an 11-2 record in 2012, its second-straight 11-win season. The Gamecocks had won 10 games just once previously in school history. The 2012 edition staked its claim as the best team in school history, as it finished the year ranked seventh by the Coaches and eighth in the final Associated Press poll, the loftiest final rankings in history.

Head coach Steve Spurrier became the winningest coach in Carolina history during the 2012 season, breaking Rex Enright's mark of 64 wins with a 27-17 win at Clemson. Coach Spurrier added a win over Michigan in the Outback Bowl, giving him 66 victories in his eight-year tenure in Columbia.

163 Bowl Games

South Carolina has played in 18 bowl games, including nine since the turn of the century. The Gamecocks are enjoying a streak in which they have been bowl-eligible for nine straight years, the longest stretch of its kind in school history. Carolina has won back-to-back bowl games, defeating traditional powers Nebraska (Capital One Bowl) and Michigan (Outback Bowl) in the last two years.

THE HISTORY: 2013 marks the 120th season of inter-collegiate football at the University of South Carolina, dating back to 1892. It is the 107th-consecutive year in which South Carolina has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team in either 1893 or 1906. Carolina owns an all-time record of 565-545-44.

SEC HISTORY: The 2013 season marks South Carolina's 22nd year in the Southeastern Conference. South Carolina and Arkansas joined the 10-team league prior to the 1992 campaign. The SEC became a 14-team conference last year when Missouri and Texas A&M joined. The Gamecocks earned their first SEC Eastern Division title in the 2010 season.

MAKING HISTORY: The Gamecocks have put together back-to-back 11-win seasons, the first back-to-back, double-digit win seasons in school history. They have logged two of their three 10-or more win seasons in the last two years. The only previous 10-win campaign came in 1984. The Gamecocks have won 22 games over the past two seasons, 31 over the past three seasons, and 38 over the past four seasons, all school records.

THE RANKINGS: The Gamecocks finished eighth in the final 2012 Associated Press poll and seventh in the final USA Today/Coaches poll. It was the highest finish on record for Carolina, one spot better in both polls than in 2011.

TOP-10 PROGRAM: The Gamecocks have put together back-to-back Top 10 finishes for the first time in school history, finishing ninth in 2011 and eighth in 2012 according to the Associated Press. They finished one spot higher in the Coaches' poll both years. The Gamecocks have finished among the nation's Top 25 for three-straight seasons, another "first" in school history. Here are South Carolina's final AP Top-25 rankings:

YEAR (FINAL AP): 1958 (13); 1984 (11); 1987 (15); 2000 (19); 2001 (13); 2010 (22); 2011 (9); 2012 (8).

IN THE POLLS: The Gamecocks have been ranked in the Associated Press Top-25 for 47 consecutive polls, starting with the second week of the 2010 season. That is the longest consecutive streak in school history. According to research compiled by "The Blitz," South Carolina was ranked in the A.P. poll 148 times from 1936-2011, 14 times as a member of the ACC (1936-1970), 57 times as a Independent (1971-1991) and 77 times since joining the SEC prior to the 2012 season.

YES THEY CALL IT A STREAK: The Gamecocks are tied for the fifth-longest current streak of being ranked in the Associated Press's Top 25. Carolina and Stanford have been ranked for 47 consecutive weeks, trailing only Alabama, LSU, Oregon and Oklahoma.

THE TOP 10: The Gamecocks were ranked in the Top 10 for a school-record 10-consecutive Associated Press polls, the final two of the 2011 season and the first eight of the 2012 campaign, before falling out after successive losses at LSU and Florida. The Gamecocks have been ranked in the AP Top 10 31 times in school history, 17 under head coach Steve Spurrier including 14 times in the last two seasons. STARTING ON A ROLL: The Gamecocks won their final five games of the 2012 season, with consecutive victories over Tennessee, Arkansas, Wofford, Clemson and Michigan. It's the first time in school history that Carolina enters the offseason on a five-game winning streak. The previous best was four, set in 1958 and matched in 2011. The 1912 unit went 4-0-1 in its last five games and the 1947 squad went 5-0-1 in its last six contests. The Gamecocks will enter the 2013 season tied with Rice for the nation's eighth-longest winning streak behind Ohio State (12), Arkansas State (8), Stanford (8), Utah State (7), Vanderbilt (7), San Jose State (7) and Texas A&M (6).

THEY'RE BACK: The Gamecocks welcome 36 returning letterwinners to begin the 2013 campaign. The 36 lettermen consist of 19 offensive players, 16 defensive players and one special teams player. The Gamecocks lost 24 lettermen, including 10 on offense, 11 on defense and three from special teams. A complete list of the returning and lost lettermen can be found on page 12.

SQUAD BREAKDOWN: The 107-man squad consists of five seniors, 25 juniors, 31 sophomores, and 46 freshmen.

FOR STARTERS: The Gamecocks list 12 returning starters from the 2012 squad (six on offense, five on defense and one specialist). The returning offensive starters are OG **A.J. Cann**, WR **Bruce Ellington**, OG **Ronald Patrick**, OT **Corey Robinson**, QB **Connor Shaw** and OT **Brandon Shell**. The returning defensive starters include DE **Jadeveon Clowney**, CB **Victor Hampton**, CB **Jimmy Legree**, DT **Kelcy Quarles**, SS **Brison Williams**. The lone returning specialist is P **Tyler Hull**.

GONE BUT NOT FORGOTTEN: The Gamecocks said goodbye to 26 lettermen from last year's bowl roster including 12 starters. The departing starters include TE **Justice Cunningham**, OC **T.J. Johnson**, TB **Marcus Lattimore**, WR **D.L. Moore** and WR **Ace Sanders** on the offensive side of the ball and LB **Reginald Bowens**, SPR **DeVonte Holloman**, DT **Byron Jerideau**, FS **D.J. Swearinger**, DE **Devin Taylor** and LB **Shaq Wilson** on the defensive side of the ball, along with PK **Adam Yates**. A complete list of the departed letterwinners can be found on page 12.

EVERY TIME OUT: The Gamecocks had nine players start all 13 games a year ago. Of the nine, WR **Bruce Ellington** and OG **Ronald Patrick** will return for the 2013 campaign.

THE HEAD BALL COACH: Steve Spurrier begins his ninth season directing the Gamecock football program. He has logged a 66-37 mark (.641) in Columbia. The Head Ball Coach is Carolina's winningest coach with 66 victories and is second in games coached with 103, behind Rex Enright (140). Spurrier owns a 208-77-2 mark (.729) in 23 seasons as a collegiate head coach, with previous stops at Duke and Florida.

AT THE TOP OF THE LEADER BOARD: Head coach Steve Spurrier recorded his 65th victory at South Carolina in his 102nd career game as the Gamecocks' head coach in the regular-season finale at Clemson and added No. 66 in the Outback Bowl against Michigan. He surpassed Rex Enright (64) for the most coaching wins in school history. He is already the winningest coach at Florida with 122 victories. The legendary Bear Bryant (60 at Kentucky and 232 at Alabama) is the only other coach to own the most wins at two SEC schools.

TOPS IN HIS FIELD: Steve Spurrier became the 71st head college football coach (all divisions) and the 22nd in Division I history to record 200 wins when he accomplished that feat against UAB in 2012. He ranks third among active Division I coaches with 208 wins. In addition, the HBC has 47 wins as a head coach at the professional level, giving him 255 career coaching wins.

UNCHARTED TERRITORY: The 2013 Outback Bowl marked the seventh time Coach Spurrier has taken Carolina to a bowl game. They have been bowl-eligible in each of his eight campaigns. No other coach in Carolina history has taken the Gamecocks to more than three bowl games (Jim Carlen and Joe Morrison). Coach Spurrier is 3-4 in bowl games at South Carolina, including back-to-back bowl wins over Nebraska (Capital One Bowl) and Michigan (Outback Bowl). He is the only Gamecock coach to post three bowl victories.

COACHING SHUFFLE: The Gamecocks made just one coaching change during the off-season, as veteran defensive line coach Brad Lawing left for Florida and was replaced by former North Carolina defensive line coach Deke Adams.

ENROLLING EARLY: The Gamecocks welcomed three scholarship players to the roster in January. The threesome included junior college cornerback **Ronnie Martin** and a pair of high schoolers who graduated a semester early, quarterback **Connor Mitch** and offensive lineman **D.J. Park**.

IN THE CLASSROOM: The Gamecocks placed 29 players on the 2012 SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll while posting a team GPA of 2.918, highest in school history. Among those who made the SEC Honor Roll include returnees **Landon Ard**, **K.J. Brent**, **Damiere Byrd**, **A.J. Cann**, **Shon Carson**, **Gerald Dixon Jr.**, **Phillip Dukes**, **Bruce Ellington**, **Deon Green**, **Mason Harris**, **Tyler Hull**, **Kadatrix Marcus**, **Drew Owens**, **Ronald Patrick**, **Kelvin Rainey**, **Corey Robinson**, **Brandon Shell**, **Brock Stadnik**, **Clayton Stadnik** and **Dylan Thompson**.

THEY PAY TO SEE THE GAMECOCKS PLAY: The Gamecocks ranked 18th in the nation in average home attendance in 2012, averaging 80,001 at Williams-Brice Stadium. That includes a school record 85,199 who were on hand to watch the Gamecocks thump Georgia, 35-7.

TWO-SPORT STARS: Head coach Steve Spurrier is not adverse to having his players participate in other sports at Carolina. Wide receiver **Bruce Ellington** has been the starting point guard for the basketball team for the past three seasons, while tailback **Shon Carson** and cornerback **Ahmad Christian** spent the spring with the Gamecock baseball team. In addition, wide receiver **Damiere Byrd** was a sprinter during the indoor track & field season.

IT'S A NUMBERS GAME: The Gamecocks return 42 percent of their rushing yards, 96 percent of their passing yards and 54 percent of their receiving yards from a year ago. In addition, six of the squad's top 13 tacklers, return for the 2013 campaign.

GOOD HOME COOKIN': The Gamecocks have won their last 11 games at Williams-Brice Stadium. Carolina is 27-3 in its last 30 home games. The only home losses in the last four years came to top-ranked Florida in 2009, to 17th-ranked Arkansas in 2010 and to defending national champion Auburn in 2011.

PERFECT AT HOME: The Gamecocks went 7-0 at home in 2012. It marked the first time they ran the table at home since joining the SEC. The last time they went undefeated at home was in 1987. They have been undefeated and untied at home 10 times.

TOP HOME STREAKS: The Gamecocks have won 11-straight home games, their longest stretch since joining the SEC and the third-longest streak in school history. Here are the top home winning streaks:

AN SEC SIX-PACK: With a 6-2 SEC mark in 2012, the Gamecocks reached six SEC victories for the second year in a row. They had never had six SEC wins in a season prior to 2011. They finished the 2000, 2001, 2005 and 2010 seasons with 5-3 SEC marks. Carolina finished 2012 with at least a .500 SEC mark for the 10th time in 21 seasons and have put together three-straight .500-or-better SEC records for the first time in school history.

GAMECOCKS IN THE SEC: The Gamecocks wrapped up their 21st season of league play in the SEC in 2012. They have played 168 SEC regular-season contests since joining the league. Here's a breakdown of the Gamecocks in three-year segments in conference regular season action:

OUT OF THEIR LEAGUE: The Gamecocks went 5-0 in non-conference action in both 2011 and 2012, and have been undefeated in regular season non-conference play for three consecutive years. They are 31-7 in non-conference games under head coach Steve Spurrier, including wins in 29 of their last 34 non-SEC tilts. The year-by-year breakdown: 2005 (2-2); 2006 (5-0); 2007 (3-1); 2008 (3-2); 2009 (4-1); 2010 (4-1); 2011 (5-0); 2012 (5-0). They have a regular season winning streak over non-conference opponents of 16 games. South Carolina's last regular season non-conference loss came at Clemson in 2008.

KEEPING THE FANS HAPPY: The Gamecocks have taken care of business against their top rivals in recent seasons. Over the past three years, they are an impressive 11-1 against SEC Eastern Division rivals Georgia (3-0), Florida (2-1) and Tennessee (3-0) and against in-state rival Clemson (3-0). In fact, Carolina has won the Palmetto State Championship four years in a row, the longest winning streak over the Tigers since 1951-54.

AS GOOD AS IT GETS: The 2013 Gamecocks will feature one of the game's top players in junior defensive end **Jadeveon Clowney**. Clowney, who is regarded by most as the top defensive player in the country and a likely top pick in the 2014 NFL Draft, was just the second Gamecock to earn unanimous All-America honors in 2012, joining George Rogers from his Heisman Trophy season in 1980. Clowney was named the Hendricks Award winner as the nation's top defensive end, and the All-America Player of the Year, presented by AT&T as selected by the fans on ESPN.com. He finished sixth in the Heisman race and was a finalist for the Nagurski Trophy, Rotary Lombardi Award and the Bednarik Award after being named the SEC Defensive Player of the Year by the league's coaches.

THE LEGACY CONTINUES: The Gamecocks roster features four players whose fathers also donned the Garnet & Black: junior defensive tackle **Kelcy Quarles** and his father, Buddy (1984-87); sophomore defensive linemen **Gerald Dixon** and **Gerald Dixon Jr.** and their father, Gerald (1990-91); and redshirt freshman **Jordan Diggs** and his father, Shed (1984-87).

RECRUITING SUCCESS: The Gamecocks had another successful February signing day. Carolina has put together nine-straight classes that rank among the nation's top-25, according to *Rivals*. Here are the recent recruiting class rankings according to *Rivals* and *Scout*:

ATTENTION BOOSTERS:

The University of South Carolina Office of Compliance Services is committed to a comprehensive compliance program that educates everyone about the importance of adhering to NCAA, SEC, and institutional rules. We strive to create a "compliance conscience" within the University and throughout the community.

The commitment to compliance ensures institutional control over the department of athletics and furthers the mission of the University of South Carolina. The existence of a successful compliance program depends on the willingness of coaches, administrators, staff, student-athletes and boosters to be cognizant of NCAA, SEC, and institutional rules.

WHAT IS COMPLIANCE?

At South Carolina, the Office of Compliance Services works within the department of athletics and the University to ensure South Carolina's compliance with all applicable rules. In doing so, the compliance staff is charged with the following tasks:

- Educating administrators, coaches, staff, prospects, student-athletes and boosters about NCAA, SEC, and institutional rules;
- Developing monitoring systems to ensure compliance with these rules. These systems are designed to monitor rules pertaining to recruiting, academic eligibility, financial aid, awards, extra benefits, ethical conduct, amateurism, agents, employment, occasional meals, and the playing and practice seasons for each sport; and
- Investigating and reporting violations of NCAA, SEC, and institutional rules to the appropriate governing authority.

ARE YOU A BOOSTER?

You are a booster if you are or ever have:

- Been a member of a booster organization that supports University of South Carolina athletics;
- Made any financial contributions to any area the University of South Carolina;
- Made any annual or lifetime membership commitment to a booster organization;
- Been involved with the recruitment of a prospect;
- Provided benefits to an enrolled student-athlete or his/her relatives or friends;
- Been involved in promoting South Carolina's athletic program;
- Provided or helped to arrange employment for student-athletes;
- Been a season ticket holder.

PROSPECTIVE STUDENT-ATHLETES

A prospective student-athlete (prospect) is a student who has:

- Started classes for the ninth grade, or
- Ever received any financial assistance or other benefit prospective students do not generally receive.

An individual remains a prospect until one of the following occurs (whichever is earlier):

- The individual officially registers and enrolls in a minimum full-time program of studies and attends classes in any term (including summer) of a four-year collegiate institution's regular academic year.
- The individual participates in a regular squad practice or competition at a four-year collegiate institution that occurs before the beginning of any term.

Remember a prospect remains a prospect even after signing a National Letter of Intent with the University of South Carolina.

EXTRA BENEFITS

A recruiting inducement or extra benefit is any special arrangement by a University of South Carolina employee or booster to provide a prospect, a student-athlete, or their relatives or friends a benefit not expressly authorized by the NCAA. Examples of impermissible extra benefits include, but are not limited to:

- Free or reduced cost services, rentals, or purchases of any type (e.g., meals, drinks, clothing, laundry, haircuts, legal fees, tattoos, car repairs, free upgrades on products or services, etc.)
- Gifts of any kind, including special occasions (birthdays, holidays, graduation, etc.)
- VIP access to bars, clubs, events, etc.
- Free or reduced cost housing for any length of time
- Loans (including co-signing)
- Cash or like items
- Use of an automobile or transportation
- An employment arrangement for a prospect or student-athlete's relatives
- Entertainment
- Use of your telephone or credit card
- Providing a meal in your home
- Academic assistance of any kind (e.g., tutoring, editing papers/projects, assistance in completing classwork, use of computer, etc.)
- Any tangible items, including merchandise

WHAT ARE THE CONSEQUENCES?

South Carolina is responsible for the actions of its boosters. If a booster provides an impermissible benefit to a prospect, a student-athlete, or their relatives or friends, South Carolina may be subject to penalties, even if the student-athlete has completed his or her eligibility. The prospect or student-athlete who accepts an impermissible benefit jeopardizes his or her eligibility for intercollegiate competition. A booster who provides an impermissible benefit may be disassociated from the University's athletics program. Disassociation results in a loss of all benefits or privileges offered by the department of athletics and may involve other penalties as appropriate.

In February 2012, the University of South Carolina appeared before the NCAA Committee on Infractions as a result of violations committed by boosters of its athletics program. One question that circulates around athletics is, "Is it harder to build a championship program or to maintain one?" Well, the South Carolina Gamecocks are about to find out.

Coming off their best season in school history, a campaign in which they won 11 games for the second-straight year and produced their highest final national ranking, the Gamecocks will try to build on that momentum in 2013. The ultimate goal of winning an SEC Championship has barely eluded Carolina over the past three seasons, but the squad will head into the fall focused on reaching that lofty goal again this season. As one of only four BCS schools, along with Alabama, Oregon and Stanford, that has recorded 11-win seasons in each of the last two campaigns, Carolina expects to once again be the hunted, rather than the hunter.

Buoyed by the return of 36 lettermen, including a dozen starters from a team that went 11-2, captured the Outback Bowl and finished as high as No. 7 in the Coaches' poll, the Gamecocks, under ninth-year head coach Steve Spurrier, have solidified the program to a point where they are able to re-load, rather than re-build. Led by the nation's top defensive player and a Heisman Trophy candidate in Jadeveon Clowney, Carolina figures to be one of the favorites in the SEC East and a preseason top-10 candidate again in 2013.

Once again, the road to Atlanta and the SEC Championship Game is a difficult one. However, at least on paper, this year's schedule appears a bit more manageable, as it does not feature a gauntlet similar to the one the Gamecocks faced in 2012 when they had contests versus Georgia, at LSU and at Florida in consecutive weeks, a stretch that proved to be Carolina's undoing.

After a non-conference Thursday night opener against neighboring North Carolina, the Gamecocks will travel to Georgia for a key early SEC Eastern Division showdown in which Carolina will try to make it four-straight over the Bulldogs. Much-improved Vanderbilt visits Columbia the following week. After a non-conference trip to UCF, the Gamecocks embark on a stretch of six-consecutive SEC contests, beginning with a home game against Kentucky. Carolina then has three-straight road tilts - at Arkansas, Tennessee and Missouri - that will test their mettle before wrapping up the conference slate with back-to-back home battles with Mississippi State and Florida, the latter of which could decide the East.

The regular season ends with a pair of non-conference home games against in-state opponents on the opposite ends of familiarity. The Gamecocks will meet Coastal Carolina for the first time ever, then will try to make it five-straight against Clemson when the teams meet for the 111th time on November 30 in Columbia.

The Carolina offense officially returns six starters, including four on the offensive line, from a squad that averaged 31.5 points per game a season ago. Gone are playmakers like Marcus Lattimore and Ace Sanders, along with center T.J. Johnson who started every game over the past four seasons, and solid contributors in Justice Cunningham and D.L. Moore. Led by a pair of experienced quarterbacks in Connor Shaw, the only senior skill position player on the depth chart, and junior Dylan Thompson, the Gamecocks have as good of tandem QB's as anyone in the country. The Gamecocks return 42 percent of their rushing yards, 96 percent of their passing yards and 54 percent of their receiving yards from a year ago. Along with the signal-caller, the strength of this year's offense could be in a still young, but experienced offensive line.



Incumbent **Connor Shaw** returns for his senior campaign. Shaw, who owns a 17-3 record as a starting quarterback, including a 10-0 mark at home, threw for just under 2,000 yards a season ago while completing two-thirds of his passes, including 17 for touchdowns

At 6-3 and 219-pounds, he is blessed with excellent size and was highly regarded coming out of Raleigh, N.C. Newcomer **Perry Orth** caught the coaches' eyes in the spring as well, while sophomore walk-on **Austin Hails** provides depth.

TAILBACK: The Gamecocks will have a new look at tailback following the departure of Marcus Lattimore and Kenny Miles, who combined to rush 870 times for over 4,000 yards during their Carolina careers. While running backs coach Everette Sands is excited about the overall talent in the backfield, he viewed the spring as a time for separation and was looking for someone to step up and fill those big shoes vacated by Lattimore. Ideally, Sands would like his number one tailback to have 60-65 percent of the carries, with the number two back getting the next 30-35 percent. The first three on the depth chart entering the fall are all sophomores. **Mike Davis** gained some valuable experience and showed some flashes last fall as a true freshman and came out of the spring holding a slight lead as the front-runner to work with the first unit. He averaged 5.3 yards per carry including a 50-yard burst against UAB. **Brandon Wilds** returns after sitting out the 2012 campaign as a redshirt and looked faster and stronger in the spring. Wilds has proven himself at this level, as he logged three 100-yard rushing games as a true freshman in 2011. A patient runner, Wilds is also considered the best blocker of the group. Redshirt freshman **Kendric Salley** was healthy for the first time and had an opportunity to put his talents on display this spring. WIDE RECEIVER: Youth will be served at the wide receiver position, as the unit does not feature a senior. Wide receivers coach Steve Spurrier Jr. will have to find a replacement for his top performer, Ace Sanders, who left after an MVP performance in the Outback Bowl and with a year of eligibility remaining to embark on a pro career. But Spurrier Jr. is accustomed to replacing some special receivers who have donned the Garnet & Black in recent years, including Sidney Rice, Kenny McKinley and Alshon Jeffery, all of whom earned spots on NFL rosters. The leader of this year's group figures to be one of college athletics top two-sport standouts in junior **Bruce Ellington**. Ellington had his best season on the gridiron last fall, leading the team with 600 receiving yards on 40 catches with seven touchdowns. He

three projected starters stand taller than 5-9. After those three, the rest of the receiving corps is talented but virtually untested. OFFENSIVE LINE: Relatively young but experienced would be the best way to describe the returners on the offensive line. The Gamecocks lost a good one in center T.J. Johnson, who started every game over the past four seasons, but return everyone else who saw any significant action during the 2012 campaign. The only senior of the group is right tackle **Ronald Patrick**, who started every game a year ago. Patrick is one of just four scholarship seniors on this year's squad and joins Connor Shaw as the only two on the offensive side of the ball. A pair of junior starters return on the left side of the line and figure to man those positions again this year. Tackle **Corey Robinson**, the biggest of the linemen at 6-8, 341, and guard **A.J. Cann**, a two-year starter who is considered an all-conference candidate, should be even more comfortable working side-by-

side this season. Robinson came into his own last season while Cann has taken on more of a leadership role both on and off the field. Sophomore **Brandon Shell** took over the right tackle duties last season and earned a spot on the SEC All-Freshman team. The coaches feel he as a tremendous upside.

The only newcomer on the starting five entering the fall figures to be redshirt freshman center **Cody Waldrop**. The coaches like his potential and he could become a fixture for years to come. Junior **Cody Gibson** has made six starts in his career and could push either Robinson or Shell for playing time at one of the tackle positions, giving Carolina quality depth at that spot. Another tackle, junior **Mike Matulis**, has seen considerable playing time during his Gamecock career, including 10 starts, but missed the spring while rehabbing from shoulder surgery. He has yet to use a redshirt, so that's a possibility for him if he needs more time to rehab the shoulders. The only sophomore reserve of the group, **Will Sport**, saw action on special teams last season and is a darkhorse candidate to see playing time at an inside position. A trio of redshirt freshman, six-foot nine-inch tackle **Mason Zandi** and the twins, guard **Brock Stadnik** and center **Clayton Stadnik**, used the year to get bigger and stronger in the weight room. They are hoping that extra work paid off and can carry over to the field of play. Newcomer **D.J. The Carolina defense returns five starters from a unit that ranked in the top 25 in the four major statistical categories a year ago - scoring defense (13th), rushing defense (17th), passing defense (21st) and total defense (11th). The Gamecocks will have a completely different look to their linebacking corps, as Reginald Bowers, DeVonte Holloman, Damario Jeffery, Quin Smith and Shaq Wilson, who combined for 99 career starts, all moved on following graduation. Carolina will also be without starters Byron Jerideau and Devin Taylor along the defensive line, and standout safety D.J. Swearinger. However, the cupboard is certainly not bare. Any unit that can feature 6-6, 272-pound defensive end Jadeveon Clowney, a unanimous All-American and legitimate candidate for every post-season award in 2013, including the Heisman Trophy, is one to be reckoned with. Clowney will be joined up front by Kelcy Quarles and Chaz Sutton. The secondary features three returning starters in cornerbacks Victor Hampton and Jimmy Legree and safety Brison Williams. Defensive coordinator Lorenzo Ward is confident the talent level is there and the experience will come, but the goal will be to develop some leaders among the unit, which started in the spring.

DEFENSIVE LINE: The only coaching change for the Gamecocks this past offseason came on the defensive line where former North Carolina assistant Deke Adams was brought in to replace longtime assistant Brad Lawing. Adams must have felt like he won the lottery when he took the job knowing he would be working with the nation's top defensive player in **Jadeveon Clowney**. Clowney, a 6-6, 274-pound junior earned unanimous All-America honors last season, just the second Gamecock in history to do so, joining Heisman Trophy winner George Rogers. Clowney, a Heisman contender in his own right after finishing sixth in the balloting in 2012, was the Ted Hendricks Award winner as the nation's top defensive end, and was a finalist for the Nagurski, Lombardi and Bednarik Awards after setting school records with 13.0 sacks and 23.5 tackles for loss. But Clowney isn't the only standout on the defensive line. Junior

has started 17 games over the past two seasons and figures to be a stalwart in the middle of the defensive line again in 2013. The only scholarship senior of the unit is defensive end **Chaz Sutton**. Sutton, a 6-5, 263-pounder, has waited patiently for his turn in the starting lineup,

but has been very productive as a backup, as witnessed by his 5.0 sacks last season. Junior **J.T. Surratt**, who also has been waiting his turn, figures to open the fall as the probable starter at the defensive tackle position next to Quarles.
