South Carolina Notables

- This is the 38th season of women's basketball at South Carolina and the Gamecocks' 21st season in the SEC.
- South Carolina's defense, rated second in the nation in points allowed (45.3), has held eight opponents to 48 or fewer points this season, the most since 2006-07.
- In conference games only, the Gamecocks lead the SEC in both steals per game (9.5) and turnover margin (+6.5).
- During its current seven-game win streak, the Gamecocks have scored 68.1 points per game on 44.7 percent shooting while holding opponents to 42.3 points per game on 34.7 percent shooting. South Carolina has a +11.4 rebounding advantage and a +7.0 turnover margin during the stretch as well.
- Freshman forward Aleighsa Welch leads the SEC in field goal percentage, shooting 67.6 percent on the season. Over the last five games, she has shot 75.0 percent (21-of-28) from the field, including a pair of games hitting better than 80 percent of her shots.
- Senior forward Charenee Stephens has been the team's top rebounder in three of the last four games, including pulling in a game-high eight against #24/21 Vanderbilt, despite giving up four inches to the Commodores' primary post players.

A South Carolina Win Would...

- Be the Gamecocks' 14th of the season, the best season start since the 2002-03 team also went 14-2.
- Be the Gamecocks' eighth-straight victory, the longest win streak since the 2003-04 team put together eight straight from Nov. 24 through Dec. 18 in non-conference action.
- Make the Gamecocks 3-0 in the SEC for the first time since the 2001-02 team started league play with four straight victories.
- Be Dawn Staley's first over Florida while she is the Gamecocks' head coach. Staley's Temple team topped the Gators 85-80 in overtime on Jan. 2, 2007, in Gainesville.

By the Numbers

- 0 Games this season in which the Gamecocks have committed more turnovers than their opponent
- .167 3-point field goal percentage (1-of-6) to which South Carolina limited Vanderbilt (Jan. 5), which had entered the game leading the nation in 3-point field goal percentage at 43.8 percent
- .447 Field goal percentage for the Gamecocks during the current seven-game win streak, which includes four players connecting on at least half their field goal attempts – Aleighsa Welch (.703), Markeshia Grant (.515), Charenee Stephens (.519) and Sancheon White (.500)
- 2 National rank for the Gamecocks in scoring defense
- 3 SEC rank in conference games only for the Gamecocks in field goal percentage (.427), compared to its rank of seventh (.399) for all games
- 4 Games in which freshman forward Aleighsa Welch has pulled down six offensive rebounds, which are the fourth-most by a freshman in school history

Last Time Out

South Carolina improved to 2-0 in SEC action with a 65-55 win over #24/21 Vanderbilt Thursday night. The Gamecocks executed their game plan with precision, limiting the nation's top 3-point shooting team to just 1-of-6 from behind the arc and forcing 26 turnovers, while constantly attacking the basket on offense to stretch their win streak to seven games. Freshman Aleighsa Welch poured in a season-high 19 points, thanks in large part to six offensive rebounds, while senior Charenee Stephens pulled down a game-high eight rebounds on the night.

Florida Series Notes

The Gators lead the series 20-8 and have won the last five meetings. Florida narrowly escaped Colonial Life Arena last season with a 65-63 victory on Jan. 9 on a bucket in the final 16 seconds. The Gamecocks are 5-8 against the Gators in Gainesville, which was the site of South Carolina's last victory over Florida – a 69-65 decision on Feb. 24, 2008.

South Carolina senior La'Keisha Sutton has put up the best career numbers versus Florida,

averaging 13.0 points per game on 43.8 percent shooting while handing out 4.3 assists per game. Senior Charenee Stephens' 6.0 rebounds per game against Florida leads the team, which includes her 10-rebound outing on Jan. 24, 2010. Ieasia Walker was the team's top scorer in last season's matchup, netting a game-high 22 points on 4-of-6 shooting from 3-point range.

Road Warriors

South Carolina has a 183-231 (.442) all-time record on the road. The Gamecocks' best season on the road was 1979-80 when they went 11-4. Under head coach Dawn Staley, South Carolina is 14-22 in road games. In her 11th season as a head coach, Staley has a 76-68 road record.

The Gamecocks are 4-1 on the road so far this season. The most true road games South Carolina has won under Staley is five, which the 2009-10 team amassed. The Gamecocks have not won more than five true road games in a season since the 1990-91 squad went 6-4.

Life in the League

South Carolina is 83-186 all-time in its 21st season SEC regular-season play. The Gamecocks are 55-81 in SEC games played in Columbia with a 28-105 record on the road. The Gamecocks are 17-17 in conference play since head coach Dawn Staley's first season in the league yielded a 2-12 mark. The Gamecocks' 3-2 start to league action in 2009-10 was its best five-game open since the 2001-02 squad went 4-1. Overall, Staley boasts a 118-54 record in league play, including eight seasons leading her Temple teams to a 99-25 Atlantic 10 mark.

Bringing the Defense

In the NCAA statistical rankings released through games of Jan. 5, the South Carolina defense was second in the nation in points allowed per game (45.3) behind just Connecticut (42.8). The Gamecocks have allowed more than 55 points just twice in 15 games this season – Drexel 58 (Dec. 28) and Xavier 56 (Nov. 30) and have held eight opponents to 48 or fewer points.

Under head coach Dawn Staley, stingy defense has been a staple of the Gamecock game plan. South Carolina has allowed just 59.8 points per game on Staley's watch, including a 45.3 average this season and a 59.6 mark in 2010-11. In the last two seasons, the Gamecocks held their opponent to 55 or fewer points in a game 27 times, including 13 of 15 games this season. In the 105 games with Staley at the helm, South Carolina has held an opponent to 55 points or fewer 35 times. In that same period, an opponent has netted 70 or more points in a game just 26 times.

One of the more interesting facets of that statistic is that the Gamecocks have not necessarily held opponents to a sub-par shooting percentage. Through Staley's tenure, opponents have shot 41.0 percent from the field. South Carolina has shot 39.5 percent during that time with the Gamecocks' season field goal percentage exceeding that of its opponents just once (2009-10). The defensive success appears to come from limiting opponent shot attempts entirely as South Carolina has put up more shots than its opponents every season except Staley's first (2008-09). This season alone, the Gamecocks have taken 12.2 more shots per game than their opponents.

Good Hands

South Carolina is ranked 10th in the country with a +7.2 turnover margin. The trio of experienced guards have helped the Gamecocks on both sides of the turnover margin. The Gamecocks have forced 20 or more turnovers in nine of their 15 games this season while committing 20 or more turnovers only once (vs. College of Charleston, Nov. 23). The Gamecocks are also 11th in the nation in fewest turnovers per game (13.7).

Tough to Scout

Throughout the preseason, head coach Dawn Staley talked about the versatility of her team as a key to the season's success. While she may have been

speaking more about the various ways individual players could score, it's been the Gamecocks' ability to get points from various locations that has delivered the program's best opening record since Staley arrived in Columbia. In 15 games, seven different players have led the team in scoring – Markeshia Grant (3), Ieasia Walker (3), Aleighsa Welch (3), Ashley Bruner (2), Tina Roy (2 – 1 shared), La'Keisha Sutton (2, 1 shared) and Charenee Stephens (1). In all, eight different Gamecocks have scored in double figures at least once this season.

Helping Hand

With arguably the best point guard in international women's basketball history at the helm, South Carolina has been at its best when its assist numbers are highest. In the Dawn Staley era (2008-09 through present), the Gamecocks are 41-16 when handing out 10 or more assists, including a 9-1 mark this season. When missing the 10-assist plateau, South Carolina is just 15-35 overall with Staley, including a 5-20 mark in SEC action. That overall record includes this season's 4-1 ledger.

started the same five Gamecocks in 14 of 15 games this season and has always liked the idea of bringing an offensive weapon off the bench. That strategy seems to be working to full effect this season as 48.6 percent of the Gamecocks' scoring has come from someone not in the starting five. It is the highest percentage of bench scoring in Staley's tenure at South Carolina – in 2010-11, the bench netted 36.7 percent of the team's points; in 2009-10, it was 27.5 percent; and in her inaugural season of 2008-09 it was 29.0 percent. The delay tactic has not slowed the Gamecocks' production in the early going as they have been in the lead in the opening five minutes of all but three games so far this season.

With both junior Ashley Bruner and freshman Aleighsa Welch coming off the bench, the reserves have accounted for 60.9 percent of the team's rebounding this season. Welch has pulled down a team-high 6.3 boards per game, while Bruner has added 6.1. Senior forward Charenee Stephens leads the starting group on the glass as her 4.7 per contest is third-best on the team.

Defense Is the Difference

How solid is the South Carolina defense this season? Just look at its performances against three of the nation's top 25 offenses.

Most recently, the Gamecocks limited #24/21 Vanderbilt (Jan. 5) to just 55 points after the Commodores entered the game ranked ninth in the country with 80.0 points per game. South Carolina crippled the nation's top 3-point shooting team, which entered the game shooting 43.8 percent from the arc and making 6.5 3-pointers per game, allowing Vanderbilt to take just six 3-pointers in the game, making one of them.

Entering its Dec. 18 game against the Gamecocks, North Carolina led the nation in scoring, pouring in 87.5 points per game. South Carolina allowed the Tar Heels just 54.9 percent of that average – 48 points – the lowest scoring output for the Tar Heels since Connecticut held them to 47 points on Jan. 9, 2010. Even with that limited offense against the Gamecocks, North Carolina still ranks among the nation's top 10 in scoring offense.

The first evidents of the stingy South Carolina defense came early in the season when the Gamecocks allowed Penn State, which is currently ranked 24th in the nation in scoring offense, just 55 points on Nov. 20. The Lady Lions have not scored lower than 65 points in any other game this season and have topped out at 103 in three games.

Triple Play

Coming into the season, many observers felt the fate of the Gamecocks' season rested largely in the hands of its experienced backcourt – seniors Markeshia Grant and La'Keisha Sutton and junior Ieasia Walker. Through the first 15 games, that has certainly been the case as between their points and assists,

the trio has contributed to 59.3 percent of the team's 63.6 points per game.

Grant is leading the trio in scoring with her team-high 10.6 points per game, which ranks 23rd in the SEC. Sutton is atop the assist category as her 3.0 per game are 12th in the league standings. Walker leads the defensive effort, ranking fifth in the SEC with 2.5 steals per game.

Not So Fast

While the backcourt got all the attention leading into the season, two of the team's top four scorers play in the frontcourt. Freshman Aleighsa Welch and junior Ashley Bruner are currently second and fourth, respectively, on the team in scoring with 8.9 and 7.8 points per game. While Welch has been the higher scoring of the two lately, averaging 10.6 points over the last five games, much of the season's early success rested heavily on Bruner, who spent most of the season's first month as the team's top scorer and rebounder.

Locking It Down

South Carolina has held an opponent to 48 or fewer points eight times this season, the most since the 2006-07 squad limited its foes to that number eight times. The most games in a season with opponents netting 48 or fewer points is 11 in 2005-06. South Carolina has never lost a game when holding an opponent to 48 or fewer points, which it has done in a total of 109 games (two games in the 1980-81 season were later forfeited).

Making a Name for Herself

In December, senior guard La'Keisha Sutton etched her names among the top guards in South Carolina women's basketball history. Handing out her 300th career assist against Drexel (Dec. 28) and scoring her 1,000th career point against South Carolina State (Dec. 14), making her just the 11th Gamecock to achieve both milestones in her career. The last to hit both marks was Cristina Ciocan in 2003-04.

On the Horizon

Head coach Dawn Staley inked four players in the early signing period. Below is a brief look at each of the future Gamecocks.

- **Tiffany Davis** (Houston, Texas/Westbury Christian) is a 5-foot-8 point guard rated the 29th in the 2012 class at that position. Before transferring to Westbury Christian, she helped Westside High to the 2011 District 20-5A championship game. Davis earned all-region and first-team all-district honors as a junior, netting 16.0 points per game.
- **Asia Dozier** (Columbia, S.C./Spring Valley) is a 5-foot-11 guard who helped Spring Valley to state championships in 2009 and 2011. Rated the 34th-best guard in the 2012 class and a four-star player by *ESPN Hoop/Gurlz*, Dozier averaged 17.1 ppg and 3.8 apg as a junior as the Lady Vikings went 29-0. As a freshman, her 18.3 ppg and 3.8 apg earned her Class 4A Area Player of the Year honors from *The State* newspaper. Her father, Perry, and uncle Terry Dozier also played basketball for the Gamecocks.
- **Tiffany Mitchell** (Charlotte, N.C./Providence Day) is a 5-foot-10 guard who is rated among the top 50 players in the 2012 class by *ESPN Hoop/Gurlz*. She earned South Charlotte player of the year honors and was an *Associated Press* All-State selection after averaging 18.4 points, 6.9 rebounds, 4.2 steals and 3.9 assists as a junior. She guided the Chargers to 21 straight wins in 2010-11, including the program's second-straight NCISAA state title.
- **Khadijah Sessions** (Myrtle Beach, S.C./Myrtle Beach) is a 5-foot-6 point guard rated the seventh-best in the class at her position by *ESPN Hoop/Gurlz*. The 40th-ranked player overall, she averaged 17.9 points and 5.7 assists as a junior while leading the Seahawks to their second-straight AAA state championship. A member of the all-state team, Sessions also captured all-region honors last season.

Sutton's 1,000th career point game just 8:40 into the 100th game of her career on a trademark drive through the lane. Her effort against South Carolina State, which ended with 12 points, made her just the 27th player in school history to score at least 1,000 points. She also became the 48th player to play in 100 career games in that outing. Her 300th assist came just in time for the Gamecocks to hold off a late rally by Drexel. After driving the lane, Sutton found Ashley Bruner on the right block for a bucket that ended a four-minute scoring drought for the Gamecocks.

Record Book Rewrite

The South Carolina defense has made its mark on the program's record book just 10 games into the 2011-12 season. The Gamecocks have both tied and broken the previous record for fewest points allowed in a game – holding Presbyterian to 24 to tie the mark on Nov. 27 then limiting SC State to just 21 to reset the record on Dec. 14. Presbyterian's 11 second-half points lowered that record by two, while SC State's 13 in the second stanza tied the previous low. The Lady Bulldogs became just the fifth opponent in Gamecock history to fail to reach double figures in the first half, and they now hold the Gamecocks' record for lowest opponent field goal percentage at 12.5 (6-of-48).

Judging January

The Gamecocks are 174-174 (.500) all-time in the month of January, including a 102-73 (.580) record at home. Under head coach Dawn Staley, South Carolina is 12-15 in the first month of the year. The Gamecocks went 2-6 in Staley's first year at the helm (2008-09) and were 4-5 in each of the last two seasons. The Gamecocks are 2-0 so far this month.

Strength of Schedule

After finishing the 2010-11 campaign with the nation's 19th-toughest schedule, the Gamecocks are facing another challenging slate in 2011-12. South Carolina will play eight games against teams ranked in both the Associated Press and USA Today/ESPN Coaches polls this week – Tennessee, Kentucky (2), Georgia, Vanderbilt (2), Penn State and North Carolina.

Seventeen of the Gamecocks' 29 games this season will be against teams that participated in the 2011 postseason, including nine who were in the NCAA Tournament. Of the 24 opponents on the schedule, eight finished the 2010-11 season with an RPI in the top 50. Six others closed with an RPI between 51 and 100.

Watching the Gamecocks

Fans can catch up with the Gamecocks on television 12 times this season, including a pair of games on the ESPN family of networks. South Carolina will also live stream video of all of its non-televised home games for free via its official athletics website, www.GamecocksOnline.com.

Preseason Props

SEC Coaches voted two Gamecocks to the Preseason All-SEC team last week as senior La'Keisha Sutton and junior Ieasia Walker earned spots on the second team. The pair of guards accounted for 38.2 percent of the team's scoring last season and handed out 54.0 percent of the assists.

We're Back...

South Carolina returns eight letterwinners from last season's Women's NIT team. All are juniors and seniors, including three starters. Additionally, the group includes the top two in points, rebounds and assists for the season. The two seniors that departed in May provided vast leadership and experience, but did not necessarily have a significant game-to-game statistical impact.

The returning Gamecocks accounted for 74.5 percent of last season's scoring, 63.1 percent of rebounding and 81.4 percent of assists. The group of five seniors and three juniors amassed 103 starting assignments a year ago.

Fresh Look

South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley added five student-athletes to her roster this season, providing depth and height on the backcourt while building a foundation for the frontcourt. As a group, the newcomers have accumulated two state titles, eight all-conference selections, six all-state honors and six player of the year awards.
