



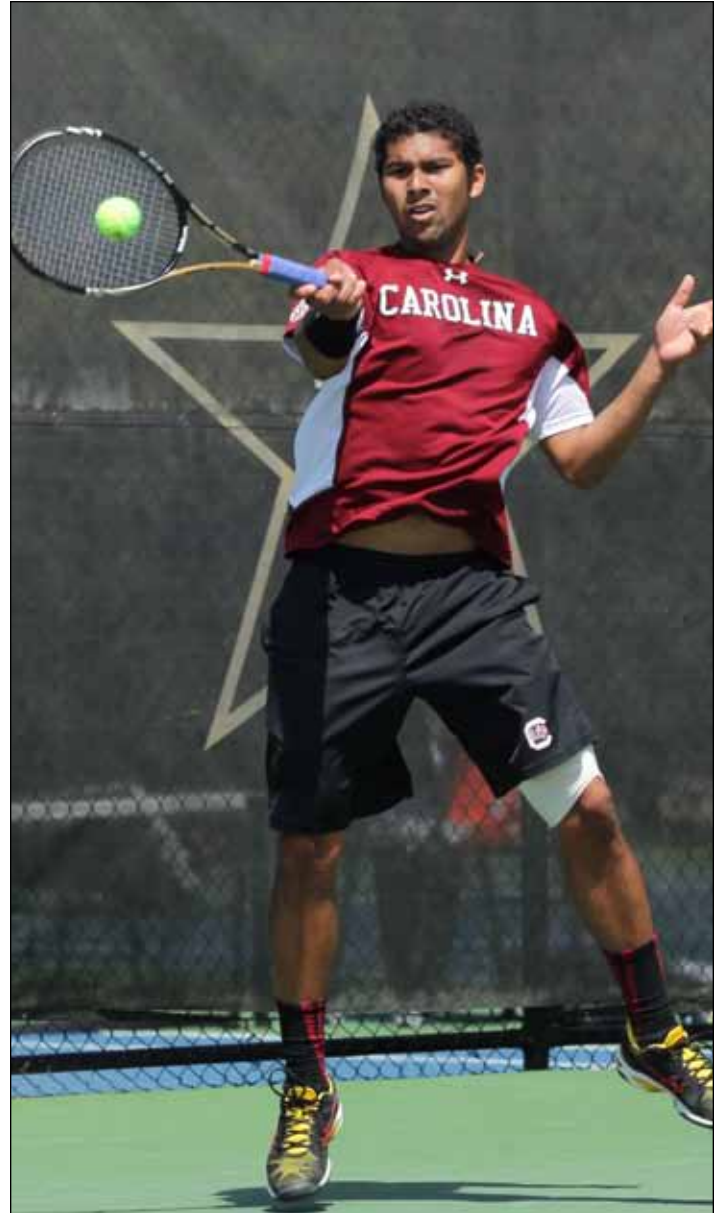

First Appearance in NCAA Singles Championship

- National Rank: 54 – Highest rank of career, previous best was No. 62 in Fall 2012
- Second-Team All-Southeastern Conference for second-straight seasons – Earned SEC All-Freshman honors in 2012 as well
- Went 6-6 against nationally-ranked opponents this season, tied for most ranked wins on the team
- Has two wins over other players in the NCAA Singles Championship field – Nik Scholtz (Ole Miss) and Gonzales Austin (Vanderbilt) – both coming in April
- Opened season with 7-2 record in dual matches after sitting out the fall to recover from offseason hip surgery
- Moved into the team's top singles spot in fourth week of SEC play and went 5-3 down the stretch of the regular season, including three wins in conference play – then-No. 70 Chris Simpson (LSU), then-No. 16 Nik Scholtz (Ole Miss) and then-No. 19 Gonzales Austin (Vanderbilt)
- Was actually more effective at the top of the order than in his combined 12 matches at a lower position – 6-4 (.600) at No. 1 compared to 7-5 (.583) at Nos. 2-4
- Won first NCAA Tournament match of his career with 7-5, 6-2 victory over Atlantic 10 Conference Most Outstanding Performer Francisco Dias of George Washington, who claimed the A-10 title
- Clinched team's win over Vanderbilt in regular-season finale with 7-5, 6-4 win over then-No. 19 Gonzales Austin
- Gained confidence after dominant 6-3, 6-2 win over then-No. 16 Nik Scholtz of Ole Miss – the highest ranked win of Adams' career and the only SEC loss for Scholtz, who was later named SEC Player of the Year – which helped Gamecock to their first win over the Rebels since 2004
