### Auburn Women's Basketball Quick Hitters

- This is the 39th meeting between Auburn and South Carolina, the 17th in Columbia
- Auburn leads the all-time series 21-17, but South Carolina has a 9-7 advantage in Columbia
- South Carolina has won the last two meetings and three of the last four
- Auburn is 2-13 all-time against teams ranked No. 1 in the nation
- Auburn's last meeting against a No. 1 team came Nov. 27, 2005 (lost 69-37 at Duke)
- Auburn's last win over a No. 1 team was March 30, 1990 (def. Louisiana Tech 81-69 in Final Four in Knoxville)
- South Carolina will be the seventh different No. 1 team Auburn has faced in its history
- Auburn is 16-19 in SEC openers and 14-21 in SEC road openers
- Auburn has won three of its last four SEC openers including both games under Williams-Flournoy
- The Tigers' win at FIU on Dec. 29 snapped a six-game road losing streak
- Auburn's last SEC road win came on Feb. 13, 2014, at Vanderbilt
- Auburn has won 11 straight home games dating back to end of last season, matching the longest streak at Auburn Arena
- Auburn is 13-15 all-time in games played in the state of South Carolina (0-1 in 2014-15)
- The Tigers are 4-2 all-time on January 2
- Auburn is 216-49 all-time in the month of December; Coach Flo is 15-2 in December at Auburn
- Auburn is 5-0 this season when forcing 25 or more turnovers
- The Tigers have recorded 15 or more steals five times this year, going 5-0 in those games
- Auburn is second in the SEC in assists (16.0/game) and third in steals (12.8/game) and assist/turnover ratio (1.0)
- The Tigers hold opponents to 51.4 points per game, third-best in the SEC and 8th in the nation
- Sophomores Brandy Montgomery and Katie Frerking were named to the FIU Fun & Sun all-tournament team
- Montgomery has two 20+ point games this season, both on the road - 24 at Virginia (11/23) and 20 at FIU (11/29)
- Sophomore Khady Dieng was named to the St. John's All-Tournament Team after scoring 26 points in two games
- Senior Kiani Parker is 5th in the SEC in assists (4.0/game)
- Senior Hasina Muhammad is 2nd in the SEC in blocked shots (1.7/game) and is 9th in steals (2.2/game)
- Muhammad scored a season-high 14 points in win over Savannah State (12/17) to lead Auburn for 1st time in 2014-15
- Junior Tra'Cee Tanner has held or shared the Auburn lead in scoring in 10 of 13 games this year

**LOOKING AHEAD**

Auburn plays its first home SEC game of the season Sunday, Jan. 4, as the Florida Gators visit Auburn Arena. Tip is set for 3 p.m. CT with the game to be televised on SEC Network.

**IN THE RANKINGS**

South Carolina is ranked No. 1 in both polls. Auburn is unranked.

**QUICK HITS**

Auburn finished its non-conference schedule at 9-4... Auburn won its 850th all-time game with its win over Troy on Nov. 14, becoming the 19th team in NCAA history with 850 victories ... Auburn is in its 44th season of women's basketball and sports an all-time record of 858-412... Auburn has made 18 NCAA Tournament appearances, five WNIT appearances and three Final Fours in the program's history... Head Coach Terri Williams-Flournoy is 47-34 in her third season at Auburn... She has a 190-138 record as a head coach... Auburn advanced to the 2013 WNIT Quarterfinals and the 2014 WNIT Third Round... The Tigers are coming off back-to-back 19-15 seasons.

**IN SEC OPENERS**

Auburn is 16-19 all-time in Southeastern Conference openers, dating back to the 1979-80 season. The Tigers have won both of their prior SEC openers under coach Terri Williams-Flournoy and three of their last four. Auburn defeated Mississippi State on the road 82-74 last season.

Auburn's record vs. SEC opponents in league openers: Arkansas (1-0), Mississippi State (5-1), South Carolina (2-0), Tennessee (2-2), Alabama (1-0), LSU (2-4), Kentucky (1-3), Ole Miss (1-3), Vanderbilt (1-3) and Florida (0-3).

Auburn is 14-21 in SEC road openers, dating back to 1979-80. The Tigers won their road opener in 2014 at Mississippi State (see above).

**AGAINST THE SEC**

Auburn has an all-time record of 204-188 (.520) against the other 13 members of the Southeastern Conference (in league

games). The Tigers have won five SEC regular-season titles (most recently 2009) and four SEC Tournament championships.

**AUBURN VS. NUMBER ONE**

This will mark Auburn's 16th contest against the nation's top-ranked team (AP poll) in history. The Tigers are 2-13 all-time against teams carrying the No. 1 ranking. It will be the first time Auburn has faced South Carolina when the Gamecocks were atop the national polls.

Auburn's last win over a No. 1 team came on March 30, 1990, as the Tigers defeated top-ranked Louisiana Tech in the Final Four in Knoxville, Tenn. The last meeting with a No. 1 team was a 69-37 loss at Duke on Nov. 27, 2005.

The Tigers opened the game with the first four points, and went on a 9-0 run during the first half to eventually led by 12 at 25-13. South Carolina made a run of its own late in the half and tied things up, 39-39, at the break.

South Carolina took its first lead of the game early in the half after a 3-pointer from Asia Dozier. Auburn would tie the game two more times, but never took the lead as the Gamecocks controlled the rest of the game.

The Gamecocks took their biggest lead at 68-57 with 2:17 remaining, but the Tigers gathered themselves for one last push. Auburn cut the deficit to four with 23 second left after a Brandy Montgomery 3-pointer, but would come no closer.

Auburn lost despite out-rebounding South Carolina, 32-27, and forcing 20 Gamecock turnovers. The Tigers turned those turnovers into 27 points on the other end. Defense proved to be Auburn's main method of scoring as the Tigers shot just 39.7 percent from the field, including 35.5 percent in the second half.

**SCOUTING THE TIGERS**

Auburn enters conference play at 9-4 overall, coming off a split at the FIU Fun & Sun Classic where the Tigers defeated host Florida International and dropped a tight contest to Hampton in the championship game.

Junior Tra'Ce'e Tanner has been the Tigers' top offensive threat thus far, averaging 12.7 points and shooting an SEC-best 60% in the first 13 games. She had a double-double in the opener vs. Troy with 16 points and 10 rebounds, then followed that up with a career-high 31 points on 14-of-18 shooting vs. Grambling State. She then scored 19 points in a win over FGCU, got her second double-double against St. John's (12 pts, 10 reb) and has led Auburn in scoring in nine of 13 games.

Sophomore Brandy Montgomery is averaging 11.2 points per game, including a career-high 24 at Virginia and 20 at FIU, and sophomore Khady Dieng has contributed 8.5 points per game so far, including 26 over two games in the St. John's Tournament. Sophomore Katie Frerking is the team's top rebounder at 6.5 boards/game.

Pressure defense remains a staple of Coach Flo's system. After averaging 20.0 forced turnovers per game during her first two seasons, the Tigers have forced an average of 21.5 turnovers in the first 13 games of this season while racking up 12.8 steals/game.

**SCOUTING THE GAMECOCKS**

South Carolina is 12-0 for the season and ranked No. 1 in both the AP and USA Today polls. The Gamecocks lead the SEC in a number of categories, including scoring defense (47.6 ppg allowed), scoring margin (+32.3), field goal percentage (.490), rebounding defense (31.2), blocks (6.1/game), and assists (20.0/game).

The Gamecocks have only had three games decided by less than 10 points - a nine-point win over Southern Cal in the season-opener, a four-point win over #22 Syracuse in a tournament in the Bahamas, and a one-point win at #9 Duke.

Junior Tiffany Mitchell (14.8 ppg) and freshman A'Ja Wilson (14.2 ppg) rank in the SEC's top 10 in scoring. Alaina Coates leads the SEC with six double-doubles; she averages 11.4 points and 8.8 rebounds per game.

Dawn Staley is in her seventh year at South Carolina and led the Gamecocks to their first SEC regular-season title in 2014. Carolina has advanced to the NCAA Tournament each of the last three seasons.

**LAST TIME OUT FOR AUBURN**

Auburn fought back from a nine-point halftime deficit but came up just short in a 44-42 loss to Hampton in the championship game of the FIU Fun & Sun Classic Tuesday afternoon at FIU Arena.

The Tigers (9-4) struggled to score in the first half but were able to create turnovers in the second half, keeping things close to the final horn. Auburn found itself down by 10 points in the latter stages of the game but fought back to a two-point margin. However, Auburn's inconsistency at the free-throw line - 9-for-17 in the game - proved to be a major difference in the two-point loss.

Brandy Montgomery and Katie Frerking were named to the all-tournament team. Montgomery scored eight points and pulled down six rebounds to go along with her 20-point, five-steal performance against FIU Monday. Frerking had a career-high 10 rebounds in Tuesday's game along with seven points; she scored 12 in the FIU win Monday.

Despite foul trouble that kept her on the bench most of the first half, Tra'Ce'e Tanner led Auburn with 13 points on 5-of-8 shooting. Junior Cabriana Capers came off the bench and put together one of her best games in an Auburn uniform, tying a career-high with eight points and pulling down seven rebounds in 14 minutes of action.

**LAST TIME OUT FOR SOUTH CAROLINA**

No. 1/1 South Carolina posted its 12th-straight win Sunday afternoon, 84-44 over Liberty, behind an efficient offense and a dominating effort on the glass. Junior Tiffany Mitchell shot past 1,000 points in her career early in the game, and super subs Alaina Coates and A'ja Wilson sparked an early 16-0 run that turned a one-point deficit into a 15-point lead midway through the first half.

Mitchell wasted little time getting into the flow of the game as ball movement found her open on the perimeter early. Her 3 from the left side put the Gamecocks on top 5-2, and her pull-up jumper from the right elbow marked the 1,000th point of her career less than four minutes into the contest.

**ON JANUARY 2**

This will be Auburn's seventh all-time game on January 2. The Tigers have a 4-2 record on the second day of the year; the most recent contest on this date was a 66-55 win at Alabama in 2011.

**HOME SWEET HOME**

Auburn has won 11 straight games at Auburn Arena, including the final two regular season games and two WNIT games in the 2013-14 season and the first six games of 2014-15. Dating back to a win over Alabama on Feb. 17, 2013, Auburn has won 23 of its last 29 home games, including a 17-1 mark against non-conference opponents.

The Tigers have matched the longest home win streak since Auburn Arena opened in 2010. Auburn previously won 11 straight over the last two games of 2011-12 and the first nine games of 2012-13.

Under Coach Terri Williams-Flournoy, Auburn has a record of 22-1 in non-conference home games.

Auburn is 49-22 (.690) in its fifth season at Auburn Arena.

**IN AND OUT**

With Auburn's high-intensity defensive pressure, the Tigers must rotate multiple players to keep fresh legs on the floor at all

time. As a result, 10 different players are averaging at least 10 minutes played per game, and no player is averaging 30 minutes or more.

Brandy Montgomery has played the most minutes, averaging 27.8, followed by Tra'Ce'e Tanner (24.2), Khady Dieng (23.7), Kiani Parker (23.5) and Katie Frerking (23.0).

**TAKING OUR TALENTS TO SOUTH BEACH**

Sophomores Brandy Montgomery and Katie Frerking were named to the FIU Fun & Sun Classic all-tournament team in late December. Montgomery scored 20 points in 20 minutes and had a career-high 5 steals in a win over FIU, and Katie Frerking scored 12 points on 6-6 shooting against FIU and had a career-high 10 rebounds against Hampton.

**KHADY IN THE BIG APPLE**

Sophomore Khady Dieng had two of her best performances of the season in the St. John's Chartwells Holiday Classic, scoring 27 points over two games against St. John's and SMU on Dec. 20-21. Her 14 points against SMU were a season-high, and she was named to the all-tournament team.

**BIG NIGHT FOR TRA'CEE**

Junior Tra'Ce'e Tanner had a career-high 31 points in a 92-42 win over Grambling State on Nov. 17. It was the first time an Auburn player scored 30 or more points since Blanche Alverson had 32 against Mississippi State on March 3, 2013.

Tanner's performance was the 35th time in Auburn history that a player scored 30 or more points in a single game.

**BRANDY FROM DOWNTOWN**

Sophomore Brandy Montgomery scored a career-high 24 points against Virginia on Nov. 23, including six 3-pointers. It marked the most 3-pointers in a game by an Auburn player since Ruth Ketcham had six vs. Colgate on Dec. 5, 2007.

Montgomery needs just 16 more made 3-pointers to move into the all-time Auburn top 10.

**CLUB PRESS**

Auburn's high-pressure, full-court defense under coach Terri Williams-Flournoy, referred to by the players as "Club Press," has ranked as one of the best ever at Auburn over the last two seasons. In 2012-13, Auburn's 402 steals set a new school record for a single season while the 701 turnovers forced went down as second all-time on The Plains.

In 2013-14, the Tigers forced 659 opponent turnovers while recording 354 steals, remaining a major force on defense in the Southeastern Conference.

Auburn has forced 25 or more turnovers in a game 115 times since 1987 and has done so five times this season. Auburn forced 29 turnovers in the season-opener vs. Troy, 25 in the win over Grambling and 27 in wins over Marquette, Samford and FIU. The Tigers have also tallied 15 or more steals in a game on 105 occasions since 1987, doing so five times last season and five times already in 2014-15.

The Tigers used the defense to fuel their offense, averaging 19.3 points per game off turnovers last year. Auburn scored 29 points off turnovers in the season-opener vs. Troy, 34 against Grambling, 28 vs. Marquette and 27 vs. Samford.

### BACK-TO-BACK 19-WIN SEASONS

Auburn has posted back-to-back seasons with a 19-15 record, which tie for the most wins in a season since the Tigers' SEC Championship season of 2009. The Tigers advanced to the WNIT quarterfinals in 2013 and the WNIT third round in 2014.

### LOCKDOWN DEFENDER

Hasina Muhammad returns for her senior season as one of the top defensive players in the Southeastern Conference. A selection to the SEC All-Defensive Team in 2014, Muhammad ranked second in the SEC in steals (2.4/game) and fourth in the league in blocks (2.1/game). She also ranked in the top 50 nationally in both categories in 2014.

Muhammad currently ranks second in the SEC in blocks (1.8/game) and ninth in steals (2.2/game).

### TOUGH SCHEDULE

The Tigers will play a challenging schedule this season, playing as many as seven non-conference games against teams that advanced to the postseason a year ago. Florida Gulf Coast, Winthrop, St. John's and Hampton all played in the NCAA Tournament last year, while SMU, Marquette and Bowling Green advanced to the WNIT.

Auburn's first five SEC opponents - South Carolina, Florida, Kentucky, Georgia, and Tennessee - all advanced to the NCAA Tournament last season. Texas A&M, LSU and Vanderbilt all made the Big Dance, while Mississippi State and Missouri joined Auburn in the WNIT.

### SISTER ACT

For just the fourth time ever, Auburn's roster features a sister combination as twin freshmen Jazmine and Jessica Jones will be in uniform for the Tigers. It gives Auburn a pair of sisters on the roster for the third-straight year as Tyrese and Tra'Cee Tanner played together the last two seasons.

Other sister combinations to play together at Auburn include

Tyrese (2010-14) and Tra'Cee Tanner (2012-present); Sherell (2004-09) and Reneisha (2006-10) Hobbs, and Ruthie (1985-89) and Mae Ola (1984-88) Bolton.

### NEW FACES

Auburn welcomes five newcomers to the roster for 2014-15, all freshmen. Joining the Tigers this year are G Bria Johnson (Baton Rouge, La.), F Jazmine Jones (Winston-Salem, N.C.), F Jessica Jones (Winston-Salem, N.C.), PG Neydja Petithomme (Boca Raton, Fla.) and F Asia Robeson (Kalamazoo, Mich.).

The Jones twins, Petithomme and Robeson made their collegiate debuts vs. Troy on Nov. 14, and Johnson saw her first action in an Auburn uniform vs. Grambling State on Nov. 17.

### ON THE TUBE

A total of 22 Auburn games will be televised on either digital or linear networks during the course of the 2014-15 season. Eleven games will appear on SEC Network +, which is available online and on mobile devices via the WatchESPN platform. The Tigers' game at St. John's on Dec. 20 will also be available online via ESPN3. Ten games will appear on linear networks, with the SEC Network and Fox Sports Net broadcasting five games each.

Auburn will welcome forward Jonika Garvin (6-0, Lake Worth, Fla./Lake Worth Community HS) and point guard Janiah McKay (5-6, Gainesville, Fla./Gainesville HS) to The Plains in the fall of 2015.

"I think we really signed what we needed for our 2015 class," Williams-Flournoy said. "We're losing two seniors in Hasina Muhammad and Kiani Parker. Jonika is very athletic and can help us at the top of our press, and Janiah helps fill that point guard position in losing Kiani. Both of them could be very good defensive players. We definitely filled some needs."

AUBURN, Ala. - Junior Tra'Ce'e Tanner had her fourth career double-double, and the Auburn women's basketball team used a huge run around halftime to earn a season-opening 71-54 win over Troy on Friday night at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (1-0) kept up their trademark defensive pressure throughout the game, forcing 29 turnovers while amassing 22 steals on the night, falling just two swipes shy of a school record.

Tanner led the way both shooting and on the boards, scoring 16 points and pulling down 10 rebounds to earn her first double-double since posting 14 points and 10 boards at Tennessee last season.

Auburn controlled the boards on the night, out-rebounding Troy 51-41. The Tigers also had 21 assists to Troy's 10 and shot 43.5 percent while holding the Trojans to a 26.6-percent night.

Four Auburn players hit double-figures on the night. Along with Tanner's 16, sophomore Khady Dieng contributed 13 points while sophomore Katie Frerking and senior Hasina Muhammad had 10 apiece.

Frerking narrowly missed a double-double of her own, pulling down a career-high nine rebounds. She also had a career-best five steals along with two assists and a block.

Auburn led for more than 37 minutes on the night, but the big run came just before and just after halftime. The Tigers outscored the Trojans 16-0 over the final 2:24 of the first half and the first 1:32 of the second stanza, opening up an 18-point lead. Troy would get no closer than 14 points the rest of the way.

AUBURN, Ala. - Auburn overcame a slow start to shoot 63.3 percent in the second half and run away from Southeastern Louisiana for a 72-44 win in women's basketball action Thursday night at Auburn Arena.

After missing 10 of 11 shots to open the game and falling behind by eight points, the Tigers (5-2) hit 29 of their final 46 attempts and saw a five-point halftime lead swell to as much as 29 late in the second half. It was the ninth straight home victory for Auburn, dating back to last season.

Junior Tra'Ce'e Tanner overcame a 1-for-7 start to finish with a game-high 15 points on 7-of-14 shooting. She was also Auburn's leading rebounder with six boards on the night. Sophomore Brandy Montgomery added 14 points on a 6-of-8 night from the floor that included a pair of 3-pointers.

Freshmen Jessica Jones and Neydja Petithomme put together one of the best games of their young careers, each scoring a career-high 11 points off the bench. Jones did not miss from the field (5-for-5) and Petithomme had a season-high six assists. The Auburn bench outscored the Lady Lions' reserves 30-9.

The Tigers shared the ball exceptionally well, recording 26 assists. Petithomme's six led the way while Kiani Parker and Katie Frerking had five apiece.

Auburn led by five at the half after struggling for much of the opening period. But much like in their win over Marquette, the Tigers found a spark out of the break and went on a 24-5 run over the first nine minutes of the second half, shooting as high as 80 percent during that stretch.

AUBURN, Ala. - Auburn played tough defense and used a balanced scoring attack to earn their third-straight win with a 64-41 victory over Samford in women's basketball action Sunday afternoon at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (6-2) have now won 10 straight home games at Auburn Arena, one shy of the arena record. Auburn is now 21-1 in non-conference home games under coach Terri Williams-Flournoy.

It marked the fourth time this season for Auburn to force 25 or more turnovers; the Tigers are 4-0 in those games. Auburn also forced 18 steals, the fourth time this season with 15 or more takeaways.

Senior Hasina Muhammad filled the stat sheet with a season-high seven steals to go along with seven points, four rebounds and four blocks. In one sequence in the second half, she blocked an opponent's shot on three consecutive attempts.

Freshman Jazmine Jones led the Tigers with a career-high 12 points on 5-of-5 shooting. Sophomore Katie Frerking had 11 points and a team-high seven rebounds, and junior Tra'Ce'e Tanner scored 10 points to finish in double-digits for the seventh time in eight games.

Auburn never trailed in the game, but allowed Samford to keep things close through the first 12 minutes. But with the game tied 19-19 with 8:32 to play, the Tigers finished the first half on a 13-1 run to take a 32-20 lead into the break.

Samford came out strong in the second half, cutting the deficit to five points at 34-29, but Auburn would go on a 21-5 run over the next six minutes to extend their lead to 11 points. The Tiger lead would not drop below double-digits again as Auburn's depth and pressure defense wore down the shorthanded Bulldogs, who only had eight players play in the game.

The Tigers scored 27 points off Samford's 27 turnovers, and the Auburn bench outscored Samford's reserves 29-2. Auburn got 40 of its 64 points in the paint.

**NEW YORK - Junior Tra'Ce Tanner** had her second double-double of the season, but the Auburn women's basketball team's rally from a big early deficit came up short in a 56-49 loss at 25th-ranked St. John's on Saturday.

The Tigers (7-3) trailed by as much as 17 late in the first half but put together a second-half rally that saw them get within three points on two occasions. However, Auburn could not quite get over the hump despite putting major pressure on the Red Storm (10-0) throughout the second half.

Tanner led Auburn with 12 points and 10 rebounds, including seven boards on the offensive end. It was her second double-double of the year to go along with 16 points and 10 rebounds in the season-opener against Troy. Sophomore Khady Dieng matched Tanner's scoring output with 12 points of her own on 5-of-8 shooting.

Kiani Parker had a strong day at the point guard position, scoring eight points along with five assists. She was key in the second-half defensive effort, recording three steals and putting constant pressure on the ball in the backcourt.

Twice in the second half, Auburn cut the deficit to as little as three points. Auburn came out of the gate strong and cut the lead to 40-37 with 13:04 to play. After St. John's moved back ahead by 10 points late in the half, the Tigers ramped up the pressure and forced several turnovers to cut the lead to three points again at 52-49 with just over a minute to play. However, St. John's Aliyiah Handford hit a clutch baseline jumper with 50 seconds to play to make it a five-point game, and then two late free throws sealed the deal for the Red Storm.

The Tigers hit their first three shots and opened the game with a 6-0 lead, but the Red Storm would go on a 23-4 run from that point to take a 23-10 lead. After making their first three attempts, the Tigers would only connect on two of their next 16 shots. Despite trailing by as many as 17, Auburn would cut the deficit to 10 at the half at 32-22.

Auburn forced 13 St. John's turnovers on the day - the fewest of the season by a Tiger opponent - but 10 of those came in the second half. The Tigers out-rebounded the Red Storm 35-27, including a 16-9 advantage on the offensive glass.

**NEW YORK - Auburn** built a 23-point lead early in the second half but had to hold off a late SMU rally for a 56-43 win Sunday afternoon in the consolation game of the St. John's Chartwells Holiday Classic.

Sophomore Khady Dieng led the Tigers (8-3) with a season-high 14 points and was named to the all-tournament team for her effort throughout the weekend. Senior Kiani Parker contributed a career-high 11 points and five rebounds in the winning effort.

Auburn led by 20 with 10:22 to play after a three-point play by Hasina Muhammad gave the Tigers a 47-27 lead. From that point, however, SMU (4-7) tightened down on defense and forced the Tigers into six turnovers the rest of the way and held Auburn to just one field goal for the remainder of the game.

The Tigers sprinted to a huge early lead, holding SMU to just three field goals in the first 14 minutes of the game as Auburn built a 27-7 lead at the 7:43 mark. A 9-0 run pulled the Mustangs within 11 at 27-16, but Auburn finished the half on an 8-2 run to take a 35-18 lead into the break. The 18 SMU points were the fewest allowed by Auburn this season.

Auburn outscored SMU in the paint 28-14, but foul trouble on the Tigers' bigs kept Auburn from pushing the ball inside in the second half. The Tigers forced SMU into 23 turnovers, scoring 24 points on the Mustangs' giveaways.

Despite going cold over the final 10 minutes, Auburn shot 40 percent for the game, holding SMU to 26.3 percent from the field.

MIAMI - Auburn fought back from a nine-point halftime deficit but came up just short in a 44-42 loss to Hampton in the championship game of the FIU Fun & Sun Classic Tuesday afternoon at FIU Arena.

The Tigers (9-4) struggled to score in the first half but were able to create turnovers in the second half, keeping things close to the final horn. Auburn found itself down by 10 points in the latter stages of the game but fought back to a two-point margin. However, Auburn's inconsistency at the free-throw line - 9-for-17 in the game - proved to be a major difference in the two-point loss.

Brandy Montgomery and Katie Frerking were named to the all-tournament team. Montgomery scored eight points and pulled down six rebounds to go along with her 20-point, five-steal performance against FIU Monday. Frerking had a career-high 10 rebounds in Tuesday's game along with seven points; she scored 12 in the FIU win Monday.

Despite foul trouble that kept her on the bench most of the first half, Tra'Ce'e Tanner led Auburn with 13 points on 5-of-8 shooting. Junior Cabriana Capers came off the bench and put together one of her best games in an Auburn uniform, tying a career-high with eight points and pulling down seven rebounds in 14 minutes of action.

The Tigers turned up the defensive pressure in the second half, forcing Hampton (5-8) into four 10-second violations, and a 10-0 run to start the half gave Auburn a 22-21 lead. The Lady Pirates would move back ahead by as many as 10 points at 39-29 with just over eight minutes to play, but the Tigers kept chipping away. A Capers layup with just over three minutes to play made it a three-point game, and a Frerking free throw cut it to two. However, the Tigers could not take advantage of their last four possessions with a chance to tie or take the lead, missing their final six shots of the game.

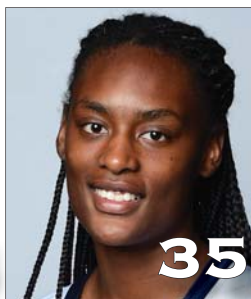
