South Carolina continues SEC play on the road on Saturday when it travels to face Missouri for a 4 p.m. ET matchup versus the Tigers. South Carolina nearly won last season's meeting at Mizzou Arena, holding a 13-point lead in the second half, but unable to close the victory. This weekend marks the American Cancer Society and National Association of Basketball Coaches, Coaches versus Cancer weekend. The Gamecock coaching staff will be wearing sneakers on the sideline for the event.



CAROLINA OUICK HITS

South Carolina is in its 106th season of basketball.

The Gamecocks are led by Frank Martin in his second year. Matt Figger is the associate head coach, and Perry Clark and Lamont Evans are assistant coaches. Andy Assaley is in his second year as the director of operations for the Gamecocks.

The Gamecocks are in their 23rd season of competition in the Southeastern Conference in 2014. Carolina owns a 133-226 (.370) all-time record in SEC play.

■ Frank Martin owns a 54-51 (.514) all-time record in conference play.

Martin owns a 6-6 record during his head coaching career vs. Missouri, all but two of those contests coming while the head coach at Kansas State. In Columbia, Mo., Martin is 1-5.

It was announced on Jan. 16 that junior guard Tyrone Johnson suffered a right foot fracture in the Jan. 15 game at Texas A&M, which required surgery. Johnson is out indefinitely. The Plainfield, N.J., native has played in 16 contests this season for Carolina, averaging 11.2 points and a team best 3.4 assists per game. He tallied 11 double-figure scoring games and 11 games with at least three assists prior to his injury.

After hitting 15-of-15 from the free throw line last week combined at A&M and vs. Ole Miss, senior guard Brenton Williams now qualifies for ranking in the NCAA statistics (min. 2.5 makes per game), and leads the nation in free throw percentage at 98 percent (50-of-51/Jan. 20). He has missed just one free throw dating back to the Feb. 28, 2013 game vs. Missouri. Williams was 2-of-2 from the line at Georgia on Wednesday.

South Carolina suffered a 97-76 loss in SEC play on the road at Georgia on Wednesday, despite a career high 26 points from freshman guard Sindarius Thornwell and 18 points from senior guard Brenton Williams. South Carolina's bigs were in foul trouble the duration of the contest, with both Mindaugas Kacinas and Desmond Ringer on the bench with three fouls by the eight-minute mark of the opening half. Georgia also won the battle of the boards, out-rebounding the Gamecocks 39-27, including 13 on the offensive glass, which led to 15 second-chance points.

In overall games, South Carolina ranks sixth in the SEC in free throw percentage (68.6), second in 3-point field goal

percentage (36.9), sixth in 3-point field goal percentage defense (31.1) and fifth in offensive rebounds per game (13.0). ■ The Gamecocks held a 10-point lead at halftime against Ole Miss, but the Rebels came back to out-score the Gamecocks 48-37 in the second half and claim a 75-74 win last Saturday at Colonial Life Arena. Freshman guard Sindarius Thornwell posted the first double-double of his career with teams highs of 24 points and 11 rebounds in the game. Senior guard Brenton Williams did not hit a basket in the contest, but was a perfect 9-of-9 from the free throw line, including making three from the line with just six seconds to play to pull the Gamecocks within one of the Rebels at the time

■ Sophomore forward Laimonas Chatkevicius earned his first start of the 2013-14 campaign against Ole Miss and hit 6-of-7 attempts from the field to match his career high of 12 points in the game. He also blocked two shots and collected one steal. Freshman forward Desmond Ringer also earned the first start of his career in the game.

■ The Gamecocks fell to 0-3 in conference play on Jan. 15 with a 75-67 loss at Texas A&M. The Gamecocks led by as many as 11 in the opening half, but the Aggies outscored Carolina 37-28 in the second half en route to the victory. Foul trouble once again plagued Carolina, with several players' minutes limited due to fouls, especially early in the second half. Senior guard Brenton Williams led the team with 14 points, his eighth-straight double-digit scoring game, while freshman guard Duane Notice added 12 points and five assists.

■ The Gamecocks suffered a 71-68 decision to visiting LSU in the SEC home opener last Saturday at Colonial Life Arena. The Gamecocks put together a 9-0 run late in the second half after trailing by as many as 14, but LSU was able to hold on for the victory. Freshman guard Sindarius Thornwell scored a season high 25 points on 9-of-13 shooting from the field and a 6-of-9 mark from the free throw line. Thornwell's 25-point effort marked the first time a Gamecock freshman has tallied 25 points in an SEC contest. He tallied 13 points in the first half alone. The Tigers out-rebounded the Gamecocks 42-32, the second-largest margin this season for a Carolina opponent in the category. ■ For his play during the opening week of league play vs. 10th-ranked Florida and LSU, Thornwell was named the SEC Freshman of the Week. He averaged 17.5 points and 4.5 rebounds, hitting 66.7 percent from the field in the two games. It is the first-career weekly honor for Thornwell.

■ South Carolina suffered a 74-58 loss on the road to 10thranked Florida in the SEC opener for both schools on Jan. 8. The Gamecocks were unable to find the basket until the middle of the first half, and the Gators used a 14-1 run to open the contest to open up a 13-point lead at the half. South Carolina responded during the second 20 minutes of action, hitting 54.5% (12-22) from the field in the half, but Florida scored 40 points in the paint, compared to 16 from the Gamecocks and closed the 16-point victory. Junior guard Ty Johnson led the Gamecocks off the bench with 12 points, his third-straight game leading Carolina in point production off the bench. Senior guard Brenton Williams, a Kissimmee, Fla., native posted his sixth-sraight doublefigure scoring contest with 10 points.

■ Entering Saturday's contest vs. Ole Miss, South Carolina's strength of schedule ranks 33rd in the country according to CBSSports.com and 24th according to ESPN.com.

■ South Carolina posted an 82-75 win over SC State last Friday in the final non-conference contest of the regular season for the Gamecocks. Four scored in double figures led by Williams' 19 points, while Johnson added 17, Notice 13 and rookie forward Demetrius Henry earned his first double-double of the year with 10 points and a game-high 11 rebounds.

■ Williams set a new South Carolina record for consecutive free throws made when he hit his lone attempt from the line for one of his 18 points vs. Marshall. Williams hit 50 straight free throws dating back to last season to hold the record. He missed his first free throw attempt of the season on Jan. 11 vs. LSU. He broke a record held by John Roche since the 1969-70 campaign.

■ South Carolina snapped a three-game losing streak when it earned an impressive 78-71 win over Saint Mary's on Dec. 22 in the opening round of the Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic in Honolulu. Four Gamecocks scored in double-figures, led by Johnson's 16 points. Freshman guard Sindarius Thornwell added 13, Notice netted a then-season high 11 and sophomore forward Laimonas Chatkevicius posted a career high 12, including 11 in the second half.

■ The Gamecocks shot 58.3 percent (28-48) from the field vs. Saint Mary's, the best percentage for Carolina this season, and the best percentage from the floor since hitting 57.7 percent last season in a win vs. Arkansas on Jan. 26, 2013.

■ The Gamecocks will hold a young roster this season, welcoming seven freshmen to Columbia in forwards Demetrius Henry, Desmond Ringer, Reggie Theus Jr., and guards Duane Notice, Justin McKie, Jaylen Shaw and Sindarius Thornwell. Ellington, who graduated in December, will begin preparing for the draft and will not complete his final season with the men's basketball team. Ellington concludes his career on the hardwood for the Garnet and Black with 80 career games played and 66 starts. He scored 893 points for an 11.3 points per game average. The Moncks Corner, S.C., native averaged 3.0 assists, 2.7 rebounds and 1.0 steals in 30.4 minutes per game. Ellington posted 39 double-figure scoring games in his career, including eight 20-point games and one 30-point effort, a career high 31 points at Furman during his freshman season of 2010-11.

SEC TOURNAMENT

Fresh off hosting the 2013 Final Four, the Georgia Dome will be the site for the 2014 SEC Tournament, March 12-16 in Atlanta. The Georgia Dome first hosted the tourney in 1995 and the 2014 event will mark the 11th time the venue has hosted the league's postseason tournament. The winner of the 13-game tournament receives the SEC's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. The tournament seeds are determined by the 18-game conference schedule during the regular season. Teams are seeded 1-14 based on their regular-season conference finish.

Former assistant Matt Figger was promoted to associate head coach during the offseason, and Lamont Evans returns for his second season as an assistant on Martin's staff in Columbia.

University of South Carolina head men's basketball coach Frank Martin announced on Nov. 19 the signing of Marcus Stroman (G - 6-2 - 170 - Columbia, S.C./Keenan High School) and TeMarcus Blanton (G - 6-4 - 185 - Locust Grove, Georgia/Luella High School) to National Letters of Intent. The duo will join the Gamecocks for the 2014-15 campaign and both will have four years of eligibility beginning next fall. Below are brief comments from Coach Martin on each signee.

Martin on Blanton

"I'm extremely excited about TeMarcus Blanton. He is a 6-5 wing that is ultra-competitive on both ends of the floor. He fits exactly the kind of guard that we want to build our program around. He's a slasher, a defender and an athletic finisher that loves every opportunity that he gets to compete."

Martin on Stroman

"Marcus is a consummate point guard. He understands the position at his age as well as, if not better, than most. Every time I watch him play, I leave games thinking that the four guys with him are better than they actually are, because he is so good at making others look good. He is an ultra-competitive, hometown kid, who grew up a Gamecock fan, and we are extremely excited to have him become part of our program."

GAMECOCKS TO COMPETE IN 2014 CHARLESTON CLASSIC

The Charleston Classic presented by Gildan announced six of the eight-team field for the 2014 tournament to be held Thursday, Friday and Sunday, Nov. 20, 21 and 23, at TD Arena in Charleston, S.C. South Carolina will compete in the event for the second time, and for the first time since the 2009 campaign. The other participating teams announced are Akron, Cornell, Miami (Fla.), Penn State and Southern California. The final two teams will be announced at a later date. During the 2009 event, the Gamecocks defeated La Salle in the tournament's opening round, earned a win over USF to advance to the finals, and lost to Miami in the championship game. The 2014 Charleston Classic will feature a bracket format with 12 games over three days. Each team will compete in one game per day, advancing through the bracket. The two teams that remain undefeated throughout will face off in a championship game on the final day of competition.

COLUMBIA, S.C. - South Carolina (13-15, 3-12 SEC) could not overcome a 69.6 percent shooting performance by Missouri (20-8, 9-6 SEC), dropping a home conference contest 90-68 on Thursday night at Colonial Life Arena. Sophomore guard Damien Leonard scored a career-high 20 points, hitting a career-best six 3s to lead the Gamecocks.

Junior guards Brian Richardson and Brenton Williams scored 10 points apiece in the game. Freshman forward Michael Carrera and senior forward Lakeem Jackson grabbed a team-high four rebounds. The Gamecocks shot 42.9 percent in the game, hitting 24-of-56 shots.

Senior guard Keion Bell recorded 18 of his game-high 24 points in the first half to lead Missouri. Sophomore guard Jabari Brown added 23 points, with senior forward Alex Oriakhi tallying 18. Both junior guard Phil Pressy and junior forward Tony Criswell registered a game-high five rebounds with Pressy adding nine assists.

Carrera struck first for South Carolina, giving them the early 2-0 lead, but Missouri was able to build a cushion, taking a 13-5 lead after Brown and Bell hit back-to-back 3-pointers to give the Tigers an eight-point lead four minutes into the matchup.

After checking in at the first media timeout, freshman forward Mindaugas Kacinas immediately drained shot from behind the arc and Richardson added another 3 on the next possession for the Gamecocks, cutting the Missouri lead to 15-11. Williams hit a 3-pointer two plays later and tacked on a basket in the lane to tie the game at 17 at the second media break.

With the game knotted at 17, the Tigers went on a 9-0 run to take a 26-17 upperhand. Williams stopped the run with a score in transition.

On the back of three Leonard 3-point baskets, the Gamecocks pulled to within two at 32-30, and the Gamecocks leveled the game again, this time at 32-32, on a long Ellington jumper with 5:14 remaining in the half.

Leading 38-34 at the final media timeout of the first half, Missouri went on a 7-2 run to match their largest lead of the half at nine. Freshman forward Laimonas Chatkevicius scored a bucket for South Carolina on their final offensive possession of the half, making the score 45-38 when the teams went to the locker room.

Holding a seven-point advantage at halftime, the Tigers started the second half 6-of-6 from the floor, going on a 12-4 run to stretch out a 57-42 lead. The Gamecocks were able to cut the lead to 11 after five straight points.

EXHIB. - SOUTH CAROLINA 84. USC AIKEN 72 NOV. 3. 2013/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA, S.C. - In South Carolina's only exhibition game before opening up the season on Nov. 9, the Gamecocks used a pair of first half runs fueled by its defense to take hold a 17-point first-lead before ultimately defeating USC Aiken 84-72. Sophomore guard Michael Carrera led the Gamecocks with 14 points, while sophomore forward Laimonas Chatkevicius added a double-double with 10 points and 11 rebounds.

South Carolina jumped out to a quick 5-1 lead just over two minutes into the game after a jumper from freshman guard Duane Notice. The Pacers though tied it up a minute and a half later on a bucket from senior guard Jesse Seilern and pushed the lead to 9-7 after a 3-pointer from Seilern at the 15:03 mark. From that point on, the Gamecocks picked up their pressure on the defensive end that resulted in a 10-1 run that was capped off by Carrera turning

over Aiken's DeVontae Wright in the backcourt and taking the ball the length of the court for a two-handed dunk. Wright came back and connected on a 3 on the right side to end a two

and half minute drought that saw the Pacers forced into six missed attempts. Wright's basket was the last for the Pacers for almost seven minutes. After a pair of free throws from the senior guard cut the game to two at the 9:30 mark, South Carolina went on a 16-1 run that started with a dunk from Chatkevicius. Over two minutes later, Notice found Carrera open on the left side as the sophomore marksman drained the triple to push the lead to nine.

Five free throws and buckets from Notice and fellow freshman Demetrius Henry pushed the lead to 33-16. During the near four and a half minute stretch, the Gamecocks forced the Pacers into 12 missed field goal attempts.

With under a minute remaining in the half. Thornwell turned over Aiken, flipped the ball to Notice who found Carrera on the end in transition for an easy dunk, but Seilern's third 3 of the half for the Pacers with five seconds left made it a 17-point game.

After holding USC Aiken to 21 percent shooting in the first half, the Pacers caught fire midway through the second half. With a 62-47 South Carolina lead at the second media timeout at 11:49, USC Aiken went 6-of-10 from the floor to go with four free throws in less than four minutes. After Chatkevicius added a free throw for Carolina at 9:54, the Pacers went on a 13-0 run in under two minutes, highlighted by three-straight 3-pointers from senior guard Ronald Zimmerman. Senior forward Paul Larsen's layup with eight minutes remaining cut the lead to three at 65-62.

The defensive intensity picked back up for the Gamecocks as they went on a 16-2 run over the next 5-plus minutes, primarily at the free-throw line to put the game away.

The run was keyed by senior guard Brenton Williams who hit a big 3 for the Gamecocks to push the lead back up to six with under seven minutes remaining

To go with Carrera's 14 and Chatkevicius' 10, Thornwell and Williams were also in double figures with 12 and 10 points, respectively. Aiken's Seilern led all scores with 18.

GAME 1 - SOUTH CAROLINA 82. LONGWOOD 44 NOV. 9. 2013/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA, S.C. - South Carolina (1-0) posted an 82-44 victory in its season opener on Saturday versus Longwood (0-1). The win marked the 13th straight in an opener for the Gamecocks and held head coach Frank Martin's record at a perfect 7-0 in openers for his career. South Carolina junior guard Ty Johnson led all scorers with 18 points, hitting 6-of-9 attempts from the field. Prior to the start of Saturday's opener, it was announced that Johnson had been granted a waiver from the NCAA allowing him to compete effective immediately. Johnson went on to score the first points of the contest on a driving lav-up to the right side in his first regular season action since the 2011-12 campaign at Villanova.

Sophomore forward Mindaugas Kacinas set a career high in the game with 14 rebounds, where the Gamecocks out-rebounded the Lancers 50-27. Kacinas pulled down five of Carolina's 12 offensive boards in the game.

South Carolina held Longwood to just 22.8 percent (13-57) shooting, which marked a new Colonial Life Arena record. Longwood's 44 points in the contest were the fewest for a Gamecock opponent since SE Louisiana scored 43 on Dec. 21, 2011. It was the largest margin of victory for Carolina since defeating Alabama A&M 88-50 on Nov. 13, 2009.

The Gamecocks held an early 6-0 lead behind the play of Johnson before a lay-in from Longwood's Tristan Carey put the Lancers on the board with 14:09 to play in the opening half.

Back-to-back 3s from sophomore forward Michael Carrera pushed the Gamecock lead to 18-4 with 11:04 remaining in the first half before Longwood would score five unanswered points over the course of the next three minutes to put the score at 18-9 at the under-eight minute media timeout.

The Lancers would add a jumper with 5:47 remaining, forcing a called time out for the Gamecocks

South Carolina would score seven unanswered out of the timeout, and would end the half on a 19-4 run, sparked by consecutive 3s from freshman guard Duane Notice, to hold a 37-15 upperhand at the break. Senior guard Brenton Williams led all scorers in the opening half with 11, while Kacinas pulled down eight rebounds, including four on the offensive glass.

Strong defense from the Gamecocks forced the ninth and 10th turnovers of the contest for the Lancers, with Carolina capitalizing on both with jumpers from freshman guard Sindarius Thornwell and Johnson at the 17:12 mark, which forced a Longwood timeout.

South Carolina continued to bolster its lead through the remainder of the second half. A one-handed dunk from Carrera pushed the lead to 61-24 at the 10:17 mark. The Gamecocks continued to dominate the remainder of the half. Johnson reached his career high for points in the later minutes of the game, and Kacinas pulled down his career high for rebounds, adding eight points to almost reach the double-double.

Williams and Thornwell both posted 14 points in the win, with all of Thornwell's tallies coming in the second half. Carrera added 12 points, nine rebounds and two blocks and Notice led the way with four assists. Carey led Longwood with 12 points in the contest

Freshman guard Sindarius Thornwell saw a pair of shots fall just short in the final seconds, and forward Michael Carrera was fouled attempting a put-back at the final horn, but officials determined the infraction occurred after time had expired. Thornwell was the catalyst for the Gamecocks throughout the afternoon.

leading all scorers with a season-high 20 points and chipping in four rebounds as Baylor was unable to find an answer for him.

Both teams opened up the game shooting high percentages with South Carolina starting the game hitting eight of its first nine from the field, while Baylor connected on seven of its first eight field goals.

The teams went back and forth throughout the first 20 minutes, both shooting over 48 percent from the field. South Carolina held a slim lead for much of the half, posting its largest lead of four, four times during the period and only trailing twice and taking a 39-38 edge into the locker room at halftime.

With 14:08 leftin the game, Baylor grabbed its first lead since the 12:42 mark in the first half when a missed free throw was kicked out to Brady Heslip for a 3-pointer to give the Bears a one-point advantage. After the Gamecocks quickly went back on top, Heslip responded with another triple. South Carolina's Demitrius Henry tied the game at 52-52 with 12:21 remaining.

After Henry gave the Gamecocks a two-point advantage, Baylor got one back on a free throw before forward Cory Jefferson hit a jumper to give the Bears the lead just before the 10-minute mark. Ten seconds later a missed free throw by Jefferson was gathered by Baylor where it was kicked out to Heslip for his third 3-pointer in less than five minutes. The bucket gave the home team its largest lead of the game at 58-54.

Baylor pushed the lead to 60-55, but South Carolina remained persistent and fought back to tie the game at 64-64 on a jumper from Thornwell with 4:20 on the clock.

Trailing 65-64, the Gamecocks forced a stop with just under a minute remaining, but Tyrone Johnson's layup on the other end wouldn't go down. Baylor guard Kenny Chery hit one of two free throws to give a the Bears a twopoint lead before the Gamecocks called a timeout with 16 seconds remaining.

On the other end, Thornwell got the ball in the corner and drove to the basket, but wasn't able to get his attempt to fall. He quickly stole the ball from Royce O'Neal before getting a second attempt off, which fell short as well. Carrera corralled the rebound, his team-high seventh of the game, and went back up to beat the buzzer, but neither the shot nor the foul called on Baylor occurred before the final horn.

For the game, Gamecock senior guard Brenton Williams had 12 points, while Johnson had eight points and eight assists to go along with four rebounds. Heslip led Baylor with 18 points, going 5-of-10 from behind the 3-point line.

CLEMSON, S.C. - After valiantly fighting back to within one point midway through the second half, South Carolina (1-2) was unable to sustain its comeback bid on the road, falling to Clemson (3-0) 71-57 at Littlejohn Coliseum. Gamecock sophomore forward Mindaugas Kacinas recorded his first doubledouble of the season with 13 points and 12 rebounds, while Tiger junior forward K.J. McDaniels led all scorers 21 points and grabbing 10 rebounds.

The teams traded made baskets through the first media timeout of the opening half, before back-to-back 3s from Clemson's Adonis Filer and Jordan Roper pushed the Tiger lead to 17-9 at the 12-minute mark.

Laimonas Chatkevicius responded out of the media timeout with a dunk courtesy of an assist from freshman guard Duane Notice, but the Tigers put together a 7-4 run to lead by 11 at 24-13 with 8:54 remaining in the half.

South Carolina suffered a near seven-minute scoring drought through the middle portion of the first half until a 3 from Sindarius Thornwell at the 3:42 mark halted the stretch. Thornwell added a floater on the next possession and another layup with 30 seconds remaining in the half to fuel a 13-9 Gamecock run over the final 3:42 to put the score at 35-26 Clemson at the break.

Clemson scored its last nine points of the first half at the foul line, hitting 9-of-10 attempts during the final 2:51 of the half.

South Carolina hit 33.3 percent (12-36) of its attempts from the floor during the opening half, with the Gamecocks having just three free throw attempts. The Tigers hit 10-of-24 attempts (41.7 percent) and 12-of-14 attempts from the free throw line.

A dunk and jumper from Demitrius Henry sparked an 8-5 Gamecock run out of the break, but Henry was called for his third foul of the second half at the first media timeout, with Carolina trailing the Tigers by six at 40-34 as 15:16 remained on the clock

Michael Carrera connected for a dunk out of the break, and Tyrone Johnson added a tally from the foul line, as the Gamecocks continued to battle back from a 13-point deficit to trail by just three at 40-37 with 14:21 to play.

The Gamecocks pulled within one at 40-39 following a continuation call on a floater from Carrera in the lane, but the Tigers responded with a 10-1 run over the next three minutes forcing a Gamecock timeout with 10:02 to play, and a 50-40 Clemson advantage.

The Tigers increased their lead to 54-43 at the under-eight minute media timeout and the score stood at 61-49 Clemson following two free throws from Desmond Ringer with 5:37 on the clock

The Clemson lead climbed to 14 at 63-49, before a 3-point play from Kacinas pulled Carolina within nine at 63-52 and 4:10 on the clock. The Tigers scored five straight from that point to push the lead back to 16.

Clemson's run in the second half was aided by its shooting from the free throw line, hitting nine of its second-half free throws after the Gamecocks closed to within one. The Tigers were 12-12 from the line in the second half and 24-26 (92.3 percent) for the game. On the defensive end, they totaled 12 blocks on the day, with seven coming from McDaniels.

GAME 4 - SOUTH CAROLINA 84. FIU 72 NOV. 24. 2013/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA. S.C. - Trailing at the half. South Carolina (2-2) put on the defensive clamps in the second half as they defeated FIU (6-3), 84-72, at Colonial Life Arena this afternoon as four Gamecocks scored in double figures for the second time this season.

Junior Tyrone Johnson matched his season high with 18 points and recorded seven assists, while freshmen Jaylen Shaw and Demetrius Henry had career days with 16 and 14 points, respectively. Shaw went 4-7 from 3-point range. Senior guard Brenton Williams also chipped in 16 points as well.

After forward Rakeem Buckles hit a 3-pointer in the opening minute from the right side to give FIU a 3-1 lead, the Gamecocks answered with six points over the next two minutes to take a four point lead and force the Panthers to call a timeout. FIU guard Jason Boswell cut the deficit to one though with a 3 out of the timeout.

After a long jumper from Buckles gave FIU an 11-9 lead at the 13:56 mark, Shaw responded with back-to-back 3-pointers to give Carolina a 15-11 advantage.

The Panthers though scored six points over a one-minute span to knot it up at 17-17, but Johnson hit a 3 for Carolina just before the under-12 media timeout to give the Gamecocks a 20-17 lead.

After a 3 from Williams for the Gamecocks out of a 30-second timeout at the 10:11 mark, the Panthers went on an 8-0 run in less than two minutes to take a 27-23 lead.

Carolina was able to equalize at 31-31 with 4:39 remaining in the half after Johnson split the defense and hit a floater with seconds left on the shot clock after pulling the ball back out with under 10 on the clock

The Gamecocks grabbed a 34-33 lead with 3:10 left after Williams found Shaw in the right corner for his third 3-pointer of the half. Johnson then found sophomore forward Michael Carera in the same spot minutes later to give the Gamecocks a four-point advantage with under two minutes in the half.

FIU was able to take a one-point lead with 27 seconds left, before Tymell Murphy went the length of the court in the final seconds and laid it in at the buzzer to give the Panthers a 42-39 lead at the break. The Panther guard recorded 13 of his game-high 22 points in the first half. Both teams shot well throughout the half, going above their season averages in the ope half with South Carolina shooting 16-31 (51.6 percent) from the floor, while FIU shot 14-25 (56 percent) from the field and hit 11-13 (84.6 percent) from the free throw line. With the two teams trading points throughout the early going in the second half that saw

three lead changes, a pair of free throws by sophomore forward Mindaugas Kacinas tied the game up at 51-51 at the 15-minute mark. Following a missed jumper from Murphy, freshman quard Sindarius Thornwell found an open Shaw on the right side for his fourth 3 of the game.

Thornwell ended a three-minute drought with a jumper at the 5:24 mark, which extended South Carolina's lead to six after both teams turned up the defensive pressure. With just under four minutes remaining, Williams turned Murphy over in the backcourt and took it in for a onehanded dunk to push the lead to 69-61.

After Marco Porcher Jiminez cut South Carolina's lead to four with under two minutes to play, Johnson scored five points over the next minute, going 5-6 from free throw line to push the lead to nine.

The Gamecocks hit eight free throws over the final minute and Thornwell added a dunk with seconds remaining to give South Carolina the 84-72 win. The 84 points was the most scored this season by the Gamecocks.

South Carolina held FIU to just 10-25 (27.3 percent) from the field in the second half after the Panthers shot over 55 percent during the first 20 minutes. The Gamecocks shot 30-59 (50.8 percent) from the field for the game, and hit a season-high 8-19 (42.1 percent) from the beyond on arc.

Along with Henry, Johnson, Shaw and Williams who were in double figures, Kacinas recorded nine points and nine rebounds.

STILLWATER, Okla. - Unable to solve the hot shooting and defensive pressure of No. 9 Oklahoma State (8-1) in the first half, South Carolina (2-3) fell tonight, 79-52, at Gallagher-Iba Arena.

The Gamecocks were led by a strong performance in the second half from freshman guard Jaylen Shaw, who posted 13 points, going 4-5 from the field went 3-4 from 3-point range. Junior Tyrone Johnson chipped in 12 points as well. The combined 25 points though was not enough as the Cowboys' starters, led by Le'Bryan Nash, who had a game-high 16 points. combined for 60 points as all five were in double figures.

Forward Demetrius Henry opened up the game by giving the Gamecocks an early 2-0. Oklahoma State though clamped down on defense after the early bucket holding South Carolina to only one point over the next fiveplus minutes as the Cowboys when on a 16-1 run led by the guards Marcus Smart and Markel Brown.

Oklahoma State took advantage of 13 South Carolina turnovers, scoring 21 points off of them as the team hit 13-26 (50 percent) from the field and were 10-14 (71.4 percent) from the line. The Gamecocks went 4-20 (20 percent) from the field.

Despite the halftime deficit, the Gamecocks continued to battle over the second half. Shaw kick-started a spurt midway through the half as he connected on a 3-pointer and followed that up with a dunk 30 seconds later to cut the lead to 50-28. Johnson followed that up with a lay-in and pair of free throws before Oklahoma State's Brian Williams responded.

With under nine minutes remaining in the game, Shaw was back it from beyond the arc as he hit his second and third 3's of the game just minutes apart, with the second making it 70-44 game.

Throughout the final 20 minutes, Oklahoma State outscored South Carolina by three as the Gamecocks found a better rhythm, shooting 12-25 (48 percent) in the second half after going 4-20 (20 percent) in the opening half. The Cowboys though scored 14 points from the free throw line as they maintained their lead.

Guard Bruce Ellington rejoined the team this week after competing with the football team throughout the season. He saw his first game action, plaving 17 minutes.

COLUMBIA, S.C. - South Carolina was unable to overcome the timely shooting and 34 made free throws from Manhattan tonight as the Gamecocks fell 86-68 to the Jaspers at Colonial Life Arena.

Manhattan's George Beamon scored 26 points on night, while fellow senior Michael Alvarado added 20 points, hitting 10-11 from the free throw line. Freshman guard Sindarius Thornwell led the Gamecocks with 17 points and five rebounds as junior Tyrone Johnson added 12 points.

South Carolina (2-4) opened up the game quick as senior guard Bruce Ellington scored five points in a 20-second span after the Jaspers scored the opening basket. Johnson followed that with lay-in and added a free throw to give the Gamecocks an early 8-2 advantage.

Thornwell cut the deficit to five with a pair from the line at 15:32. The Jaspers responded though with five quick points on a 3-pointer from Alvarado and a pair of free throws from Emmy Andujar.

With under 13 minutes to play, Thornwell squared up and hit an open 3. Alavardo responded though with a two free throws to push Manhattan's lead back to 10.

At the 11:31 mark, Mindaugas Kacinas found Michael Carrera sitting underneath for a lay-in as he was fouled. COLUMBIA, S.C. - Holding a three-point lead at the half, South Carolina was unable to keep up with USC Upstate's shooting from the field in the second half (48.1 percent) as the Gamecocks fell 74-68 today at Colonial Life Arena.

Freshman Sindarius Thornwell led South Carolina with 19 points and seven rebounds, and junior Tyrone Johnson chipped in 11 points, but the Spartan offense was keyed by Ricardo Glenn who had a season-high 22 points and 14 rebounds to go along with three others who scored in double figures for USC Upstate

The Gamecocks (2-5) grabbed an early 4-0 lead after senior guard Bruce Ellington found Johnson cutting to the basket, but the Spartans (6-5) quickly tied the game up, scoring on consecutive possessions before senior forward Torrey Craig the road team a one-point advantage from the line.

Down three, Johnson drove to the basket and forced a foul on the Spartans, but the ball wouldn't drop for the junior. HONOLULU, Hawaii - South Carolina (3-5) opened play at the Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic on Sunday with a 78-71 victory over previously unbeaten Saint Mary's (9-1) behind four Gamecocks scoring in double-figures, including a team high 16 from junior guard Tyrone Johnson and a career high 12 points from sophomore forward Laimonas Chatkevicius

The Gamecocks shot a stellar 58.3 percent (28-48) from the field in the win, including a 4-of-7 (57.1%) mark from 3-point range. The shooting percentage for the Gamecocks was the highest since Carolina hit 57.7 percent (30-52) in a win vs. Arkansas on Jan. 26, 2013. South Carolina held the Gaels to 40.7 percent (22-54) from the floor in the game

South Carolina held a one-point lead after freshman forward Demetrius Henry blocked a shot by SMC's Stephen Holt, and responded with a fast break lay-up at the opposite end, for a 7-6 Gamecock advantage with 14 minutes remaining in the first half.

Carolina played solid defense in the early part of the contest, holding Saint Mary's to just 4-of-17 from the field through the first 11 minutes.

The Gamecocks led 16-8 near the nine-minute mark before the Gaels responded with a quick 6-0 run fueled by a 3, and another 3-point play from Holt. The Gamecocks responded with a 7-0 run of their own behind a 3 and fast break lay-in from Johnson through the sevenminute mark to lead 23-14 with six minutes to play. South Carolina extended its lead to as many as 12 during the opening half, but the Gaels

began to close the gap with a pair of 3s on back-to-back possessions from James Walker III with just over 90 seconds to play in the frame. Freshman guard Sindarius Thornwell hit a jumper during the stretch, but Holt scored his 10th point of the half on a lay-in at the buzzer to put the score at 33-27 Gamecocks at the half.

South Carolina played with stellar energy and stifling defense through the first half. The Gaels hit just 9-of-31 (29.0%) during the opening frame, far below their season average of 48 percent, with the Gamecocks connecting on 12-of-22 (54.5%), led by Johnson's 10 points, in the first half. Henry was big on the boards for Carolina during the opening half, pulling down a season high eight rebounds in just the opening 20 minutes of play.

Saint Mary's scored three quick points out of the break on a lay-in and free throw from junior forward Brad Waldow. The Gamecocks would score on consecutive possessions, a dunk from Chatkevicius and jumper from freshman guard Duane Notice, but Waldow would added two more buckets at the opposite end and the score stood at 37-33 Carolina through the 18-minute mark.

South Carolina would score on the next three possessions, with the Gaels' Jordan Giusti providing a 3 during the stretch. Carolina's lead was 43-37 at the under-16 minute media

The Gaels would answer, as a lay-in from Walker tied the contest at 45 with 12:49 to play. The teams traded baskets through the next possessions and the contest was tied at 50 at the under-12 minute media timeout of the half.

Chatkevicius connected for dunks on consecutive possessions out of the timeout and Caro-lina took a four-point lead at 54-50, 10:36 to play.

Back and forth play continued, but consecutive baskets from Johnson near the nine-minute mark pushed Carolina's lead to 59-54. The score stayed close, before a 3-point play from Notice with just under six on the clock pushed Carolina's lead to 66-60.

Thornwell scored back-to-back lay-ups with the second pushing Carolina's lead to 70-62 with 4:16 to play in the contest. GAME 11 - SOUTH CAROLINA 78. AKRON 45 DEC. 28. 2013/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA, S.C. - Playing for the second time since Christmas, South Carolina (5-6) cruised to a 78-45 win in today's rematch with Akron (6-5) at Colonial Life Arena behind a stellar day from senior guard Brenton Williams who tied a career-high in 3-pointers (6) and field goal attempts (17) as he led all scorers with 24 points.

To go with Williams' 6-9 shooting from beyond the arc, sophomore Michael Carrera chipped in a season-best 13 points as well as seven rebounds. Sophomore Mindaugas Kacinas also tallied double-figures on the afternoon with 11 points. Akron was led by Quincy Diggs who recorded 13 points .

After the Zips grabbed an early 4-0 lead, the Gamecocks quickly erased it from the 3-point line as Sindarius Thornwell and Williams hit back-to-back 3s to open up the game for Carolina.

Williams extend the lead to five just under five minutes into the game, but Akron hit a 7-0 spurt over the next three minutes as Deji Ibitayo collected five of five points during the run that gave the Zips a 14-12 lead.

After reclaiming the lead on a pair of free throws from Kacinas, the sophomore extended the lead to three with a lay-in after a strong drive through the lane from Duane Notice freed him up under the rim. A rebound on a his own missed free throw from Thornwell on the Gamecocks next possession allowed Carolina push the lead to 24-18. Notice collected one of his career-high six assists as he found Williams on the right side for an open 3.

Akron managed to cut the deficit to two with 1:46 remaining, but the strong shooting from Williams continued as the senior hit his third 3-pointer of the half. Williams ended the half with 11 points, hitting a season-high three 3's as the Gamecocks took a 30-24 lead into the half.

South Carolina continued its first-half momentum into the second 20 minutes. After missing on its first two shots of the half, the Gamecocks raced out to a 17-1 run with six different players scoring in the opening eight-plus minutes of the half. The Gamecocks held the Zips to 0-6 from field during the stretch as they pushed the lead to 47-25 with 12:24 remaining in the game.

After Pat Forsythe hit a jumper to end the drought for the Zips, Williams connected on his fourth and fifth 3s of the afternoon on back-to-back possessions to give the Gamecocks a 53-27 lead with 10:49 left.

With just over eight minutes remaining, the Gamecocks went on an 11-0 run starting with Carrera passing his season-high mark with his 13th point of the day. The three-minute stretch also saw Kacinas score four of his 11 points as the Gamecocks took a 69-35 lead.

During the run, Williams tied John Roche's school record for consecutive made free throws at 41. Williams' stretch dates back to Feb. 28, 2013 when he hit the second of two free throws against Missouri. Roche accumlated his streak during the 1970 season in a four game stretch (Wake Forest, Davidson, Duke, at N.C. State) from Feb. 9-18.

The 33-point win for the Gamecocks was keyed by a season-high 20 assists to only seven turnovers. Four days ago, Carolina had 12-10 ratio against Zips in its 10-point win at the Diamond Head Classic.

The Gamecocks had a strong performance defensively on the afternoon as they turned the Zips over 21 times and held them to 13-40 (32.5 percent) from the field. Carolina finished the day shooting 28-63 (44.4 percent), going 8-15 (53.3 percent) from 3.

COLUMBIA, S.C. - After scoring 78 points two days ago, South Carolina (6-6) followed Saturday's performance with its best offensive showing of the season tonight, defeating Marshall (5-8) 92-65 at Colonial Life Arena.

The Gamecocks were led by Tyrone Johnson and Brenton Williams who each scored 18 points on the night. Along with Duane Notice (13) and Demetrius Henry (12), the four combined for 61 of the team's 92 points. Shawn Smith led the Herd with 19 points, while Ryan Taylor chipped in 18.

Williams continued his hot shooting of late from beyond the arc by hitting his first two to give Carolina an early 6-4 lead. After a pair of free throws from Taylor tied-up the game, the Gamecocks went on a an 8-3 run as Henry scored four points for Carolina in the paint on consecutive possessions.

As the Herd cut the deficit to three, Henry was there again to extend the lead, hitting a pair of jumpers to push the Gamecocks lead 20-13 with eight minutes remaining.

With Carolina holding a 24-18 lead, Marshall went on a 11-4 run over a two-plus minute span to take a 29-28 lead with 3:55 remaining in the half, its first since taking 4-3 lead early in the game. The Herd went 6-6 from the line during the stretch.

The Gamecocks regained the lead though on a jumpers from Michael Carrera and Johnson. After trading field goals, and the lead, Carolina finished the half on 6-0 run to end the half and take a 36-31 lead into the break after holding Marshall without a field goal over the final 2:44.

Despite allowing the Herd to convert on only eight field goals in the opening 20 minutes, the visitors went 14-20 (70 percent) from the free throw line as the Gamecocks were whistled for 16 fouls.

South Carolina opened the second half on a 9-3 run to take a 45-34 advantage. Sindarius Thornwell scored the three of the first five points of the half after sitting much of the first half with two fouls

The Herd was able to get the deficit back down to seven with less than 16 minutes to play after a Taylor scored on put back. The Gamecocks quickly countered though as Williams found Notice open in the left corner for a 3. The triple ignited a 14-1 Carolina run over the next three minutes. The freshman ended the night two points off his career-high, but tied his high in assists with six and set a new high in . rebounds with six.

With 9:15 remaining, Williams drove to basket and scored a lay-up after being fouled. The senior went to the line and converted on the three-point play and passed John Roche's school record for consecutive free throws made in the process with his 42nd in a row. Williams' streak dates back to Feb. 28, 2013 versus when he hit the second of two free throws versus Missouri.

On Marshall's following possession, Williams turned over Smith and took it the other way to give the Gamecocks a 71-48 lead after a quick 8-2 run with 8:39 remaining.

Holding an 18-point lead with under seven minutes left. Johnson scored sixstraight points to extend to the Gamecocks lead to 80-57. The junior finished the night by totaling 18 points for the third time this season.

Carolina closed out the game out-scoring the Herd 12-8, to finished off the 92-65 win

For only the second time this season, South Carolina hit over 55 percent from the field, going 34-66 (56.8 percent), while the defense held Marshall to 37.8 percent (17-45) The shooting helped Carolina negate a 12-point advantage for the Herd on the free throw line as the visitors hit 30-46 (65.2 percent) from the stripe compared to the Gamecocks who were 18-25 (72 percent). Carolina held a decided advantage on the boards at 45-27

COLUMBIA, S.C. - After a furious second-half rally from the visitors. South Carolina (7-6) grinded out an 82-75 win tonight over South Carolina State (4-9) at Colonial Life Arena as the Gamecocks shot 50 percent from the field for the second straight game. Four Gamecocks ended the night in double figures as senior Brenton Williams led all scorers with 19 points on an efficient 6-7 from the field and 2-3 from 3-point range. Freshman Demetrius Henry recorded his first career double-double with 10 points and a career-high 11 rebounds. Senior forward Matthew Hezekiah led the Bulldogs with 18 points and five rebounds, while fellow senior Theron Stephens added 15 points.

Carolina opened the game on a 5-0 run after a jumper from Williams and three points from Duane Notice. The Bulldoos were able to pull within two at 6-4 after a Devin Joint tipped in a missed jumper from Hezekiah, but Notice responded for the Gamecocks with his sixth point in the first four minutes.

Palmer answered for SC State with a 3 of his own, but Williams connected from 3 on the other end for the Gamecocks as they took a 12-7 lead. That 3-pointer started a 9-1 run for home team that Williams capped off 43rd and 44th consecutive made free throws as he pushed South Carolina's lead to 18-8 with just over 12 minutes to play. Following Johnson's first 3 of the game just under two minutes later, Laimonas Chatkevicius began to impose himself inside as he scored on three-straight possessions as Notice earned three of his career-high eight assists during the stretch.

With 1:31 left in the half, a quick 5-0 run after a jumper from Notice and Williams' second three of the game, the Gamecocks held their largest lead of the half of 15.

The Bulldogs though turned up the pressure on the final possession after getting two points back. Darrion Eastmon picked off a pass attempt from Notice in the backcourt and dished it to Darryl Palmer for the lay-up on the break. South Carolina held a 44-33 lead at the break after shooting 15-29 (51.7 percent)

from the field and going 6-12 from behind the arc.

SC State continued its late first-half run into the second as Stephens hit back-to back 3s in the first minute and a half to cut the deficit to 44-39. After a pair of free throws from Sindarius Thornwell three minutes in the Bulldoos went on a 6-0 run. punctuated by Joint dunking a missed shot to cut to the game to two at 50-48 with 15:23 on the clock.

Despite seeing the game cut to one a minute later, the Gamecocks were able to maintain the lead until the Bulldogs came up with another 6-0 run to tie-up the game at 60-60 with 7:02 to play. On the ensuing possession though, Notice found Thornwell open on the right side where he drained his lone 3-pointer on the night.

With SC State trying to get momentum back with the score at 70-65 with under four minutes remaining, Johnson found an opening in the lane and split two defenders as he drove to the basket for a left-handed lav-in as he was fouled. The junior converted the free throw to push the lead to eight. He finished the night with 17 points. The Gamecocks sealed their fourth-straight win as they hit 9-12 from the free throw

line during the final minutes. South Carolina went 25-50 (50 percent) from the field and 7-15 (46.7 percent) from

the 3-point line, while SC State shot 29-65 (44.6 percent) from the field and 5-20 (25 percent) from 3.

GAINESVILLE, Fla. - South Carolina (7-7, 0-1) had to weather a tough start in tonight's SEC opener at No. 10/11 Florida (12-2, 1-0) to keep the game close, but an 11-0 run midway through second half propelled the Gators past the Gamecocks, 74-58, at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

Florida guard Scottie Wilbekin led all scorers with 17 points including, 3-6 shooting from beyond the arc, and senior center Patric Young added 13 points and seven rebounds. Junior guard Tyrone Johnson led the South Carolina with 12 points, six rebounds and two assists.

The Gamecocks struggled offensively to get in sync from the tip against a suffocating Gator defense. Florida turned South Carolina over seven times in their first 10 possessions and forced six missed field goal attempts as the home team built a 14-1 lead in just over seven minutes as the Gamecocks leadingscorer Brenton Williams was sent to the bench with two fouls four minutes into the game.

After getting a fouled on a 3-point attempt Duane Notice was sent to the free throw line where he hit two-of-three. The freshman point guard tried to force the issue a minute later, getting forward Will Yeguette his second foul of the night.

Young stretched the lead to 16-4, before the Gamecocks registered its first basket as it came on a jumper from the corner from Mindaugas Kacinas with 10:35 on the clock

Despite giving up its first basket, Florida was able to extend its lead up 18, the second time at 32-14 with just over four minutes left in the half. The Gamecocks, though, would not fade away. Right after Williams came up with a steal and took it the other way for two, Notice found Sindarius Thornwell open on the left side for a 3-pointer on the following possession as the Carolina ended the half on a 7-2 run.

Williams though, went back to the bench with just under two minutes remaining after being called for his third foul.

After starting the game 0-7, the Gamecocks climbed back into it, going 6-12 the rest of the half. The quick start from Gators though was too much as they held a 32-21 lead at the half, getting 18 points from Casey Prather (10) and Wilbekin (8).

The Gamecocks were able to keep the deficit close to 10 points throughout the early going in the second half, getting it down to eight with 13:55 remaining, but Wilbekin's second 3-pointer of the half ignited a 9-2 run for the home team that forced Carolina to call a timeout.

The Gamecocks countered with five straight points after a 3-pointer from the corner by Williams, though, cutting the Gators lead to 10. Florida responded with a three of its own from freshman guard Michael Frazier. Young then turned over Kacinas in the backcourt and took it the other way for a layup.

Just over a minute later, Wilbekin pushed the lead to 18 at 60-42 with a 3, just before Frazier followed that up with his second 3 of the night with just under seven minutes left.

The Gators shot 57.8 percent from the field on the night, hitting 14-20 (70 percent) in the second half compared to Carolina, which finished the game 18-41 (43.9 percent). After holding a decisive rebounding edge at the half, the Gamecocks ended the night with only a 28-25 edge on the glass.

COLLEGE STATION. Texas. - South Carolina (7-9, 0-3 SEC) suffered a 75-67 loss at Texas A&M (12-4, 3-0 SEC) on Wednesday evening in Southeastern Conference play. The Gamecocks led by as many as 11 in the opening half, but the Aggies out-scored Carolina 37-28 in the second half en route to the victory. Junior guard Tyrone Johnson suffered a right foot injury near the end of the first half and did not play the remainder of the game. An update on his injury will be released on Thursday after further evaluated ation in Columbia.

Foul trouble once again plaqued Carolina, with several players' minutes limited due to fouls, especially early in the second half. Senior guard Brenton Williams led the team with 14 points, his eighth-straight double-digit scoring game, while freshman guard Duane Notice added 12 points and five assists. Rookie forward Desmond Ringer set a season high with nine points, and matched a season best with seven rebounds, a team high.

Junior forward Jamal Jones led three Aggies in double figures with 22 points, including a 9-of-12 showing from the free throw line. Texas A&M attempted 41 free throws in the contest, compared to just 22 at the line for Carolina.

The Aggies scored the first basket of the ball game, but the Gamecocks responded with a 10-0 run to lead by eight at the first media timeout of the contest.

Williams added two at the free throw line and sophomore forward Michael Carrera scored his first basket of the game at the 14:39 mark, but A&M climbed to within seven to put the score at 14-7 Carolina with just under 12 minutes to play in the half.

The Gamecocks continued to play aggressive on the offensive end at the midway point Ringer pulled down an offensive rebound and found Carrera for a wide open 3 from the perimeter. Ringer added a lay-in on the next possession, and the Gamecocks' lead stood at 23-16 with 8:52 showing in the half.

The Aggies would put together a 6-2 run over the course of the next minute and a half and the Carolina lead was just three at 25-22 at the under-eight minute media timeout. Despite lav-ups from sophomore forward Laimonas Chatkevicius on consecutive possessions, a tip-in from A&M's Davonte Fitzgerald gave the Aggies a 32-31 upperhand with 4:20 remaining in the opening 20 minutes of play. The teams traded baskets the remainder of the half. A tip-in from Chatkevicius and a

pair of free throws from A&M's Shawn Smith saw the Gamecocks lead by one at the break, 39-38. With near a minute to play, Johnson was assisted off the court by the Gamecock athletic training staff, suffering a right foot injury after an awkward step on his

foot. He did not return the remainder of the game. The story of the opening half was a 20-10 rebound advantage for the Gamecocks, while Carolina also held a 20-14 upperhand in points in the paint.

The Gamecocks found themselves in foul trouble early in the second half with No tice, Carrera and sophomore forward Mindaugas Kacinas on the bench with three fouls apiece and freshman quard Sindarius Thornwell with four shortly into the half. A 3 from freshman guard Justin McKie pushed the Gamecocks lead to 50-43 with 15:37 to play.

The Aggies pulled to within two at 53-51 on two free throws from freshman guard Shawn Smith but Carolina held its lead, and Ringer scored his season high ninth point of the contest with 8:02 remaining to push the Carolina lead to 57-54.

South Carolina led the entire second half until two free throws from Jones gave Texas A&M a 58-57 advantage. Smith would hit a 3 from the corner at the shot clock buzzer just moments later, and the Gamecocks called a timeout with 5:51 to play. The Aggies led by five when Williams hit a long 3 after an offensive rebound and assist

from Ringer to keep the score within two at 64-62 Aggies with just over four minutes to play.

The teams matched free throws out of the final media timeout of the contest, but the Aggie lead stood at 73-65 with one minute to play after a layup from junior guard Jordan Green.

Williams hit two from the line with 34 seconds remaining, but Texas A&M held on for the 75-67 victory.

COLUMBIA, S.C. - Freshman forward Sindarius Thornwell's first career double-double wasn't enough as South Carolina (7-10, 0-4 SEC) fell 75-74 to Ole Miss (12-5, 3-1 SEC) this evening at Colonial Life Arena in front of its largest crowd of the season at 14,302. Thornwell led the Gamecocks with 24 points and a season high 11 rebounds, but he was unable to hit a tough off-balance shot from the top of the key with 1.8 seconds left.

Thornwell ead all scores, going 7-of-16 from the field and 4-of-7 from beyond on the arc. Anthony Perez led the Rebels with 22 points, while Marshall Henderson and Jarvis Summers each had 19. Ole Miss opened up the game on a 12-4 run triggered by 3's from Henderson and Perez. Just over four minutes into the game, point guard Duane Notice was whistled for his second foul sending him to the bench. Two minutes later a dunk from Aaron Jones off of an inbound pass forced the

South Carolina began chipping away through Jaylen Shaw as the freshman hit a 3-pointer with 13.26 on the clock before converting a pair from the foul line 30 seconds later.

Trailing 16-9, Shaw drained his second 3 of the half at the 10:29 mark to bring the Gamecocks

Just under two minutes later, Michael Carrera turned over Summers and took it the length of the court for a lavup to pull the Gamecocks within one. Fouled on the play, the sophomore converted gave Carolina its first lead with a pair from the free throw line 30 seconds later.

Carrera continued to be the catalyst for the home team during the early part of the run as he

pushed the lead to four as Thornwell found him on the back door. Thornwell then extended the Gamecocks lead to 27-21 with a 3 from the right side. The guard added two more of his game-high 24 points with just over two minutes remaining in the half to give Carolina an eight-point lead. After two more from Mindaugas Kacinas, the Gamecocks took their largest lead of the half at 12, 37-25, after Desmond Ringer hit a pair from the foul line with 1-27 left. Perez added two in the final minute for the Rebels, but Carolina took a 37-27 lead into the half at

the team turned 11 Ole Miss turnovers into 16 points. Despite two early free throws from Thornwell to open the second half, the Rebels 15-2 spurt as Henderson scored seven straight points during the run after only scoring three in the first half

After giving up the lead for the first time since the 8:06 mark in the first half, Thornwell re with back-to-back 3-pointers to hold the Gamecocks lead at 47-45. Henderson though, quickly

responded with a 3 of his own to grab the Rebels the lead back. Down three at 54-51, Thornwell leveled the game with his season-high fourth 3-pointer of the game with 11:26 on the clock, but South Carolina was unable to regain the lead until the 6:04 mark. Thorwell was sent to the line after pulling down an offensive rebound a missed free throw. The freshmen hit of 2 from the line to give the Gamecocks a 62-61 lead. Notice extended the lead to three on the ensuing possession with a floater in the lane for his

first points of the afternoon. The freshman point guard pushed the lead to five with four and half remaining, but the Rebels scored five straight points to tie the game up at 68-68 with 2:56 to play. With 2:04 left, Summers drove hard through lane and kicked the ball out to Perez in the left corner where the forward hit his second 3 of the game. Brenton Williams attempted to match Perez at the other end, but his shot was off the mark. Summers then converted two from the foul line to push the Rebels lead to 73-68.

Ole Miss though was only able to hit 2-of-6 free throws in the final minutes as the Gamecocks closed the gap at the foul line. After Thomsell converted two attempts, Williams was fouled on a 3-point attempt with six seconds remaining. The senior calmly sank all three free throws to bring Carolina within one.

The Rebels were unable to get a clean inbound pass off and Williams grabbed the errant pass in the backcourt. Out of a timeout with 1.8 seconds left, Thornwell received the pass at the top of the key, but the pressure on the ball forced an off-balance shot that was wide of the mark.

Laimonas Chatkevicius recorded 12 points, while Shaw and Williams each scored nine on the day for the Gamecocks, with Williams going 9-of-9 from the charity stripe. Carerra chipped in eight points and six rebounds.

ATHENS, Ga. - South Carolina (7-11, 0-5 SEC) suffered a 97-76 loss on the road in SEC play at Georgia (10-7, 4-1 SEC) on Wednesday night. Freshman guard Sindarius Thormwell scored a season high 26 points to lead four Gamecocks in double figures in the context.

Thornwell netted his fourth 20-point game of the season, and surpassed his previous season high of 25 points from earlier this month versus LSU. Thornwell hit 8-of-12 attempts from the floor and was 9-of-12 from the free throw line. He also collected four rebounds and dished four of Carolina's eight assists in the game.

Senior guard Brenton Williams responded after a tough outing versus Ole Miss last Saturday, posting 18 points on 6-of-11 shooting from the field and four 3s. Freshman guards Duane Notice and Jaylen Shaw added 14 and 12 points, respectively, in the game. Georgia was led by junior forward Nemanja Djurisic with 22 points, while Kenny Gaines added 14 and Brandon Morris 13. The Bulldogs posted 10 3s in the game, and hit 33of-50 from the foul line. Ajumper from Thornwell gave the Gamecocks a 6-4 lead with 17:31 remaining in the first

A jumper from Thornwell gave the Gamecocks a 6-4 lead with 17:31 remaining in the first half, but nine-straight points from Djurisic followed by back-to-back Bulldog 3s saw the home team hold a 17-8 upperhand four minutes later.

Notice broke the streak with a jumper in the lane, and Shaw hit a 3 with 12:22 on the clock to pull Carolina within six at 19-13.

Georgia held on to a double-digit lead until a floater from Notice near the eight-minute mark brought the Gamecocks within nine at 30-21.

Foul trouble plagued the Gamecocks, with sophomore forward Mindaugas Kacinas and freshman forward Desmond Ringer both with 3 and forced to sit on the bench much of the half. The Bulldog lead stood at 13 at the under-four minute media timeout with 3:51 to play before the break.

South Carolina missed four from the free throw line down the stretch, and UGA led by as many as 15, but sophomore forward Laimonas Chatkevicius pulled down threeconsecutive defensive rebounds, and Notice and Williams added lay-ins and the Georgia lead was just nine at the break, 45-34.

The Bulldogs scored six 3-pointers in the opening half and out-rebounded the Gamecocks by seven at 21-14. Notice led Carolina with 13 points in the stanza, hitting 4-of-5 from the field. The teams combined for 30 fouls in the set.

Georgia's Charles Mann was called for a flagrant foul just 30 seconds into the second half, sending Notice to the line for two attempts. He hit one from the line and Mann and Williams traded 3-pointers moments later to put the score at 48-38 UGA with 18 to play. Consecutive turnovers from the Gamecocks saw the Georgia lead push to 22 at 64-42 with just over 14 minutes on the clock.

Chattlevicius fouled out with 12 minutes to play, and freshman forward Demetrius Henry and sophomore forward Michael Carrera were both on the bench with 3 each. Thornwell scored on consecutive possessions midway through the half, but the Bulldog

lead hovered near 20 points through the next several minutes of play. Sophomore forward Brian Steele hit a 3 and earned a steal at the opposite end on the ensuing UGA possession near the four-minute mark. Freshman guard Jaylen Shaw gave the Gamecocks another 3 at the top of the key and the score stood at 87-70 Georgia with 3:33 to play.

Thornwell hit a season high with 26 points on two lay-ups with 90 seconds to play, but Georgia posted the 97-76 victory. South Carolina finished the contest hitting 45.8 percent (22-48) from the field, compared


