CAROLINA QUICK HITS

- South Carolina is in its 104th season of basketball.
- The Gamecocks are led by fourth-year head coach Darrin Horn.
- South Carolina concluded play in the Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational with a 63-60 loss to Southern California last Saturday. Sophomore forward Damontre Harris led the Gamecocks with a career high 15 points in the contest.
- Sophomore forward RJ Slawson had a career night against top-ranked North Carolina last Friday, posting career highs with 13 points, 14 rebounds and four blocks. It was the most rebounds in a game for South Carolina since Sam Muldrow collected 14 vs. Vanderbilt on Jan. 8, 2011.

 Three Gamecocks registered season highs competing in Las Vegas. Slawson's career high 13 points vs. UNC, sophomore guard Brian Richardson's season high 12 points vs. Southern Cal, and sophomore forward Damontre Harris' career high 15 points against the Trojans.
- Sophomore point guard Bruce Ellington made his return to the practice court with the Gamecock hoops team on Monday. Ellington is also a member of the Gamecock football team. To date, Ellington has scored two touchdowns this season, including a 49-yard reception for a score vs. Clemson last Saturday.
- Not including the loss to then-No. 1 North Carolina, the Gamecocks' other three losses have come by a combined nine points
- In games it has won this season, South Carolina holds a +14.5 scoring margin over its opponents. To compare, in games in has lost, Gamecock opponents score 8.5 more points per game. R-senior forward Malik Cooke leads the Gamecocks in scoring in both games won and lost, posting 14.0 and 10.3 points per outing, respectively.
- South Carolina's game vs. Southern Cal last Saturday marked its fourth in a seven-day stretch. The Gamecocks will now play just three games over the course of the next 13 days (Providence, at Clemson, vs. Presbyterian) due to final exams
- South Carolina is 278-265 (.511) all-time in the month of December. South Carolina earned a 4-2 mark last season during the month.
- The Gamecocks own a 54-69 (.439) all-time record against current schools in the Big East. Carolina's last victory over a school from the conference came in a 69-66 win over South Florida on Nov. 20 competing at the Charleston Classic. Carolina's last loss to an opponent from the league came in a 58-51 loss to Pittsburgh on Dec. 28, 2005.
- South Carolina travels to face intrastate rival Clemson on Sunday. The contest will mark the fourth away from Colonial Life Arena for the Gamecocks this season. South Carolina won last season's matchup between the two schools, 64-60, in Columbia behind 14 points from Bruce Ellington.

INTERVIEW POLICIES

All interview requests must be made in advance to SID Emily Feeney in the South Carolina Media Relations Office. Beginning with the start of practice in October, Feeney will release a weekly coach and player availability schedule to media no later than 9 a.m. each Monday morning during the season.

BY THE NUMBERS

11.0 - Sophomore forward RJ Slawson and senior forward Malik Cooke both tallied 11.0 points per game in two neutral site contests last week, vs. No. 1 North Carolina and Southern Cal.

56.3% - Slawson hit 56.3%, 9-of-16, from the floor in Las Vegas last weekend. He had a career night vs. top-ranked North Carolina. He hit career highs with 13 points, 14 rebounds and four blocks. His 8.5 rebounds per game during the stretch were also a team high.

- **12.0** Sophomore guard Brian Richardson produced his best game of the season vs. Southern Cal, hitting 4-of-7 attempts from 3-point range.
- **15.0** Sophomore forward Damontre Harris had a dominating performance against Southern Cal. Harris put together his top offensive performance of his career in the Garnet and Black, connecting on 7-of-11 shot attempts, while also hitting his lone attempt from the charity stripe for a career high 15 points. His previous career high was 11 points, which he tallied vs. Ole Miss last February.
- **52.4%** South Carolina shot a season high 52.4% from the floor, including a season high 47.1% from 3-point range vs. Southern Cal.

BIG EAST/SEC CHALLENGE

Carolina's contest vs. Providence marks the second time that the Gamecocks will compete in the Big East/SEC Challenge. South Carolina earned a 68-67 victory over Providence in Philadelphia during the 2007-08 campaign in its only other appearance in the event. Thursday's game also marks the second appearance for the Friars in the Challenge.

PROVIDENCE SERIES

Providence holds a 4-3 upperhand in the all-time series with the Gamecocks, however South Carolina has won two straight entering Thursday's matchup. Prior to the 2007 meeting, Carolina also earned a 67-48 home win on Dec. 3, 2001. Every game of the series has been played in the month of December. The complete series is below:

TREND SETTING

Gamecock trends under Darrin Horn ...

- South Carolina is 20-9 when collecting at least 10 steals in a contest.
- South Carolina collected 11 steals in its season-opening win over Western Carolina. The Gamecocks used solid half-court defense to collect seven steals over MVSU on Nov. 22
- The Gamecocks are 21-12 when blocking at least seven shots in a game.
- The Gamecocks average 5.3 blocks per game this season; Carolina blocked a season high seven shots vs. Tennessee State, Mississippi Valley State and UNC.
- South Carolina is 39-14 when holding its opponents under 45% shooting from the field.
- South Carolina has held its opponents under 45% shooting from the field in four of six contests thus far in 2011-12.
- Carolina is 29-9 when out-rebounding its opponent.
- The Gamecocks have out-rebounded five of six opponents this season, including a 43-35 mark vs. UNC. Only Southern Cal collected more rebounds than the Gamecocks, winning the battle of the boards by a 28-18 margin.

SEASON NOTABLES

- Behind freshman forward Anthony Gill's 14-point performance, the Gamecocks earned a 69-59 victory over D-II powerhouse Kentucky Wesleyan in the lone exhibition of the season on Nov. 3. Senior forward Malik Cooke chipped in 11 points and sophomore forward RJ Slawson added 10, while collecting a team-best nine rebounds.
- South Carolina earned a 75-50 victory over Western Carolina in the season opener on Nov. 11. Freshman forward Anthony Gill paced Carolina with 14 points, while sophomore guard Brenton Williams impressed, scoring 13 points on 5-of-8 shooting from the floor, while collecting five steals.
- 36 South Carolina first-year players (Gill, Leonard, Williams, Geathers) accounted for 36 points vs. Western Carolina on Nov. 11. Gill paced the group with 14 points.
- Carolina's 12 3-point field goal attempts versus Western Carolina rank as the second-fewest in the Darrin Horn era. The Gamecocks have attempted just 12 on six occassions, with the previous time in a 74-61 win over Delaware State on Dec. 1, 2010. Under Horn, the fewest attempts by Carolina in a game is 10, which has happened three times.
- South Carolina sophomore guard Eric Smith tallied a career high 18 points in just 18 minutes vs. Tennessee State on Nov. 20. The Mullins, S.C., native hit 6-of-10 from the floor, including a stellar 5-of-7 from 3-point range. Smith's previous career high was nine points.
- Senior forward Malik Cooke paced the Gamecocks with 18 points against Mississippi Valley State on Nov. 22, including a stellar 10-of-12 mark from the free throw line. Both his free throws made and attempted were career highs for the Charlotte, N.C., native.

Darrin Horn is in his fourth season in Columbia with a career record of 163-94, including a 52-46 mark at South Carolina. Darrin Horn-led teams are 78-48 all-time in league play. Horn led Carolina to a 10-6 record in SEC action during his first year in Columbia, a 6-10 mark in his second and one of the youngest teams in the nation to a 5-11 mark in 2011. Horn led Carolina to one of the most celebrated seasons of its 19-year participation in the SEC during the 2009 campaign, as the squad captured the 2009 SEC Eastern Division Co-Championship and won double-digit league games for the first time since the 1998 campaign. His 2010 squad earned upset wins over No. 1 Kentucky and No. 13/19 Vanderbilt.

INJURY UPDATE

South Carolina sophomore guard Brenton Williams suffered a left knee sprain early in the first half vs. Tennessee State last Sunday. Williams will miss 2-4 weeks from the time of the injury.

NON-CONFERENCE SCHEDULE

Contests against at least five teams that competed in the 2011 NCAA Tournament highlight the 2011-12 South Carolina men's basketball non-conference schedule. South Carolina will host 11 non-conference contests at Colonial Life Arena, including one exhibition, the first two rounds of the Las Vegas Invitational, Providence in the Big East/SEC Challenge and Big Ten powerhouse Ohio State. The Gamecocks will face at least six teams that compiled 18 or more wins last season, including North Carolina, Southern California or UNLV, Clemson, Ohio State and Wofford, which all advanced to the NCAA Tournament. South Carolina is slated to face five BCS schools during the coming non-conference portion of the schedule.

2012 SEC TOURNAMENT

The 2012 SEC Tournament returns to New Orleans, La., next spring, marking the third time the city has hosted the event. It will be the first time the tournament will be held at the New Orleans Arena. The SEC Basketball Tournament semifinals and championship game will be televised nationally on ABC, while the first two rounds of the event will be televised on the SEC Network.

SEC DIVISIONAL PLAY

Starting with the 2011-12 season, this year marks the first time there will not be an East/ West Division champion since the conference split into two divisions in 1992. The regular season standings will be listed from one through 12. This season the schedule will still reflect the divisions of years past, as South Carolina will still play the five schools who were also in the East - Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Tennessee and Vanderbilt - twice, while playing the former West schools - Alabama, Arkansas, Auburn, LSU, Ole Miss and Mississippi State - once during the regular season.





GAME 1 - SOUTH CAROLINA, 75, WESTERN CAROLINA 50 **COLUMBIA, S.C. - NOV. 11, 2011**

COLUMBIA, S.C. - Freshman Anthony Gill and sophomore Brenton Williams scored 14 and 13 points, respectively, to lead the South Carolina men's basketball team to a season-opening 75-50 victory over Western Carolina on Friday night at Colonial Life Arena.

Gill was 6-of-7 from the floor, including 1-for-1 from 3-point range, while Williams was 5-for-8 on the night. Williams also led a solid defensive effort, collecting five of the Gamecocks' 11 steals. Senior Malik Cooke added 10 points and seven rebounds, and junior Lakeem Jackson filled the stat sheet with five points, five assists. 10 rebounds and three steals.

With the win, the Gamecocks (1-0) claim their 11th straight season opener, including a 4-0 mark under head coach Darrin Horn

South Carolina dominated nearly every statistical category as it shot 50.8 percent from the floor (30-of-59) and held the Catamounts to 36.2 percent shooting (17-of-47). The Gamecocks also held a decisive advantage in points in the paint (46-18), second chance points (20-9), bench points (38-16) and points off turnovers (22-15) and they controlled the boards with a 37-29 edge, including 18 offensive boards.

The Gamecocks used their defensive pressure to break an 8-8 tie early on with an 8-0 run, including six straight points off turnovers. Williams made a transition layup off a steal by Brian Richardson to cap the run and give South Carolina a 16-8 lead at the 10:40 mark.

Western Carolina (0-1) scrapped back with back-to-back 3-pointers and a dunk by Brandon Boggs to knot the game at 16-16, but South Carolina scored the next nine points to build a lead it would not relinquish. Williams gave the Gamecocks their biggest lead of the half at 33-22 by converting a layup off a steal by Jackson, one of five South Carolina had in the half. Williams, who paced the Gamecocks with 11 points in the half, sank a pair of free throws with less than a minute remaining to give South Carolina a 35-25 advantage heading into the locker room.

The Gamecocks outscored Western Carolina 40-25 in the second half as they held the Catamounts to just 32 percent shooting. Gill drained a 3-pointer at the 17:00 mark to give South Carolina a 43-29 lead. After Boggs knocked down a jumper to trim the Gamecocks' lead to 43-33 with 15:06 remaining, South Carolina outscored Western Carolina 26-10 over the next 10 minutes to pull away for the win.

Sophomore Eric Smith chipped in a career-high nine points and four assists for the Gamecocks

Trey Sumler and Harouna Mutombo netted 11 points apiece to lead Western Carolina.

COLUMBIA, S.C. - The South Carolina Gamecocks (1-2) suffered a 64-63 defeat against Tennessee State (2-2) on Sunday night at Colonial Life Arena competing in the Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational. Sophomore guard Eric Smith led the Gamecocks with 18 points, doubling a career high.

Tennessee State started a run as the game passed the 10-minute mark and held a 15-9 lead with just over eight minutes left in the opening half. Carolina gained new life 30 seconds later after senior Malik Cooke poked the ball free from a Tiger guard and Lakeem Jackson collected the loose ball to take it down the floor and slam home a two-handed dunk.

Tennessee State's Robert Covington would hit a 3 at the other end, but Cooke would follow with a free throw and Damien Leonard hit a 3 from the corner to pull the Gamecocks to within three points of the Tigers with 5:31 left in the stanza. COLUMBIA, S.C. - The South Carolina Gamecocks (2-2) rallied for a 61-57 victory over Mississippi Valley State (0-4) on Tuesday night at Colonial Life Arena competing in the second game of the Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational. Senior forward Malik Cooke led the Gamecocks with 18 points, and freshman guard Damien Leonard scored a career-high 16 points for the Gamecocks. Freshman forward Anthony Gill corralled a game-leading seven rebounds, and redshirt freshman Carlton Geathers blocked a career high three shots.

Joyner drew sophomore forward Damontre Harris' third foul and converted a three-point play that gave the Delta Devils a 31-30 lead, their first lead of the game since the opening basket.

South Carolina, who had begun to chip away at the MVSU lead since the 6:36 mark in the second half, then began a feverish comeback that was ignited by the Gamecocks defenses. Sophomore forward R.J. Slawson stole the heall at midcourt due to the South Carolina press. Sophomore guard Eric Smith drained at three-pointer, which was assisted by Slawson on a crosscourt pass, to cut the lead to five at 48-53 with 3:19 remaining. South Carolina continued to apply the press and forced another turnover, which resulted in two Leonard free throws to bring the Gamecocks to within three. A third consecutive steal, this time on an inbounds pass created a Leonard fast break layup to cut the MVSU lead to one at 52-53.

Gill drew a charge on Crosby to give the Gamecocks a chance to take the lead. Slawson drained a jumper with just 2:00 minutes remaining to take the lead at 54-53. Cooke put back a Slawson miss to extend the Gamecocks' lead to three. Cooke collected a loose ball and hit two free throws to make the score 58-53 with 55.7 to go in the game.

The Delta Devils cut the Gamecocks' lead to one at a score of 58-57 on shots by Cox and freshman guard Brent Arrington with just 24 seconds remaining, but Cooke extended the Gamecock lead to 61-57 on two trips to the line.

The teams would trade baskets through the middle of the half, with neither team holding more than a five-point advantage. A 3 by Cooke with 8:39 remaining gave the Gamecocks a 48-44 edge, but Jones would bury three 3s over the next five minutes to give Southern California a 58-53 lead with 3:09 remaining

The score stayed close during the final minutes of play. The Gamecocks found themselves down three with 43 seconds to go, but another clutch jumper by Cooke would pull Carolina within one at 60-61 with 33 seconds remaining.

A Gamecock foul would give Jones a one-and-one opportunity with 25 seconds to go. Jones scored both at the line and the Gamecocks were unable to connect on a 3 late in the set, as Southern California won 63-60.






