## POSTSEASON SCENARIOS

Should South Carolina win, they are guaranteed a spot in the SEC Tournament in Orange Beach, Ala., next week. If the Gamecocks tie, then it will need wins by Auburn (against Alabama) and Tennessee (vs. Georgia) plus no more than a six-goal swing in differential if Vanderbilt beats Kentucky to maintain the tiebreaker advantage over the Commodores. A South Carolina loss plus a win by Alabama, Georgia or Vanderbilt pushes the Gamecocks out of the SEC Tournament picture. South Carolina owns the first tiebreaker, head-to-head, with wins over both Alabama and Georgia, and has a seven-goal advantage in differential with Vanderbilt (-5 to -12)

## SCOUTING FLORIDA

Florida brings a 13-4-1 (10-2-0 SEC) record to Columbia for Thursday's match up. The Gators are coming off weekend road trip where they fell in Friday's match 1-0 to Alabama and bounced back to defeat Vanderbilt 4-0 on Sunday. Four different Gators scored the four second half goals in the victory. Despite missing three games this season, Erika Tymrak leads the team with 16 points (5g, 6a). Senior defender Jo Dragotta and senior midfielder McKenzie Barney share the team lead with six goals apiece. In the net, sophomore Taylor Burke has started every game of the year talling four shutouts and carrying a 1.02 goals against average. A Florida win clinches an SEC title for the Gators.

## GAMECOCK BACKLINE LIMITING OPPONENT'S CHANCES

South Carolina has needed to use a rotating group of players on the backline this season due to injuries throughout the lineup, but in typical Shelley Smith fashion, the squad has been strong in limiting opportunities. During a five-game stretch in conference play, the Gamecocks limited Vanderbilt, Georgia, Tennessee, LSU and Ole Miss to only 17 shots on goal in 470 minutes of action. Vanderbilt only had one shot on frame in the match, Tennessee had four, Georgia had five, LSU only tallied two and Ole Miss registered five. In South Carolina's last match (Oct. 21 vs. Alabama), the Crimson Tide only tallied three shots on frame.

## OVERTIME GAMECOCKS

Six of South Carolina's 16 matches so far this season have gone to overtime, and the Gamecocks are 0-2-4 in those fixtures. The team has tied the program record of six overtime matches set in 2004, 2006, 2007 and 2008 after a 1-1 draw at Vanderbilt last Sunday. Two of Carolina's four losses this season have come in extra time (Minnesota 2-1, Clemson 1-0) while the Gamecocks have yet to notch a golden goal, something that was not a problem in 2011 when South Carolina went 3-1-0 in overtime matches.

## CAROLINA VS THE SEC

South Carolina historically has enjoyed greater success against SEC West foes than SEC East foes by the surprising note that the Gamecocks hold the series advantage against all six SEC West schools (not including newly added Texas A&M) but does not have the advantage against any of the SEC East schools. The Gamecocks are 52-23-15 (.661) all-time vs the West with series' against Alabama (11-4-0), Arkansas (9-3-2), Auburn (7-6-3), LSU (9-2-5), Ole Miss (8-4-2) and Mississippi State (7-4-3). In contrast, South Carolina is 22-69-11 (.269) vs SEC East schools.

**GILBERT'S REMAINS FLEXIBLE**

Junior **Gabrielle Gilbert** has been the version of a utility player for South Carolina, starting matches at defender, midfield and forward in her career. The Canadian began her career on the backline, starting her first career match at right back, but earned the starting right wing spot the first eight matches of the 2012 season. With injuries forcing a change in philosophy, Gilbert has once again moved to the backline where she has started three matches at right back before moving to the midfield three weeks ago at Vanderbilt. Gilbert currently has contributed two goals and three assists, second-most on the team.

**AU HITS THE BOARD**

Junior **Danielle Au** endured nine matches this season before hitting her first goal of the year in the 70th minute at Arkansas. South Carolina's leading returning scorer from last season, Au has been plugged as the striker and attacking center mid for the Gamecocks this year and has now scored three goals in five matches after a two-goal outing at Auburn.

**GILBERT ON TV**

Junior **Gabrielle Gilbert** has proven to be fond of playing on TV with six of her career 15 points coming in televised matches. Gilbert scored a header in the 13th minute at Vanderbilt in a match that was televised by CSS and ESPN3.com. Coincidentally, the last time South Carolina played on CSS, Gilbert hit the game-winning goal via a header from a corner kick.

**YOUTH IN REVOLT**

South Carolina lost 70 percent of its scoring from last season, and the natural question coming into 2012 was where would the goals come from. The freshman class has shown no problem taking up that challenge with the quartet of **Coryn Bajema, Courtney Angotti-Smith, Stevi Parker** and **Raina Johnson** tallying seven of South Carolina's 14 goals thus far. The other scores have come from a sophomore (**Lani Smith**) and three juniors (**Rae Wilson, Danielle Au & Gabrielle Gilbert**).

**MAKING DUE**

Shelley Smith is dealing with a squad decimated by injuries for the first time since the 2006 team was forced to deal with mass knocks. The 2012 Gamecocks have already lost two players for the season (**Emily Bollinger, Bay Daniel**) and have had 11 other players - including five of the six returning starters - miss time or leave games this season due to injury. Only 10 dedicated field players have been without injury - four mids, four forwards and two defenders.

**GAMECOCKS ON TV**

South Carolina will appear on a TV a minimum of four times in 2012 with at least one of those games occurring on national TV, marking the sixth-consecutive season that Carolina will play in front of a national audience. Carolina's home matches against Missouri (Sept. 16) and Florida (Oct. 25) will air live on ESPNU and SUN Sports, respectively, and away matches at Vanderbilt (Sept. 30) and Kentucky (Oct. 19) will air on CSS and SportSouth.

The Gamecocks were a perfect 3-0-0 last season in televised games, outscoring opponents 8-2 in those contests. This season, South Carolina has not fared as well going 0-2-1 in televised games.

**ALI ALI OXEN FREE**

Sophomore **Ali Whitney** has had a tough go the past 12 months after a promising freshman year ended with a season-ending injury at Ole Miss last fall and a recurring injury keeping her sidelined for all but four matches this season. However, Whitney has made the most of her comeback despite moving from her starting leftback position last season to a left winger role this year. Gifted with the ability to take long throw-ins thanks to her swimming background, Whitney notched her first assist of the season at Arkansas in her most extensive action of the year.

**SPREADING THE WEALTH**

Fifteen of 18 eligible healthy field players have scored a point for the Gamecocks at this point of the season, with 14 of those 15 having contributed at least one of South Carolina's 27 assists. Ten players have combined to score 17 of South Carolina's goals this season.

**SABRINA D'ANGELO RETURNS FROM FIFA U-20 WORLD CUP**

Sophomore **Sabrina D'Angelo** missed the first four games of the season while competing for Canada at the FIFA Under-20 Women's World Cup in Japan, but the reigning SEC Freshman and Defensive Player of the Year made her return to Columbia in time for the Clemson match. D'Angelo registered two saves in her first game back at South Carolina and shutout East Carolina in her second match of the season.

Canada went 1-2-0 and finished third in Group C behind North Korea and Norway. D'Angelo registered 16 saves, one shutout and stopped a penalty kick against Norway in the tourney.

## ANGOTTI-SMITH NAMED SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Freshman **Courtney Angotti-Smith** was named the SEC Freshman of the Week after her two-goal performance against East Carolina. Angotti-Smith came off the bench in the 23rd minute as an attacking midfielder and scored 79 seconds after subbing in for her first career collegiate goal. She also scored the final goal of the day in the 70th minute.

## EVEN MAKEUP

The Gamecocks started a lineup even across the board in both matches over the season-opening weekend with three freshmen, three sophomores, three juniors and two seniors earning spots in the Starting XI. Three Gamecocks earning starting nods as freshmen were **Coryn Bajema**, **Caroline Gray** and **Stevi Parker**.

## HOME AT THE STONE

South Carolina has been nearly unstoppable at Stone Stadium the past five seasons, posting a 49-12-7 record at home since 2006. The streak included a 15-game unbeaten streak from Aug. 31, 2006-Oct. 5, 2007 and a 13-game unbeaten streak at "The Graveyard" from Oct. 19, 2007-Oct. 23, 2008. Seven of the 11 losses have come to teams ranked in the top 25 - #7 Florida (2008), two thrillers against #14/13 Wake Forest (2009 and 2011), #23 Minnesota (2010), #20 Georgia (2010), #8 Florida (2010), Tennessee (2012) and #17 Missouri (2012).

## ANGOTTI-SMITH MAKES HER DEBUT

Freshman **Courtney Angotti-Smith** missed the season-opening weekend after suffering a niggle in training, but the Goose Creek native made her debut weekend against Mercer and Jacksonville in outstanding fashion. Angotti-Smith earned 43 minutes off the bench vs Mercer and immediately made a spark for the Gamecock offense, setting up the corner kick that led to **Rae Wilson's** game-winning goal before adding an assist on **Coryn Bajema's** insurance score. Angotti-Smith then played 52 minutes and added two more assists in the Jacksonville match to give the freshman a team-leading three assists in only two career games played.

## FIRST TIME OPPONENTS

South Carolina's schedule is filled with familiar faces this season with only three first-time opponent on the schedule in 2012. The Gamecocks had never played Milwaukee, Jacksonville or new SEC opponent Missouri and went 1-1-1 with a season-opening draw at Milwaukee and a 3-0 victory over Jacksonville. Last season, Carolina went 1-0-0 against first time opponents with a 1-0 double overtime victory at Arizona.

## PARKER LINKS THE ATTACK

Freshman **Stevi Parker** has been the link between the back and the front in her midfield position, but she also made her mark on the score sheet with her first career goal against Jacksonville. Parker's 53rd minute blast from the top of the '18 capped a 3-0 Gamecock victory. Parker also registered her first assist in Sunday's win against ECU.

## BAJEMA HONOR

Freshman **Coryn Bajema** earned her spot as South Carolina's starter on the left wing in her first career game, and the forward rewarded the staff's confidence in her with a team-leading three goals in the first four matches. Bajema's three-goal weekend against Mercer and Jacksonville led to her being named the SEC Freshman of the Week.

## RAE OF LIGHT

Redshirt junior **Rae Wilson** missed all of the 2011 season recovering from hip surgery, but the Greenville native has started 2012 with a bang. Wilson has scored a point in each of South Carolina's last two games, registering an assist at Minnesota and hitting the game-winning goal against Mercer. The goal was the second of Wilson's career - the first coming in a three-point game at Arkansas in 2010 when she notched a goal and an assist.

## LANI MAKES HER MARK

Sophomore **Lani Smith** earned the distinction of scoring the first goal of the 2012 season after her thrilling buzzer-beating goal at the end of the first half against Minnesota. Smith's goal - which was also the first of her career - came at 44:59 to tie the game at 1-1 going into halftime, but the Gamecocks dropped the match in overtime.

## THE TOP DRAWER TOP 100

Sophomore **Sabrina D'Angelo** clocks in at No. 51 on the Top Drawer Soccer list of the Top 100 Upperclassmen in the nation. D'Angelo is the fifth goalkeeper on the list.

## BETWEEN THE PIPES

Senior **Darien Vercillo** opened the season with a shutout of UW-Milwaukee before earning a career-high four saves at Minnesota. Vercillo, who spot-started in goal in 2011, showed her leadership in the net and came up big in both matches to prevent goals on breakaways by both the Panthers and Gophers.

**FOUR GAMECOCKS NAMED TO SEC PRESEASON WATCH LIST**

Four Gamecocks were named to the SEC's Preseason Watch List, which has taken over from the previous Preseason All-SEC poll. Senior **Dani Henry**, junior **Danielle Au**, sophomore goalkeeper **Sabrina D'Angelo** and freshman **Stevi Parker** were selected to the list. Au and D'Angelo have both earned postseason All-SEC honors in their careers with D'Angelo entering 2012 as the reigning SEC Freshman, Goalkeeper and Co-Defensive Player of the Year. Henry leads a backline that has been tops in the SEC the past two seasons. Parker enters her career as a player to watch in the midfield.

**SENIOR CLASSES SET THE BAR HIGH**

The 2011 senior class left Columbia as the winningest and most-accomplished class in program history after accumulating a four-year record of 61-22-10 (.710), ranking 15th in the nation and second in the SEC for total victories from 2008-11. The Class of 2011 advanced to four consecutive NCAA Tournaments and won two SEC titles (2009 Tournament, 2011 Regular Season).

The 2012 senior class of Dani Henry and Darien Vercillo will look to surpass those numbers with a strong year. The 2012 class currently holds a record of 54-23-10 (.678), just eight victories shy of setting the new record. The duo will also look to become the first class to advance to the NCAA Second Round all four years.

**RETURNING CATEGORY LEADERS**

Carolina returns six starters from last season's NCAA Tournament team. South Carolina will enter 2012 with a new look and new faces, but talent and depth will be available with Coach Shelley Smith welcoming 10 newcomers - nine freshmen and one transfer - including three who started in the season opener.

The three international students are the most South Carolina has had since 2001 when the team had two players from Finland (Jessica Julin and Miaa-Maria Heinonen) and one player from Nova Scotia (Erica Bowie).

**SABRINA D'ANGELO NAMED TO CANADA U20 WORLD CUP TEAM**

Sophomore **Sabrina D'Angelo** (Welland, Ontario) has been named to Canada's 21-player roster for the FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup. The goalkeeper will miss South Carolina's first four matches (at UW-Milwaukee 8/17, at Minnesota 8/19, vs Mercer 8/23, vs Jacksonville 8/26), and may also miss the final two non-conference matches (vs Clemson 9/1, vs ECU 9/9) depending on Canada's run in the tournament. D'Angelo will return to the Gamecocks in time for the SEC opener against Mississippi State at Stone Stadium on Friday, September 14.

Canada earned its spot in the U-20 World Cup after winning the silver medal at the CONCACAF U-20 Women's Championship in March where D'Angelo earned the distinction of being just the second goalkeeper in the 10-year history of the international competition to post shutouts in all three group stage matches.

Canada - a member of Group C - will face Argentina, Norway and Korea DPR in the group phase of the tournament with the first two matches on August 20 (Argentina) and August 23 (Norway) taking place in Kobe and the final group match on August 27 (Korea DPR) will take place in Saitama. The winner and runner-up in each of the four groups will advance to the knockout stage that begins August 30. The final is scheduled for September 8 in Tokyo.

## Shelley Smith 12th Season

If there was ever any question about the program Shelley Smith has built, it was put away at the end of the 2011 season when Smith's South Carolina squad won its second piece of conference hardware in the past three years and advanced to its fifth consecutive

NCAA Tournament appearance.

Smith earned both NSCAA South Region and SEC Coach of the Year honors in 2011 for the second time in three years after solidifying South Carolina as an elite conference contender and nationally-acclaimed program. The Gamecocks won the 2011 SEC regular season and eastern division titles with a 9-2-0 record and moved to the NCAA Second Round for the third consecutive year – one of only two SEC programs to do so in that span.

Smith has led the Gamecocks to 75 overall and 34 SEC victories since the NCAA streak began with the 2007 season, marks that both rank second amongst the league's 12 active coaches. She guided her teams to back-to-back SEC Championship Game appearances, winning the title in 2009 and claiming second in 2010, and has seen her team play for the SEC title on the final day of the regular season each of the past three seasons, breaking through in 2011 with a 2-1 victory at No. 18 Florida.

The 2011 team posted a 16-7-0 overall mark and a program-record 9-2-0 finish in conference play en route to the title. Smith's squad finished the season with a program-record eight-match SEC winning streak to win the league despite playing road games at the league's No. 2 (LSU), No. 3 (Tennessee), No. 4 (Florida) and No. 5 (Georgia) seeds. The record-breaking season ended with a loss to eventual national champion Stanford in a year where Smith's Gamecocks played three of the four teams in the 2011 College Cup. The squad swept the SEC postseason awards with Kayla Grimsley winning her second consecutive SEC Offensive Player of the Year award and freshman Sabrina D'Angelo being named SEC Freshman of the Year, SEC Co-Defensive Player of the Year and SEC Goalkeeper of the Year – in the process becoming the first player in conference history to earn two player of the year honors in the same season. Grimsley also was named a second team All-American by the NSCAA and Soccer America, while D'Angelo was named a first team All-Freshman selection by the organization.

Once again, the Gamecocks finished as the top defensive unit in the league in 2011. The Gamecock squad held seven of 11 SEC opponents to four shots on goal or less, and finished the regular season as the SEC's leader in nearly every major defensive category including goals against average, shots on goal allowed and points allowed. The team posted nine shutouts on the year and was led by first team All-SEC selection Ellen Fahey. Offensively, Grimsley became South Carolina's all-time leading scorer at 119 points and finished the season eighth on the NCAA active list for career points.

Carolina's success has also been apparent in the classroom under Smith, who has coached 154 SEC Academic Honor Roll recipients since coming to USC in 2001. South Carolina has earned an Academic All-America selection in six of the past seven seasons, making the Gamecocks one of only three teams in the nation – and the only in the SEC – to achieve that feat since 2005. Even more impressive is that South Carolina is one of only two programs in the country – alongside North Carolina – to have a first team Academic All-America selection in three of the past four seasons. In 2011, the Gamecocks were also honored with their 10th NSCAA Team Academic Award in her tenure.

Smith has coached several top student-athletes at Carolina including Ashley Kirk, USC's first four-time All-SEC honoree, Carolina's All-Americans in four-time All-SEC selection Blakely Mattern and two-time SEC Player of the Year Kayla Grimsley, and two-time All-SEC performers Melinda Carter, Jessica Julin and Sarah Lentz. Julin is currently the captain of the Finland National Team, and Carter and Mattern played in the WUSA and WPS, respectively. The Gamecocks have earned 32 All-SEC honors in the last 11 years.

In her first season as head coach at Carolina (2001), the Gamecocks were the third-most improved team in the nation with an

8-7-3 overall record. Carolina also performed well at home with a 5-3 at Stone Stadium while allowing opponents to score only four goals in eight matches.

The success continued for USC in 2002 with 13 wins in Smith's second season. The year was highlighted with USC's first ever victories against Florida and Kentucky. Smith also led her team to ties against 2002 SEC champion Auburn and Eastern Division champion Tennessee.

Smith led the Gamecocks to another successful season in 2003 with 10 wins including a USC record eight-game unbeaten streak as well as a 6-2-1 record at home in Stone Stadium.

The 2004 season featured a win over No. 7 Clemson, the Gamecocks' first win over a ranked opponent since 1998, as well as a 6-3 mark in non-conference action. Ashley Kirk also became the first freshman soccer player in school history to be named SEC Freshman of the Year. In addition, Carolina set a school record for a home game winning streak with six consecutive wins.

Following an injury filled 2005 season, the program took a big step forward in 2006 as USC went undefeated at home for the first time in school history with an 8-0-3 mark at Stone Stadium. The team's cumulative goals against average of 0.69 was the lowest ever tallied at Carolina. The season culminated with the Gamecocks advancing to the SEC Tournament semifinals for the first time in Carolina history, as Blakely Mattern became the team's first Freshman All-America selection since 1998.

Smith directed the 2007 Gamecocks to arguably the best season in school history at that time, tying the school record with 14 victories and advancing to the NCAA Tournament for only the second time in program history. Carolina posted a 14-6-3 overall record including a 5-4-2 mark in the SEC after beginning the season by becoming the first team ever to knock off defending national champion and top-ranked North Carolina in a season opening game at Fetzer Field in Chapel Hill. The Gamecocks ran to a 7-0-0 start to the season – program bests for start to a season and winning streak – and peaked at No. 7 in the national polls. For the second consecutive season South Carolina advanced to the SEC Tournament semifinals after knocking off Tennessee for the first time in program history and earned the school's first bid to the NCAA Tournament since 1998. Blakely Mattern became the first sophomore to ever earn SEC Defensive Player of the Year honors in addition to becoming the first All-American in South Carolina history.

Smith has cemented Carolina's position as a conference title contender and player on the national stage after guiding the Gamecocks in 2008 to their second consecutive NCAA Tournament bid and third consecutive SEC Tournament bid, both program firsts. The Gamecocks went 11-7-4 overall and earned five SEC wins for the third year in a row with only one senior on the roster. Respected as a top defensive team, the Gamecocks finished the regular season second in the SEC with eight shutouts and ranked in the top two in every major defensive category including goals allowed, points allowed, shots allowed and shots on goal allowed.

Carolina into the upper echelon of programs after Smith guided the Gamecocks in 2009 to the program's first SEC title and a berth in the NCAA Round of 16, earning her SEC Coach of the Year and NSCAA South Region Coach of the Year honors. South Carolina was a No. 2 national seed in the NCAA tournament and finished with a 19-4-2 record, the best in school history. The Gamecocks finished as one of the top defensive teams in the nation with a school record 15 shutouts, led by Mattern on the backline who was a consensus first team All-American and Lowe's Senior CLASS Award finalist in her final season. Grimsley finished the year with 33 points and was named an honorable mention All-American by Top Drawer Soccer. The team finished eighth in the nation in average attendance.

The 2010 team posted a 15-6-4 overall mark and earned the number two seed in the conference with an 8-2-1 record. The team advanced to the NCAA Second Round in a year that saw Grimsley earn SEC Offensive Player of the Year honors in addition to becoming the second All-American in Gamecock history and a MAC Hermann Trophy Award candidate. The Gamecocks finished as one of the top defensive teams in the country with a streak of 11 consecutive games in limiting opponents to four shots on goal or less and 10 shutouts on the year behind the efforts of Brittny Rhoades on the backline and Patton, a Lowe's Senior CLASS Award candidate,

in goal. Rhoades was named to the first team on Top Drawer Soccer's Team of the Season. Academically the squad tied a program best with three Academic All-District honors in Patton, Christine Watts and Brooke Jacobs.

In 15 years as a head coach, Smith has compiled an overall record of 172-113-30. Besides her collegiate coaching, Smith was a member of the Region III ODP staff for the past six years, as well as an assistant for the '90 Regional Team. Smith also was a member of the 2003 U-14 National Camp staff for U.S. Soccer.

With a background in both semi-professional and collegiate soccer, Smith previously served as head coach at Rhode Island from 1997-2000. The 2000 NSCAA Northeast Region Coach of the Year, Smith rebuilt the URI women's soccer program, compiling a 41-34-2 overall record. Smith took a program that was 2-16 her first year to 12-6-1 in her second season, marking the eighth-most improved won-lost record for a team in NCAA history. In 2000, Smith coached URI to its best record ever of 15-4-1, while reaching the Atlantic 10 Semifinals, a first in URI history.

Smith was nominated for the 2000 National Coach of the Year. The New England Women's Soccer Intercollegiate Soccer Association (NEWISA) also named her its Division I Coach of the Year in 2000. She was the 1998 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year as well.

In addition to her experience as a coach, Smith brings experience from the semi-professional level. From 1996-2000, Smith played for the Boston Renegades in the W-1 League. Smith was captain in 2000 as she led Boston to the semifinals in the W-1 Championship. The Renegades reached the finals in 1998. Smith also had the opportunity to play overseas in 1994 as a member of the Sheffield United Women's Football Club in England.

Smith, a 1993 graduate of the University of Vermont with a degree in nutritional science, received her teacher's certificate from the same institution in 1995. Smith started all four years for the Catamounts. Her primary positions were center midfielder and central defender. She was a regional All-American in both 1992 and '93 in addition to being named First Team All-North Atlantic Conference each year from 1991-93. During her freshman year, the squad won the ECAC Tournament. Vermont was one of the first programs to offer women's soccer as a varsity sport and it competed on a national level. Smith was named to Vermont's Athletic Hall of Fame in the summer of 2004.

Smith worked as an assistant coach at Dartmouth College from 1995-97. The Big Green made the NCAA Tournament in her second season with the program.

Smith is married to USC associate head coach Jamie Smith, a 1994 graduate of Providence College. They are the proud parents of two sons, Braden James, born on Nov. 25, 2003 and Evan Addison born on Jan. 6, 2006. The family resides in Columbia, S.C.

Smith has her USSF B license and the NCAA Advanced National Diploma. She is currently a member of the USYSA Regional Olympic Development Staff.
