Mark Berson, one of three coaches all-time to post 450 victories while coaching only in NCAA Division I, begins his 37th season at the helm of the South Carolina soccer program in 2014. Berson has been at South Carolina from the beginning, hired in 1978 to move the program to varsity status.

Before coming to Carolina in 1978, Berson went 11-5-0 in one season at The Citadel, making his overall record 462-205-68, a .675 winning percentage at the start of 2014. In 2006, Berson became one of five active (at that time) Division I coaches and the 10th all-time to reach the 400-victory milestone when his Gamecocks defeated UAB, 2-0, in a televised contest at Stone Stadium. Berson entered the year with a 451-200-68 record at South Carolina.

Berson has taken the Gamecocks to 20 NCAA Tournaments, with those teams advancing to at least the second round 11 times. His squads have four quarterfinal and two NCAA College Cup appearances to their credit as well. In 1993, the Gamecocks advanced to the NCAA Championship Game.

Though Carolina has been independent during the majority of the program's tenure, the Gamecocks have captured four conference titles under Berson's leadership. Carolina won the 1993 Metro Conference Championship in one of its two years competing in the conference. The Gamecocks joined Conference USA in 2005 and promptly claimed the league's tournament championship and automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament, while Carolina also won the C-USA Championship Tournament in 2010 and collected the regular season championship in 2011.

Besides making an impact in collegiate soccer, Berson's presence is also felt at higher ranks. The Gamecocks are one of only two collegiate programs to have had a player on each of the last four United States World Cup teams. Josh Wolff competed on the United States World Cup team for the second time during the summer of 2006 and was also an Olympic team member in 2000. Clint Mathis, a teammate of Wolff during his time at Carolina, also enjoyed a celebrated professional career that spanned 11 seasons in Major League Soccer. Mathis, who retired from professional soccer in 2010, was a member of the 2002 U.S. World Cup squad and helped his MLS team, Real Salt Lake, capture the MLS Cup in 2009. Mathis also graced the cover of Sports Illustrated in May 2002 prior to the World Cup, marking the third Gamecock athlete, in any sport, to be featured on the cover of the prestigious magazine. Former Gamecock goalkeeper Brad Guzan was honored during the summer of 2010 with a roster spot on the U.S. Men's National Team for the 2010 FIFA World Cup in South Africa. The netminder continued the Gamecocks' streak with a roster spot for the 2014 FIFA World Cup in Brazil.

Berson led Carolina to a 113-39-12 mark (.726) in the 1990s, which rated the Gamecocks as one of the winningest programs in NCAA Division I soccer. In 1998, Berson earned the inaugural Independent Coach of the Year award after leading Carolina to the best record of all Independent schools. Berson has also been honored as the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Coach of the Year in the South Region on four occasions (1984, 1985, 1988, 1995).

Berson has been involved in soccer development as a coach, teacher and administrator on many levels. He is a U.S. Soccer National Instructional Staff Coach with an "A" coaching license and has served as a US Soccer National Instructional staff coach since 1989. He has served as State Coach for the South Carolina Youth Soccer Association (SCYSA), working in player development and coaching certification. In 1992, he was inducted into the South Carolina Youth Soccer Association Hall of Fame.

Berson also coached the U.S. National U-18 team in the Granatkin/Leningrad Tournament in January 1989, in the Soviet Union. In July 1987, he directed the South team to the gold medal in the U.S. Olympic Festival in Durham, N.C., one year after serving as an assistant coach for the South squad.

A 1971 graduate of Summit (N.J.) High School, Berson attended the University of North Carolina and received his bachelor of arts degree in journalism in 1975. Berson played on the Tar Heel soccer squad for four years, one as a midfielder and the other three in goal. As a senior, Berson received the UNC Educational Foundation Award and was a member of the Academic ACC Honor Roll. Berson earned his master's of education degree in sport administration from Ohio University in 1977.

Born March 16, 1953, in Hartford, Conn., Berson is married to the former Shauna Hopkins, a South Carolina alum, of Columbia. They have two children, Erin Rhea and Luke William. Erin graduated from South Carolina in 2009, and Luke is currently enrolled at the University of South Carolina in the Moore School of Business.

SOUTH CAROLINA TEAM NOTES

- South Carolina has been a second-half team, winning more corner kicks (48-30) and shot chances (124-89) in the second 45 in its 15 matches.
- Two Gamecocks have played every minute this year: Braeden Troyer (Sr.) and Ive Burnett (So.).
- South Carolina has taken 131 of their 227 shots, 57 percent, in six home matches: Belmont, Mercer, UNC Greensboro, Marshall, Georgia State and Kentucky.
- Four times, SC has held foes to 2 or less shots on goal: Belmont, Marshall, Georgia State and UAB.
- South Carolina stands with an all-time record of 458-208-68 (.670).
- The 3-0 start was South Carolina's best in a decade, when the 2004 squad won its first four matches.
- Ranked 17th in the Sept. 9 NSCAA/Continental Tire poll, South Carolina received its first ranking since the last regular season poll of 2011 (23rd).

GAMECOCKS ARE COMEBACK KINGS IN 2014

- In five of South Carolina's seven wins, the team has come from behind to take the victory.
- Four victories came from one goal back, with the fifth marking the largest comeback in school history (down 0-3 at Florida Atlantic).
- Twice, the team has fought back against a ranked foe despite being down a player to force double overtime (down 0-1 vs. No. 25/18 Clemson, down 0-3 vs. No. 19/22 Kentucky).
- The only win that didn't involve overtime or coming back was a 2-0 decision over Mercer.

ESPECIALLY EXPERIENCED IN OVERTIME

- The Gamecocks hold a 4-4 mark in overtime this year, the most OT wins in a season in history and the most extra-time matches played without a tie for the Gamecocks.
- The eight overtime matches ties for most in a season with last year's squad.
- South Carolina has played 15 overtime matches in its last 28 outings dating back to last year.
- The eight OT contests ties for second in NCAA Division I this year, behind UC Davis with 11.
- Albany, Loyola (Chicago) and UC Riverside have also played extra time in eight matches.

SOUTH CAROLINA CELEBRATING 10 YEARS IN CONFERENCE USA

- The 2014 season is South Carolina's 10th as a men's soccer affiliate member of Conference USA.
- In 2011, the Garnet and Black captured the league's regular-season crown, sharing it with UAB.
- Twice, the Gamecocks have won the league's tournament (2005 and 2010).
- South Carolina's student-athletes have taken 40 all-league nods, with 14 coming on the first team.
- In C-USA outings, South Carolina owns a 37-27-16 (.563) mark.
- On the road, that mark is 18-12-10 (.575). At Stone Stadium, that record is 19-15-6 (.550).
- Entering their final two matches on the road, the Gamecocks look to complete their fifth undefeated road slate since entering C-USA.
- The others came in 2005 (4-0-1), 2007 (2-0-2), 2011 (4-0-0) and 2013 (2-0-1).
- Both Old Dominion and New Mexico have yet to lose a home C-USA match this year, with the Lobos never losing a league match at home since entering prior to the 2013 season.

BIZARRO WORLD FOR 2014 GAMECOCKS IN C-USA ACTION

- South Carolina went 0-4 in Conference USA play at home, the first time the Gamecocks went winless at home in league action.
- Offense dried up in those outings, with the three goals coming in the final 50 minutes of action vs. No. 19/22 Kentucky.
- The three goals against the Wildcats pushed their goals-against average down 10 spots to No. 12 in the Oct. 27 NCAA Division I stats rankings.
- When on the road, the Gamecocks have scored nine goals in C-USA play (5 at FIU, 4 at FAU), not losing a road match with two to play.

CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT FIELD FAR FROM SET

- South Carolina holds the seventh spot in the Conference USA standings, the final one to make the league's tournament, with six points.
- Behind them are Florida Atlantic and FIU, teams that SC hold wins over and thus the tiebreaker.
- The Owls (4 points) and Panthers (3 points) meet on Wed. in Miami.
- If Florida Atlantic wins, the Gamecocks have to get at least one more point to tie them and take the final spot in the tourney.
- Both have two more matches after that: the Owls at Charlotte and home vs. UAB, the Panthers hosting league-leading Kentucky and a match at Old Dominion.

ATTENDANCE OUTSTANDING AT STONE STADIUM

- The 2014 Gamecocks have the sixth-highest paid attendance average in NCAA Division I at 2,602.
- That 2,602 attendance average is the largest for a season in Stone Stadium history.
- The paid attendance of 5,415 for the season-opening match against Belmont ranks as the 4th-best in Stone Stadium history and 8th in the site's history of men's matches.

GAMECOCKS COME BACK AT FLORIDA ATLANTIC FOR BIG WIN

- The Gamecocks scored four unanswered goals in the final 30 minutes of regulation and five minutes of overtime to claim a 4-3 road win at Florida Atlantic on Oct. 17.
- South Carolina posted its biggest come-from-behind victory with that effort, the first time in 37 years a Gamecock team overcame a three-goal deficit.
- Doubling the Owls in shots in the second half, SC had two goals from redshirt freshman Mikkel Knudsen, including the neutralizer with 7:59 remaining.
- Two Gamecocks made their season debut in the win, juniors Devin L'Amoreaux and Wesley Eads. L'Amoreaux had an assist on the game-tying goal by Knudsen.

BERSON RANKS SIXTH ON NCAA DIVISION I COACHING WINS LIST

- The only head coach in South Carolina men's soccer history, Mark Berson ranks as one of four coaches in NCAA Division I history with 450 wins at one institution.
- Berson owns 469 career victories in 38 years, which includes his 11 in 1977 at The Citadel.
- He holds 6th on the NCAA Division I wins list and 16th on the all-divisions listing.
- The FAU win broke a tie with former Kean head coach Tony Ochrimenko to give Berson 16th alone on the all-divisions list.
- Berson coached his 750th collegiate match on Sat. vs. Kentucky.
- He's coached 13 players who have captured 15 All-America nods at South Carolina.
- He's also guided at least one player on each of the past four US Men's National Teams in the World Cup (Clint Mathis 2002, Josh Woolf 2002 and 2006, Brad Guzan 2010 and 2014).

WE SCHEDULED STRONG FOES

- Of the 17 regular-season matches scheduled this season for the Gamecocks, 12 come against top-100 RPI teams in the final 2013 report from the NCAA.
- Seven rank in the top 50, four from C-USA (Charlotte, UAB, Old Dominion & New Mexico).
- Four foes made the NSCAA/Continental Tire Preseason Top 25, well, 26 when you count Old Dominion tying for the 25th spot with Navy.
- Six of the Gamecocks' foes appear in the current NSCAA top 25 or are receiving votes.
- One team currently ranked remain on the schedule: No. 15/20 New Mexico.
- The Gamecocks are 1-3-0 against ranked teams in 2014, beating No. 25/18 Clemson.
- SC is 1-5 against top-35 teams in the latest RPI report.
- South Carolina's remaining foes have RPIs in the top 50 (Old Dominion 43, New Mexico 17).
- The remaining opponents have a combined record of 17-8-2, giving SC the 12th-toughest remaining schedule in NCAA Division I.

AWARDS CAME IN BUNCHES IN SECOND WEEK

- Sophomore goalkeeper Marco Velez won two honors over Sept. 8-9, the Conference USA Defensive Player of the Week and the Disney Soccer/NSCAA Player of the Week.
- It's Velez's second C-USA weekly honor, matching his award on Oct. 28, 2013, as a freshman.
- He's the first national player of the week for SC since Bradlee Baladez took the College Soccer News award on Oct. 4, 2010.
- The last Gamecock before Velez to earn NSCAA's weekly nod was Ayo Akinsete on Oct. 25, 2006.
- Mahamoudou Kaba took a spot on CSN's Team of the Week on Sept. 8 after garnering the C-USA Preseason Defensive Player of the Year award.

RECENT DOMINANCE OF ARCHRIVAL CLEMSON

- Since 2007, the Gamecocks are 6-2 against their archrival Clemson, with both of the losses coming in double overtime on the road (2011 & 2013).
- The last four matches at Stone Stadium have gone to the Gamecocks, three coming in shutouts.
- It's the best stretch since the Gamecocks went 10-4 from 1985-95 against the Tigers, with three of the wins in that stretch coming in NCAA Tournament play.

2014 SOUTH CAROLINA GAMECOCK MEN'S SOCCER

ROSTER NOTES

- South Carolina brought back 18 letter-winners to go with nine newcomers for 2014.
- The Gamecocks return 80 percent of their goals and 76 percent of their assists from last year.
- Included in that returning group is the top-two goal scorers (Jeffrey Torda and Mahamoudou Kaba) and the top-two assist distributors (Kurtis Turner and Ryan Arambula).
- Only one goalkeeper of three who played in 2013 is not back from last year (Chris Duzan, 30:19).
- Four Conference USA award winners return, including defenders Kaba and Braeden Troyer as well as 2013 All-Freshman Team members Turner (midfielder) and Marco Velez (goalkeeper).
- Both Kaba and Troyer made the C-USA Preseason team, with Kaba garnering the Defensive Player of the Year title.

THE GAMECOCKS SHINE IN THE CLASSROOM AS WELL

- South Carolina's 18 returners have a total of 30 SEC Academic Honor Roll certificates and 31 Conference USA Academic Honor Roll notations between them.
- Of those, 10 are Conference USA Academic Medal mentions, which is awarded to student-athletes with a 3.75 cumulative GPA or higher.
- Troyer has three of those Academic Medals, while both Ryan Arambula and Jeffrey Torda have two.
- Four of the seniors, Robert Beebe, Mahamoudou "Mo" Kaba, Asa Kryst and Braeden Troyer have three certificates each.

SCOUTING OLD DOMINION

- The Monarchs stand at 7-5-1 on the year, ranking tied for fifth in C-USA with a 2-2-1 mark.
- At home, Old Dominion dominates, winning five of six with the lone loss coming to UNC Wilmington, a squad who came to Stone Stadium and left with a 2-1 win on Sept. 12.
- Alex Tiesenhausen holds down the defense with a 1.04 goals against average, playing every minute in goal.
- He has four shutouts on the year to go with a league-leading 63 saves.
- Ryan Condatta and Jesse Miralrio both have three goals and one assist each.
- Christian Schroerer has a team-high three assists on the year.
- Two of Miralrio's goals have come in league play, while two of Schroerer's assists have as well.

SOUTH CAROLINA VS. OLD DOMINION - STONE STADIUM

COLUMBIA, S.C. - South Carolina suffered a 2-1 loss to Old Dominion in its final regular season contest.

SC's Asa Kryst recorded the first shot of the match in the 10th minute. The attempt was blocked, but the forward collected the rebound and quickly put a second attempt on frame. Sean Stowe was there for his first save of the night but couldn't contain the ball. The Gamecocks were awarded their first corner kick of the night on the play.

Midfielder Stephen Anderson was on the other end of Kurtis Turner's corner kick from the near side, but Stowe got just enough of a hand on the header to deflect it over the cross bar.

On an indirect kick in the 16th minute, Ivan Militar found Tim Hopkinson in the six-yard box, who hit a header across the face of the goal just past an outstretched Velez for a 1-0 lead.

Old Dominion stretched their lead to 2-0 with less than five minutes remaining before the break. Militar earned his second assist of the night for setting up Cole Stringer for a header on a corner kick.

The Gamecocks threatened in the 62nd minute. Koty Millard sent a rocket toward Stowe. The keeper saved the shot, but midfielder Devin L'Amoreaux controlled the rebound. Stowe's quick reflexes helped him make another save.

In the 81st minute, Turner drew a foul just outside the 18-yard box. On the direct kick, Kryst found Torda. Torda's rocket slightly deflected off an Old Dominion defender and went past Stowe to make the score 2-1.
