GAMECOCKS WRAP UP HOME SCHEDULE WITH COLLEGE OF CHARLESTON, QUEENS, WINGATE

South Carolina will close out its home slate this weekend with a two-session meet against College of Charleston, Queens and Wingate at the Carolina Natatorium. Friday's session is scheduled to get underway at 4 p.m., with a Senior Day ceremony to take place at 3:45. The teams will return to action to wrap up the meet on Saturday at 10 a.m.

SERIES HISTORY

The Gamecocks enter the weekend with a combined 42-0 record against this week's opponents. Both the Gamecock men's and women's teams are 19-0 all-time against College of Charleston and 2-0 all-time against Queens. This week marks the first meeting between South Carolina and Wingate on both sides.

LAST TIME VS. COLLEGE OF CHARLESTON

This weekend's meet is the second of the season between the Gamecocks and Cougars. The teams squared off in November, and South Carolina came out on top in both matchups. The Carolina men won 178-115, and the Gamecock women defeated the Cougars 169-126 for their first win of the season. For the meet, South Carolina placed first in 27 of the 32 events. Junior Narayan Naik led the way with three first-place finishes. A native of Oklahoma City, Okla., Naik won the 100 backstroke (58.27), 200 backstroke (2:06.98) and the 400 IM (4:37.84).

LAST TIME VS. QUEENS

South Carolina swept Queens in a meeting last season on Jan. 14, 2012. The Gamecock men defeated the Royals 222-66, while the Carolina women posted a 254-39 victory over Queens. The Gamecocks had 20 first-place finishes on the day, including two apiece from divers Courtney Forcucci and Rylan Ridenour and swimmers Gerard Rodriguez, Rachael Schaffer and Matt Navata.

SCOUTING THE COMPETITION

College of Charleston enters the weekend at 2-3 on the men's side and 2-5 overall on the women's side. The Cougar men are coming off a 176-171 victory over Gardner Webb, while the women's team dropped a 176.5-167.5 decision to Gardner Webb. The Cougar men's team is the defending Coastal Collegiate Swimming Association champion.

Both Queens and Wingate compete at the Division II level and are in the Bluegrass Mountain Conference (BMC). Queens' men have won four meets on the year, including the Conference Carolinas Meet and the Wingate Fall Frenzy. Queens finished 11th at last year's NCAA Division II Championships. On the women's side, the Royals have won three meets, including the Conference Carolinas Meet. Queens finished 21st at last season's NCAA Division II Championships.

Wingate's men's team has won two meets on the season, including the Savannah College of Arts and Design Invitational. The Bulldogs are the defending BMC champions and they finished fifth at last year's

NCAA Division II Championships. The Wingate women also won the Savannah College of Arts and Design Invitational this season. The Bulldogs finished runner-up at last year's BMC championships and 18th at the NCAA Division II Championships.

SENIOR SALUTE

This weekend will mark the final time 12 Gamecock seniors compete on the boards and in the pool at Carolina Natatorium. Prior to Friday's session, all 12 seniors will be honored with a ceremony on the pool deck. South Carolina's 2013 senior class includes Bobby Cave, Matt Columbus, Collin Kaden, Graham Kauffman, Rylan Ridenour, Brooks Ross, Whitney Avers, Meghan Brockington, Jordan Gibbs, Logan Griffith, Chay Malvasio and Matea Peteh.

MISSED OPPORTUNITY

With three nationally-ranked teams in town last weekend, South Carolina had a chance to pick up a signature win. However, the Gamecocks were unable to pull off an upset of the 13th-ranked Florida State men, the 21st-ranked Florida State women and the 18th-ranked Arkansas women. On the men's side, the Gamecocks dropped a 180.5-117.5 decision to the Seminoles. In the women's action, South Carolina fell to the Seminoles, 190-109, and lost to the Razorbacks, 223-77.

On the night, the Gamecocks won five events with a different winner in each event. Senior Brooks Ross took first in the 1,000 freestyle in a season-best time of 9:22.58. Junior Michael Flach tied for first in the 200 freestyle in 1:39.74. Junior Jay Warner recorded his first win of the season by touching first in the 100 backstroke with a mark of 50.34. Gerard Rodriguez posted a first-place finish for the Gamecocks with a win in the 500 freestyle in 4:34.08. The Gamecock women managed just one first-place finish, as junior Amanda Rutqvist posted a NCAA B cut of 2:14.19 to win the 200 breaststroke

MOVIN' ON UP

After falling out of the College Swimming Coaches Association of America Division I Team Rankings in the final poll of the fall, the South Carolina men made a return to the top 25 this week. The Gamecocks are ranked No. 23 after defeating Duke on the road and putting up a strong showing in a loss to 13th-ranked Florida State last Friday. South Carolina recorded 12 first-place finishes during the two meets.

GOING THE DISTANCE

South Carolina's distance corps has been a strength this season, and senior Brooks Ross has played a key role in the group's success. A native of Manakin-Sabot, Va., Ross has recorded a team-high five wins in distance events this season. He's turned in three straight wins in the 1,000 freestyle, including a first-place finish with a season-best time of 9:22.58 against Florida State.

LEADER OF THE PACK

Junior Michael Flach has had a stellar return to collegiate swimming after redshirting last season to focus on the U.S. Olympic Trials. A native of Annandale, Va., Flach has recorded a team-high 11 first place finishes this season and has finished runner-up six times. He has competed in seven events and recorded at least one win in all but two of the events. He currently has the 10th fastest time in the country in the 500 freestyle (4:18.38) and the 14th fastest time in the 200 butterfly (1:45.51).

Flach put together a performance to remember at the Virginia Tech Invitational in November. Flach posted the nation's fastest marks at the time in the 500 freestyle (4:18.38) and the 200 butterfly (1:45.51) on his way to earning Counsilman Hunsaker National Swimmer Of The Week and SEC Male Swimmer of the Week honors.

KEEPING ABREAST

Junior Amanda Rutqvist has been rolling along in her signature event, the 200 breaststroke. Rutqvist, who earned All-America honors in the event in 2011 and 2012, has won her last five races in the event. Her time of 2:09.97 currently ranks 13th in the nation.

DIVING ONTO THE NATIONAL SCENE

Sophomore Patricia Kranz continues to blossom into one of the top divers in the country. Kranz, who has won seven times this season, put on a stellar performance going head-to-head with Duke Olympic medalist Abby Johnston two weeks ago. Kranz finished second with a mark of 302.47, which was 7.36 points shy of knocking off Johnston. Kranz currently ranks first in the conference on the one-meter (344.93) and second on the three-meter (372.38).

AWARD-WINNING DEBUT

Freshman Marwan El Kamash earned SEC Freshman of the Week honors after an impressive collegiate debut against Texas A&M and North Carolina. A native of Alexandria, Egypt, El Kamash helped lead the Gamecocks to a 160-140 victory over Texas A&M on Saturday in a tri meet with the Aggies and North Carolina, turning in four top-five performances. El Kamash won the 500-yard freestyle in 4:31.27. He took runner-up honors in the 1000-yard freestyle with a time of 9:21.21. He swam the leadoff leg of the 400-yard freestyle relay and helped the team to second-place finish in 3:02.05. El Kamash also placed fifth overall in the 100-yard freestyle in 46.45.

NO REST FOR THE WEARY

South Carolina's swimmers and divers will have to be at their best as they face one of the toughest schedules in school history in 2012-13. The schedule features six teams that finished 16th or better at last year's NCAA Championships on the men's side and five teams that finished in the top 20 at the women's NCAA Championships.

On the men's side, Texas A&M (13th), North Carolina (14th), Florida (eighth), Virginia (15th), Florida State (16th) and Georgia (11th) are on the schedule. The Gamecock women will face North Carolina (19th), Texas A&M (sixth), Florida (10th), Virginia (17th) and Georgia (second).

FLACH IS BACK

After a year away from NCAA competition, junior Michael Flach returns as the team's unquestioned leader. Flach, who took an Olympic redshirt last season to focus his efforts on training for the London Olympics, made a splash on the national scene by finishing eighth in the 200-meter butterfly at the 2012 U.S. Olympic Trials, becoming the first Gamecock to make the finals since 1988.

Flach's stellar summer continued into August when he was named to the U.S. roster for the 2013 World University Games, which will be held July 6-17 in Kazan, Russia. Flach earned his spot on the team with a second-place finish in the 200 butterfly at the U.S. Open, which was held in August in Indianapolis, Ind. After sneaking into the championship final with the eighth fastest time in the preliminaries (2:00.75), Flach shaved more than two seconds off his time in the finals to touch second in 1:58.40, securing his spot on the team.

JUNIOR LEADERS

Juniors Amanda Rutqvist and Rachael Schaffer have been leaders of the women's team since arriving in Columbia, and 2012-13 will be no different.

Rutqvist, who is the Gamecocks' top breaststroker, earned her third All-America honor last season by finishing 15th in the 200 breaststroke at the NCAA Championships. She is the school record holder in both the 100 and 200 breaststroke with times of 1:00.20 and 2:07.86, respectively.

Schaffer narrowly missed earning her first All-America honor a year ago, finishing 17th in the 400 IM at the NCAA Championships. A native of Baltimore, Md., Schaffer is one of the Gamecocks top all-around swimmers after winning 12 individual races last season.

THE TRADITION CONTINUES

South Carolina head diving coach Todd Sherritt has produced a long line of SEC Champions and All-Americans during his 20-year tenure in Columbia, and sophomores Cole Miller and Patricia Kranz look to keep the tradition alive this season.

Kranz scored twice at the SEC Championships last season, finishing 14th on the one-meter springboard and ninth on the platform. Miller looks to build on one of the best freshman campaigns in the conference. A SEC All-Freshman Team selection, Miller scored points at the SEC Championships, finishing sixth on the three-meter board and fifth on the platform. At the NCAA Zone Championships, he set the 12-dive school record on the platform with a score of 609.25.
