#### **FOR STARTERS**

South Carolina (3-1) returns to action this weekend with a three-game series vs. Northeastern (2-1) at Carolina Stadium. Saturday's doubleheader will start at 2 p.m. with Sunday's series finale scheduled for 1:30 p.m.

#### THE NORTHEASTERN SERIES

This is the first meeting between the Gamecocks and Northeastern in baseball. The Huskies enter the weekend with a 2-1 record after defeating Incarnate Word in two of three games last week.

Northeastern marks the second Gamecock opponent this year from the Colonial Athletic Association, the previous being College of Charleston.

Northeastern is the only Gamecock opponent this season that South Carolina has never met in baseball prior to the upcoming year. Head coach Mike Glavine played for Northeastern and was inducted into the Northeastern Hall of Fame in 2006. He spent 10 seasons in professional baseball. The New York Mets called him up the majors in 2003, where he played with his older brother Tom, who was recently elected to the National Baseball Hall of Fame in 2014. He is in his first season as head coach of the Huskies.

#### **RANKINGS**

South Carolina is ranked in every publication. The Gamecocks are No. 5 by D1Baseball, No. 10 USA TODAY coaches poll, No. 12 by the NCBWA, No. 13 by Baseball America, No. 13 by Perfect Game and No. 20 by Collegiate Baseball.

#### LAST TIME OUT

Senior outfielder Elliott Caldwell went 4-for-4 with a pair of doubles and a three-run triple and freshman right-hander Clarke Schmidt worked 4.2 scoreless innings of relief to earn his first career win as fifth ranked South Carolina defeated Furman 5-2 on Tuesday afternoon at Carolina Stadium.

#### MORE ON CALDWELL

Caldwell's three-run triple in the third inning erased a two-run deficit. The triple was the first of his career and the first triple by the Gamecocks for the season. He set a career-high with four hits. It was the most hits since he had three on Mar. 28, 2014 vs. Tennessee. Caldwell's three RBI are a season-high by a Gamecock player this year as well. It also marked Caldwell's second career game with two doubles, he had two doubles vs. Brown, Mar. 8, 2014.

#### FRESHMEN RIGHT-HANDERS

A pair of freshmen right-handers factored in Tuesday's vs. Furman. Clarke Schmidt worked 4.2 scoreless innings with just three hits allowed, no walks and four strikeouts to pick up his first career win and Brandon Murray picked up his first career save with 1.2 scoreless innings of relief. He allowed just two hits and struck out one batter.

#### A LOOK BACK

South Carolina opened the 2015 season winning a series against 25th ranked College of Charleston with a doubleheader sweep on Saturday as the Gamecocks defeated the Cougars 7-1 and 8-3. Carolina was the only SEC squad to defeat a Top-25 team in a series in the first weekend of play.

#### K-MART

Senior first baseman Kyle Martin was the Gamecocks' top hitter over the weekend going 4-for-9 (.444) with a pair of runs, a double and three RBI. Martin went 2-for-4 with two RBI in the 7-1 win and followed that up going 2-for-4 with a run in the 8-3 victory.

Martin elected to return for his final season after being selected in the 20th round of the 2014 MLB Draft by the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim. Martin was Carolina's leading hitter last year batting .336 (82-for-244) with 35 runs scored, 11 doubles, five homers and 38 RBI, a .389 on-base percentage and a .443 slugging percentage. He started all 62 games at first base.

Martin averaged 1.32 hits per game last year, tied for highest among SEC returning leaders. His .336 average is second-highest among returning SEC players as well.

#### A CLOSER LOOK AT WIDENER

Sophomore right-hander Taylor Widener was effective in his first relief appearance of the season as he pitched 2.2 scoreless innings of relief with six strikeouts to earn a save in the 8-3 win to win the rubber game vs. College of Charleston. Widener tied a career-high with six strikeouts and did not allow a hit to pick up his first career save.

#### IN THE CROWE'S NEST

Sophomore right-hander Wil Crowe won game one of the doubleheader vs. College of Charleston as he shut down the Cougars going 6.1 innings and allowing just one run on four hits with three walks and a career-high 10 strikeouts. Crowe's 10 strikeouts tied for the most by a SEC pitcher over the weekend. Crowe bested his previous career mark of nine that he set twice, the last time vs. Vanderbilt on May 17, 2014.

Crowe is among the top sophomores in the country. Crowe earned Freshman All-America honors last year as he went 8-3 with a 2.75 ERA in 15 starts with 59 strikeouts to 19 walks in 91.2 innings pitched. Opponents hit just .228 against him. He did not allow a stolen base either.

Crowe is one of 50 players in the nation to be named to USA Baseball's Golden Spikes Award Preseason Watch List.

#### **GORE IN A GROOVE**

Sophomore Jordan Gore was key in the doubleheader sweep vs. College of Charleston. He opened the doubleheader going 2-for-3 with two runs and two RBI in the 7-1 win and followed that up with a two-run single in the bottom of the eighth of the 8-3 win in the night cap. Gore hit .364 (4-for-11) in the series with three runs and four RBI. Gore's pair of multi-RBI games were the first of his career.

# DYNAMIC DESTINO

Freshman Alex Destino made his debut in a Gamecock uniform and he came up with a big hit in the rubber game as his two-run homer in the bottom of the sixth broke a 3-3 tie in the 8-3 victory. Destino was 4-for-12 (.333) for the weekend at the plate.

Destino earned third-team Preseason All-America honors from Baseball America. Baseball America surveys scouting directors and national crosscheckers to vote on the Preseason All-America team.

#### **MAX IT OUT**

Junior infielder Max Schrock was on base a lot vs. College of Charleston as he went 3-for-9 (.333) and drew five walks for a .571 on-base percentage in the series. Schrock scored a team-high four runs as well and drove in a run. Schrock is tied for the league lead in walks after the opening weekend.

#### **STREAKS**

Jordan Gore and Gene Cone have hit safely in all four games this year and have five-game hitting streaks dating back to last year.

#### **SOME DEBUTS**

Three Gamecock right-handers made their debuts on the mound las weekend. Freshmen Tyler Haswell, Brandon Murray and Clarke Schmidt all took to the mound for the first time. Murray went 0.2 scoreless and picked up his first career win in the 8-3 victory. Schmidt pitched one scoreless inning and struck out a batter on Opening Day.

Also making their first appearances in a Gamecock uniform were freshman catcher Hunter Taylor, freshman infielder Madison Stokes, junior college transfer and first baseman Collin Steagall and freshman outfielder Clark Scolamiero. Taylor, Stokes and Steagall each got a start with Stokes driving in a pair of runs with a single in the 8-3 win. Scolamiero scored a run as a pinch-runner in the 8-3 win.

## JACK OF ALL TRADES

Junior left-hander Jack Wynkoop returns to the weekend rotation for a third straight year. He has made 28 starts in his career, that is second-highest among all returning SEC pitchers.

Wynkoop was the Opening Day starter for the Gamecocks, the fifth consecutive year a left-hander has been the first to get the ball for the Gamecocks. Wynkoop allowed four runs on eight hits in five-plus innings with a walk and two strikeouts.

#### A BRIGHT SPOT

Senior outfielder Connor Bright homered in the 7-1 win vs. College of Charleston and was 2-for-3 with two runs and a RBI in the 8-3 win.

One of five seniors on the squad, Bright is back for one more season with the Gamecocks. Bright saw action in 44 games with 42 starts in right field, but battled back issues in the last half of the season. Despite his injury, he hit .311 (50-for-161) with 24 RBI and 25 runs scored. Bright is expected to start in right field on Opening Day. He has 117 career starts with the Garnet & Black, that is the highest total on the active roster for the Gamecocks.

#### **VINNY**

Junior left-hander Vince Fiori went 2.2 scoreless in the 7-1 win over College of Charleston and allowed just one walk as he retired six of seven batters he faced.

#### CONE LEADS IT OFF

Sophomore outfielder Gene Cone was 3-for-12 with a pair of runs and a RBI vs. College of Charleston. He added a single and two runs in Tuesday's 5-2 win over Furman.

Cone is coming off a solid summer that saw him earn Coastal Plain League Hitter of the Year, as voted on by the CPL head coaches. Cone hit a league-best .385 (62-for-161) for the Florence Red-Wolves during the regular season in 43 starts with 18 doubles, a pair of triples, 25 RBI and 40 runs scored. An All-Star selection as well during the summer season, Cone collected a .468 on-base percentage with 26 walks to 17 strikeouts. Cone continued to swing a hot bat during the playoffs to help lead the RedWolves to the CPL Petit Cup Championship Series. He hit .314 in eight playoff games.

Cone came on late for the Gamecocks and made 30 starts last season as a freshman and finished with a .371 on-base percentage. He scored 22 runs and made just one error in the outfield.

#### REAGAN ON THE LEFT

Sophomore left-hander Josh Reagan made just his second career start in Saturday's 8-3 win. Reagan went 5.2 innings and allowed three runs on seven hits with a walk and four strikeouts. The stint was the longest of Reagan's career besting his previous mark of five vs. Stetson last year on Mar. 4, 2014.

#### **DC DELIVERS**

Junior infielder DC Arendas had a team-high .625 on-base percentage in two starts vs. College of Charleston. He went 1-for-4 with a run scored, two walks and two hit by pitches in two games played.

#### MOONEY IN THE MIDDLE

Junior infielder Marcus Mooney is back and will factor in the middle infield positions. Mooney played 58 games with 57 starts in 2014. He hit .274 (59-for-215) with 32 runs scored, 10 doubles, a triple and 22 RBI, also a .380 on-base percentage.

#### AT THE PLATE & ON THE MOUND

South Carolina hit .261 as a team (24-for-92) with a .384 on-base percentage in the College of Charleston series. South Carolina's 17 walks at the plate was fourth-highest among the league last weekend. The pitching staff went 27.0 innings and allowed 10 runs on 26 hits with 13 walks and 24 strikeouts. College of Charleston hit .260 against the Gamecocks.

#### ON THE FIELD

South Carolina did not commit an error in the three-game series vs. College of Charleston. The Gamecocks have just two errors on the year with a .987 fielding percentage (155 C, 108 PO, 45 A).

#### PRODUCTION

All nine Gamecocks in the starting lineup reached base at least once in the 7-1 win vs. College of Charleston with eight of nine tallying at least one hit in the 8-3 victory vs. College of Charleston as well.

#### **GREAT SCOTT**

Sophomore right-hander Reed Scott was one of the top relievers for the Gamecocks last season. He was 2-0 with a 1.94 ERA in 41.2 innings, allowed 11 runs, nine earned, on 34 hits with eight walks and 31 strikeouts. He did not allow a run in nine of 14 appearances last year.

#### AND THEN THERE WAS ONE

South Carolina senior outfielder Patrick Harrington is the last remaining active Gamecock player that was a member of the 2011 national championship team.

Harrington saw action in 26 games last year with 16 starts and compiled a .319 on=base percentage with five runs scored and nine RBI.

#### **GAMECOCK NEWCOMERS**

South Carolina baseball's recruiting class was ranked as high No. 5 in the nation as announced by Baseball America. It is the second consecutive year the Gamecocks have brought in a Top 5 class as last year's group was ranked No. 3 in the country by Baseball America.

#### STUDENT ASSISTANT COACHES

Two former Gamecocks will serve as student assistant coaches this year. Former infielder Scott Wingo (2008-11) and former catcher Justin Dalles (2009) have returned to campus to complete their degree requirements and are serving on the staff this year.

Dalles spent three seasons in the Baltimore Orioles organization, one year with the Philadelphia Phillies and last year in the Independent League. Dalles lettered in 2009 and earned second-team All-SEC honors on the way to being a sixth round MLB draft choice by the Orioles. Dalles hit .324 with 15 homers and 47 RBI to help lead the Gamecocks to a NCAA regional appearance.

Wingo spent the past three seasons in the Los Angeles Dodgers organization. Wingo was a four-year letterwinner at South Carolina from 2008-11 and played on both national championship teams in 2010 and 2011. Wingo served as captain his senior year in 2011, earned first-team All-SEC honors and was the Most Outstanding Player at the College World Series. He was also a two-time SEC All-Defensive team selection. Wingo played in 254 career games with the Garnet & Black, the second highest total in school history.

#### THIS IS SOUTH CAROLINA BASEBALL

South Carolina earned its 15th straight trip to the NCAA Regional as the 2014 team finished 44-18 and finished ranked as high as No. 22 by the USA Today coaches' poll. South Carolina went 18-12 in the SEC and is one of only two schools in the conference to finish among the top four teams in the league in both 2013 and 2014 and one of four schools in the SEC to win at least 40 games in both 2013 and 2014. South Carolina is also one of only nine schools in the nation to host a NCAA Regional in 2013 and 2014.

South Carolina won the NCAA Division I Baseball Championship in 2010 and 2011 at the College World Series. South Carolina has 11 College World Series appearances, including six in the last 13 years. The Gamecocks own the second-highest win total in the nation in the last 15 years (2000 to the present) with a 713-289 record. South Carolina is one of five schools to appear in the NCAA Regional every season in the last 15 years, including 11 NCAA Super Regional appearances in that span, one of only two schools to accomplish the feat.

#### **HOME SWEET HOME**

South Carolina went 34-7 in 2014 in home games. Since the opening of Carolina Stadium, the Gamecocks are 189-39 for a .829 winning percentage, the best winning percentage at home among the 14 SEC schools.

In 2014, South Carolina hosted a NCAA Regional for the fifth-straight year marking the Gamecocks as one of only two schools in the nation to claim that distinction. Gamecock Nation flocked to Carolina Stadium as South Carolina set a total attendance record at 305,564 in 2014, the first time South Carolina eclipsed the 300,000-plus mark.

# Head Coach Chad Holbrook

Chad Holbrook begins his third year as head coach of the South Carolina program after directing the Gamecocks in 2014 to a 15th consecutive appearance in the NCAA Tournament. Holbrook is the only head coach in South Carolina history to have led a team to the NCAA Regionals in his first two years as head coach. His SEC winning percentage of .593 is the highest of any South Carolina coach in the first two seasons of the league and his overall winning percentage of .696 is the second-highest of any South Carolina coach in his first two seasons at the helm of the program.

The 2014 team finished 44-18 and finished ranked as high as No. 22 by the USA Today coaches' poll. South Carolina went 18-12 in the SEC and is one of only two schools in the conference to finish among the top four teams in the league in both 2013 and 2014 and one of four schools in the SEC to win at least 40 games in both 2013 and 2014. South Carolina is also one of only nine schools in the nation to host a NCAA Regional in 2013 and 2014.

Among the highlights in 2014 included a series sweep of instate rival Clemson. Holbrook's team would claim six SEC series including a pair of wins at eventual national champion Vanderbilt as well as a series victory vs. CWS participant Ole Miss. South Carolina hosted a NCAA Regional for the fifth-straight year marking the Gamecocks as one of only two schools in the nation to claim that distinction. Gamecock Nation flocked to Carolina Stadium as South Carolina set a total attendance record at 305,564 in 2014, the first time South Carolina eclipsed the 300,000-plus mark. South Carolina also set a record with 5,957 season tickets sold.

The 2014 Gamecocks led the SEC with a 2.43 earned run average that ranked ninth in the nation. The pitching staff was among the best in the country with 13 shutouts, fifth-highest in the nation, a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.03, sixth-best in the country and a 1.12 WHIP that was eighth overall. South Carolina hit .281 as a team with a .361 team on-base percentage and fielded .975 as well.

South Carolina would have seven players selected in the 2014 MLB Draft including five players in the first 11 rounds. Highlighting that group was junior catcher Grayson Greiner, who was a third round pick and the No. 99 overall selection by the Detroit Tigers. Greiner was a second-team All-America honoree by Baseball America and Perfect Game and was named he 2013-14 USC Co-Male Student-Athlete of the Year alongside Gamecock football/basketball standout Bruce Ellington. He would also be a semi-finalist for the Johnny Bench Award for the top catcher in college baseball and a member of the SEC All-Defensive team. Greiner played in 60 games with 58 starts, hit .311 (66-for-212) with 39 runs scored, 50 RBI, 13 doubles and eight homers, also a .389 on-base percentage and a .486 slugging mark. Greiner hit a team-best .327 (37-for-113) in league games with four homers and 24 RBI vs. SEC teams. Junior left-handed pitcher Jordan Montgomery was a 4th round selection by the New York Yankees after leading the pitching staff with an 8-5 record and a 3.42 ERA in a team-high 100 innings with 95 strikeouts. Montgomery became the 22nd pitcher in school history to reach the 20-win total as well. Junior infielder Joey Pankake was

a seventh round pick by the Tigers. He became the 26th player in school history to tally 200 or more hits with a double in the second inning of the Florida game at the SEC Tournament on May 22. He finished his career with 204 hits in the Garnet & Black. He started 58 games and hit .303 (67-for-221) with a team-high 52 runs scored. Junior outfielder Tanner English went in the 11th round to the Minnesota Twins after manning the center field position the entre year with 62 starts and being named to the SEC All-Defensive team. Joel Seddon also was selected in the 11th round after earning second-team All-America honors from the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association with 14 saves. He was also a second-team All-SEC choice. Junior first baseman Kyle Martin was South Carolina's best hitter with a .336 average (82-for-244) and would be picked in the 20th round but chose to return to school for the 2015 season. Right-handed pitcher Evan Beal rounded out the group as a 21st round choice by the Royals. A Gamecock newcomer also found success as freshman righthanded pitcher Wil Crowe earned Freshman All-America honors as announced by Collegiate Baseball on Wednesday morning. In his first season, Crowe went 8-3 in 15 starts with a 2.75 ERA in 91.2 innings pitched. Crowe allowed just 32 runs, 28 earned, on 76 hits with 19 walks and 59 strikeouts. Crowe was strong in his last start with the Garnet and Black as he pitched four-hit complete game shutout in a 9-0 win vs. Campbell in the NCAA Regional that earned him All-Tournament Team honors. Crowe earmed SEC Pitcher of the Week and SEC Freshman of the Week also.

The Gamecocks also shined off the field as Greiner continued a streak of a Gamecock making the Capital One Academic All-America teams to four years, following LB Dantzler's Academic All-America Division I Baseball Player of the Year nod last season and Michael Roth's two selections to the first team in 2011-12.

Holbrook's first season as head coach in 2013 saw the Gamecocks compile a 43-20 record and the school's 11th NCAA Super Regional appearance. Holbrook directed the 2013 squad to a final national ranking of No. 12 in the USA Today Baseball Coaches Poll along with No. 13 by Collegiate Baseball and Perfect Game and No. 14 by Baseball America.

Among the 2013 highlights was a series victory against Clemson, four sweeps of SEC teams and six SEC series victories including a pair of wins at LSU, the only team to go into Baton Rouge in 2013 and claim a three-game set. South Carolina hosted a NCAA Regional for the fourth straight year with the Gamecocks going undefeated in three games and continuing a run of 27 straight postseason wins at home including a 16-0 mark at Carolina Stadium. South Carolina ended the 2013 season with a total attendance of 260,605, third highest in the country.

Chad Holbrook was named head baseball coach for the University of South Carolina on July 16, 2012. Holbrook was promoted to the top spot by athletics director Ray Tanner after four seasons as associate head coach and recruiting coordinator for the Gamecocks. Holbrook came to South Carolina in July 2008 as associate head coach. Along with his recruiting coordinator duties, he served as hitting instructor, overseeing the Gamecock offense, including base running and the short game and was the third base coach. He also worked with the outfielders. Holbrook came to the Gamecock program after serving 15 seasons as a member of the University of North Carolina coaching staff. Holbrook was the 2011 ABCA/Baseball America Assistant Coach of the Year after the Gamecocks won a second consecutive national championship.
