Gamecocks Set for 14th Straight NCAA Regional Appearance

No. 25 South Carolina received a bid to play in the 2012 NCAA East Regional, which marks the 14th straight regional appearance for the Gamecocks. The 54-hole event runs May 10-12 at the Penn State Golf Course in State College, Pa. The Gamecocks are the No. 8 seed and will vie for their second regional title and a berth to the NCAA Championship. Eight teams and two individuals not on those teams from each regional site will advance to the NCAA Championship, which will be held May 23-26 at the Vanderbilt Legends Club in Franklin, Tenn.

The Lineup

South Carolina head coach Kalen Harris has decided to go with a lineup of senior Katie Burnett, juniors Amanda Strang and Meredith Swanson, sophomore Suzie Lee and freshman Justine Dreher. This is the first time this season the Gamecocks will play with this lineup.

Burnett is primed to lead the way in the fourth NCAA regional of her career. The Brunswick, Ga., has not missed a tournament in her career and currently ranks first in career scoring average at South Carolina. She also has had success at the regional level as she captured medalist honors at the 2010 NCAA East Regional. Strang is making her third career NCAA appearance, with her best finish being a tie for 39th showing at the 2010 NCAA East Regional. Swanson and Dreher are making their first trips to the NCAA postseason. Dreher is coming off a strong showing at the SEC Championship, where she finished in a tie for 12th place.

History at the NCAA Regionals

The Gamecocks are making their 14th straight trip to the NCAA Regionals and 19th overall. Carolina won the East Regional in 2010, the program's first regional title. Katie Burnett led the way by claiming medalist honors with a score of 210 (-6) to become the school's third regional champion. The previous best finish was a fourth-place showing in 1995.

Carolina is looking to advance to its 12th NCAA Championship, including the fourth in five years under head coach Kalen Harris.

Breaking Down the Field

Joining the Gamecocks are 16 teams ranked in the nation's top 50, including No. 2 Alabama, No. 17 Arizona, No. 5 Arizona State, No. 8 Duke, No. 11 Texas A&M, No. 14 Florida, No. 19 Oklahoma State, No. 25 Michigan State, No. 26 Washington, No. 30 Texas, No. 32 Tulane, No. 38 UCF, No. 42 Wake Forest, No. 43 Northwestern and No. 45 San Diego State. Augusta State, Campbell, Chattanooga, Jacksonville State, Kent State, LIU Brooklyn, Maryland and Oral Roberts round out the field.

South Carolina has faced 16 of these teams this season, compiling a 21-22 record.

Recapping the 2011 NCAA West Regional

The Gamecocks played in the West Regional for the first time in program history in 2011 and produced a sixth-place finish to advance to the NCAA Championship. Then-freshmen Suzie Lee and Samantha Swinehart were the top finishers for Carolina as they each shot a 222 (+6) to tie for 15th.

Burnett, Dreher Garner All-SEC Accolades

Senior Katie Burnett was named second team All-SEC, while freshman Justine Dreher was selected to the SEC All-Freshman Team, the conference announced last week.

For Burnett it is the second All-SEC selection of her career after garnering second team honors in 2010. The Brunswick, Ga., native has been a steady force for the Gamecocks this season as she was the team's top finisher in all nine events. She led the team and was 10th in the conference in scoring with a 73.19 stroke average, which ranks first all-time at South Carolina. She lowered her career scoring average to 74.30, moving her to the top of the program's career scoring list. Burnett, who is ranked 19th in the country by Golfweek, finished inside the top 20 six times, including a team-high three top-5 showings. She also tied the school record for lowest round with a 66 in the second round of the Cougar Classic and led the team in rounds of par or better (10) and 54-hole score (212).

Dreher, a native of Valbonne, France, played in six events this season and produced a stroke average of 75.71, which ranks third on the team and is currently fourth all-time for a freshman at South Carolina. She recorded two top-20 finishes, including a tie for 12th showing in extremely challenging conditions at the SEC Championship in Fayetteville, Ark. Her second-round 68 at the Tar Hill Invitational is the lowest round by a freshman in school history.

Burnett One of the Best to Ever Wear Garnet and Black

Senior Katie Burnett, who has not missed a lineup in her Gamecock career, is in her final season in garnet and black with her name already scattered around the South Carolina record books. Burnett's career stroke average of 74.30 is currently the best all-time, while this season's stroke average of 73.19 ranks first in school history.

Burnett's 72-hole total of 286 at the 2010 NCAA Championship ranks first all-time. Her 54-hole total of 210 is the third best score in program history, while her 36-hole score of 142 is tied for first all-time. She is also tied for first in lowest score (66), first round score (67) and second in both second round score (67) and third round score (69).

Gamecocks Finish Sixth at 2012 SEC Championship

South Carolina posted a score of 313 (+25) to conclude play at the 2012 SEC Championship at the Blessings Golf Club. The Gamecocks moved up one spot to claim sixth place with a three-round total of 936 (+72). Carolina's round of 313 was tied for the lowest score of the day.

Senior Katie Burnett and freshman Justine Dreher played the most consistent golf of the weekend in extremely challenging conditions to lead the Gamecocks. With winds gusting up to 30 mph for the final round, Burnett carded a 3-over 75, and Dreher turned in a 6-over 78, as both golfers finished the tournament in a tie for 12th with a score of 230 (+14). The finish is the lowest of Burnett's career at the SEC Championship, while it is Dreher's career best. Burnett began the day on hole No. 12 and got off to a quick start with birdies on her first two holes. She then bogeyed three of her next five holes before making five straight pars. Burnett closed out her round with two birdies, two bogeys, a par and a double bogey to finish the day at 3-over. Dreher recorded one birdie, three bogeys, two double bogeys and 12 pars for her round. The lone birdie came on the par-4 11th, which was her final hole of the day.

Junior Amanda Strang earned her best career finish in three tries at the SEC Championship as she turned in a 5-over 77 and finished in a tie for 26th with a score of 235 (+19). Strang closed out the round in strong fashion, playing 1-under on the back nine.

Junior Meredith Swanson shot an 83 (+11) to wrap up the event in a tie for 46th, while sophomore Samantha Swinehart posted an 86 (+14) to finish in a tie for 42nd.

Liz Murphey Classic

South Carolina shot a final-round 298 (+10) to finish in fifth place at the Liz Murphey Collegiate Classic at the University of Georgia Golf Course. The Gamecocks wrapped up the tournament with a three-day total of 875 (+11), giving Carolina its best finish at the Liz Murphey Classic since a fourth-place showing at the event in 2002.

Senior Katie Burnett continued her steady play from the first two rounds by posting an even-par 72 to lead the Gamecocks on Sunday. Burnett claimed fifth place with a score of 212 (-4), which is the eighth-lowest 54-hole score in school history.

Junior Meredith Swanson carded a 2-over 74 on Sunday to earn the first top-10 finish of her career as she tied for 10th place with a score of 214 (-2). Swanson struggled to a 4-over 39 on the front nine but she settled down and closed out the round in strong fashion, making two birdies and seven pars on the back nine to finish the round at 2-over.

Junior Amanda Strang and sophomore Samantha Swinehart each shot a 4-over 76. Strang finished in a tie for 33rd with a score of 223 (+7), while Swinehart tied for 85th with a total of 237 (+21). Sophomore Katie Rose Higgins turned in an 81 (+9) and finished in a tie for 66th with a score of 231 (+15). Freshman Justine Dreher, who played as an individual, posted an 80 (+8) to finish in a tie for 75th.

Darius Rucker Intercollegiate

Club. The Gamecocks posted a two-round score of 604 (+36) for the event, which was shortened to 36 holes after severe storms postponed the second round.

The golfers struggled to put up low numbers during all three days of competition, as only six rounds under par were posted on the weekend. Senior Katie Burnett had a stellar day to lead the Gamecocks as she recorded 14 pars, two birdies and two bogeys to card an even-par 71. Burnett wrapped up the tournament in sixth place with a two-round score of 143 (+1), which is her eighth career top-10 finish. Her weekend total also lowers her career scoring average to 74.37, which ranks first all-time at Carolina.

Dreher earned the first top-20 finish of her career as she carded a 2-over 73 to tie for 20th with a two-round score of 150 (+8). Sophomore Suzie Lee tied for 60th with a two-round total of 158 (+16) after carding a final-round 78 (+7), while junior Meredith Swanson and sophomore Samantha Swinehart tied for 62nd with a score of 159 (+17). Swanson shot 85 (+14) on Sunday, and Swinehart turned in a 79 (+8). Junior Amanda Strang and sophomore Katie Rose Higgins played as individuals for the Gamecocks and finished tied for 49th and tied for 68th, respectively. Strang posted an 81(+10) on Sunday, while Higgins turned in an 80 (+9).

UCF Challenge

On what proved to be a tough scoring day, South Carolina shot a final-round 300 (+12) at RedTail Golf Club to wrap up the UCF Challenge in seventh place with a three-round total of 889 (+25).

After several teams posted red numbers the first two days, not a single team was below par, and only four individuals carded rounds under par. Cold temperatures and windy conditions left the field battling for low numbers.

Senior Katie Burnett led the way for the Gamecocks for the second straight day as she posted a final-round 73 (+1) to move seven spots up the leaderboard to finish tied for 14th with a score of 219 (+3). Junior Meredith Swanson, who played as an individual, carded a 76 (+4) to finish the tournament tied for 32nd with a score of 223 (+7). Sophomore Samantha Swinehart and junior Amanda Strang finished tied for 38th with a score of 224 (+8). Swinehart carded a final-round 77 (+7), while Strang turned in a 76 (+4). Freshman Justine Dreher bounced back from Monday's 77 to shoot a 2-over 74. She finished the tournament in a tie for 43rd with a three-round score of 225 (+9). Sophomore Suzie Lee joined Dreher in the group tied for 43rd after shooting 5-over 77.

Landfall Tradition

The South Carolina women's golf team wrapped up its fall schedule with a strong performance in the third round at the Landfall Tradition. The Gamecocks shot a 301 (+13) at the Country Club of Landfall's Jack Nicklaus Course to climb four spots to finish the event in fourth place with a score of 922 (+58). South Carolina finished 18 strokes back of tournament champion Purdue (904) and just four strokes behind second-place Auburn (918). The fourth-place showing is the Gamecocks' best this season.

South Carolina senior Katie Burnett added another top five finish to her list of career accomplishments as she shot a final-round 72 (E) to end the tournament tied for fourth with a score of 224 (+8). Burnett now has four top five finishes as a Gamecock.

Junior Amanda Strang was Carolina's next highest finisher as she shot a final-round 79 (+7) to tie for 29th with a three-day total of 233 (+17). Sophomore Samantha Swinehart posted her best round of the tournament with a 2-over 74 to tie for 34th with a score of 235 (+19). Swinehart recorded double bogey on her second hole of the day but she finished strong by playing even par the rest of the way. Sophomore Katie Rose Higgins and junior Meredith Swanson carded rounds of 76 (+4) and 79 (+7), respectively, to tie for 39th with a score of 236 (+20).

SEC/Pac-12 Challenge

The South Carolina women's golf team saved its best round for last at the SEC/Pac-12 Challenge as it shot a 293 (+5) in the final round at Holston Hills Country Club.

The Gamecocks improved 17 strokes from their first-round score and 12 from the second round to wrap up the tournament in 17th place with a three-day total of 908 (+44). Carolina's score was the fifth lowest of the day in the 23-team field.

Sophomore Samantha Swinehart posted a season-low 71 (-1) to lead the Gamecocks on the final day. She recorded three birdies, two bogeys and 13 pars to finish the tournament tied for 44th with a score of 224 (+8). Senior Katie Burnett also tied for 44th with a score of 224 (+8) after carding a final-round 73 (+1). Junior Amanda Strang was Carolina's next highest finisher as she shot a 76 (+4) on Sunday to finish tied for 59th with a score of 227 (+11). Junior Meredith Swanson recorded her best round of the tournament with a 1-over 73, while sophomore Katie Rose Higgins turned in a 77 (+5). Sophomore Suzie Lee, who played as an individual, shot an 82 (+10).

Tar Heel Invitational

The South Carolina women's golf team posted a final-round 294 (+6) to finish in 11th place at the Tar Heel Invitational at the UNC Finley Golf Course. The Gamecocks concluded the tournament with a three-day score of 882 (+18).

Junior Meredith Swanson bounced back from a 79 on Saturday to lead the way for South Carolina in the final round. Swanson carded an even-par 72 and finished the tournament in a tie for 37th with a score of 222 (+6).

Senior Katie Burnett claimed the highest finished for the Gamecocks despite a final-round 78 (+6) as she tied for 21st with a score of 219 (+3). Sophomore Suzie Lee shaved four strokes off her second-round score to shoot 1-over 73 on Sunday. Lee's three-day score of 223 (+7) left her in a tie for 44th. Sophomore Katie Rose Higgins carded her second-consecutive round of 74 (+2) to wrap up the tournament in a tie for 55th with a score of 225 (+9), while junior Amanda Strang recorded a 75 (+3) on Sunday to tie for 73rd with a 227 (+11). Freshman Justine Dreher played the event as an individual and turned in a final-round 77 (+5). Dreher, whose round of 68 on Saturday was the lowest round ever by a South Carolina freshman, finished the tournament in a tie for 37th with a score of 222 (+6).

Cougar Classic

South Carolina had three golfers post scores under par in the final round of the Cougar Classic on its way to setting the record for the lowest round in school history with a 279 (-9) at Yeamans Hall Club. The Gamecocks finished the tournament with a three-round total of 869 (+5) to claim 10th place in the 22-team field.

South Carolina's score of 279 broke the previous school record by three strokes, which was set in the second round of the 2002 Southeastern Conference Championship. It also tied for the second lowest round in Cougar Classic history. The Gamecocks' tournament total was the fourth best 54-hole total in program history.

Sophomore Katie Rose Higgins posted South Carolina's lowest score of the round with a career-best 67 (-5), tying Burnett and three former Gamecocks for the third lowest round in school history. Higgins' three-round total of 221 (+5) left her in a tie for 44th.

After posting a career-low 69 in the second round, South Carolina junior Meredith Swanson was at it again on Tuesday. Swanson fired the ninth-best round in Gamecock history with a 4-under 68. She finished the tournament in a tie for 12th with a three-day score of 214 (-2), which is tied for the 10th best 54-hole total in school history. Senior Katie Burnett finished in the top 10 for the eighth time in her career as her final-round 74 (+2) moved her into a tie for ninth with a three-day total of 213 (-3). Burnett's 54-hole score is tied for the eighth best in program history. South Carolina's third round under par came from junior Amanda Strang, who carded a 2-under 70 for her lowest round of the tournament. Sophomore Samantha Swinehart turned in her best round of the event with a 74 (+2). After making three birdies in the first two rounds combined, Swinehart recorded three in the third round to go along with five bogeys and 10 pars.

Kalen Harris

Head Coach :: Duke, 2001 :: 5th year at South Carolina

Kalen Harris enters her fifth year as the head coach of the South Carolina women's golf team on a high note - as the defending NCAA East Regional Champion.

Harris led the Gamecocks to their first regional title in 2010 as the team posted an even-par total of 864, holding off Tennessee by two strokes to earn a second NCAA Championship berth in three years - not a bad start for

the 2001 Duke graduate in her initial head coaching position.

Harris earned that job when South Carolina tabbed her to mentor its program in January 2008. She joined the Gamecocks after two years as an assistant at Duke, where she had an All-American career as a player, and a four-year stint as a professional on the FUTURES Tour. And her philosophy on coaching has led to immediate success for the Carolina program.

"I am dedicated to building a championship program at the University of South Carolina," Harris said. "The Gamecock women's golf team is committed to achieving short-game and scoring game excellence, and our much of our practice time reflects this goal. I also place a strong emphasis on building individual relationships and finding what motivates players on an individual level. I focus on individual skill development within a competitive, supportive team environment. I bring intensity to practices and training, while also creating a structure that allows players to lead a balanced life as a student-athlete."

In four seasons at South Carolina, Harris has overseen a seamless, successful transition from the previous coaching staff, highlighted by the program's first tournament title in five years at the 2010 NCAA East Regional. In addition, two players have earned All-America accolades, equaling the number of All-Americans in program history prior to her arrival.

Under Harris, the Gamecocks have advanced to three NCAA Championships in four seasons; the program had appeared in the NCAA Championship a total of eight times since

What was thought to be a rebuilding year in 2011 - one junior, two sophomores and three freshmen comprised the entire Carolina roster - turned into unforeseen success as the Gamecocks battled through being shipped to the West Coast for their NCAA Regional to finish in sixth place and earn their third NCAA Championship berth in four years. Freshmen Suzie Lee and Samantha Swinehart led the charge at the West Regional in Auburn, Wash., tying for 15th place after battling through cold, wind and rain for three days. The team would finish in 18th place at the NCAA Championships in College Station, Texas, setting the stage for what could be a very strong 2011-12 campaign.

The 2010 season was a banner year for Anderson and the Gamecocks, capped by the team's second NCAA Championship appearance in three years where they earned a tie for 14th place. This followed Katie Burnett's and the Gamecocks' triumph at the NCAA East Regional in Greenville, N.C., where Burnett earned medalist honors in leading Carolina to the regional title.

In 2009, her first full season at Carolina, the team grew together as the season progressed and earned a spot in the NCAA East Regional in Gainesville, Fla. Highlighting the year was Benedicte Toumpsin's tie for medalist honors at the LSU Golf Classic and the emergence of a freshman star in Katie Burnett.

Her first season in 2008, Harris guided the Gamecocks into the NCAA Championship for the first time since 2003. Team leader Bénédicte Toumpsin earned third-team All-America status from *Golfweek* and an honorable mention All-America nod from the National Golf Coaches Association, becoming South Carolina's first All-American since Kristy McPherson earned the honor for the third time in her career in 2003.

Harris joined the staff of Duke's Hall of Fame head coach Dan Brooks in the spring of 2006 and helped the Blue Devils to their second-straight national title. Duke went on to add a third title in 2007. Duke also claimed back-to-back Atlantic Coast Conference championships in her time on staff. Anderson was the designated coach during several tournaments and saw four Blue Devils earn All-America status in 2006, including three first-team selections.

"In coaching, we work on skills and techniques during practice, so when we get to tournament play, my major role is to help players keep a positive attitude and stay in the right frame of mind to let their hard work and talent shine," Harris said. "In addition to being a resource to help players make smart decisions during competition, I like to use humor to keep them loose while also pushing them toward productivity."

Outside of tournament play, Harris focused on short game, course management and mental coaching with her players. She helped three-time All-ACC selection Jennifer Pandolfi raise her short game from 431st in the nation in December 2005 to 84th in April 2007, while her chipping stats improved from 341st to 15th over the same period. Additionally, Harris helped personalize fitness plans for players and actively participated in team workouts.

Off the course, Harris was just as involved with shaping college players. At Duke, she assisted in arranging community service opportunities and monitored academic progress. She designed practices and skill sets, arranged team travel, ordered and managed equipment and uniforms, and assisted in fundraising projects for the Blue Devils. Anderson also worked hard as a recruiter, evaluating top-ranked prospects on the state, national and international level. Organizing and leading recruiting visits, she helped the Blue Devils land the top golfer in the class of 2008.

"I am extremely grateful to have had the opportunity to be mentored by Coach Brooks and be part of an elite program both as a player and a coach," Harris said. "My many experiences at Duke have taught me how to keep players motivated, excited about golf and focused on attaining their goals. I will draw on that experience to help build South Carolina women's golf into a championship program."

Prior to her start in coaching, Harris played golf professionally from 2001 through 2005. She played a total of 56 events on the FUTURES Tour, recording her best finish at the 2002 Florida Hospital FUTURES Golf Classic in Sebring, Fla., where she tied for fourth. Harris also participated in four LPGA Qualifying Schools and played in the 2000 U.S. Women's Open. While playing, she also worked to network and generate sponsorships to support her career, raising \$120,000 of capital.

Harris kicked off her college career by earning Atlantic Coast Conference co-Rookie of the Year honors in 1998. Playing in the NCAA Championship all four years of her career, she helped the Blue Devils to their first national title in 1999, finishing 12th in the individual standings. She captured All-ACC and Academic All-America honors that year, a feat she would repeat over the remaining two years of her career. With the nation's top-rated total short game in 2000, Harris picked up second-team All-America status. Finishing ninth in the NCAA Regional in 2000, she was the Blue Devils' top finisher at the NCAA Championship, claiming 21st place. In all, Harris collected 16 top-10 finishes in her career, including the individual title in the 2001 Liz Murphey Intercollegiate.

A native of Edina, Minn., Harris earned her bachelor's degree in psychology with a certificate in markets and management from Duke in 2001. She is married to Deuce Harris of Durham, N.C., a former wrestler at Duke University.



As a player at Duke, Harris was a three-time All-ACC selection. She earned second-team All-America status in 2000 and was part of Duke's first national championship team in 1999.

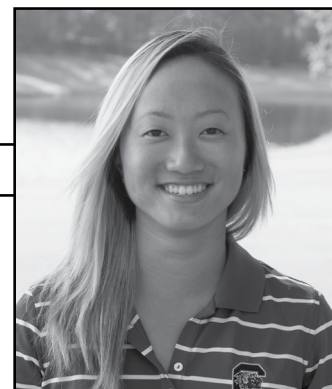

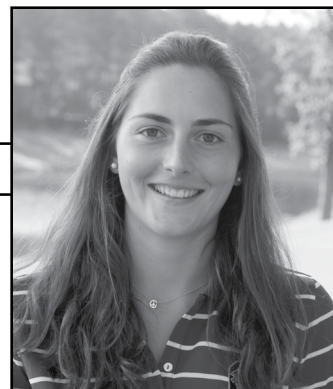
