FOR STARTERS

College baseball's premier rivalry is this weekend as South Carolina (6-1) meets Clemson (5-2) for three games in three different sites. The series opens on Friday in Clemson at Doug Kingsmore Stadium with first pitch at 6:30 p.m. Game two of the series shifts to Greenville and the Reedy River Rivalry contest at Fluor Field with first pitch at 2:30 p.m. The series concludes on Sunday in Columbia at Carolina Stadium at Noon.

Carolina has had success against Clemson in recent years winning 23 of the last 31 contests between the two schools dating back to the 2007 season. South Carolina won all three games last year. Friday's game will be broadcast live on ESPN3. Sunday's game will be televised live on the SEC Network with Tom Hart and Kyle Peterson on the call.

All three games can also be heard on the Gamecock Radio Network from IMG College including flagship station 107.5 FM "The Game." Andy Demetra, Derek Scott and Tommy Moody will have the call this weekend.

PRICE AWARD & BRADLEY AWARD

For the 15th consecutive year, the Tom Price Award and Bob Bradley Award will be presented to the MVP for South Carolina and Clemson respectively. The presentation will be made at the end of Sunday's game.

Both Price and Bradley had a tremendous positive influence on the baseball programs at Clemson and South Carolina as the school's sports information directors.

Price passed away on Feb. 1, 2008 at the age of 81 after 45 years of service to the Gamecock program. Bradley passed away on Oct. 30, 2000. He served as the Tigers' baseball athletic communications director for 45 years and still served as Clemson's official scorer for most of the 2000 season.

A LOOK BACK

South Carolina won all four games last week with a 5-2 midweek victory vs. Furman and a sweep of Northeastern with wins of 10-1, 6-0 and 6-4.

JACK OF ALL TRADES

Junior left-hander Jack Wynkoop tied his longest outing of his career as he went eight innings and allowed just one run on three hits with a walk and nine strikeouts in the 10-1 victory vs. Northeastern in the first game of the doubleheader. Wynkoop's 13.0 innings ranks third in the SEC.

Wynkoop is in the weekend rotation for a third straight year. He has made 29 starts in his career, that is second-highest among all returning SEC pitchers.

DYNAMIC DESTINO

Freshman Alex Destino was impressive at the plate in the Northeastern series going 7-for-12 (.583) including a three-run homer in Sunday's 6-4 victory vs. Northeastern. Destino is batting .458 (11-for-24) for the season with a pair of homers and six RBI. Destino ranks 13th in the SEC in hitting as of Monday, Feb. 23. Destino's 11 hits for the season tie him for 6th in the SEC along with Gene Cone. Destino owns a six-game hitting streak.

SCHMIDT CONTRIBUTES

Freshman right-hander Clarke Schmidt earned a pair of wins in relief last week. Schmidt worked 4.2 scoreless innings with just three hits allowed, no walks and four strikeouts in the Tuesday 5-2 win over Furman. He followed that up with 2.1 innings of work in Sunday's 6-4 win over Northeastern allowing one run on five hits with no walks and three strikeouts. Schmidt is 2-0 with a 1.12 ERA in eight innings with no walks and seven strikeouts.

CONE LEADS IT OFF

Sophomore outfielder Gene Cone has hit safely in all seven games this year and has an eight-game hitting streak dating back to last season. Cone hit .583 (7-for-12) in the Northeastern series with a pair of runs and two RBI. Cone hit his first career homer in the 10-1 win over Northeastern and followed that up with a 3-for-4 day at the plate in the 6-0 win over the Huskies. For the season, Cone is batting .407 (11-for-27) with six runs scored and a .467 on-base percentage. Cone's 11 hits for the season tie him for 6th in the SEC along with Destino.

IN THE CROWE'S NEST

Sophomore right-hander Wil Crowe pitched four scoreless innings with only four hits allowed, no walks and seven strikeouts in the 6-0 win over Northeastern. Crowe is 1-0 with a 0.87 ERA in 10.1 innings with one run allowed on eight hits and three walks to 17 strikeouts. Opponents are batting .211 against him. Crowe's 17 strikeouts are second highest in the SEC.

Crowe won game one of the doubleheader vs. College of Charleston as he shut down the Cougars going 6.1 innings and allowing just one run on four hits with three walks and a career-high 10 strikeouts. Crowe's 10 strikeouts tied for the most by a SEC pitcher over the weekend. Crowe bested his previous career mark of nine that he set twice, the last time vs. Vanderbilt on May 17, 2014.

Crowe is among the top sophomores in the country. Crowe earned Freshman All-America honors last year as he went 8-3 with a 2.75 ERA in 15 starts with 59 strikeouts to 19 walks in 91.2 innings pitched. Opponents hit just .228 against him. He did not allow a stolen base either.

Crowe is one of 50 players in the nation to be named to USA Baseball's Golden Spikes Award Preseason Watch List.

GORE IN A GROOVE

Sophomore Jordan Gore drove in a team-high five runs over the weekend in the Northeastern series and went 4-for-12 at the plate (.333). Gore is batting .346 (9-for-26) for the year with four runs scored and a team-high nine RBI. Gore has a team-high three multi-RBI games. Gore's nine RBI tie him for sixth currently in the SEC.

K-MART

Senior first baseman Kyle Martin has hit safely in six straight games and is batting .364 (8-for-22) with five runs and seven RBI as well as a .464 on-base percentage. Martin hit his first homer of the year in the 10-1 win over Northeastern.

Martin was the Gamecocks' top hitter over the weekend going 4-for-9 (.444) with a pair of runs, a double and three RBI. Martin went 2-for-4 with two RBI in the 7-1 win and followed that up going 2-for-4 with a run in the 8-3 victory.

Martin elected to return for his final season after being selected in the 20th round of the 2014 MLB Draft by the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim. Martin was Carolina's leading hitter last year batting .336 (82-for-244) with 35 runs scored, 11 doubles, five homers and 38 RBI, a .389 on-base percentage and a .443 slugging percentage. He started all 62 games at first base.

Martin averaged 1.32 hits per game last year, tied for highest among SEC returning leaders. His .336 average is second-highest among returning SEC players as well.

VINNY

Junior left-hander Vince Fiori earned a win in relief in the 6-0 win over Northeastern. Fiori worked two scoreless innings and allowed just two hits with a strikeout. Fiori has three appearances on the year and has not allowed a run in 4.2 innings of work.

A CLOSER LOOK AT WIDENER

Sophomore right-hander Taylor Widener picked up his second save of the season in Sunday's 6-4 win over Northeastern. Widener allowed one run on two hits in 1.2 innings with no walks and two strikeouts. Widener has pitched 4.2 innings and has tallied eight strikeouts in two appearances with three walks. Opponents are batting .133 against him.

CALDWELL AMONG LEAGUE LEADERS

Senior outfielder Elliott Caldwell had a career-high in hits in Tuesday's 5-2 win over Furman going 4-for-4 with a key three-run triple in the victory. Caldwell leads the Gamecocks in hitting with a .467 average (7-for-15) with a .529 on-base percentage as well. Caldwell ranks 11th in the SEC in hitting as of Monday, Feb. 23. His on-base percentage is 14th best with his .733 slugging mark 15th best in the league.

MORE ON CALDWELL

Caldwell's three-run triple in the third inning erased a two-run deficit. The triple was the first of his career and the first triple by the Gamecocks for the season. He set a career-high with four hits. It was the most hits since he had three on Mar. 28, 2014 vs. Tennessee. It also marked Caldwell's second career game with two doubles, he had two doubles vs. Brown, Mar. 8, 2014.

A HIT

South Carolina reached the double-digit mark in hits in all three games vs. Northeastern including a season-high 13 in Sunday's 6-4 victory. The Gamecocks are now batting .306 (68-for-222) as a team on the year with a .403 on-base percentage and a .423 slugging mark.

ON THE MOUND

South Carolina pitchers own a 2.29 ERA for the year and have allowed just 17 runs, 16 earned, on 60 hits in 63.0 innings with 18 walks and 55 strikeouts on the year. Opponents are batting .255 against the Gamecocks.

ON THE FIELD

South Carolina is fielding .982 as a team with only five errors this year. The Gamecocks do not have an error in four games this year.

SUPERLATIVES

South Carolina is 6-0 this year with a lead entering the seventh inning. South Carolina is 6-0 on the year also when allowing five runs or less. The Gamecocks are 2-1 in games decided by three runs or less.

MAX IT OUT

Junior Max Schrock leads the SEC with 11 walks on the year and is tied for third in the nation. Schrock has tallied two or more walks in four games this year. He owns a .438 on-base percentage.

START ME UP

Gene Cone, Jordan Gore and Max Schrock have started all seven games this year for the Game-cocks.

A BRIGHT SPOT

Senior outfielder Connor Bright homered in the 7-1 win vs. College of Charleston and was 2-for-3 with two runs and a RBI in the 8-3 win.

One of five seniors on the squad, Bright is back for one more season with the Gamecocks. Bright saw action in 44 games with 42 starts in right field, but battled back issues in the last half of the season. Despite his injury, he hit .311 (50-for-161) with 24 RBI and 25 runs scored. Bright is expected to start in right field on Opening Day. He has 119 career starts with the Garnet & Black, that is the highest total on the active roster for the Gamecocks.

BACKSTOPS

Sophomore catcher Logan Koch has hit safely in three consecutive games and tallied a two-run single in Saturday's 10-1 win over Northeastern. Freshman catcher Hunter Taylor recorded his first career hit and RBI in Saturday's 6-0 win over Northeastern.

MOONEY IN THE MIDDLE

Junior infielder Marcus Mooney went 3-for-4 in Saturday's 6-0 win over Northeastern with two doubles and two runs scored. Mooney is batting .400 (4-for-10) for the year with four runs scored and a team-high three doubles

PRODUCTION

All nine Gamecocks in the starting lineup reached base at least once in the 7-1 win vs. College of Charleston with eight of nine tallying at least one hit in the 8-3 victory vs. College of Charleston as well.

AND THEN THERE WAS ONE

South Carolina senior outfielder Patrick Harrington is the last remaining active Gamecock player that was a member of the 2011 national championship team.

Harrington saw action in 26 games last year with 16 starts and compiled a .319 on=base percentage with five runs scored and nine RBI.

GAMECOCK NEWCOMERS

South Carolina baseball's recruiting class was ranked as high No. 5 in the nation as announced by Baseball America. It is the second consecutive year the Gamecocks have brought in a Top 5 class as last year's group was ranked No. 3 in the country by Baseball America.

STUDENT ASSISTANT COACHES

Two former Gamecocks will serve as student assistant coaches this year. Former infielder Scott Wingo (2008-11) and former catcher Justin Dalles (2009) have returned to campus to complete their degree requirements and are serving on the staff this year.

Dalles spent three seasons in the Baltimore Orioles organization, one year with the Philadelphia Phillies and last year in the Independent League. Dalles lettered in 2009 and earned second-team All-SEC honors on the way to being a sixth round MLB draft choice by the Orioles. Dalles hit .324 with 15 homers and 47 RBI to help lead the Gamecocks to a NCAA regional appearance.

Wingo spent the past three seasons in the Los Angeles Dodgers organization. Wingo was a four-year letterwinner at South Carolina from 2008-11 and played on both national championship teams in 2010 and 2011. Wingo served as captain his senior year in 2011, earned first-team All-SEC honors and was the Most Outstanding Player at the College World Series. He was also a two-time SEC All-Defensive team selection. Wingo played in 254 career games with the Garnet & Black, the second highest total in school history.

THIS IS SOUTH CAROLINA BASEBALL

South Carolina earned its 15th straight trip to the NCAA Regional as the 2014 team finished 44-18 and finished ranked as high as No. 22 by the USA Today coaches' poll. South Carolina went 18-12 in the SEC and is one of only two schools in the conference to finish among the top four teams in the league in both 2013 and 2014 and one of four schools in the SEC to win at least 40 games in both 2013 and 2014. South Carolina is also one of only nine schools in the nation to host a NCAA Regional in 2013 and 2014.

South Carolina won the NCAA Division I Baseball Championship in 2010 and 2011 at the College World Series. South Carolina has 11 College World Series appearances, including six in the last 13 years. The Gamecocks own the second-highest win total in the nation in the last 15 years (2000 to the present) with a 713-289 record. South Carolina is one of five schools to appear in the NCAA Regional every season in the last 15 years, including 11 NCAA Super Regional appearances in that span, one of only two schools to accomplish the feat.

Head Coach Chad Holbrook

Chad Holbrook begins his third year as head coach of the South Carolina program after directing the Gamecocks in 2014 to a 15th consecutive appearance in the NCAA Tournament. Holbrook is the only head coach in South Carolina history to have led a team to the NCAA Regionals in his first two years as head coach. His SEC winning percentage of .593 is the highest of any South Carolina coach in the first two seasons of the league and his overall winning percentage of .696 is the second-highest of any South Carolina coach in his first two seasons at the helm of the program.

The 2014 team finished 44-18 and finished ranked as high as No. 22 by the USA Today coaches' poll. South Carolina went 18-12 in the SEC and is one of only two schools in the conference to finish among the top four teams in the league in both 2013 and 2014 and one of four schools in the SEC to win at least 40 games in both 2013 and 2014. South Carolina is also one of only nine schools in the nation to host a NCAA Regional in 2013 and 2014.

Among the highlights in 2014 included a series sweep of instate rival Clemson. Holbrook's team would claim six SEC series including a pair of wins at eventual national champion Vanderbilt as well as a series victory vs. CWS participant Ole Miss. South Carolina hosted a NCAA Regional for the fifth-straight year marking the Gamecocks as one of only two schools in the nation to claim that distinction. Gamecock Nation flocked to Carolina Stadium as South Carolina set a total attendance record at 305,564 in 2014, the first time South Carolina eclipsed the 300,000-plus mark. South Carolina also set a record with 5,957 season tickets sold.

The 2014 Gamecocks led the SEC with a 2.43 earned run average that ranked ninth in the nation. The pitching staff was among the best in the country with 13 shutouts, fifth-highest in the nation, a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.03, sixth-best in the country and a 1.12 WHIP that was eighth overall. South Carolina hit .281 as a team with a .361 team on-base percentage and fielded .975 as well.

South Carolina would have seven players selected in the 2014 MLB Draft including five players in the first 11 rounds. Highlighting that group was junior catcher Grayson Greiner, who was a third round pick and the No. 99 overall selection by the Detroit Tigers. Greiner was a second-team All-America honoree by Baseball America and Perfect Game and was named he 2013-14 USC Co-Male Student-Athlete of the Year alongside Gamecock football/basketball standout Bruce Ellington. He would also be a semi-finalist for the Johnny Bench Award for the top catcher in college baseball and a member of the SEC All-Defensive team. Greiner played in 60 games with 58 starts, hit .311 (66-for-212) with 39 runs scored, 50 RBI, 13 doubles and eight homers, also a .389 on-base percentage and a .486 slugging mark. Greiner hit a team-best .327 (37-for-113) in league games with four homers and 24 RBI vs. SEC teams. Junior left-handed pitcher Jordan Montgomery was a 4th round selection by the New York Yankees after leading the pitching staff with an 8-5 record and a 3.42 ERA in a team-high 100 innings with 95 strikeouts. Montgomery became the 22nd pitcher in school history to reach the 20-win total as well. Junior infielder Joey Pankake was

a seventh round pick by the Tigers. He became the 26th player in school history to tally 200 or more hits with a double in the second inning of the Florida game at the SEC Tournament on May 22. He finished his career with 204 hits in the Garnet & Black. He started 58 games and hit .303 (67-for-221) with a team-high 52 runs scored. Junior outfielder Tanner English went in the 11th round to the Minnesota Twins after manning the center field position the entre year with 62 starts and being named to the SEC All-Defensive team. Joel Seddon also was selected in the 11th round after earning second-team All-America honors from the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association with 14 saves. He was also a second-team All-SEC choice. Junior first baseman Kyle Martin was South Carolina's best hitter with a .336 average (82-for-244) and would be picked in the 20th round but chose to return to school for the 2015 season. Right-handed pitcher Evan Beal rounded out the group as a 21st round choice by the Royals. A Gamecock newcomer also found success as freshman righthanded pitcher Wil Crowe earned Freshman All-America honors as announced by Collegiate Baseball on Wednesday morning. In his first season, Crowe went 8-3 in 15 starts with a 2.75 ERA in 91.2 innings pitched. Crowe allowed just 32 runs, 28 earned, on 76 hits with 19 walks and 59 strikeouts. Crowe was strong in his last start with the Garnet and Black as he pitched four-hit complete game shutout in a 9-0 win vs. Campbell in the NCAA Regional that earned him All-Tournament Team honors. Crowe earmed SEC Pitcher of the Week and SEC Freshman of the Week also.

The Gamecocks also shined off the field as Greiner continued a streak of a Gamecock making the Capital One Academic All-America teams to four years, following LB Dantzler's Academic All-America Division I Baseball Player of the Year nod last season and Michael Roth's two selections to the first team in 2011-12.

Holbrook's first season as head coach in 2013 saw the Gamecocks compile a 43-20 record and the school's 11th NCAA Super Regional appearance. Holbrook directed the 2013 squad to a final national ranking of No. 12 in the USA Today Baseball Coaches Poll along with No. 13 by Collegiate Baseball and Perfect Game and No. 14 by Baseball America.

Among the 2013 highlights was a series victory against Clemson, four sweeps of SEC teams and six SEC series victories including a pair of wins at LSU, the only team to go into Baton Rouge in 2013 and claim a three-game set. South Carolina hosted a NCAA Regional for the fourth straight year with the Gamecocks going undefeated in three games and continuing a run of 27 straight postseason wins at home including a 16-0 mark at Carolina Stadium. South Carolina ended the 2013 season with a total attendance of 260,605, third highest in the country.

Chad Holbrook was named head baseball coach for the University of South Carolina on July 16, 2012. Holbrook was promoted to the top spot by athletics director Ray Tanner after four seasons as associate head coach and recruiting coordinator for the Gamecocks. Holbrook came to South Carolina in July 2008 as associate head coach. Along with his recruiting coordinator duties, he served as hitting instructor, overseeing the Gamecock offense, including base running and the short game and was the third base coach. He also worked with the outfielders. Holbrook came to the Gamecock program after serving 15 seasons as a member of the University of North Carolina coaching staff. Holbrook was the 2011 ABCA/Baseball America Assistant Coach of the Year after the Gamecocks won a second consecutive national championship.
