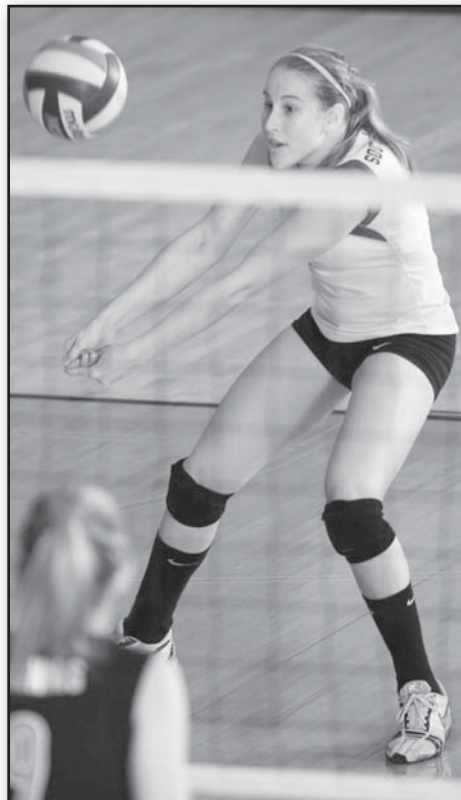

The Gamecock volleyball team ran its record to 3-1 thanks to a 3-0 (30-14, 30-27, 30-17) victory against Virginia Commonwealth in the Third Degree Sportsweek Invitational.

Hannah Lawing reached double figures in kills for the Gamecocks with 10 on 23 attacks, and she added 11 digs for her first career double-double. Dani Bedore and Belita Salters each had nine kills apiece for Carolina, and Salters notched a career-high with four solo blocks. Her total also tied for the second-most in school history for a three-game match. Sarah Cline led in digs with 15, and Jordan Bradosky had the first double-double of her career with 20 assists and 13 defensive saves. Petra Lorenzi had 16 assists and seven digs as well.

Carolina dominated in nearly every statistical category, holding a 49-29 edge in kills and a 61-45 upper hand in digs. The Gamecocks' nine service aces was triple the total of VCU, and their hitting percentage of .292 (49-14-12) was almost 250 points higher than the Rams' figure (.050, 29-23-121). In the first game, South Carolina connected on its attacks at a 36.8 percent mark (18-4-38).

With South Carolina leading, 16-12, in game one, Bedore got a kill off a feed from Bradosky to put her team on top by five. She served up consecutive aces to give the Gamecocks' a 19-12 advantage and forced a Virginia Commonwealth timeout. Up 21-14, South Carolina ran off nine straight points, with Cline serving for eight of them and posting two aces and one kill along the way.

VCU bounced back in the second game and went ahead, 15-10, following a kill by Rich. After a timeout, South Carolina went on a 7-1 run to snag a 17-16 lead. The frame was tied at 25-all before the Gamecocks strung together four points in a row. Bedore closed out the three-point win with a kill.

Carolina wasted no time finishing off the Rams in game three, jumping out to a 10-2 lead that was capped by a Salters block against Mariel Frey. The lead swelled to double digits for the Gamecocks at 17-7 after Rich misfired on an attack. Carolina would go up by as many as 14 (29-15) before winning, 30-17.

Approaching record-level efficiency in hitting percentage, South Carolina downed Troy, 30-14, 30-15, 30-22, in the fourth and final match on Friday at the 2007 Nike Gamecock Invitational.

Dani Bedore put down 11 kills in the contest to lead the Gamecocks. Ivana Kujundzic had another standout match, dropping 10 kills in the match while ranking second on the squad with seven digs. Dinelia Concepcion recorded 12 digs in the contest, while Jordan Bradosky finished with 27 assists. Megan Laughlin had three solo blocks, becoming the second Gamecock this season to block three shots or more alone in a match and the second time in four matches the freshman has achieved this level.

The Gamecocks dominated game one, hitting .630 in the frame with 17 kills, as Kujundzic had seven of those. Even more amazing was the fact that USC did not make an error in the game. Contrast that with the seven made by the Trojans and one can see how well the Garnet and Black controlled the first.

Game two had one Gamecock record her first career kill during the 30-15 victory. Erin Kennedy hammered down her initial kill during the frame. South Carolina checked in with a .400 hitting percentage in the frame, compared to a -.029 by Troy. The Gamecocks posted 17 kills for the second consecutive game and made only three errors.

Jordan Kennedy made her debut during the 30-22 game three win, and she made the night memorable for the Kennedy clan. Jordan also recorded her first career kill during the third frame. Christine Hauer put down her first kill in Columbia during the final game, where the Gamecocks hit at a .500 clip. Troy had its only positive hitting percentage of the evening, checking in at .267.

Overall, the .500 hitting percentage for the three-game match ties this outing for third best in program annals, meeting the same standard hit on Sept. 27, 2002, against Auburn. And for the first time this season, all 16 Gamecocks recorded court time.

Freshmen Megan Laughlin and Annie Thomas led the Gamecocks with nine kills each. Junior libero Dinella Concepcion finished with 13 digs to top the squad.

Georgia got off to a good start in game one, running out to a 5-1 lead. The Gamecocks responded after a Dani Bedore kill. Five straight points on Laughlin's serve put the Garnet ahead at 7-5. The teams swapped points until 10-8, when Taylor got her second kill of the match. Valentina Gonzalez followed with back-to-back aces to put Auburn up, 11-10. Each team would go on mini runs until 23-23, when Clark stepped up and got a big kill to put the Bulldogs up. In game one, the Bayou Bengals took control early, running out to a 9-3 lead before the Gamecocks would call time out to try to halt the momentum. Behind career-highs in both kills and digs from Caitlin Weiss, Mississippi defeated South Carolina, 30-23, 30-22, 27-30, 30-26, at the Gillom Sports Center.

Ivana Kujundzic led the Gamecocks with 15 kills, while Belita Salters hit .500 with 14 kills and match-best eight blocks. Meredith Moorhead had 11 kills behind a .423 hitting percentage, and libero Dinelia Concepcion added 18 digs. Setter Petra Lorenzi had a season-high 31 assists.

Both teams came out hot in game one, with the Rebels hitting .424 in the 30-23 win. South Carolina hit .333 behind a perfect Salters, who had four kills in the frame. The Gamecocks once again put up a valiant effort after falling down 2-0, but Alabama proved to be too much, as the Crimson Tide, led by seniors Crystal Hudson and Bridget Fuentez, take a 3-1 win over South Carolina in the CAVE.

Ivana Kujundzic led the Gamecocks with her third double-double of the year, recording 13 kills and 12 digs, both team highs. Belita Salters tied Kujundzic with 13 kills, while Meredith Moorhead knocked down 12 kills with a team-leading .458 hitting percentage. Megan Laughlin also had 10 kills in the contest, while Hannah Lawing tied Kujundzic for top honors with 12 digs. Dinelia Concepcion added 10 digs.

Alabama ran away with the first game behind five runs of three points or more. The first of those gave the Tide a 7-4 lead before Dani Bedore ended the run with her first kill of the match. Four Gamecocks had double-digit kills to lead Carolina to a 3-1 win over Mississippi State, 30-19, 26-30, 30-28, 30-27, in the Newell-Grisson Building.

Ivana Kujundzic had her second straight double-double, collecting 17 digs along with 12 kills. Meredith Moorhead collected a career-high 18 kills to lead the South Carolina volleyball team to a 3-1 triumph over Tennessee, 23-30, 30-27, 30-23, 30-22, at the Volleyball Competition Facility.

Ivana Kujundzic and Megan Laughlin assisted Moorhead, as both tallied 15 kills. Kujundzic collected her third straight double-double, adding 11 digs as well. Laughlin also paced the squad with a .500 hitting percentage. Libero Sarah Cline had her third 20-dig match of the campaign and second consecutive with 21, while Hannah Lawing had 16 digs along with nine kills.

Carolina ran out to a 15-12 lead in the first game behind three kills from Salters before the Lady Vols started their comeback. Two kills from Hinkey around one from Fowler caused the Gamecocks to call timeout to try to stop the run. UT's Milan Clarke would get one more in to give Tennessee its first lead since 2-1 before Bedore stopped the streak with a kill. The Big Orange would not be stopped, though, as they took six of the next seven points to get a 22-17 advantage. A Lawing kill and a ball handling error brought the Garnet to within three, but they would not get closer. The Lady Vols ended the game getting five of the final six points, including an ace from Fowler to set up game point. Tennessee hit .316, while UT also got six blocks in the frame.

After UT fought back with a pair of small runs, the Garnet stretched the lead back out to eight after a Laughlin ace and a block by Lawing and Salters. After Tennessee got within three at 18-15, the Gamecocks ran off three more points on kills by Laughlin and Kujundzic and a block by the duo. Tennessee would get within one at 23-22 after three errors by Carolina. But the squad would rebound, taking four straight points on kills from freshman Dani Bedore, Kujundzic and Moorhead along with a block from Salters and Moorhead put the Gamecocks up, 28-24. Tennessee tried to fight back with a pair of points, but USC would not allow it, ending the game with a Kujundzic kill, her fifth of the frame. Five Gamecock blocks helped Carolina capture the game.

Game three saw the Gamecocks fight back from a 10-8 deficit to take a 16-13 advantage on an amazing play from Laughlin. First, she kept the point alive with a sliding save at the net to send a free ball over. Then the freshman got the point with one of her seven kills in the game. The Lady Vols took the next two points, but USC answered with two of its own. After South Carolina stretched the lead to 22-17, Tennessee closed the gap with four of the next six points. South Carolina responded with a five-point run with three kills from Bedore, Lawing and Laughlin. A Tennessee error ended the game, one of seven in the game for the Lady Vols.

South Carolina pushed ahead in game four at the midway point after falling behind, 8-5 and 12-9, taking six of seven points to move to a 15-13 lead. Two kills in the run came from Moorhead. After the squads traded side outs, the Garnet and Black went on another three-point run behind Bedore and Kujundzic kills and a Kujundzic ace. The Gamecocks would get two more aces over the course of the game, including one from freshman setter Jordan Bradosky, her third of the match, to close out the victory.

Megan Laughlin led South Carolina with a career-high-tying 17 kills, but Kentucky's Queen Nzenwa had 20 kills to lead the Wildcats to a 3-1 victory over the Gamecocks, 34-36, 30-28, 30-27, 30-26.

Ivana Kujundzic compiled her fourth-consecutive double-double, tallying 15 kills and 10 digs. Laughlin also topped the squad with four blocks, three aces and a .364 hitting percentage. Belita Salters and Dani Bedore both collected 10 kills, while Bedore tied Laughlin with three service aces. Libero Sarah Cline led the team with 24 digs, her third straight match over 20, while Hannah Lawing had 11 digs. Setter Petra Lorenzi had her second double-double of the year with 32 assists and 10 digs.

Neither team wanted to give up in game one, with the Gamecocks eventually getting the win, 36-34. The Wildcats would get a 22-19 lead before Lawing ended a run. The Gamecocks went back ahead at 28-26 behind a Kujundzic ace, a Laughlin kill and a block by Lawing and Laughlin. The Big Blue would respond with a three-point run of their own, getting a point away from ended the frame after a handling error by the Garnet. But South Carolina would answer back on a Laughlin kill. USC took back the lead, 31-30 after a block from Lawing and Salters and an ace from Bedore. Kentucky would get back the advantage after a Nzenwa kill and a Gamecock error. The Wildcats responded with a four-point run, led by consecutive kills from Bartek. The Gamecocks tried to fight back, getting consecutive points to bring it within one at 25-26 after a Bedore kill and a Kentucky hitting error. But the Wildcats would benefit from a USC hitting error, while a Nzenwa kill pushed the lead out to 28-25. With Kentucky at game point, Salters got a kill, while a UK error gave the Gamecocks hope. But Bartek would end the threat with her seventh kill of the game.

Kentucky would run out to an 11-6 lead, this time getting five consecutive points on two kills from Britenriker and one from Sarah Mendoza and a block from the duo. After chipping away with two three-point runs, Carolina went on top at 19-17 on a Kujundzic kill and punctuated by a Bedore smash after a long serve reception came back over the net. The Wildcats rebounded with four points of their own to take a 21-19 lead, as three straight points came from Britenriker before she would fall to the floor on the fourth after a USC error. The Wildcats' leading attacker would not return after hopping off the playing surface. The Gamecocks tied it up at 22-22 behind Laughlin's third ace of the game, but Kentucky ran off three more points behind a pair of kills from Nzenwa. South Carolina closed the gap to one, 26-25, after kills from Moorhead and Kujundzic, but Kentucky would hold on, closing out the frame with kills from Lauren Rapp and Hiler. Nzenwa hit a perfect 7-for-7 in the game, helping the Wildcats to a .425 hitting percentage.

Carolina got out to a 17-11 lead behind a run of four points that included a Laughlin kill and solo block and a Jordan Bradosky ace. Despite a career-best effort from Ivana Kujundzic, the Gamecocks fell in a hard-fought match, 3-2, to Georgia, 23-30, 30-25, 34-32, 25-30, 16-14.

Kujundzic tallied her eighth double-double of the season, digging 14 balls to go with her career high 26 kills. Hannah Lawing collected her third double-double with 11 kills and 11 digs in her return to her home state. Salters compiled a career-best 20 kills and a season-high 10 blocks for the Gamecocks. Cline tied the program record with 36 digs in the contest. Lorenzi had 11 digs and 29 assists, while Lawing had a career-best 14 kills and 23 digs, just two off the high she set against LSU. Lawing also matched career-best marks with three assists and two aces. Ivana Kujundzic just missed a double-double, making 17 kills while getting nine digs. Megan Laughlin added 15 kills, while Meredith Moorhead had 11. Jordan Bradosky also narrowly missed a double-double, making a match-best 39 assists and nine digs.

South Carolina got control of game one after consecutive kills from Salters gave the Gamecocks a 11-9 lead. That grew to 14-9 after an Arkansas ball handling error, another spike from Salters and an ace from Lawing. The lead expanded to 18-11 after kills by Kujundzic and freshman Dani Bedore. Arkansas cut the Carolina lead to two after kills from Dorrell and Lindsay Scanlan and a USC attack error. However, the Gamecocks would come back to put the game away, first getting a Kujundzic kill followed by a LadyBack attack error before closing out the match on kills from Kujundzic and Laughlin and a Kujundzic ace.

Carolina ran out to a 6-2 advantage behind a Lorenzi ace and back-to-back kills from Kujundzic in the second game. Arkansas cut the lead to one at 11-10 after two blocks around a Dorrell kill. The LadyBacks would tie the Gamecocks but not overtake them until a four-point run put them up, 23-21. Carolina would tie it back up at 23-23 after a Lawing ace. But the Hogs would get the lead on a three-point skein that saw Dorrell get a kill and an ace. Arkansas closed out the game taking three of the final four points, ending it with its fifth block of the frame. The Hogs hit .316 in the frame.

The Gamecocks took a 7-2 lead thanks to two kills from Laughlin. Arkansas would charge back to take a 13-10 advantage on a six-point streak that had two kills from Dorrell. Carolina tied it back up at 22-22 after a block from Salters and Lawing and an Arkansas attack error. Both squads had advantages later, including the LadyBacks having a game-point opportunity after a Christina Lawrence kill. But Salters kept the game going with one of her five kills in the frame. Eventually, the LadyBacks got a kill from McCormick and a block from McCormick and Sarah Freudenrich to take the 37-35 win. Dorrell had 13 kills alone in game three, half of Arkansas' output. Carolina made 38 digs in the frame.

The fourth game saw the Gamecocks get a 7-3 lead after a Salters and Lawing block and a block error by the Hogs. Arkansas took a 18-12 advantage before South Carolina tied it up at 19-19 after a Moorhead kill and a block from Moorhead and Salters sparked a four-point swing. Arkansas had a chance, going ahead 26-24 after a Dorrell kill and a block from Dorrell and Freudenrich. But Carolina tied it up again after a Dinelia Concepcion ace. Dorrell put Arkansas back up one, but the Gamecocks responded with four consecutive points to wrap up the game. Salters had the kill to put USC up by one before she ended it with a solo block to send the match into game five.

In game five, The Gamecocks closed to within one at 10-9 after a Lawing kill and a block by Salters and Moorhead. But Arkansas would put together two points of its own, getting another Dorrell kill followed by a Carolina attack error. Lawing ended the run with a smash, while Salters and Bedore brought the Garnet to within one with a block. Dorrell had an attack error before Bradosky put an ace in front of a LadyBack defensive specialist to put USC up. Kujundzic put the Gamecocks on the brink of victory, but Bradosky added some suspense, putting her serve in the net. But she redeemed herself shortly after, setting Bedore for the match-clinching kill.

Megan Laughlin had 13 kills for Carolina, but Kentucky had four players with double-digit kills to take a 3-0 sweep, 30-19, 30-24, 30-28, at Memorial Coliseum.

Laughlin was the only Gamecock with double-digit kills, while fellow rookie Jordan Bradosky had a double-double with 20 assists and 10 digs. Libero Sarah Cline had 14 digs to top Carolina.

Kentucky handily got the game one victory. After a three-point Carolina run cut Kentucky's lead to 11-9, the Wildcats put together an impressive streak, getting 10 of the next 11 points, including seven in a row, to take a 21-10 lead. After Salters ended the streak with a smash, the Wildcats tacked on two more on a Mendoza kill and a Gamecock error. The teams traded side outs with one exception till a Carolina service error ended the frame. Mendoza had six kills in the game, while Nzenwa had five kills and two blocks. The Wildcats hit .429 in the win.

The Wildcats took an 8-3 advantage, led by a pair of kills from Britenriker, early in game two. South Carolina made it 9-7 after kills from Dani Bedore and Hannah Lawing and a block from Bedore and Salters. A Gamecock blocking error and a block from Nzenwa and setter Sarah Rumely put the Blue back up by four. The Garnet and Black chipped away at the lead, getting back-to-back points from Laughlin on a kill and a block with Bedore. Carolina later tied it at 17-17 after successive blocks from sophomore Meredith Moorhead, first assisted by Salters before a big solo block. The Wildcats came back with four consecutive points, two on Nzenwa kills, to take a 22-20 lead. Kentucky closed out the game on a three-point skein, getting two kills from Britenriker before she landed an ace to finish it out. Britenriker had eight kills and three blocks in game two to lead the Wildcats.

In game three, the Big Blue got an 11-9 lead after taking four out of five points. Rumely had the first two of the stretch, first on a dump and then an ace. Carolina went back ahead with three consecutive points, as a Laughlin solo block was surrounded by Wildcat errors. Kentucky went back ahead, 21-18, after taking six of nine points. Four different Wildcats had kills in the stretch that also included a block from Nzenwa and Rapp. The Gamecocks made a stand after the Big Blue got a 28-24 advantage. Kills from Laughlin sandwiched around a Bedore smash brought Carolina within one, forcing the Wildcats to call a timeout. The break did not help immediately, as sophomore Ivana Kujundzic made a kill to tie the game. But Kentucky would come back to close it out, getting a block from Rapp and Britenriker before Rumely ended it with a dump.

Belita Salters matched her career high with 20 kills, but that was not enough to turn away Tennessee, as the Lady Vols defeated the Gamecocks in five games, 30-28, 30-17, 27-30, 33-35, 15-11, on Sunday afternoon at the Stokely Athletic Center.

Megan Laughlin also matched a career high with 17 kills. Meredith Moorhead tallied 15 kills, while Ivana Kujundzic compiled her 12th double-double of the season with 14 kills and 16 digs. Setters Petra Lorenzi and Jordan Bradosky also tallied double-doubles, as Lorenzi had a season-best 50 assists and 14 digs and Bradosky had 20 assists and 14 digs. Libero Sarah Cline had 26 digs in the match.

The Gamecocks came back from an early 3-1 deficit to take an 11-9 advantage after getting five out of six points in one stretch. Tennessee answered with a similar skein to take a 14-12 lead, getting a kill and block from Hinkey in there. Carolina had a 26-23 lead before the Lady Vols went on a five-point run to get the lead they needed. Three straight Gamecock errors started the stretch that was continued by a kill from Marshall and an ace from Loyd. Fowler closed out the frame with two of her five kills in the game.

In game two, Carolina got a 5-2 lead thanks in part to three Lady Vol errors. The Big Orange came back to take an 8-6 advantage, getting two kills and a block from Yuliya Stoyanova. After the Gamecocks tied it up at 10-10, Tennessee went back up 13-10 after back-to-back kills from Fowler. That lead grew to 18-12 before the Garnet and Black closed to within three at 19-16 behind a pair of Bedore kills and a Moorhead smash. But that would be as close as the Gamecocks got, as Tennessee ran off nine straight points. Laughlin stopped the run with a kill, but the Lady Vols ended the frame with kills from Powe and Fowler. Fowler had eight kills, while Tennessee had a .364 hitting percentage in the game.

The Gamecocks got an 8-4 lead in game three, getting two kills each from Laughlin and Kujundzic and a block from the duo. Tennessee got within one at 16-15 after a block from Berg and Powe. But Carolina went back up by four after a three-point run, led by kills from Laughlin and Bradosky. Tennessee would get within one at 28-27 after a Stoyanova and Powe block and a Fowler kill, but South Carolina closed out the game behind Salters' 10th kill and a block from Salters and freshman Erin Kennedy.

The Lady Vols got nine consecutive points, getting two blocks and two kills from Hinkey in the stretch, to take a 12-5 advantage. Carolina chipped away at the lead, bringing it to 20-18 after a Laughlin kill and a block by Laughlin and Lisa Shelley. After Tennessee stretched the lead back out, 27-24, Carolina made it one again after a UT service error and a Laughlin kill. Shelley tied up the match, 28-28, with her first career kill. A Laughlin ace put Carolina at game point, but Fowler kept UT alive with a kill. A USC hitting error put the Lady Vols on the brink of the match win. But Salters drilled one to tie the match back up at 30-30. Carolina got its first game-point chance at 33-32 following a block from Laughlin and Kujundzic. A Gamecock hitting error continued the match, but the Lady Vols gave the advantage back on a blocking error. After another long rally, Moorhead stepped up and hit a ball cross court that Tennessee couldn't handle, giving the Gamecocks the 35-33 victory.

In the deciding game, kills from Hinkey and Powe put UT on top, 12-6. The Gamecocks responded with four of the next five points to bring it within three at 13-10. But a service error would push the Lady Vols back to match point. Salters extended it, but Fowler hit a smash down the line to clinch the victory.

Great hitting performances from Belita Salters and Meredith Moorhead propelled the Gamecocks to a 3-0 sweep of Mississippi State, 30-24, 30-20, 32-30, in the Volleyball Competition Facility.

Moorhead led the way with her 14 kills and .423 hitting percentage. Salters added 10 kills and a match-best four blocks while hitting .421. Ivana Kujundzic had 12 kills. Libero Sarah Cline topped all players with her 18 digs, while Hannah Lawing added 10. Setter Jordan Bradosky just missed a double-double, getting 15 assists and nine digs.

The Gamecocks got out to a 12-8 advantage in game one on a four-point run that had kills from Moorhead and Salters and an ace from Lawing. The lead grew to 17-10 after Mississippi State had trouble setting the ball, being called for three set or handling miscues in a five-point stretch. The Bulldogs closed the gap to 17-15 thanks to kills from setter Eva Kriegel and Ashley Newsome. But Carolina answered, taking a 20-16 lead after a kill from freshman outside hitter Dani Bedore and a block from Bedore and Salters. The Garnet and Black closed out the game taking four of the final five points, including a smash from Bedore to wrap it up. Four Gamecocks had three kills or more in the frame, while the squad hit .333.

Carolina controlled game two from the start, running out to a 11-3 lead. The Maroon and White answered with a five-point skein, led by a pair of block assists from Erin Seago. Kujundzic stopped the run with a kill before Bedore made one for the Gamecocks on her own, getting consecutive smashes. Kujundzic followed those with a pair of aces to put USC up, 16-8. After Carolina took a 25-13 lead, State made a stand, eventually getting to within nine after back-to-back kills from Ioana Demian. But Salters would close out the frame with a spike to put the Gamecocks on top, 2-0. Moorhead had five kills in game two to lead the Gamecocks.

The Bulldogs went out strong in game three, taking a 14-8 lead after a four-point streak that included a pair of Demian kills. Carolina fought back, cutting a seven-point lead down to one behind a pair of Salters kills and block assists. After the Garnet and Black tied it up twice, State took back the advantage after a four-point run. Demian had a kill and block assist during that stretch. A South Carolina timeout at least helped end the streak, but it did not last long. The squads traded side outs until a Gamecock service error put the Bulldogs up, 25-21. A Bulldog attack error ended the match in Carolina's favor. Kujundzic had seven kills in the final game to lead South Carolina.

The South Carolina volleyball team ended its 2007 season on a high note, sweeping NCAA Tournament hopeful Alabama, 30-27, 30-16, 33-31.

Belita Salters had 13 kills to lead the Gamecocks, while Meredith Moorhead added 10. Libero Sarah Cline topped the squad with 16 digs, while Hannah Lawing and Ivana Kujundzic had 13 and 12, respectively. Middle blocker Megan Laughlin compiled six blocks in the match to pace Carolina.

Carolina never trailed in the first game, getting a four-point lead at 10-6 following a Salters kill and a Bama attack error. The Tide knotted up the match at 13-13 after consecutive kills by Hudson and a Gamecock error. Laughlin put South Carolina ahead for good with her kill of a Jordan Bradosky set. The Garnet and Black moved ahead 19-15 on a three-point run that included kills from Moorhead, Kujundzic and Salters. Alabama got within one at 20-19 on kills from Lindsey Buteyn and Hudson, but Carolina stretched the lead out to five behind a pair of kills from freshman Dani Bedore. Alabama made it interesting, getting three straight points on a Buteyn kill and block with Liz Salstrand and a USC handling error to make it 29-27. But an errant Tide serve wrapped up the game for Carolina. Bedore hit .667 with four kills to lead the Gamecocks in the frame, helping the squad to a .317 hitting percentage.

The Gamecocks ran away with game two early. After a pair of aces from the freshman setter Bradosky made it 8-3, Alabama head coach Judy Green called timeout, but it barely fazed Carolina. The lead grew to 15-7 after two separate three-point skeins. The big dagger came soon after, as the Gamecocks went on a six-point run during Cline's serve that included kills from Kujundzic and Moorhead and a Kujundzic block. That run gave Carolina a 23-9 advantage. Salters ended the frame with her ninth kill of the match. The Garnet and Black defense held Alabama to a -.054 hitting percentage in the game, helped by four Carolina blocks.

Alabama came out fired up in game three, taking an 8-5 lead on kills from Fuentez and Salstrand and a block from Hudson and Salstrand. Carolina came back to take a 10-9 lead after two kills and a block assist by the freshman Lawing. Alabama took back a two-point advantage after a pair of Hudson kills and a block by Hudson and Webster. That lead inched out to 18-15 after a Webster ace. Carolina tied it up again at 19-19 before the Tide got kills from Fuentez and Hudson to go back ahead, 22-19. The Gamecocks answered again to tie it at 22-22, but Alabama kept pushing, getting a 27-24 lead after a Buteyn kill and an ace by setter Brigitte Slack. South Carolina got within one at 28-27 after an Alabama service error and a Cline ace. Fuentez would take Alabama to game point after a kill, but a Crimson Tide attack error kept the Gamecocks alive. Laughlin and Kujundzic got a big block to tie up the match at 29-29 before a Bradosky ace gave Carolina the chance at match point. A Gamecock blocking error tied up the match again before Hudson gave Alabama the chance to force game four after her 11th kill. But Mary Catherine Aune's serve went long, knotting up the match again. Kujundzic got a kill to give Carolina a chance to close out the match, and a Tide hitting error did just that.



Belita Salters continued her rise up the Carolina all-time charts in 2007, as she now ranks seventh in blocks per game with 1.10 in her career. She finished the year 10th in the Southeastern Conference with 1.21.



Hannah Lawing became the first Gamecock to earn Southeastern Conference Defensive Player of the Week accolades on Oct. 29.
