Gamecocks Take Break from SEC with Game at Winthrop, DH vs. Longwood

South Carolina steps out of conference play for its next three games, first traveling to face Winthrop on Wednesday night at Terry Field before hosting Longwood in a doubleheader on Saturday. First pitch in Rock Hill is set for 7 p.m. on Wednesday, while Saturday's twinbill begins at 1 p.m. A live audio stream for all three games will be on GamecocksOnline.com, while live stats will also be available.

Garcia Still Strong Atop Lineup

Shortstop Samie Garcia ranks second on the team and fifth in the SEC with a .409 batting average and with 45 hits. She's also sixth in the SEC in runs, tied for fifth in sixth and knotted at seventh for doubles.

The junior saw her 21-game hitting streak snapped in the first game versus Arkansas (3/9), the second-longest documented skein in Gamecock history. Her biggest day came in front of family and a large crowd at the Highlander Classic, when Garcia went 3-for-4 with the game-tying RBI double in the 3-2 comeback win over UC Davis. And during the Blue & Gold Feisberg Memorial, she led the team with nine RBI in the event. Her grand slam versus Providence helped propel South Carolina to the 9-1 (5) win.

Childs Prefers to Trot . . .

Senior third baseman Evan Childs has tallied nine homers on the year, tied for third most in a single season at South Carolina. Two came in the Gamecocks' series-clinching 8-7 victory over Arkansas on March 11, the second-career two-homer game for Childs, tying the program's single-game record again. She hit the second homer off Florida Gator pitching this season on March 18. With 15 in her career, she's tied for seventh on South Carolina's all-time list with Samantha Jennings and Tina Plew. She's vying to be the first Gamecock since McKenna Hughes (2004-07) to lead the team in homers twice in her career.

While Lackey Likes Stretching It to Three . . .

Senior outfielder Lauren Lackey has four triples on the year, tying for the SEC lead. Lackey is looking to be the first Gamecock since Ashton Payne in 2007-08 to lead the team in triples in consecutive seasons. Tied for ninth on the Gamecocks' career triples chart with nine, one more would push Lackey into a tie for seventh with two former standouts, including two-time All-American Karen Sanchelli.

Westfall A Double Machine in 2012

Senior leftfielder Kaitlin Westfall leads the SEC with 14 doubles this season, one shy of making South Carolina's single-season top-10 list. Westfall has four more than her closest competition in the league. Five of Westfall's came in the Blue & Gold Feisberg Memorial, as she posted two each in wins over Illinois-Chicago and Villanova.

Carolina in the Month of March

Since 1984, the Gamecocks are 422-222-3 (.655) in the third month of the year. Last season, the mark was 8-11 in March for South Carolina.

Childs' Game-Ending Blast New Feeling for These Gamecocks

South Carolina senior Evan Childs ended the series finale against Arkansas with a two-run home run, helping the team claim its first win of the season when trailing heading into the seventh inning. Childs' walk-off shot is the first for the Gamecocks since McKenna Hughes ended a nine-inning affair against Ole Miss in similar fashion in the second game of the doubleheader on May 5, 2007. It was Hughes' ninth round-tripper in her program-best 11-homer year.

The Long Ball Proving to Be Bellweather Again for Gamecocks

The 2012 Gamecocks have tallied 28 homers on the year, tied with the 1994 team for the fifth-highest total in program history. And yet again, the homers point to good things for the team. South Carolina is 13-3 when sending at least one ball out, while it is 3-12 when going without a triple or homer. Last season, the Gamecocks went 17-6 in games in which they hit a homer while winning just three games when the team did not record at least one triple or one home run.

Starting Things Right Very Important for Gamecocks

The Gamecocks thrive when they reach base to start an inning. As a team, South Carolina gets on base at a .412 clip to begin a frame. In the 18 contests where the team has started two or fewer innings with a base runner reaching, the Gamecocks are 6-12.

Hits Kept Coming vs. Charlotte

South Carolina posted 18 hits in the victory at Charlotte on Feb. 29. That mark is the best since March 5, 2005, when the Gamecocks had 20 in a 15-2 win over South Dakota State.

Hathorn Leads Gamecocks to Walkoff Win vs. Charlotte

Sophomore second baseman Dana Hathorn stepped up with another big hit to lead the Gamecocks over Charlotte on March 14. She poked a single to left to score Kaitlin Westfall from third and give South Carolina its second comeback win in four days.

Hathorn's biggest game of the year came in the Feb. 22 win over Winthrop, when she provided two two-run doubles to help lead the team to a 9-1 win in five innings over the Eagles.

Gonzales Coming on Strong

Junior catcher Shelby Gonzales knew there'd be an adjustment period in her first year of NCAA Division I softball. Last season's NJCAA Division I RBI leader has seemed to make those in recent weeks. She's fourth on the team with a .424 on-base percentage and with three home runs. She's been big with runners in scoring position and two outs, going 5-for-8 and driving in eight runs.

Big RBI Games Already Surpassing Last Year

The Gamecocks have posted five four-RBI games already in 2012, three more than what the team did in the whole of 2011. Sophomores Chelsea Hawkins (2/11) and Dana Hathorn (2/22) both drove home four in wins over Winthrop, while junior Samie Garcia had a grand slam in the win over Providence (2/17). Senior Evan Childs has two four-RBI games on the season, the last in the comeback triumph over Arkansas to clinch the series on March 11.

Hawkins Providing Thump

Sophomore Chelsea Hawkins has provided a lot of power for the Gamecocks this season, hitting five homers, two shy of making South Carolina's top-10 single-season charts. She's driven in 20 runs, tied for second on the team, and stands third in batting average (.330) and slugging percentage (.526). The only blemish is the 24 strikeouts in 97 at bats.

Horseshoes, Hand Grenades, Etc.

In last year's 26-30 season, South Carolina went 7-11 in one-run games and 1-3 in extra-inning affairs. Turning half of those one-run losses into wins would move the Gamecocks a long way to their goal of NCAA Tournament eligibility. The Gamecocks stand at 1-1 in extra-inning games this season, getting a 5-4 victory in eight over Western Kentucky, and hold a 5-4 mark in one-run games.

Howser a Bullpen Ace in Early Going

Freshman Katelynn Howser has done some of her best work in 2012 out of the bullpen. In 14 relief appearances, she's picked up three saves, which ranks ninth on South Carolina's single-season chart, and three of her eight wins. In the 40.1 innings of relief, she's posted a 2.60 ERA. In her 11 starts, she's 5-4, tossing five complete games and posting a 3.66 ERA in 51.2 innings.

Early Season Schedule Provided Tests

While the first glance at South Carolina's pre-conference schedule may lead one to think that they should have all been easy games, closer examination says otherwise. Three of the contests came against defending conference champions and NCAA Tournament teams in Illinois-Chicago (Horizon), Jacksonville (Atlantic Sun) and Portland State (Pacific Coast Softball). The Gamecocks went 2-1 in those games, including shutting out the UIC Flames.

Seven Games of HR Equals 2009 Season Total

South Carolina combined to hit 13 homers in the seven-game stretch from Feb. 28-March 4. That total matches what the 2009 team did in 45 games and surpassed the outputs of both 2008 and 2010. In 31 games in 2012, South Carolina has hit 28 homers, three more than in the whole of 2011. The program record is 38 long balls in a season, set in 2003.

South Carolina Defense Downfall in Early Losses

A common strand ran through the first three Gamecock losses: defensive errors and unearned runs. South Carolina committed seven errors combined and allowed nine unearned runs. Only the Tennessee State game would have stay tied without those runs; the rest would all favor the Gamecocks. Errors also haunted the Gamecocks in the first game against Mississippi State, as four unearned runs crossed in the 10-6 setback on March 13.

Last season, South Carolina went 21-19 when making one or no errors. That record fell to 5-7 in games with two errors. When the Gamecocks made three or more errors, they went 0-4. This season, the Gamecocks are 15-10 when making one or less errors but 4-6 when committing two or more.

Broyles Goes the Distance and More

Redshirt junior Audrey Broyles passed a personal milestone in her first start of 2012, tossing 117 pitches in the complete-game victory over Western Kentucky. That marked the first time since 2010 that Broyles had thrown that many pitches, when she threw 120 in the loss at Florida Atlantic. Broyles felt so strong that she tossed another 1.1 innings against Winthrop immediately following.

The Pembroke Pines, Fla., product leads the Gamecocks with a 2.23 ERA, tossing 47 innings this season. She made her first relief appearance of the year on March 11 and held Arkansas scoreless for the final 3.2 innings in the 8-7 comeback win. And when things get tough, she gets better, as the chart shows.

South Carolina Offense Posts Back-to-Back 10+ Run Games

South Carolina rebounded from a two-hit effort in the first game against Charleston Southern to post consecutive 10+ run games. The Gamecocks rebounded with a 11-2 win in five innings over the Buccaneers on the nightcap of Feb. 28 before posting a 13-7 win at Charlotte on Feb. 29. The last time South Carolina scored 10+ in consecutive games was on April 3, 2005 when the Gamecocks run-ruled Kentucky in both halves of a doubleheader in Lexington by scores of 12-2 and 10-1.

On five occasions, the Gamecocks have posted double-digit runs, matching the team's best in the SEC era, hit by last year's squad and the 1997 league champions. The most recent team with more than five is the 1996 group, which posted 10 10+ run outings.

White Getting the Chance to Start and Finish

Senior pitcher Kierstyn White tossed her first career shutout on the trip to Miami. She blanked defending Horizon League champs Illinois-Chicago, coming within two outs of a no-hitter. The two-hit shutout stands out even more due to White's efficiency, using 74 pitches to get through the seven-inning affair.

In the past, White closed out other pitcher's starts, finishing 36 games over her first two years, Now, she has a chance to start and finish them, posting five complete games in 11 starts in '12.

Gamecocks Among Most Experienced Teams in NCAA Division I

South Carolina has 10 seniors listed on the roster for 2012, which is believed to be the most in NCAA Division I this year. Seven position starters return from last year, losing starters at catcher and designated player. When removing two players expected to sit out this year due to injury along with the starts by last year's seniors, the Gamecocks bring back 92.3 percent of their outfield starts and 84.8 percent of infield starts from third to first.

A Much Better Showing in 2011

South Carolina posted one of the best turnarounds in the country last year, the first under Beverly Smith. The 12 1/2 game improvement tied for 12th in NCAA Division I, and the mark was the eighth best for a team that finished 2010 under .500.

Coaches Know a Bit about Winning

Last season was outside of the norm for the Gamecock coaching staff. Both head coach Beverly Smith and assistant coach Janelle Breneman came down from North Carolina, which was ranked in the top 25 in each of their last five seasons in Chapel Hill, while the Tar Heels made NCAA Tournament appearances eight times during Smith's tenure. Calvin Beamon also knows something about winning, claiming crowns at all three of his amateur stops. A high school state champion at Smoky Hill High School in Cherry Creek, Colo., Beamon won the NJCAA Division I title in 2003 at the College of Southern Nevada and the College World Series at Texas during 2005.

Scouting the Winthrop Eagles

Winthrop enters Wednesday's contest with an 11-20 record overall, dropping 10 straight, including five of those to top-25 teams in a tournament at Hawai'i. The Eagles are struggling everywhere but defensively, with the team holding a .970 fielding percentage.

Offensively, the Eagles rely on the duo of Chelsey Schoenfeldt and Megan Chapman. Schoenfeldt leads the team with a .360/.437/.517 line and with 29 RBI. She's one of four Eagles with three home runs. Chapman leads the team with 10 stolen bases in 15 tries and ranks second with a .345 batting average and .433 on-base percentage. McKenzi Corn leads Winthrop with 14 runs scored and is 7-for-9 in stolen base tries.

Natalie Becker tosses most of the Eagles' innings, posting a 3.53 ERA with 107 strikeouts and 71 walks in 101 innings. Schoenfeldt has struck out 33 and walked 16 in 75.2 innings, posting a 4.53 ERA. Foes are hitting .350 against Schoenfeldt compared to .223 against Becker.

Series History Versus the Eagles

South Carolina is 44-8-1 all-time against their rivals from Rock Hill in a series that dates back to 1975. In games that are known to have been played in Rock Hill, the Gamecocks are 7-3-1, including a 6-1 win last season. This year, the Gamecocks are 2-0 against the neighbors from an hour north.

The Last Meeting vs. Winthrop - Feb. 22, 2012

A second-straight offensive onslaught sent South Carolina to a 9-1 win in five innings over in-state rival Winthrop at Beckham Field. Sophomore second baseman Dana Hathorn led the Gamecocks with a 2-for-3 day, posting a pair of two-run doubles. Junior shortstop Samie Garcia went 2-for-3 with two runs scored and a stolen base. Junior rightfielder Hannah Milks and sophomore designated player Chelsea Hawkins both went 2-for-3 as well, with Hawkins driving in two with her first-inning double.

Scouting the Longwood Lancers

Longwood brings a 23-12 record into the weekend, sweeping a doubleheader at Hampton on Tuesday afternoon. The Lancers hit the ball well, posting 29 home runs as a team on the year, and they also have speed with 36 stolen bases.

Jordan Cox has nine homers and 27 runs driven in, both high marks for Longwood, but she's hitting .250, eighth on the team. Megan Baltzell has a .379/.472/.728 line, posting seven home runs and 27 RBI. She's also stolen 10 bases in 12 tries. Leta Bressin leads the Lancers with a .403 batting average and 10 stolen bases. Marci Christian has five homers and 21 RBI, while Brooke Short has four homers and 21 RBI.

Libby Morris has a 5.05 ERA with 50 strikeouts and 46 walks in 94.1 innings, the most work of any Lancer. Short holds a 4.06 ERA and 32 strikeouts against 17 walks in 58.2 innings. Ashley Cornell has a 2.83 ERA in 64.1 innings, striking out 28 and walking 32. As a group, the Lancers have hit 43 batters.

Series History Versus the Lancers

The all-time series is knotted at 2-2, with both teams sweeping doubleheaders at their home field. The Gamecocks did that feat on Feb. 16, 2010, while the Lancers responded in kind on April 9, 2011.

The Last Series vs. Longwood - April 9, 2011

Stranding nine runners in the contest, South Carolina dropped the first game of the doubleheader 3-1 at Longwood. Samie Garcia and Hannah Milks both had two hits, with Milks posting a double. Laura Mendes drew two walks and drove in a run, while Molly Brossart also walked twice. Tricia Nelson was the only Lancer to post two hits in the contest, going 2-for-2.

Maggie Margadonna's homer in the seventh ended a back-and-forth game and gave Longwood an 8-7 victory over South Carolina in the second game at Lancer Field. With one down in the seventh, Margadonna launched a 3-1 pitch out to left to break a 7-7 tie and end the game. She went 2-for-4 with a double and the homer. The Gamecocks took a 1-0 lead when Samie Garcia deposited the first pitch of the game over the wall in center. But the Lancers followed with four in the first, the final three coming on home runs. Nichole Simmons scored from third on a double steal, while Brooke Short hit her second two-run homer of the day. Jordan Cox followed with a homer to nearly the same spot as Short's to make it 4-1.

Strong Weekend Propels Quartet Onto Gamecock Invite Team

Even in a rain-shortened event, the Gamecocks stood out, running to another title and claiming four spots on the all-tournament team. Samie Garcia earned the Gamecock Invitational MVP after going 7-for-11 in the event and leading the Gamecocks in runs and stolen bases. She was joined by three seniors: Evan Childs (three runs, four RBI, double and homer), Lauren Lackey (.545 batting average, two stolen bases) and Kierstyn White (two complete game wins).

Four Gamecocks Claim Palmetto Classic All-Tourney Honors

South Carolina took home the team title from the Palmetto Classic, and four Gamecocks led the way on the all-tournament team. Senior Kaitlin Westfall claimed MVP honors, leading South Carolina with five RBI on the weekend. Joining her on the team was another senior, Evan Childs, who posted a huge day in the win over Cleveland State. Sophomore Dana Hathorn captured a spot, collecting a hit in each of the four games, while redshirt junior Audrey Broyles also garnered recognition. Broyles had the complete-game win over Western Kentucky, an eight-inning affair.

Offensive Improvement Easy to See from '10 to '11

In 2011, the Garnet and Black tallied a batting average that was 51 points better than 2010 (.267-.216), an on-base percentage 54 points improved (.341-.287) and a slugging percentage 94 points better (.382-.288). From 2010 to 2011, the Gamecocks posted 89 more runs, 130 more hits, 14 more doubles, 10 more triples, 16 more homers, 36 more walks and 66 more stolen bases in '11. They also had 76 less strikeouts in 253 more at bats.

Record Speed in 2011

Last season, South Carolina recorded 79 stolen bases, tying the 1992 team for the second most in program history. That trailed only the 1995 squad (87) and marked just the fourth time in recorded history (since 1982) that the Gamecocks averaged over a steal per game (1992, 1994, 1995). The 2011 team did set one speed record, attempting to steal 99 stolen bases. The team 79.8 percent success rate ranks third in the last decade.

Hannah Milks wrote her name in the single-season record books twice for her work on the basepaths last year. Her 0.32 steals per game ranked ninth in Gamecock history, while her and senior Lauren Lackey's perfect percentage became the sixth and seventh such seasons at South Carolina. Milks stole 16 bases without being caught, one more than Lackey.

Offense (and Speed) Return Almost Fully from Last Year

South Carolina has a lot of offense returning from last year's team. In almost every major category (minus doubles and sacrifice flies), the Gamecocks have at least two-thirds of their firepower back. Most exciting is the 96 percent of stolen bases back from last year, the highest percentage of any stat. The chart below shows the full breakdown of what comes back for Beverly Smith's team.

Gamecocks Set Painful Record in 2011

South Carolina, as a team, took more hit by pitches than in any season previous, getting hit 37 times. The previous mark came in 2009, when the team took 32 pitches off their collective bodies. Those are the only two seasons in record of over 30 HBPs.

And the Pitching Has Picked Up, Too

The Gamecock offense was not the only thing that improved from '10 to '11. The team's ERA finished more than a run and a half better than in '10 (3.31-4.97). South Carolina tossed four more complete games and seven more shutouts than the year before, and opponents hit 66 points lower (.253-.319) against the team. In roughly 60 more innings, the Gamecocks compiled four more strikeouts and just one more walk.

Plenty of Pitching Opportunities for All

Unlike the offense, there is a lot of pitching to fill in for the Gamecocks this spring. Here's the breakdown for the pitching that returns from Audrey Broyles and Kierstyn White.

There's Plenty of Depth Again

South Carolina's softball roster this season is comprised of 22 student-athletes, one less than last year. And after a year of work for 16 of those, there is a viable backup at every position who could see time for a variety of reasons. Two players, Kelley Dillon and Julie Sarratt, are likely out for the year due to offseason surgeries.

South Carolina Picked to Finish Fifth in SEC East

In the poll of Southeastern Conference coaches prior to the season, South Carolina finished fifth in the SEC Eastern Division. Florida was the pick to win the East, while Tennessee ranked second. Kentucky edged out Georgia for the third spot. Alabama was the coaches' choice to win the SEC West, while Florida was crowned the favorite for the overall title this season by one vote over Tennessee.

Gamecocks Flew as Far South as Possible

South Carolina has played at many events in the Sunshine State, but the trip to Florida International in Miami marks the farthest south the Gamecocks have played on record. Last season, the Gamecocks played at Florida Atlantic, in Boca Raton, and Florida Gulf Coast, in Fort Myers, with Boca being a few miles farther south. Miami is an hour south on Interstate 95 than the FAU campus.
