TODAY'S GAME

South Carolina will host Jacksonville on Friday in its final contest before the break for exams next week. The meeting marks the fifth all-time between the two schools, with all five meetings in Columbia. The contest will be televised on Fox Sports Carolinas/Fox Sports South with Andy Demetra and Eddie Fogler on the call, while fans can also listen on the Gamecock IMG Sports Network and GamecocksOnline.com.

CAROLINA QUICK HITS

- South Carolina is in its 105th season of basketball.
- The Gamecocks are led by first-year head coach Frank Martin. His associate head coach is Brad Underwood and his assistant coaches are Matt Figger and Lamont Evans. Andy Assaley is the director of basketball operations.
- Carolina suffered a 64-55 loss to visiting Clemson last Sunday at Colonial Life Arena in the annual meeting between the two intrastate rivals. The Gamecocks had won the previous two meetings.
- Junior guard Brenton Williams is now the team leader with 13.4 points per game after a 16-point performance vs.
- The Gamecocks have hit just 35.9 percent (42-117) from the floor in their last two games both losses, at St. John's last Thursday and vs. Clemson on Sunday. The Red Storm and Tigers combined to hit 51.5 percent during the stretch, with SJU hitting 56.9 percent (33-58).
- South Carolina suffered an 89-65 loss at St. John's on Nov. 29 in its first true road contest of the season competing in the 2012 SEC/BIG EAST Challenge. Freshman forward Michael Carrera posted his second double-double of the year with 11 points and 11 rebounds.
- Junior guard Brenton Williams suffered a neck injury midway through the second half vs. St. John's. He was transported to a local hospital and further evaluated. He was released and traveled home with the team. He returned vs. Clemson and led the team in scoring with 16 points, his sixth double-figure scoring game of the year.
- Junior guard Bruce Ellington saw action in his first contest of the season at St. John's. Ellington, the leading receiver for the Gamecock football team, returned to practice on Nov. 27, and will practice and compete with the basketball team until bowl practices begin for the football squad. Ellington scored seven points in his debut vs. the Red Storm, playing a team high 29 minutes, and followed with a 12-point performance vs. Clemson.
- South Carolina posted a 74-62 victory over Arkansas Little-Rock on Nov. 25 to claim the 2012 Hoops For Hope Classic tournament title in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico. Senior guard Lakeem Jackson was named to the All-Tournament Team and senior guard LaShav Page was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Player.
- Jackson collected his second double-double of the season vs. UALR, scoring 10 points and collecting a career-high 15 rebounds. It was the most rebounds in a contest for Jackson since he collected 14 vs. Alabama on March 11, 2010.

A SOUTH CAROLINA WIN WOULD ...

- · Snap a two-game losting streak for the Gamecocks
- Keep the Gamecocks undefeated all-time vs. Jacksonville
- Page led the Gamecocks with 19.0 points per game in two contests in Puerto Vallarta, including a team high 22 vs. Missouri State. Page paces Carolina with 13.6 points per game entering Sunday's contest vs. Clemson.
- Junior guard Brian Richardson scored 14 points vs. Missouri State, including four 3s, just one shy of matching his career high. Richardson played a career-high 38 minutes in the contest.
- Junior guard Eric Smith dished a season-best six assists vs. Missouri State and added five vs. UALR. He leads the Gamecocks with 3.0 assists per game.
- Carrera, the Nov. 12 SEC Freshman of the Week, did not play vs. Morgan State, Rider or Elon due to a concussion suffered in practice on Wednesday, Nov. 14. He returned to score 18 points vs. Missouri State, including the game-tying 3-pointer at the end of regulation to send the contest into overtime.
- In two overtime games this season, Carolina has hit an impressive 22-of-24 (91.7%) attempts from the free throw line during OT.
- The Gamecocks are a stellar 41-of-53 (77.4%) from the free throw line this season with under five minutes remaining in games (including overtime).
- South Carolina holds an all-time record of 20-8 against current schools in the Atlantic Sun Conference.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE

The Dolphins enter Friday's contest with a 4-5 overall record, including an 89-66 win vs. Florida Christian earlier this week. Jacksonville and South Carolina both played in the Hoops For Hope Classic, with the event ending in Puerto Vallarta. JU psted a 2-2 record in the event, with victories vs. Missouri State and Milwaukee. Freshman guard Jarvis Haywood paces the team with 10.9 points per game and senior forward Glenn Powell leads the team, and ranks fourth in the Atlantic Sun Conference with 7.3 rebounds per contest. Jacksonville is led by head coach Cliff Warren in his eighth season.

JACKSONVILLE SERIES

Friday's contest marks the fifth in the series with South Carolina and Jacksonville. All four previous games were held in Columbia. The Dolphins won the first meeting between the two schools in 1979, and the Gamecocks have won the last three. Below is the breakdown.

BY THE NUMBERS

- +10.8 South Carolina ranks second in the SEC (Missouri, 11.8) and 11th nationally with a +10.8 rebound margin. Carolina has out-rebounded each of its eight opponents this season, including a 36-29 advantage vs. Clemson.
- **19.3** South Carolina is hovering near the 20-turnovers per game mark after committing 19 vs. Clemson last Sunday. In the current two-game losing streak, the Gamecocks average 15.5 turnovers per contest.
- 37 Clemson shot 37 free throw attempts in last week's contest, the most by a Carolina opponent this season and the second-most by an opponent of any SEC school this season.
- **29.9** South Carolina's bench averages 29.9 points per contest, and as a unit, has out-scored the opposing bench in each game this season.

UP NEXT FOR THE GAMECOCKS

South Carolina will have a 12-day break before hosting Appalachian State on Dec. 19 in the first part of a double-header with the Gamecock women's team. Game time is set for 5 p.m. ET, with the game televised on Fox Sports Carolinas.

2013 SEC TOURNAMENT

The 2013 SEC Men's Basketball Tournament will be played March 13-17 at Bridgestone Arena in Nashville, Tenn. The men's basketball tournament has expanded to include all 14 teams and will be seeded 1-14. The tournament will begin on Wednesday, March 13 with matchups between the No. 11 and No. 14 seeds and the No. 12 and No. 13 seeds. The winners will advance to meet the sixth and fifth seeds, respectively, on Thursday. Also playing on Thursday with be the No. 8 and No. 9 seeds and the No. 7 and No. 10 seeds. The top four seeds in the tournament will receive byes until Friday's quarterfinal round.

NON-CONFERENCE SCHEDULE

The 2012-13 non-conference slate features 10 home dates, including one exhibition, to be played at Colonial Life Arena, two trips to New York City and an international visit to Puerto Vallarta, Mexico, to highlight the lineup. In the non-conference portion of its schedule, the Gamecocks will take part in three events, including the Hoops for Hope Classic with games in Columbia and Puerto Vallarta, Mexico, the annual SEC/BIG EAST Challenge, as well as the Brooklyn Hoops Holiday Invitational. The latter two will see the Gamecocks travel to New York City.

EXCEPTIONAL COACHING STAFF

The South Carolina men's basketball staff has nearly 100 years of coaching experience combined from the high school level, through the junior college ranks and at elite level programs in Division I basketball. Head coach Frank Martin is in his 13th season of coaching in college basketball, associate head coach Brad Underwood in his 27th, assistant coach Matt Figger in his 20th and Lamont Evans in his fifth.

COLUMBIA, S.C. -- Brenton Williams scored 12 of his 14 points in overtime as South Carolina (1-0) overcame a 17-point deficit in the second half to defeat Wisconsin-Milwaukee 82-75 Sunday in Frank Martin's debut as Gamecocks coach

They trailed 40-23 early in the second half. But Carolina ended the period on a 26-12 run and tied things on two foul shots by freshman Mindaugas Kacinas to force the extra period.

Freshman forward Michael Carrera was stellar in the contest, posting a double-double with 17 points and 15 rebounds. It marked the first doubledouble by a Gamecock freshman since the 2008 campaign. Kacinas also pulled down double-digit rebounds with 13, while adding eight points.

Senior transfer LaShay Page paced Carolina with 19 points, including 17 in the second half. Williams posted 14 points, including a perfect 8-of-8 performance from the free throw line in overtime.

Jordan Aaron had 28 points to lead the Panthers (1-1).

The teams traded baskets early in the first half before Kacinas assisted Williams on a layup underneath to give Carolina a 14-11 upperhand at the

The Panthers responded with an 8-0 run through the under-eight minute media timeout, before a lay-up from Carrera at the 6:21 mark halted the scoring drought for Carolina.

The difference in the first half was eight made 3's from the Panthers, while the Gamecocks were 0-of-8 from beyond the arc. Carrera ended the half with a near double-double, scoring nine points and pulling down nine rebounds. but UWM held a 38-23 upperhand at the break.

Carolina started the second half on a 9-2 run, propelled by a lay-up and two jumpers from Page, which forced an early timeout from Milwaukee.

After the break, stellar play from the Gamecocks brought the score within four at 40-36. Carrera hit a pair of free throws before Kacinas blocked a shot at the opposite end and assisted on Page's fifth made basket of the second half at the 14:32 mark.

Milwaukee extended its lead to 50-36 with 11:53 remaining, but the Gamecocks continued to battle.

The Gamecocks had cut Wisconsin-Milwaukee's lead to 63-58 with 4:32 to go when Theirno Niang hit the team's 13th 3-pointer to give them an eightpoint cushion with under 4 minutes to go.

Kacinas began the final charge in regulation with an inside bucket, Carrera had a putback, and Eric Smith drove in for a layup to make it 66-64 with

After Niang missed a 3-point try, Kacinas found himself with the ball outside the 3-point line and time running down. He got fouled by Kyle Kelm on the long-range attempt and made 2-of-3 free throws to tie the game.

Carrera got things going in overtime with two foul shots as South Carolina moved in front for the first time since early in the opening half. Kacinas followed with two more foul shots before Williams took over.

Williams scored 12 of Carolina's 16 points in overtime.

GAME 2 - SOUTH CAROLINA 87. MORGAN STATE 71 NOV. 16. 2012/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA, S.C. - South Carolina (2-0) defeated Morgan State (1-3) 87-71 on Friday night in non-conference action at Colonial Life Arena. Five Gamecocks scored double figures in the match, led by senior guard LaShay Page who scored a game-high 20 points and pulled down five rebounds.

South Carolina junior guards Eric Smith, Brenton Williams and Brian Richardson added 17, 14 and 10 points, respectively, for the Gamecocks. Junior forward R.J. Slawson put up 10 points and brought down seven rebounds and senior forward Lakeem Jackson notched eight points and eight rebounds. Every South Carolina player that registered significant minutes tallied at least two boards in the effort as the Gamecocks out-rebounded the Bears 35-22. South Carolina was without freshman forward Michael Carrera, the reigning SEC Freshman of the Week, due to a concussion.

Two junior guards led the Morgan State effort, Justin Black, who scored 20 points and Anthony Hubbard with 15. Senior forward DeWayne Jackson added 11 on the night. The Bear's leading rebounder was junior center lan Chiles who came down with five.

Morgan State jumped out to an early lead by capitalizing on chances in transition. The Bears built up a seven-point advantage early in the first half, but could not pull away.

After chipping away at the Morgan State lead, South Carolina tied the game at 22-22. Page ignited a run by jumping on a loose ball and calling timeout to give South Carolina possession. Williams drained a 3-pointer coming out of the timeout to spur a 16-5 Gamecock run. Page added another three and a pair of free throws in the spurt to give the home team an 11-point lead.

The Bears responded with a 10-2 run of their own to pull within three, but could not get any closer. The teams went into the locker room with South Carolina holding a 45-41 advantage.

Coming out of the break, Morgan State pulled within one at 45-44 on a threepoint play by Hubbard, but the Gamecocks responded with six unanswered points that included back-to-back buckets by Slawson to firmly take the lead. South Carolina built a 12-point lead midway through the second half and went 9-9 from the free throw line down the stretch to maintain their lead and cruise to a 87-71 win.

COLUMBIA, S.C. - South Carolina (3-0) defeated Rider (2-2) 88-76 at Co-Ionial Life Arena on Monday night as a part of the Hoops for Hope Classic. Junior guard Brenton Williams led the way for the Gamecocks with the best stat line of his career. In his 38 minutes of play, Williams scored 22 points, hit 5-8 from behind the arc, pulled down four rebounds and dished out four assists. All numbers were career highs.

Every Gamecock who entered the game scored and four reached double figures on the night. In addition to Williams, freshman forward Mindaugas Kacinas scored a career-high 18 and senior forward Lakeem Jackson dropped 14. Senior guard LaShay Page added 12 points despite missing most of the first half with foul trouble. South Carolina also handed out 22 assists on 32 made baskets. COLUMBIA, S.C. -- South Carolina (3-1) fell to Elon (4-1) 65-53 on Wednesday night in non-conference action at Colonial Life Arena. Senior forward Lakeem Jackson led the Gamecocks in the effort with 14 points and 10 rebounds

Junior guard Brenton Williams added nine points for the Gamecocks, Junior guard Brian Richardson and junior forward RJ Slawson each added seven points and eight rebounds. The eight rebounds were a career high for Richardson who also dished out four assists. South Carolina turned the ball over 22 times on the night, leading to 18 Elon points. For the third game in a row, the Gamecocks were without freshman forward Michael Carrera.

Three Elon players scored in double figures. Junior forward Lucas Troutman led the team with 15 points and six rebounds. Junior guard Jack Isenbarger and sophomore guard Austin Hamilton netted 13 points apiece as well. Junior guard Sebastian Koch brought down a team-leading seven rebounds. Richardson found Jackson in transition for a bucket with 36 seconds remaining in the half, but Elon's Isenbarger responded with a 3-pointer with three seconds to go, giving the Phoenix a 31-23 advantage going into the locker room

After the break, a Richardson 3-pointer and a free throw by freshman forward Mindaugas Kacinas brought the Gamecocks to within four to start the second half, but the Phoenix responded with two 3s of their own to extend the lead back to 10.

Williams, who scored all nine of his points in the second half, cut the lead to four at 39-35 with 15:29 remaining when he poked the ball away and took it the distance for a dunk. The Gamecocks would not get any closer.

Down 53-37 with 10:42 remaining, South Carolina made one last attempt to rally and set off on a 15-4 run to cut the deficit to five. Jackson scored six points in the stretch, with two of them coming on an emphatic dunk in transition. The spurt forced Elon to call timeout to stop the surging Gamecock momentum. After the timeout, the Phoenix responded with three unanswered baskets, all by Troutman, to again give the Phoenix a double-digit lead at 63-52. Each team made an appearance at the free throw line in the final two minutes and Elon held on for the 65-53 win.

PUERTO VALLARTA, Mexico - South Carolina posted a 74-67 victory over Missouri State in the third round of the Hoops For Hope Classic in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico, on Saturday in non-conference action. In his first contest back after missing three games due to a concussion, freshman forward Michael Carrera hit a 3 as time expired in regulation to send the contest into overtime.

Senior guard LaShay Page led the Gamecocks with 22 points and six rebounds, while junior guard Brian Richardson added 14 points, hitting four 3s in the contest, just one shy of matching his career high. Carrera added 18 points in his return and pulled down five rebounds.

South Carolina committed a season high 25 turnovers in the contest, however, after committing 20 of those in the first half, the Gamecocks were solid through the second half and overtime, posting just five turnovers during the stretch. The Gamecocks outrebounded the Bears, 33-29.

Marcus Marshall led the Bears with 17 points, while Anthony Downing and Christian Kirk both added 16. Keith Pickens' eight rebounds were a game-high.

After Missouri State took an early 2-0 lead after an administrative technical foul called on Carolina during pre-game warmups, the Bears jumped out to a quick 7-0 lead before a 3 from Richardson halted the stretch at the 17:41 mark.

The Gamecocks responded with a 10-4 run over the course of the next three minutes to take a 13-11 lead on another 3 from Richardson. Back and forth play followed, but the Gamecocks were never able to extend a lead due to several turnovers through the middle part of the half.

Missouri State held a 19-18 advantage near the seven-minute mark, but the Gamecocks continued to battle and Richardson's third 3 of the half tied the contest at 23 with 4:31 remaining before halftime.

Carolina committed five turnovers through the last four minutes of play and Missouri State held a 33-28 lead at the half. The Gamecocks finished the half with just 11 shots attempts, connecting on eight to shoot 72.7 percent in the set.

Page scored two 3s and a lay-up through the first three minutes and 30 seconds of the second half to tie the contest at 38. The teams traded baskets before a lay-up and two free throws from Carrera gave the Gamecocks a 42-40 lead with 13:06 on the clock.

After a lay-up from Kirk, Richardson's fourth 3 of the contest pushed the Gamecock lead to 45-42 with 11:24 remaining in regulation. The teams traded baskets and the contest was tied at 47, before Marshall gave the Bears a three-point advantage at the 7:39 mark

Junior guard Eric Smith earned the assist on a lay-up from Page to tie the contest at 51 with just over six minutes remaining. Two free throws from MSU's Marshall gave the Bears a 53-51 advantage, before Carrera tied the contest at 53 with a hard-fought lay-up with 2:42 on the clock.

Kirk gave MSU a 55-53 lead with 1:25 remaining, before the teams traded missed baskets and the Gamecocks were called for an intentional foul with 33 seconds on the clock. The Bears were only able to hit 1-of-2 from the line to hold a 56-53 lead.

Richardson was called for a foul with 29 seconds remaining and MSU's Williams missed the front end of a 1-and-1 opportunity before Page connected on the opposite end on a jumper to pull the Gamecocks within one at 56-55 with 13 seconds remaining.

Marshall connected on two free throws for the Bears at the opposite end with 12.2 seconds on the clock to go up three at 58-55. Smith collected the inbounds pass from freshman forward Mindaugas Kacinas and raced down the floor, finding Carrera just beyond the 3-point line with just seconds remaining.

Carrera faced the basket and shot his first attempt from beyond the arc this season, hitting at the buzzer to tie the contest at 58 and force overtime.

The Gamecocks dominated the OT session, out-scoring the Bears 16-9 in the set, including four points from Carrera and seven made free throws from Page to secure the Carolina victory.

PUERTO VALLARTA, Mexico - The South Carolina men's basketball team (5-1) claimed the 2012 Hoops For Hope Classic Championship on Sunday night in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico, with a 74-62 victory over Arkansas-Little Rock (4-3), Senior forward Lakeem Jackson collected his second doubledouble of the season with 10 points and a career-high 15 rebounds.

Jackson was named to the all-tournament team and senior guard LaShay Page was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Player.

Junior guard Brenton Williams led the five Gamecocks who scored double figures in the championship game with 17. Page added 16, freshman forward Mindaugas Kacinas tallied 13 and junior guard Eric Smith posted 12 in the balanced effort. Jackson's 15 rebounds were a game high.

Junior forward Will Neighbour led the ULAR charge with 19 points and five rebounds. Freshman guard John Gillon netted nine points for the Trojans.

South Carolina jumped out to a 12-4 lead through the first six minutes of play, but UALR responded with a 7-2 run through the under-12 minute media timeout to pull within three at 14-11.

Page scored six points after the break and Smith extended the Gamecocks lead to nine at 23-14 with 8:53 on the clock on a made 3 at the shot clock

Neighbour would add a lay-up for the Trojans, but a basket from Jackson and two from Williams gave Carolina a solid advantage at 31-16 with just over four minutes remaining before the half.

South Carolina continued to dominate on the offensive end the remainder of the set. Page hit his second 3 of the contest with just over a minute to play, and Kacinas buried a 3 just before the halftime buzzer to push the Gamecock advantage to 39-22. Carolina held a dominating 25-8 rebounding advantage in the half, scoring 13 second chance points.

The Gamecocks picked up where they left off before the break in the second half. Carolina held a 55-28 lead after back-to-back buckets from Williams midway through the half.

Page collected an assist on a floating pass to Kacinas just under nine minutes for a 25-point Carolina lead at 59-34.

Jackson collected his second double-double of the season with his 10th point on a breakaway dunk near the six-minute mark, and the Gamecocks closed out the contest with a 74-62 victory.

GAME 7 - ST. JOHN'S 89, SOUTH CAROLINA 65 NOV. 29. 2012/CARNESECGA ARENA

QUEENS, N.Y. - South Carolina (5-2) fell to St. John's (5-2) 89-65 in the 2012 SEC/BIG EAST Challenge on Wednesday night at Carnesecca Arena. Freshman forward Michael Carrera registered his second double-double of the season with 11 points and 11 rebounds to lead the Carnecocks.

Junior guard Brenton Williams was injured in the contest. He suffered a neck injury and was taken to a local hospital for further evaluation. He did have movement of his arms and legs on the court. An update will be released when available.

Before his injury, Williams scored 10 points in the matchup. Freshman forward Mindaugas Kacinas scored nine and added six rebounds. Senior forward Lakeem Jackson also came down with six boards for the Gamecocks.

Junior guard Bruce Ellington and freshman forward Laimonas Chatkevicius

both made their first appearance of the season in the contest.

St. John's had four players in double figures. Sophomore guard D'Angelo Harrison led the way with a game-high 26 points. Sophomore guards Amir

Garrett and Phil Greene IV tallied 15 and 13 points, respectively. Freshman forward JaKarr Sampson registered 11. Garrett also brought down 11 rebounds to lead SJU.

South Carolina struggled from the floor in the opening half, hitting just 37.5 percent (12-32) compared to 53 percent (14-26) from the Red Storm. St. John's would make 9-of-14 from the free throw line in the opening set, while the Gamecocks had zero attempts in the half.

The teams traded possessions early and a jumper from Williams with 13:31 remaining before half saw the St. John's lead at just one at 12-11.

The Red Storm would answer with eight unanswered points through the 10:50 mark, before a jumper from Chatkevicius halted the stretch.

Two made attempts from the line by SJU freshman guard Felix Balamou put the lead at 32-17, before a 3 from junior guard Eric Smith brought Carolina with 12 at 32-20 with 2:56 on the clock.

Three made baskets from Carolina brought the contest back to 12 points at halftime, with St. John's holding a 38-26 advantage.

Carolina took its first foul shots of the game two minutes into the second half when an intentional foul was called on St. John's. Carrera hit both attempts to put the score at 45-32 SJU after early baskets from both teams.

Williams would hit back-to-back 3s just before the first media timeout of the second half to put the score at 50-40 with 16 on the clock.

The injury to Williams occurred with just over 10 minutes on the clock in the second half.

St. John's held its advantage after play resumed. The Gamecocks pulled to within 15 just after Williams' injury on two Carrera free throws, but the Red Storm pulled away to capture the win. St. John's held a 28-point upper hand, the largest of the game, with just over one minute remaining in the contest.

GAME 8 - CLEMSON 64, SOUTH CAROLINA 55 DEC. 2. 2012/COLONIAL LIFE ARENA

COLUMBIA, S.C. - South Carolina (5-3) fell to intrastate rival Clemson (5-2) 64-55 in non-conference action at Colonial Life Arena on Sunday afternoon. Junior guard Brenton Williams led the Gamecocks with 16 points.

Two other Gamecocks registered double figures in the contest. Junior guard Bruce Ellington scored 12 and freshman forward Mindaugas Kacinas added 10. Freshman forward Michael Carrera and senior forward Lakeem Jackson brought down six rebounds a piece. South Carolina out-rebounded Clemson 36-29 and pulled down 17 offensive rebounds.

Sophomore forward K.J. McDaniels led Clemson with 16 points and seven boards. Sophomore guard Rod Hall registered 15 and senior center Devin Booker scored 13 and tallied a game-high eight rebounds in the contest. Clemson scored 23 points off of 19 Gamecock turnovers.

While adjusting to the physical play of the game, neither team converted a basket until just before the first media timeout. Kacinas hit freshman forward Laimonas Chatkevicius under the basket for the Gamecocks' first bucket of night and Hall drained a jumper on the ensuing possession to give Clemson a 5-3 lead.

During an over four minute South Carolina scoring drought, the Tigers went on an 11-0 scoring run to pull out to a 14-3 advantage. Booker keyed the run for Clemson with back-to-back dunks.

Trailing 23-11, the widest margin of the first half, South Carolina went on a 16-5 run to close the half. Just before the break, Kacinas hit a pair of free throws and Clemson held on for the last shot of the half. Hall could not connect and the Tigers took a one-point lead into the locker room at 28-27.

After scoring the first points of the second half on baskets by Williams and Jackson, the Gamecocks took their first lead since 1-0 at 31-30. The Tigers responded with an 11-2 run to recapture the upper hand at 41-33. Kacinas halted the run with a 3.

With eight minutes to play, senior guard LaShay Page and Williams hit back-to-back 3s to cut the deficit to single digits at 49-43.

Ellington drained a jumper with 4:10 remaining to bring South Carolina to within four at 51-47, but the Gamecocks would not get any closer. Sophomore guard Damarcus Harrison immediately responded with a 3 for the Tigers and Clemson went 10-for-12 from the free throw line down the stretch to hold on for the 64-55 victory.


