

Mark Berson, the winningest active coach in NCAA Division I, has been at the helm of the South Carolina soccer program since his hiring in 1978 ushered the program to varsity status, a reign that stands at 38 years.

Before coming to Carolina in 1978, Berson went 11-5-0 in one season at The Citadel, putting his overall record entering 2015 at 472-215-68, a .670 winning percentage. In 2006, Berson became the 10th NCAA Division I coach all-time to reach the 400-victory milestone when his Gamecocks defeated UAB, 2-0, in a televised contest at Stone Stadium. Berson entered 2015 with a 461-210-68 record at South Carolina.

In 2015, Berson has received two huge honors. In January, the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) honored him with the Bill Jeffrey Award, given to an individual for outstanding service or achievement in college soocer, at its annual convention. In July, Berson was announced as one of eight selected to join South Carolina Lettermen's Association Hall of Fame, where he joins six of his former players.

Overall, Berson has taken the Gamecocks to 20 NCAA Tournaments, with those teams advancing to at least the second round 11 times. His squads have four quarterfinal and two NCAA College Cup appearances to their credit as well. In 1993, the Gamecocks advanced to the NCAA Championship Game.

Though Carolina has been independent during the majority of the program's tenure, the Gamecocks have captured four conference titles under Berson's leadership. Carolina won the 1993 Metro Conference Championship in one of its two years competing in the conference. The Gamecocks joined Conference USA in 2005 and promptly claimed the league's tournament championship. Carolina also won the C-USA Tournament in 2010 and collected the regular season crown in 2011.

Besides making an impact in collegiate soccer, Berson's presence is also felt in the higher ranks. The Gamecocks are one of only two collegiate programs to have had a player on each of the last four US Men's National World Cup teams. Josh Wolff competed on the US teams in 2002 and 2006 and was also an Olympic team member in 2000. Clint Mathis, a teammate of Wolff during his time at Carolina, also enjoyed a celebrated professional career that spanned 11 seasons in Major League Soccer. Mathis, who retired from professional soccer in 2010, was a member of the 2002 U.S. World Cup squad and helped his MLS team, Real Salt Lake, capture the MLS Cup in 2009. Mathis also graced the cover of Sports Illustrated in May 2002 prior to the World Cup, marking the third Gamecock athlete, in any sport, to be featured on the cover of the prestigious magazine. Former Gamecock goalkeeper Brad Guzan has been on the US roster for the past two FIFA World Cups in 2010 and 2014.

Six times, Berson has been recognized as a coach of the year. Most recently, he was the Conference USA Coach of the Year in 2011 after winning the league's regular-season title. In 1998, Berson earned Independent Coach of the Year honors after leading Carolina to the best record of all Independent schools. Berson has also been honored as the NSCAA South Region Coach of the Year on four occasions (1984, 1985, 1988, 1995).

Berson has been involved in soccer development as a coach, teacher and administrator on many levels. He is a U.S. Soccer National Instructional Staff Coach with an "A" coaching license and has served on the US Soccer National Instructional staff coach since 1989. He has served as State Coach for the South Carolina Youth Soccer Association (SCYSA), working in player development and coaching certification. In 1992, he was inducted into the South Carolina Youth Soccer Association Hall of Fame.

Berson coached the U.S. National U-18 team in the Granarkin/Leningrad Tournament in January 1989. In July 1987, he directed the South team to the gold medal in the U.S. Olympic Festival in Durham, N.C., one year after serving as an assistant coach for the South squad.

A 1971 graduate of Summit (N.J.) High School, Berson attended the University of North Carolina and received

his bachelor of arts degree in journalism in 1975. Berson played on the Tar Heel soccer squad for four years, one as a midfielder and the other three in goal. As a senior, Berson received the UNC Educational Foundation Award and was a member of the Academic ACC Honor Roll. Berson earned his master's of education degree in sport administration from Ohio University in 1977.

Born March 16, 1953, in Hartford, Conn., Berson is married to the former Shauna Hopkins, a South Carolina alum, of Columbia. They have two children, Erin Rhea and Luke William. Erin graduated from South Carolina in 2009, and Luke is currently enrolled at the University of South Carolina in the Moore School of Business.

SEVEN SOUTH CAROLINA PLAYERS MAKE CONFERENCE USA AWARDS LIST

- Junior Danny Deakin led seven Gamecocks who garnered spots on Conference USA's awards.
- Deakin earned first-team honors after ranking fourth in league matches in goals scored (4).
- On the second team were junior defender Koty Millard and senior forward Kevin Walker.
- Third-team honorees from the Gamecocks were junior defender Ive Burnett and senior forward Jeffrey Torda.
- Two central defenders Peyton Ericson and Torgeir Nyboe made the C-USA All-Freshman Team.
- The seven honored is the most for a Gamecock squad since eight earned accolades in 2008.

South Carolina's Conference USA Tournament History

- This ranks as the ninth Conference USA Tournament South Carolina has played in since joining the league as an affiliate member in 2005.
- Twice, the Gamecocks have won the event, in 2005 and 2010. Last season, SC played in its third championship match.
- South Carolina is 9-6-1 all-time in the event.

OFFENSE HIGHLIGHTS FOR THE GAMECOCKS

- Junior Danny Deakin leads South Carolina in goals and points and has three game-winners.
- Deakin recorded a hat trick and two braces already this season and is the first Gamecock since Sam Arthur in 2008 to tally 10 goals in a season.
- Deakin's three vs. UNC Greensboro on Sept. 8 came almost exactly 14 years after the previous Gamecock hat trick, as Jordan Quinn recorded his on Sept. 9, 2001, against TCU.
- The braces (two-goal matches) came in home wins over No. 8 Elon, scoring both in the second half, and Florida Atlantic, tallying both in the first period.
- Senior Jeffrey Torda has four Gamecock game-winners, the second getting national recognition.
- His scissor kick goal made the No. 2 spot on ESPN SportsCenter's Top 10 plays for Aug. 31.
- Junior Koty Millard has a goal and a team-best five assists, tying senior Ryan Arambula in helpers.

WE SCHEDULE TOP COMPETITION

- According to the NCAA's data on Nov. 9, the Gamecocks have played the toughest non-conference schedule in the country and the sixth-toughest overall.
- South Carolina has faced six RPI top-30 foes, with 10 in the top 50 and 13 in the top 100.
- Of the 17 regular-season matches, 12 came against top-100 RPI teams in the final 2014 report.
- Ten of those ranked in the top 50, five from C-USA (Charlotte, Kentucky, UAB, Old Dominion and New Mexico).
- Four foes made the NSCAA/Continental Tire Preseason Top 25, with five more among those receiving votes.
- Eight of the Gamecocks' opponents made last year's NCAA Tournament.

GAMECOCKS SERVE COLUMBIA COMMUNITY DURING FLOODS

- Twice in the week after the unprecedented storms caused creeks to swell and lake levees to breach, this Gamecock team stepped out to help.
- On Thurs., Oct. 8 and Sun., Oct. 11, they assisted at centers helping those most affected, spending
 the first day at Harvest Hope Food Bank and the second at Rosewood Baptist Church.
- Donations were also taken at the Gamecocks' match on Fri., Oct. 9 against Florida Atlantic.
- Relief efforts continue, and the South Carolina athletic department continues to help.
- The University of South Carolina teamed up with local vender School Cuts to sell a T-shirt, with proceeds benefiting three non-profits who are assisting with the cleanup.

GAMECOCKS KEEP COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT STREAK ALIVE WITH TWO PICKS

- Senior Jeffrey Torda and junior Ive Burnett gained CoSIDA Academic All-District 4 honors.
- Torda garnered his second selection, while Burnett took home his first.
- The Gamecocks have had at least one honoree in each of the past 10 years and have had multiple students make the list for three consecutive years.
- The two move onto the national ballot. The CoSIDA Academic All-America Teams will be announced on Nov. 24.

THREE WEEKS PRODUCE BIG AWARDS FOR GAMECOCKS

- Twice this season, South Carolina has earned three awards in a week for its play.
- After downing No. 8 Elon and No. 7 New Mexico, William Pyle earned C-USA Defensive Player
 of the Week honors and made the Top Drawer Soccer Team of the Week.
- Danny Deakin garnered College Soccer News Team of the Week honors that week as well as on Nov. 2 after his two goals in wins over FIU and No. 13 Old Dominion.
- Deakin claimed C-USA Offensive Player of the Week on Nov. 2 as well, while junior Koty Millard took a spot on the Top Drawer Soccer Team of the Week on Nov. 3.
- Millard claimed the league's Defensive Player of the Week honors on Nov. 9 after helping the Gameccocks shut out No. 11 Coastal Carolina.

GAMECOCKS REPEAT HISTORY WITH UNDEFEATED HOME RECORD

- The Gamecocks posted an undefeated record (8-0-1) at Stone Stadium this season, the fifth time in program history a team has not lost a home match in the regular season.
- Three times, South Carolina fell in NCAA Tournament play at home to blemish the record: 1985, 1987 and 1997.
- The only year South Carolina went undefeated at home all year was 1993, going 10-0-1.
- That team won the Metro Conference title and played in the NCAA Championship Match.

THE NCAA DIVISION I ACTIVE WINS LEADER: MARK BERSON

- NCAA Division I's active wins leader, Mark Berson is fifth on the Division I wins list and 15th on
 the all-divisions listing with 482 career victories in 38 years.
- He has 471 wins at South Carolina as the only head coach in program history, and he had 11 in 1977 at The Citadel.
- He's one of four coaches in NCAA Division I history with 450 wins at one institution.
- Berson coached his 750th collegiate match vs. Kentucky on Oct. 25, 2014, while his 750th South Carolina match came in the 2-1 win over Florida Atlantic on Oct. 9, 2015.
- He's coached 11 players who have captured 13 All-America nods at South Carolina.
- He's also guided at least one player on each of the past four US Men's National Teams in the World Cup (Clint Mathis 2002, Josh Woolf 2002 and 2006, Brad Guzan 2010 and 2014).

FORWARDS PRODUCED IN WIN STREAK

- Kevin Walker and Bjorn Gudjonsson came on strong during the Gamecocks' four-match winning streak.
- Walker scored the first Gamecock goal in three straight outings in the skein.
- He now has five goals on the season, tied for second on the team.
- He's the first Gamecock since Mahamoudou Kaba in 2013 to score in three-consecutive matches.
- Gudjonsson returned to the pitch at Marshall and promptly scored the game-winning goal, his first collegiate tally. He added an assist against No. 13 Old Dominion.
- In the evolving alignment which shifted seniors Asa Kryst and Jeffrey Torda to the front line, 11 of South Carolina's last 17 goals have come from the front line.

ATTENDANCE OUTSTANDING AT STONE STADIUM

- In the 2015 season opener, 4,325 fans packed the stands for the eighth-largest crowd to watch a
 men's match in Stone Stadium's history.
- In the Nov. 9 report from the NCAA, South Carolina ranks eighth in average attendance this season, with 2,415 fans counted through nine home matches.
- Over 1,000 season tickets were sold for Gamecock Soccer in 2015.
- The first two exhibitions of 2015 had over 4,000 students scan in for each, filling the stands.
- The 2014 Gamecocks had the fifth-highest paid attendance average in NCAA Division I at 2,602.
- That 2,602 attendance average is the largest for a season in Stone Stadium history.

Homegrown Gamecocks Highlight 2015 Roster

- Eight Gamecock players hail from inside the Palmetto State, highlighting Mark Berson's commitment to recruiting and developing local talent.
- At least three SC natives have started in 11 of the 13 matches, with junior Koty Millard starting every match.
- For the past decade, South Carolina's roster has increased its number of natives on the team, with six or more on each squad since 2006, a mark only hit twice in the previous 15 years.

GAMECOCKS HAVE A RICH HISTORY IN NCAA TOURNAMENT

- On 20 occasions, the Gamecocks made an NCAA Tournament, the most in Conference USA.
- Eleven times, the Gamecocks played the NCAA Tournament Round of 16.
- South Carolina is 16-19-1 in the tourney, making two College Cups in 1988 and 1993.

Scouting New Mexico

- The Lobos are 8-5-4 this season, finishing sixth in Conference USA with a 2-4-2 mark.
- Breaking a long scoreless streak, New Mexico downed Florida Atlantic 3-0 in its last match.
- Jason Beaulieu has done his job in goal, making 72 saves in 1,630 minutes and 17 starts to post a 0.94 goals against average.
- His last two shutouts came at FIU, who had been one of the top scoring teams in the country, and
 against the FAU Owls.
- Chris Wehan leads the Lobo offense with 10 goals and 22 points, posting four game-winners.
- Josh Goss has a team-best five assists.
- Francesco Casucci has four goals and 10 points off the bench, second in both categories.
- Niko Hansen has three assists, second on the team, and he ranks third in both points (9) and goals (3).
- The Lobos have seen their foes get carded 33 times and have taken two penalty kicks, while they only have 12 yellows total and have not given up a PK.

TIES BETWEEN SOUTH CAROLINA AND NEW MEXICO

 Four Lobos played with the Real Salt Lake Academy: junior Josh Goss, redshirt sophomore Lucas Seligman, sophomore Sam Gleadle and freshman Aaron Herrera. Gamecock junior Ive Burnett graduated from RSLA.

SERIES HISTORY VS. THE LOBOS

The series stands in SC's favor, 2-1, and began with New Mexico's entrance into Conference USA in 2013.

THE LAST TIME - SEPT. 25, 2015 NEW MEXICO AT SOUTH CAROLINA - STONE STADIUM

South Carolina (5-2-1, 2-0 Conference USA) picked up its second-consecutive win over a top-10 team, downing No. 7 New Mexico (5-2-1, 0-1 C-USA) 2-1 in overtime on Friday night at Stone Stadium.

Senior Jeffrey Torda made a late run down the left side and sent a shot from the corner of the 18 toward goal. New Mexico's goalkeeper got a hand on it but couldn't redirect it, as the ball slipped inside the far post for the game-winner in the 99th minute.

The Gamecocks scored in the third minute of the match when senior Kevin Walker pushed his third goal of the season home from inside the six. Redshirt senior Asa Kryst started the chance with his pass to junior Koty Millard, who crossed it from the corner to Walker for the score.

The lead held until the 86th minute when the Gamecocks were called for a foul in the box. Chris Wehan stepped to the spot and knocked in the tying goal, forcing the overtime period.

Both teams had other chances, the best for South Carolina coming in the 34th minute, as Walker had a shot hit off the crossbar. Junior Danny Deakin stepped in and tried to put in the rebound, but his chance missed high. New Mexico had a one-on-one chance from inside the 18 in the 66th minute that South Carolina stopped.

- South Carolina brings back 13 letter-winners and 16 members from the squad that made the 2014 Conference USA Tournament Championship Match.
- Ten newcomers join the group: three transfers and seven freshmen.
- The Gamecocks return 47 percent of their goals and 57 percent of their assists from last year.
- Third-team All-Conference USA midfielder Kurtis Turner is the top returning scorer.
- Turner has led the Gamecocks in assists in each of his first two years.
- Junior goalkeeper Marco Velez is also back after playing 87 percent of the minutes in goal and recording three solo shutouts last season.

THE GAMECOCKS SHINE IN THE CLASSROOM AS WELL

- South Carolina's 16 returners have a total of 26 SEC Academic Honor Roll certificates and 25 Conference USA Academic Honor Roll notations between them.
- Last season, 20 of the roster members picked up spots on each honor roll.
- Ryan Arambula (three) and Jeffrey Torda (two) both own multiple C-USA Academic Medals, which go to honorees holding a 3.75 cumulative GPA or higher.
- Both seniors also have CoSIDA Academic All-District nods.
- Torda earned his second CoSIDA Academic All-District honor this season, and junior Ive Burnett joined him on the 2015 team.
- Ten times, SC has garnered the NSCAA Team Academic Award, including in each of the past seven years.
- Twice in the past six years, the Gamecocks have captured the top GPA in NCAA Division I according to the NSCAA.

BEATING TWO TOP-10 TEAMS IN A WEEK BRINGS RECOGNITION

- The Gamecocks won their first game vs. an NSCAA top-10 team since 2013 by downing No. 8 Elon 3-1 on Tues., Sept. 22.
- They followed that with a 2-1 overtime victory over No. 7 New Mexico on Fri, Sept. 25.
- It's the second time South Carolina has downed top-10 foes in consecutive matches, matching wins in 2000 over No. 3 Virginia and No. 8 Maryland (9/8-10).
- Goalkeeper William Pyle earned the Conference USA Defensive Player of the Week nod and made Top Drawer Soccer's (TDS) Team of the Week for his efforts.
- College Soccer News (CSN) put midfielder Danny Deakin on its Team of the Week after his two goals in the Elon win.
- All four national polls recognized the Gamecocks, with the NSCAA putting the squad 19th in the country on Sept. 29.

11th Year for South Carolina in Conference USA

- The 2015 season is South Carolina's 11th as a men's soccer affiliate member of Conference USA.
- In 2011, the Garnet and Black captured the league's regular-season crown, sharing it with UAB.
- Twice more, the Gamecocks won the league's tournament, in 2005 and 2010.
- South Carolina's student-athletes have 48 all-league nods, 14 coming on the first team.
- In C-USA outings, South Carolina owns a 44-30-16 (.578) mark.
- On the road, that mark is 21-15-10 (.565). At Stone Stadium, that record is 23-15-6 (.591).

SOUTH CAROLINA PLAYED FOR THIRD CONFERENCE USA TOURNAMENT CROWN IN 2014

- Last year, South Carolina advanced to the finals of the tourney before falling 2-1 to host Old Dominion.
- The seventh seed, the Gamecocks opened the event by beating second-seeded and 18th-ranked Kentucky 2-1.
- In the semifinals, South Carolina downed No. 21 UAB, 1-0.
- Entering the event, SC had only once faced a rematch against a team it lost to in the regular season.
- In 2010, South Carolina fell to SMU in the regular season 3-1 but came back to win the semifinal rematch 2-1 en route to its second tourney title.
- The Gamecocks added to that total with both wins in the 2014 event.
- It's the second time the Gamecocks downed back-to-back ranked foes in the event, matching the 2010 team (2-1 W in semis over No. 5 SMU, 11/12; 1-0 W in finals over No. 25 Tulsa, 11/14).
- SC missed becoming the first No. 7 seed to win the tourney but joined two others who made the finals (FIU 2007, Memphis 1998).
